This past week, FanDuel – the owners of TVG, the horse racing network and advance deposit wagering company – [announced their net gaming revenue breakdown](#).

Sportsbook – 66 per cent

Online Casino – 23 per cent

Daily Fantasy – 4 per cent

Horse Racing & Sponsorship – 7 per cent

In 2018 – just four short years ago – horse racing accounted for 42 per cent of their revenues. Although these numbers were just recently released, people in our industry didn't need a crystal ball to figure out this was happening. Recently, viewers of TVG have noticed more and more screen creep on the channel when consuming their favorite racing content. At times it has even been a meme.

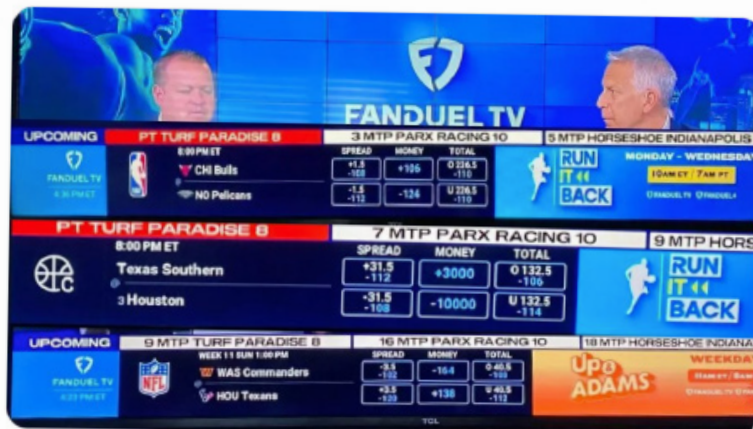

However, when a branded U.S. horse racing network replaces the Three Diamonds Final or Clark Stakes with a handball game from Thailand, not even the most optimistic of us can spin it as a good thing.

Everyone needs a bogeyman as a deflection - just watch your favorite political team make someone on the opposing team one - so I guess we're supposed to make FanDuel that shadowy figure in the corner. *They're* the problem, and there's nothing we can do about it. We all know that's not true.

The sport of harness racing, particularly, has neglected itself for a long time.

Through a quarter-century, where the sport generated billions upon billions of slot revenue, the sport has sold its betting signal to places like TVG for almost nothing, instead of building its own platform.

It went cap in hand to betting networks, paying them fees to show the races, instead of trying to distribute its own product, through its own broadcast (something Bob Marks has been talking about for years).

And maybe most importantly, it did little to make this a great betting game, where a network like TVG wouldn't *want* to drop it for some obscure sport a half a continent away.

The money was always there. In fact, it probably is still there. But, despite some factions in this sport clamouring to use a small slice of it for promotion and broadcast, and even lower takeout, the Springsteenian screen door slammed in their faces at almost every turn.

A year from now we might flip over to TVG to catch the 9th at the Meadowlands, only to find it's not there anymore. But if we're being honest with ourselves, with the sport's lack of vision, investment and long-term commitment, could it have turned out any other way?

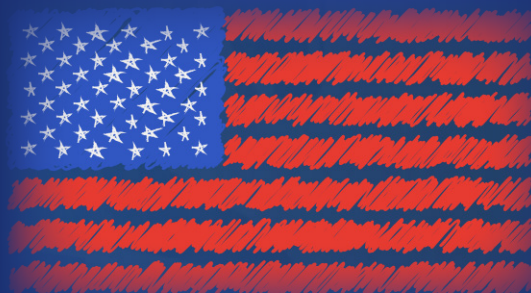

TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON

with MURRAY BROWN



Bob “Hollywood” Heyden on his long tenure at the “greatest racetrack and greatest racing operation in the world”

From its inception The Meadowlands has likely had the greatest public relations / publicity department than that of all other racetracks combined. Just think of all the fantastic people who have occupied its press box through the years — names such as Allen Gutterman, Ellen Harvey, Sam McKee, Steve Katz, Bob Heyden, Charlie Singer, Sam Anzalone, Dave Little, Dave Brower, Carol Hodes, Nick Salvi, Ken Warkentin and Dave Little to just mention some. The only other racetrack which could possibly be mentioned in the same breath would have been Roosevelt Raceway which had the greatest of all publicists, harness or otherwise, Joseph Herbert Goldstein and Lou Barash.

Harness publicists are a diverse group, but the one thing that all the above have in common was and is a great love of the sport and the people in it.

When speaking of diversity among publicity folk, this scribe has never encountered one more different in so many areas than Bob “Hollywood” Heyden.

In keeping with the areas in which I have heretofore not covered in these weekly interviews relating to harness racing, we turn to public relations and publicity. One of the best of the genre, Hollywood Heyden was in the New York/New Jersey area this past week to pay tribute to another of those who he knew well Dave Brower.

Let's start at the beginning or close to it, how did you get involved with harness racing?

