Great things building for Good off mixed sale kickoff

Eric Good parlayed his Hellabalou winnings into some significant stallion shares as the Standardbred Horse Sales

Company mixed sale began in earnest.




Eric Good's glamour boy colt caused quite a bit of hullabaloo through the 2021 Grand Circuit season. In a year of expected divisional standouts including Perfect Sting, Southwind Gendry and Summa Cum Laude, Good's appropriately named Sweet Lou colt Hellabalou sparked several shocks, first pulling a 70-1 upset in winning an elimination for the Meadowlands Pace and soon after winning the \$500,000 Adios Pace for the Orchids. He continued to prove himself a player on the stakes circuit through the tail of the season, giving Good a ride worth \$412,084 in purse earnings.

"Oh, it's been a great ride," said Good, who purchased Hellabalou for \$42,000 at the 2019 Harrisburg sale. "I loved Hellabalou since I bought him as a yearling. It's been very fun."

Good, all through the week at the Standardbred Horse Sale Company's (SHSC) annual sale, has been reinvesting off his good fortune. He purchased four pacing fillies through Lexington, a few more fillies through Harrisburg and – on Thursday (Nov. 11) – shelled some large cash during the stallion share section of the Mixed Sale.

"We're building a broodmare band for sure," Good said regarding his decision to purchase stallion shares. "I bought three yearlings – one Monday and two Tuesday – and [Richard] Nifty [Norman] is going to train them for us. I have a small farm in Maryland. We've got 50 acres and, at any given point, we could have 10 horses there; five broodmares and five yearlings. They are all Delaware [eligible]."



While he didn't pay the most for a stallion share on the day (that honor goes to Shaun Laungani, an agent for Diamond Creek Farm who paid \$142,000 for a stallion share to Chapter Seven), Good wrote three six-digit checks. He first won auction on Hip 982, a stallion share to Captaintreacherous, for \$100,000. As he was signing his ticket, Good maintained focus with the auctioneers to strike the winning bid of \$120,000 on

the following hip, a stallion share to Chapter Seven. Some time passed before Good acquired his final stallion share, a breeding interest in Muscle Hill, for \$100,000.

The stallion shares give Good the right to breed to the stallions he purchased an interest in through the life of the horse, giving him the option at future racing prospects or future sale ringers. All in all, Good's homerun with Hellabalou has given him the opportunity to build a full-scale operation.

"They'll be for sale in a couple of years," Good said of the future yearlings. "We might keep a couple. [But] our goal was to buy a bigger farm and start selling yearlings."

What A Knockout!

Through the morning on Thursday, auctions remained steady in terms of pace and overall price. Sales started to crescendo off the stallion shares and into the broodmare portion, highlighted in part by Herb Liverman's eight-mare dispersal. After the final one stepped into the ring, Hip 1097, a Donato Hanover mare named What A Knockout, initiated a bidding war.

Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky sat toward the middle aisle in the sale arena bidding on the mare for Hanover Shoe Farms. As the price climbed to \$590,000, the auctioneer pointed at Dr. Jablonsky for her next move. Appearing slightly hesitant to make another bid, Dr. Jablonsky committed and confidently nodded her head to signal a bid for \$595,000. She won the auction, and a round of applause broke in the arena.

Broodmare What A Knockout topped Thursday's mixed sale session by selling for \$595,000 to Hanover Shoe Farms from the Herb Liverman dispersal sold by Peninsula Farm.





"We went over a little bit by the number that we had," Dr. Jablonsky said on the price, "but, to me, she was the best in-foal mare in the sale by far. We've really wanted one from the Mission Brief family. She's a Donato mare and Donato's a great broodmare sire. She's got a fast record. She's in foal to the right horse. She's a great-looking mare. I mean, there wasn't a box that she didn't click. She's a true marquee mare."

What A Knockout, from a Chocolatier mare whose dam is a half-sister to broodmare Southwind Serena (dam of Mission Brief [3, 1:50.2f; \$1,599,517] and Tactical Landing [3, 1:50.2M; \$812,300]), is currently in foal to Muscle Hill. Dr. Jablonsky said she has not thought much about breeding the mare beyond this foal, but has options.

