Bullet The Bluesky sets world record in Swedish Breeders Crown

The Daniel Wäjersten trainee posted a 1:54.4 world record for 1.3 miles while winning the Breeders Crown for 3-year-old colt trotters.

Sundbyholm racetrack played host to four divisions of \$320,000 Breeders Crown in Sweden on Saturday (Nov. 16) afternoon and the 3-year-old colts and geldings showed up early on the card.

Daniel Wäjersten was the most successful trainer when the eliminations were held two weeks earlier and in Sundbyholm's first Breeders Crown final he sat behind the favorite, Kriteriet winner **Bullet The Bluesky** (Readly Express). Bullet The Bluesky could not take the front position when Johan Untersteiner stepped on the pedal immediately as the car left the field and Untersteiner's drive Far Wise As would hit the lead in a quick opening. The opening left its mark on the leader who got fired

up and Far Wise As reached the first kilometer in a mile rate of 1:54, which often is too fast for a 3-year-old in Swedish conditions in November.

And it turned out to be too much for the leader. Wäjersten had to settle in first over with his Bullet The Bluesky, but the driver played it cool and never got tricked by the leader's high pace, and kept his horse calm and motivated in his not so satisfying position.

This Breeders Crown final became nothing more than a onehorse show. Bullet The Bluesky left the opponents at the top of the stretch and he held strong finisher Coin Boy L.A. in safe distance winning in a very strong mile rate of 1:54.4 over 1.3 miles. A world record performance!

FIRST OVER BEST POSITION IN 4YO MARE FINAL

The 4-year-old mares battled next and their final was nothing like that of the 3-year-old boys, at least not in terms of speed. Paul Hagoort-trained Ester Degli Dei opened quickly for the lead and for once this season, favorite **Daim Brodda** (Readly Express) had to race outside of the leader. Daim Brodda is usually hard to snatch the front position from, but this time, Norwegian driver Eirik Höitomt had to let Daim Brodda do the hard work. And the slow pace in front was certainly a positive factor for the season's dominating 4-year-old mare. The leader had obviously plenty of gas to use during the race's last kilometer, but the pace began to increase dramatically with a half mile to go and as it turned out, Daim Brodda managed to disarm the leader in the stretch.

Thor Borg trains the Swedish-bred winner, who hit the wire in a moderate mile rate of 1:57.1. Daim Brodda has developed to be the queen of the crop after winning two of the most prestigious events of the year: the Derbystoet and Breeders Crown.

Ester Degli Dei was beaten by a neck as runner up and Elegance Kronos finished third after a smart drive, signed by Björn Goop.

NEW STAR IS BORN IN 3YO FILLY FINAL

Daniel Redén knows how to have horses in the best shape when the Breeders Crown finals are held. It's more or less a tradition that Redén collects one or maybe two or three wins in the last big stakes event in Sweden and Saturday's edition included a nice victory for 3-year-old filly **La Yuca** (Face Time Bourbon). La Yuca took the big step towards the best fillies in the crop with that victory and the winning formula was a perfect pocket trip, perfect racing room, and perfect drive by Magnus A Djuse.

La Yuca opened quickly from post 3, but couldn't pass by the favorite S.G.Empress, so Djuse opted for a trip behind the leader before an outside move. Some luck was involved before La Yuca flew by new leader Screen Time Limit shortly before the wire. In the last turn, a break by Elegance Silvio opened up some necessary racing room for the Face Time Bourbon filly. But luck is not all you need when winning. La Yuca showed extremely great speed and the victory in a mile rate of 1:57.3 over 1.3 miles, was well deserved.

ECLIPSE AS TOPS 4YO MALES

With a kilometer to go in the 4-year-old colts and geldings division of the Breeders Crown, the winner sat fourth on the inside, with basically all the favorites in front of him. But racing is unpredictable, especially over 1.3 miles in November, after a long season for most of the contenders and in this case, fourth on the inside ended with victory.

Heavy favorite Epic Kronos did not have his best day and he disappeared and went off-stride with some half-mile to go. At that point, Örjan Kihlström had tried to put some pressure on leader Bicc's Tobee, but it ended with a break, which opened the race up for upsets, or the second choice, leader Bicc's Tobee.

Positions were changed during pretty much the entire race and Ulf Ohlsson must have been pleased with the fact that his fourth inside position all of a sudden, at the last back stretch, was exchanged for a trip behind the leader. And when racing room appeared at mid-stretch, his drive **Eclipse As** (Nuncio) exploded and comfortably passed by the leader. It was a winning time 1:54.1 for Eclipse As, who started his career in Reijo Liljendahl's barn. Reijo is now living his harness racing life in America and his Eclipse As was moved to Ville Karhulahti, a trainer who took over the position as second trainer at Stig H Johansson's stable. That position was occupied by Liljendahl for decades before Liljendahl went on his own as a trainer in 2012.



Filling the void

Now it begins — the void.

The final yearling racehorse prospect has plodded down the ramp of the sales ring at the Harrisburg sale. The northern weather is growing cold. For many of us who race stakes horses, this means long winter months where our only contact with our annual horse dreams will be expensive bills. We face a long slog of nothingness until late spring.

The calendar of professional baseball mirrors the harness racing stakes season. After the World Series in late October, there is a lull for baseball fans, but Major League Baseball has less of a void than harness racing.

After the Christmas holidays, baseball fans may not have ballgames. Still, baseball fans have several outlets to keep the fires lit: the trading and acquisition of players, draft lists, the progress of top prospects, rosters keep getting shuffled, pitchers and catchers reporting, then spring training games. Virtually every day of the baseball off-season, especially in our social media world, a baseball mind can keep occupied.

Filling our harness racing off-season can only be a positive. What can we do for a harness race fan in months like January and February to fill the void?

One of the pioneers in filling the void is Anthony MacDonald and TheStable.ca. MacDonald does a yeoman's job of filling the void and keeping his investors in the loop with videos, audio, and even meet and greets. A few of my friends who have participated in his fractional ownership plan give him a thumbs up for his tireless efforts to fill the "off-season." I have logged on to his videos and agree. No doubt there are other fractional stables with good communication. We need more of this off-season action. Here is a small suggestion for MacDonald, his fellow fractional operators, and any group sharing ownership of a young racehorse - delegate the job of filling the void.

Let's suppose that the purchasers own a yearling named First Engagement. Let's also suppose eight buyers are involved in the adventure with First Engagement. One of those eight owners could take the reins in bringing the members deeper into this particular 2-year-old in training.