“I liked all sports. I also liked to play the races and was fascinated with the sport's history. Horse racing was the combination of the two. While I was in college at Rutgers, I would go to the races at Freehold. I also would go to both Roosevelt and Yonkers. I distinctly remember driving by The Meadowlands then being built by the Sports Authority and saying to myself, ‘When that racetrack gets built, I'm going to work there.’ There were a few years between the prediction and the reality. But that eventually came to pass. After I got out of school, I went to work in the restaurant industry, mostly tending bar. I then went to work for *Sports Eye* initially working with the thoroughbreds and then transferring to harness. I started working at The Meadowlands in 1983. I had landed where I said I was going to. I always had a deep interest in baseball and had interned as a beat writer at the *Bergen Record* in 1979. In February of 1986 while at The Big M I got a phone call from the *Record* offering me the job of

I have often wondered what would have been if I had gone. I was always a huge Yankees fan. One of my dearest friends was Gene “Stick” Michael who was kind enough to introduce me at my Communicators Corner Hall of Fame introduction at Goshen.

Working at The Meadowlands back in those glory days must have been fantastic.

“Indeed, it was. Everything was possible. All we had to do was dream it and it became true. Everything about the operation was first class. In a very short period of time, it became the greatest racetrack and greatest racing operation in the world. In my opinion, its success was based upon the exceptional talent of four great people, who with their staffs, built it that way – Bob Quigley, who made the whole enterprise click; Joe DeFrank, the

director of racing who established the greatest racing program in the sport’s history; Charlie Singer, an astute student of racing and handicapping and Allen Gutterman who put together a stellar staff who let the world know that we were there. Those days were like no others. Sadly, there will never again will be another track remotely like it. That said, I am especially excited to see Ken Warkentin going into the Communicator’s Corner – the absolute best guy to work with as well the most prepared - always.”

My three kids would often speak of me as a “garbagehead” referring to the amount of, to them, useless information that I was able to furnish. I’d think to myself, they have no idea what a garbagehead is. They don’t know Hollywood Heyden. That’s not to say that all or even a decent amount of the statistics you are able to gather are useless. They are far from that. The majority of them are quite interesting.

“The truth is that I’ve been gathering up interesting and maybe sometimes not so interesting factoids and tidbits for as long as I can remember. One might call it a talent or maybe an idiosyncrasy that is part of what I call my brain. I find these facts interesting. I hope others do as well.”

You’ve been involved in the game for what seems like forever. Let’s talk about its stars.

BEST HORSE - TROTTER?

“By far – Muscle Hill. We never even got close to seeing how great he was or could have become.”

BEST HORSE - PACER?

“I’m going to take the coward’s way out. Triple dead heat – Niatross at 2, Somebeachsomewhere at 3, Bulldog Hanover at 4. All three have varying qualities that the others don’t.”

GREATEST DRIVER?

“Dexter Dunn. Some might disagree and say John Campbell or Bill O’Donnell at their best. I wouldn’t be inclined to argue with them. The young New Zealander is beyond special. He can do things with horses that I’ve seen no one else do. Mike Lachance told me a year ago about Dexter that the guy never makes a bad move. It seems as if he is never where he shouldn’t be. I find him to be absolutely amazing but in the totality of the last 15 years, I would certainly mention Tim Tetrick.”

GREATEST TRAINER?

“Stanley Franklin Dancer and not just by a little bit either. I consider Stanley not to have only been the greatest harness trainer ever, but the greatest horse trainer of any breed. Just look

at some of the statistics. He had three Triple Crown winners in five years. No other trainer ever had more than one. More Horses of the Year than any other trainer. Something that is sometimes overlooked is that Stanley never had a huge stable. He had a decent sized one in his formative years and a relatively small one as he grew older, yet champion upon champion emanated from there. Some might say that he had the power of the checkbook behind him and they would probably be correct. But he earned that power. He grew from being a poor boy who in my perhaps less than humble opinion grew to become the greatest horse trainer ever.”

I’m not about to disagree with what you say about Stanley but there might be some who say that you might be a bit prejudiced in your thoughts because Mr. Dancer was one of your best friends.

“They might be a little correct, but not entirely. The facts and records speak for themselves. They don’t need my opinion to speak for them. It’s true Stanley was one of my dearest friends. Right until he passed, I would speak to him at least two or three times a week for the last 15 years of his life. Just as we will never see anything like the original Meadowlands again, we will never see those such as Stanley Dancer, Bill Haughton, Joe O’Brien, Delvin Miller and their like again.

“I would be remiss if I didn’t mention another of my bigtime passions – the Harness Horse Youth Foundation. I love HHYF, especially since my girlfriend of almost 10 years Ellen Taylor runs it. The kids are great and from time to time I get to work with them or hang out at camp. It’s been around since 1976 and Ellen’s mother Margot was the person most responsible for its success and presence. Who doesn’t want kids to progress and learn all they can about standardbred racing?”

You were back in the area to visit your mom and to be present at the Celebration of Life held at The Meadowlands for our dear friend Dave Brower on Saturday. What can you say about Dave that hasn’t been said before and by many others.

“Whatever the accolades were and they were many, our friend Dave was most worthy of them. I look back and see that we travelled similar and somewhat parallel routes at The Meadowlands. One thing about Dave and I, nobody loved and cared about the place and the sport more than either of us. As is often the case, when new management arrives at a venue, they decide to make changes. Both Dave and I were on the chopping block so to speak, during the first bloodletting. I managed to survive and sadly Dave did not. He was gone for several years and I continued at work at the place which was both my home and my workplace. In the midst of the second changeover, they had the good sense to bring Dave back. Whether they realize it or not it was one of the wisest moves they ever made. In the interim, I guess they found me expendable and my services were no longer required. After 36 years when then decided to not bring me back in October 2019. Mr. Gural did not insult me, he insulted the 1,179 individuals who wrote, texted, called or told me in person how sorry they were that I was leaving.”

