Usefulness of passing lane shown in Breeders Crown

This year's event at Harrah's Hoosier Park showed the passing lane has a place on any size track.

When it comes to the never-ending debate of what role a passing lane should play in harness racing, the discussion relates primarily to the smaller sized tracks. There's generally a consensus that the larger a track is, the lesser the need is for a passing lane. With that in mind, comes the unpopular opinion that this year's Breeders Crown showed the passing lane has a place on any size track.

At Harrah's Hoosier Park, a seven-eighths mile track, the passing lane was pivotal – though not exclusive – in determining how a number of Breeders Crown races were won.

In short, the argument against a passing lane goes something like this: If drivers know they can race on the inside and wait for a passing lane, they'll be less aggressive and it leads to more boring and predictable races. It disincentivizes movement in a race, especially on tracks where it can be disadvantageous to race on the outside. But, in this year's Breeders Crown it seems like almost just the opposite happened. Many races had decent flow to it, and race after race yielded memorable finishes.

Let's start with the biggest upset in Breeders Crown history. In the 3-year-old colt pace, the exhilarating stretch run that saw horses come from everywhere to try to take down Tall Dark Stranger would have likely looked different in a stretch without a passing lane. Cattlewash had the most immediate inside shot at Tall Dark

Stranger off a pocket trip, but there were two additional horses taking runs up the inside. For all of the commentary that makes it seem like wins for pocket-sitting horses with a passing lane is a piece of cake, Cattlewash had nearly the entire stretch to pass on the inside and couldn't get by. Rather, it was a 200-1 outsider that swept widest of all for the win.

Similarly, in the open mares pace, Shartin N was allowed most of the stretch through the passing lane to get by Kissin In The Sand and wasn't able to get on terms with that leader. Sometimes it works out when horses can parlay a passing lane trip to a win and sometimes it doesn't work out. There were a number of other Breeders Crown winners, including Amigo Volo, Fire Start Hanover and Gimpanzee, as examples, that were able to take leads into stretch and win, despite their competitors having additional avenues to race by, if good enough. It continues to disprove the fallacy that any dime-a-dozen horse can sit a pocket trip and win if there's a passing lane.

Sure, sometimes a lesser deserving horse can luck into a passing lane trip and win, but more often than not it's deserving horses that are able to work out passing lane trips and capitalize on them. Even on a seven-eighths mile track, they should be afforded that opportunity. Examples from the Breeders Crown were plenty.

If not for the Hoosier passing lane, Peaky Sneaky may have not had the chance to get by Party Girl Hill. In that race, Peaky Sneaky was used to the front, strung out Party Girl Hill when yielding, and then was resurgent once the passing lane was available in the stretch. With Lyon's Sentinel coming on too, can anyone say that wasn't an exciting finish or that Peaky Sneaky wasn't deserving?

How about the finish in the 3-year-old filly trot event? On the surface it might look like Next Level Stuff was a quintessential lucky horse that won because she drew the rail and then just waited for the passing lane, but that would be cheating her. In that race, it was actually Sorella that got the pocket trip and once Next Level Stuff got the inside opening she had to out-sprint not just the race leader but also the pocket-sitting Sorella who had the length head start. The point is that in both these cases horses won not solely because of a passing lane, but because they were given a chance to race when they needed to.

In a couple of races, horses that won up the passing lane did so after having to re-rally against outside horses who had already had the jump on them, or had to rely on longshot leaders carrying them far enough until the open stretch became available. Racing on the inside isn't always an open invitation that guarantees being able to reach the passing lane before it's too late.

It was the same thing with evenly split results in the 2-year-old Breeders Crowns where two races (both trots) were won by horses utilizing the passing lane. On the pacing side, one race was held by the filly that led into the stretch and the other race was a dead heat between a horse on the lead and a horse from well off the pace. Just from the standpoint of excitement, what's not to like of close finish after close finish?

A passing lane on a track such as Hoosier may seem unconventional, but it's not a first. Balmoral Park was a one-mile track with a passing lane and I don't recall much controversy over whether or not a mile track should have a passing lane. In fact, handle used to be quite decent there in its heyday.

Even if you were to compare the flow of a race at Hoosier to that of Woodbine Mohawk Park or the Meadowlands, is there really that much of a difference despite the fact that Hoosier has a passing lane? One thing I will concede at Hoosier is that the outside horses generally do have a more difficult time than the inside horses. In so many of the Breeders Crown eliminations the week prior, race after race saw the outside group of horses fizzle in the stretch while ground-saving horses shot through for wins. But again, I see the same thing all the time at Harrah's Philadelphia where if the outside flow of horses can't reach the leader with any momentum by the top of the stretch, it becomes that much more difficult to kick off cover and gain any ground. That's just the nature of harness racing.

The Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park proved that there can be high quality racing on a track with both a long stretch and a passing lane. It comes down to giving horses the chance to win if good enough. What more could you ask for?

Disparities between our game and the runners never more apparent

Tidbits: The difference in financial power between our industry and the thoroughbreds was never more evident than displayed in the sales and dealings last week.

Sister Sledge and Guinevere Hall, both very nice trotting fillies, changed hands in the low three figure range. Sister Sledge was exported to Sweden by Robert Lindstrom, a very astute horseman, and Guinevere was sold privately by Martinez Bloodstock.

On the other side of the street, Monomoy Girl and Got Stormy two fancy thoroughbred girls brought \$9,500,000 and \$2,750,000, respectively.

Two absolutely top 3-year-olds were also retired almost simultaneously.

Authentic, owned in part by Spendthrift Farm, will start stud service there in 2021 for a fee of \$75,000.

Tall Dark Stranger, to this writer one of the most impressive stakes colts I have ever seen, will retire to Hanover Shoe Farm at a fee of \$20,000.

I am not saying the disparity is wrong but it definitely seems out of whack with the potential return on investment (ROI). Which, once again, points out how much better your chances are of making money in our business than the runners.

True, you hit a home run in the thoroughbred sport and you may be set for life. That said, buying a lottery ticket may be easier.

I am not big on statistics. For my part they are a total waste of time and effort. The best is the best and who cares by how much. Some of the greatest horses always won by very little. Captaintreacherous and Tall Dark Stranger come immediately to mind. That said, something struck me as

interesting this morning while looking at the USTA website. Dexter Dunn is the leading money winning driver in 2020 after coming to our shores just a short while ago. That is amazing enough. But that's not all. Tim Tetrick the second leading money winner is \$1,100,000 behind and he has had about 425 more drives. There is still a month and a half to go. Stay tuned.

Bob Baffert keeps rolling. Gamine and Authentic were awesome in their respective Breeders' Cup events. When asked about the positives, that I will reiterate were sheer nonsense, I could tell he was annoyed but didn't dodge the questions at all.

I don't understand the reasoning of bringing attention to a negative on a nationally-televised event with a huge worldwide audience. Sadly, it has become evident that the new normal is to knock the winners no matter what the cost.

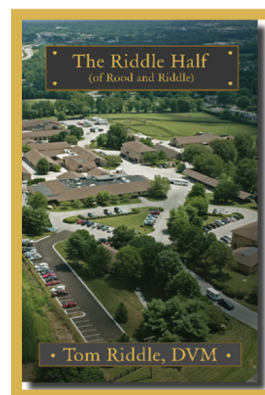

night that year and also at a different racetrack. My friend Gordon Waterstone points out that I was second in the older trot Crown at Mohawk with Charlie Ten Hitch.

For an older fellow that has trouble remembering a lot these days, that would have been a real stretch expecting me to remember those details. That was almost 30 years ago, and in my own defense the Mohawk race was Oct. 9 and the Pompano races were on Oct. 23.

Howard Shultz asks: Have you heard anything about any new indictments or have any update on what's going on in the drug investigation?

As I said a few weeks ago, I have heard from a very substantial source that there were many more indictments on the way. The virus has obviously stalled the court dates so the where and when is impossible to forecast.

There was however a update last week when the owner of Tailor Made Compounding, (not to be confused with the famous Taylor Made thoroughbred operation) Jeremy Delk, plead guilty to federal charges of illegal drug distribution. This was made clear in a press release from the U.S. Attorney's office of the Eastern District of Kentucky. The drugs were designed to mimic the effects of anabolic steroids. The pharmacy will be forced to forfeit the proceeds from sales of the illegal drugs to the tune of nearly \$2 million.

Delk faces up to 10 years in prison and up to \$250,000 in fines.

There have been many visible ties between Tailor Made and MediVet, the company that produced the drugs Jason Servis was accused of using in the earlier indictments.

There is truly a plethora of possibilities involving the ongoing FBI investigation. Not the least of which is the possibility of the formation of a choir made up of many indictees.



Richard Holloway asks: I remember seeing you at Monticello Raceway in the '60s in the old fashion long belted colors. How did you end up with the brown and white Captain America motif?

In those early days, the powers that be were much more strict as to colors being proper than they were in later years. If you applied for colors, the lady in charge would redesign them as well as add or delete a color to insure you didn't look like another driver on the track. My color card, as received from the USTA, was orange, white and brown. I looked something like a burnt creamsicle.

In the mid-'60s, there was a massive change from the no style belted colors to what was called the Eisenhower jacket that a few years later with white pants attached became today's driving suit.

