# **Divisional decisions**

Did last night's Fall Final Four / TVG Finals at The Meadowlands have an impact on the year-end awards?

Fall Final Four / TVG Finals Night from The Meadowlands is in the books for 2021.

Did those races change the viewers' votes for Dan Patch divisional honors?

In my opinion: Maybe.

I do believe the choice in at least some of the divisions contested

were decided before a hoof even touched the track Saturday (Nov. 20).

Let's start with Niki Hill.

I shouldn't have to say more, but I will by asking the question: What more does she need to do?

She has nine wins in 10 starts and is only three-quarters of a length away from perfection.

If her win in the \$359,450 Three Diamonds doesn't put her in the conversation for Horse of the Year, what would?

For the people who say they don't think a 2-year-old should be named Horse of the Year, I'd really like to know why.

Before the \$386,600 Governor's Cup, I felt that Monte Miki, winner of the \$600,000 Breeders Crown and \$650,960 Metro, should be the 2-year-old pacing colt division champ and after the race I still feel the same way.

Congratulations to the connections of Early Action for winning

the Governor's Cup. It was a tough field and an impressive victory.

Despite the fact that Fast As The Wind won the \$413,600 Valley Victory in a stakes-equaling 1:53.2, I don't believe he has not done enough this season to challenge King Of The North in the 2-year-old trotting colt division.

Prior to being interfered with in the Mohawk Million — where he still managed to finish fifth — King Of The North won the \$505,600 Wellwood, \$293,450 Peter Haughton and \$200,000 NJSS Final.

Even though he hasn't shown his best at the end of the year, King Of The North should wear that divisional crown.

It was nice to see Lyons Sentinel back to her winning ways in the TVG Mares Pace Final, which should lock up divisional honors for her.

Had Breeders Crown champ Rocknificent won, it certainly could have started a discussion.

Congratulations to the connections of both top-notch mares and I hope we get to see them slug it out again next year.

Allywag Hanover won the \$350,000 TVG Open Pace and I believe will triumph over Ocean Rock for divisional honors.

Even though Ocean Rock did win the \$600,000 Breeders Crown, it is the only race he won worth more than \$200,000, while Allywag Hanover has won the \$472,000 Canadian Pacing Derby, \$265,400 William Haughton and the TVG.

The two older pacers have gone head-to-head three times this season with the 2-1 advantage going to Allywag Hanover.

Going into the \$479,450 Goldsmith Maid, I believed that Venerable was a lock to be the 2-year-old trotting filly champ. But this is why we race them, because when Breeders Crown champ Joviality S came out on top in a stakes record time of 1:52.1 more research was required.

The two fillies have faced off only twice this season with each one getting a victory. Venerable has more money and only two losses on her card this year compared to three for Joviality S.

Joviality S has won the aforementioned Goldsmith Maid, \$600,000 Breeders Crown, \$200,000 Kentuckiana and \$200,000 NYSS Final, while Venerable has won \$790,000 Mohawk Million, \$326,850 Jim Doherty, \$309,680 Peaceful Way, \$200,000 NJSS

It's not a lock anymore, but I still give the edge to Venerable.

For a few years the trotting mares division has been a two-horse fight between Atlanta and Manchego.

Congratulations to When Dovescry for winning the \$175,000 TVG Mares Trot and joining the discussion and making that twosome a threesome. I started out leaning towards Manchego, but this win may have changed that.

Is two wins enough to secure you a divisional honor? Maybe.

There is no doubt that Ecurie D DK was impressive winning the Allerage and Breeders Crown and if he had raced in the \$350,000 TVG Open Trot, and done well even if he hadn't won, I probably would have voted for him.

But Forbidden Trade has been knocking heads with the best all season and has now hit the board nine time in 14 starts. In addition to the aforementioned TVG, he also won the \$210,000 Caesars Trotting Classic and the \$135,000 Crawford Farms.

I think it's too close to call.

# Niki Hill reigns supreme in sparkling Three Diamonds score

**Niki Hill** and driver Dexter Dunn proved again she is the best in the 2-year-old filly pacing division by commanding the win in the \$359,450 Three Diamonds on Saturday (Nov. 20) at the Meadowlands. The time for the mile was 1:50.4.

