# Lawson: Canadian sports betting bill "will destroy this industry"

The CEO of the Woodbine Entertainment Group is raising the alarm about a private member's bill aimed to legalize single-event sports betting in Canada. As written, the bill would allow non-racing betting outfits to provide fixed-odds wagering on horse racing without any money accruing to the industry itself.

Woodbine CEO Jim Lawson was particularly blunt when asked Friday what would happen to the horse racing industry if a bill to legalize single-event sports betting in Canada passes as written.

"It will destroy this industry in Canada. It will certainly destroy Woodbine," Lawson said.

Parlay wagering, such as offered in most provinces through the Ontario Lottery and Gaming corporation's (OLG) Proline product, has been legal for nearly 30 years. But legalizing the more popular single-event betting requires a change to Canada's criminal code.

That's exactly the aim of a private member's bill authored by Conservative MP Kevin Waugh of Saskatchewan.

In fact, for at least two decades, Woodbine has been a strong proponent of legalizing single-event sports betting with an eye on horse racing benefitting from it.

But Waugh's bill, as written, could cut horse racing out of the deal entirely, warns Lawson.

The issue is that the bill would allow non-racing betting companies to establish fixed-odds wagering on horse racing without the tracks getting a cut.

"We could not survive if fixed-odds wagering is permitted on racing and we're not a participant," Lawson said.

For example, a betting company could start taking fixed-odds bets on horse racing at Woodbine without Woodbine getting any of the money. The current pari-mutuel wagering system supports everyone employed at the track, the horsepeople that race there and the breeders that produce the horses to race in the first place.

"Picture FanDuel coming into our market and owning the sports wagering market and having a sportsbook with horse racing and us not getting any of that income... it would put us out of business," Lawson said. "We do not have the luxury to lose a huge percentage of our revenue source to a third



party that doesn't share in the cost of putting on that content or the purses."

One of the issues is the growing popularity of fixed-odds wagering.

"We have seen in the United States a quick and steady growth in the popularity of fixed-odds wagering on horse racing. We have seen fixed-odds wagering overtake pari-mutuel wagering in Australia as the most popular form of bet, and there are good reasons for that," Lawson said. "The biggest reason, I think, is that, as everyone appreciates who is fairly close to the game, most of our wagering comes from our big customers. These numbers get thrown about, but we believe 80 per cent of our wagering comes from 20 per cent of our customers. So those customers are betting large amounts of money and there's no question in our view, in talking to them, that some of them have already moved to offshore opportunities in the United States. It's obvious that fixed-odds wagering appeals to them. If you're wagering a large sum of money — for the purpose of this I'll use the example of \$5,000 or \$10,000 to win on a horse - you'd like the comfort of knowing that the horse is going off at 3-1, which are the odds you're staring at when you're deciding to make the bet, as opposed to late money coming in on a pari-mutuel and all of a sudden turning your \$10,000 to \$30,000 win-risk proposition... Then all of a sudden you could be betting \$10,000 to make \$10,000 instead of \$30,000."

Also, younger gamblers tend to prefer fixed-odds wagering, Lawson said. The pari-mutuel system, with its ever-fluctuating odds, can be a turn off.

"They are saying, 'Wait a second, I bet the horse at 3-1, what do you mean I don't get \$8 back on my \$2 bet?' It's a huge deterrent to bringing in new customers because that's not what the younger demographic is used to. The world has changed. Pari-mutuel wagering is a difficult concept and one that a young demographic does not accept," Lawson said.

Except, pari-mutuel wagering fuels the entire horse racing infrastructure that in Canada is estimated to support some 50,000 jobs nationwide.

Lawson said there is a simple solution — amend the bill.

"What we would propose is that the same parties that hold pari-mutuel licenses in the country also hold fixed-odds wagering on horse racing. So, if you have a pari-mutuel license to wager on horse racing, then you're the only party that can take fixed-odds wagering on horse racing," he said.

Failing that, mandating that non-racing gaming companies must partner with pari-mutuel licensees to offer fixed-odds

wagering on horse racing would also be acceptable, Lawson said.

"That's more the route that they've taken in New Jersey. When we've spoken to the government about the New Jersey model they really haven't taken it into consideration."


In either scenario, Lawson said the key is also allowing horse racing entities to take bets on other sports to make up for lost revenue from skinnier fixed-odds margins.

Lawson argued there are a lot of advantages for cutting Woodbine into an enhanced sports betting market.

Not only is it a Canadian company that mostly operates as a not-for-profit that invests its revenue back into Canadian jobs, but Woodbine already has the infrastructure and capacity through its HorsePlayer Interactive (HPI) wagering platform to expand into sports betting.