This person will lead and create a sub-community that interacts consistently. The community leader should be a sparkplug who keeps the other seven in motion. Of course, participation is not mandatory, but the First Engagement community will offer content to interested members who crave more involvement, especially during the off-season.

What would the members of the First Engagement group do? Everything and anything, there are no rules. Every group, like every horse, is different. Maybe take a deep dive into the First Engagement pedigree and invite a pedigree expert to opine about the horses' lineage. Follow First Engagement's siblings that are racing. Make new friends via Facetime. Arrange Skype meetups or meet in person when possible. A member near the training center can shoot videos and interviews. Just converse, keep in contact, and make the ownership experience richer.

The key to the success or value of this deep dive into a single horse depends on the people involved. Is the community leader clever and industrious? Are the other members enthusiastic? There are no guarantees, but what are the downsides?

Small communities, even communities centered around a young racehorse, can create islands that offer a respite from the insane speed of modern life. A group of people centering around something as unusual as horse ownership can open doors of communication. Just as book clubs are not entirely about books, a horse club or horse group of this nature is about more than a racehorse in training. High-interest groups are about people connecting.

High-interest groups like these could help fill the chasm of time between the sales ring and the day First Engagement is in the box.

My picks for 2024 Dan Patch divisional honors

It's that time of year. Time to pick the season's champions from my perspective. This is the way my Dan Patch ballot will be filled in.

2-YEAR-OLD COLT TROTTERS MARYLAND

This is a gimme. It should be unanimous, but it probably won't be. This colt swept the board. The richest, with earnings of \$1,227,695 and tied as the fastest (1.51.4) 2-year-old trotter of 2024. From mid-summer on, he was not even approachable. His many wins, on the way to a six-for-nine season, included the Breeders Crown and the Mohawk Million.

2-YEAR-OLD FILLY TROTTERS

CHAMPAGNE PROBLEMS

This was very close. I finally went with the highest money earner (\$495,536) and most current winner. Close by were Lady Landia with earnings of \$426,300 and the horse

Monalishi for which I likely would have voted if she had also raced out of Canada. She had earnings of \$413,280.

2-YEAR-OLD COLT PACERS

LOUPRINT

Close between him and the Metro winner Fallout. But as they say, "It All Comes Down to the Breeders Crown," (although, sometimes it doesn't). This colt was also the highest money-winning 2-year-old pacer with earnings of \$737,939. Honorable mention goes to the fastest 2-year-old ever, Sippinonsearoc with a record of 1.48.2.

2-YEAR-OLD FILLY PACERS

CHANTILLY

This is another one who, in my view, should be a gimme, but likely will not be. She violated some of the rules that I like to maintain. She didn't race out of Ontario and of course didn't race in the Breeders Crown to which she was not eligible. She wasn't the richest 2-year-old filly of the year. That honor goes to Miki And Minnie who earned \$671,750. But if you saw Chantilly race you would know from where I'm coming. She was nine-for-nine and earned \$560,315. No other filly either got close to her or even warmed her up.

3-YEAR-OLD COLT TROTTERS

SIG SAUER

In his case it came down to the Breeders Crown and also the Kentucky Futurity, both of which he captured in exciting fashion. There are undoubtedly those who believe Karl deserves the honor because of his Hambletonian win and early season's prowess. I certainly respect their opinion and I am not about to publicly disagree with them.

3-YEAR-OLD FILLY TROTTERS

R MELINA

This was the closest match for me, between R Melina and Allegiant. In the end I went with money earnings (\$815,969) and the former's win in the Kentucky Filly Futurity over Allegiant (\$710,902) who, other than that race at the Red Mile, was the best in the latter part of the season. But you will find no disagreement from me if you picked Allegiant.

3-YEAR-OLD COLT PACERS

NIJINSKY

I believe that there were four terrific colts worthy of consideration Nijinsky, Captain Albano, Mirage Hanover and Legendary Hanover. Each of them was dominant at various times of the season. I went with Nijinsky because of his earnings (\$1,142,920) and his overall consistency. He was excellent early in winning the North America Cup and was still a player throughout and at the end of the season.

3-YEAR-OLD FILLY PACERS

MY GIRL EJ

She was undoubtedly the best. She earned the most money - \$759,643. She won the big ones. She was around and competitive all season long. Honorable mention to Its a Love Thing (\$615,608) and Odds On Platinum (\$548,720).

OLDER MALE TROTTERS

WINNER'S BET

Very good all year and great towards the end. Very close to being a gimme as at least half of the older winners are. He finished the season with earnings of \$729,254 winning eight of 11 starts, with a Breeders Crown victory. I was rather surprised to discover that Periculum had outearned him slightly with winnings of \$741,072.

OLDER FEMALE TROTTERS

JIGGY JOG S

The gimme of all gimmes. How can one argue with perfection? This wonderful mare was six-for-six. She earned \$934,188 and just jogged in the million-dollar Yonkers International Trot as she did in most of her other races. Harness racing will be much poorer without her presence on the racing scene in 2025.

OLDER MALE PACERS

ABUCKABETT HANOVER

The model of consistency in a racehorse. He earned more than any other older pacing male. Although not always a winner, he was always right there.



A second gimme of all gimmes. Although not undefeated, she was close to perfection in winning 10 of 12 starts and earning \$827,062. She was the head of her class, perhaps all classes from the very beginning of the season until her spectacular Breeders Crown win in late October.

Taylor, Elmore and Austin inducted into IHRA Hall of Fame

Ellen Taylor, Brian Elmore and Terri Austin are the newest members of the Indiana Horse Racing Association, Inc. Hall of Fame, formally inducted Monday evening (Nov. 11). The ceremonies were conducted at Horseshoe Indianapolis Racing and Casino. The trio of honorees were recognized for their service to the state's racing industry, and each has a connection to Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing and Casino and the Anderson area.

Taylor is a lifelong supporter of harness racing, growing up in a racing family based in Central Indiana. She is best known for her work with the Harness Horse Youth Foundation. At the age of 16, Taylor took on the role of camp coordinator for HHYF. In 1990, she took the reins of the organization from her mother, Margot, assuming the role of executive director, a position she still holds today.

Taylor was a driving force behind the creation of the Harness Racing Youth League program, held for the first time in 1999 at Hoosier Park. The HRYL paved the way for an annual schedule of summer camps HHYF conducts in the Midwest and East Coast that introduce youth to harness racing and teach care and horsemanship. These camps have exposed thousands to the industry she dearly loves.

