I also won't argue for or against any person. Everyone who put their name forward to volunteer their time to help try to steer the industry toward a brighter future should be commended.

The important point is that everyone with a vote — the election is open until Dec. 12 to Canadian residents who are Standardbred Canada (SC) members — needs to exercise that right. Voting is easy and, given the importance SC plays in shaping the future of the sport — and the fact the sport continues to strive for a sustainable future — to not vote



does a great disservice to the industry by which most of us make our living.

Though six people are running for just one spot in Atlantic Canada, particularly contentious appears to be the race for active directors in the Ontario region. Six people — Blair Burgess, Ryan Clements, Mark Horner, Alex Lilley, Jeffrey Wellwood and Jim Whelan — are running for two spots.

Anyone with a vote would be wise to educate themselves on the candidates. What have they done to make the industry better and what do they stand *for*, not what do they stand against?

Who will work to unite the industry, not divide it?

After all, people should be judged on their records and their ideas, not finger-pointing and negativity devoid of concrete, practical suggestions for how they would improve the industry for all.

Once you have that information — and bios for most are available at the links provided above — please take the time to do some critical thinking.

Unless a candidate promises to divulge the location of a magic money tree, it's equally a work of fantasy to suggest the answer to our ills is simply more money, more race dates and more tracks, particularly when there is a horse shortage.

Remember, despite how much we love harness racing, declining public interest in it from the very same Ontario taxpayers already ponying up some \$100 million annually to support the industry — most unknowingly so — makes it

unrealistic to think more is coming from government.

When you consider that \$100 million could easily be spent somewhere more politically expedient in a time of extreme debt and deficit, the answer is not to complain about how little we have, but be thankful and use it as a basis to figure out how to grow and improve our own industry.

That said, Standardbred Canada has made some significant progress in recent years, particularly in leading the charge — in tandem with John Campbell — for universal rules from coast to coast. By involving provincial regulators early on in the process, word is that weighty initiative could come to fruition in the next year or so. Improving the conditions for our betting customers is essential for growing our bottom line, which is the surest way to increase purses and, perhaps, the number of dates.

SC also made some progress in terms of a five-year strategic plan, microchipping, electronic entering and other areas.

Does all that mean one should vote for the status quo? I'll leave that to the voters to decide.

The key is to be informed, think carefully, and, most importantly, exercise your right to vote.



# **Notes from Harrisburg**

To say that I felt a little apprehensive going to Harrisburg last week would be somewhat of an understatement.

After all, this was going to be the first time in over 50 years that I would not be working the sale after 52 years as an employee of Hanover Shoe Farms and 37 as the general manager of Standardbred Horse Sales Company.

What would I do? How would I feel?

For emotional support, I brought my dear wife Carol along. She was there to provide it, if necessary. She was certainly an asset as she always is. But I got along just fine.

The first thing I did was fulfill my lifetime contract with my buddy David Reid of Preferred Equine Marketing.

Four years ago I suggested he add hot dogs to his menu of lunches that he provides to his employees and many of the prominent, and some not so prominent, individuals in the sport.

Reid's response was that if I bought him a hot dog machine together with the hot dogs and buns, he would be more than happy to do so.

Thus, a lifetime contract was entered into. It's been three years now and hopefully if I last long enough, Preferred will be providing hot dogs for many years to come.

I was met at the door by my adopted son, Simon. He had his cart ready to bring the dogs and buns to PEM's cook, Marty.

Aside from Reid and Steve Bray, there is no people more important to the PEM operation than Simon Wise and Lillie Brown.

Among the people being regularly fed by PEM are the entire auction crew.

Speaking of the auction crew, they were wonderful. They are a terrific young group of go-getters who should be involved with the sales crew for many years to come. The "young" sobriquet also fits my friend, the venerable Richard Patterson, who to my eyes will never appear old.

It was so wonderful running into so many people who said they regularly read this column and enjoyed it.

It was especially nice visiting with so many of my former colleagues at Hanover. As usual, they did a remarkable job and enjoyed an all-time record sale at Harrisburg.

Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky heads this team of great people.

I've said it before and I'll say it again there is nobody in this industry who does a better job at what she does than the remarkable Dr J.

They say that nobody is irreplaceable, but Bridgette Jablonsky comes very close to meeting that description.

As most know, the yearling sale was a blockbuster.

