Harrisburg completes sale with record numbers

The Standardbred Horse Sales Company's auction concluded Friday with a new record for average (\$53,527) and the second highest gross in history (\$69,477,500).

2021 SHSC MIXED SALE AT HARRISBURG

Many figures out of Standardbred Horse Sale Company (SHSC) 2021 sale set records, among them the pace; Friday's (Nov. 12) session had 215 horses go through the ring starting at 10 a.m. with all horses sold and clean up starting just before 3 p.m.

"Our auctioneers said it was one of the easiest weeks they've ever had," said Dale Welk, president and director of operations for SHSC. "All week, bidders came ready to bid and they bid. They didn't hesitate. Usually someone will try to cut the bid a little bit and they didn't even try to do that. They just kept right on bidding."

Such enthusiasm reveals itself in the final numbers of the Black Book sale. From 1,298 sales, the sale grossed \$69,477,500. The

highest gross ever came in 2007 when \$70,228,377 was handled, but that year included 2,037 sales. With nearly half the horses as 2007, the sale easily broke the record for sale average set in 2019 of \$45,292 with a figure of \$53,527 (up 18.2 per cent; in 2019, 1496 sales were handled).

"Right up to the end, the arena was packed," Welk said. "Right up to the last horse. [We] sold a horse for \$140,000 in the supplement – it's just great. It was just unbelievable, borderline saying it was crazy. I mean, you didn't know how to predict anything this week. It's great. I couldn't feel better about it. It's not just me, there's a lot of work goes into this – beforehand getting entries, everything. The consignors brought us a great group of horses."

The Mixed Sale altogether just missed 2019's gross by only \$9,000 with \$27,012,000 gross from 521 horses (2019 had 663). Friday alone grossed \$13,447,000, down from the final-day gross in 2019 of \$14,594,000 but far beating its \$36,567 average with a figure of \$62,544 (up 71 per cent). the trend visible through the whole week of the sale, which is that competition for racehorse ownership has become much more aggressive compared to the economic stasis of 2020.

"I just had a few people in the office recently that said they didn't get a horse and they've got money," Welk said as the flags hanging around the sales arena came flying down and the chairs were mostly packed. "A lot of these guys will set a limit and that's where it is. I've got to appreciate that, that they can stop, but there's a lot of others that didn't stop. Some of the higher-priced horses, people said, 'I was going to stop \$100,000 before that' but, you know, if it's worth \$400,000 then it's worth \$450,000."

A turn for Key operation

Bob Key, a prominent and engaged horse owner, died early in 2021 at 88 years old. His widow, Patty Key, assumed control of the farm and of the Winning Key LLC operation.

Preferred Equine led all consignors Friday (\$9,105,000), for the mixed sale (\$14,049,000) and overall counting the yearling and mixed sale together (\$19,828,500).

When Key was alive, he had a love for racing and dabbled in breeding. He notably bred American Winner, who won the 1993 Hambletonian, and had since bred and raced most of his own horses. And while Winning Key, after Bob's passing, has continued to race much of the farm's stock, Patty has begun to transition the outfit by selling some of its racehorses and yearlings and focusing specifically on mares.

Shaun Laungani, the stallion booker for Diamond Creek Farm, has handled part of the search for Winning Key 2.0. Through the Mixed Sale, Laungani signed for over \$1 million worth of stock ranging from stallion shares to race mares. On Friday, he paid the third-highest amount on the day when winning auction on **Hip 1449**, a Bar Hopping filly named **My Abigail**, for \$370,000. Laungani also purchased the Muscle Hill filly **Avenir (Hip 1397)** for \$230,000 and the Chapter Seven filly **Sweeping Rainbow (Hip 1407)** for \$180,000. Along with shares they bought for Chapter Seven and Muscle Hill, as well as a mare in foal to Father Patrick named **Munster**, Laungani has curated the next phase in Patty's plan to evolve Winning Key from a homebred operation to a fixture selling Day-1 yearlings.

"So, it's a complete shift," Laungani said. "Bob hadn't sold yearlings in decades and now they are starting to disperse some of the stock in the yearling sales, but that stock now is being churned and cycled back in with new, fresh stock coming in. They would like to get to the point where they are a boutique, blue hen, premier breeding operation. Much smaller numbers,

I don't know for sure, but somewhere in the 25-50 mare range. They want to sell yearlings in Lexington and Harrisburg. I'm honored to be a trusted advisor at this point and so Diamond Creek is here to help them with whatever they need.

"There's an amazing history there, whether it's American Winner or BJs Pleasure, Break The Bank K... a lot of bright spots over the years," Laungani also said. "There are some nice breeding pieces still left, but there's a lot of retooling that needs to take place that's already been in the works over the last year. The public can expect champions to start coming off of Winning Key Farm again."

The Seven-Million-Dollar Man

Greg Luther famously dove headfirst into horse ownership with his million-dollar experiment, which started last year. Today, Luther has spent an additional \$6 million in his ownership venture – Black Magic Racing – and has added to it.

For one, Luther gets to keep one of his stable stars. He was on record back in August that Katie's Lucky Day, his filly who bested divisional star Bella Bellini by a nose to win the \$351,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity, would go as entered in the Mixed Sale. Early in the week, it was announced she was out.

"She had a little injury [Luther later said it was respiratory related] about 10 days ago after her last race and we felt it was best not to haul her during her recovery time," Luther said. "Unfortunately, we had to take her out. As high as [the mares]

are selling today, I really wish we could've sold her, but we wanted to do the right thing by the horse, for sure. Obviously, if she does come back from the injury... the vet says it's probably a 50/50 shot, but if she does come back, we'll race her. If not, we'll just have to breed her next year, so we'll know by then."

Luther also bought many others through the sale and paid one of the loftiest prices for active racehorses when he acquired Sandbetweenmytoes, the 2020 Breeders Crown 3-year-old colt pacer champ, for \$305,000.

"He raced against three of my Grand Circuit horses this year, so we had Catch The Fire, Captain Kirk and Chief Mate and he raced against them all year long," Luther said. "My main man, Scotty Zeron, drove him last year so he knows the horse. He says, 'You know you're going to have to overpay for the horse today because that's what they are all doing, but I think it'll work out for you.' So, I figured we'd give it a shot.

"As long as he comes back good and comes back strong, I think he'll be a good 5-year-old. He's very well-bred, gorgeous horse – unbelievable look – so hopefully he's just as fast as he is good looking."