Taylor is a longtime member of the United States Harness Writers Association, serving as an at-large director for 15 years and currently holding the same position in the Indiana chapter. She has chaired USHWA's silent auction committee since 2013. Taylor was named USHWA Member of the Year in 2015, and received the Stan Bergstein Proximity Award in 2009.

With this distinction, Taylor is the fourth member of her family to be honored in the Hoosier State. Her grandfather, Don Taylor, and parents, Margot and Dick Taylor, are each members of the Indiana Standardbred Hall of Fame. Margot was honored as an Immortal in Goshen, NY last year.

Brian Elmore's participation in the racing industry spans five decades. Born in Sullivan, IN, Elmore's involvement in the sport began with quarter horse racing. He eventually moved into track management, leading him to Texas for a stint. Elmore returned to Indiana in late 1995 to work at Hoosier Park's off-track betting location in Indianapolis. He would rise to director of OTB operations, and later move into the roles of director of racing operations and general manager of racing at Hoosier Park and Horseshoe Indianapolis. He has also served as vice president and general manager at Ellis Park.

When he stepped away from roles in track management, Elmore transitioned into the position of executive director of the Indiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA). He held that title until his retirement earlier this year, but he continues to support the Indiana HBPA as a consultant.

Currently, he is devoting time to the planning and construction of a \$1.4 million community center that, when complete, will provide a 150-person chapel, offices and meeting space for the chaplaincy program at Horseshoe Indianapolis.

Elmore was previously honored by The Jockey's Guild in 2016, receiving the prestigious Eddie Arcaro Award.

Terri Austin served the people of Anderson and Madison County for two decades as a state representative. She was elected to the Indiana House of Representatives in 2002, and during her time in office, she held several leadership roles. She was an ally for Harrah's Hoosier Park, providing unwavering support for horse racing in her district as well as the state. Austin's support was instrumental in the passage of legislation that allowed casinos at Indiana's two pari-mutuel tracks.

Keayang Zahara is a freak, but no fluke

The undefeated homebred 3-year-old filly trotter is all the rage Down Under.

She is the filly that has everyone in Down Under harness racing talking.

Keayang Zahara is a generational talent and could even be something more.

The homebred 3-year-old trotter stretched her unbeaten record to 12 races when she travelled from Australia to

New Zealand to thrash her rivals in the inaugural \$500,000 The Ascent (1,980 meters) at Addington in Christchurch on Friday (Nov. 15).

Keayang Zahara sat parked and floated away from her rivals to win by eight lengths with driver Jason Lee barely flinching, except when he flourished his whip to a cheering crowd over the last 50 meters.

It was her sixth Group 1 win and she's already banked \$477,330.

It's remarkable given she only had her first start on April 3.

Keayang Zahara will stay in New Zealand to chase her seventh Group 1 win in the space of just eight months when she tackles the \$140,000 NZ Trotting Oaks at Addington on Friday.

Top Victorian trainer Andy Gath, who was among the excited observers at Addington, said, "She would've gone close to winning the feature open class trot today (Group 1 New Zealand trotting free-for-all). The times she runs and the way she does it is really freakish.

"They don't do what she's doing."

Let's go back to the start with Keayang Zahara.

Yes, she is a homebred, but she's got some serious bloodlines.

Keayang Zahara is by boom stallion Volstead out of the talented Muscles Yankee mare Keayang Yankee, who raced just

19 times for nine wins. Keayang Yankee's dam, Dream Interest, is by Dream Vacation.

She was bred by the Lee and Craven clan, a salt of the earth Victorian country family. They are better known for a huge dairy farming operation at Ecklin South, about three hours south-west of Melbourne.

It's hardly harness racing central.

But the Lee/Craven clan have had some lovely horses, most notably former Chariots Of Fire winning pacer Jilliby Kung Fu, who also finished second in a Miracle Mile. Injuries cut him down in his prime, but he still landed 19 wins and almost \$600,000.

In more recent times, the clan has invested plenty in buying and breeding top quality horses, with a growing percentage being trotters.

In a nutshell, Keayang Zahara is a freak, but she is no fluke. She's the result of big investment and a concerted strategy.

Marg Lee trains the filly with son, Paddy. Another son, Jason, does the driving.

They were all at Addington, along with an army of other extended family members, many of whom are part of the broad family ownership in her.

Marg, who prefers to let her sons do the talking, was moved to open-up a bit herself about Keayang Zahara after the romp.

She spoke about the mounting pressure of training an unbeaten horse with the growing hype of Keayang Zahara.

"When I flew over [from Melbourne to Christchurch] the night before the race, I watched the movie about Winx [a champion be easy coming over here [to race at Addington], travelling for the first time and racing good New Zealand horses. I was surprised how easy it was, but this filly [Keayang Zahara] seems to just keep surprising us.

Aussie thoroughbred who won 33 races on end] and how much pressure Chris Waller [her trainer] felt," Marg said. "I don't think it helped. It made me feel even more pressure about our filly and that people just sort of expect her to turn up and win every time now.

"We never thought it would be easy coming over here, travelling for the first time and racing good New Zealand horses. I was surprised how easy it was, but this filly seems to just keep surprising us.

Paddy was as impressed with how well Keayang Zahara handled the trip as he was with her win last Friday.

"I really expected it to take a fair bit out of her, but she bounced back within a day of arriving and ate better here than she does at home," he said. "Once we'd taken her in for a look around Addington in a little hit out six days before the race, we started to get really excited. Jase said she felt terrific.

"Everything just went so smoothly, so while it was awesome to see her come out and win so well, it probably wasn't surprising because we felt we had her spot on."

Jason said, "She's just something else. I was happy to balance her up early and then move around them to sit parked and stay out of trouble and take bad luck out of the equation.

"She was cruising coming off the back [straight] and really did it all herself. That's the amazing thing about her, she just does it so easily. Everyone says it looks that way and that's how it feels, too."

Beyond Friday's New Zealand Oaks, Paddy said plans are uncertain.

"There's the Derby here [in Addington] a week later, but we're leaning towards getting her back home and giving her a break," he said. "You don't want to get too greedy. She's come a long way very quickly and, hopefully, has a big career ahead.

"We've got some thinking to do about what next year looks like, how long we give her out and when we look at the big [open older] races with her."