From the very beginning to the very end of the yearling segment, even extending to the small number of yearlings selling on Thursday morning, what was perceived as quality was very much in demand.

If you had what people wanted, especially a combination of pedigree and conformation, the prices were terrific.

Some observations:

1. The trotting market was especially vibrant. One statistic that really stood out to me was that two trotting stallions, Muscle Hill and Father Patrick, out averaged the highest priced pacing stallion Somebeachsomewhere by a significant margin.

Even more demonstrative of the tremendous demand for trotting yearlings was the fact that eight different trotting stallions out averaged the next leading pacing stallion.

Nevertheless, you had to have the individual to go along with the pedigree. There were several blue-blooded Muscle Hill yearlings who were early foals out of outstanding and well-bred mares which brought very low prices.

2. I've been preaching since Betting Line entered the stud that if he didn't become a top stallion, I would never make a prediction on a stallion again.

I still stand by that.

Apparently others felt the same way as the Betting Lines were extremely well accepted. Sixty-six of them grossed

\$3,469,000, averaging \$52,561 and out averaged such proven stallions as his sire Bettors Delight, Sweet Lou and his first year rival Always B Miki.

Here's an interesting fact about the Always B Miki yearlings: Allowing for my sometimes poor arithmetical skills, his yearlings on the second day of the sale both out averaged and out grossed those selling on the first day.

On Monday, his 17 yearlings sold for \$743,000, averaging \$43,710. On Tuesday his 13 yearlings brought \$749,000 and averaged \$57,110.

3. I thought the New York and Ontario segments were especially, strong providing one had the right individual. Pennsylvania was also very strong, but because of the very large numbers of them, buyers could afford to be a little more discriminating. Nevertheless, if you had the right horse, the sky was the limit. New Jersey-sired horses, mostly because of the dominance of Muscle Hill, sold very well. I thought the Trixtons might have sold a little better, but the main reason they probably didn't was because of the dominance of that same Muscle Hill.

Of course, with the high prices that the right Muscle Hill yearling brings, he or she isn't being bought to compete in regional events.

There was definitely a premium received on yearlings eligible to more than one regional jurisdiction with those having Kentucky eligibility as well as another state's being very much in demand.

Which brings me to a slight pet peeve. Why are these secondary stakes eligibilities referred to as sires stakes, when in most cases they have nothing to do with stallions standing in that particular state?

4. I thought that the European presence was stronger in Harrisburg than it has probably ever been. Traditionally, especially in recent years, European buyers have been much more of a factor in Lexington than they have in Harrisburg. This year, they probably still were. But without knowing it for a definite fact, I would guess that the gap might have been significantly narrowed.

As usual, Canadians were multi-present and made their presence felt. For some reason, at least from my perspective, I've found that more Canadians have always been greater factors in Harrisburg than in Lexington. Perhaps it has something to do with so much money being available to race for later on in Canada. I'm of the belief that its more likely a

consequence of habit. They've always come there. It's closer than Lexington. Harrisburg doesn't have the great racing that Lexington has. It has no racing at all. It also doesn't conflict with anything monumental or with the preparation for major events.

In short, both Lexington and Harrisburg have their adherents. Most of the major buyers are significant factors at both venues.

I suppose that, as always is the case, what it comes down to is what is in the catalog and how the horses look.

## Mixed Sale

I've always said, and firmly believe without reservation that there is no better place or time to sell a quality broodmare or a broodmare prospect than Harrisburg.

The stars just come together there in perfect alignment.

Many of the breeders have just hopefully concluded a successful yearling sale.

They have money burning a hole in their pockets.

The consignors to Lexington have already been, or are just about to be, paid for the horses they sold there.

Anybody and just about everybody who professes to be or wants to be in the breeding business is there.

Before I go any further, I need to say that I don't claim any expertise in the racehorse end of things. It used to be the area where I hung my hat and in which I was most interested. That was a long time ago. No more.

Without the knowledge myself, I will go along with what I've been told. This one, as are most racehorse sales, was very successful. There is a shortage of good racehorses pretty much everywhere. If you've got what people want, especially a horse that you can put into the box immediately, there are plenty of people willing to pay you a very fair price for it.

The breeding stock portion of the sale was headlined by the dispersal of the White Birch Farms broodmare band.