My good friend Mike Metcalf R.I.P. knew how much I hated my colors and gave me a 30th birthday card and a gift. The card read you are 5'11" 220 with no future as a driver. No one cares what a trainer wears. Happy Birthday. In the box was a knit Eisenhower jacket with the Captain America design in brown and white, just like Mike's colors were in red, white and blue.

Mitch Myrin first points out the quality of the horses and drivers at the Red Mile Grand Circuit meet are so superior to the norm but the handle is never commensurate with the product. He then asks, why don't they have the sales during the day and the racing at night?

In the scheme of things, the bottom line on the sales has more impact on the purses than the racetrack handle.

Just like our neighbors across town (Keeneland) the sales company's profits go a long way to helping out the purses. The situation at the Red Mile is very similar on a smaller scale.

It's not that the handle is unimportant, but prime time for the sale takes precedence.

Please take note that in previous years they have had the first week of Grand Circuit at night when the sales fell on the second week. I personally don't know the figures but few people I know are better with numbers than the management of the Red Mile and I am sure if it was in there best interest they would have left it that way. The change to all daytime was a calculated choice.

Another thing you must take into your understanding is the fact that night racing does not produce the records that day racing does and that would lessen the attraction of shipping questionable horses to Kentucky.

Tom Santoro asks: What is your take on Lasix? Is it more effective in the winter or the summer? Would you consider it a performance enhancer?

Lasix (Furosemide) is a human drug that relieves the body of excess fluids, swelling in the abdomen and extremities. It is not a stimulant or a sedative. It is mainly prescribed for patients with high blood pressure.

I have been on Lasix for many years and find its diuretic value amazing. Aside from have totally normal blood pressure, it removes all the bloat from my body.

After reading my previous comments, one may think that it is not a performance enhancing drug. On the face of it you would be correct. However, as a result of the body's reaction to the drug, I would classify it as a great PED.

It is more understandable to reference the thoroughbreds in this discussion to begin with as they are so weight conscious. There are handicappers that would throw out a horse where the jockey was three pound overweight. How about the fact that a horse can lose from 10 to 20 pounds of water after Lasix is administered? In and of itself, that would be considered a drug that will enhance performance.

Now take into consideration that the lack of fluids in the body lowers that blood pressure and volume and thus lessens the chances of a horse bleeding.

I am of the thinking that all horses bleed when they race to some extent. Lasix will, in most cases, prevent a severe occurrence.

As far as winter or summer, I can make a case for both, but I am basically not a fan of the drug. Using summer for example, think that if a colt loses 15 lbs of water from Lasix and races on a 95-degree day and loses another 20 lbs from the heat, this cannot be a good thing.

When trying to formulate a reasonable opinion as to whether we should keep, or ban the drug, please take into consideration that most venues throughout the world do not permit the use of Lasix in race horses. That includes many major racing areas.

That said, racing is alive and well on the continent.

Bob Marks and Fred Hudson ask: Why not revamp the Triple Crown so that the Breeders Crown is the last leg?

The idea is good, but the time logistics are terrible and the change in venues will not be equality for all.

Right now we have a small track, Yonkers Trot, and two mile tracks the Meadowlands (Hambletonian) , and the Red Mile (Kentucky Futurity). By dropping the Yonkers Trot in favor of a larger oval which has been the norm it creates an easier scenario.

The additional time of close to a month insures the fact that the Hambletonian winner is beaten up a little bit more.

The positioning of the Breeders Crown in and of itself has always presented me with a less than fit horse at that time of the season when it is necessary to have a colt on his A game. This year is a great example. Look who was fabulous earlier in the year and where they were at Crown time. Ramona Hill was a non-starter, Tall Dark Stranger was defeated and retired, Party Girl Hill's winning streak was ended.

These are not three good horses, they are three great horses.

Keeping a horse in top form for five straight months is difficult to say the least but to have an elimination and a final with the importance of the Breeders Crown at the end of that long period of time is very challenging.

As for the pacing Triple Crown, the question raises a more realistic chance for change. With our present format, the pacing version is basically a non-factor. Due to the demise of Roosevelt Raceway and the lack of formidable stakes programs at Yonkers, a change in the races on the pacing side is well worthy of consideration.

To me, the Pepsi North America Cup, the Meadowlands Pace and the Little Brown Jug would be a perfect match for the trotting version. Two big ovals and a half-miler.

Once again, using the Crown to replace any of the aforementioned would stretch the timeframe to the utmost.

Please take note that the entire thoroughbred Triple Crown takes place in a five-week period. The Kentucky Derby is followed in two weeks by the Preakness and the Belmont Stakes is three weeks later.