Australia's biggest trotting race, the Great Southern Star, will come too soon in early February.

An option is the \$600,000 TAB Trot slot race at Cambridge in April.

"That timing could work, but there's a chance we also want to give her a really good spell and it could come up too soon," Paddy said. "We've been patient so far and didn't race her as a 2-year-old. She could've raced, but had some growing pains so we were happy to wait. We knew she had heaps of ability back then."

With Down Under champ Just Believe turning 9 at the end of the year, Keayang Zahara looks every bit his heir apparent.

It would be fantastic to see them clash and could happen in a race like the TAB Trot.

Looking further forward, Keayang Zahara has the speed, strength, talent and gait to go and chase a race like the iconic Elitloppet in Sweden.

There's so much to look forward to.

History makers and those who could join them

Here are some people or horses that have made — or may make — history this year.

BRETT BECKWITH

Brett Beckwith, who does not turn 22 until January, should be a unanimous choice for 2024's Rising Star Award making him the youngest ever to win it. Beckwith, who is having a career year – 2,720 544-451-381, \$5,606,286 – missed winning the award by a single vote a year ago. Richard Silverman set the record in 1986 turning 22 in November of his award-winning season.

CHRIS RYDER, DEXTER DUNN, AND TWIN B JOE FRESH

Chris Ryder is on the doorstep of being the first trainer since 1970 to be elected to the Hall of Fame and have the Horse of the Year the same year. Joe O'Brien did it in 1970 with Fresh Yankee.

Ryder, Dexter Dunn, and Twin B Joe Fresh will be the third Trainer of the Year, Driver of the Year, Horse of the Year combo in the same year, should they all win. In 2012, trainer Linda Toscano, driver Tim Tetrick, and Chapter Seven did it, as did trainer Greg Peck, driver Brian Sears and Muscle Hill in 2009.

This one goes a step further with Ryder and Dunn in on the ownership of the outstanding Roll With Joe mare.

Of course, this is contingent on Ryder winning the trainer award which has several worthy candidates such as Ron Burke, Ake Svanstedt, Marcus Melander, et al.

MULTIPLE MILLERS AND MORE

Six Millers in one race? The second race at Hoosier Park on Friday (Nov. 15) had drivers Andy, Lewayne, and Marcus as well as trainers Erv, Susan and Julie. Alvin Miller is in a later race. It's a good stat, but likely not a world record.

Thursday (Nov. 14 2024) there were back-to-back \$100 horses at Hoosier Park. That has happened before, but is extremely rare. Trace Tetrick and Jordan Ross, the first and fourth leading drivers at the track, both won with a favorite and a \$100 horse on the same night, which could be a record. Tetrick won the first race with Fancywontletyadown (\$3.80) and the ninth with

Miki Leaks (\$112.20). Ross won the fourth race with favored Gracefull Lilly (\$6) and then lit up the board with J Ks Desire in the 10th (\$101.20).

AMAZING CATCH

Amazing Catch sold for \$1,850,000. Wow! It was the third seven figure sale at Harrisburg in a record setting week. Possibly even more amazing, is of the top 50 earners of 2024, Amazing Catch is No. 16 at \$707,330. But the only one with just two wins (12 2-3-5).

MARYLAND

As of Nov. 15, Maryland is No. 1 among all earners in North America at \$1,227,695. About \$85G up on Nijinsky at \$1,142,920. The last time a 2-year-old trotter led the entire sport at year's end was Newport Dream in 1953. It's also happened three times on the pacing side, the last being Redskin in 1986.

BOB-BING AND WEAVING

Here are a few more stats on some top drivers and trainers:

- In the last 22 years, nine times the Driver of the Year also handled the Horse of the Year. Dunn could double up in 2024 after handling the unanimous winner Bulldog Hanover in 2022. Others who have done it are Yannick Gingras with both Hannelore Hanover (2017) and JK She'salady (2014), Dave Miller with both Always B Miki (2016) and with the last Triple Crown winner on the pacing side No Pan Intended (2003), Tim Tetrick with Chapter Seven (2012), Brian Sears with Muscle Hill (2009), John Campbell with Glidemaster (2006) and Ron Pierce with Rainbow Blue (2004).
- On the training side (eight for 39), it happened last with Nancy Takter in 2020 with Tall Dark Stranger. Linda Toscano actually went 1-2 with Chapter Seven and Market Share (2012). Greg Peck won with Muscle Hill (2009), Steve Elliott with Donato Hanover (2007), Ivan Sugg with No Pan Intended (2003), Mark Ford with Gallo Blue Chip (2000), Bob McIntosh with Artsplace (1992) and Chuck Sylvester with Mack Lobell (1987).
- Dunn with 1,348 starts and Scott Zeron with 1,303 are in the top four in money in 2024, yet no one else in the top 29 in driving earners has fewer drives.
- Amazing UTRS of .469 for Brett Pelling in 2024 off the strength of his great stats: 279 86-56-41 and \$2,887,822. It's quite likely that Pelling will be the 28th trainer in the last 32 years to not get a HOY vote the year after winning it the year prior (Confederate).
- Ron Burke is having another huge season with his \$21.2 million, more than the next three Ake Svanstedt, Travis Alexander, and Per Engblom combined (\$19.98 million).

Patience is Aaron Mason's blueprint for future success

The game plan Aaron Mason has crafted for his racing career is very much like his approach to horses.

There is little, if any chance at all, that the young Manitoba horseman will ever get too far ahead of himself.

Instead, Mason, who hails from Killarney, population around 2,500, is measured in his approach to the sport of standardbred racing.

"I think with this sport, you need to be patient to find success," Mason said. "Whether that happens to be with the horses you train and care for, or how you develop your career, sometimes staying in the moment can be a huge help for what you want to achieve down the line."

Mason, son of successful Manitoba husband and wife horsepeople Darryl and Sherri Mason, continues to adhere to that philosophy as he looks to broaden his horse racing horizons.

His ties to the sport date back to his early childhood days, times when he would spend hours at the racetrack or on it.

Aaron's earliest recollections of horses and harness racing harken back to the moments he would, quite literally, go along for a ride with his father.

"One of the first things I can remember is sitting in the jog cart with my dad and my sister," Aaron said. "I was 5. It was just fun being able to do that with my family and to feel that rush of sitting behind a horse."

It didn't occur to him then, but Aaron knew he was destined to have a life in harness racing.

And that was precisely what he wanted.

