Amazing Catch becomes the most expensive standardbred sold at auction

The reigning Canadian Trotting Classic champ was purchased by Greg Luther for \$1.85 million from the Preferred consignment on the last day of the Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in Harrisburg, PA.

Record after record shattered through the week of the 2024 Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in Harrisburg, PA culminating in Friday's (Nov. 8) closing session with the largest purchase ever made at a standardbred auction.

Amazing Catch – the 2024 Canadian Trotting Classic champ – sold within the last 50 horses of the final Mixed Sale session, was listed as Hip #1595.

The 3-year-old Walner colt out of Mets Life, entered in the sale as part of an ongoing dispersal from the partnership of Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, quickly drew high offers. He opened at \$200,000 and ascended in a multi-prong bidding

war that dissolved into a battle of two after breaching the million-dollar threshold. On one side of the arena stood Andrew Harris, his back against the black and yellow curtain draped over the corridor to the North Hall. Harris, with his catalog over his mouth as he talked over the phone with owner Bill Pollock, pressed persistently as \$1 million became \$1.1 million, then \$1.2 million and marched ever nearer to Atlanta's record sale of \$1.55 million over on Gait.

Harris' opponent in this fight kept forcing the number to climb from the other side of the arena. Greg Luther, standing on the floor in front of the grandstand seating against the Main Hall, stayed adamant as Amazing Catch surpassed the record, but the bidding moved deeper. Harris pulled back from the hundred-thousand dollar leaps with a bid of \$1.75 million, but Luther came back with an offer

of \$1.85 million. At that point, Harris backed out and the auctioneer let a still moment hover. When no other offers arose, Luther won and applause erupted for the richest sale ever at auction for a single standardbred.

"I figured he'd go close to \$2 million," Luther said. "I was thinking \$1.5 to \$2 million because a lot of people wanted to export him; wanting to take him overseas. I was going to keep going. Like I say, \$2 million, \$2.5 million – when you get to those numbers it's only a 10 per cent or 20 per cent difference. You're going to overpay. When you want

a good horse, you're going to overpay. Frankly, at an auction, you have to be the dumbest person in the room. Everyone else basically has to say, 'Oh my gosh, that's too much money.' That's how you win in an auction. That's every horse that went through – somebody said, 'That's too much.' So, I figured that would be the case, but I wanted a good horse like that.

"You've got to pay for a good horse, and it's such a unique opportunity next year with everybody retiring – Karl, T C I, Sig Sauer, It's Academic, Winner's Bet... They are all gone [to stud], so you can really make a lot of money next year."



Luther, who noted he's likely to keep Amazing Catch with his current trainer Ake Svanstedt, also said he felt confident going so high in price because of the colt's prospects as a stallion, including to breed with some in his own stable of currently 160 head.

"I wish [they] would've sold this horse before those great trotting mares yesterday, because I'd be raising my hand on that end and be going for crazier money," Luther said with a laugh, "but we've got plenty of time for that and I'll probably be stocking up next year.

"So, anybody watching or listening or reading, put your broodmares in there next year because I'll do the same for you."

With the sale of Amazing Catch, the 2024 SHSC auction is the first standardbred sale in history to sell three horses for seven figures in the same year. Yearling Cambridge Hanover sold for \$1 million on Monday (Nov. 4) and broodmare Hot Mess Hanover, the dam of Jiggy Jog S, sold for \$1 million during Thursday's (Nov. 7) session.

Only the 2019 Lexington Selected Sale had two million-dollar sales with the yearlings Maverick (selling for \$1.1 million) and Damien (selling for \$1 million).

"[I'm] terribly thrilled," said Dale Welk, president and director of operations for the Standardbred Horse Sales Company. "It's still not quite sunk in, but I'm not ashamed to admit that I was back there with a huge lump in my throat when the last one sold. I thought it would be close to a million, but I never dreamed \$1.8 million. Until it hit \$1.6 million, then it was, like, 'This thing might hit \$2 million!' I'm still a little emotional about it. It's a big deal. I think you'll see million-dollar mares and million-dollar others, but I don't know if you'll see them all in the same auction. It just proves that we're Pennsylvania strong and it's great to be in this building. We're in Pennsylvania and we're here to kick butt."

Amazing Catch was consigned by Preferred Equine, which sold the first horse and the last horse of the 2024 sale. The consignment also surpassed exactly \$20 million in gross sales in 2023 with \$20,507,000 in sales this year, a 2.5 per cent increase, to lead all consignors for the complete auction.

"The market is always ready for a good horse," said David Reid, president of Preferred Equine. "I think the overall sale — when you go back and digest it — the \$1.8 million was good today, obviously, and the million-dollar mare yesterday was good, but it was still a very workmanlike sale. There's a lot of money out there. For the top end, whether it's thoroughbreds or standardbreds, there's been money all year for the top-end horses. I hope it bodes well going forward, but the industry has to still continue to improve and we'll see what happens in the future"

David Reid's Preferred Equine sold two million-dollar horses at this year's SHSC sale – mare Hot Mess Hanover and trotting colt Amazing Catch – and set a record for consignor gross sales with \$20,507,000 over five days.

CLOSING SESSION LEADERS

Mambacita, selling as Hip #1510, drew the second-highest bid of the closing session. Ashleigh Bailey signed the ticket for \$750,000 as agent for Crawford Farms, a co-owner of the millionaire 4-year-old mare by Tactical Landing. Bailey also signed as agent for Sadbirdstillsing, selling as Hip #1513 for \$285,000 – the sixth-highest price of the afternoon. The daughter of Chapter Seven and Mambacita were consigned by Preferred Equine.

After getting outbid on Amazing Catch, Harris came back a few horses later to post the third-highest purchase of the day with Hip #1600, the Captaintreacherous colt Captain Luke. Harris paid \$400,000 for the 2023 Governor's Cup winner consigned by Preferred.