Trixton's big day in Sweden

Trixton became the most successful stallion when four divisions of \$360,000 Breeders Crown was held at Sundbyholm racetrack in Sweden on Sunday (Nov. 8) afternoon.

Four-year-old mares were the first trotters that entered the track in Eskilstuna and the big favorite ahead of the day, Mascate Match, was scratched due to an injury in a tendon, which made the race more open.

Mahma Lane and Grande Diva Sisu both opened quickly when the car left the field of 11 horses and Grande Diva Sisu was the one who controlled the field after a quarter of a mile.

Daniel Redén trained **Milady Grace**, runner up behind stablemate Diana Zet in \$420,000 Derbystoet in August, placed in third over, began her attack three wide at the mid back stretch. American bred (Little E, LLC) Golden Tricks, also from Redén's barn, followed Milady Grace three wide throughout the last turn and when first over trotter Ganga Bae disarmed leader Grande Diva Sisu, much pointed at a victory for one of Daniel Redén's trotters. Milady Grace (Ready Cash) sprinted to safe win for Örjan Kihlström in a



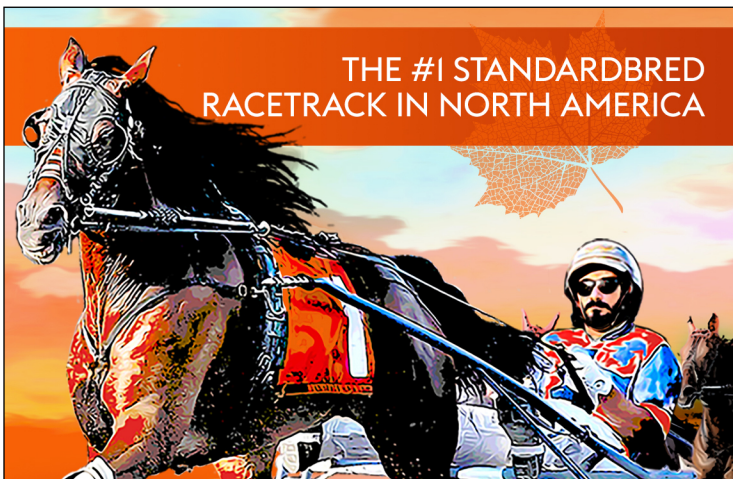

mile rate of 1:56.1 over 1.3 miles and Golden Tricks (Trixton) followed as second ahead of a brave Ganga Bae (Muscle Hill).

The future of Mascate Match is uncertain at this moment. Reports from Finland stated on Wednesday afternoon this week that Pekka Korpi's mare, who will enter a sale in her home country in the end of December, has a quite severe injury that will take up to a year before it heals completely.

In the Breeders Crown for 3-year-old fillies, Björn Goop-trained **Eagle Eye Cherry** (Bold Eagle) dominated the race in a safe wire-to-wire victory in a mile rate of 1:56.4. Goop sent his filly to the front from post 1 behind the gate and the opponents were never really close to challenge Eagle Eye Cherry. The Bold Eagle filly established her

position as the crop's number one in Sweden. In the end of September, Eagle Eye Cherry won the \$635,000 Oaks at Solvalla and her season has resulted in six wins in 12 attempts and \$583,000 in earnings.

Loaded Maria (Trixtion) finished strongly in second and No Business (The Bank) picked a bronze medal.

Robert Bergh's **Hail Mary** (Googoo Gaagaa) is the king among the 4-year-old colts and geldings in Sweden. Bergh himself was suspended and hired Per Lennartsson to drive Hail Mary in the Breeders Crown final, a task that Lennartsson solved without any problems. Hail Mary was sent to the front from post 3 and the great son of Googoo Gaagaa just played with the opponents in a mile rate of 1:55 over 1.3 miles. Runner up Brother Bill (From Above) attacked three wide with 5/8ths of a mile to go and would have been excused if he ended among the last in the race, but Timo Nurmos' horse just fought on the outside of the field and showed what a great horse he is.

Guzz Mearas (Muscle Mass) finished third after a pocket trip for Johan Untersteiner.

The last Crown final on the card was the one for 3-year-old colts and geldings and when first choice San Moteur went off stride in the start, the way to victory was open for **Mister Hercules** (Trixtion) and Kihlström. Mister Hercules opened quickly with no shoes from post 1 and Redén could collect his second Breeders Crown trophy when the Trixtion son hit the wire in 1:56.1.

Manny Muscle (Muscle Hill) found his space late in the home stretch and finished quickly as runner up ahead of first over trotter Selected News (Maharajah).