This year, Luther said he has bought 30 yearlings to up his arsenal coming into 2022, bringing the total head under his ownership to 75.

"I own 74-and-a-half of them," Luther said. "I only have one partner on one horse – everything else I own myself. It should be a very fun year next year. We're going to Spring Garden Ranch in Florida with the babies this year, so hopefully they'll get an easy winter for themselves and come back as champions."

Leaders from the day

Quickest Hanover (Hip 1453) topped the final session of the Mixed Sale when returning to his home, Hanover Shoe Farms, for a price of \$450,000. The Father Patrick filly is a three-quarter sister to 2014 Hambletonian Oaks winner Lifetime Pursuit (3, 1:50.4M; \$1,065,586) and joins another high-priced purchase in the Somebeachsomewhere filly Viva La Deo, who was purchased by Hanover Shoe Farms for \$250,000. From the Rocknroll Hanover mare Rocklamation (6, 1:48.3M; \$2,277,374), Viva La Deo is a three-quarter sister to Breeders Crown winner Rocknificent (4, 1:48M; \$1,133,661).

Kentucky Championship winner **Empressive Hill** brought the second-richest tag of the session when auctioning for \$410,000 to Jean-Pierre Barjon, who plans to send the Muscle Hill mare to Hunterton Farms to begin her career as a broodmare. Another high-priced mare in transit to Hunterton is the Cantab Hall filly **Evening Stroll**, who was purchased for \$310,000 by Mario Zuanetti for M. Biassuzi Stable. Zuanetti said he does not know if the owner plans to bring the mare back to the track, but knows that he, one, paid a high price and, two, that she will be bred at some point.

"We overpaid, just like everybody else," Zuanetti said. "Obviously, we have to raise the bar. I saw fillies or mares going for twice as much as I thought. At that point, \$200,000 became \$310,000. That basically sums it all up. [We could breed to] Muscle Hill or Walner, but Walner is going to be tough... [he's] just about impossible to get breedings from. She'll cross good with everything."

Reid wrap

"It's a good solid market," Dave Reid said, reflecting on the Friday session. "Listen, I don't get impressed that easily. I've been doing this a long time. Really, it just reinforces what our pre-sale comments were, meaning that the fillies have been

selling well the last few years and Lexington was strong and it was strong here.”

In the 2021 SHSC sale, the interest laid largely in trotting fillies, which led the yearling portion by average with an average of \$70,627. The filly phenomenon continued into the Mixed Sale with the largest average posted by trotting filly racehorses – a figure of \$94,466. Trotting broodmares brought the second highest average of \$60,765 and pacing fillies brought the third highest with an average of \$56,556.

“It’s a very cyclical business and the breeders are putting the money back into the game,” Reid said. “When you buy quality, as I said two days ago; if they don’t work out on the track the way you’d hoped, you do maintain residual value. So, when you buy quality – well-bred, good individuals – in a cycle like we’re at now where the economy is rolling and the yearling sales are good and the breeders are putting the money back into the business, that’s where it pays dividends and you saw that on numerous occasions today.

“I would make a note, also, that I noticed at this sale, a factor that was probably underappreciated was the borders opening up,” Reid also said. “There were a lot of Canadians here and, more

importantly, a lot of Europeans – from Holland, from Italy, from Sweden. With the border opening up earlier this week, people definitely couldn’t wait to get here. The crowd was great, the bidding was spirited and I think that’s a strong factor to the week’s success as well. They do have the internet, but there’s nothing like being live at an auction.”

The Mixed Sale wraps another sharp year for Preferred as they led all consignors by gross with sales totaling \$14,049,000 from 239 offerings, averaging a sale tag of \$58,782. Preferred also led all consignors for the entire sale with gross sales of \$19,828,500.

“I just can’t thank our customers – the people that trust us to sell their horses for them – enough,” Reid said. “We had the Warrawee dispersal and of course that’s a little bittersweet because Mike Wilson is a class guy that runs a class operation. It’s a small nursery in Canada, but I actually treasure those small nurseries because I think they are the backbone of the business.

“The buyers that came here, you’ve got to give them credit for doing their homework. We tried to provide them with as much information as possible, pre-sale, especially with a mixed sale like this. Overall, it was a great week. It’s been a long fall and onto a new venture, maybe, who knows. We’ll see what happens. We’re always thinking and you never know what could be next for Preferred Equine.”