"We have the most robust sports wagering technology and it's country-wide, so we're regulated across the country," Lawson said. "We have the whole package ready to go to run online wagering and could do it on the systems that we have today... Picture our new Dark Horse app offering bets on the NHL.

"Part B of that, at least in Ontario, is that we have over 60 off-track wagering locations and the four principal ones are



Woodbine, Mohawk, Greenwood and WEGZ, where we could run sportsbooks out of those four places. We have the facilities. We have the technology. We have the location. We do \$300 to \$400 million in wagering out of our off-track locations today."

Waugh's main goal with his bill is to raisemuch-needed tax revenue with governments facing huge deficits to battle the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We, as a racetrack and as an industry, are taking the position that we are supportive of sports wagering and see the opportunity for the tax payer to have additional sources of revenue to offset government costs... in particular health costs and education costs. We've seen a spike in all of those costs with COVID-19 so it does make sense," Lawson said, adding the potential betting market is huge in Canada, with much of it now, "going offshore or being earned in illegal ways and not being taxed or any percentage going to the government. That's problematic."

Lawson said specifically granting WEG a license to operate single-event sports betting would also be another positive for government coffers because it would allow Ontario to stop directly subsidizing horse racing, which it currently does to the tune of some \$100 million annually.

"The government wants to get horse racing off any sort of subsidy and, believe me, horse racing wants to get off any sort of government subsidy," Lawson said. "This is one of the ways we could do it... We're not going to have a [sports betting] monopoly, but having us play a significant role in sports wagering, either with sportsbooks or online is certainly the way to go to make this work for the taxpayer and make this work for the horse racing industry."

Lawson said bill PMB C-218 has now gone for a second reading and he expects it will be voted on in parliament during the first order of 2021. Though private members bills rarely are successful, particularly ones from MPs from a party that doesn't hold power, don't count this one out given the desperate need for revenue and the fact the United States has embraced sports betting. If it passes, it will likely go to a number of committees before becoming law.

That leaves little time for the horse racing industry to convince politicians of the harm the bill will do to the industry if it is not amended.

### A conversation with trainer and astute yearling picker Jack Darling

Jack Darling was familiar with horses as a kid, but the riding and jumping kind. He really had no connection with harness horses until a friend who was involved with Western Fair Raceway took him to the races there and he liked it. Darling was 19.

His ambition soon evolved from wagering on them to deciding that he would like to own and train them.

His first venture was when he claimed Yankee BB at Western Fair for \$1,500 and raced it back the following week at Woodstock for \$1,750. He won and was claimed.

He not only made some purse money, but he also wagered on it. It turned out to be a very good payday.

In the early years, he not only trained, but he drove as well. His circuit consisted of Western Fair, then to Buffalo and Batavia and on to Windsor and across the river to Hazel Park. In winter he'd head south and race at Pompano Park.

He gave up driving at the age of 35. There were so many exceptional drivers at Windsor before and at the time that he realized he was at a disadvantage driving against them. He was better off utilizing them for his own benefit rather than going against them. Included in the drivers colony were: Lew Williams, Greg Wright, Ray Remmen, Bill Gale and a couple of young kids named John Campbell and Trevor Richie.

After 20 years of racing overnight horses he decided to take a crack at the yearling game.

His first yearling purchase was a colt that he bought for \$4,000 named Steady Star Time. He did pretty well with him and sold him for a profit.

From that point on, that became his business model.

"One never goes broke taking a profit," he said. "If someone will pay me what I think is a fair price for a horse that I own I will sell. I look forward to the next owner having as much, if not more success with the horse than I had. That way,

everybody is happy and maybe that person will come back and buy more from me."


Through the years, he had significant and successful partnerships with Dan Smith and Trevor Richie.

He recalls his first real good horse as being Terry Herbert.

He also became quite successful in improving good racehorses. To some degree, he credits his success to never having a really large stable, although the opportunities were always there to have that. He almost always owned the horses in his stable wholly or in partnership.

He never had more than 20 head in training. That size allowed him to give more individual attention to each horse under his care and owning them allowed him the freedom to make all decisions relating to them.

He considers himself to be an assiduous shopper. This author can certainly attest to that. He studies his catalog closely and is usually down to a relatively small number of horses to look at by the time he arrives at a sale. Before going, he has studied the videos of the ones that first interested him.

On a domestic note, Jack's wife Ann helps with the bookkeeping and has also helped with the horses when needed. Their son, Justin, works with Jack with the horses and daughter Jaclyn is a business woman in Windsor. She is married to John and they have a son Julian. Those three are their biggest fans.