"Unfortunately, she can't go to Greenshoe because she's by Donato, but there's Walner, there's Chapter Seven," Dr. Jablonsky said. "I mean, there's so many good trotting stallion options and I think that's why the trotting mare market is so high now, because there's so many stallions you can breed them to and get your money back, if you get a nice yearling."

The Liverman dispersal helped give Peninsula Farms a big day as they led all consignments by average with an average sale of \$112,421 from 19 horses total.

"I was very pleased," said John Duer of the results from the dispersal. "I'm sad to see them go because we won't have him at the farm anymore, but I'm glad they sold well for the owner. It's a sellers' market right now and I guess if you're going to sell them, it's a good time to."

Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farms snagged the second-highest priced horse of the afternoon when purchasing Hip 1110, the Muscle Hill mare Jolie De Vie (in foal to Walner). At first, the auction looked ready to end at the \$200,000 mark with Stewart, but late and aggressive bidding made the final ding to Stewart's wallet \$425,000.

"I thought we were going to get her for a lot less," Stewart said. "We had originally thought around \$300,000 or so, but whatever. We'll divide her up with our usual groups.



"We're very excited. Any time you can buy a mare like that. We always like to buy something that's happening in the family. We bought another one for \$100,000 earlier and it was the same thing – a lot going on with the family. That usually bodes well for us. A lot of times people will buy horses a lot for what has happened in the past, which is fine, but, to us, we like current success... or action, I quess you might call it."

Jolie De Vie has produced three foals in her breeding career, including the Walner filly Lilbitalexis (2,1:52.2M; \$173,362), who was one of the favorites in the Breeders Crown 2-year-old filly trot. She'll join a pair of mares also heading to Hunterton purchased by one of the farm's clients, Jean-Pierre Barjon: Hip 1106, the Father Patrick mare Graceful Lady (the third session topper at \$360,000 and the dam of 2014 Hambletonian Oaks winner Lifetime Pursuit); and Hip 1093, the champion Glidemaster mare Maven (bringing the fourth-highest price at \$285,000). Barjon won the auction on both the mares from the internet.

Big numbers get bigger

The 2021 Black Book Sale continues to top 2020's numbers. Although comparing Mixed Sale figures can vary heavily on the stock being sold, 2021 nonetheless posted a single-day gross of \$13,367,000 from 298 sales, beating the opening day of the Mixed Sale in 2020 which grossed \$6,567,000 from 275 sales (an increase of 103.5 per cent). The average over 2020 is also up strongly to \$44,856 from \$23,880 (up 87.8 per cent). But 2021 even beat the first day of the 2019 Mixed Sale, which also included the dispersal of White Birch Farm's broodmare band – featuring prominent names such as Darlinonthebeach, Darlin's Delight, Fancy Filly, etc. With the White Birch dispersal, 2019 grossed \$12,459,000 (increased 7.3 per cent) for an average of \$37,869 (increased 18.5 per cent) from 329 sales.

Cumulatively, 2021 far exceeds 2020 with a gross of \$55,832,500 compared to last year's gross through Day 4 of \$36,107,000 (up 54.6 per cent). The current gross also tops 2019's record of \$53,265,000 (increased 4.8 per cent).

"It was a great day again," said Dale Welk, president and director of operations for SHSC. "The sale is staying strong. Overall, I think it's great for the industry, I really do. It's great for the sellers, of course, and the consignors.

"I think overall it shows in the industry that people want to be here. We're strong and we're going to stay strong. I think tomorrow is going to come back just as good or better."

The day was also strong for Preferred Equine, which led the first mixed session by a wide margin with \$4,944,000 in sales for an average of \$43,752 on the day through 113 horses. At the end of the sales session, the Preferred stable hands and employees arranged into three tiers while a photographer climbed his step-ladder to capture a group picture with just one day left in Harrisburg.

"It takes a lot of effort," Preferred Equine president Dave Reid said of getting through the sale, "but we're very fortunate that we try to have a good team of people here, year in and year out, and try to service our clients and service the public as well.

Maven sold for \$285,000 to the session's leading buyer, Jean-Pierre Barjon of France, from the Peninsula Farm consignment.