Just after the first turn, Always Gonna B You fired fast to get the lead, but was rough gaited and broke stride, scattering the field. Joyride Hanover took advantage of the rumble to get the lead while Find Happiness charged first over only to give in to Treacherous Dragon as the busy first quarter went in :27.1.

Zooming past all of the shuffling, Niki Hill began her path to victory with Treacherous Dragon following and Dont Fence Me

In going first up as the half was clocked in :55.4.

It was all Niki Hill from there. The Always B Miki—Road Bet juvenile began to draw away around the second turn, easily dismissing Dont Fence Me In and eating real estate in the stretch with a three-quarters in 1:24.2 and an unchallenged win by 1-3/4 lengths in 1:50.4. Treacherous Dragon held for second and Don't Fence Me In was for show.

Trainer Chris Ryder said, "[Dexter] asked her for some kick in the stretch, just spoke to her briefly, and he said she had plenty left. She just took off; whenever he asked her, she just gave him more."

Ryder expected a big mile out of her in the Three Diamonds, even though she had a skin problem the last two weeks. "Sometimes that can knock a horse," he said, "but she's a champion. It's so rewarding when you get a horse like this. She's done so much for us and I can't say enough good about her."

Tom Hill of the United Kingdom owns Niki Hill. She has earned \$904,556 this season, winning nine of 10 starts She paid \$2.20 to win.

Niki Hill was bred by Stephen Dey III.

# Allywag Hanover resurgent in TVG Open

Sitting patiently behind torturous fractions, **Allywag Hanover** (\$6.20) had ample energy in the stretch to thread through at the pegs and outlast a late charge from 45-1 outsider Workin Ona Mystery to capture the \$350,000 TVG Open Pace on Saturday night (Nov. 20) at The Meadowlands.

After riding the pocket to a runner-up effort to Enavant in last Sunday's (Nov. 14) Potomac Pace at Rosecroft Raceway, just outside Washington, DC, Allywag Hanover found himself in a similar spot just off the pace — but took advantage of a longer stretch drive to reclaim victory. The 4-year-old Captaintreacherous— Anderosa Hanover gelding controlled a :26.3 first guarter before stringing Cattlewash out through the third furlong and then being relegated to third as Daniel Dubé brushed even-money choice Enavant to the fore in a punishing :53.1 half mile. As Enavant maintained his advantage to three-quarters in 1:20.2, Allywag Hanover was locked in by the uncovered Ocean Rock - but found room up the pegs turning for home as Cattlewash took aim from the pocket. The hot pace took its toll on both Enavant and Cattlewash, as Todd McCarthy pointed Allywag Hanover through an inside lane and reached the lead just above the sixteenth pole. Allywag Hanover was driven out to the end of a 1:48.1 mile, just holding off Workin Ona Mystery (Tim Tetrick), who cascaded four-wide off cover and flew home to finish second. Catch The Fire (Scott Zeron) finished third.

Brett Pelling trains Allywag Hanover, who now has won 18 times in his career and banked over \$1.2 million, for the Allywag Stables.

Captaintreacherous not only sired the winner — which was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms — he also sired the place and show horses, as well.

# Forbidden Trade wins TVG Open Trot

Forbidden Trade rallied from mid-pack on the final turn to take the lead from battling Amigo Volo and Ready For Moni in the stretch and capture Saturday's (Nov. 20) \$350,000 TVG Series Open Trot championship by a head over Chin Chin Hall in 1:52 at The Meadowlands. Back Of The Neck finished third.

Forbidden Trade was fifth for the first three-quarters of the mile as Amigo Volo led the field to fractions of :27.1, :56, and 1:24.1. When Ready For Moni made a first-over bid for the front, Forbidden Trade followed that cover into the lane and then held off late-closing Chin Chin Hall and Back Of The Neck for the victory.

The three were separated by a neck at the wire.

"He raced super," winning driver Daniel Dube said about Forbidden Trade. "We got a good trip, second over, and it worked out good.

"He's always kicking late. From behind like that, he never quits."