Linda Stewart of Lexington, KY paid \$360,000 — the fourth-highest price of the session — for Hip #1490, the Chapter Seven filly Chaparmbro. She is a half-sister to millionaire Dejarmbro as well as stakes winner Shared Past. She was consigned by Northwood Bloodstock.

RECORD WRAP

The two-day mixed portion of the SHSC auction ended with the highest gross ever. From 597 sales, this year's mixed session grossed \$31,608,000 and set an all-time average record of \$52,945.

Friday's second session of the 2024 mixed sale, from 253 sales, grossed \$15,632,000 for an average of \$61,787 and with a median price of \$35,000.

Adding in the yearling portion, the complete five-day auction ended with the fourth-highest gross of all time. From 1,463 sales, the 2024 session grossed \$68,699,000, just 2.2 per cent off the all-time record gross in 2007 of \$70,050,000. The 2024

total sale average of \$46,958 sits as the third best in Black Book history.

"I try to predict things in my mind and I do say things when we all talk," Welk said, "but [this mixed sale] exceeded what I thought and that doesn't happen often, because I have high hopes and expectations for myself and the crew and the yearlings and the horses and the buyers. I couldn't have written a book down to get it better than this."

The \$20.5-million gross for Preferred Equine also was a record for the SHSC auction, slightly eclipsing its record of \$20.49 million from the 2022 sale.

"We're very consistent with our numbers, generally speaking,"

Martti Ala-Sepalla is Noel Daley's not so secret weapon

There is a person, I am certain he is likely the only person, who has watched the videos of every single trotting yearling that has been offered at all the Lexington and Harrisburg preferred sales since 1986. That's literally thousands upon thousands of yearlings that he has watched and graded. His name is Martti Ala-Sepalla, a native of Finland.

He now is active in the sport as a breeder, a stallion manager and as leading trainer Noel Daley describes him, "My now, not so secret weapon" when it comes to choosing trotting yearlings. This scribe and Martti had occasion to speak during his annual trip to Harrisburg which he has been making for the last 40 plus years.

You've been involved in harness racing for a lifetime. How did it begin? Were you born into the sport as so many others have been?

"I lived in the small Finnish town of Lahti. My father passed away when I was 11. A friend first took me to the races when I was 13, I suppose I was without a lifeline. I had to do something to survive. I became a gambler. I prefer to call it an investor. I see there being a difference between the two. I see a gambler as someone who relies solely upon the vagaries of chance. I see an investor as someone who studies the situation and invests with opportunities lined up in a manner that favors his investment chances.

"I discovered that I had an eye for the horses and the way they went. I watched warmups with great dedication. I still do. For example, when the races take place at Lexington, I'm always there a good time before post to watch the horses warming up. I don't bet near as much as I used to, but I still occasionally will make a wager. I gradually became interested in the breeding of the horses and in the myriad of areas that lead to them becoming racehorses.

"The chief industry in our town was a welding company called Kemppi. I somehow convinced the owners of that company to buy a piece of land and become involved in breeding and raising trotters. At the age of 21, I became its manager. Within a relatively short period of time, we became the leading breeder in Finland. From the beginning we always turned a profit. I looked upon it as though I didn't have a choice. It was as you Americans say, 'sink or swim.' After a period of time, together with Timo Kemppi we bought the breeding enterprise. Ten years ago, I sold my interest in Kemppi."


You made some contacts in the United States, notably Steve Stewart and Noel Daley.

"Yes. I've been involved with Steve from the beginning. We've been partners on horses. I've been a client of his at Hunterton Farms since 1985. Most important of all we have been the closest of friends. It's a friendship that still thrives today. The same applies to Noel."

How did your association with Daley begin and continue to the point where he calls you his secret weapon when it comes to choosing trotting yearlings and has said to me, that he will not even bid on one without your blessing?

"I had this filly Impressive Kemp who was out of the terrific filly Emilie Cas El. Emilie Cas El was a daughter of the great producer Amour Angus, the dam of the three great Hall brothers

Andover, Conway and Angus. But her daughter Impressive Kemp was pony sized and stood like a duck. She toed out significantly. Nevertheless, I loved the way she trotted, clean and straight. I had noticed that Noel was doing well. I approached him about training our filly. He looked at her and remarked on her size the way she stood. I told him that I felt certain that she would grow and that she trotted clean and I felt certain that she would overcome that perceived conformation fault. He agreed to take her on. The result was that she became a terrific race filly and earned over \$500,000 and won the Breeders Crown for us. Perhaps more importantly, it led to a great friendship and business relationship that continues to this day."

Which leads to my next question. Why aren't you involved as an owner in the trotting yearlings that Daley buys and how are you rewarded for all the hard work that you put in?

"The answer to your first question comes down to one word. That word is economics. Simply put, I am not a wealthy man. I might be able to invest in one or two of them, but in nowhere near all. If I chose just one, or perhaps the one I liked the best, I might be casting a negative light on the others. I think its best that I watch from the sidelines and cheer for all of them. With regard to any compensation that I might receive, I am rewarded when they do well by receiving booking rights to them when they go to stud. I look upon that as being fair to everyone involved."

Daley has told me that he wouldn't have bought or perhaps even looked at Volume Eight without your urging.

"Of all the trotting yearlings offered for sale in 2021, I thought that he had the very best video. I told Noel about him and he looked at him. He was somewhat small, but he otherwise checked all the boxes. When I look at a yearling, I don't only go by what is before me, but perhaps more importantly I measure it and envision its size at 3 and beyond. That was the case with Volume Eight. Noel bought him for \$75,000 and the rest was history."

Would you say, to some degree, the same was the case with Sig Sauer?

"Certainly, to some extent. I loved his video. I liked him even more as an individual than I did Volume Eight. He was a bigger, stronger and more robust specimen. He was also a lot more expensive as a yearling. Thankfully Noel had some owners who were enjoying a good season and were prepared to spend the \$200,000 that he brought as a yearling. I can't say that all my choices ended up as champions, but I like to think that my record is fairly decent.