"The market was strong – pacers, trotters, stallion shares. The in-foal mares, I thought sold well. I haven't analyzed it, but it felt pretty good up here. It was good to see European participation. I saw a couple of my old friends from Europe and they were able to make it over here. I think it's onward and upward for tomorrow, starting off with the race mares and then going into the racehorses. I expect a good market tomorrow, for sure."

Today (Nov. 12) concludes the Black Book Sale with a day of purely racehorses going through the ring, over 200 in total beginning at 10 a.m. Preferred is again slated to have a busy day, consigning a large amount of the racehorses entered including horses of high earnings, high prestige and rich pedigree.

"We've got Sandbetweenmytoes. We've got a sister to Rocknificent, a race filly. We probably have seven or 10 deep over here with the race mares," Reid said. "Then, obviously the racehorses. We've got Mon Amour, who is racing [Thursday] in the Matron [finished 8th]. There's a horse that's in-to-go in the Kindergarten Series on Saturday night (Nov. 13), so we've got a lot of interesting prospects. It's really deep and there's something for everybody, for all jurisdictions, for all sized tracks. I'm really looking forward to it. The race fillies really look the part. They have deep pedigrees and they are good individuals, so I look forward to selling those as well."

Heavily-favored **Bella Bellini** (Dexter Dunn) cruised to a six-length, 1:52.2 victory in the \$148,550 Matron Stake for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Thursday (Nov. 11) at Dover Downs.

Moni for Lindy and You Ato Dream tangled early, and set fractions of :27.3, :56 and 123.4.

Dunn waited patiently in fourth position then moved to the outside at the 5/8 marker and powered past the field to win

Bella Bellini (Bar Hopping—Bella Dolce) is a homebred owned by David H. McDuffee of Delray Beach, FL and trained by Nifty Norman. She paid \$2.40 for the win.

The win was the 11th of the season in 18 attempts for Bella Bellini.

You Ato Dream finished second for trainer and driver Jeff Gregory. Iteration finished third for driver Brian Sears and trainer Marcus Melander.

Bella Bellini is now 11-6-0 in 18 starts this year and has earned \$1,095,738 lifetime, all but \$4,398 of it in 2021.

Swingforthefences was bred by Concord Stud.

Top-ranked Test Of Faith wins

Test Of Faith, the #1 horse in the Hambletonian Society / Breeders Crown poll, did nothing to hurt her top ranking when she won the \$129,000 Matron for 3-year-old pacing fillies by a half-length over Blue Diamond Eyes (Gingras) in 1:49.1. Scarlett Hanover (Tetrick) was third.

David Miller drover the daughter of Art Major—Cannae Cammie to victory for trainer Brett Pelling and owners Melvin Segal, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Eddie Gran.

The win improved Test Of Faith's 2021 record to 14-2-0 in 16 starts and her career record to 22-3-0 in 25 starts. She has earned \$1,069,739 this year and \$1,569,739 lifetime.

Test Of Faith was bred by Fred Hertrich III of All American.

Charlie May tops in 3yocp Matron

Favorite Charlie May (Brett Miller) went wire-to-wire to win the \$165,750 Matron for sophomore pacing colts by a neck over Lou's Pearlman (Gingras) in 1:49.2.

The win improved Don Tiger's homebred gelding to 10-6-0 in 20 starts in 2021. Charlie May (McArdle—Stipple Hanover) has earned \$839,400 this year and \$1,168,027 lifetime under the tutelage of Steve Carter.

Abuckabett Hanover (Andrew McCarthy) was third.

Areas where the Breeders Crown can learn from the Breeders' Cup

Two weeks ago, the Breeders Crown was conducted at the Meadowlands and by relative industry standards, the two-day event conducted over Friday and Saturday was successful. There were plenty of feel-good story stories amongst the 12 divisional winners and handle easily surpassed numbers from all recent Breeders Crowns, the latter accomplished despite a late September announcement which changed Saturday's races from

night to the afternoon.

With that said, there's still much left to be desired. In stark contrast to the prior week's Breeders Crown, the thoroughbreds competed in the Breeders' Cup World Championships this past Friday and Saturday. Different industries of different magnitudes for sure, but the Breeders' Cup event offered glimpses into what harness racing can – and should – strive to be. Here are some of those key areas.

