was that it would be held on the same day as the Kentucky Sires Stakes finals. I had dinner last night with some of the Burke crew. They said that they felt cheated. One of their motivating factors in buying high-priced yearling trotting colts this year was the million-dollar trot. The fully intended to buy two spots in the event. What do you think?

First of all, and of the utmost importance, I think the innuendo of you guery is way off base. There is no chance that this was a ploy to enhance the prices at the Lexington sale. Neither the sale company nor any of its directors had anything to do with the idea of the race. They were just happy to oblige the idea that was propagated by John Campbell. I know in my heart you meant no ill will by your question, but it certainly didn't come across in a kindly fashion.

I said it was a weak year so I will give you the best of a bad group, but these are all at least four or five stars a worth reading: The Great Alone by Kristen Hannah, The Cuban Affair by Nelson DeMille, The Rooster Bar by John Grisham and A Woman In The Window by A.J. Finn (my favorite of a bad year). Books just out and coming soon you should watch the list for are, The Reckoning by John Grisham, The Long Road to Mercy by David Balducci, Past Tense by Lee Child, and Dark Sacred Night by Michael Connelly. My tip for the new year to my reading friends: When a popular writer dies and a contemporary tries to keep the run alive as in The Girl With the Dragon Tattoo series DONT fall in that trap, it's a waste of time and money.

Thanks to all my readers for their kind words. I hope to have a list of the coming 2-year-olds in training at Sunshine Meadows shortly. Have a wonderful week.

Long shots steal the show in sophomore Matrons

A pair of long shots in This Is The Plan and The Downtown Bus stole the show in the \$193,750 Matron Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings on Thursday (Nov. 15) at Dover Downs, tag-teaming in deep stretch to nose out Jimmy Freight in a 1:49.1 dead heat.

While Jimmy Freight and local favorite Lather Up tasted defeat in their Matron split, divisional standouts Six Pack and Youaremycandygirl refused to disappoint in their respective events.

\$210,150 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot (race four)

In a meeting of the millionaires, dual classic winner Six Pack (\$3.00) made easy work of the first-over Met's Hall en route to a 1:54.1 score over sloppy going in his Matron Stakes division.

Trainer/driver Åke Svanstedt sent the son of Muscle Mass to the front immediately from post five, and the pair floated clear of Fashionwoodchopper (Yannick Gingras) midway on the first turn before rating early splits of :28.1 and :57.3. Up the backstretch, Met's Hall (Andy Miller) sustained a first-over ascent out of third to within half a length of the lead, but Six Pack shrugged off his rival under minimal hand urging through the final turn.

With Met's Hall no longer a threat past three-quarters in 1:26, Six Pack accelerated away from Fashionwoodchopper to take his 15th career win by four lengths. Mississippi Storm (Andy McCarthy) saved ground after gapping cover to just collar the weakening Met's Hall for third.

Svanstedt co-owns Six Pack with Little E LLC, Stall Kalmar FF, and Lars Berg.

\$183,900 3-Year-Old Filly Trot (race six)

Indiana standout Custom Cantab (\$17.80) had something left in the stretch after winning a cutthroat first-quarter duel, as she was able to turn aside Plunge Blue Chip not once, but twice en route to a 1:53.1 Matron score.

David Miller put the Mr Cantab filly in play from the outset, but the pair faced immediate resistance from Supergirl Riley (Tony Morgan) on approach to the first turn. After pressing in the two-path through a :26.4 first quarter, Custom Cantab accelerated to the fore with a circuit to go, but shortly thereafter faced pressure from the emerging Plunge Blue Chip (Åke Svanstedt) nearing a :55.2 half.

Custom Cantab asserted up the backstretch, but had to dig in again a quarter from home to fend off the resurgent Plunge Blue Chip a second time on the final turn. Not only did she have enough to parry her outside rival, but she also kept a second push from Supergirl Riley — who emerged up the open stretch in the final sixteenth — a head short. Plunge Blue Chip's third-place finish, 1-3/4 lengths behind, was enough to push her past the million-dollar mark in

career earnings, while Breeders Crown winner Lily Stride (Tim Tetrick) failed to threaten from second-over and finished last.

Trainer Chris Beaver co-owns 15-time winner Custom Cantab with Donald Robinson and RBH Ventures Inc.