"I love it," he said. "Being around it so much made you appreciate it even more."

Lessons learned along the way were many.

"With my parents being so involved, you were able to take in so much," said Aaron, who started training his first horse at the

from my parents], above all else, was work ethic. Putting in an honest day's work was always the most important thing. They also spoke about having a positive attitude and to love what I was doing.

age of 12. "Whether it was them sharing some helpful advice or just watching what they did and how they did it, I always took something away from each day I was in the barn.

"The one thing, above all else, was work ethic. Putting in an honest day's work was always the most important thing. They also spoke about having a positive attitude and to love what I was doing."

By the time he sent out his first starter in 2023, Aaron was well prepared across the board.

That milestone moment came on July 15, 2023, at Miami, a half-mile oval in his home province, with B Special, a pacing mare he owned.

With his father driving, B Special, a daughter of Mystery Chase (AB), finished fourth in a time of 2:03.1.

The breakthrough success came on Sept. 16 at The Loop, a half-mile track in Winnipeg, the capital city of 849,000 people in Manitoba.

Darryl guided B Special to a quarter-length score in 2:01.3.

"That was such a great day," Aaron said. "To get your first training win is special, but then to have it be a family thing made it even more memorable."

The icing on the cake was the horse who delivered the win.

"She is an awesome mare," Aaron said. "She is so easy to be around, very quiet. She has taught me a lot."

B Special has also inspired Aaron to add another facet to his racing career.

"I wrote my driver's test this summer and started my drives," he said. "The racing season here in Manitoba is short, so I wouldn't have had enough weekends to complete my drives for the test. I will finish those in the spring and hope I get it."

For now, he will focus on training and advancing his horse racing education, in between his full-time job at a Heavy-Duty equipment company in his hometown.

"I have three horses, and they all teach something," he said. "Each horse is different, and I am learning a lot from them."

Aaron, Manitoba Standardbred Racing Industry's rookie of the year in 2023, is also plotting a methodical career path for himself.

He is in no hurry to fast-track any aspect of what he does or what he is chasing.

"I would love to find a horse to put in the so-called big races," he said. "My family runs a breeding farm, and I would like to take one of their young colts, make it my own, develop it and then see if I can get it to a higher racing level. I think the ideal number of horses I would like to train, as I start out, would be 10. I have raced that number with my family, and it has worked well. If it grows from there, that would be great, but I want to make sure I do it the right way."

Just like Aaron, who is working to obtain his Level 2 Heavy-Duty Mechanic License, plans to do with the driving side of racing.

"I want to get my license, then start slow and work my way up," he said.

It's a blueprint that Aaron believes will be the foundation for future success.

An earnest dedication to all things racing won't be an issue.

Nor will an organized schedule of his day.

"When I get home from work, I take half an hour for supper, then I head out to the barn to make sure all the stalls are clean, and the horses are jogged," he said. "My mom and dad are helping me jog. We get done around 9 in the evening and then I am in for bed at 9:30. Then it's up around 6:45 and 7 off to work again."

Aaron does manage to find time to play the sport he has long enjoyed.

In the winter, when he isn't at the shop, or the barn, he can be typically found at the local hockey arena.

"I enjoy playing hockey in the winter," Aaron said. "On weekends, I get to go play hockey and have fun with my friends."

While a career with his hometown NHL team, the Winnipeg Jets, is out of reach, carrying on his family's rich legacy in Manitoba horse racing is very much attainable for the young horseman in the burgundy and grey driving colors.

"This year, I learned even more that things take patience," he said. "You can't rush a horse. You want to make sure you have them fully prepared, the right way, every time they race. It takes time to bring out the best in them."

I'll spare you the details; believe me. My father's life was void of pure luck, until his 56th birthday. Why? Because the day he entered his 57th year on Earth he discovered the winds of happy chance were at his back.

It is a long drive from the borough of Brooklyn to the village of Belmont but as Tzu suggested I prepared by laying plans before I invited him. Among them was the ride to Long Island. It would be filled with light conversation; having nothing to do with horse racing or gambling. Or his lost job. Or his guilt for being unable to fully support his wife. No toxic topics would be addressed. And I would let him ramble without delivering any of my opinions.

As Tzu wrote, "The Moral Law causes the people to be in complete accord with their ruler, so that they will follow him regardless of their lives, undismayed by any danger." I was the ruler and the Moral Law worked. Ralph was all in for the trip during the ride to Belmont. "All warfare is based on deception." It was a good beginning.

Belmont Park in the mid-70s was a splendiferous sight on any day. But on Ralph's birthday trip to the track the spring weather

lifted its luster; it had the clarity of a master painter's brush strokes on the outside and viewing the landscape from the grandstand wreaked wonderment.

I paid our admission and bought two racing programs. We found seats and I bought us coffee. Ralph said nothing when I gave him a program. He held it for a bit and then opened it. I said nothing. He would have to ask me questions about anything he suddenly discovered interesting. He drank an entire cup of coffee before he said a word.

"So, each page is the bunch of horses in a race?" he said.

"Yup. Each group in a race is called a field."

I left him alone with his program while I bought us more coffee. When I returned, he asked a few more questions. I answered in a matter-of-factly voice so as not to sound pedantic. No questions about handicapping arose and I did not offer any. We sat in silence as the track announcer introduced the first-race field.

All was good, I thought, because dad was relaxed and alert and surprisingly comfortable in one of the old unfit-for-heavy-bodies grandstand seats. He sat looking at the program with an expression anyone might conclude displayed he knew what he was reading. Then I decided to play a horse in the opening race.

As I stood to find the nearest betting window, he said, "Which of these are you going to bet?"

"The 7. To win."

"Of course, to win."

I explained to him about betting to place and show and on the Daily Double. I left to bet and returned with a win ticket.

"What about the 1?" he said.

"I bet the 7."

"You should bet the 1."

"Why?"

"He looked good when he was introduced."

"Do you want me to get you a bet on the 1?"

He reached into his pocket but I waved him off and ran to a window to buy him a win ticket on the 1. I returned as the field left the gate.

"How many times do they run around the track?" he said.

"In this race they run once around."

The 7 ran fifth but the 1 came in second. He thought he won money. I explained again about win, place and show. Losing did not bother him. In between races he showed no signs of boredom. And he began to ask more questions. I answered simply. No info dumps. I was following Tzu's rules that "the skillful leader subdues the enemy without any fighting."