Quick Hitch Café brings the track kitchen back to Mohawk

Rose Denne and Al Mitchell bring back track kitchen meals and memories.

Track kitchens are harder to find as fewer tracks have active backstretches. While horses ship in and race from the Woodbine Mohawk Park paddock, the humans who work with them can still get a taste of the old-school racetrack kitchens at the Quick Hitch Cafe, located in the same building.

Before being interviewed, Rose Denne had to turn down the heat on the made-from-scratch broccoli and cheddar soup she was cooking. She and partner Al Mitchell began running the trackside canteen earlier this year, expanding on their former business of selling breakfast and lunch items from a truck that visited training centres around Mohawk.

"We started the first of June. Things are going good," she told HRU.

The Quick Hitch Cafe now occupies a canteen space that previously closed during the pandemic.

"People kept telling us, because we had a mobile that went around to all the standardbred barns, with sandwiches, drinks, and wraps: They kept saying that this place needs to be open."

Encouraged by a family friend, Rose reached out to Woodbine Entertainment's director of standardbred racing about reopening the shuttered canteen. "Our trainer, Rod Hughes, said, 'You need to get over there and talk to Bill McLinchey.' I sent Bill a message, but COVID was on, so he said it was kind of on hold. A few months went by, and then Rod said again, 'You should get over there!'"

McLinchey connected the couple with Heather Flaherty, general manager at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"She asked me to do up a proposal," said Denne. "So I went home and did up the proposal and sent it to her. In a few days, she got back to me, and we're here!"

Mitchell and Denne have each operated several restaurants and diners, but the pandemic forced them to give up the latest.

"We had a cafe up in Barrie, it was in the Barrie Chrysler Dodge dealership. We had it for three years, and then COVID hit and they closed us. I called it 'Dodge N Go,'" said Denne.

It was trainer Hughes who initially suggested that the couple start the mobile food service for the training centre. "Rod called and said, 'We need sandwiches and things,'" said Denne. "So we came down and just started going barn to barn. We asked all the owners that owned the property and the barns if they would let us come in and do that, and they were happy to let us, so that's how it started."

Denne's homemade sandwiches, baked goods and coffee got a warm reception on busy mornings.

"We'd just go to the barn, honk the horn, and out they'd come to get their stuff. It was pretty cool actually," she told HRU. "Now,

in full circle, we're here! And I still get to see everybody and I'm with the horses, which I love, so it all worked out."

The couple currently share ownership of one horse, Warrawee Yippie, with Hughes.

"When I grew up, I had ponies and horses," said Denne. "We've been together six years and Al had horses – seven of them – in the early '90s. Jerry Hughes, Rod's dad, was Al's trainer."

The couple were part of San Pail's (7, 1:50.4m; \$3,012,029) entourage of fans during his racing career. The 2011 Dan Patch/O'Brien Horse of the Year is co-owned by Rod Hughes and Glenn Van Camp of Port Perry, ON. After the Canadian Hall of Fame trotter retired in 2015, Denne and Mitchell could visit and watch him grazing near their home.

Twin B Archie (3, 1:53.1s; \$604,638) is the Quick Hitch Cafe's current sentimental favorite. When operating the mobile food service with Mitchell, Denne said she was awestruck by the dark brown trotter.

"Samantha McEneny was bringing out a horse. I said, 'What's that one's name?' She said, 'Twin B Archie'; and since then I've just followed him... My dad's name was Archie Denne," she said. The 3-year-old gelding ended his season on top of the Ontario Sires Stakes Gold standings for his division.

Denne plans to put a photo of Twin B Archie on the wall at the Quick Hitch, which currently has a few racing photos. Customers also get a perfect view of horses approaching Mohawk's first turn. But it's the food and friendliness that have quickly made the restaurant a popular stop.

"It's just all homemade," said Rose. "I don't buy it and bring it in, other than when I first started here, I didn't have enough time to do the baking, so I'd bring some stuff in... I don't like to bring stuff in that's already made, because that's not who I am."

Mitchell has a background in the sport that dates back to Greenwood Raceway.

"I started out in 1989," he told HRU. "I got involved with it through a friend of mine who was in the horse business. I'm a retired professional golfer now, but I was golfing at the time and he just said, 'Hey, would you like to get involved in the horses?' I said, 'Yeah, why not? Let's buy one and see what happens.' He already had a couple, so I got involved with it. One turned into two turned into three turned into four..."

"I had one that had a little bit of success [pacing-bred trotter Brown Road], so once that happens, it kind of makes you want to get another one," he said with a laugh.

Two-year-old colt Warrawee Yippie (Sportswriter–Flipnetwothree) is his most recent foray into horse ownership, after a long break. Naturally, it was Rod Hughes who helped him reconnect: "I've known Rod since he was 16 years old, so I've known him 32 years.