\$159,350 3-Year-Old Filly Pace (race 10)

Youaremycandygirl (\$2.40) strode strongly to the front and never looked back, avenging her Breeders Crown defeat to stablemate Percy Bluechip with a 1:51.3 win in their Matron event.

Entering off a resounding 9-3/4 length win in the \$113,000 USS Indy at Hoosier Park, Youaremycandygirl and driver Yannick Gingras out-sprinted Percy Bluechip (Matt Kakaley) and Solitary (Andy Miller) through a :27.2 first quarter before pulling the pace back. With a circuit to go, Dance Blue (Andy McCarthy) commenced a first-over bid from fifth and advanced steadily as the pace slackened through a :56.2 half.

Up the backstretch, Youaremycandygirl's lead was cut to a length and a quarter by Dance Blue, but was never in jeopardy. The daughter of American Ideal coasted through a :27.1 third quarter to evade Dance Blue and kept the pocket-sitting Percy Bluechip 1-1/4 lengths at bay in 1:51.3. Alexa's Power (Tim Tetrick) chased evenly for third after being hemmed in until the top of the stretch.

Ron Burke trains 18-time winner Youaremycandygirl for William Donovan.

\$193,750 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace (race 12)

After Ontario standout Jimmy Freight was tasked with the heavy lifting through strenuous fractions and sternly dismissed the challenge of 4-5 local favorite Lather Up, This Is The Plan (\$17.00, Tim Tetrick) and The Downtown Bus (\$20.60, Corey Callahan) emerged in the final stride to simultaneously nose out Jimmy Freight in a dead heat in the glamour boys' division of the Matron.

Jimmy Freight and driver Scott Zeron let This Is The Plan clear before taking charge midway on the first turn and reeling off a :25.3 initial quarter. A determined advance from Lather Up (Montrell Teague) out of fourth with a circuit to go kept the pace hot through a :54.4 half, but Jimmy Freight remained undeterred with three-eighths to go and shrugged off that rival. Meanwhile, This Is The Plan remained close from the pocket and The Downtown Bus followed the three-wide cover of Breeders Crown winner Dorsoduro Hanover (Matt Kakaley) past three-quarters in 1:22.1.

Turning for home, Dorsoduro Hanover stalled and Jimmy Freight was driven out to maintain a two-length lead, but it began to shrink in the final sixteenth. This Is The Plan lunged up the open stretch and The Downtown Bus surged widest of all, and they both reached the winning post simultaneously in 1:49.1, a nose better than Jimmy Freight.

Ron Burke trains This Is The Plan, a six-time winner by Somebeachsomewhere, for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Silva Purnel & Libby, and Larry Karr.

Trainer Jeff Gillis co-owns 11-time winner The Downtown Bus with Ellen Ott.



Sparkling performances in Sweden's Breeders Crown

Eskilstuna racetrack was, as usual, the host track for the Swedish Breeders Crown finals last Sunday. Four finals were held and top trotters showed up and entertained the fans.

Eskilstuna arranged great races the whole weekend and on Saturday's race card, an impressive V75 jackpot resulted in a betting handle of an incredible \$25,514,297.

On the Sunday's card, the gambling was not as much in focus, since the finals of Breeders Crown had collected many of the best horses among the 3-, and 4-year-olds.

Hambletonian winner Perfect Spirit or Swedish Derby winner Who's Who? That was the question many fans asked before the final for 4-year-old colts and geldings and it seemed like answer would be Perfect Spirit. The son of Andover Hall hit the lead at an early stage, but in the hands of Örjan Kihlström Perfect Spirit got a little bit too eager in the 1.3 mile-long race and when Selmer I.H. attacked strongly three wide, an upset was a fact.

Selmer I.H. (Love You) is trained by an amateur from north of Sweden, Ingemar Hultqvist, driven by Finnish Mika Forss and the purse for the 4-year-old colts and gelding was in this case \$176.200.

The 1:55 mile rate was noted for both Selmer I.H. and Perfect Spirit and the judges had to take a really close look at the photo to decide who had won the race.

BC 4-year-olds replay

Björn Goop's Mellby Free (Muscle Hill) closed her season with another great win in races for 4-year-old mares. Mellby Free won Stochampionatet at Axevalla in July, finished second to Villiam in Grand Prix de l'U.E.T. at Vincennes in October and was more or less outstanding in the Breeders Crown for 4-year-old mares (\$353,000) in Eskilstuna. The only drama happened when Dibaba got willing to race on the outside of the leader in mid race, but when Dibaba's gas

ran out, Goop put Mellby Free in the highest gear and she answered her driver's command.