Dube drove Forbidden Trade for trainer Luc Blais and owner Determination stable. The 5-year-old stallion has won five of 14 races this season and earned \$601,002. For his career, he has won 21 of 44 starts and \$1.91 million. The son of Kadabra out of Pure Ivory was bred by Steve Stewart.

Forbidden Trade was Canada's Horse of the Year in 2019, when he counted the Hambletonian among his wins for the season. He was limited to five starts last year because of injury.

Sent off at odds of 9-2, Forbidden Trade paid \$11.00 to win.

# Early Action speeds to Governor's Cup glory

Off a runner-up finish to Hammering Hank in the \$238,700 Kindergarten Classic, Early Action came out on top with a speed-show performance to click a 1:50 victory in winning the \$386,600 Governor's Cup on Saturday (Nov. 20) at The Meadowlands.

PJ Lou and Fourever Boy sprinted for the front as driver Brian Sears sent Early Action from post 9 for a spot up top, though he waited for the :26.1 first-quarter dust to settle before sliding to the lead. On the point, Early Action rolled unchallenged by a :54 half while Market Based tipped first over with Hammering Hank, the 1-5 favorite, perched in behind.

Market Based began to falter to three-quarters in 1:22, forcing Hammering Hank to lunge three wide to challenge Early Action in the straightaway. The Joe Holloway trainee held his ground through the homestretch, keeping Hammering Hank at bay and hitting the line just in time to hold off 50-1 shot Mad Max Hanover, who ripped from the backfield to take second. Hammering Hank settled for third and Fourever Boy finished fourth.

"They were pushing, trying to hold their spots there early on and I was just kind of waiting for them to get settled so I could make a move," Sears said. "In his first start back here, he might've been a little ouchy, but they took care of that this week and he raced super. He's put on some really game efforts. I can't say enough about that. He held in there for a couple of tight wins in Lexington and the effort he put in tonight was really special."

Early Action earned his eighth win from 13 starts this season with the victory, pushing his career bankroll to \$442,817 for owners Val D'Or Farms and Ted Gewertz. The Huntsville—Fashion Kate gelding paid \$14.80 to win.

Hanover Shoe Farms not only bred the winner, it also bred the place and show horses, as well.

## When Dovescry holds off Atlanta for TVG title

When Dovescry took the lead prior to the half and fended off a challenge from Atlanta around the final turn and through the stretch to win Saturday's (Nov. 20) \$175,000 TVG Series championship for female trotters by one length in a stakes-record-equaling 1:51.4 at The Meadowlands.

Atlanta finished second and Bella Bellini, a 3-year-old filly taking on the mares, was third.

Breeders Crown Mare Trot winner Felicityshagwell S led the field to the opening quarter in :27.1, taking the top spot ahead of Hypnotic AM and Next Level Stuff after the three left the gate quickly for position in the first turn. When Dovescry was fourth, but driver David Miller had the 5-year-old mare moving toward the front before reaching the quarter.

Once on top, When Dovescry reached the half in :56 and three-quarters in 1:24 on the way to her eighth win in 18 starts this season.

"I was a little disappointed in the Breeders Crown, I misread the race and ended up in a bad spot and she raced real well," Miller said, referring to When Dovescry's third-place effort on Oct. 30 at The Meadowlands. "After the way she raced in her last start (winning in 1:51.2 at the Big M on Nov. 12), I thought I would give her her best shot.

"She got to the lead and was able to get a breather in. When Atlanta came, I took off. I didn't want (Atlanta) swelling up beside me. So, we took off and my mare just raced her heart out through the stretch. She knows what to do."

When Dovescry is trained by Brett Pelling and owned by John Lengacher. A daughter of Muscle Hill out of Cedar Dove, she was bred by William Weaver III. She has finished off the board just once in her 18 starts this year and earned \$514,014.

For her career, she has won 20 of 47 races and \$1.63 million.

"I've got to give credit to Brett," Miller said. "He's kept her sharp all year and he's got her really sharp right now. He told me coming out onto the track that she's in super form. All that figured into my strategy of racing her."

When Dovescry was the 8-5 second choice behind 4-5 Atlanta, paid \$5.40 to win.