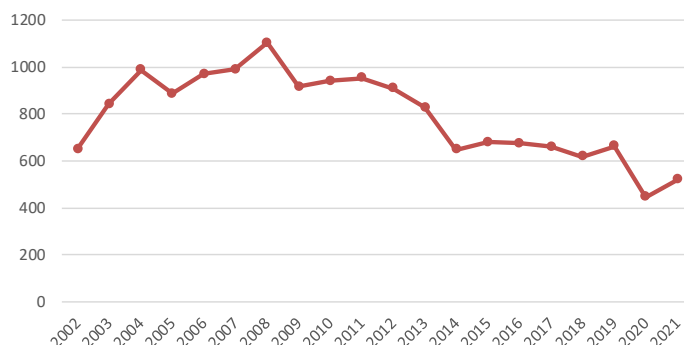

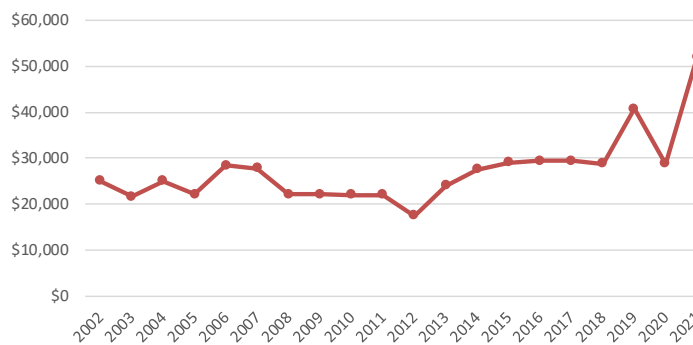

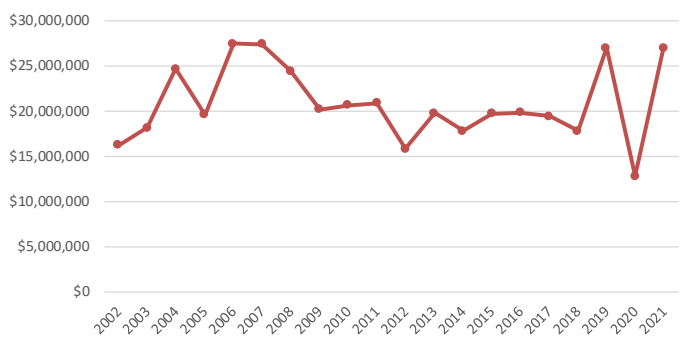
Mixed Sale - Number of Horses Sold



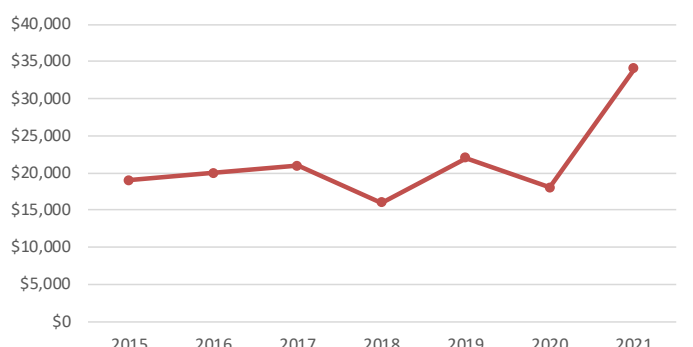

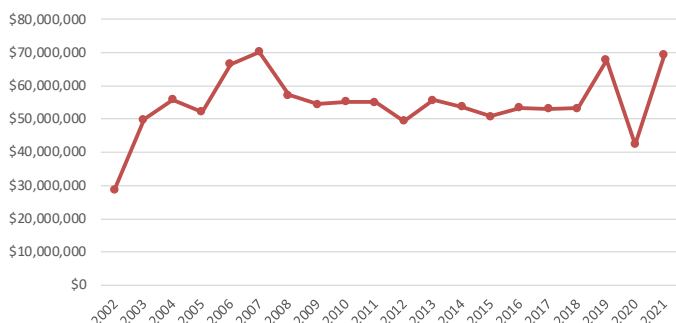
Yearling & Mixed Sale - Number of Horses Sold



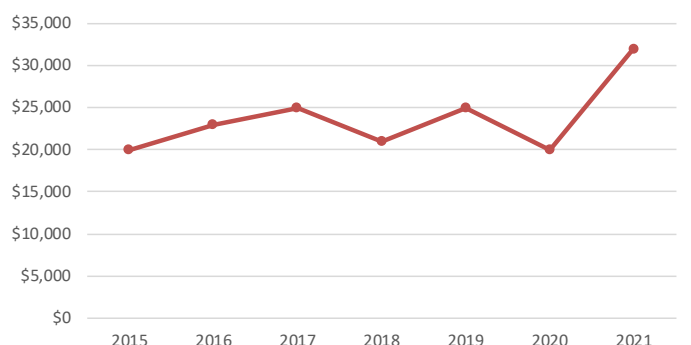
Yearling & Mixed Sale - Average

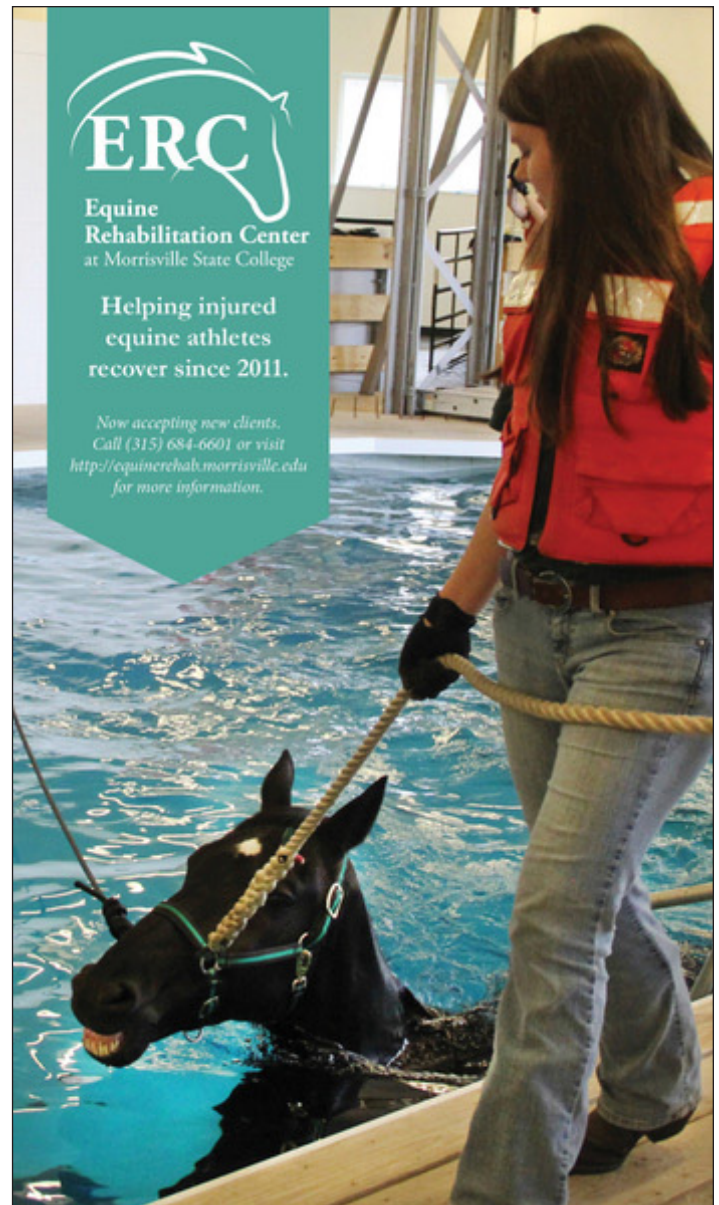

May Dodge and me

It's not that I think our sport is perfect when I come up with problems in the thoroughbred world. Of course we have plenty of things that cry out for correction, including drugging, ridiculously low fines for whipping, (New Jersey not included, they do it right), post time drags at all our major tracks, etc., etc., and so forth, in the words of Yul Brynner as the King of Siam.

It's just that the thoroughbred King Tuts are so self righteous and act so superior. In the time this kid has lived in Kentucky, I've yet to meet someone from the running horse world who didn't look down on us standardbred folks as a lower form of animal life.