"As for Sig Sauer, he might be the very best horse with which I've been involved. He was a very good 2-year-old; perhaps a little better than he is given credit for being. Noel does not like to push them at 2, preferring to preserve them for the Classic races at 3 and bringing them along fairly moderately as he has done with Sig Sauer. I am naturally somewhat prejudice of course, but I think he was the best 3-year-old trotter out there this season. I will be somewhat disappointed if he does not receive the Dan Patch Award as 3-Year-Old Trotter of the Year. We shall see."

You have spoken about the necessity to you of videos. What else do you look for in a trotting yearling?

"As I've told you, before I even arrive at Lexington, I've looked at the videos of all the trotting yearlings in the catalog. The same applies to Harrisburg. I can't tell you what I look for in black and white, but I will say that by then I've eliminated at least 70 per cent of them. Most people place great importance at watching them move from the front and back. Of course, I do that as well. I place equal, perhaps more importance on a side view. Of course, I want a correct individual. Like great trotting trainer Chuck Sylvester, I want one that toes out, but not too

much. Taking Chuck's philosophy one step further, I want one that toes out on its left front, not the right. I've found that those that do can handle the turns easier. Why toeing out? Because if they toe out, the chances are that they will never hit their shins. I'd sooner have one that might come close to a knee than one that hits its shins. I also place great importance on a good head, particularly a great eye. I view the horse's eye as a mirror to its soul. I believe I can learn about a horse's character and perhaps its gameness through its eye."

Noel trains as many, maybe more pacers than he does trotters. How come you don't advise him on those?

"Two main reasons, both of utmost importance. The first is that my knowledge of pacers is severely limited. I know very little about them. But at the age of 65, I am learning a little and attempting to learn more. The second is that if as you say I am his 'Trotting Guru,' he already has his own 'Pacing Guru,' a man that knows at least as much about pacers and watching them move as I know about trotters. His name is Harvey Fried. His knowledge about harness horses in general and pacers in particular is unlimited. He is a true hidden resource. He is usually involved as an owner in all of Noel's yearling purchases."

Homebred heroine

Woodbine Mohawk Park's
Dabarndawgswatchin took an unconventional
path to the Breeders Crown final for pacing
mares.

The resume of Dabarndawgswatchin (p, 5, 1:49s; \$548,756) might be the most atypical of the 10 2024 finalists. No pacing mare going into the 2024 Breeders Crown final had nearly as many lifetime starts (106); only three in the field of 10 had more wins (24).

"It's just an honor to get that far, you know," said Julie Ferguson of Greely, ON. She and Lloyd Stone of Portland, ON are the owner/breeders of Dabarndawgswatchin, who started her career in June 2020 at Rideau Carleton Raceway and outpaced their wildest expectations.

She confirmed that this year's Breeders Crown will be the last for the 6-year-old daughter of He's Watching—Addison Bay, who finished ninth in the richest race of her life on Oct. 26 at The Meadowlands.

Dabarndawgswatchin's origin story is unusual for a Grand Circuit performer today.

"We claimed the mother, Addison Bay [p, 5, 1:51.3s; \$414,066], at Rideau Carleton," Ferguson said.

In June 2012, trainer/driver Ted MacDonald began working with the mare. When he temporarily relocated after the Rideau meet, MacDonald met Dave Menary.

"He'd go to the barn in the morning, and Dave would be there," Ferguson

said. "He'd go home and come back in the afternoon to get ready to go race, and Dave would be there. He would go race and go back to the barn after they raced at Mohawk or Flamboro or wherever, and Dave would be there. So, Ted said to him one day, 'Dave, what are you, the barn dog? You're always here!"

When Addison Bay began racing regularly at Mohawk in August 2012, Ferguson and Stone sent the mare to Menary.

"At the same time, she was there, Dave had He's Watching [p, 3, 1:46.4m; \$1,116,450], so that's how we ended up breeding Addison Bay to He's Watching," said Ferguson. "The first one was a filly, Baywatching [p, 4, 1:52.3s; \$91,614]."

Addison Bay's second foal was named Dabarndawgswatchin, a reference to the ongoing joke between MacDonald and Menary.

"Dave calls Ted 'the barn dog' and Ted calls Dave 'the barn dog,' and this has been going on for years," Ferguson said with a laugh.

Dr. Peter Oddie helped with Addison Bay's transition from race mare to broodmare.

"He was our veterinarian in Belleville and Kingston when we were there for years," said Ferguson, naming two of the shuttered Ontario racetracks where she and MacDonald had started out.

"[Dr. Oddie] has a farm in Joyceville. When I decided to breed Addison, I called him... Him and his wife Bonnie have taken care of Addison since we retired her at 9 years old. He foaled out Baywatching, Dabarndawgswatchin, and one that didn't make it, called Sparkle City."

After missing a couple of years, Addison Bay produced Allison Bay, a 2-year-old All Bets Off filly who recently returned to training at Rideau Carleton; Cattlewash colt Dacattledawg, now a yearling; and weanling Cattlewash filly Washawayyurcares.

During breaking and training, Dabarndawgswatchin immediately stood out.

"Ted liked her right from the day he broke her," Ferguson told HRU. "He's broke a lot of babies and trained a lot of horses. Right from day one, he said she's special. Smart, with a beautiful gait. She trained down free-legged, and just did everything he asked her to do, naturally. He never had to push her."

Dabarndawgswatchin first qualified at Rideau Carleton June 24, 2020 for MacDonald, breaking her maiden there Aug. 11, 2020 in a 1:56 dead heat with 3-year-old gelding Mach Tie Son. The 2-year-old filly next won back-to-back legs of Mohawk's Harvest Series by open lengths for driver Jody Jamieson and trainer Ronald MacDonald, finishing third in the Nov. 2 Harvest final before stopping for the year.