"I was out of it for so long, and then I thought, you know what? Maybe I'll get back into it. I saw Rod up at Georgian Downs and I just said to him, 'I wouldn't mind getting back into it and hook up with you on a horse if anything comes along.' A couple of months later he called me and said, 'I just bought one down in the states and if you guys are interested, I'll give you a piece of it.' That was three years ago, in 2019."

Mitchell had spent 27 years away from racing before the reintroduction.

"I got out in 1992. About the year before Greenwood shut down, and they were starting to close all the 'B' tracks," recalled AL. "They were closing Kingston and Belleville, and there was only a few left. You had Elmira still, and Orangeville was closing. We weren't having success with the horses, so I just soured on it."

He switched careers and became involved in the restaurant business.

"Being a golf pro, I managed a golf course up in Port Sydney, Ontario, which is just south of Huntsville, and we had a restaurant there that I built from scratch. And I had two Shoeless Joe's locations, one in Oshawa and one in Maple. They're long gone."

This year, the couple opted to focus exclusively on the Quick Hitch Cafe.

"We're basically open from 5 'til 10 on race nights and then the qualifier mornings, which have slowed down because it's wintertime," said AL. "It's been really good. We were happy doing our mobile service, which was good too, but with the cost of gas and driving around... We still enjoyed it, but this just seemed like a better opportunity."

It's also been an opportunity to bring back the old-school backstretch kitchen feeling, in a corner of Mohawk's very modern paddock.

"That's what the older trainers and drivers that I've known over the years all say: We're very similar to the backstretch kitchen at Greenwood or the backstretch kitchen they used to have here at Mohawk," said Mitchell. "There was quite the backstretch one here, before the big fire [in April 1992]...I think a lot of the younger drivers and trainers don't remember that."

AL said he's noticed a few changes from the track kitchen clientele of yesteryear. "We've had a good mix of people. We've had not too many owners – that's died down over the years – but some owners coming in, and caretakers and trainers and drivers. The drivers will walk through one door and say hi to Rose, whether they are buying something or not."

The unexpected bestseller? Chicken fingers and fries.

"They are definitely the number one seller," said Mitchell said. "When we first took it on, when [Bill McLinchey and Heather Flaherty] talked with us about what we wanted to do, or what we were going to sell, they said, 'If you just sell chicken fingers and fries, you'll do okay.' At our cafe in Barrie, we didn't even sell chicken fingers and fries! So we said, 'You guys are nuts.' But we brought in chicken fingers and fries, and now everyday we're buying more."

The runner-up is "any of Rose's sandwiches, because she won't keep a sandwich overnight. So they're always fresh," he said. "And we've just started with the soups. Our first night was Saturday night [Nov. 12], because it was cold, and now we have soup again tonight. We sold all of our soup on our first night – cream of potato and bacon."

Mitchell estimated that "probably 90 per cent" of Quick Hitch Cafe orders are for takeout, including a special meal they prepared for Canadian Thanksgiving (Oct. 10).

"Woodbine paid for Thanksgiving dinner for all the horsepeople," he told HRU. "We made it all in here. They just came in and got their free turkey dinner. [Rose] did turkey and mashed potatoes and vegetables for 200 people. Actually, we had a lot of people stay in and eat too, because it included Woodbine employees. Caretakers took it with them."

Expect something festive at the Quick Hitch over the Christmas holidays.

"We're going to put up a tree and lights and have a turkey dinner," said Mitchell. "We're going to hang up a lot of paraphernalia from the horse racing business. Just things like whips and bits and harnesses, and the stories behind them. We're going to redecorate to make it look more like a hometown tavern kind of thing."

At a time of year when many reflect on their blessings, Rose said she was grateful for the opportunity to run the Quick Hitch Cafe, for the support from horsepeople, and for Rod Hughes' encouragement.

"He was a big, big help. I could never thank Rod enough, that's for sure."

Fiftyfour best in Sweden's highest rated 2-year-old race

Tomas Malmqvist-trained **Fiftyfour** (Fourth Dimension) dominated the \$320,000 Uppfödningslöpningen for 2-year-old trotters at Jägersro on Saturday (Nov. 19) afternoon.

Danish driver Ken Ecce sat behind Fiftyfour, who came to the final after a safe elimination win two weeks ago and Ecce had a definite plan as the car left the field. Fiftyfour opened quickly and came to the lead, challenged by outside horse King Of Twilight throughout the first turn.

After the quick first quarter opening, Fiftyfour slowed the pace down before the attacks from behind began with 500 meters to go.

Frustration (Fourth Dimension) was served a perfect pocket trip and used her speed as the road opened at the top of the stretch. But leader Fiftyfour had no plan in slowing down the pace on the home stretch and the win was safe.

The winning time was 1:58.1 for the son of Fourth Dimension, who has his first crop racing in Sweden this year. Having the winner and the runner up in the biggest 2-year-old race in Sweden is a promising start as a sire, to say the least.

Fiftyfour made his fifth lifetime start and collected his fourth win.

"This was a big relief and it's hard to find the right words for me. This is my biggest win in my career so far. When 200 meters remained of the race I felt that Frustration would maybe beat us, but my horse answered when she tried to challenge," said Ecce after the big win at Jägersro.