Jack, you are one of the most astute yearling buyers that I've known. I can almost visualize the prototype of the type of yearling you look for. What is it you want to see in a yearling?

"I suppose the first thing I want to see is the absence of faults. I like for a horse to have what I consider a classy look. Ideally, I'd like a little extra of everything. I wantthem to be a little bigger, to have a bigger ass end and shoulder. I go back to the Billy Haughton four finger test in the original edition of *Care and Training of the Trotter and Pacer*. I want a horse to have a wide jaw, wide enough to easily fit four fingers. Of course I'm talking about my fingers which are average in size. I want a wide nostril. Both of these items indicate to me that the horse will be able to get its air properly. I watch the videos closely. A horse that paddles is a definite no-no. I like a nice head and a good sharp eye. I'm usually not very interested in a horse who appears to be dull or disinterested."

In the past you'd buy horses from all over. In recent years, you seem to have concentrated almost entirely on Ontario-sired ones.

"There are several reasons. Ontario-sired horses have shown that they can compete anywhere. Of course, having a world renowned sire like Bettors Delight here certainly helps a great deal. But he isn't the only one. Trotters like Kadabra, Balanced Image and Muscle Mass have shown that they can sire horses that are competitive everywhere. Trixton arriving here will be a big plus. Shadow Plays and Sportswriters and others are quite competitive. As I get older, shipping horses all over the place is not only taxing on me and the horses, but can also be quite expensive. The Ontario program is one of, if not the best Sires Stakes program in the world. Having an Ontario-bred also cuts down significantly on the stakes payments."

You've just had one of your best seasons ever with 3-year-old Beaumond Hanover and 2-year-old Bulldog Hanover, quite arguably both being the best of the class in the province. Tell me a little about them.

**Beaumond Hanover**— "I remember him as being one of the early sellers in the catalog, maybe number five or thereabouts. I thought he was a gorgeous colt who impressed me in every way. I was fairly certain that he would bring \$100,000 or even more. I was pretty sure that I wouldn't be able to afford to buy him. I decided to just hang around when he was selling, on the off chance that he would bring a price in my range. I was pretty surprised and very pleased to be able to corral him for \$45,000.

"As a 2-year-old, he trained very well. I thought that he had a chance to be a really good one. He was and still is a really good feeling colt. He got to kicking in the stall and sustained a real bad bone bruise. That kept him from starting until late in the season where he showed some talent and won a couple of races. He came back great this year and has earned over \$400,000. One of his best races was in the North America Cup when he had a tough trip coming first up on Tall Dark Stranger and still only got beat a length and a half."

Bulldog Hanover— "He was a beautiful colt that I bought on Day Three at Harrisburg for \$27,000. His dam BJ's Squall was a terrific race filly, but to that time really hadn't come close to replicating herself. All last winter, everyone including myself thought he was only our second best colt. He was always nice but he trained together with a Sportswriter colt who we all thought was a lot better. As time went on, he gradually came close to catching up. I remember one day thinking to myself, by the time this is over, he just might be our best 2-year-old. As the season progressed, he just got better and better. I think his performance in winning the OSS Super Finals just might have been one of the greatest performances I've ever seen by a 2-year-old — not only an Ontario 2-year-old, but by any anywhere."

I'm guessing that it's likely not a coincidence that Beaumond and Bulldog are Hanovers. Do you have any special places where you like to shop?

"Not necessarily so. I look at most places. But I feel that I've built up a pretty good relationship with the folks there. I'm a big believer in videos. I really love the way they do theirs. Also, I feel that they are loyal to their customers. I remember buying Winbak Maya as a yearling for \$100,000. After she was done racing, I asked her breeder at the Lexington Sale if they were willing to give me a yearling credit for \$50,000 for her. I could have been over reacting to it, but I felt that I got a brushoff. If I had got the credit, I would have spent all of that and probably significantly more with them. I went to see you the next morning and you said that you'd speak to Dr. J and Jim Simpson and get back to me. The next time I saw you, you said we had a deal. She's been a good producer for Hanover. \*Her yearling this year sold for \$135,000. I couldn't

be happier for them. If I've got a worthwhile filly or mare to sell, I now generally go to Hanover first. I learned that from Bill Herbert (see below)."

\* Author's note. Of some interest with this yearling is the fact that he is line bred to Yankee Blondie. On top as the dam of Muscle Hill and below as the great grandam of the colt named Whiskey Hanover. He will be trained by Julie and Andy Miller.