So what happened last Saturday at the Breeders' Cup, which owes its origin to a refugee from the standardbred world, John Gaines, was insightful. In one of their biggest races of the whole series, the one for 3-year-old colts, the favorite threw himself down in the gate and got stuck there.

At that point, someone with a working IQ wisely opened the gate of the colt in the next stall so he wouldn't get tangled up with the colt stuck under the gate. That colt in the neighboring stall had been standing quiet as a lamb. When the gate opened in front of him, he and his jockey quietly walked out of the gate and around to the back of the gate, so he could be reloaded.

It was then that a lame brain vet, one of the Breeders' Cup officials, declared the well mannered colt a vet's scratch, although the colt hadn't done a thing wrong. So betting was stopped on the scratched colt. Then a wiser head, not a terribly competitive field, reinstated the colt and allowed him to compete for the purse, albeit removed from the betting.

Here, justice finally prevailed, and the reinstated colt won the race, and the big purse. But one has the right to wonder, how does such a man made screw-up happen on one of thoroughbred racing's biggest days?

On a different note, there's lately been some attention given to the foundation mare May Dodge. Her blood continues to run in some of today's top horses, including Captaintreacherous, and it will continue to be sought after for years to come.

My own experience with one of her descendants involved someone who played a key role in the success of Billy Haughton, a legend today but a close friend in earlier days.

John Froehlich was essentially a truck farmer on Long Island, a man sans a higher education who nevertheless was smart enough to buy up hundreds of acres of land where he raised his crops. In time that land became priceless and it made John Froehlich a rich man.

As the money came rolling in, Froehlich discovered harness racing and Billy Haughton. That had as much to do with geography as anything else, since Haughton and his family happened to live quite close to Froehlich's home farm.

Like many of us, Froehlich was totally captivated by Haughton, who had a personality that simply glowed. As a personal digression, in 1958 I went to a wedding reception in Palm Beach, and John F. Kennedy was also there. Screwing up my courage, I introduced myself on the basis of both of us having gone to the same college, and we shook hands.

All these years later I still remember how there was a kind of glow around Kennedy, which I guess is best defined as charisma. Billy Haughton didn't have as strong a presence as JFK, but he came about as close as ordinary mortals could.

John Froehlich was the owner who put up the big money whenever Haughton needed it. As a quick example, when Romulus Hanover was selling at what looked to Haughton like a bargain price, he threw in a \$35,000 bid without a second thought, knowing that John Froehlich would cover it. That may seem like peanuts today, but to get a perspective, you probably should multiply the dollars of those days by 20 to get today's value.

One of Haughton's other good owners was a lady named Margaret Lloyds, whose husband was Lloyd Lloyds, believe it or not. She didn't have the buying power of Froehlich, and so she would ferret out bargains. Before one of the Harrisburg sales, she and Froehlich were both interested in the same yearling.

They talked it over, and then Froehlich resolved it by telling Margaret;

"You bid on the colt as far as you want to go, and if you get him, that's great. But if you've hit your limit and the bidding is still going, I'll start bidding when you're finished."

The kindness there speaks for itself. Which brings me to my encounter with John Froehlich and May Dodge.

My kids were quite small in those days, and on Sundays I'd frequently bring them over to Froehlich's home place, which was a little bit like a magic kingdom, with goats, sheep, dogs, and chickens the kids could play with.

On one of those visits, Froehlich told me he had a mare he wanted to sell, Romantic Hanover. She was by Tar Heel, and out of Romola Hal, who was actually a granddaughter of May Dodge. I immediately lusted for her.

I don't remember if Froehlich actually set a price, but I knew whatever it was, I couldn't afford it. In one of those quirks of fate, earlier that year I had bought a yearling colt on the advice of my friend, Phil Tully, who told me that he owned the colt's 2-year-old full brother, who he said was going to set a world's record for 2-year-old trotting geldings at Lexington.

I bought the colt, despite the fact that he stood a little off in one front foot, and sure enough, he soon had a world's champion brother.

Back to Romantic Hanover, Froehlich told me that she was open after being bred at Walnut Hall Farm to Duane Hanover, a free-for-all that Haughton had raced with good success for Froehlich.

Actually, as it happened, Romantic Hanover had failed to catch after several tries during the breeding season, and everyone just assumed that was the case after her last cover, right before she was shipped home.

Froehlich and I did some real horse trading, and I finally bought Romantic Hanover, as a barren mare, for my yearling full brother to the new world champion 2-year-old trotting gelding and \$5,000 hard earned dollars.

So the yearling was shipped off to Haughton's winter training

quarters in Pompano, and Romantic Hanover was shipped to Lana Lobell Farms. Where she was preg checked as a matter of routine, and of course she was in foal to Duane Hanover.

The mare had already been transferred to my name, and the yearling to Froehlich's. Fait Accompli, as they would say in France. I immediately went back to Froehlich, and told him that he would own 50 per cent of the foal Romantic was carrying. It turned out to be a colt, which Froehlich bought out of our yearling consignment the one year we sold at Tattersalls in Lexington.

The colt turned out to be a nice racehorse for Froehlich, and Romantic Hanover was an okay broodmare, but nothing great.

But when I was in Lexington with that colt and the rest of our consignment, I also met the prettiest girl I had ever seen.

And, to make a long story short, we've now been married for just short of 30 years. And maybe, just maybe, John Froehlich and Romantic Hanover had a little to do with it.

Are there more accidents and, if so, what is causing them?

A plethora of opinions from industry leaders.

There has been a great deal written about the perceived number of serious racetrack accidents this year.

In order for this type of discussion to have any credence, it would be necessary for us to know the facts. For these, I contacted T C Lane at USTA. In his normal expeditious manner, TC obliged.

I don't have the exact numbers at hand. However to summarize, we haven't had any more, likely fewer accidents this year over most years. In comparison to the '90s as an example, significantly less.

However, in terms of accidents causing bodily harm to drivers, there are just no numbers kept, so there is nothing to back my thoughts up.

I am still of the firm belief that more guys (I'm unaware of any gals) have been seriously hurt this year, with several of them being hospitalized than ever before in the numerous decades I've been involved in the sport.

I began speaking to people regarding what I felt was happening this past Sunday morning. No sooner did I open my mouth, than we had an accident that very same day in the second race at Harrah's Chester. The next day I was blamed for it happening. In essence I was told, 'Don't tempt fate' or as Mr. Simpson would sometimes say, 'If it doesn't smell, then don't stir it.'

As would be expected, there were no universal conclusions. A few felt that there were no more and probably less serious accidents.