"We never race a 2-year-old very many starts anyway, especially one that shows some potential," Ferguson said. "We brought her home and just turned her out at Garth Henry's farm."

After qualifying at Rideau Carleton June 2, 2021, the 3-year-old Dabarndawgswatchin relocated.

"Because Ted [MacDonald] knew Dave [Menary] from years previous, when he had Addison, he trusted him with her," Ferguson said. "Any horses that we have that are good enough to go to Toronto, they go to Dave, because he's a very hands-on trainer."

Dabarndawgswatchin's first sophomore win came July 16, 2021 against 4-year-old and younger female pacers at Mohawk. The homebred overachiever won an overnight race in an eyecatching 1:50.4 on July 16 for Trevor Henry, then brought home her first Ontario Sires Stakes Gold victory July 23. On Sept. 24, Dabarndawgswatchin and Jody Jamieson overtook Voelz Delight for another 1:50.4 win in OSS Gold.

Dabarndawgswatchin was fourth in 2021 O'Brien Award voting for the 3-year-old pacing filly category.

She has raced at Mohawk almost exclusively since 2022, rising to the distaff preferred level for the first time April 15, 2022. She finished a neck behind winner So Much More (p, 7, 1:49.1s; \$1,287,526), who was on her way to a second O'Brien Award as Canada's top pacing mare.

Dabarndawgswatchin won her first Mohawk filly and mare open handicap Sept. 24, 2022 for Dexter Dunn. While seventh in her 2022 Breeders Crown elimination, she bounced back with three straight wins before the end of the meet, including the Dec. 2 and 9 distaff preferred-2.

April 19, 2023, she signaled her readiness to return, winning her comeback qualifier by seven lengths at Rideau Carleton.

She took her 1:49 mark Sept. 23, 2023, a front-end victory over eventual 2023 Canadian Horse of the Year Sylvia Hanover in the Mohawk filly and mare preferred handicap.

This year, Dabarndawgswatchin took time off between June 7-July 26.

"She hadn't been racing good," said Ferguson, adding that co-owner Stone was just as concerned about their mare's long-term health. "She was sick, and Dave just couldn't get her blood right. He's not a numbers guy. He really cares about the individual horses."

As she recovered, Dabarndawgswatchin was turned out with a well-known pasture buddy at Menary's father's farm: Sintra (p, 4, 1:47.2m; \$1,370,839).

Oct. 5, 2024, Dabarndawgswatchin made her triumphant return to the Mohawk winner's circle, wiring in 1:49.2 to take the distaff preferred for Louis-Philippe Roy.

Ferguson took a moment to consider which wins meant the most.

"Probably her first [OSS] Gold," she said. "That was amazing for us, small-town people. Then when she came back this year, and still at 6 years old paced in 1:49. I'm in tears every time."

While entrusting Dabarndawgswatchin's care during the racing season to the Menary team and Shawna Henderson, who usually

paddocks the mare, Ferguson said she enjoyed spending time with her before the 2024 Breeders Crown final. She attended the race with her sister Joanne.

"I walked Dabarndawgswatchin in retention, the morning before the race," Ferguson said. "You're allowed to take them out and walk them or jog them or whatever, and there were like 15 or 20 horses walking in retention. All the horses that were in the Breeders Crown were out walking in the morning. So, I got to go and do that. It was fun."

Although a longshot, Dabarndawgswatchin competed in the last three Breeders Crowns.

"She didn't make the final the first year," Ferguson said. "The only reason we put her in it was because it was so close... Actually, the first year we had to pay an additional thousand dollars because she wasn't eligible as a baby."

Dabarndawgswatchin will have a less ambitious campaign ahead, in what is expected to be her final year on the track.

"We gave her some time off after the Breeders Crown, and we're hoping that she'll be in to go [at Mohawk] this week," Ferguson told HRU on Wednesday (Nov. 6).

When the Breeders Crown returns to Woodbine Mohawk Park next year, Ferguson said another "Dawg" will hopefully take over where his big sister left off.

"The goal is to get her brother there as a 2-year-old...," Ferguson said. "Of all the babies, he does have her gait and he's pacing free-legged."

Leamington Raceway wraps up successful 2024 season

Clear skies, a community feel, and a compelling 10-race card paved the way for yet another successful season finale at Leamington Raceway.

The southwestern, ON oval officially wrapped up its 13-week 2024 program on Sunday (Nov. 3).

"For the beginning of November, the weather was excellent," said track announcer Nathan Bain, who assumed the role in 2020 as an 18-year-old. "Overall, we had a good crowd on hand. There was plenty of great racing, and the fields have stayed pretty steady right to the end."

That desirable combination enabled Learnington to deliver strong wagering results throughout its 2024 meet.

The half-mile track got out to a hot start on opening day (Aug. 11), recording its highest single-card handle since the raceway reopened in 2013 (\$86,380).

Altogether, handle reached \$784,706 (awaiting confirmation of Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency), good for an average of \$60,362 per race day (13 total).

Leamington's closing day output finished slightly below the mean at \$55,875.

However, as Bain noted, that figure remains encouraging and a notable step up from marks set in previous years.

The voice of Learnington racing also noticed an intriguing trend within this year's customer base.

"We hosted a lot of new fans that we've never seen before," Bain said. "For us, the on-track atmosphere — we have a simulcast cast, too, and there's got to be a proper balance — is essential for building a base of young fans who are coming out every week, because we have to make sure that we have future fans of this sport."

To do this, the folks at Leamington effectively executed a plan that enticed fans, both novice and veteran, to come out to the races

While the on-track product always took precedent, this plan involved creating a family-first atmosphere through special events and theme days.

Whether it was fresh displays like Driver Appreciation Day (Sept. 15) and Seniors Day (Sept. 22), or familiar favorites in Fan Appreciation Day (Oct. 20) and the beloved Wiener Dog Races (Oct. 6), the community showed up in droves.