Wagering: \$182,908,309 was the two-day handle for the Breeders' Cup conducted at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club in California. That's an astonishingly high figure that was good enough for the all-time Breeders' Cup handle and puts into perspective the popularity difference in the industries when compared to the two-day Breeders Crown handle at the Meadowlands of \$7,372,476.

The interesting thing is that it's really in the wagering where you see by far, the widest disparity between the two breeds. Many other metrics are somewhat comparable. For example, the average yearling price from the yearling portion of the Harrisburg sale this week was \$54,653. The September Keeneland Sale – essentially the thoroughbred equivalent sale – the average yearling price was \$131,737. Yes, the thoroughbred yearlings averaged almost twice the amount of the standardbred yearlings, but that's nothing like the 26 times increase in wagering. Even from an earnings potential, an ordinary thoroughbred won't earn an amount dramatically different from a typical



harness horse. So, why the massive difference in wagering?

From a wagering standpoint, appeal in the Breeders Cup' is that there's almost always the possibility of a life changing score. This year, the Pick-6 concluding with the Breeders' Cup Classic, paid \$513,085, over a half-million dollars. And that's not an uncommon payout either; there've been multiple instances over the year's where the Pick-6 has paid out well more than \$1 million. Harness racing can't compete with that, but at least an effort could be made.

As I wrote a couple of weeks ago, there was no concerted effort made in the Breeders Crown to incentivize handle. Nothing unique or special whatsoever was made in the way of guarantees in the Pick-x races; all standard guarantees that you'd see any other day of the year applied. The Breeders' Cup doesn't need to bother with pool guarantees, because there's already an implied guarantee that if you win these horizontal wagers, you're going to win a ton of money. But it seemed odd that more wasn't done to promote wagering in the Breeders Crown. A more aggressive (even still safe) quarantee might have helped move the needle on handle. Or better yet, instead of a never-in-doubt \$50,000 guarantee, why not seed the pool with \$50,000 in free money. Who knows, maybe the handle would have increased an additional few hundred thousand by doing so. I know that wagering is often overlooked, but a Breeders Crown that generates more interest in wagering will generate more interest overall.

Attendance: Despite all-time handle records at the Breeders' Cup, attendance of over 47,000 at Del Mar was down over 30 per cent from the other time they hosted the event in 2017. It shows that onsite attendance isn't everything, especially today, but the optics of lack of attendance at the Breeders Crown is a killer. And I say that as an enthusiast who would love nothing more than there to be large crowds to accompany the Breeders Crown races.

Video taken from the apron from Friday night's 2-year-old Breeders Crown races showed no people. Even if you toss that entirely due to the inclement weather, the visuals from Saturday – a dry and pleasant fall afternoon – were only marginally better. I wasn't there in person (hypocritical of me, I suppose), but photos circulating on social media throughout that day showed attendance to be sparse. What's the reason for that?

I'm sure for an owner or for the connections to a winning horse it's all the same, but in sports, crowds are synonymous with excitement. The Breeders Crown conducted in front of limited fans had the same effect that sports had last year when playing in empty arenas. It's just not the same. Now, there were a far more respectable number of fans at this year's Hambletonian at the Meadowlands, so maybe it had to do with the time of year where people are more likely to come to the track on a summer afternoon than a colder one. But whatever the case, horsepeople racing against each other for millions of dollars in purses but not many others there to see it in person takes away from the excitement. The screaming and roar of the crowd should be something that adds a thrill to the Breeders Crown,

just as it does with the Breeders' Cup.

International competition: By the end of October in harness racing, many divisions have seen the same horses go against each other since May. The Breeders Crown just reflects the latest go-around of the same groups of horse's week in and week out that are racing against each other for the ninth time this year. What could add a different element to the Breeders Crown races is to make it more of a "world championship," just like the Breeders' Cup.