From those who felt that there were indeed more serious accidents, the number one causal factor cited was speed. The feeling was that we were racing our horses faster and for longer stretches of the mile than ever before. The time for giving a horse a "breather" during the course of a race was no more. Today's horses and drivers are so good that with the majority

of them, they are able to overcome what is asked. Except for occasionally the second quarter in a race, there are no breathers. Finishing second in blame were the bikes and the manner that the drivers sit in them.

I've asked a few people in the industry their views. There was nothing close to unanimity in what was expressed. Here are a few thoughts from a cross section of those in the industry.

Please bear in mind that when I write these columns, I generally submit a proof to the subject to correct any possible inaccuracies. Because of the time restraints and the number of people I spoke with, I wasn't able to do that with this column. Any errors in communication are solely mine.

Michel Lachance

"In my opinion, there are not more accidents, probably fewer of them. However, those that we do have are probably more serious because of the speed that today's horses are capable of going. We rid ourselves of the worst culprit that we had – the hubrail. I hate to think how dangerous racing would be if we still had those. The day that racetracks removed them made racing far safer for everyone in the game. There are probably many more reasons, including, but far from limited to, the speed of our horses. Back way back when, there were not a lot of horses that could go fast enough to get you seriously hurt. Our drivers today are so much better. Back when I began driving, there were a good many drivers, who were not what I would call "professionals". Today, it's very rare to find any at just about every track who are not. As great as youth is insofar as making drivers great, it can also have a negative effect in promoting reckless behavior on the track. You are a lot less brave and more judicious after you've hit the ground a few times than you are before that has happened. I was extremely lucky in all my years of driving in that I was never seriously injured. No particular reasons. I just consider myself to have been lucky."

David Reid

"There are numerous reasons for the seriousness of accidents, not necessarily their frequency. I think the figures actually show that there are fewer of them, but when they do happen they can be more serious. Included in the factors are speed, number one, equipment (bikes), size of tracks, track conditions, the incredible ability of our horses and drivers and the soundness of horses. There are far fewer unsound horses racing today. But speed is the number one factor. I have been preaching for decades that the way to not only help avoid mishaps, but perhaps more importantly to improve our product would be to de-emphasize speed. I know it would be difficult, if not impossible, because the very history and the name of our breed is related to speed. The term 'standardbred' was derived from the need for a horse to be able to perform to a standard of speed. Most people might think that it would be impossible to implement. I disagree. It could be quite easy if the

desire were there. My solution would be to dig up our tracks. If this were done, there would be less emphasis on going out of there like a bullet from a gun and maintaining your position on top. If we made our tracks softer and a little deeper, you'd see a whole lot more horses that left too fast fading and more coming from behind than you see now. It would become far more difficult for the horse on top to dictate the race. It would bring much more strategy into the way horses were raced. I also think that it would probably improve soundness, like the old maxim goes 'speed kills.' I'm not saying that speed is the only reason for unsoundness — far from it. But it is undoubtedly a large contributing factor."

Blair Burgess

"I don't necessarily believe that we have more wrecks today, but the ones we have can be more serious. Thank goodness we don't have those dreaded hub rails any more. Because if we did, they would be far worse. I think there are numerous factors, including, but far from limited to speed. Just like with cars, some might be caused by aggressive driving gone amok, including loose lining and putting horses in dangerous situations. Sometimes too much concentration by the drivers on oneself and their own situation. It's not just guys that don't drive that much. Even the best drivers are capable of getting into trouble. Things can and do happen so very quickly out there. Its faster and tighter. I think that drivers position in the bike and where they have their hand holds are factors that should be considered. Perhaps there should be established standards for both. They definitely can cause delayed reaction time and visual concerns. The Meadowlands Pace this year was a classic example. Most of the drivers were late in reacting to a steppy horse. Then, they over reacted, just totally screwing up the race. The bikes are a problem. Even if they are comfortable and help horses go faster, they put drivers in an unsafe position, one not conducive to quick reaction time. They are made of steel. They don't give and probably do more damage in wrecks. They also have catapulting capabilities. I hope that this doesn't sound like an anti-driver speech. To the contrary. Today's drivers are amazing. They are great professionals. They do the best they can with what they have. But it's very competitive out there. Competition is a great thing. It's the very essence of the sport. However sometimes enhancing the competitive aspects can lead to unforeseen consequences."

Brett Pelling

"I don't know the numbers, but it can seem as though there are more. If there are more, which I doubt, and more serious ones, probably, then the number one culprit is speed. This might sound crazy, but our horses might be too good. The breed was established for horses to go the set distance of one mile. They have probably progressed to the point where their abilities have exceeded that distance. That's the main reason why we see so many start to finish winners today. If you have a horse that doesn't possess high speed, it's quite difficult, if not close to impossible to do well today. The days when you could get

a good horse who was a grinder and could do well with it are close to over. They just go too fast in all parts of the mile today. The reason is not soundness. I think today's horses, speaking in generalities are sounder than they have ever been. However speed once again comes into play. They are nevertheless still capable of getting tired, being constantly on their toes. Just like people, if you are tired, you sometimes get off your game. The same applies to horses. If one is tired, they can take a bad step. A bad step can lead to a wreck. Wrecks can be more dangerous and consequential because of the speed the horses are going. I think that next to speed, the biggest contributing factors are the bikes. There is absolutely no way that as good as today's drivers are, and they are that, that they are not somewhat compromised by their seat in the bike with regard to their vision and reaction time. It's something that needs to be considered. It not only creates a safety factor, but it also seriously makes it more difficult to win races unless you are in front or very close to the front. You have to make up significantly more ground than you used to before the advent of the longer bikes and lean back driving."

Tony Alagna

"Speed has become a necessity. Unless you have the ability to leave the gate quickly, you are put into a bad position. The bikes and the lean back posture of the drivers are certainly contributing factors, not necessarily to safety but to the requirement of speed. Like the saying goes 'speed kills.' Just like when you are driving a car, the faster you go, the greater chances you have of getting into a wreck. If you get into a wreck in a car or with a horse the faster you were going would contribute to the amount of damage done. With respect to the bikes and the way they affect racing, it used to be that if you were in a race with 10 horses and were sitting 10th, you'd be 10th by 10 lengths. Today in the same situation, you are 10th by 17 lengths."