# Joviality S shuts down division foes in stakes record Goldsmith Maid win

**Joviality S** reasserted her authority off her Breeders Crown victory to win the \$479,450 Goldsmith Maid for 2-year-old trotting fillies, posting a stakes-record mile of 1:52.1 on Saturday night (Nov. 20) at The Meadowlands.

Valentina Blu grabbed the front from post 10 as Joviality S jetted off the car for the front to the first turn. Approaching a :27.3 first quarter, driver Brian Sears vacated the pocket to circle Valentina Blue for the lead as 2-5 favorite Venerable loomed two-wide up the backside with Misswalner Fashion in tow. Joviality S yielded control to Venerable, who then yielded to Misswalner Fashion, heading to a :56.3 half.

Joviality S was placed well as Misswalner Fashion cruised with Venerable readying a charge to three-quarters in 1:24.3. As they dueled, Joviality S came off the pylons and hit her best stride, easily passing her foes with a surge that ended in the stakes-record and lifetime-best 1:52.1 victory by a length. Venerable got by Misswalner Fashion for second and Valentina Blue finished fourth.



Joviality S (Brian Sears) won the \$479,450 Goldsmith Maid in 1:52.1.

from day one," he said. "It's been a long season and she performed like this at the end of November. It just shows, especially coming out of the Breeders Crown from the 10 hole and with [the wet] weather that night how sound she is after this season. I think it's amazing."

Courant Inc owns Joviality S, who paid \$7 to win. Her earnings now peak at \$895,340, pumped by nine wins this season.

"I'm very happy with our relationship with Brian [Sears]," Melander said. "He drives a lot of our horses, he takes care of them like they're his own and I'm very happy about that."





#### Redemption for Lyons Sentinel in TVG distaff

After coming up a half-length short of Rocknificent in the Breeders Crown, Threelyonsracing's **Lyons Sentinel** (\$7.40) no doubt redeemed herself in Saturday night's (Nov. 20) \$175,000 TVG Mares Pace at The Meadowlands, unleashing a long first-over attack en route to a 1:49.1 score and eclipsing \$2 million in career earnings in the act.

Tim Tetrick floated the 4-year-old daughter of Captaintreacherous—Tutu Hanover forward from the outside wing of the starting gate, but was forced to tuck in sixth amid a contested pace that saw Peaky Sneaky protect inside position for the early lead before yielding to Rocknificent just after a :26.1 first quarter. Up the backstretch, Scott Zeron rated Rocknificent

through a :54.2 half before Lyons Sentinel began her long uncovered bid on approach to the far turn.

After failing to flush cover out of midfield, Lyons Sentinel switched into another gear with three-eighths to go, accelerating forward to press the pace to three-quarters in 1:22.2 before grinding to the lead in the final 150 yards. Despite Rocknificent's game effort up the pegs, Lyons Sentinel edged away to win — for the 22nd time in her career — by the better part of a length. Gia's Surreal (James MacDonald), who stalked the front flight throughout, angled off the pegs in upper stretch and chased stoutly for a narrow second over the game Rocknificent.

"She just came back like the champion she is," said JoAnn Looney-King, who shares the training duties of Lyons Sentinel with her husband, Jim King Jr.

Of the first-over grind, Looney-King said, "It worked tonight, because she's just a good horse."

While the Kings plan for Lyons Sentinel to return to the races as a 5-year-old, they believe that a 10-for-19 campaign in 2021 cements their champion mare as the queen of her division.

"I would be thrilled to get Pacing Mare of the Year," Looney-King said. "I don't ask too much, but if she's not the best pacing mare out there, I don't know who is."

### Fast As The Wind blows through fiercely to win Valley Victory

Again in a tight spot in the straightaway, **Fast As The Wind** had a wide-enough gap open ahead for driver Dexter Dunn to dash the Tony Alagna through and deliver as the 3-5 favorite in the \$413,600 Valley Victory on Saturday (Nov. 20) at The Meadowlands.

Coach K Hanover kicked for the front to a :27.3 first quarter while Fast As The Wind protected position from the pylons in second and his stablemate Slay settled into third. Slay then pushed off the pegs up the backside and engaged with Coach K Hanover,

who strung the challenger out to a :55.1 half before breaking and promptly regaining stride to the final turn.