Take All Comers earns millionaire status by taking MGM Grand Prix final

Take All Comers went over the \$1 million mark in lifetime earnings after capturing the inaugural \$250,000 MGM Grand Prix Trotting Series final on Friday night (Nov. 15) at MGM Yonkers Raceway. The time for the mile and a sixteenth was 2:01.4.

Driven by Jordan Stratton and sent off as the 8-5 favorite, Take All Comers left out quickly from post 5, but It's Academic (David Miller) also showed speed from post 6, and It's Academic worked his way around Take All Comers for the top spot past the :26.4 quarter. Behind them, Ari Ferrari J (Jason Bartlett) landed third and Chapercraz (Yannick Gingras) found a seat on the cones in front of Delayed Hanover (Dexter Dunn).

Heading to the half, which Miller and It's Academic backed down to just :57 seconds, Ari Ferrari J was sent first-over, and that provided cover to Chapercraz and Delayed Hanover. However, Ari Ferrari J made a break entering the third turn, leaving Chapercraz first-over against fellow Ron Burke trainee It's Academic. Chapercraz made some gains on the rim as they trotted to the 1:25.3 three-quarters, but he stalled out on the final bend.

After Chapercraz began to fade late on the far turn, that left It's Academic and Take All Comers to decide it. It's Academic came off the pylons in the stretch, and that gave Stratton the room he was looking for, but Take All Comers still had to have the trot to go with it to chase down last year's Dan Patch Award winner for older trotting males. It came right down to the final stride, but Take All Comers was able to get up and defeat It's Academic by a head, with Delayed Hanover third. Chapercraz and Pappardelle (George Brennan) rounded out the top five.

"He leaves just as fast as a pacer, especially with the mile and a sixteenth and the extra distance to the first turn," Stratton said post-race. "That was the winning spot. I just needed some racing room. There was a lot of yellow [Burke horses] around me. I didn't know if I'd find room or not, but the horse dug in through the lane, and he beat a really good horse at the wire. I didn't know if I was going to get there, but he really put his head down and dug right down by the wire.

"Being the home track, it's a good feeling [to win]."

Trained by Jim Campbell, Take All Comers was bred by owner Runthetable Stables with Chelsea Batelli. The victorious 6-year-old Creatine gelding made his 20th appearance in the winner's circle, has put away \$1,078,866 and returned \$5.50 to win. He led a \$19 exacta and a \$98.50 trifecta.

With two preliminary rounds complete, the companion MGM Grand Prix Pacing Series is on a break until the third leg on

Dec. 9. The \$250,000 final is on Dec. 16, and leg three and the final will be at the distance of a mile and a sixteenth.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is operating on a Monday through Friday live racing schedule with post time each night at 7 p.m. (EST).

It's Academic 'a dream' for Grant

As trotter It's Academic prepares for the final races of his career, it's safe to say the 7-year-old stallion has brought owner Brad Grant on a memorable ride.

Grant, an Ontario resident, purchased It's Academic at the age of 3 in October 2020 hoping for a horse to send out regularly in the preferred at Woodbine Mohawk Park. But when racing in the province was suspended in April 2021 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, It's Academic returned to the U.S. and his former trainer Ron Burke.

"The rest is history," Grant said.

A fitting choice of words, from an academic standpoint.

Since that April, It's Academic has earned \$2.22 million for Grant and Burke. He hit the board in 47 of 70 starts, winning 20, during that time and was the 2023 Dan Patch Award winner for best older male trotter.

For his career, the son of Uncle Peter—Annapolis has won 34 of 97 races and earned a paycheck 84 times on his way to \$2.69 million (nearly \$3 million Canadian) in purses. His North American earnings rank seventh among trotting stallions in history.

"It's been great," Grant said. "Ronnie was good enough to take him back down there, and he just continued to excel. He's taken on all comers. Since I've had him, he's never been in less than the preferred and raced in every stakes race going. That says something.

"Night after night, he's raced against the toughest and shows up and wins his fair share. I think most nights you can't count him out. The horse is a dream."

It's Academic has won 12 times on the Grand Circuit in his career, with his triumphs including the John Cashman Memorial, two editions of the Spirit of Massachusetts, the Caesars Trotting Classic, and Crawford Farms Open Trot.

He has finished second in eight Grand Circuit starts, including a Breeders Crown, Maple Leaf Trot, and TVG (now FanDuel) Championship.

In addition, It's Academic was invited to the MGM Yonkers International Trot on three occasions, with a best finish of third from post 8, and never was worse than fifth.

"There's not really one race that stands out, I just like to watch him race every night," Grant said. "You never get tired of watching him. I think you knew that every night he was going to give it his best and you knew he would give it a run.

"Every year there is a horse that steps up and pushes all the right buttons, but this guy showed up every year. Ronnie and his crew have done a great job with him. The credit goes to them and the caretaker. They're the ones that should get the credit."

On Friday (Nov. 15), It's Academic finished second, beaten a head, at MGM Yonkers Raceway in the \$250,000 MGM Grand Prix Trotting Series final.

"The size of a track doesn't seem to bother him, so he's versatile that way," Grant said prior to Yonkers race. "Ronnie has given him every chance. Hopefully, we can get it done this weekend and finish with the FanDuel [Championship] and put him away sound and see what happens going forward. When I bought him, I never dreamt he would be the horse that he turned out to be. I was just looking for a horse to race on Saturday nights at Mohawk.

"We couldn't have asked any more of him."

Following the completion of his campaign, It's Academic will retire to stallion duty at Tara Hills Stud in Ontario.

"There are a couple of good, solid, stallions up here, but I think there is room for another good one," Grant said. "I want to support the Ontario sires program as much as I can, so we thought this would be the place to put him. I'm excited to see how his foals turn out. He's a beautiful horse. He should throw good, tough racehorses. I think he's got all the credentials to be a great stallion."



Shore Not Beach, Won Last Call repeat in DSBF prelim

by the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund

First-round winners **Shore Not Beach** and **Won Last Call** repeated in their respective \$20,000 second-round Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund events for 2-year-old male pacers, held Thursday (Nov. 14) at Bally's Dover.

In the second division, TLB Racing's Shore Not Beach and driver Pat Berry sprinted clear from post 5 to lead Sting Ray (driven by Corey Callahan) and three other rivals through splits of :27.1, :55.4 and 1:24.3 before edging clear of his pocket rival around the final turn. The Badlands Hanover—Azure Deo gelding evaded a mild late rally from runner-up Lew Not Lou (Tim Tetrick) by two lengths and reduced his lifetime mark to 1:54.1. Sting Ray faded to third, another 3¾ lengths behind.