"On Wiener Dog Day [Oct. 6], we saw almost 2,000 people," Bain said. "You couldn't even move in the grandstand.

"Looking ahead, it's about continuing to build on our events. Generating awareness for the racetrack is so important. I was really happy to see how our special days came along this year."

Those who attended on closing day were treated to a stellar day of racing, headlined by the Lakeshore Cup.

The \$8,000 invitational for the meet's top earning preferred trotters went to 6-year-old son of Deep Chip—Lexis Electra, Shouldaknownbetter and veteran reinsman Lorne House.

"It was an interesting race," Bain said. "A couple of the top trotters that we've seen all season made breaks, rare breaks, but Shouldaknownbetter has been racing really well lately.

"He's a tough horse to beat on the front and has gotten along well with Lorne, who came midway through the meet as part of the driving colony, and we've seen him in the winner's circle two, three times a day. He had a great meet himself."

Despite a later arrival to the Leamington party, House finished tied with Nick Steward for the third-most wins (18) amongst drivers.

Robert Doyle and his 19 tallies landed in second behind Garrett Rooney's 32 – the B-track star also stands as Western Fair's leading driver with 130 victories and \$750,116 banked (as of Nov. 5).

Bain believes that having such remarkable driving talent routinely steer through Leamington is crucial for both horseplayers and the oval's overall wagering output.

"Not only is Garrett the leading driver at all the small tracks down this way, but he's the leading driver at Western Fair," Bain said. "I think that has generated quite a following to him.

"The horseplayers, they see familiarity in drivers like Garrett Rooney, Lorne House, Nick Steward, and Scott Wray, who are regulars at London, and that makes them more comfortable betting Leamington, more familiar with it."

And that familiarity is just as meaningful to the casual follower.

"The fans love them," Bain said. "They come to know these drivers and cheer for them every week."

On a personal note, the recent Leamington program was especially rewarding for the Bain family.

Nathan's father David Bain, who took on full-time training duties in 2020, finished tied for the third most wins (seven) and fourth-highest earnings total (\$23,614) of all conditioners.

Across 117 total starts, David sports a 22-14-19 line with over \$83,500 banked (all as of Nov. 6).

For Nathan, who works closely with his dad's charges, watching them barrel towards the finish line from the race caller's booth is somewhat of a tightrope act.

"That's a hard part of the job," Nathan said with a laugh. "I try my best to stay neutral and professional. It's very nerve-wracking, but it's even more special for me because I work with the horses every single day, running the stable, and it's definitely extra special getting to see them win.

"It was our best season yet at Leamington, and one of our best seasons overall. It was a fun year, no doubt."

While transitioning into off-season mode is bittersweet, Nathan is optimistic that 2025 will bring just as much cheer as the season that was.

As for what Leamington's loyal fan base can expect next season, perhaps regarding possible venue upgrades or special events, nothing is concrete just yet.

That said, Nathan can foresee a potentially grand improvement coming down the line.

"The budget is still yet to be approved," he said. "There are always things that we can hopefully get done, and nothing's for sure yet, but it'd be great to do a little something in the grandstand. That would be great to see, but nothing's official yet.

Rosy Weaver has been through a lot doing what she loves

When you're in the sport of harness racing, many unexpected situations can and do happen. Some are joyous, while others may be devastating. For most of us, our horses are not just a hobby, or a 9 to 5 job – it's our life.

The work is not just a job and the barn becomes our home away from home. We spend much more time at the stable than at our real home for we go to the barn early in the morning, return at night to feed and muck the stalls, and sometimes we may not get home until late at night if we have a horse racing.

Getting up at 5 in the morning is not an option, but a requirement, for a horse is like an alarm clock and knows exactly when their next meal is due. Most likely when you arrive at the barn at dawn, you will find the horse standing by their feed bucket patiently waiting, or in other cases the horse can be raising cane, screaming and banging on the stall gate. Really annoying!

Why do so many people do this day after day? It's not for the money for until the horse makes it to the races, you better have some deep pockets. Whether you raise or buy a young horse the most exciting thing is when they win their first race. It makes all those early mornings worth it.

But then on the other side of the spectrum is the heart-wrenching times when your horse gets claimed, injured or worse, dies. This month's superstar is trainer Rosy Weaver who has experienced many of the above.

In 2024 unfortunately all of Weaver's horses were exposed to toxic feed. This occurs when dietary exposures encompass a wide variety of etiologies that can be caused by natural or manmade components. In the case of horse feed, it is important to inspect the sweet feed or pellets and look for hot spots: areas of mold growth, discoloration or moisture.

It can be deadly to the animal so if you think your horse has been poisoned, you are to stay calm — yeah, right! — and contact the vet. Horses can't talk and tell you that something doesn't



taste right. Some of them may not eat the toxic feed, while others will eat anything. It is your responsibility to make sure the feed is okay, for you don't want what happened to Weaver to happen to you.

"When my horses were exposed to toxic feed, I didn't stay calm for it was extremely scary, but I was blessed for all my horses survived," Weaver said. "My feed mill had moldy corn mixed into the feed that they were unaware of. It was impossible to smell or see.

"The feed looked and smelled fine, but when my horses' got colic, tied up, and others started interfering when they never did before, I knew something was really wrong. It was very frustrating and scary, but I finally figured it out. The weird thing is not one horse missed a meal!"

Weaver is a Buckeye who was born in a small town in Ohio called Mt. Eaton.

"I still live in the same area for it is home," Weaver said. "My family was not involved in the business, but I've always loved horses and wanted to work with them. I started out as a groom working at a private farm called Flowing Mineral Farm for about six years before going on my own. Ironically, I'm still there but it's now called Glory Meadows.

"Presently, I have a stable of around 40 2- and 3-year-olds. I train mostly trotters, but this year we bought two pacers and had some success with both. I either own 100 per cent or at least 50 per cent of most of the horses I train; and I also own 25 per cent of some horses with partners. I race mostly in Ohio stake races and occasionally at The Meadows.