GOCCIADORO SCORED IN THE NETHERLANDS

Alessandro Gocciadoro went to Wolvega and Victoria Park in The Netherlands on Friday (Nov. 18) night where the prestigious \$70,000 Prijs Der Giganten was held.

Zaccaria Bar (Ready Cash) was Gocciadoro's weapon in the race and the duo hit the lead on the first backstretch. A fast opening and a considerably slower second part of the race was the winning receipt for Zaccaria Bar and Gocciadoro's horse sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:56.2 over 1.3 miles.

Early leader Floris Baldwin held to second place ahead of quick finisher Hades de Vandel.

Stacey Vanraemdonck – owner/ trainer/horse transporter

One of the hardest things about being in the sport of harness racing is when you have to say goodbye to one of your four-legged kids, for one reason or another.

For the four decades that I've been involved in the sport, every time I had to say goodbye to one of my horses, my heart broke a little more. (I don't think I have much more than a pea-sized heart left.) Unable to keep them because I do not own a farm and of course it's costly; my job as a good "mama" is to make sure my kids go to a safe, loving home to live out their life in peace.

Luckily, there are several wonderful establishments available that will place your horse in a forever home. So, when my first born after many years (Babyitscoldoutside) was told she could no longer be a mama I looked for a wonderful place where she could be loved and feel wanted. Although she never made it to the races, she gave me three colts and she will always mean so much to me.

Only seven years old, Baby had a lot of years yet to live and I wanted her to have the very best life. She is a beautiful, sweet mama (although at times she could be a bitch, lol) and she deserved a safe and happy home. Every horse does.

Laurie Poulin, a friend of mine told me of a place called Cold Springs Nurse Mares, located in Ocala, FL. They place nurse mares with orphaned foals that had sadly lost their dam or were rejected. Some of the mares on the farm are thoroughbreds, percherons, quarter horses and now Baby will help represent the wonderful standardbred breed.

I am beyond ecstatic and will keep in touch with them, periodically receiving photos of Baby and any adopted foals, and one day will go visit her.

Now I had to find someone to ship Baby from Paris, Kentucky to Ocala. This was a very busy time because of the stakes races and horse sales. I was given a name of a horse transporter who came highly recommended. Her name is Stacey Vanraemdonck.

Transporting a horse is a very, very tough and responsible job and getting a dedicated, caring and careful transporter was a must in my book.

I looked into Vanraemdonck and was sold from the first hello. Very professional and a true animal lover, Vanraemdonck has a beautiful rig and treats the horses as if they were her own. She even sent a photo of Baby when she was loaded and another on her way to her new home: a caring, thoughtful woman indeed.

Born in Flint, MI, Vanraemdonck grew up in Flushing, MI – 15 minutes from Sports Creek Raceway.

"I grew up on a farm caring for a variety of animals, such as horses, llamas, reindeer, goats, cows, pigs, chickens, ducks, dogs and cats. I even pinched in to help with the neighbor's chores," Vanraemdonck said.

"When I was 3 years old I started riding and I started taking lessons at 9 years old. After graduating from high school, I attended Northwood University pursuing my BBA in Business/ Minor in Operations Supply Chain, but spending time with horses was a top priority to me.

"Although my family was never involved in the sport, my grandfather liked to bet on the horses, and I would look at his racing program that went all the way back to Del Miller's great horse, Adios.

"I began showing in 4-H equestrian team and then competed in local and national level horse shows.

HOW MUCH DID YOU BET TODAY?



Horse is a brilliant piece of historical fiction

A hot tip from a good friend sent me to the new books section of my local library, where I could find a hardcover or audio download of the new book *Horse*. I went with the hardcover. The tip paid off.

BOOK REVIEW

"A horse so fast that the mass-produced stopwatch was manufactured so fans could clock his times in races that regularly drew more than twenty thousand spectators. A horse so handsome that the best equestrian artists vied to paint him..."

Pulitzer Prize-winning author Geraldine Brooks turns extensive research into brilliant historical fiction. She finds a subject of interest, collects bones of interesting historical facts, builds a skeleton, and then adds a thin layer of fictional meat onto the bones.

Her latest book, *Horse*, began at a party when an executive from the Smithsonian Institute described how he had recently overseen the delivery of a skeleton of the most celebrated American racehorse of the 19th century. The destination was the International Museum of the Horse in Kentucky.

And what a horse. Originally named Darley, the horse was purchased in 1853 by a syndicate headed by Richard Ten Broeck, a fascinating character who was the primary owner of the Metairie Course of New Orleans. He gave the horse a new name, and the equine legend of Lexington began.

When Lexington died on July 1, 1875, he received a ceremonial burial, complete with a horse-sized coffin. His skeleton was eventually disinterred and gifted to the Smithsonian. Years later, as the horse's fame waned, the structure of the famous horse was relegated to the attic.

Brooks now had her subject. She was off, in search of historical factual bones. Her search led to multiple time frames and

locations, seesawing between Kentucky and Mississippi in the 1850s, New York City in the 1950s, and Washington in 2019. She takes readers on a fascinating ride.

A passionate horsewoman, Brooks' awareness and compassion for horses leap off the pages with details of anatomical variations of horses, the biomechanics of speed and strength, training regimes, breeding strategies, and the individual temperaments of horses. But this book is no one-trick pony. The themes are multiple and profound, including structural racism, horseracing business, equine art, and the civil war. The list of historical figures encountered in her research for the novel is long and impressive. To me, each historical character merits a book of their own.