For me, it provoked a feeling of great sadness. I actually once met Joe Parisi's father who was the founder of the farm over 60 years ago. I believe it was called Joe-Mar Farms then.

I considered Joe and his son Michael to be wonderful friends.

Joe could be a little tough sometimes, but he was always fair.

Michael was one of the sweetest and nicest people to ever inhabit the planet.

All in all, I thought that segment of the sale was very strong.

There is an old saying that says "A dead man's horses always sell better." I don't know if that was the case here, but they sold darn well. If there was any weakness, it might have been among the pacing mares. There were some who were very good value relative to their cost.

In general, trotters sold better than pacers in just about every segment of the sale.

In terms of trotting broodmares, if you had a mare in foal to what was perceived as the right horse, it sold quite well and, in most cases, brought more than I thought it would bring.

Just my opinion, but I thought that there were very few trotting mares available that came from top families. The few that did sold through the roof. There were quite a few others though that brought inordinately high prices.

That was not always the case with pacing mares. The high-quality ones sold very well, but not with the premium that the trotters did.

I felt that there were definitely good buys to be found in the mid-priced pacing mare selection. I was helping a friend who bought two well-bred mares in foal to popular stallions for about half of what I thought they might bring.

Whether they turn out to be as good buys as I think they will be remains to be seen of course.

The top breeders were very much in evidence. Cameo Hills, Diamond Creek, Fair Winds, Hanover Shoe Farms and Hunterton Farms were very active in the high-priced mare department, as was Winbak Farms in the mid-priced group.

There was some new money in both the yearling and broodmare segments, but not nearly as much as I wish there would be.

Our owner base continues to get older and diminish, yet we still have great sales such as the one we had last week. People, including myself, ask why this is the case. My stock answer is, as it has always been, that people just love horses and love to own them.

# Dancin Yankee to stand in Ohio at Cool Winds

World champion and 3-time Ohio Older Pacer of the Year DANCIN YANKEE p,1:47.2f (\$2,003,907) has been retired from racing and will stand for stallion service at Cool Winds Farm, Lima, OH, for the 2020 breeding season.

A perennial iron-horse with 80 lifetime wins, as well as a fan favorite, the 11-year-old son of Yankee Cruiser earned over \$115,000 in each of the last nine of his 10 racing seasons. Dancin Yankee recently eclipsed \$2 million in lifetime earnings while copping his 11th victory of 2019.

"He's the best blue collar horse I've ever driven," said driver Chris Page. "He shows up every single week and gives you everything he's got every time out."

Still the fastest older pacing stallion on a half-mile track, Dancin Yankee defeated both Foiled Again and Heston Blue Chip in a world record 1:48.4h, winning the Joe Gerrity Memorial at Saratoga in 2014 at age six. He banked \$509,140 that season, also setting a world record of 1:47.2f at Pocono in May with Tyler Buter driving. He returned six weeks later to win the \$100,000 Sun Stakes Invitational in 1:47.3f.

As of late, Dancin Yankee has been owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Melissa Patterson and Larry Karr.

"Dancin Yankee has been the perfect horse on the racetrack and he checks all the boxes as a stallion. Correct,

versatile, handles any sized track and can race any way you want. He is from an outstanding family, is a double millionaire, and is tough, durable and classy," said prominent owner Mark Weaver.

"We expect him to pass on all of those traits to his offspring and feel that Ohio is the perfect place for him as it's quickly becoming the most lucrative sire stakes program in the country. We look forward to fully supporting him in the breeding shed and at the yearling sales."

He is the first foal from the 100 per cent-producing Cambest mare Dancewiththebest p,4,1:54.4f, she a half-sister to seven sub-1:54 multiple-stakes winners, including Marty Party p,2,1:51.2f (\$684,603) and The Lunch Pail p,3,1:51.3 (\$503,629).

Dancin Yankee is also a three-quarter brother in blood to recent Breeders Crown champion Dancin Lou p,3,1:48.3 (\$578,359) and four other sub-1:54 stakes winning performers.

In fact, not only is his sire Yankee Cruiser p,3,1:49.3 (\$1,150,123) the sire of the fastest 2-year-old pacer of all time, Elver Hanover p,2,1:48.3-19 (\$363,450), but he is also the sire of prominent Pennsylvania stallion Sweet Lou.

The connections of Dancin Yankee have decided to send the horse to Kim and Randy Haines of Cool Winds Farm to manage his stud career.