Traci Berry trains three-time winner Shore Not Beach, who has now earned \$62,500 in his career. Sent off the 1-2 favorite, he paid \$3 to win.

The first split, conducted as a non-wagering race, set up as a rematch between first-round winner Won Last Call and Harrington series champion Primo Maschio. In the first leg, Won Last Call recovered from an early bobble to post a 26-1 upset over Primo Maschio, and their second meeting had a similar dynamic from the start. Eight-time winner Primo Maschio (Trae Porter) strolled through a :59.2 first half with Won Last Call and Montrell Teague stalking comfortably from the pocket. Primo Maschio picked up the pace on the backstretch, throwing down a :28.1 third quarter and trying to sprint free of his pocket foe, but Won Last Call emerged off the home turn and collared Primo Maschio by a half-length in 1:55. Wyatt Earp (Justin Irvine) finished third after stalking the top pair throughout the entire mile.

Joe Columbo trains four-time winner Won Last Call, a Badlands Hanover—I'm Won Shot Wiser gelding who competes as a homebred for George and Tina Dennis Racing and has earned \$47,094.

In addition to preliminary winners Shore Not Beach and Won Last Call, the following horses have qualified for the \$110,000 DSBF championship, to be held Nov. 21: Primo Maschio, Lew Not Lou, Wyatt Earp, Sting Ray, LL Royal Man and Our Perfect Aim.

Bythemissal back at Rosecroft for Potomac Pace title defense

Bythemissal is being readied for a title defense in today's \$125,000 Potomac Pace at Rosecroft Raceway, where the 5-year-old gelding became the first favorite to win in the eight-year history of the one-mile event.

The Ron Burke trainee, who produced the fastest mile ever recorded at Rosecroft by a 4-year-old pacer when he covered the mile in 1:48 last year, enters this year's edition coming off a subpar performance.

The son of Downbytheseaside finished fifth in the Oct. 26 Breeders Crown Open Pace at The Meadowlands as the 2-5 favorite.

"He had kind of a tough enough trip that it could have affected him, but also I don't think he was as sharp as he'd been," said Burke, who was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2021. "Everything now seems good. I expect him to race very well."

Bythemissal, who captured his Breeders Crown elimination race impressively the week prior to his disappointing finish in the final, has earned more than \$2.3 million during a 40-race career than includes 27 victories. He is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Eric K. Good, Rich Lombardo Racing, and Weaver Bruscemi.

"He tries so hard," Burke said. He's one of the most willing horses I've had. He's very fast, too. I don't know if I've had a horse that can go for a piece as fast as him. It makes him tough. Anytime you have a horse that has high, high speed and is very willing, makes him hard to beat."

Bythemissal has only raced seven times this season.

"He got a minor injury in the middle of the year that kind of screwed his whole year up," Burke said. "Then, I took my time bringing him back and got him right. I was thrilled with everything until his last start. He wasn't terrible but I know he's a better horse than that. I expect him to come back to himself this week."

Yannick Gingras will drive Bythemissal, who drew post 6 in an eight-horse field.

"I think he could have drawn a little bit inside, but I think he's all right there," Burke said. "I feel good about him."

The Potomac Pace field from the rail out is: Charlie May, It's My Show, Abuckabett Hanover, Voukefalas, El Rey, Bythemissal, Little Rocket Man, and Ruthless Hanover. South Beach Star is the also eliqible.

First-race post for today's 14-race program is set at 3 p.m. The Potomac Pace is carded as race 11.

Gruesome Twosome, Lets Go Endofaera shine in Star Destroyer at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Two of Indiana's finest, **Gruesome Twosome** and **Lets Go Endofaera** staged late rallies to get their noses on the wire first in a stakes filled card Friday (Nov. 15) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Seven splits of the Star Destroyer headlined the 14-race card for the four sophomore divisions, headlined by the \$57,000 lone division for trotting colts.

Gruesome Twosome left from post 5 in the field of nine as the 1-20 favorite, with driver Daryl Bontrager settling the bettors' choice into fourth early while Dashing Danny (Kyle Wilfong) worked around 70-1 shot Flirtnwiththepilot (Marvin Luna) through a first quarter of :28. Bontrager thought better of a backside brush, opting to stay in fourth as Dashing Danny got to the half in :57.1. The tempo quickened on the final turn,

allowing Dashing Danny to scamper away by two lengths at three-quarters in 1:25.3 as Gruesome Twosome followed the cover of Victor Lazlo (John De Long) from second-over in fourth.

Victor Lazlo jumped it off at the top of the lane, as Gruesome Twosome found himself with a 5½ length deficit to a dueling Dashing Danny and Flirtnwiththepilot midway through the stretch. Flirtnwiththepilot appeared poised to pull a massive shocker before Gruesome Twosome found his best stride late, rocketing home in :27.2 to chase down the longshot and reach the wire first by a quarter-length in 1:54. Dashing Danny held for the show spot.

Bontrager trains and co-owns Gruesome Twosome along with Ira Steinberg. A winner in 10 of 15 this season, the son of You Know You Do—All Set Lets Go has surpassed \$400,000 in seasonal earnings, with a career bankroll of \$642,603.

Lets Go Endofaera needed similar late race heroics to secure victory in the \$30,000 second division for pacing fillies. John De Long landed the 4-5 favorite in fourth early while Asweetbeachhere (Andy Miller) battled Daisy's Star (LeWayne Miller) to the quarter in :27.2. After the dust settled, Brandon Bates wheeled Seaside Diva to assume command from Daisy's Star at the half in :55.3. Seaside Diva looked to give the field the slip on the final turn, opening up by three lengths at three-quarters in 1:24.1 while Lets Go Endofaera stalked from second-over in fifth.

Seaside Diva looked to be home free in the lane, before beginning to tire in deep stretch with Lets Go Endofaera gaining. Surging late with a :26.3 last quarter, Lets Go Endofaera snagged the victory by a neck from Seaside Diva in 1:51.4, Daisy's Star finished third at 38-1.

A winner in 11 of 14 this season, Lets Go Endofaera is trained by Tabby De Long. The Jesse De Long homebred daughter of JK Endofanera—Let's Go Higher is co-owned by John and William De Long, and newly minted Indiana Horse Racing Association Hall of Famer, Brian Elmore. The victory brought Lets Go Endofaera's seasonal earnings to \$394,140 and just shy of \$700,000 for her career.