As the first choice in the race, Mellby Free sprinted home in mile rate of 1:56.2 and summed up a season where she put more than \$660,000 in her bank account.

Timo Nurmos' Hevin Boko finished strongly from bad position and Global Upper Style took the bronze medal.

BC 4-year-old mares replay

Svante Båth shows phenomenal results with young trotters and for the Breeders Crown finals he had qualified two colts in the race for 3-year-olds. Erik Adielsson selected Global Welcome (SJ.'s Caviar) as his choice and the owners of Båth's second horse in the race, Global Withdrawl, let the caretaker – and Svante Båth's daughter – Kim Moberg drive in the final.

Global Withdrawl opened quickly from number one behind the gate, but when Jorma Kontio let Kriteriet winner Inti Boko challenge for the lead after a quarter of a mile, Moberg willingly let Inti Boko to the front position.

The field was full of potential top trotters. E3 winner Betting Gangster was one of them and he had to do the hard job outside the leader and also offered a cover trip for Global Welcome. Erik Adielsson had to attack three wide with a little less than a half mile to go and Global Welcome seemed to get control of the race in the home stretch. But leader Inti Boko had no thoughts about giving the race up and Timo Nurmos' trotter fought impressively, which also must be said about Betting Gangster between horses.

Global Welcome won Breeders Crown, Inti Boko finished second and Betting Gangster third. Mile rate for the winner was 1:56.1.

BC 3-year-olds replay

SJ's Caviar's success in Breeders Crown had not come to an end by global Welcome's win for the 3-year-old colts and geldings. Among the mares, a new star is born. The chestnut coloured Conrads Rödluva, trained by Daniel Redén, followed up her win in Oaks in September, by showing who's the best female trotter for the 3-year-olds this season.

A Sweet Dance and Staro Miami both have had a longer season and Conrads Rödluva made her breakthrough when she beat the best mares in Sweden in Oaks at Solvalla.

The S.J.'s Caviar mare was the first choice after an impressive win in the eliminations, but the bettors had maybe lost their trust in Daniel Redén's trotter with 5/8ths of a mile to go. At that point, "Rödluva" (Red Riding Hood in English) had to leave third over when horses attacked three

wide from behind, so she had to try to make contact with leading duo A Sweet Dance and Staro Miami by attacking without cover during the last kilometer of the race.

Conrads Rödluva succeeded to pass by Staro Miami and landed outside A Sweet Dance just before the last turn and shortly after, she was in the lead, from where Örjan Kihlström could let his horse jog to comfortable victory in mile rate 1:56.2.

The win was Conrads Rödluva's sixth in nine starts 2018 and she pushed her lifetime earnings over \$540,000, which is a new record for a Swedish bred 3-year-old, trained in Sweden.

Staro Miami (S.J.'s Caviar) finished second, just like in Oaks, and A Sweet Dance (Maharajah) held strongly for third.

BC 3-year-old mares replay

Rookie trotter Antonio Tabac (Crazed) won in The Netherlands

The \$68,000 Prijs der Giganten was held at Victoria Park in Wolvega, The Netherlands, on Sunday afternoon and after four consecutive wins in Swedish silver division and one in gold division, trainer Oskar Kylin-Blom aimed for a bigger target against more merited European trotters.

Prijs der Giganten had not attracted the elite behind the gate, but Antonio Tabac's journey through the classes is impressive and he won this objective in mile rate 1:57 over 1.3 miles.

Antonio Tabac has won eight of 13 starts this year and will most certainly be a colourful contribution in big races next year.

Report from Vincennes

Big races were held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Monday afternoon this week. In the \$135,000 Prix Abel Bassigny, Sébastien Guarato's new star, 3-year-old Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) played with his opponents from the lead. Björn Goop drove the Ready Cash son to victory in mile rate 1:58.1 over 1.3 miles.

In the \$135,000 Prix Rene du Corta, the spectators could see an impressive performance from Philippe Allaire-trained Fly With Us (Ready Cash). An early break resulted in approximately 20-25 lost lengths to the leader, but driver Yoann Lebourgeois made contact deep down in the field and the finish was nothing but astonishing from the Ready Cash mare.

The 1:57.1 mile rate over 1.3 miles and Fly With Us will probably aim for the \$271,000 Criterium des 3 ans at Vincennes on Dec. 16.