"He is an outstanding individual," Randy said. "Big, strong and was a very fast and gritty racehorse. Dancin Yankee is also incredibly fertile. We look forward to offering him to breeders in the Buckeye State."

Dancin Yankee will stand for an introductory stud fee of \$2,500, with a limited number of lifetime breedings available for \$6,000 (or \$3,500 in 2020 and \$3,000 payable in 2021). For more information contact Cool Winds Farm at 419-227-2665 or 419-234-6772.

# Lather Up to stand stud at Sugar Valley Farm in Ohio

Lather Up's ownership has announced the decision to stand their two time world champion in Ohio instead of New York.

"When we saw the overwhelming reception on the part of Ohio breeders coupled with that of top breeders from other states who appreciate the convenience of shipped semen, (Diamond Creek's) Adam (Bowden) and I thought it best to stand the horse in Ohio. He will be standing at Sugar Valley Farm as a Diamond Creek / Taylor Made Stallion," said Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor.

"We could not be more excited about the addition of Lather Up, the co-fastest horse on the planet, to our stellar roster. With Ohio re-establishing itself as a top state in the industry with a top notch stakes program and opportunities galore, it became more apparent to us at Sugar Valley to continue the full court press to bring Lather Up back to Ohio, " said Sugar Valley's Joe McLead. "Our industry has the appeal of the most prolific thoroughbred operation, in Duncan



Taylor & Taylor Made Farm, wanting to be a part of Ohio's program. It is quite humbling to be working alongside of them, standing the fastest pacer in Lather Up and a champion trotter in What The Hill. Working with Adam Bowden and Diamond Creek Farm while standing Downbytheseaside has been tremendous."

In July at the Meadowlands, Lather Up equaled Always B Miki's world record time for the mile in 1:46. He is also a two time world champion who set seven track records from ages 2 to 4. Lather Up established a new track record in one of every five starts, an achievement that will likely define him as one of the most accomplished standardbreds of all time.

The first out of four "B-races" ahead of the Prix d'Amérique in Paris in January next year is scheduled at Vincennes racetrack today and three tickets to one of the toughest races in the world is at stake.

Eighteen trotters will chase a slot in the Prix d'Amérique and the racing fans will likely experience a spectacular race in today's \$121,000 Prix de Bretagne over 1.6 miles.

Title defender Belina Josselyn chases the right condition and will be driven by Nicolas Bazire, while trainer Jean-Michel Bazire has to watch his contenders from beside the track since he's suspended.

## **Riordan aims for France**

Jerry Riordan's 4-year-old Italian-bred Zarenne Fas (Varenne) won the Groser Preis von Deutchland in Germany recently and was first in the \$67,000 Axel Jensens Minneslopp at Bjerke racetrack in Oslo, Norway on Saturday afternoon.

Zarenne Fas was given anything but a perfect trip in the race, but there was no doubt that Riordan's trotter was the best horse in the race. Coming four wide in the final turn didn't stop Zarenne Fas from sprinting to a comfortable win in 1:56.2. Riordan now aims for a start in Paris in December.

"This was an impressive performance. We won in Germany, but that day everything just worked perfectly and to win a race with a last turn like today is never easy and this was a confirmation that Zarenne Fas really is a great horse. We will aim for Criterium Continental in Paris on December 22 and there he will face some of the best horses in the crop; Face Time Bourbon among others," said Riordan.

# These dozen records will be tough to break

- 1. Jimmy Takter's 22 Breeders Crown wins after going into the Hall Of Fame.
- 2. Redskin's \$1,407,263 2-year-old single-season earnings record (set in 1986)
- 3. Miss Easy's Meadowlands record versus her own kind. She was 19-for-19 against females. Her two losses at the Big M came in a baby race to Arties Dream and when she broke early in her 1991 Meadowlands Pace elimination.
- 4. Ryan Anderson's Breeders Crown win at age 20 in 2000 with Popcorn Penny.
- 5. A 1,000-1 shot (actually 1,023-1) in a million-dollar race Amazing Fella. In happened in 1985 at Garden State Park in the Governor's Cup won by Barberry Spur. He finished ninth in the 12-horse field, driven by Don Irvine, Jr.
- 6. A six-for-eight record in a single decade in the same million-dollar race. John Campbell had a streak in the 1990s of winning the North America Cup in six of eight drives.
- 7. Winning your first Breeders Crown race (Call Me Queen B) the same year you win the Triple Crown (Marion Marauder). It happened to Scotty Zeron in 2016, the same year he also surpassed \$50 million in his career and won his first Meadowlands driving title.