"Before going on my own I worked as a groom for trainers Jimmy Smith and Ben Miller. This year I've had several setbacks, but I've also had some excitement. I do occasionally drive in a race, but mostly leave it up to the professionals. Every summer I get overwhelmed with emotions when my 2-year-olds get behind the starting gate for the first start of their career."

Weaver said her all-time favorite horse is Elegant Gigi.

"[Elegant Gigi] had so much determination and a huge heart," Weaver said. "She is a sweetheart who showed up in the right time in my life. She will never leave my farm and is now a broodmare.

"My fastest horse is As A Real Legend who still holds the world record as of today for 2-year-old gelding trotters at Northfield Park."

Weaver also talked about her favorite female in our sport.

"First, I want to say I am so happy to see Victoria [Howard] write a column about the females in the sport," Weaver said. "Since the beginning, harness racing was known as a 'man's sport' but as you can see, 'we've come a long way,' since the days of the greatest female trainer/driver, Bea Farber.

"She passed away before I had a chance to meet her, but I've read about 'Queen Bea,' and watched videos about her. She was and always will be the 'Queen' in my eyes and I hope to be half the successful horsewoman that she was."

When it comes to giving credit for helping her get to where she is, Weaver said the list is long.

"I couldn't have gotten to where I am without the people who had a hand in my success, such as, Don Irvine who drove for me and allowed me to pick his brain a lot and Willis Troyer who believed in me since day one and is now my partner on some horses," she said. "Willis has made it possible for me to train at a private farm and take my horses south in the winter. I will be forever grateful to have him on my team.

"I want to thank all those people who showed up in my life to work with me and make my dream a reality.

Also, my family, especially my brother Mike, who has supported me all the way. He makes sure my horses get the best hay delivered and helps in keeping the farm in shape, besides fixing things on the farm."

Weaver said she has her hopes for the future.

"Like many other horsemen my dream is someday to have one of my horses in the Hambletonian or Little Brown Jug," she said. "I suppose that is probably every horseman's dream, but dreams do come true.

"My future plans are to stay healthy and continue to strive for that ultimate goal of one day having a champion. When the time comes to slow down, I would love to try my hands with broodmares and foals. But in the meantime, I am beyond blessed doing what I love to do."





Ride into the sunset on a shaving horse

Trey does woodworking. Turning a tree or a hunk of wood into an object is remarkably satisfying, and woodworking is much cheaper than seeing a therapist. Trey particularly enjoys retro woodworking, reproducing wooden objects from history without power tools.

For example, this is a photo of a young Abigail aboard a shaving horse. A shaving horse is a tool, a combination of **vise** and **workbench**, not to be confused with a sawhorse for lumber support or a trihorse, a portable woodworking station. I made this shaving horse by viewing pictures in a book and using fallen trees in my backyard.

To use a shaving horse, the woodworker straddles the seat as if sitting on the back of a horse, and then the worker pushes down on their feet as if they were trying to stand up in the stirrups. This action with your feet pinches the wood you are working on and holds it firm as you pull a drawknife towards you. A shaving horse is excellent for creating a round profile from a square or shapeless piece of wood. Long before power lathes, shaving horses (sometimes called "Bodgers benches") were often used to form chair legs, posts, or spokes for wagon wheels.

You can buy a shaving horse, build a modern one, or find a prefab horse for assembly. However, some of us woodworkers enjoy the old-fashioned method of taking a tree and creating a tool our forefathers used for centuries.

This summer, while busy doing a combination of nothing and nonsense at my own pace, I took the photo below.



I found the vehicle in an Ohio village and took a photo. I'm not sure what the technical name for this horse-drawn cart is, nor do I know its age or history, but to my eyes, this vehicle could be called a mini buckboard. Except for a few metal parts, the construction of the smallish contraption was very rudimentary. Now, what do these photos have to do with harness horse racing?

Not much. However, the photos planted a seed in my mind. They might find a few roots with a few of you.

My partner and I race stakes horses, usually just one per season. Therefore, we occasionally find ourselves as city dwellers who own a young horse. We strive to find good homes for these animals, but this relocation to a good home is not always easy. Part of the business is to send unproductive horses to a sale or online auction, take what you get, and turn the page, or you will soon have a herd of expensive pets.

I have a weird idea. When I face placement for my next trotter, I will seriously consider keeping this horse and paying for equine room and board at a nearby farm. However, merely driving out to the farm a few times a month to gaze into those brown eyes and scratch my horse's nose does not hold much charm. DOING something enjoyable with my horse is a horse of a different color.

Ergo, this photo of a buckboard-like vehicle is thumbtacked on my workshop wall. The shaving horse I built is in my backyard. Building this crude vehicle would be a fun challenge. The cost of construction would be minimal. Customizing the construction would also be alluring.

If the stars align, I will look for a retirement home for my trotter at a location that offers some paths, fields, and lanes to take drives and ramble. I might build a wooden sleigh for snowy winter days or attempt to construct a more complex historical horse-drawn vehicle. Keep your eyes open. You may someday see me and some acquaintances plodding down country paths or across the fields.

If I build it, they will come, I will have a challenging project, and one more horse will have a happy ever after.

London, ON, based trainer Scott McNiven surpassed the \$10 million plateau in career earnings with a third-place finish by Lolas Sunshine on Friday (Nov. 8) at The Raceway at Western District.

McCarthy sweeps Matron sophomore paces

Todd McCarthy captured both 3-year-old pacing divisions of the Matron Stakes, held Thursday (Nov. 7) at Bally's Dover, teaming up with Little Brown Jug winner, **Captain Albano** to take the \$185,500 sophomore male pace and Kentucky Sire Stakes champion, **Direction** in the \$116,500 sophomore filly pace.