### You started out mostly with overnighters and claimers and gradually made the transition to youngsters.

"The first really good horse I had was Terry Herbert. I bought him privately from Bill Herbert for \$11,000. He was racing in a series where he was considered to be one of the also rans. He wasn't even going to make the final. Bill said that if by some miracle he did and did well in it, he would hope that I reconsider the price. As luck would have it, another one scratched out of the final and he drew in from the outside. I drove him myself, went to the top and won easily. When I got the purse check, I gave Bill a few thousand more. I remember him saying to me that I would never regret doing the right thing. From that point on, if Bill had a horse to sell, I would have first dibs on it. Terry Herbert went on to be a consistent open and free-for-all winner. In the interim, though, we nearly lost him. He had a bout of severe colic resulting in his being operated on and having surgery to remove about 20 feet of intestines."

You've had a lot of very good horses, some bordering on greatness. Among them were Northern Luck, Twin B Champ, Apprentice Hanover, Northern Sky, Decor, Big McDeal, Gothic Dream, Ticket To Rock, Diehard Fan, Faded Glory, Diamond Dawn, JR Mint, Silent Swing, St Lads Popcorn, Pearl River Matt and Low Places. Which one was your favorite?

"I suppose that prior to this year it would be Twin B Champ. He was very special. He was the favorite in the North America Cup and broke down. But in the past year, it would be hard to duplicate the success we had with Bulldog Hanover and Beaumond Hanover. All three of them occupy a special place in my heart."

### Who would be the person you've learned the most from in training horses?

"There have been several. I suppose number one would be Bob McIntosh. Look at his record – two Halls of Fame, year after year being successful on the racetrack and as a breeder as well. Also, I learned a lot from the first edition of *Care and Training of the Trotter and Pacer*. It was my bible for the longest time."

### How about drivers? Who is the best that you've ever seen?

"Undoubtedly, that would have to be John Campbell. He was a true professional. He always came prepared. He came early and was free to discuss any horse with you. There are more good drivers, maybe even great drivers today than there ever have been. With many, in many instances, I'd differentiate between those who are overnight drivers, Grand Circuit type drivers and those I'd like to use in helping a green 2-year-old starting out. Among the best two in the latter category, Bill Gale and Trevor Richie were excellent."

### What has been your greatest thrill in all your years in harness racing?

"Before this year, it was winning the Metro with Gothic Dream. This year,. it was equalled with Bulldog and Beaumond in the Ontario Super Finals. I'm really excited and looking forward to racing the two next year. I suppose some of Beaumond's races will take us out of Ontario; also some of Bulldog's. I sure hope that darn virus is gone by then."

### What has been your greatest disappointment?

"I've never won a Breeders Crown. I thought I had a great chance with Northern Sky. She was just super warming up for the race. She was always at her best racing off a helmet. As the race turned out, she was forced to cut it. She just got nipped at the wire."

In recent years, you and your wife have taken the winters off traveling, usually in the southwestern United States leaving your horses in good hands until you returned. In this COVID-19 year, what are your plans?

"To be truthful, I have no idea. This whole COVID situation is such a mess. For one thing, we wouldn't be allowed to cross the border by automobile. For another, especially based on the recent reports, things are getting worse rather than better. The reports from Pfizer on their vaccine are encouraging, though. Things can change. But for the moment, I think we will probably just stay put."

### Driving cream rises to the top in Breeders Crown

It's clear the Breeders Crown brings out the best in the sport's best drivers. Let's look at the history.

### Average Crown wins per year

The list of drivers ranked by the average number of Crown wins is as follows:

Brian Sears - 1.8

Yannick Gingras - 1.5

John Campbell - 1.4

Tim Tetrick - 1.4

David Miller - 1.2

Ron Pierce - 1.2

#### Lookalike seasons

In 2013, the top 5 drivers in North America won all 12 Crowns at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

The top three had remarkably similar results:

Pierce - 11 3-3-0

Tetrick - 11 3-0-3

Gingras - 11 3-1-1

### **Every final**

Twenty-nine times in Breeders Crown history a driver has driven in every Crown final:

Campbell - 11 times

Mike Lachance, Tetrick, Sears and Pierce — three times, each Miller and Luc Ouellette — once, each

### Multiple winners

Six different times as many as nine drivers have won at least one Crown in a single year:

1990-91-93-95-96 and 2011.

### The big 5-0

This is the list of Breeders Crown driving wins for those past their 50th birthday:

Pierce -15 wins in 103 attempts.

Miller - 12 wins in 59 drives.

Sears — 7 wins, which is impressive considering he has had just three Crown years since turning 50.

Campbell and Lachance each won six after turning 50. Lachance won four in the Crown year of 2000, just prior to his 50th.