# Fiona Reynolds – The caretaker with the golden hands

Some of the most important people in horse racing are the ones behind the scenes. I'm talking about the caretakers, the unsung heroes of the sport.

The trainer tends to get all the credit and recognition for the performance of the horse, but the person who has the one-on-one interaction on a daily (and nightly) basis is the groom.

One caretaker who many say has golden hands is Fiona Reynolds.

When Reynolds was 17 she moved her saddle horse to a barn whose owners had standardbreds. That's all it took.

Although Reynolds hadn't been brought up around these incredible athletes, once bit by the horse bug she and her boyfriend at the time, Jim Pudge McDonald, developed a small stable of horses and raced at her home track of Avalon Raceway in Goulds, Newfoundland.

"In 1980, Jim and I went to Pompano Park Racetrack in Florida where I got a job working for trainer Archie McNeil. Three years later, I relocated back to Ontario and started grooming for John Burns."

Today, Reynolds keeps herself busy helping out between top trainers Tony Alagna, Dr. Ian Moore and Mike Vanderkemp.

"It's interesting to me how many different ways there are to reach the ultimate goal of a trainer, which is of course is winning. Each has his personal method and each is successful," Reynolds said. "I am the type of person that asks a lot of questions, so because of that I've learned a lot."

She doesn't have a preference in caring for a mare, stallion or gelding.

"I honestly don't prefer one to another. I just meet that animal where their headspace is. I treat the horses as equals for they are not machines, but living creatures with a soul. Although they all have different personalities, I have found each horse to be kind and really just wanting to please and be loved."

Her all-time favorite?

"That's a tough question," Reynolds said.

"I'm going to say it's a horse named Pequoig Warrior. He was a trotter from my teenage years who absolutely hated humans, but we loved each other.

And then there was Soky's Atom who took me on the Grand Circuit journey as a 2- and 3-year-old.

"But whatever horse I'm managing at the moment, I treat as if he/she were mine and love them all. I absolutely loved the horse Stay Hungry. I am thrilled that Tony Alagna and his mother Donna Lee trusts me tending to their top stock on race nights in the major races.

"Throughout the years I have been blessed to have paddocked some of the best horses, such as Stay Hungry, Ramona Hill and American History."

Talk about Ramona Hill and American History. What a thrill these two superstars gave Reynolds Breeders Crown weekend at Mohawk when Reynolds groomed both horses on consecutive nights.

First, there was the filly Ramona Hill who busted out of the 10-hole at 14-1 odds to be victorious in the \$786,000 2-year-old filly trot.

The following night, Reynolds took 4-year-old American History to the paddock and scored a double for Alagna when the colt won the \$657,895 Breeders Crown Open Pace. (Alagna also took a third Breeders Crown trophy with 2-year-old pacing filly Reflect With Me.)

Call it lady luck or does this woman have golden hands?

"One of the things I admire most about Fiona is the way she treats every horse she takes care of. Even though it's not full time, she cares for them like they are hers. She is attentive and caring to everyone — whether it's a maiden or Grand Circuit caliber."

"Fiona has always been my go-to girl when I need paddock help," Lee added. "She's a complete professional and loves her job. Fiona has a gift with difficult horses and a calming effect on fussy mares — including me."

It says something about your character when your boss compliments and praises you as the Alagna Stable has done; but caring for these animals is not Reynolds' primary job — it's her second.

Her first job is a long care nurse, tending to those who need her. Perhaps being such a caring, compassionate person rubs off when she cares for her four-legged friends.

"I couldn't imagine my life without working with these amazing animals. They are my therapy and time with them feeds my soul. A few years ago I went to see a psychic medium that told me I would leave this world 'on a white horse.' Although that sounds lovely, I'm not ready to leave here yet, so for the time I try to stay clear of tending to any greys, roans or white horses," Reynolds said, laughing.

# Part three: Summing up the value of promo events for bettors to increase business

## Part 1 | Part 2

What follows is the final part of this mini-series exploration on increasing business using promotional events that include bettors — as in drivers' tournaments.