Trixtion became the most successful stallion with \$339,232 in the Breeders Crown finals in Sweden and behind him followed Bold Eagle (\$207,617), Googoo Gaagaa (\$200,202) and Ready Cash (\$185,372).

Face Time Bourbon dominated in Paris

Sébastien Guarato-trained **Face Time Bourbon** couldn't beat Zacon Gio in Italy two weeks ago, but when the \$100,000 Prix Marcel Laurent was held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Thursday afternoon (Nov. 12), Goop placed his drive in position first over during the race's first half before he stepped on the gas and pushed Face Time Bourbon in front midway through the 1.3 miles long race.

When in front, Face Time Bourbon was unstoppable and the Ready Cash son came home in impressive mile rate of 1:52.2.

Feerie Wood finished second ahead of Gu d'Heripre.

More news from France says that champion trainer Jean-Michel Bazire will get an interesting horse in his barn. Italian-bred Vitruvio (Adrian Chip) will face a winter in France and Bazire will take care of the well-merited trotter. Alessandro Gocciadoro has (mostly) trained the 6-year-old star who had his big breakthrough season 2019 when Vitruvio won several Group 1 races in Europe. Bazire knows what is required to get horses in the best shape during the French winter meeting in Paris and it would be no surprise if Vitruvio is one out of 18 horses when the Prix d'Amérique is scheduled in the end of January next year.

Hambletonian winner ends racing career

Hambletonian winner Perfect Spirit (Andover Hall) has made his last start and will now work as a stud in Sweden.

Perfect Spirit won the \$1 million Hambletonian in 2017 as a 3-year-old before he moved to Sweden where he won \$231,500 Kungapokalen and \$231,500 Sprintermästaren as a 4-year-old.

When Barton Dalious questioned what he wanted to do for a career, he wound up getting the answer straight from the horse's mouth.

It would have been easy – and certainly understandable – if the young man from Delaware had joined the ranks of the standardbred world because of his father.

William “Bart” Dalious had long ago established himself as a talented horseman in The First State, a driver/trainer who has campaigned several stars over the years, including Table Talk, the multiple stakes-winning daughter of Bettors Delight.

When the younger Dalious, at his father's behest, came to work for him at the barn, the standout wrestler at Milford Senior High School was still wrestling with a major life decision.

Warrawee Monarch helped him figure it out.

“He was the first horse I jogged,” said Dalious, of the bay son of Dragon Again. “He had a lot of attitude, but he was also lovable. I kind of liked that about him. So, when I jogged him, something about it just felt right that day. I was just out of college and I really didn't know what I was going to do. I had come out to the barn and helped out a little bit. I jogged Warrawee about two weeks into being there. And when I did, I thought, ‘Man, this just feels right.’ We went over to Pocomoke Fair and I won my first race over there with him. He'll always have a special place in my heart.”

So too does a feisty 4-year-old pacing daughter of Big Jim.

Disturbed Hanover, bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and owned by The Wiz Kids Stable LLC, delivered Dalious his biggest racing thrill so far, a 1 ¼-length score on March 4 at Dover Downs.

Barton Dalious went from being a standout high school wrestler to following in his father's horse-racing footsteps.

While the margin of victory and the final time, 1:53.3, were both impressive, that's not what stands out for the young reinsman.

“That was my first win,” said Dalious. “I almost felt like I didn't even know what I was doing. I was on the front and when I hit the top of the stretch, I knew I had a big chance to win. All the way down the lane, I was just so happy. It's about as good a feeling as you can have.”

He has high praise for the bay mare that was a \$10,000 purchase at the 2017 Harrisburg Sale.

“She's way up there on my list of my favorite horses. I've really grown to like her. She's treated me so well. I love Warrawee, but I think Disturbed is slowly taking his spot as my No. 1. She has a lot of attitude, but I put up with it because I love her.”

Although he had an appreciation for standardbreds well before he sat in the race bike, Dalious has developed a much deeper connection with pacers and trotters over the past two years.

“Honestly, it's great to be around all of them. It's so

rewarding to work with the horses, especially the ones you really like and they race well for you. I feel like it takes a special person to be able to work in the horse business, get up early every day and take care of the horses. Then, you work all the way through the night and do it all over again the next day.”

Although he had stopped wrestling after high school, Dalious, who won several competitions and was twice runner-up in state finals, has been able to take some of the skills he learned on the mat and transfer them to the racetrack.

Racing, like wrestling, has also fueled his competitive nature.

“I was very competitive when I was wrestling and I’m the same way with driving. It’s almost, as a driver, that you’re more of a coach than the athlete. I did a little bit of coaching when I was wrestling and that’s how I feel towards the horses as I would with a younger wrestler.”