Myron Bell and Charley Karp

These two watch more races than most and do so with an experienced eye. Both responded that they do not see that many accidents, especially at The Meadowlands where our best and brightest, both horses and drivers, hold sway. Bell said that he believed that the smaller tracks might play a role, with the same number of horses, but because of the greater space the longer bikes take up might not be conducive to the safest environment.

Jack Rice

Jack has spoken about the subject several times on Facebook, generally saying that there were just as many, if not more accidents previously, but they were just not reported to the degree they are now. I asked him for his views for publication.

"I feel it is the same this year as any other year. I think that you may be seeing more because of social media and the press.

When I raced at Monticello, accidents were a regular occurrence. I do think, though, that some accidents are more significant now because drivers are leaning so far back that their vision is affected. I've seen horses 5-6 lengths behind fallen horses and still running into them. If they were more upright, I believe this might have been avoided. I blame the media for publicizing it at the better known tracks, but not the smaller ones. I also think the time of year and the weather might be a factor. It's late in the year. Horses and people are generally speaking not as sharp and can be tired. Trainers are sometimes responsible for sending out some tired and perhaps not perfectly sound horses to maybe keep the training bill going. I think you might find this more at the smaller tracks than at the larger ones. I also think the track and state vets play a part in not scratching horses that seem off scoring down. Of course, some tracks now limit the scoring down, but that is another subject."

John Butenschoen

"I race mostly at Pocono Downs, which together with The Red Mile might be the two best and safest racetracks in North America. Together with it being a great surface to race on, it is also one that is most speed favoring, quite possibly the most speed favoring racetrack in North America. Not that George and Anthony Napolitano are not great drivers, because they most certainly are. They can make speed like very few others can, certainly those racing regularly at any place other than The Meadowlands. If they get to the top with a horse that is comparable to those that they are in against, then chances are that you aren't going to beat them. Unless you are especially hard on one at Pocono, they are going to get less tired there than at any other place that I've ever raced. What does this have to do with accidents you might ask? Probably a whole lot if you believe that speed is a factor in creating accidents. It's my belief that the faster you go, the more likely you are to have accidents. Together with that, the speed at which an accident occurs will result in more harm. It's simple Physics 101. What is the solution? As my friend David Reid said to me many years ago, 'We need to dig up the racetracks and allow our horses to go slower and de-emphasize speed and make strategy more important.' It will not only lead to fewer accidents, but also lessen the number of casualties resulting from them. It might also make our sport a trifle more interesting. What are the chances of that happening? My answer to that would be: Probably south of zero. I know I'm being too simplistic in blaming it all on speed. Of course there are other factors, including but not limited to the bikes and drivers positions in them."

Active drivers

I've reached out to many of them. Perhaps understandably, they've either not gotten back to me or answered to the effect that they don't believe that there are many more accidents (which the actual numbers confirm) or that they believe that

the number of accidents involving drivers being hospitalized is probably just an aberration this year. A few did say that there are far more potential accidents that are avoided on a daily basis than ones that actually take place. We are truly fortunate that there are not more than those that we in fact see.

The author's summary:

1. The chief causal factor in accidents on the racetrack is speed. The faster the horses go, the greater the likelihood of there being an accident. Certainly if one does occur, following the laws of physics it should be more serious and potentially cause greater harm and damage than if it happens at a lesser speed.
2. Second in line are the bikes, the way the drivers sit in them and the feeling that they have less control, a diminished view of what is transpiring and lessened reaction time.
3. Other factors, such as loose lining by drivers, racetrack conditions, possible unsoundness issues with the horses, poor judges and track veterinarians.

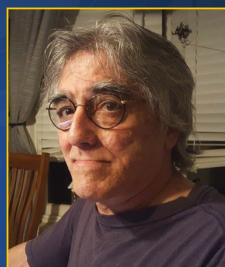

Punters' delicate condition, Part 2

Conditions for races, though published in past performance pages for every breed of horses racing, are primarily for horse-men and then specifically for trainers and owners — those responsible for placing their horses in particular races.

Although I have no data on bettors seriously reading race conditions and/or applying a value to them when handicapping, I have been exposed to enough punters (in person and via mail from thousands of readers) on both sides of the Atlantic and throughout North America to safely document they are not interested in most of the details covered.

Here, for instance, is the extent of what bettors care about in race conditions (as done best by The Meadowlands harness programs):

2 Year Olds Colts & Geldings

Sometimes, bettors do not even check if the race is a pace or a trot. This is not a generational thing, either; all handicappers in the new millennium have not been diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. Even the placid types roll their eyes at conditions like this:

6 Furlongs. Alw 5000s Purse \$16,200 (PLUS UP TO 40% PABF) FOR FILLIES AND MARES THREE YEARS OLD AND UPWARD WHICH HAVE STARTED FOR A CLAIMING PRICE OF \$5,000 OR LESS SINCE JANUARY 1, 2020. Three Year Olds, 123 lbs., Older, 124 lbs. Non-winners Of A Race Since October 10 Allowed 2 lbs. A Race Since September 10 Allowed 4 lbs. if the dietary rules followed the great green frog over a three-colored-only rainbow. Hi, Jimmy, what'd ya think about Holly's new haircut?)

If you read through the preceding conditions and did not see it stray to abstraction then you did not read the entire text.

All right, so racing conditions for racing's largest audience, the bettors, should be short and sweet, but there are two levels to using conditions which may work as promotions for betting beginners and as challenges for veteran punters.

Level One

Aside from the basic information we know bettors absorb, first and foremost there must be coverage of the betting types employed in a particular race. Even before the basic condition (see Meadowlands example above) the wagering info should be posted:

W-P-S/Exacta/\$0.50 Trifecta/\$0.10 Superfecta/Daily Double/\$0.50 Pick 3 (Races 4-5-6)/\$1.00 Pick 5 (Races 4-8)

Nothing is more important to the new or well-versed bettor than that. Then, a good editor (track publicist) should work on a simple version of the race conditions (leave the details for the race office to post for trainers/owners).

Race office conditions: ^[SEP]N/W \$22,500 in Last 5 Starts; AE: N/W 11 Extended PM Races Lifetime; (Wins for \$2,500 or Less First Money N/C); (N/W \$17,500 Drawn Inside)

Bettors' program conditions: Non-winners of \$22,000 last 5.

Yup. Any more will scare away novices and veterans will rarely complain the other conditions are gone. It is the closest thing to a "lock" that the racing secretary will not be swarmed with protests from bettors that conditions they rarely address for handicapping or betting are missing. And of course, the new bettors will understand the simple conditions and not be turned off to reading conditions in the future--which brings us to level two.