### Oh, Canada

The first 19 years of the Breeders Crown a Canadian-born driver led all 19 years:

Campbell - 13, Bill O'Donnell - 3, Lachance - 2 and Wally Hennessey - 1

The last 18 years of the Breeders Crown a Canadian-born driver has led only twice:

Gingras in 2014 and 2017

P.S. Gingras' streak of nine straight years winning at least one Crown is alive. Campbell holds the record at 15 (1984-1998)

### Miller past \$14 million

David Miller is now past \$14 million all time in the Breeders Crown and is second behind Campbell at \$22,483,677.

### Six for Dunn

Dexter Dunn is the first driver to win six Breeders Crowns in his first two years.

### These three kings

Still the three biggest money seasons for one driver in a Breeders Crown year are:

- 1. Campbell 2001 \$1,684,292
- 2. Sears 2005 \$1,647,026
- 3. Tetrick 2012 \$1,627,400

### Pierce went out with a bang

Ron Pierce retired after being the leading Breeders Crown driver in the previous five years combined.

He retired on March 8, 2015, but his combined money total from the prior five Crowns was \$4,312,062 (2010-2014), ranking him number one. His 10 wins in that stretch tied with Gingras. Pierce's composite was 53 10-7-5.











# Jessica Buckley - Woodbine's senior vice-president of standardbred and thoroughbred racing

Born in St. Thomas, ON, Jessica Buckley never imagined one day she would be the senior vice-president of standardbred and thoroughbred racing for Canada's largest horse racing company — the Woodbine Entertainment Group.

"I have had the great luck of making a career in racing. After taking a summer job at Woodbine Entertainment, following graduation from university, I became fascinated with the complexities of the racing business.

"Although it was not my immediate plan, opportunities for innovation were arising with technology. After being part of the team that launched HPI bet (HorsePlayer Interactive) and HPI TV, I left Woodbine after eight years to pursue an opportunity in California with Magna Entertainment (now The Stronach Group) where I helped launch Xpress Bet and Horse Racing TV (now TVG2).

"After working with Magna for 9 years, I returned to Canada and to Woodbine where I began working with the team on the property development in the role of Government Relations and Community Relations.

"During that time the Woodbine board made the decision to move harness racing year round to Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"In 2017, when I became president of Mohawk Park, I worked with a team to make this special property and track a year-round destination for racing and entertainment.

"In 2020, my role shifted to senior vice-president of standardbred and thoroughbred racing — now dividing my time between the two breeds," said Buckley.

Jessica's love for horses started with her mother, Mary Anderson, who was a pony clubber in London, ON.

"My mother kept her pony, Bay Lady, in a field next to cottages in Orchard Beach. In the bliss of the 1950s, when she was in her early teens on summer vacation, she met my dad, Bob, in nearby Port Stanley.

"She jumped her pony over the hedges between the cottages and swam with Bay Lady at Little Beach on the

shores of Lake Erie.

"My father innately loved horses and wanted to be around them so together in their early 20s they bought their first thoroughbred broodmare and set out to become breeders. It was a shared passion.

"They were the first generation of horsepeople in each of their families and successfully operated a thoroughbred breeding farm for many years in St. Thomas, Ontario.

"Decades later, my brother, David Anderson, piqued my dad's interest in standardbreds. It was a mind leap at the time, but David convinced my dad there was a great value in the business. He acted as bloodstock agent and soon found some incredible fillies at the sales and they went on to have harness racing success together."

It's no surprise Buckley has been so successful in her position, for she is determined that Woodbine become the #1 harness racetrack in North America. This includes challenging every season to come up with innovations in racing and new ways to do things.

"If our tests in innovation do not work out, we don't think of it as a complete failure — we learn and adjust. Staying focused on integrity in racing is of utmost importance for our players and horse people.

"Racing is an industry with much tradition, but we must continue to make changes to evolve over time and continue to appeal to the new generation of fans and the next generation of horsepeople."

What are some future plans for Woodbine Mohawk Park?

"Future plans include year two of the Mohawk Million in 2021, along with our stakes program —one of the best in North America.

"We have invested over \$16 million in the track and facilities over the past three years. We will continue to invest

in our wagering infrastructure, including Dark Horse and HPI bet.com, which have been a massive part of our shift to digital wagering during COVID-19.

"This shift has accelerated the penetration of online wagering and allows for further investment in the Dark Horse app, built for the next generation sports wagering fan."

Racing horses at Woodbine has become more popular for trainer/owners, despite the winters that can be quite brutal.