This Sunday (Nov. 18), the first of four preparation races ahead of the Prix d'Amérique is scheduled at Vincennes. The B-race Prix de Bretagne has attracted several top trotters in chase of \$135,000, such as Bold Eagle, Bird Parker, Belina Josselyn and Carat Williams. The top-3 horses in this race are guaranteed a place in Prix d'Amérique in January next year. 2.700 meters (approximately 1.7 miles) is the distance in Prix de Bretagne.

Googoo Gaagaa son impressive in important elimination

Four eliminations for the biggest 2-year-old race in Sweden, the \$307,000 Uppfödningslöpningen, were held on Tuesday and Wednesday night at Jägersro and Solvalla. Jerry Riordan trained Aetos Kronos (Bold Eagle) and Sören Norberg's Trix On Line (Trixton) won their respective eliminations at Jägersro before Svante Båth completely stole the show at Solvalla the day after.

Båth's Alien Kronos (Infinitif) and Global Adventure (S.J.'s Caviar) fought side by side in the home stretch and Global Adventure, who won Svampen in Örebro earlier this year, put his nose first at the wire.

Bythebook (Googoo Gaagaa) was the most impressive winner of the four trotters. Örjan Kihlström was entrusted behind Båth's 2-year-old and Bythebook disarmed the field of seven antagonists from position in the back of the field in 1:57, which is a strong note in Sweden for a 2-year-old. Uppfödningslöpningen is scheduled at Jägersro on Dec. 1.

Trotters vs. Pacers race at Cal Expo makes for interesting handicapping and watching

There was a bit of a buzz on social media last Saturday surrounding race two at Cal Expo, which wasn't your ordinary pace for non-winners of \$1,000 in their last five starts. What made this race unique was the "also eligible' clause that was for trotters who were non-winners of \$1,200 per start in 2018. Making it even more interesting was the stipulation that the trotters would draw outside.

The three trotters in the race were made the top three morning line choices despite not seeming to hold any type of speed advantage on the four pacers to their inside. Somewhat oddly, the public made one of the three trotters in the field the post time favorite. Perhaps drawn to his apparent class edge, the public made Silverhill Volo – who last raced at Hawthorne in that track's open trot – the 6 to 5 chalk.

This turned out to be a poor risk, possibly because the seven-year-old Muscle Hill gelding from the Yankee Glide mare Silver Springs hadn't raced in close to two months. On this night, he showed nothing, finishing sixth and distanced, ahead of Majestic Lady Jo, another distanced trotter.

It was the pacing gelding who shipped in from Northlands Park, Mystery Dragon, who paced to a 1:56.2 win at a juicy price of 8 to 1. Pacers filled the top three spots, and the top two combined for a \$93.70 exacta payoff.

Some bettors were surprised by the payoffs provided by the pacers. Azarik Sivatjian, posting in the Facebook group "Cal X Harness" said: "Can we have more trotters vs. pacers? Free money." Group member Andrew Szabo chimed in: "The favorite never was close to getting involved. It was free money indeed."

This race piqued my interest and I wondered how common this type of race was carded. There was plenty of response to a thread started in the 29,474 member Facebook group "Harness Racing History." Bob "Hollywood" Hayden mentioned that the great trotting mare Grades Singing "famously took on the pacers in the late '80s and won!" Rick Lidstone wrote that Bob Craig from Charlottetown, PEI Canada raced his good trotter, Colgans Comet, against good pacers and won his fair share of races.

The Magic Man, Billy 'O Donnell, said that he saw it almost every night at Sackville Downs when that Nova Scotian track was operating.

Ben Hollingsworth provided a results chart of the day Moblessinsdinblues raced against pacers at Truro Raceway in July of 2010. Not only did he beat seven pacers by 12 lengths that day, but Moblessinsdinblues also broke the Truro trotting track record by stopping the clock in 1:59.1.

Many other responders said they have seen the trotter vs. pacer matchup in pari-mutuel races in cases where there were horse shortages and the few trotters needed somewhere to race, which was likely also the case at Cal-Expo this night. But it made for some interesting conversation and some great memories being shared.

Aaron Merriman is gunning for back-to-back 1,000-win seasons.