Level Two

This is the fun part, something that can be valuable for new and old customers, track income and general amusement. First, for income. Sell race-condition sponsorship. This should be an easy sell, after all, locally there are businesses and with ADWs and simulcasting there is a national and worldly audience in play. Sell the damned space in any way possible, offering recognition using name, brand, logo, slogan and even race-naming:

THE DELANEY CAR SERVICE PACE: Winners of \$10k this year^[SEP] THE DELANEY ROOT BEER INVITATIONAL TROT \$30k for highest earning trotters this season

You can also have a ton of fun with all the new space, especially to get attention and spread the track's easy-going attitude and camaraderie with patrons. Cut a deal with a streaming service that is promoting a new series or movie or stand-up comedian performance or documentary.

AFTER THE RACES: STREAM MARK DELANEY LIVE LAFFS ON NETFLIX [APPLE+ HBOMAX] or wherever.

There is no limit to the spinoff ads and promos you can use if you let your mind spin out and reach beyond the sport. There is also no limit to working with the race secretary to write creative races — for betting or exhibition — mostly as instructional devices for novice bettors. That aspect will enjoy all of the space we offer in part three for the December Alternative Actions.

BREAKING STRIDE

with TREY NOSRAC

Sitting across from my pal Shoes at a picnic table on the town square, I nodded in the direction of a bright yellow food truck. The name, *Serial Grillers*, was written above the sliding window. I said, "I spend a lot of time thinking about how I could do a better job than the people who are doing the jobs."

Shoes took a slug of Diet Coke, slowly shook his shaggy head, and said, "That is what happens when you have too much time on your hands when you don't have a career and keep changing jobs."

"I'm selective. The thing is, even during sporadic employment, I always think my boss could do better."

"He could have started by not hiring you."

Ignoring the shot, I continued, "Come on, don't you lay in bed thinking of how if you were the GM of a Major League Baseball franchise, you could make the right trades to win the pennant? Don't you daydream about how you could put together a great team on a low budget, and how could you pack the grandstands?"

"No, I lay in bed trying to remember if I turned off the garden hose or if my hairline will stop receding or how to keep my real business afloat."

"Ah, my friend, that real life will kill you. It's much more fun to design football plays in your mind or imagine that you would have pulled that trotter at the half-mile pole. I'm f an armchair General Manager who rolls things around in my mind before the game."

He plucked a potato chip from the bag, "Speaking as a real owner, of a real business, operating a greenhouse is not as simple as it appears. Few things are as simple as they appear from the outside."

"I know that. But if I had an idea to grow a better daffodil and draw new customers to your garden center, would you want to hear it?"

"What are you getting at?" he asked.

"I have part ownership in a pair of yearlings. They are being broken to harness and will go to a horse trainer. We haven't

decided on trainers. We have hired several trainers through the years, and honestly, I can't say a bad word about any of them. They are nice folks, trustworthy, and did a fine job."

"Okay, good people are hard to find. You found some. What's the problem?"

"We are looking for an extra dash of proactive communication. Don't get me wrong, every previous trainer answered our calls, explained anything we asked, and they welcomed us to their barns."

"So, what's your point? What more would you do if, heaven forbid, you were a trainer?"

I said, "Create routine video reports on the progress of two-year-old equine pupils for owners, and include these regular training updates as part of the training bill for a two-year-old racehorse."

"How regular? How big of a production?"

"Depends. If you only train a small stable, you can go all out, communicate weekly. For young or struggling trainers, this service could be a chance to stand out. I believe there is a category of owners who would appreciate the updates."

Shoes frowned and said, "Big stables and trainers with herds of horses probably don't have time to mess around with that. They are busy."

"True, but remember, this isn't racing season. I'm talking about the training season for a two-year-old, so it is a little slower-paced. The trainer doesn't even need to do the report. There are other options to make the video."

"Like what?"

"Trainers could delegate."

"To whom?"

"Grooms, second trainers, relatives, friends, spouses, young, old, basically anyone who wants to try an interesting project. Don't force anybody, rather present it as a fun thing to try, a project they could play around with and get creative."

I paused a second and then gave an example, "Trainer X goes to someone, say a nephew if film school or a groom. He says, '*Hey Stephanie, Joe Smith, the guy who owns Overexposure, asked if we could send him a three-minute clip every two weeks until qualifying. He would send you a small stipend. Are you Interested?*'"

Shoes said, "So Stephanie goes out and records the horse jogging."

I nodded, "Here's the thing. Some people will stand by the fence, push the record button and send the file. They will see this as a small task or a side job, and that's fine."

I snatched a potato chip for dramatic effect before continuing, "But, other people will see this as an opportunity, a challenge. There are always creative people looking for outlets. A certain segment might go as far as making a super-mini movie. They would go the extra mile and expand to a video of the horse in the barn, on the training track, and in the bath stall."

Shoes said, "Like at Junior High Science Fair - some of us poked a hole in a glob of Play Dough and called it a volcano, while other kids built a nuclear-powered skateboard."

"Exactly, the video reporter could go all Steven Spielberg and add narration, even a soundtrack. You can find all sorts of special effects and dub them using iPhone footage. The fledgling filmmakers could even record dialogue."

He shook his head, "Dialogue on the clips could get tricky, loose lips and all that stuff."

"Dude, who knows how this would play out, but for some owners, January to May is a long, long time. Cell phone videos of their horse jogging with the date and a few words would mean a lot."

"Those 'few words,' he put inside air quotes, "are likely the problem. If I'm your horse trainer, I don't want to get your hopes up. I would want to under-promise and over-deliver."

"I call BS. I'm sure trainers have horror stories of difficult owners going nuts when their young horse does not make it, but most of us owners know the game. We ALREADY have our hopes high. Hell, sometimes, those high hopes during the brutal winter months are the only thing we get out of our investment. We don't want salesmanship or over-the-top hype, but we do want the flames of our dreams to get stoked a bit."

He slurped the rest of his coke and rattled the ice in the glass, "Trey, you are an outgoing guy. Some people may even say you are a hyper clown. But I'm guessing plenty of horse trainers are introverted. They want owners who pay their bills, do not butt in, and maybe show up a few times."