"Winter racing is not for the faint of heart. I am amazed at the resilience of the horsepeople on cold nights. We have an incredible track surface crew that work very hard to keep the track race ready: snow, sleet or warmer winter days.

"The new paddock extension and renovations to winterize the race paddock have made the experience much more comfortable during the winter months.

"Hosting a year-round circuit creates a great opportunity for people to make a living here in Ontario."

As far as racing in 2021, Buckley said, "We are focusing on continuing the positive momentum with the wagering pools, confidence in our product with large fields, integrity in racing and world class standardbreds.

"I'm happy to see that people are still investing in horses at the fall sales. I think there will be some racing jurisdictions that may suffer with uncertainty, but in Ontario, we plan to continue strong into the new year and move ahead with great opportunities for all."

### Lmc Bumble Bee, Keith Waples' Karma Seelster take SBOA finals

**Karma Seelster** and **Lmc Bumble Bee** captured SBOA Stakes glory Saturday (Nov. 14) to wrap up the 2020 stakes season at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

With the temperature sitting at the freezing mark, the SBOAs saw full fields of 10 Ontario-sired fillies clash in the \$138,518 pacing final and \$141,518 trotting final.

Karma Seelster finally got her big win, shooting up the rail after a two-hole trip to win in 1:53 for driver Doug McNair and trainer Gregg McNair (replay here) The daughter of Sportswriter—Kiddie Cocktail entered the evening with over \$200,000 earned this season, despite having just found the winner's circle twice in 14 starts.

"She finishes second, third quite a bit and I mean going for money like that it adds up," said McNair of Karma Seelster. "It's a little frustrating sometimes as a driver when you get a trip like that and sometimes she'll shoot through and just kind of hang around and finish second and third, but she really put out tonight and raced great."

Karma Seelster blasted to the front, posting a :27.2 opening quarter. Rose Run Victory also flashed early speed and made the front early in the second-quarter after being parked around the first turn.

The middle-half saw little action, as Rose Run Victory got

to the half in a comfortable :56.3 and three-quarters in 1:26. Lauras Love angled out from third to sit first-up on the far turn, while Rose Run Vantage followed that cover.

In the stretch, Karma Seelster found daylight up the rail and shot through to the lead, holding off Rose Run Vantage in the center by a head in 1:53. Lauras Love finished third, while Rose Run Victory was fourth.

"I figured the way Hensley's filly (Rose Run Victory) raced last week she was probably the one to follow and as soon as I made the front he was on the move right away," said McNair. "In the last turn I just thought we were racing for second or third off those fractions, but things opened up and she raced great."

Karma Seelster's win is a family affair as she is owned by Hall of Famer Keith Waples, his wife Eileen Waples and their daughter Karen Hauver. The pacing filly now has three wins and \$277,570 earned this season to bring her career totals to seven wins and \$539,775.

A \$2 win ticket on Karma Seelster returned \$5.70.

The SBOA Filly Trot final delivered a thrilling finish, with Lmc Bumble Bee capitalizing off some nifty stickhandling from driver James MacDonald to win at odds of 9-1 (replay here).

"I was in an awful spot with nowhere to go," said MacDonald about his position at three-quarters. "They kind of hooked wheels for a second in front of me and I got a seam to get out and at the top of the stretch I was just dying for some daylight because I had all kinds of trot."

Lmc Bumble Bee hustled off the wings of the gate to lead into the first-turn just before Shape Shifter cleared to command at a :27.1 opening quarter. Princesspartypants, who was parked around the first turn, got a rough ride in the second-quarter on her way to the top, finally clearing at a huge :55.2 half.

Race favorite P L Notsonice was out and moving going to the half, taking over the top spot racing to three-quarters in 1:25.1. Second-choice Susies Lady was left uncovered first-up, while Lmc Bumble Bee was pinned at the rail and shuffled back to seventh turning for home.

The stretch drive saw P L Notsonice and Susies Lady square off for a good chunk, but neither filly had enough in the tank to hold off the back field.

Jula Shes Magic and Yen were marching strong in the center, but the strongest of all was Lmc Bumble Bee. The Nick Gallucci trainee and MacDonald were flying up behind rivals before diving down to the rail and maintaining momentum to pull off the thrilling victory by three-quarters of a length over Jula Shes Magic.

Yen grabbed third, while Susies Lady and P L Notsonice settled for fourth and fifth, respectively.

A daughter of Muscle Mass out of Hornby Gem, Lmc

Bumble Bee has found her best stride late in the season after some setbacks.