Aaron Merriman deserves the Driver of Year award

With only two years left in this decade, no one other than Tim Tetrick, Yannick Gingras, Dave Miller and George Brennan has been awarded as the United States Harness Writers Association's (USHWA) Driver of the Year award. All those drivers have won the award twice over the past 8 years. This year, it would be very easy to again give the award to a

Tetrick, Gingras or Miller based on their seasonal successes. But at an absolute minimum, a good long look should be given to the year's inevitable dash winner, Aaron Merriman.

With 955 wins as of Thursday and probably increasing during this writing, Merriman is set to comfortably break through the 1,000-win plateau for the second consecutive year. In the process, he'll be the first driver to ever win at least that many races in a year two different times. It will also be Merriman's fourth consecutive leading dash title. It isn't, though, the string of consecutive dash wins that is the reason why Merriman should be considered for this year's award – he should be considered for his feats this year alone.

As usual, Merriman is miles clear of his next closest competitor in the win column. After Merriman's 955 wins, the next best is Ronnie Wrenn at 649 and then George Napolitano at 614. Dan Noble is the only other driver this year with more than 500 wins.

The main difference with the year Merriman is having now compared to recent years, is that this year he has Driver of the Year type earnings to go with the number of wins.

With over \$9.1 million accumulated thus far in purses earned this year, Merriman is third best among all drivers. Just a shade ahead of David Miller, he trails only Gingras by about \$1.5 million and then it's another \$1.6 million to Tetrick who owns a commanding earnings lead over everyone at \$12.2 million.

By contrast for Merriman, despite his 1,095 wins in 2017, he finished with \$8.7 million in earnings. Far from shabby, that was only good enough to place him in 7th in that category. Two years ago told a similar story where Merriman's earnings that year of \$7.6 million were only good enough to be 8th best.

This year is different because now, in addition to being the runaway winner for the most driving wins, he's right up there with the very best in earnings, too. There isn't a hard and fast set of numbers that say if you meet these numbers then you will be Driver of the Year, but if Merriman can get to both 1,000 wins and \$10 million in earnings, that's entering rarified company.

In addition to the earnings to compliment his wins, Merriman has broken through this year with a couple of big open stakes wins on the Grand Circuit. These signature wins include the \$250,000 Jim Ewart Memorial with Split The House, and the \$200,000 Charlie Hill with Homicide Hunter. Both horses were trained by Chris Oakes. While these wins are helpful in adding to the bankroll, they are even more valuable resume enhancers when being considered for year-end awards.

Even if Merriman were relying on the number of wins alone to bolster his case, it wouldn't be the first time that a driver won the award based on the strength of wins.

In 2008, Tim Tetrick tied for the USHWA Driver of the Year award with Dave Palone. For Palone, his 885 wins were a career best, but it was likely that in combination with the jump from a previous career best of \$5.6 million in seasonal earnings to over \$10 million in 2008 that got him the co-honor. Proving that earnings isn't everything, Tetrick earned an all-time harness racing record of \$19.7 million in earnings that season but it wasn't enough for him to take the award outright.

There's going to be drivers who have a right to take exception to this, but the only driver I see that should be standing in Merriman's way at this point is Tetrick.

Even by his standards, Tetrick is having a sensational year and will wind up with his highest seasonal earnings since 2013. Tetrick has driven horse of the year contender Shartin N the entire season, has notched multiple big wins with Crystal Fashion, and won the Jugette and a Breeders Crown. It's an incredibly strong resume and I wouldn't blame anyone for going in his direction.

Essentially the same can be said for Yannick Gingras. He'll wind up second in earnings and has won too many major stakes to count, including marquee wins throughout the year with Manchego, Warrawee Ubeaut, Ariana G, Hannelore Hanover and others. Ditto for Dave Miller, who won the Meadowlands Pace and Little Brown Jug this year with Courtly Choice.

It's never easy, but what the Grand Circuit drivers do every year is repeatable because of the power stables that they all drive for. With over 4,000 starts and thousands more miles of travel this year between Northfield Park and The Meadows, there's no question that Merriman has done it the hard way. It's also been a season that saw Merriman notch his 10,000-career win earlier this year in March.

In his career year, Merriman's number of wins combined with the amount of earnings is a unique accomplishment. It's an accomplishment that should garner him serious consideration for the Driver of the Year award, if not the award itself.

'Crunch' crush

From the moment Ella Johansson saw him, there was a connection. The colt's name was Captain Bean and Ella spotted him as soon as she and her parents, harness racing trainer Nancy and driver Marcus, arrived in Harrisburg to look at yearlings the day before the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sale.