Although his laid-back demeanor would suggest quite the opposite, Dalious doesn’t like to lose.

In fact, he bristles at the very thought.

That said, he’s found a winning formula in how to deal with a tough beat.

“I feel like I’m pretty good about moving on to the next race. Sometimes, when I mistake, I’ll think, ‘I should have won that race.’ Those carry over a little bit harder, but usually, I don’t think about them too much until the races are over. That’s when I’ll reevaluate what I did.”

He also keeps in mind the plentiful advice he’s received from his father. Two words in particular come to mind.

“Advice-wise, my dad told me, ‘Be careful,’” Dalious said with a laugh. “It’s pretty simple. But it’s something you need to do. Anything can happen on the racetrack at any moment. It could be someone around you or it could be you. My dad gets really excited when I’m driving. I love having him there. I appreciate all the help and everything he does for me. It’s good to have him rooting and cheering for me.”

He’s not the only one whose voice goes up a few octaves during those races.

The man holding the reins can be quite vocal as well.

“I like to yell a lot when I’m out there,” said Dalious. “And it’s always words of encouragement.”

When he wants to escape the often-hectic standardbred world for a bit, you’ll find him hitting the local lanes in his hometown.

Although he hasn’t come close to bowling a perfect game,

Dalious sees the sport as an ideal way to have some fun and also maintain his competitive edge.

“I like to keep a little bit of a social life. If I want to get some alone time, I’ll stay at home and watch some TV or play some video games. But I enjoy going out with my friends and doing some bowling. I like to think that I’m good sometimes. I think the best game I had was when I bowled 180-something.”

When he isn’t trying to knock down a 7-10 split, Dalious is devoted to upping his standardbred game.

Now that he’s found his calling, he’s not about to let anything get off-track.

“Where I’m at right now, I set a goal for each meet, in terms of amount of wins. My goal is to always get a check with every horse I drive. I know that’s not always possible, but long term, I want to start picking up more drives and make a solid career out of this.”

Thanks to Warrawee Monarch, Dalious won’t need to jog his memory to remember how that came to be.

Stakes finals at Rosecroft

Pride Of Windswept capped off an exciting 2-year old season as she won the \$45,000 Charlie Keller Memorial for 2-year old trotting fillies in a record setting 1:56.4 on Sunday (Nov. 8) at Rosecroft Raceway.

The homebred of owners John and Sarah Swart, Pride Of Windswept swept all six Maryland Sires Stakes events in 2020 and also dominated a Virginia Breeders event as well. She lost her first career start in a conditioned event at Ocean Down and has now won seven straight. Driver Corey Callahan popped the pocket down the backside and drew off to 14-length victory for trainer Shaun Callahan and became the third Charlie De Vie offspring to put her name in the Sires Stakes record books. Call Me Keeper (Jonathan Roberts) was second and Lookie Lookie (John Wagner) was third.

In the \$45,000 Earl Wagner Memorial for 2-year old pacers, **Real Made** finally made it through a race without making a break and the talented but frustrating son of Rusty's For Real rallied to knock off pocket sitting KO Master (Mark Gray) and pace setting Harvey's All In (John Wagner) in 1:54.4. It was the first career win for the homebred of owner Dale Hall Jr. Allan Davis was in the bike and the gelding is trained by Brian Wright. In all five of his previous starts he had made a break, but in two of the starts he found second place finishes anyway.

Wowie Zowie was a placed winner in the \$45,000 Wayne Smullin Memorial for 2-year old filly pacers as she was pacing past pace-setter Madisonsallin who ran out and brushed the wheel of Wowie Zowie knocking her briefly off full stride. It was enough for Madisonsallin to regain the lead under the wire but was an obvious candidate for disqualification.

Driver Russell Foster also owns the Cam's Rocket filly that

is trained by his wife Megan. She is now 6-for-8 on the year and rebounded from her first off the board appearance in a preliminary last week and has seasonal earnings of \$59,925. It was the first of three wins on the betting card for Foster who won with Toms Tarzan for Ron Short and Jeff Beauchamp, giving Wright his second training win of the night and Skywaybrenlinsib for John and Lisa Vickers.

Jared Moyer and **Trents A Lock** won the \$45,000 Ralph Hayward Memorial for freshmen trotters in 2:01.1. The anticipated showdown with his rival Funnyfunnyriddle did not materialize as the latter had to scratch due to sickness. Moyer calmly guided the altered son of Lockkeeper home past Kaaching Kaaching (John Wagner) and Sunshineonmyshlder (Justin Vincent).

The win put his seasonal bankroll at \$82,650 and the horse named after Moyers son Trent, is now 5-for-9 on the year and has two Maryland Sires Stakes and a Virginia Breeders fund win to his credit. Arlene Cameron conditions the horse for owner Pamela Wagner.