"When we trained her down, we thought she was the best trotting filly we had ever owned," said owner Frank Cirillo, who shares ownership with his daughter Loredana. "She got two surgeries last year, she had two surgeries this year after the first Gold and we never thought she'd make it back, but (Nick) Gallucci did just an amazing job bringing her back, so it's just unbelievable to be standing here right now."

The Gallucci-trained Lmc Bumble Bee is now four-for-nine with \$121,975 earned on the season. Her clocking of 1:55 on Saturday established a new career best.

Lmc Bumble Bee will be racing in the upcoming Harvest Series, as she had little money on her card prior to October and met the eligibility. She paid \$20 to win.

Live racing resumes Monday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Post time is 7 p.m.

### The art of selling a hobby horse

"My latest hobby is etymology. Every morning an app dings me and explains the origin of a word."

David smiled and said, "Harness racing, jai alai, snooker, and now etymology, you're always traveling sideroads."

"That's where the action is, my friend. Today's word is hobby. In the 13th century, the word hobby referred to a small horse. Then it came to describe a toy horse, a hobbyhorse. Hobbyhorse evolved in the modern sense to a favorite pastime, something that you do typically for fun, and you typically do it fairly regularly."

"Mildly interesting." Then he asked, "Do you think harness racing people are hobbyists, business people, or sporting people?"

I thought for a moment, "Hmm, tough question. I would go with hobbyists."

He nodded. "I agree. There are undoubtedly a few business people scattered in the harness herd. If you did a deep analytical dive on the spreadsheets of owners racing horses and gamblers gambling on horses, the business side of the equation would not be favorable."

"You could put me in that category. I say horses are my investment, but I'm addicted. On the rare occasion when I make a buck, I plow everything right back into a new horse. The idea you are going to get rich buying and betting racehorses borders between delusional and illusional. Still, it's so much fun to try to beat the odds."

He said, "For many people, hobbies are a big part of their psyche. The hobby becomes their world, and they stay with it for life."

"Harness players are loyal and tough, but the demographics are horrible. I caught the racing bug in my forties. I always felt like the youngest guy at the sale or in the grandstands. New players are rare birds."

He shrugged, "Ageing demographics are a problem for plenty of hobbies. People tend to pursue the same activities throughout their lives because hobbies are a powerful way to hold on to our sense of self as time passes and lives change. Hobbies allow people to travel back in time, to connect with the people we were when we were starting our lives."

I nodded, "That makes sense and probably applies to horse racing."

"Brain experiments find that people in their seventies or eighties who play the violin, ride in old hot rod cars, or sing in a choir are often momentarily transported to earlier moments in their life when they did these things."

I asked, "What about you, a former executive and a young retiree? Do you have any hobbies?"

"One. Not very many people know about my little passion."

I opened my hands, "Do I need to pull out the thumbscrews."

He smiled, "I am a bibliophile."

"You study the bible?"

He chuckled, "No, I collect old books."

"You never talked about that. Where did that come from?"

"At the tech company, 30 years ago. The money was flowing, and one of my co-workers, Wally Davenport, suggested rare books as a good investment, sort of an alternative to buying rare art or rare coins."

"Books? Just like that? Out of the blue?"

"Pretty much. We didn't know anything about rare books, but we figured we were smart, and we would learn. The idea was that this would be a great place to stash and increase our money."

"Did you?"

"No, we spent a lot of money. The rare times I sold a book, I plowed the money back. I got the book bug and have been collecting ever since. It's fascinating. Collecting books is one of those things that sneaks up and grabs certain people."

"That sounds like a person involved in racing."

"Owning rare old books, looking at them, and reading them is enjoyable. But Trey, the hunt, the research, and dreaming of owning certain books is addictive."

"What kind of books?"

"Well, you know how your sport has breeders, gamblers, owners, trainers, pacers, trotters, young horses, claimers, and other specialties?"

"Of course."

"In the book collecting world, we have specialties like Shakespeare folios, bibles, fiction, science, poetry, antiquities, incunabula, manuscripts, cookbooks, dust jackets, comic books, books by century, first editions, and pamphlets. The list is endless."

"What's your area?"

"Modern firsts by year. I'm a budding Bibliophagist."

I blinked. In my hesitation, David smiled and raised his index finger and said, "Bookmark this moment."

"What moment?"

"While you are sitting there, confused. Your confusion is my fault. My method of introducing book collecting was a mistake. I should have been clearer. I should have used a simple explanation and engaged you in a dialogue."

"I agree, you were a tad persiflage."

He raised his eyebrows.

"My etymology word from Monday. The word comes from 1757, French from persifler," to engage in light, flippant banter suggesting an ironical or frivolous treatment of a subject."