What makes the Yonkers International Trot the race that it is, is the international composition. Having trotters most recently in 2019 from the U.S., France, Sweden, Norway, Italy, and other countries compete against each other is always compelling. It generates a ton of buzz, both domestically and internationally. There's always fascinating backgrounds whenever international horses come here, and it changes up the typical landscape. Ecurie D was an international winner this year and Bold Eagle attracted huge attention leading up to his Breeders Crown win in 2019.

Yes, the Breeders Crown has long made a concerted effort to try to attract European horses, but perhaps there's something to be learned from the thoroughbreds on how and why their horses seem to travel the globe more easily to compete in stakes races.

Enticing growing numbers of international Breeders Crown entrants in future years would make it a worldwide event, increase race drama, and, hopefully, worldwide handle.

Innovation: The Breeders Crown should be used as races to show off the latest in in-race technology. In the Breeders' Cup, one of the most viral videos was that of a jockey cam from a turf race where a horse weaved through traffic in the stretch to find narrow holes and win. Harness racing does have some neat features including a Mic'd Up segment that Woodbine Mohawk does (and the Meadowlands is now adopting) where drivers commentate during their races, but these are videos often played back at later dates. Having something to immediately show following the completion of the race from never-before-seen angles would enhance the viewing experience in the sports biggest days such as the Breeders Crown.

Tradition: This last one may be more of a personal pet peeve than anything, but it's confusing when in the Breeders Crown and other select stakes races when drivers wear the colors of a small group of owners, many of which have thoroughbred interests where that practice is universal. I know the argument that as an owner it should be their prerogative to have a driver wear their colors like they do in thoroughbreds, but in harness racing you follow the races by the drivers and their colors, and it's that much harder to do when colors are changed in stakes races on days like the Breeders Crown.





The Wright stuff

What does it take to hit the Kindergarten-Goldsmith Maid double?

Caretaker Vicki Wright apparently knows the answer. She pulled off the 2-year-old trotting filly stakes sweep at The Meadowlands in 2019 with Senorita Rita and 2020 with Anoka Hanover.

Whereas it might be rare to care for back-to-back winners of these two stakes, what Wright did stands out even more since she did it for two different trainers. Wright had been working for trainer Noel Daley for about 10 years when he temporarily moved back to Australia in late 2018. Wright, now in her fourth decade in the game, had previously worked for several different trainers, including Hall of Famer Linda Toscano, around the start of this millennium.

"[Vicki and I] have been friends for years and years and years," said Toscano. "So, when Noel was going home, I think she was a little bit worried because she wanted to make sure that she got into a situation where she would be comfortable. So, Vicki came to work for me and the only thing she told me was she wanted trotting fillies. She would deal with pacing fillies if she had to, but she didn't want any males, she only wanted females.

"I have a tendency to train a lot of fillies to begin with because that's what I always have. So, we were buying the horses and Senorita Rita came in the barn. She basically helped put the first harness on her for the most part."

As much as Wright enjoyed working for Toscano, once Daley came back to the States after less than a year Down Under, she knew where she needed to be.

"As soon as [Noel] came home, she was so funny," said Toscano. "I could see she was starting to get quieter and quieter and finally I realized what it was. And I said to her, 'I'm assuming you're going back to Noel.' And she was like, 'I didn't know what to do, but I just feel like I have to go home.' And I said, 'Of course you do."

Just like Toscano, Daley attempts to give Wright fillies every year.

"It's a crap shoot trying to give someone the best one, it never seems to work out," said Daley. "She gets a kick out of Anoka being good. To do it back-to-back years is pretty cool.

"She's had a series of good horses over the years. She worked for Freddie Grant and looked after Cambest."

At 66, Wright is no longer interested in trying to out muscle colts and instead prefers to reason with fillies. She doesn't know when or where the affinity for trotting fillies started, since she primarily took care of pacers in the past, including Dan Patch champ Darlin's Delight, but they're certainly what she prefers now

"I like them because they're like me," said Wright. "I can relate to the bitchyness. I admire a good bitchy filly that wants to try. Trotting fillies can be a little more volatile so you have to blend with them and see what works for them. With fillies, we can have a meeting and figure out who's going to come out where."

When it comes to performing on the track and winning those back-to-back stakes, Wright can see similarities in Senorita Rita and Anoka Hanover as far as their temperament and work ethic.