I snapped, "We are those kinds of owners. This season, we merely are looking for a little more." I paused, then said, "Think of it like this, a traveler decides to attend a big, exciting event, say the World Cup Final in Barcelona next summer. They buy the tickets, book the flight and hotel, and count the days until the first Ole in November. Some of us dream of going to the same big match, but we are traveling via a very slow freighter around the Horn of Africa, soaking in every boring day."

"Boring might be the keyword. How much can trainers or grooms report about your horse going around in circles in February? Do you find a horse jogging in the snow interesting?"

"YES, plus any other barn news or other tidbits. Any crumb is an improvement over nothingness. Buying, training, staking, and racing a young horse is an experience, a rather unusual experience. Everyone knows their yearling may not be a racehorse, an extra layer of communication available via technology along the lines I am suggesting won't cost much and could make the experience deeper for both new and veteran owners."

He shrugged, "That's not as silly as most of your nonsense."

I smiled, "Now, let's talk about your Daffodils. My thinking is that if your business tried ..."

Brett Miller surpasses \$100 million in career earnings

When driver Brett Miller crossed the finished line with Charlie May to win the \$164,750 Matron Stakes 3-year-old colt and gelding pace at Dover Downs on Thursday (Nov. 11) he also crossed the \$100 million-dollar mark in earnings.

Miller, who has driven Charlie May in 24 of his 29 lifetime starts, took the son of McCardle to the lead from post seven to an opening quarter of :27. Charlie May never looked back, pacing the final half in :53 with a final quarter in :26.4, to win by a neck.

The 48-year-old Miller has now earned \$100,036,518 in his career.

"It feels good to hit the milestone," said Miller. "When I was 21 and driving one horse a week at Raceway Park, I use to think wouldn't it be nice to win 1,000 races. To get as lucky as I have gotten, is a great feeling."

Miller of Blacklick, OH, began his career in 1991. He won his first race at Northfield Park in October of 1992.

Miller's best year was 2004 when he won 639 wins. He has 380 wins this season and is currently ranked 9th among all drivers.

In 2016, Miller had his best year in earnings, winning \$7.8

million. Currently this year, he has earnings of \$5,666,492.

Miller mainly drives the Ohio southern circuit which consists of Hollywood Dayton Raceway, Eldorado Scioto Downs, and Miami Valley.

Dancer honored by Rutgers for lifelong dedication to horse industry

Assemblyman Ron Dancer, who sponsored the legislation to save the future of New Jersey horse racing by authorizing the lease of the Meadowlands racetrack and Monmouth Park to the private sector, has been honored with the Rutgers Equine Science Center's "Spirit of the Horse" award in recognition of his contributions to New Jersey's horse industry.

"Horses have always been a part of my life and I am honored to be able to give back to the equine industry, not only because it has been so impactful personally, but also because it is such an important part of New Jersey's identity," Dancer (R-Ocean) said.

Dancer is the son of the late famed harness horse racing driver Stanley Dancer and professionally raced and trained harness horses from 1968 through 1998. He has served on the boards of numerous equine organizations, including the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Sire Stakes, the U.S. Trotting Association, and the New Jersey Racing Commission.

As a lawmaker since 2002, Dancer has worked to ensure the sustainability of the equine industry. His legislation constitutionally dedicated revenues from sports wagering to horse racing purses. Additionally, Dancer was chairman of the USTA's racing helmet safety research and development committee that established a standard of safety for the manufacture of drivers' helmets.

Dancer's award was presented virtually at the center's annual Evening of Science and Celebration on Thursday, Nov. 11.

Rule change proposal regarding freeze brands

I would like to address a few rule change proposals that will be considered at the United States Trotting Association's annual meeting in March, 2022. I am a co-sponsor of a rule change proposal that continues, with slight modification, an existing USTA rule, 7.06, that requires a visible form of ID and a chip. Over several decades, the USTA has invested substantial money and staff resources to elevate the profile of Standardbreds in the pleasure horse world. During that same time frame, Standardbreds have had the benefits of a visible ID. Freeze brands have contributed greatly to the success of rescue groups that have pulled thousands of our horses out of kill pens, want ads, and auctions. These horses have been rehabbed, adopted and returned to the useful athletic life for which they were bred. With their added years of life, they contribute to the agricultural economy and promote our brand.

The growing numbers of off the track Standardbreds show their new connections have a love and admiration that extends outside of racing and service in the Amish community. There is no greater proof of this than the members of the Facebook group, "Standardbred Retraining Group", where post after post of the 10,000 members showcase the amazing attributes of Standardbreds. They have a well-earned reputation that has created a demand for them.

We know, without a shred of doubt, that a chip reader will never replace a brand in a crowded kill pen. Why would we purposely deny them the opportunity to be saved from the callousness of the Racing-Amish-Auction-Slaughter pipeline? It is obviously the humane option to continue freeze branding, as further supported by the recommendation of the Senior Advisor of Equine Protection of the Humane Society of the United States.

How did we get to this mandate for microchip only? The current rule in the USTA rule book 7.06 states - "No horse that has not been tattooed or freeze branded and implanted with a microchip as authorized by the USTA will be permitted to start at an extended pari-mutuel meeting unless the permission of the presiding judge is obtained..." At district meetings, when it has been pointed out that the current rule is not being followed, the answer has been that it is read wrong, or that was not the

intent, to it was introduced and passed in 2010, but didn't make its way into the rule book, to now it is simply a typo. I, and others, cannot find any explicit rule proposal that speaks to phasing out freeze-branding and moving to chips as the required USTA ID. Rather, in the 2018 April issue of *Hoof Beats* a brief article announces "The USTA registration committee approved a proposal that will require all Standardbreds, starting with foals born in 2019, to be implanted with a microchip".

There is no mention of phasing out brands and making them possible with a 50 per cent registration surcharge. This deserves a rule proposal stating the intention to move to chip only, where it would have gone through due process, with membership having an opportunity to weigh in, instead of now referring to adding the approval of chips in 2010, as an equal option, being the reason given for the mandate. Membership at large needs to be involved and informed. Why would we not want to give our horses a visible ID, which offers them a layer of protection throughout their whole lives and gives them the best opportunity to survive and thrive? Many individuals and groups are trying to get ahead of the dealers and this makes their work unnecessarily difficult. A freeze brand and a chip together are a win-win for our industry and our horses. Members, please consider a yes on rule change proposals 4, 18, 20, and 21 and let your directors know.

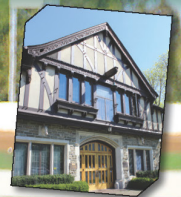