This finale is testimony to the potency of the first two parts, captured by using the absurdity of opposites. This approach attempts to explain to track administrations that racetrack promotions excluding participation of bettors—arguably the pari-mutuel racetrack's coveted customers—are futile for business.

The following promotions are based upon actual racetrack promotional events. They are explained simply, and then we add acerbic comments bettors are likely to make (because cynicism is the basic tone of pari-mutuel bettors). The comments highlight the promos' irreverence to a bettor's pari-mutuel experience.

#### **CLOSING NIGHT SPECIALS**

Free Delaney Downs [sic] track-labeled beverage tumblers for all attending the races on (date). The official track logo is printed on the tumbler and is available as long as supplies last.

Plus, a professional racetrack bugler is live and plays the traditional call-to-post melody in the winner's circle before every race.

Bettors say:

"Sure, a free cup, but no free coffee in it."

"I know a guy collects racetrack tumblers and tries to sell them on eBay."

"You could buy five tumblers for what they charge for the coffee at this track."

"What's the difference between a trumpet and a bugle?"

"Can the bugler play 'Taps' if we have a losing night?"

#### **COLLEGE NIGHT AT THE RACES**

Delaney Downs is a great place for the collegiate crowd on (date). Show your valid college student ID and get special drink prices, half-priced race programs, one \$2 wagering voucher and more.

Bettors say:

"Geez, sorry I lost my valid college ID 20 years ago."

"They'd get more people coming if they held 'College Drop-out' night."

"If they can put away their phones and watch the races it'll be a miracle."

"All the night needs is a live bugler."

#### **DELANEY DOWNS HANDICAPPING CONTEST**

Bettors buy in for \$300, of which \$100 goes to prize money and \$200 is their betting bankroll. Contestants must wager \$10 win and place on any 10 races on the 15-race program. Players keep all pari-mutuel bets earned. The winners of the contest are the players with the largest bankrolls at the end of the race card. From the prize money, the winner gets 50 per cent, followed by 25 per cent for second, 12 per cent for third, 8 per cent for fourth and 5 per cent for fifth.

Bettors say:

"The best handicapper never wins these things."

"The best handicappers never enter these things."

"So I could lose all of my \$300 in the contest? I can do that on my own."

"In Las Vegas, handicapping contests you get all you can eat and drink while you play. You don't here."

"Can you break even if you don't win the whole thing?"

"Are there refunds or rebates?"

"Is there a live bugler for the races on contest night?"

The handicapping-contest promotion is a prime example of a poor way to involve bettors in promotions. Most public relations people think it is a great, if not the best, way. In fact, it has a psychological flaw — it demands a bettor pay to play. Were a handicapping contest to offer a guaranteed purse distributed the same way as the buy-in type, a bettor would react to it like he or she does for a huge carry-over exotic pool. If the track offered a five-digit "purse" for the first five winners, the lure to play would greatly increase. The track could still ask for an entry fee if it amounted to pocket change (or the price of a beverage tumbler).

Big prizes for handicapping contests could be sponsor

supported. The track would connect with one or more local or international products/services to come up with a five- or even six-digit purse. Advertising the contest to attract players should emphasize "the pot" and the "no (or minor) entry fee" angles.

All advertisements must make reference to the fact there is no buy-in to participate and win a cash prize. There is another important thing to emphasize; it is a condition that no other handicapping contests ever suggest — no experience necessary!

Although handicapping contests do not demand anyone prove he or she is a handicapper/bettor, the inference in the title of the contest implies it is a challenge for handicappers/bettors, people that "know more" than the casual pari-mutuel fan.

By literally informing everyone of betting age qualifies for the contest and that anyone can enter for free, more people should be available to take a gamble. This ploy is a smart way to use the tired lottery slogan, "You can't win if you don't play," which infers all participants are equal because luck may be on your side.

Racetracks survive by keeping any and all customers satisfied, loyal and appreciated, targeting people that support its existence and doing so even if it has to put a live bugler on the payroll.

# Highlights galore as Pocono closes 2019 season

Saturday, on closing night of the 2019 season at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, there were many highlights, with champions both human and equine honored.

But stealing the show was 23-year-old provisional driver Sofia Zingale, who picked a dramatic circumstance in which to record her first-ever sulky victory – in the final \$15,000 Billings Amateur Driving Series Eastern Championship.