Captain Albano strode strongly to the fore from post 5 and controlled a :27 first quarter before yielding to 1-2 favorite and Breeders Crown champion Mirage Hanover (driven by Dexter Dunn), who brushed from the pocket, with a circuit to go. McCarthy bided his time with Captain Albano through

middle splits of :53.4 and 1:21.2 before vacating the pocket midway on the far turn and collaring Mirage Hanover by a half-length in 1:48.4. Huntingforchrome (Matt Kakaley) stalked the top pair throughout and narrowly held third over Captain Luke.

Noel Daley trains Captain Albano, a 17-time winner with \$1,412,773 in the bank from 25 starts, for Patricia Stable, LA Express Stable, Sjoblom Racing and Michael Dolan. As the 6-5 second choice, Captain Albano paid \$4.60 to win.

McCarthy's Matron double kicked off when Direction turned a pocket trip behind two-time Breeders

Crown champion My Girl EJ into a 1:50.2 win in the filly pace.

The Always B Miki—Blood Red filly pushed clear of Tarrific (Jason Bartlett) just beyond a :26.4 first quarter before yielding to My Girl EJ (Dunn) with a lap to go and stalking middle splits of :54.2 and 1:22.3. On the far turn, 3-5 favorite My Girl EJ faced intensifying pressure from the first-over Rocket Deo, setting up for Direction to pounce up the open stretch and prevail by a neck over Rocket Deo (Andy McCarthy). My Girl EJ was a game third.

Brett Pelling trains Direction, a Diamond Creek Racing homebred with 12 career wins and \$570,221 in earnings from 20 starts. She paid \$12 to win.

While Breeders Crown champs were upset in both Matron sophomore paces, Ryan Smith's **Allegiant** completed the Crown-Matron double with a 1:51.1 win in the \$146,100 sophomore filly trot and became a millionaire in the act.

Scott Zeron and Allegiant yielded to the pocket behind R Melina (Todd McCarthy) at the end of a :27.1 first quarter, retook at the bell to control :55.4 and 1:24.1 intermediate fractions, and then edged clear steadily through a :27 sprint home to win by $2\frac{3}{4}$ lengths. R Melina was an isolated second over She Shaq (Åke Svanstedt).

Linda Toscano trains Allegiant, now an 11-time winner with \$1,006,222 in the bank from 26 starts. She paid \$3.20 to win as the 3-5 favorite.

New York Sire Stakes champion **Sir Pinocchio** put his nose on the finish line first in the \$152,800 sophomore male trot,

inheriting the lead off the home turn when Highland Kismet broke stride and narrowly holding off Private Access for a 1:52.4 score.

In line to Jason Bartlett, Sir Pinocchio sat just off a contested :26.4 first quarter, was relegated to fourth with a lap to go when Highland Kismet (Tim Tetrick) cleared the lead, and began his first-over ascent at the :55 half-mile juncture. The Met's Hall—Lady Cromwell gelding advanced steadily and ducked into the pocket up the backstretch as Highland Kismet rolled to three-quarters in 1:23. Midway on the far turn, Bartlett angled Sir Pinocchio out of the pocket and Highland Kismet broke stride, enabling Sir Pinocchio to inherit the lead turning for home. While all-out in the stretch, Sir Pinocchio found the winning post in time, fending off the late rally of Private Access (Louis-Philippe Roy) by a diminishing head in 1:52.4. Elhelpski (Peter Wrenn) finished a distant third.

Ed Hart trains Sir Pinocchio, now a 13-time winner with \$689,329 earned from 24 starts, for owner-breeder Carolyn Atherton. He paid \$5.40 to win.

McClure sweeps Thursday Harvests at Mohawk

Driver Bob McClure guided favored **Move Your Mass** and **Bruno No No No** to victory in the Ontario Sired Harvest Series finals on Thursday (Nov. 7) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, finding his way to the winner's circle with two very different trips.

The first victory was, seemingly, less stressful. A six-horse field went postward in the \$36,900 Harvest final for 2-year-old male trotters, with Move Your Mass the 3-5 choice from the pari-mutuel public. Settled into third early, McClure asked Move Your Mass to move his mass down the backside to land on top through a :57.3 half. From there, the rookie trotting colt sped through a 1:26.3 third station and then trotted home under his own volition to hit the wire more than five lengths the best in a new lifetime mark of 1:55.4. Flanagan Sunshine (Phil Hudon) and Royal Life (Trevor Henry) rounded out the top trio.

A 2-year-old gelded son of Muscle Mass—Stonebridge Glider, Move Your Mass is owned by Mardon Stables of Loretto, ON and was developed by Bruce MacDonald.

Jeff Williams, the longtime assistant trainer for the late Bob McIntosh, took over the conditioning on Move Your Mass with this assignment and notched his first stakes final win as a trainer.

"It's a great place, lovely people, Marv and Moira have been great to us," said Williams of Mardon Stables' Marv Chantler and Dr. Moira Gunn. "I owe them a lot; they gave us a great opportunity. Bruce has done a great job with this horse, I just

tried not to mess him up for a week... and, lo and behold, we managed not to! It's a dream come true."

Move Your Mass now sports a 6-1-1 summary from 13 starts with \$60,230 in earnings. He paid \$3.30 to win.

Bruno No No No came from off the pace to prevail in the \$37,200 Harvest Series final for 2-year-old male pacers, getting up in the final strides for the 1:53.4 victory.

Winchester Phoenix (Tyler Borth), Hide The Wick (Brett MacDonald) and Merrow (Tyler Jones) all took turns on the lead before the :57.1 half. Shortly thereafter, an advancing Shining Moment (James MacDonald) blew right on by heading into that far turn. After the 1:24.4 third station, Shining Moment had gained separation on his rivals but Bruno No No No had yet to be asked. McClure had the favorite in the three path at the head of the lane as Shining Moment drifted across the racetrack. Gaining with every stride while angling to the inside, Bruno No No No just got up in time to nail Shining Moment by a head. Winchester Phoenix (Tyler Borth) completed the triactor ticket.