He chuckled. "Guilty as charged. My introduction was a mistake. Book collecting and horse racing are complicated emotional pastimes. When face to face with a possible recruit on the doorstep, we need to tread carefully. Now, where were we?

I said, "Modern firsts and what sounded like a swear word."

He collected himself, then spoke slowly, "The modern era in book collecting is the century between 1900 to 2000. First is slang for a first edition. My goal is to collect a copy of the top fiction book published each year. For example, pick a year between 1900 and 2000, any year."

I said, "Um, 1930."

"Okay, since my collection consists of exactly 100 books, I know them by heart. The Maltese Falcon by author Dashiell Hammett is renowned as the most influential fiction book published in 1930. Published by Alfred A. Knopf of New York City, The Maltese Falcon started as a serialized story in Black Mask, a pulp magazine that focused on crime fiction."

I asked, "That's it, a rich guy like you, a hundred books, that's the end of the story?"

"No, absolutely not, a book collector's story never ends. I constantly replace each copy with a cleaner edition, an edition signed by the author, or a copy with a mint condition dustjacket. I am currently trying to extend slightly outside of

the modern era to the first editions of books published before 1900."

"And what about the swear word?"

He smiled, "A bibliophagist refers to collectors who enjoy reading the books they collect."

I nodded, "Okay, I get it. Your second answer did not make me feel like an idiot. I see where you could find something as stupid as collecting books, not stupid."

He said, "Why don't you try?"

"Book collecting?"

"No, try explaining harness horse racing to someone. I remember the first time I asked you about your hobby, and you said, I'm into yearlings for stakes racing. Your answer was very confusing and flippant."

"That's how I roll."

"Try rolling more clearly, uniquely. Make the audience want to go forward. Pretend you just met me, you mentioned you like horse racing, and I asked you what sort of racing?"

I cleared my throat and used his example to say, "I'm a fan of trotters. They're large horses and move like carriage horses. Each year, I buy a baby, watch it grow, pay someone to take good care of it, and teach it how to race. Every day I dream that when the young horse is old enough to compete against others, it will bring me thrills. The process is fascinating."

He nodded. "Very few people listening to that explanation of your hobby would be confused or intimidated."

### Mandatory Pick 5 distribution on Pocono's closing day

Saturday afternoon's (Nov. 14) final card of 2020 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono contained the lure of a \$239,000+ carryover into a mandatory distribution of the Rainbow Pick 5 pool for picking the winners of the last five races of the year. With anticipation of a nice payoff no matter whether a chalk player or longshot fancier, bettors poured \$441,661 into the Rainbow Pick 5 pool, so that after the percentage deduction on the day's play, the pool distributed (carryover and "fresh money") reached \$614,889.

Only two of the nine favorites in races run before the Pick 5 events had emerged victorious, but those fortunes started to turn when favored Benson Boys N rallied strongly out of the two-hole to take a 1:50.4 lifetime mark in the \$16,000 claiming handicap pacing feature. Hunter Oakes guided the winner of three straight for trainer Steve Brabrook and owner Alan Johnston, and the favorite paid \$6.00 to win in the first Pick 5 contest.

Two more favorites followed in the next two Pick 5 events, with Anthony Napolitano guiding a \$4.60 winner and brother George behind a \$2.60 heavy chalk. 4-5 favorite Scootnroll, 10 for 12 in his career before the race, made a break at the start of the fourth event, but "form" players received some consolation from Billy Lincoln N, who won and paid \$6.60 as the second choice. The second choice also came through in the finale to the tune of a \$7.20 win mutuel.

The winning combination of 5-(2,3)-4-3-4 (the #3 was scratched from the second leg, and the substituted favorite won) returned \$143.58 per 20-cent investment in the giant pool. Doubtless some players forming large numbers of combination tickets had multiple "hits" with the races so living up to form, so many people found a good chunk of gold at the end of this Rainbow.

The total handle on the Pocono closing day handle was added up to \$845,976, with a bit over half of that brought in by the mandatory Rainbow Pick 5 payoff.

Speaking of continued form, George Napolitano Jr. took his ninth straight sulky dash-winning championship and the 14th of his unparalleled career at The Downs, winning four on closing day to boost his yearly total to 212. His 14 4-4-0 scorecard after driving every race actually boosted his seasonal UDR to .380 with rounding up – in that category he



now has seven crowns in a row and twelve overall. (George was also winningest trainer at Pocono five times.)

Finally, with everything else that Ron Burke has won in recent years, Saturday saw him win his first training title in Pocono annals, with a winner on the closing card boosting his 2020 total to 67 during the 86-day meeting.