Ella, who accompanied her parents only because it seemed a better

option to sitting at her brother's baseball tournament, implored her mother to buy him.

Nancy also liked the colt, but knew acquiring him might be easier said than done. She put together a group of owners interested in buying the horse, set a budget, and on the opening day of the sale waited for Captain Bean to enter the auction ring. Ella, watching the live stream of the sale at home in New Jersey, waited too. Ella knew what the group was prepared to spend and when Captain Bean eventually sold for \$85,000 she knew who had the winning bid.

"We got him!" she exclaimed to Marcus in the kitchen.

And a year later, her enthusiasm for the colt, now known as Captain Crunch, is undiminished.

"He was the first horse that I saw," 13-year-old Ella said, recounting her initial moments with Captain Crunch. "We walked in and he was there. He was big, he was pretty; a very sweet horse. I petted him.

"He's sweet and he's nice. He's just fun to be around."

Said Nancy, "He's big, but he's gentle with her. He lets her pet him and he plays with you. He's as nice as a 2-year-old colt can be. If you spend a couple minutes with him you can't help but to like him. He's got unbelievable charisma."

Captain Crunch, who was renamed by Ella and Nancy's mom Christina Takter, has won five of eight races this year. His most recent start came Oct. 27 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, where he won the \$600,000 Breeders Crown championship for 2-year-old male pacers on a cold, rainy night.

Ella greeted him in the winner's circle with a kiss.

"He stood like a perfect gentleman, like he always does," Nancy said.

Captain Crunch's next start is Saturday at the Meadowlands in the sole \$20,000 elimination for the Governor's Cup, which is one of the Fall Final Four stakes for 2-year-olds at the Big M. The top-seven finishers will join bye recipients Blood Money, Semi Tough, and Sugar Factory in the \$469,300 final

on Nov. 24. The elimination winner will draw from posts one through six for the final.

Scott Zeron will drive Captain Crunch, who starts from post eight in the field of 10.

Prior to each race, Ella offers words of encouragement to Captain Crunch via FaceTime.

"I just tell him good luck," Ella said. "Win."

"When they FaceTime he's paying attention to what she's saying, like he's listening," Marcus added. "It's kind of funny."

Captain Crunch is a son of Captaintreacherous out of Sweet Paprika, from the family of Dan Patch Award-winner Sweet Lou and \$2.78-million-earner Bettor Sweet. In addition to the Breeders Crown, his wins include divisions of the Nassagaweya and International Stallion Stakes (in a career-best 1:49.1). His only off-the-board finish was in his Metro Pace elimination in September, when he came up sick.

The colt is owned by 3 Brothers Stables, Christina Takter, Rojan Stables, and Caviart Farms.

"He's a good-looking horse," Marcus said. "He's got a great personality. He's happy all the time. He's always in a good mood. I like horses like that. If you walk into work and see someone who is miserable, you become miserable even if you were happy. He's the first horse on the end (of the stable). I park my car there so I can go and see him. It starts out the day good."

And while one might expect Ella to be a horse-crazy kid given her environment, it is not the case.

"As much of a horse girl that I am, she's not," Nancy said, laughing. "She doesn't care about the horses much at all."

Captain Crunch is the exception, which has made his season all the more special.

"We live a crazy life, on the road a lot," Nancy said. "It's almost like joining the circus. So it's nice when (our kids) see we're working hard and it's paying off and they feel involved in that."

For the record, Ella's brother, Marcus Jr., has a favorite horse as well. His is also a 2-year-old colt pacer, Caviart Rockland.

"They each have a horse that they follow," Marcus said. "It's 'their' horse. It makes it fun for all of us."

The stakes in addition to the Governor's Cup that make up the Fall Final Four are the Three Diamonds for 2-year-old female pacers, Valley Victory for 2-year-old male trotters, and Goldsmith Maid for 2-year-old female trotters. Eliminations were unnecessary for the Goldsmith Maid and Three Diamonds. There will be two eliminations Saturday for the Valley Victory.



A field of six clashed in the \$43,000 final for trotting fillies, while a full field of 10 battled in the \$49,900 final for pacing fillies.

Mach Three—Hedgie Blue Chip filly Lyons Hedgeabet picked the perfect time to break her maiden by winning the \$49,900 final for pacing fillies in 1:52.3.