Many of us know that horse racing was *the* popular pastime of the 1800s. In the middle of the century, New York had three prominent newspapers, and two were devoted entirely to horseracing. In America in the 1800s, people were only a generation from the land. Horses of all types raced everywhere. Farmers dreamt of breeding the next champion. In the south, wealthy landowners built racetracks on their plantations.

Few of us may be aware that before the Civil War and throughout Reconstruction, all classes and colors mingled at the racetrack. This statement sounds more benevolent than reality.

Horse racing relied on plundered labor, primarily skilled black trainers, jockeys, and grooms. Brooks found evidence in the surviving correspondence of elite white horse breeders and influential owners who deferred to the knowledge and skill of black trainers such as Hark, Ansel Williamson, and Charles Stewart. These black members of the horse racing community who worked in a complex and restrictive environment fared better than most enslaved people.

Another thread in the book is art. Photography was in its infancy, and the business of painting prize horses was a feature of the 19th century and a form of status. One of these painters, Thomas J. Scott, plays a significant role in the book, primarily through his lost painting of Lexington led by black Jarret, his groom.

Brooks carries equine art and its participants across the ages into the turbulent, bohemian, post-World War II art world and modern times.

The side roads of the story are interesting, but the novel's core revolves around Lexington and his remarkable life. The record-breaking triumphs on the racecourse are vivid, and the sometimes-cruel worlds of racing and integration blend as we look over Geraldine Brooks' shoulder into the past.



Erv Miller hits \$100 million in career trainer earnings

When Montana Chief A won the 10th race at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Nov. 11, trainer Erv Miller became just the third trainer in harness racing history to surpass \$100 million in career purse earnings.

Miller is behind only Ron Burke (over \$294 million) and Jimmy Takter (over \$130 million).

Lifetime, Miller trainees have recorded 6,169 victories and \$100,101,807 as of Saturday afternoon.

U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit declares HISA unconstitutional

The United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit announced Friday (Nov. 18) that they have overturned the previous ruling of the district court and declared that the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act is facially unconstitutional.

In the decision on the appeal from the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Circuit Judge Stuart Kyle Duncan wrote, "While we admire the district court's meticulous opinion, we conclude that HISA is facially unconstitutional.

"A cardinal constitutional principle is that federal power can be wielded only by the federal government. Private entities may do so only if they are subordinate to an agency. But the Authority is not subordinate to the FTC. The reverse is true. The Authority, rather than the FTC, has been given final say over HISA's programs.

"While acknowledging the Authority's "sweeping" power, the district court thought it was balanced by the FTC's "equally" sweeping oversight. Not so. HISA restricts FTC review of the Authority's proposed rules. If those rules are "consistent" with HISA's broad principles, the FTC *must* approve them. And even if it finds inconsistency, the FTC can only suggest changes.

What's more, the FTC concedes it cannot review the Authority's policy choices. When the public has disagreed with those policies, the FTC has disclaimed any review and instead told the public to "engag[e] with the Authority. An agency does not have meaningful oversight if it does not write the rules, cannot change them, and cannot second-guess their substance. As the district court correctly put it: "Only an Act of Congress could permanently amend any Authority rule or divest it of its powers. The FTC may never command the Authority to change its rules or divest it of its powers."

"The end result is that Congress has given a private entity the last word over what rules govern our nation's thoroughbred horseracing industry. The Constitution forbids that. For good reason, the Constitution vests federal power only in

the three branches of the federal government. Congress defies this basic safeguard by vesting government power in a private entity not accountable to the people. That is what it has done in HISA. The Authority's power outstrips any private delegation the Supreme Court or our court has allowed. We must therefore declare HISA facially unconstitutional."

Judge Duncan concluded, "The district court's judgment is reversed and the case is remanded for further proceedings consistent with this opinion."

The appeal was held before Circuit Judges Carolyn Dineen Kind, Kurt D. Engelhardt and Duncan from the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in New Orleans, LA.

Protective Association; Mountaineer Park Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Nebraska Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Oklahoma Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Oregon Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Washington Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; Tampa Bay Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. They were joined by *Intervenor Plaintiffs*—Appellants the State of Texas and Texas Racing Commission.

Jerry Black; Katrina Adams; Leonard Coleman; MD Nancy Cox; Joseph Dunford; Frank Keating; Kenneth Schanzer; Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority, Incorporated; Federal Trade Commission; Commissioner Kelly Slaughter; Commissioner Rohit Chopra; Commissioner Noah Phillips; and Commissioner Christine Wilson, were the *Defendants—Appellees* in the case.

Play Trix On Me to stand in Ohio at Cool Winds

Multiple stakes winning grandson of Muscle Hill, Play Trix On Me 4,1:50.4 (\$640,517), will stand the 2023 season at Cool Winds Farm in Lima, Ohio for a stud fee of \$3,000.

A Grand Circuit performing son of Hambletonian winner Trixton, the now 5-year-old Play Trix On Me raced against, and defeated, some of the best stakes colts in his division at two and three. The strikingly tall and handsome individual continued to enjoy success at age four, competing alongside some of the best older trotters of his generation.