The \$30,000 first division for pacing fillies was won by **Donegal Spirit** at 7-1. Driver Andy Miller gave the Andrew Harris trainee the pocket ride before fending off Zuma Beach (Kyle Wilfong) in the lane by a nose in 1:51.1. The fourth victory in 18 outings this season pushed the earnings of the daughter of Captaintreacherous to \$113,309 this season for owners William Pollock, Bruce Areman and A Harris Racing.

The \$30,300 first division for trotting fillies saw **Woman Of Passion** overcome the outside post 7 to score in 1:55.1 as the even-money choice. Driven by Pete Wrenn, Woman Of Passion took command on the backstretch, before fending off the pocket-sitting Danger (Robert Taylor) by a quarter-length on the line. A 10-time winner in 15 starts this season, the Carter

Pinske trained daughter of Walner has earned \$290,148 in 2024 for owner Al Libfeld who bred Woman Of Passion with Marvin Katz.

Ohio Sire Stakes champion **Sugar Instead** utilized similar tactics to score in the \$30,000 second division for trotting fillies. Kyle Wilfong got the call for trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr., moving the 3-5 favorite to the lead on the backstretch, before holding Stella Volo (Pete Wrenn) at bay by a length to score in 1:54.4. The dominant daughter of Volstead secured the 20th victory of her career, having won 13 of 15 this season for owners Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills. Sugar Instead sports a gaudy bankroll of \$513,339 this season while knocking on the door of \$900,000 for her career.

Tellmeitmatters notched his first victory since Aug. 1, winning as the 2-5 favorite in the first of two \$36,500 divisions for pacing colts. Going to work with his usual first-over grind, Tellmeitmatters and John De Long worked to the lead turning for home before digging in to fend off Noblesville (Brandon Bates) by a half-length in 1:50.2. Roger Welch trains the William and Patrick De Long homebred son of Tellitlikeitis—Art Matters who has won seven of 13 this year, banking \$246,315 over his sophomore campaign.

Stat That delivered the biggest price of the night, pulling an 18-1 shocker in a mad scramble to the wire. After sitting third throughout, driver LeWayne Miller split rivals in the lane with a :26.3 last quarter to reach the line a neck clear of a



hard-charging Dale Yea (Marvin Luna) in 1:51. Trained by Susan Miller for Derek Lehman, the victory was the second-consecutive and third of the season for the son of Check Six—Rockin Songbird who has earned \$108,910 in 2024.

Gural: Owners that retire horses at 3 should pay for The Big M's losses

(In further response to **Debbie Little's Meadowlands Matters column** "Money driving 3-year-olds to breeding shed, but is that good for the game?")

I certainly understand the economics of retiring horses at 3 so as not to risk poor performance at 4, but maybe the fair thing is to have those people who are retiring these horses pick up the cost of the losses at The Meadowlands over the next few years while we wait to see if we can get a casino. I certainly would be willing to waive the Gural Rule for stallions that want to pick up the losses we are going to have because of the fact that our customers want to see great racing.

In addition, they can pick up the cost of getting us on TV since I think it cost us around \$200,000 this year.

I own Six Pack and we raced him at 4 and it didn't change any of the economics. One other thing, there is a great deal of enjoyment owning and racing a top 4-year-old and my guess is the money that the owners will receive from syndicating the horse will go right back into the business. The odds are they will buy three or four yearlings who could easily give the owners a significant amount of aggravation rather than fun. How do you put a price on the enjoyment that comes from watching a great horse race? Not only that, but you will not even know if the horse is going to be a good sire for four years. I doubt if I am going to change anyone's mind but the argument for retiring horses at 3 ignores the upside that we had by racing Six Pack at 4.

More shoeless confusion

Two weeks ago, The Meadowlands hosted two nights of exciting, top-class harness racing, the Breeders Crown. Several years ago, I wrote about the shoes on/shoes off situation in harness racing. Other writers have written about this as well. A case in point

would be Sig Sauer, a 3-year-old colt by Muscle Hill who is one of the favorites to win 3YO Trotter of the Year. In the Breeders Crown elimination race the week before, Oct. 19, I picked Sig Sauer to win on my USTA selections. He went off at 6-5 odds, followed cover and finished fourth, trotting his mile in 1:52. He's a good-gaited trotter but he looked a bit unsteady in that race. His lackluster effort didn't deter me and the next week, because I think he's the best 3YO trotter in the sport. And, I figured that in the final, he'd be racing "without shoes." In the \$600,000 final, I picked Sig Sauer to win and made him 6-5 odds. Sig Sauer had post 8, left, took an early tuck sixth, and rallied gamely off cover to win by a nose at 7-2 odds while trotting in 1:50.4. He was a juicy overlay so I bet him to win.

As some may know, shoe changes are only announced at the track. In my opinion, if the sport is going to continue to allow shoe changes, the trainers should have to announce the change prior to the past performance programs being printed, so it can be listed in the past performances. In thoroughbred racing, the biggest equipment change is "blinkers on." I've literally seen hundreds of horses improve so much in blinkers that they went from a horse that couldn't break their maiden to a very solid professional racehorse with many wins. There are champion thoroughbreds that were average horses until they added blinkers. Blinkers on or blinkers off equipment changes have been listed in thoroughbred past performances for decades, even before I started following racing. In fact, blinkers are also listed in the entries that are published in newspapers. Obviously, the reason why thoroughbred racing started to put blinkers info in the program years ago was because it can be such a dramatic equipment change.

Well, shoes off on a trotter in harness racing might be even more potent of an equipment change than blinkers. Not every horse improves in blinkers, in fact, most don't. But some horses improve by several seconds. With shoes off, many trotters seem to race their fastest miles.

It's not fair to the betting public to wait until race day to announce these shoe changes at the track. Not everyone is a professional handicapper who has access to inside info. Most of the handle today is bet off track, mainly online. I'm sure that the reason why Sig Sauer didn't go off as the favorite was because of his lackluster effort in his elimination race, when he was racing with shoes. Sudden form changes are bad for the sport. We shouldn't be trying to confuse the bettors, or hide important handicapping information from them.

Shoes on or shoes off should be listed in the past performances. If the trainers can't accommodate this, then all of the horses should have to race with shoes.