Zingale looked like a seasoned pro behind the veteran Muscles Yankee gelding Inukchuck Chuck, racing him second-over behind Jacks To Open after Wygant Prince went past early leader and favorite Fiji and put up fractions of :27.4 and :58 in 27-degree temperatures. The pacesetter and first-over went at it past the 1:28 three-quarters and through the turn, with Fiji waiting for the Pocono Pike.

But Zingale tipped Inukchuck Chuck three-wide and got the trotter to rally strongly to win by 2¼ lengths over Fiji, sending Zingale to Victory Lane for the first time in a sulky (she has a 1-for-3 record in Racing Under Saddle events). Inukchuck Chuck is trained by Nick Surick for owner Clifford Grundy.

Even veteran Billings promoter John Manzi was unsure if the "lightly-raced" Zingale had a "Billings nickname" yet. Since this victory propels her to eligibility for the \$25,000 Billings Eastern Gold Cup next Saturday at Yonkers, maybe Sofia "What A Time For A First Win!" Zingale may be appropriate.

Another trotter in the limelight at Pocono Saturday was the 4-year-old Explosive Matter gelding Rich And Miserable, who formed a four-race win streak here that propelled him on to being a force in the continental free-for-all trotting ranks. Named the Trotter of the Year at Pocono, Rich And Miserable posted a 6-5-1-0-\$113,750 scorecard locally, highlighted by his victory over 2017 Horse of the Year Hannelore Hanover in the \$100,000 Great Northeast Open Series Championship. Rich And Miserable is owned by Buter Farms Inc., Lynette Buter, and William and Carol Fuhs, trained by Todd Buter and driven in all of his Pocono starts by Tyler Buter.

The \$17,500 closing night featured pace was, fittingly enough, to the Pocono Pacer of the Year and Claimer of the Year Atta Boy Dan, who overcame first-over to catch favored pacesetter American Prime Time by a neck in 1:51. Driven by Simon Allard for trainer Pete Pellegrino for owner Stephen Larkin, the ten-year-old Western Terror gelding won for the

19th time this year, one off the top figure in North America, and pushed his 2019 earnings to \$203,090; the lifetime parallel numbers are 71 victories and \$946,692.

Four claims on closing night brought the seasonal total for the 134 cards to 483 horses changing hands, for a total value of \$9,465,025. (Atta Boy Dan accounted for 17 claims and \$670,000 himself.)

Finally, George Napolitano Jr. was honored as he continued his unprecedented dominance of the driving ranks in the 54-season history of the Downs. His seasonal sulky statistics were 1437-337-205-188-357, which earned him his eighth straight win title and 13th overall, and his sixth consecutive UDR crown and 11th overall, which George adds to the five Pocono training titles he has won.

# SBOANJ's annual meeting at Freehold Raceway

The Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey's (SBOANJ) annual board of director's meeting and election was held on Friday (Nov. 15) at Freehold Raceway. The board would like to thank all those who attended and their input.

The committee summary reports were given by the board of directors. Tom Pontone reported that the pension funds continue to benefit from the change of investment managers. Both the pension fund and insurance fund have a positive gain of over 10 per cent. Mark Ford reported that racing days in New Jersey are still in negotiations. However, he said he is hopeful that 2020 race dates will be similar or better than 2019 dates. Al Ochsner reported that the benevolent fund continues to assist many members and horsemen with special needs and health issues. Mike Klau reported that breeding in New Jersey is on the rise and is projecting that 1,000 mares will be bred in 2020, the most since 2008.

Insurance committee chairman Anthony Romano announced that there should not be any changes to the current insurance program or increased premiums for 2020. However, coverage and benefits will be reviewed to keep up with rising prescription costs. Anthony Perretti expressed the importance of maintaining the relationships that TrotPAC has built with legislators that helped pass the appropriations bill. Perretti said that "now is a crucial time for our industry we must stay proactive with legislators to continue to receive the appropriations that we were awarded."

The board of directors election results were announced: Mike Klau and Mark Mullen were each re-elected in the breeder category as they ran unopposed.

Anthony Perretti and Anthony Romano were each re-elected in the owner category.

Yannick Gingras ran unopposed in the driver/trainer category and will remain on the board.

The SBOANJ would like to thank all members who ran and voted in this year's election. It is important to have members involved in all aspects of our business but especially in the election process to be able to maintain a board of directors who are active in the business.