"Rita was probably one of the nicest, sweetest, most professional horses that I've taken care of," said Wright. "She's on my top 10 list for sure, but Rita had some soundness issues that we were constantly dealing with.

"Anoka is extremely professional. Very smart. I think having a smart horse helps. One that will listen to you and trust you. We've got to keep the horse happy and the trainer happy."

Just like her fillies, professional is a good word to describe Wright, who prefers to be one of the first to arrive at the barn. Unfortunately, since it's still dark at that time, it can have a downside. Last week, she accidentally tripped over a piece of wood and broke her nose. She would end up needing four stitches in her nose, but as the blood was still gushing, she just asked another caretaker for a towel because she had to get a filly turned out and a stall done.

In addition to working for Daley, Wright is also the track photographer at Freehold Raceway. She has taken pictures – initially as a hobby – for as long as she's been in the business, and as a caretaker, understands how important a photo of your horse can be.

Anoka Hanover didn't win the Breeders Crown this year, but Adam Strom took a picture of the filly warming up that he gave to Wright. It meant a lot to her and it's the kind of thing she tries to do for others.



"I like to do it for the other grooms, because there are 10 horses in the race and nine of them aren't going to get anything," said Wright. "And they may want a picture of their horse on that particular day."

One of Wright's photos that has gotten a great response on Facebook was of trainer Marie Ortolan Bar hugging driver Lucas Wallin after losing the Hambletonian with Cuatro De Julio.

"I knew when he came back with that horse and I saw her walking towards him that something was going on," said Wright. "The way Cuatro just stood there like a perfect statue and you could see the look on Lucas' face when she went to hug him, that's everything. That's the whole story right there."

When Wright is taking these photos, either because she's employed to do so, or just because she thinks a friend might want that memory, she does it with the same care that uses for her horses.

"She loves taking pictures," said Toscano. "That's a labor of love, too. She loves everything about the business. She's just good people. She's incredibly dedicated. They are your eyes and your ears and she very well fits that description. She's been doing it a long time and still likes it. That says a lot."

The Kindergarten Classic Series Finals are on Saturday (Nov. 13) and the Goldsmith Maid is the following Saturday (Nov. 20).

Crown champ Niki Hill tops Kindergarten contenders

Niki Hill returns to action Saturday (Nov. 13) in the \$220,110 Kindergarten Classic Series championship for 2-year-old female pacers at The Meadowlands, two weeks after her dominant triumph under adverse conditions in the Breeders Crown.

The Chris Ryder trainee won the Breeders Crown for 2-yearold filly pacers by 4-3/4 lengths in 1:51 on Oct. 29 at the Big M, missing the stakes record by only three-fifths of a second despite heavy rain and strong wind. Her time over the sloppy track was the fastest of any race on the card.

"It was a statement from start to finish," Ryder said after the performance. "I was super proud of her."

The Meadowlands plays host to four Kindergarten championships for 2-year-old pacers and trotters on Saturday's 13-race card, which begins at 6:20 p.m. (EST).

Niki Hill, a daughter of Always B Miki out of Road Bet, has won seven of eight races this year and earned \$628,314 for owner Tom Hill. She is ranked No. 4 among all horses in North America in the current Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown Top 10. Her only loss was a second-place finish in her Breeders Crown elimination.

"We had a little bit of a hiccup — she tied up a little bit, had a few minor issues," Ryder said. "She was herself (in the Breeders Crown final)."

Niki Hill is the 7-5 morning-line favorite in her Kindergarten final. The 4-1 second choice, Treacherous Dragon, won a Kindergarten leg last week. She finished third in the Breeders Crown. For the year, Treacherous Dragon has won four of eight races and \$161,491 for owner Hot Lead Farm.

"She's big and strong, but she is very smart about her trade," trainer Brett Pelling said about the daughter of Captaintreacherous—My Little Dragon. "She's absolutely push-button. I don't think she is any faster than some of them, or any stronger, but she's the full package.

"Her whole season was weighted toward the end. In the beginning, we recognized that she was a very growthy filly. She was quite tall, and you knew she was going to fill out, so we aimed for all the stuff in the fall."