Rocktavius won the \$12,000 Maryland Open as Luke Hanners pocketed up behind pace setter Admiral Ballsy (Jonathan Roberts) who set fractions of :25.4, :52.4, and 1:20.4 before the closers came calling. Dirt On My Boots (Roger Plante) took a short lead in the stretch before Hanners got clearance and stormed by for a length and half victory. Mitnite Delight (Eddie Davis Jr.) won a super tight photo over Dirt On My Boots for the place cash at 42-1. It was the second straight open win, and 36th career win, for Rocktavius and a lifetime best 1:50.1 for owner Bib Roberts and trainer Megan Roberts.

It was Hanners' second win of the night as he pulled off a 16-1 upset in race nine with Hide The Cheddar for Carolin Oglesby and trainer Clyde Oglesby Jr.

Allan Davis picked up two wins on the betting card with Maurice for Green Valley Training and trainer Thomas Armour and Talking Blues for the Twin Ponds Stable and trainer John Hollingsworth who posted a double. His second win came with Johnny Crites Jr.'s, Homstretch Wes, and in hand winner for Jonathan Roberts.

Jason Thompson had a driving double as Taragon took a claiming win for Brian Tomlinson and Jack Quick stormed home to defeat some talented foes Hickory Aloha (Roger Plante) and Cash Is King (Sean Bier).

Cameron had three training wins in the betting card, in addition to the Sires Stakes win, Scott Woogen scored with his own KJ Michael and Wagner got up in the nick of time with Officer Wholihan.

Woodbine issues reminder to standardbred horsepeople

Woodbine Entertainment would like to issue a reminder to the standardbred racing community of its policies for participants who have recently traveled outside the country and seek to race at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Participants arriving from an outside country or permanent residents returning to Canada will be allowed access to race at Woodbine Mohawk Park under the following conditions:

1. Complete a successful 14-day isolation period before 6 p.m. on race night and pass the COVID-19 screening process at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Proof of date of arrival into Canada is required to be presented to the director of standardbred racing in advance of race night. Day 1 of the isolation period is the day of arrival into Canada.

2. Receipt and proof of "Quarantine Exemption" (email or paper notice) at the Canadian Border AND results of a negative COVID-19 test conducted in Canada upon arrival to be presented to the director of standardbred racing.

It is highly recommended that foreign participants or permanent residents returning to Canada not attend training centers until the results of a negative COVID-19 test are received, thereby not putting the racing community at risk.

He's Watching has also shown that he can sire fillies like Rose Run Victoria (p,2, 1:55.1f, 3, 1:50.4s-'20 (\$278,846)), who won the OSS Super Final this year. I bought a substantial share of him and plan to breed some of my top mares to him."

He's Watching stands at Tara Hills Stud in Ontario.

Aela Jamieson named USTA District 8 Horse of the Year

Two-year-old filly Aela Jamieson, by Chapter Seven of Blue Chip Farms in Wallkill, NY, has been named the United States Trotting Association District 8 Horse of the Year. The award was presented to trainer Julie Miller at Sunday's New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) & USTA District 8 Virtual Awards Banquet.

"We loved her at Lexington at the sale, she was a smaller filly, but she really grew into herself," said Miller. "I was really happy with her, she had some bumps in the beginning of the season on the half mile tracks but you don't give up on them and you just keep tinkering with her equipment. I was very fortunate that she started to get with the program at Vernon and Tioga. When the money was down at Yonkers, she really put her best foot forward."

The filly took home more than \$92,800 worth of total earnings for owners Andy Miller Stable, Inc., Dumain Haven Farm and Little E, LLC.

Dancer bill allowing NJ residents to bet from other states now law

New Jersey residents can now place bets on horse races even when they are out of state.

Gov. Phil Murphy on Friday (Nov. 6) signed legislation sponsored by Assemblyman Ron Dancer (A2355) that allows residents to place wagers using New Jersey's account wagering system while in another state.

"All New Jersey residents should be allowed to place wagers on horse racing no matter where they are, whether it's online or through an agency," stated Dancer (R-Ocean). "With the changes in technology, our access to place wagers has changed and the law should reflect those changes. It's also critical we do everything we can do to keep our staple industries afloat during and after the coronavirus pandemic."

The Assembly voted 73-0 on the bill in June, and last month the state Senate passed it with a 35-0 vote.

Gobs of guaranteed green up for grabs at Big M

There will no doubt be plenty of money put in play over the course of the upcoming weekend (Nov. 13-14) at The Meadowlands as the track's popular multi-leg wagers will offer a total of \$300,000 in guaranteed pools.