Driven by Bob McClure, Lyons Hedgeabet got away eighth from post position four. Race favorite Miss Rockadali, seeking a series sweep, shot out to the lead and posted a :26.4 opening-quarter. D Gs Shadowsbell, also going for the sweep, was parked second and had to grind things out the entire mile on the outside.

Miss Rockadali rolled the field to the half in :55.2 and three-quarters in 1:24.2.

McClure moved Lyons Hedgeabet ahead of the half into the outer-flow and sat third-over sixth, just four lengths from the lead turning for home.

In the stretch, Lyons Hedgeabet stormed by rivals to the top and paced a :27.2 final-quarter to score a convincing 4 ¼ lengths victory. D Gs Shadowsbell showed plenty of grit to finish second, while I Shadow U was third and Oxford Comma fourth.

Trained by Jeff Gillis, Lyons Hedgeabet finished third in last week's second leg after a runner-up finish in a first leg division. The Mach Three filly was making her seventh career start Monday and entered with a trio of runner-up finishes and trio of third-place finishes.

Owned by Geoffrey Lyons Mound, Lyons Hedgeabet increased her earnings to \$39,800 with the maiden-breaking score. She paid \$12 to win.

Johnny William—Breanne filly Shotgun Sally and driver Paul MacKenzie showed plenty of patience in capturing Monday's \$43,000 Harvest Series final for trotting fillies in a career-best 1:56.4.

Power And Grace hustled off the wings of the gate to grab the top spot with last week's second leg winner Miss Adam T getting away second before circling to the top early in the second-quarter. Shotgun Sally got away fifth and sat in that same spot when Miss Adam T led the field by a half of :57.1.

McKenzie gave Shotgun Sally her cue to go entering the

far turn and the 6-5 favorite trotted up into third, just over two lengths from Miss Adam T at the third-marker.

In the stretch, Shotgun Sally immediately powered by Miss Adam T and pulled away to a 5 ¼ lengths victory in 1:56.4. Miss Adam T finished second, while Gradabra rallied for third.

Trained by Todd Clements, Shotgun Sally won the opening leg of the series before being scratched from last week's second leg due to transportation issues. She now has four wins in 26 starts this season.

Owned by Trisha Barsby, Shotgun Sally, who made just two starts as a rookie, has now earned \$52,588 in her career. She paid \$4.60 to win.

The Harvest Series was open to Ontario sired three-year-olds, who were non-winners of \$30,000 in 2018 as of Sept. 30, 2018.

The stars are out Saturday at the Meadowlands

The upcoming weekend of racing, featuring eliminations for the \$1.8 million Freshman Fall Final Four and an overnight peek at a few of the sport's veteran stars looking forward to the \$1 million Grand Circuit TVG Championships will serve as a hearty appetizer to nearly \$3 million worth of finals on Saturday, Nov. 24.

Tonight's headliners are a pair of \$20,000 open handicap events both of which contain TVG eligible looking for a tightner before the final.

The open mare pace is led by Pure Country (Yannick Gingras). The TVG Final will be the swan song for the great mare whose retirement following the TVG has already been announced. The triple Dan Patch award winner will race sans hopples for the first time on Friday as she closes in on \$2.5 million in career earnings for owner/breeder Diamond Creek Racing and trainer Jimmy Takter.

The open trot boasts the point leader in both the TVG open and mare division squaring off for \$20,000.

After a sparkling beginning to his season that placed him atop the TVG leaderboard, Will Take Charge (Tim Tetrick) has not had his finest form for the past few months and looks to reclaim that position in these late stages for owner Mac Nichol.

Ice Attraction's campaign took an opposite course with early season struggles giving way to a successful fall

including a world record-equaling performance at Red Mile and a remarkable trip to gather the place in the Breeders Crown final. Andy Miller drives on Friday for owner/trainer Ake Svanstedt and partners Sipple, Burroughs and Little E, LLC.

Saturday night brings a few elimination races for the Grand Circuit season's curtain call for the freshmen.

Fifteen trotting colts entered the Valley Victory and after a pair of elimination races the top 10 of those will pass through to next week's \$435,900 final. It's an even group with the seasonal late bloomers making a last grab for the gold ring before winter training.

The Governor's Cup drew 13 colt pacers and after three colts accepted a bye into the \$469,300 final 10 are left to battle over the seven remaining berths. Breeders Crown winner Captain Crunch (Scott Zeron) brings the strongest resume to this one for trainer Nancy Johansson and the partnership of 3 Brothers Stable, Christina Takter, Rojan Stable and Caviart Farms.