Pelling will send out the 5-2 morning-line choice in Saturday's \$238,700 Kindergarten championship for 2-year-old male pacers, Hammering Hank. The gelding, by Captaintreacherous out of History Repeats, has won seven of nine races and \$125,300 for owners 3 Brothers Stables, Pelling Racing, and Rojan Stables.

Hammering Hank, who finished a fast-closing fourth in the Breeders Crown, also enters his Kindergarten final off a win in the last preliminary round a week ago.

"He's got high speed," Pelling said. "He's shown that in all his races. And he likes to bear down on horses."

Fast As The Wind is the 5-2 favorite in the \$300,960 Kindergarten final for 2-year-old male trotters. He won a preliminary round of the series last week and finished second from post 10 in the Breeders Crown final. Overall, he has won three of 13 races and \$216,813 for owners LeBlanc and Kribbs, Joe Sbrocco, John Schmucker, and Fodera Barbera Frank.

The colt, a son of Cantab Hall—Wind Stroll, won his first two races and finished third in the Peter Haughton Memorial before heading to Lexington's Red Mile, where he battled sickness.

"At the beginning of the year, before we went to Lexington, we thought he was going to be a top colt," trainer Tony Alagna said after the horse ended a streak of off-the-board finishes with a third in his Breeders Crown elimination. "We got him home and his liver enzymes were through the roof. We've been working hard on that, and (in the Breeders Crown) he was back to more what he felt like early in the year. I'm really happy with that."

In the \$294,580 Kindergarten final for 2-year-old female trotters, Lilbitalexis is the 5-2 morning-line favorite. The filly, by Walner out of Jolie De Vie, has won seven of 10 races and \$173,362 for owners Pinske Stables and David Hoese. She won a Breeders Crown elimination and finished fifth in the final for trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman.

Allywag Hanover headlines Sunday's \$100,000 Potomac Pace

Allywag Hanover will headline Sunday's \$100,000 Potomac Pace at Rosecroft Raceway, seeking to rebound from an unlucky and potentially costly loss in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown open pace.

The Brett Pelling-trained 4-year-old son of Captaintreacherous had been in the running for the 2021 Horse of the Year title with a string of five straight victories, only to finish third at the Meadowlands Oct. 30, beaten by only a neck after setting a blistering pace.

"He's definitely a candidate for Aged Pacer of the Year. If he won the Breeders Crown, he would have been a candidate for Horse of the Year. His stablemate Test of Faith, she just keeps winning. The places don't usually reverse until someone loses," said Pelling, who also trains Test of Faith, the winner of 21 of 24 career races, including the Breeders Crown pace for 3-year-old fillies. "He had his chance, but he didn't pull it off – that's the bottom line. But he's a strong candidate for Aged Pacer of the Year."

Allywag Hanover was favored at 2-5 for the Breeders Crown, in which he was parked outside Ocean Rock during a first quarter of a mile in 25 4/5 seconds. He went on to set the pace into deep stretch before faltering and being overtaken by winner Ocean Rock and nosed-out for second by Cattlewash.

"He had an outside draw and he paid for it. He was basically the one doing all the work on the outside in a 25-second [first] quarter. They pay for it, but he hung in there, also. He raced great," Pelling said.

Allywag Hanover prepped for the Breeders Crown with an open pace victory at the Red Mile, where he equaled the world record for gelding pacers with a mile clocking in 1:46.4, capping a five-race winning streak. He had previously been victories in the Sam McKee Memorial at the Meadowlands, and the Always B Mikki Invitational at Pocono, as well as back-to-back wins at Woodbine Mohawk in the Canadian Derby and Gold Cup.

"I can't really fault any of his races this year. It's not easy to win – that's the bottom line – especially while you're racing at that level," said Pelling. "He did develop a new dimension where they realized how much gate speed he has. If he's developed a new little coat to his armor, it's just sheer gate speed. Speed is everything these days."

Todd McCarthy, an Australian horseman who has driven 432 winners in his first two years of action in the U.S., will drive Allywag Hanover Sunday.

Allywag Hanover, who drew the rail post, will be challenged by seven pacers, including Ron Burke-trained This is The Plan, who finished ninth in the Breeders Crown after finishing second behind the Pelling trainee in his world record-equaling performance at The Red Mile.