Tonight (Nov. 13), the 20-cent Pick-6 – which begins in the eighth race – has a guaranteed pool of \$20,000. Big M management saw fit to make the monetary assurance in the aftermath of last Saturday (Nov. 7) when the wager went unhitched, creating a carryover of \$8,031.

Last Friday (Nov. 6), a Pick-6 carryover led to a total pot of over \$51,000, and those sharp enough to have tickets bearing all six winners walked away with \$23,020.

The other \$280,000 in assured funds will come from the 20-cent Pick-5 and 50-cent Pick-4. The Pick-5 – which begins in the first race – will be offering \$50,000 guaranteed pools on both Friday and Saturday, while the 50-cent Pick-4s will offer \$50,000 on both race sixes and \$40,000 more on each race 10 during the course of the weekend.

All of those wagers offer a low 15 per cent takeout, which is also true of the 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 – which starts on the third race – as well as the 10-cent Pentafecta, which is offered on the 13th and final race of the night.

Other payouts worth mentioning from last week include Friday night's Pick-4 (\$1,120), Survivor (\$3,118) and Pentafecta (\$1,702), while Saturday's big payoffs came in the Pick-4 (\$1,912) and Pentafecta (\$7,786).

LAST WEEK: A pair of Breeders Crown champions strutted their stuff in the Kindergarten Classic Finals for 2-year-olds last Saturday. Fire Start Hanover ran her seasonal stats to eight wins from 12 starts after taking the filly pace while

Summa Cum Laude, fresh off his dead heat in the Crown with the unbeaten Perfect Sting, overcame post 10 to win the colt and gelding pace.

Anoka Hanover upped her winning streak to six on the way to victory lane in the filly trot while 6-1 shot Dee's Red Delicious became the only winner to not go off as the public choice in the colt and gelding trot.

Big M fans can now look forward to the third biggest program of the calendar year – after Hambletonian Day and Meadowlands Pace Night – when Fall Final Four/TVG Finals Night takes place on Nov. 21, with many Kindergarten and Breeders Crown participants expected to be on hand.

That evening, 2-year-olds will be in the spotlight as the Governor's Cup (colt pace), Three Diamonds (filly pace), Valley Victory (colt trot) and Goldsmith Maid (filly trot) makeup the Fall Final Four, with total purses of about \$1.8 million.

In addition, year-end divisional honors will be on the line in the four TVG Finals, which are the Mares Trot, Open Trot, Mares Pace and Open Pace, a fabulous foursome which will see just over \$1 million get doled out.

THE BIG THREE: George Napolitano Jr. and Todd McCarthy kept on rolling, as each won four times last weekend to lead the driver colony.

With many of the Big M regulars absent in recent weeks driving on the Grand Circuit, Simon Allard, Napolitano and McCarthy have combined to win 36 of the last 77 races contested at the mile oval. Allard and McCarthy are currently leading the standings with 26 wins apiece, "Georgie Nap" is right behind them with 22.

Harness Museum and Historic Track receive \$6,000 from Monti-Goshen USHWA

Continuing a tradition that has endured for more than half a century, the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association made their annual donations to the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame and to the neighboring Goshen Historic Track.

Track president Steve Jones met with chapter president Chris Tully at the recently concluded Standardbred Horse Sale.

"We truly appreciate the consistent and generous support of our local harness racing writers," Jones said. "They help us to continue to operate during these difficult and unprecedented times. We lost considerable revenue with the postponement of our regular Grand Circuit meet in July, so these funds could not have come at a more crucial time."

Harness Museum president Max Hempt echoed those sentiments. The third generation horseman noted, "The Harness Racing Museum is fortunate to have such a dedicated group of writers that have consistently raised thousands of dollars annually on our behalf. Absent much of

our primary fund-raising efforts this year, we are grateful that Monticello-Goshen Chapter had sufficient prudent reserve to continue their enduring doctrine of benevolence."

Forced to postpone the annual Hall of Fame induction ceremony until 2021, and coupled with New York's current pandemic restrictions, the Museum has remained closed through much of 2020.

In addition, due to current social distancing requirements, the Monticello-Goshen Chapter will be unable to hold its 62nd annual awards banquet this year.

The practice of raising money and donating funds to Historic Track and the Hall of Fame began in the mid-1970s with Monticello Raceway publicity icon John Manzi, and has continued ever since.

Fortunately, due to the generosity of the chapter's past sponsors and advertisers, the writers were still able to give \$3,000 each to the Harness Museum and to Goshen Historic Track, two separate and distinct entities which share the same hallowed ground and a united mission to preserve, protect and promote Harness Racing.