"I thought I had a shot," McClure told Randy Waples after the victory. "He is a big, fast horse. He should have been in with the top [Ontario Sires Stakes] Gold colts this year but, unfortunately, he had some issues and they did the right thing and gave him the time and I think he'll come back next year and pay them back for it."

Trained by Gabriella Sasso, Bruno No No (All Bets Off—Winbak Alice) is owned by Jeff Courchesne of Cambridge, Martwest Racing Stable of Mississauga and Tony Aarts of Putnam, ON. The colt picked up his second win in five tries, more than doubling his previous bankroll to now sport \$30,090 in earnings.

Won Last Call upsets Primo Maschio in DSBF prelim

George and Tina Dennis Racing's homebred **Won Last Call** gave Primo Maschio his first taste of defeat in nine career starts by posting a 26-1 upset in the second of two \$20,000 first-round Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund (DSBF) preliminary events for 2-year-old male pacers held Thursday (Nov. 7) at Bally's Dover.

After breaking stride amid an early leave attempt, Won Last Call and driver Montrell Teague reset quickly enough to salvage a 3-hole ride behind the previously undefeated Primo Maschio (driven by Trae Porter) and Lew Not Lou (Tim Tetrick). Primo Maschio, who hadn't raced since his 1:54.1 win in the Harrington DSBF series championship on Oct. 7, rated fractions of :29,:58.3 and 1:27.3 before Won Last Call mounted a first-over challenge on the far turn.

Won Last Call turned up the heat off the corner for home, reeled in Primo Maschio with 40 yards to go, and won by a widening neck in a lifetime best 1:55.4. Primo Maschio finished second; Lew Not Lou was third, beaten 3¼ lengths.

Joe Columbo trains Won Last Call, a Badlands Hanover—I'm Won Shot Wiser gelding with three wins from six career starts. He paid \$54.40 to win.

Harrington series runner-up **Shore Not Beach** took the first DSBF division in 1:57.2, holding steadfast in a protracted duel with Wyatt Earp to win by a measured 1¼ lengths.

Pat Berry sent Shore Not Beach to an easy lead from post 4, and the pair rated soft early fractions of :30 and 1:00.2 before Wyatt Earp (Justin Irvine) began his first-over ascent from fourth and pressed into a narrow lead with five-sixteenths to go. The pair dueled through a :28.4 third quarter, and Shore Not Beach asserted to reclaim the lead just above the eighth pole before widening his advantage while under wraps. Badlands Boogie (Russell Foster) finished third, 6½ lengths in arrears.

Trainer Traci Berry's TLB Racing LLC owns Shore Not Beach, a Badlands Hanover—Azure Deo gelding bred by Odds On Nourrir with two wins from four career starts.

First-round DSBF competition continues Monday (Nov. 11) with a pair of \$20,000 divisions for 2-year-old trotting fillies programmed at the beginning of a 15-race card at Bally's Dover. First post is 4:30 p.m. (EST).

Leigh Fitch Memorial set for today at First Tracks Cumberland

First Tracks Cumberland will honor the iconic and daring Maine harness driver Leigh Fitch with a memorial race today (Nov. 9). The purse of \$7,592 reflects the dash win total of his storied career, with a large contingent of family and friends expected to be on hand to pay homage to Fitch who passed away on Oct. 26 at the age of 79.

Journalist Jay Burns wrote, "his daring, rail-hugging driving style propelled him to 7,592 victories and more than anyone's share of driving spills during a 53-year career. Fitch was one of the first great catch drivers in Maine, emerging a few years before Billy Parker, Jr.

"But speed and the front end were not what made Fitch famous in Maine. Instead, his style was iconoclastic, in keeping with his personality: independent, stubborn, and cagey. I didn't want to be like the others. I wanted to be myself. At a time when the perfect drive was the gentlemanly second-over trip described by Billy Haughton in the harness racing manual *Care and Training of the Trotter and Pacer*, Fitch's insurgent style disrupted that

model, gaining him the nickname 'The Fox.' Rarely flushed off the rail, Fitch instead was often a rail skimmer who mastered the art of anticipating the opening of a seam late in the mile, using athletic reflexes and exquisite timing to feed his horse open racetrack. Fitch once said that 'winning was life or death for me,' and his driving style, safe but daring, meant brushes with the latter. It was the era of the wooden hub rail, and any driver working the inside late in the mile needed steely nerves."

The Leigh Fitch Memorial, slated as race 8, features a group of top class of 'winners over' pacers who have collectively earned over \$1.17 million and three with sub-1:51 time badges. The early morning-line favorite is Hespoisedtopounce (3-2, Aaron Hall) who scores from post 5. Trained by Jimmy Nickerson for owners Tim Bojarski and Tony Gruppo, the 8-year-old son of Bettors Delight has two wins and eight checks in his last 10 starts.

Inside of the favorite is Vel Letsroll South (5-2, McGwire Sowers) who is trained by Autym Robinson for Mo Coo Inc., and enters the fray off a win in his last start. A horse who also warrants consideration is Denver Seelster (9-2, Nick Graffam) who leaves from pylon position for trainer Chris Dubois and owner Mary Fernald.

The presentation will be made by special guest Chaplain Lee Alphen from the Christian Harness Horsemen's Assoc.



Of course, the entire program has a lot of action for horse players with eight events boasting full seven or eight horse fields. The Pick 5 starts with the third race and has a \$605 carryover; our Pick 4 highlights the seventh, and our High-Five Pentafecta in the 10th and final race — all with a low 16 per cent takeout.

The action continues on Sunday (Nov. 10) with another 10-race card of full fields.

First Tracks Cumberland's Winter Festival extended pari-mutuel meeting enjoys weekend action throughout the month of November. Then, Cumberland Raceway will transition to three days of harness racing each week (Fri-Sat-Sun) beginning Dec. 6. The 19-day meet continues through Dec. 22, 2024, and post time is always 10:55 a.m.