In June at Northfield Park, This is The Plan, fifth in last year's Potomac, set his own world record while winning the \$200,000 Battle of Fort Erie in 1:47.3, the fastest clocking ever recorded on a half-mile track.

Yannick Gingras, who was in the sulky, has the driving assignment for the Potomac Pace.

Leonidas A is scheduled to line up behind the mobile starting gate for an attempt to score a repeat victory in the Potomac Pace. The Sheena Cohen-trained 6-year-old gelding scored a 15-1 upset victory in last year's race, closing with a rush to defeat heavily favored Bettor's Wish by three-quarters of a length.

Leonidas A, who has won nine of 19 starts this year, will once again be driven by Austin Siegelman.

Like Leonidas A, Enavant would be expected to benefit from a hotly contested early pace. The Luc Blais-trained 5-year-old gelding is coming off a late-closing fourth-place finish in the Breeders Crown, a length behind Allywag Hanover. The son of Somebeachsomewhere had previously finished second behind Allywag Hanover in the Sept. 18 Gold Cup at Mohawk Woodbine.

Daniel Dube, who drove Keystone Velocity for a Potomac Pace win in 2017, will drive Enavant.

Nicholas Beach, who finished eighth in the Breeders Crown last time out, has twice finished second behind Ocean Rock this year in the Dayton Derby Grand Circuit Stake and the Jim Ewart Memorial at Scioto Downs. The Jennifer Bongiorno-trained 5-year-old gelding finished three-quarters of a length ahead of third-race finisher This is The Plan in the Dayton Derby.

Joe Bongiorno will drive the son of Somebeachsomewhere in the Potomac Pace.

Jack's Legend N. will bring a three-race winning streak into the Potomac Pace. The Josh Green-trained 7-year-old gelding has won 28 of 82 career starts, including a 5 ½-length score at Dover Downs last time out.

Dexter Dunn returns to the sulky Sunday.

Nandolo N enters the Potomac Pace off an Open victory over Leonidas A at Yonkers. The Shane Tritton-trained 7-year-old gelding has won six races and finished at least second nine times in 18 starts in the U.S. since being imported from New Zealand.

Jason Bartlett has the drive behind the son of Betterthancheddar.

Mayhem Hanover, who won two of his last three starts at

Woodbine Mohawk before finishing sixth in a Meadowlands winners-over conditioned pace, rounds out the field.

Tim Tetrick has the drive behind the Jeff Cullipher-trained 4-year-old son of Sportswriter.

Freshmen set for sevenfigure Saturday in Big M's Kindergarten

Long-time Meadowlands fans might be feeling a bit nostalgic this weekend about a time long ago when the track hosted a handful of stakes races for 2-year-olds and called the event "Million-Dollar Babies."

On Saturday (Nov. 13) night, the Kindergarten Classic Series Finals for freshmen of each sex and gait will bring back memories – and huge money – as the 13-race program will be highlighted by the four dashes that will go for purses totaling \$1,054,350.

The biggest star of the night will attempt to keep shining in the ninth race filly pace, which sports a purse of \$220,110. The horse to beat is the Chris Ryder-trained Niki Hill, whose last start resulted in a dominant win in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown.

Brett Pelling student Hammering Hank, off a big win in the final Kindergarten leg a week ago, tops the 11th race \$238,700 colts and geldings pace. He's lost only twice in his nine-race career, both times to Breeders Crown champion Monte Miki.

Pretender and Fast As The Wind are both off final-leg victories heading into what appears to be a wide-open \$300,960 colts and geldings trot in race five while Palermo Hanover and Misswalner Fashion, also both off final-leg scores, are the ones to watch in the seventh race \$294,580 filly trot.

The season-ending scrum for resume-boosting victories will then continue next week (Nov. 20) at The Big M on "Fall Final Four/TVG Finals Night" when many divisional honors and, quite possibly, Horse of the Year will be decided on the final circle-worthy date of 2021 on the harness racing calendar.

That evening, there will be four events for 2-year-olds and four for 3-year-olds and up, with estimated purses in excess of \$2.5 million.