Both the \$490,000 Goldsmith Maid and \$391,250 Three Diamonds for 2-year-old trotting and pacing fillies respectively did not require elimination races and those two groups head directly into next week's finals.

For good measure, the Saturday card also includes TVG open pace point leader and likely final favorite McWicked facing four others in an overnight open handicap.

Post time for both nights is 7:15 pm.

Harrah's Hoosier Park concludes season; Tetrick and Cullipher win titles

Harrah's Hoosier Park concluded the 25th silver anniversary season of live harness racing with a 14-race card in front of a packed house on Saturday, Nov. 10. In addition to the racing action, the leading driver and trainer titles were awarded.

On the driving side, Trace Tetrick secured his fifth consecutive and seventh leading driver title at Hoosier Park. Tetrick, who led the standings from start to finish, was officially recognized as the 2018 leading driver with 309 victories while amassing over \$3.7 million in purse earnings throughout the 160-day season. Sam Widger finished second with 259 victories with John DeLong in third with 248 trips to the winner's circle.

The Southern Illinois native started driving in 2003 and has since surpassed the \$50 million mark in purse earnings in the bike. As the all-time leading driver in Hoosier Park history, Tetrick recorded his best season to date in 2017 with over \$6.8 million in purse earnings and 569 victories. Tetrick is also ranked among the top 10 drivers in the country with 469 victories and counting.

"I want to thank the owners, trainers, and grooms who put me in the position where I can do well every night," Tetrick said in the winner's circle. "Without them I wouldn't be standing here today. I am going to take a few weeks off and enjoy this and then will most likely be racing in Ohio for a few nights a week during the off season.

"The support of my family and friends has been great. I really appreciate the opportunity to show up every night and do what I love."

After tying with trainer Jamie Macomber for the leading trainer title last season, Jeff Cullipher took the next step and secured the 2018 leading trainer title outright.

Heading into the evening's 14-race card just four wins separated the top pair. Cullipher secured the title after winning with Wings Up and Inverse Hanover in their respective races. Cullipher ended the season with 119 victories with Jamie Macomber finishing second with 116 trips to the winner's circle.

Raised by a family rich in harness racing tradition, Cullipher has quickly made a name for himself as a trainer at Hoosier Park. The 47-year-old Henderson, KY native is no new comer to the sport of harness racing. A driver since 1988 and trainer since 1991, Cullipher has over 30 years of harness racing experience to his credit.

After recording his first million-dollar season as a trainer in 2017 with his stable netting over \$1.2 million in purse earnings and 102 victories, Cullipher is on track to record his best season to date in 2018 as his stable has already amassed over \$1.5 million in purse earnings and 124 wins. Cullipher's stable earned over \$1.3 million in purse earnings at Hoosier Park this season.

"It really is a team effort," Cullipher said. "It's a lot of hard work but I've got a great team and some great owners who helped make this possible. Owners like Tom Pollack have been a dream come true for a guy like me—it's an honor to have the caliber of horses I've been able to train all season.

"We are going to take a little bit of time off. We will keep a stable here in Indiana for the winter and we are also looking to have a stable in New Jersey starting in December so next year will be exciting."

The Saturday night program wrapped up an extremely successful season at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Hoosier Park Racing & Casino would like to thank all of the fans and horsemen who helped make the 2018 season at Hoosier Park an overwhelming success.

"I want to tip my hat to everyone at Harrah's Hoosier Park who made this 25th season of harness racing so special and memorable," said Harrah's Hoosier Park vice-president and general manager of racing Rick Moore. "And to our partners, the horsemen, who night in and night out make racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park the best there is in North America. We couldn't be more proud. We'll catch our breath and then get back to the drawing board to make 2019 even better."

The board will convene in early January with plans for a morning session of brainstorming with facilitator Christy Landwehr and its annual face-to-face meeting in the afternoon.

In the colt trot, which was slotted as the first race on the card, Trixton 2-year-olds finished first (Battenberg) and third (No Drama Please).

Trixton now ranks fifth among leading money winning trotting sires in 2018 for 2-year-old trotters and is the money-winning leader among all first year trotting sires.

Trixton will be the only trotting sire of 2-year-olds in New Jersey in 2019 and while it might have seemed difficult to top this year's results, with certainty, next year's results will be even better.