As a freshman trotter, Play Trix On Me opened his career by winning both legs and the \$160,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes final at the Meadowlands. In fact, Play Trix On Me was victorious in five of six starts at two, earning \$122,100 and taking a mark of 1:53.2 in a qualifier at The Red Mile.

At 2, Play Trix On Me was, once again, the dominant horse in the New Jersey Sire Stakes program, winning the \$128,000 final at the Meadowlands in 1:53.3. Shifting over to the Grand Circuit, he finished second in the \$425,000 Canadian Trotting Classic at Mohawk, as well as the W.N. Reynolds Stake and the Tompkins-Geers S. at the Meadowlands.

Later in the season Play Trix On Me truly excelled in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown 3-year-old colt trot final at Hoosier Park, leaving from post four and setting an opening panel of 27.1. When the outer flow materialized he was shuffled back to fifth, but rallied again and found racing room in mid-stretch and flew home to be second to Amigo Volo by a short nose in 1:53, last quarter in 27.2.

The following week Play Trix On Me remained at Hoosier Park to capture the \$140,000 Carl Erskine Memorial in 1:53, defeating World Champion It's Academic by a length and a quarter in the process. He completed his sophomore season with \$433,843 in earnings, having finished first or second in 11 of 15 starts.

At age 4, Play Trix On Me took his record of 1:50.4 at the Meadowlands racing against many of the top trotters of the

day. He picked up checks in three legs and the \$250,000 final of the tough Graduate series, earning \$84,574 on the season and was seven times 1-2-3 in 17 starts. His lifetime summary is 38-12-9-2.

From the stakes winning Credit Winner mare Lima Playmate 2,1:57 (\$265,755), he is full or half-brother to several stakes winners and fast-class performers.

Wally Hennessey to receive Monticello-Goshen's highest honor

Few people have been inducted into more Halls of Fame than Wally Hennessey. Aside from being one of the most successful reinsmen in the history of harness racing, he is also one of the most pleasant and down-to-earth guys one may ever meet.

It's no wonder that Hennessey has been enshrined in both the (U. S) Harness Racing Hall of Fame and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. In addition, he has been feted by the Saratoga Harness Hall of Fame, the Florida (USHWA) Hall of Fame, the Prince Edward Island Sports Hall of Fame, and the Prince Edward Island Wall of Fame at Red Shores Racetrack & Casino in Charlottetown.

A few weeks from now Hennessey will add another title to his long list of accomplishments. When the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association holds its 63rd annual Awards Banquet on Sunday, Dec. 11, Hennessey will receive the chapter's highest honor, their Lifetime Achievement Award.

Walter "Wally" Hennessey, a Prince Edward Island native, comes from a family with a long history in harness racing. Born October 4, 1956, he is one of the nine children of Joe and Shirley Hennessey. His father Joe, considered to be one of the finest horsemen in the sport, and his grandfather Wal encouraged

Wally to become interested in Standardbreds at an early age.

In the early 1980s, Hennessey began to re-write the Maritime harness racing record books, and then moved to the U.S. in 1986 to ply his trade in Florida, and then New York. He has posted multi-million dollar seasons nearly every year since, and is currently tenth on the all-time dash win list with 11,442 victories lifetime, and is seventh among active drivers. He has amassed \$76,411,805 in career earnings.

Having won races across many continents, and maintained his demand as a catch driver through numerous decades, Hennessey has continued to credit others with his success.

"Any time you can reach a milestone like this, it's an accomplishment," Hennessey said from the Pompano winner's circle in 2008. "I've had many opportunities from a lot of good people, and you don't stand here with 7,000 races won having done it alone."

Eight years ago Saratoga Harness hosted 'Wally Hennessey Night,' complete with the largest group photo in the history of the harness track, or perhaps any track. Last year his memoir, the 'Wally Driven to Win' book was published, with 232 pages dedicated to his life, his passion, and to his dedication to the sport he loves.

Despite being 66, and competing against guys less than half his age, Hennessey has secured 366 victories this year alone, earning over \$3 million, while maintaining a very respectable .390 UDRS. Once known as the "King of the New York Sire Stakes," in 1992 at Buffalo Raceway he won seven NYSS events, including a track-record six in a row.

While driving all around New York State this season, and training a small stable at Saratoga over the summer and autumn months, Hennessey had to switch gears recently and return south. Duty called and Wally flew home to South Florida where he was listed to drive in six of eight Florida Sire Stakes last Saturday (Nov. 12) at Sunshine Meadows. He won half of those events.

Perhaps best known for his competitive and consistent driving abilities, as well as his association with the champion trotting mare Moni Maker, Hennessey's love of Florida harness racing is not far behind. When Pompano closed earlier this year, Hennessey said, "It's a very sad time for us," echoing the sentiments of an entire community. If the Broward County plant ever had a charismatic leader, it was Wally.

Hennessey recently told the USTA's Ken Weingartner, "I could never have imagined it in my wildest dreams, all the things that have happened to me in my life; to meet the people I've met. Sophomores do battle in the Star Destroyer at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Wintery conditions in Anderson, IN gave way to hot Grand Circuit action as the Star Destroyer took center stage at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Friday (Nov. 18). Four divisions of the sport's finest sophomores headlined the 14-race Friday night card, with familiar faces making their way to the Harrah's Hoosier Park Winner's Circle.

Looking to rebound from an uncharacteristic seventh place effort in the Carl Erskine, **Ponda Adventure** returned with a vengeance to kick off the stakes action on the night with a 1:53.3 score in the \$57,000 3-year-old colt trot. Leaving from post six in the field of nine, leading driver Trace Tetrack wasted no time getting to the front, sending Ponda Adventure straight to the lead through an opening quarter of :27.1. The Erv Miller trainee had things his way through a :58 middle half, leading the charge to the homestretch with Ohio standout Caviar Gold and Chris Page hot on his heels in the pocket. Ponda Adventure dug in gamely in the lane, rebuffing the pocket popping Caviar Gold in the lane with a :28.2 final quarter to score by three-quarters of a length over Caviar Gold, Swan Flyer and John De Long finished third.

The victory was the 13th of the season in 17 tries for Ponda Adventure who has only finished worse than second once in 27 lifetime starts. Owned by Engel Stable of IL LLC, Louis Willinger

and Jerry Graham, the gelded son of Swan For All has banked \$385,569 on the season and over \$650,000 for his stellar career.

Different tactics would be utilized to score the victory in the \$57,000 3-year-old filly pace, as a late rally from the backfield would be the ticket to the winner's circle for **Galleria Hanover**. Driver Sam Widger opted to take back off the gate from post six, landing in the seventh position early as A Girl That Twirls and Trace Tetrack cut an opening quarter of :26.4 from the rail. A Girl That Twirls maintained front end control through a half of :55 before leading the field to the far turn in 1:24.1 under duress from Patsville and John De Long as Galleria Hanover waited to pounce from third over. Patsville forged to the lead briefly before being met to her outside by Galleria Hanover who thundered home in :27.3 through the snow to score by three-quarters of a length in 1:53. Patsville held for second, with Best Place To Be and Brandon Bates rallying to round out the trifecta at 78-1.

It was the fifth victory of the season for the Ron Burke trained daughter by Indiana's fastest son, Always B Miki by the Somebeachsomewhere mare, Gallie Bythe Beach. Owned by W Donavon, Purnel & Libby LLC, and Joe Sbrocco, Galleria has deposited \$190,475 in earnings on the season and now over a quarter-million dollars in her career.

In the \$58,000 3-year-old filly trot, **Brickhouse Babe** picked up her first victory of the season in a big way with a dominant 1:54.2 score. Driver John De Long was able to settle in fourth in the early going amidst confusion with breakers off the gate as Verlin Yoder fired Gracelyn Hanover to the front from post nine through an opening quarter of :27.3. Yoder kept the gas pedal down up the backstretch, putting six lengths on his nearest competitor though a hot opening half of :56. The field began to reel in the leader on the far turn, with Gabbys C Note and Chris Page vacating the pocket, forcing Brickhouse Babe three wide as she went on the attack on three quarters in 1:25.4. The wide trip around the final turn didn't faze Brickhouse Babe, as she stormed home in :28.1 to put three lengths on the field on the line, Alana Hill and LeWayne Miller finished second, with Luv Lorelei and Robert Taylor finishing third.

Trained by Ryan Miller, it was the first victory in 20 seasonal starts for Brickhouse Babe, and fifth for her career. Owned by Ray Schnittker, Brickhouse Babe is a daughter of Walner, out of the Donato Hanover mare, Royal Assets, and with the victory goes over \$300,000 earned in her career, with \$96,297 coming in 2022.

Driver John De Long picked up a second victory in the Star Destroyer, this time teaming up with Indiana Sire Stakes Champion, **Ponda Warrior**, to score the \$65,000 3-year-old colt pace. Leaving from the rail in a congested field of eleven, De Long put Ponda Warrior into play immediately, settling in the pocket behind Sure Thing Herman and Atlee Bender through an opening quarter of :27.4. De Long deuce popped up the backstretch, briefly clearing to the lead before immediately being covered up one more by Taurasi and Devon Tharps though a half of :55.4. Yourwishisgranted and Kyle Wilfong went on the offensive on the far turn, putting his nose up front on the far

turn through three quarters in 1:24.2. Taurasi battled back in the stretch to fend off the challenge of Yourwishisgranted, but would face one more rally up the rail as Ponda Warrior and De Long patiently waited for the passing lane before rallying with a :26.4 final quarter of the rail to score the 1:51.3 victory by half a length. Taurasi dug in gamely for the place position, with Sure Thing Herman finishing third.

Ponda Warrior posted his fifth win of his sophomore campaign in 17 tries for trainer Jay Hochstetler who co-owns the Rockin Image colt along with Finkelberg Racing LLC and South Of The Track Racing Inc. Out of the American Ideal mare, Sweetinsinful, Ponda Warrior boasts a bankroll of \$321,791 on the season, and \$444,991 lifetime.

Leading trainer Tyler George had a big evening on the card, teaming up with leading driver Trace Tetrack to score three victories with Major Crocker A, Mac's Big Boy and General Dolan. The three victories put George's total to 120 on the meet, establishing a new all-time single season training victories record at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The previous mark was 119 victories, first established by Jeff Cullipher in 2018, and matched by Tyler George in 2021.