Slay slowed the tempo as Coach K Hanover inched first over with Pretender in tow rounding the final turn. Meanwhile, Fast As The Wind raced locked to the pylons passing three-quarters in 1:24.2. A path opened midway through the stretch as Slay gave way and Coach K Hanover forged for the front with Pretender to his right flank. And with racetrack ahead, Fast As The Wind swept up the inside lane to claim victory by a half-length in a 1:53.2 mile. Coach K Hanover held second with Pretender settling for third and Threepointbluechip taking fourth.

"He was good early, but then he got some sickness like a lot of our horses in Lexington," Alagna said after the race on the Cantab Hall colt's continued bounce back in form. "We left Lexington [and] he just started to come out of the sickness. Since he's been back here at The Meadowlands, he's been phenomenal. But early in the year, he was third in the Peter Haughton and we thought we had a real player until the sickness hit him in Lexington."

Owned by Leblanc & Kribbs, Joe Sbrocco, John Schmucker and Fodera Barbera Frank, Fast As The Wind has banked \$566,007 while collecting his fifth victory from 15 starts. He returned \$3.40 to win.

# Tetrick Wania outstanding in Malmö

The \$313,000 Uppfödningslöpningen for 2-year-olds was held at Jägersro racetrack on Saturday (Nov. 20) afternoon and the classic race turned out to become both historical and very memorable.

No female driver had won one of the three classic stakes races (Kriteriet for 3-year-olds, The Derby for 4-year-olds and Uppfödningslöpningen for 2-year-olds) ahead of the Saturday's race at Jägersro, but Riina Rekilä became the first woman to reach this milestone.

As reported in Friday's issue of HRU (full story here), Rekilä had a great shot with Walner's brother Tetrick Wania (Muscle Hill—Random Destiny) and the duo was the bettors' first choice in the race. The director of the event must have thought of everything before the end of the show was near. Tetrick Wania was not in right balance as the car accelerated from the field and Rekilä might have seen her chances blow away as Tetrick Wania went off stride just before the start. The 2-year-old son of Muscle Hill eventually found the right gait, but the 50-60 meters disadvantage seemed to be an uphill too steep to climb for the duo.

Rekilä and her trotter got contact with the field after 500 meters and Rekilä didn't play it safe at that point. Immediately, Tetrick Wania got the order to attack three wide up the backstretch, the horse more or less flew and passed his opponents, which meant that the lead was taken in the last turn. Over the home stretch Tetrick Wania enlarged the advantage and Rekilä made history as she crossed the wire with Tetrick Wania winning in 1:58.4.

"Tetrick Wania is a very fast and strong horse and I'm very happy that I've produced this horse. He has to play a little bit sometimes and before the break he started to glance at the sides of him which made him loose his gait for a while," Rekilä said.

Rekilä sold the horse to German owners after the elimination of the Uppfödningslöpningen and the horse will now be trained by Michael Nimczyk in Germany.

#### Nuncio son best in Rome

**Denzel Treb** (Nuncio) was the favorite in Italy's \$175,000 Gran Premio Anact for 2-year-olds in Rome on Saturday (Nov. 20) afternoon and despite a first over trip, the Massimo Compagnotrained trotter proved to be the best, again. Denzel Treb, who is a brother of Elitloppet winner Ringostarr Treb, is undefeated after six starts so far and in Saturday's race he won in 1:58.4.

The fillies' division was won by **Danish Melody** (Brillantissime) and Andrea Guzzinati in 1:58.2. Danish Melody's older brother Callmethebreeze (Trixton) recently won Orsii Mangelli for 3-year-olds and the common denominator between the siblings is French top trainer (and breeder) Philippe Allaire.

# Hire wagering experts to mind the store

Using those in the trenches to identify the problems is simply good business.

The headline from last week's Breeders' Cup was not what anyone expected. It wasn't about the majesty of the winners, the performance of the Japanese horses or the sunny skies of San Diego. It involved a gate scratch of race favorite Modern Games in the Juvenile Turf. The colt was taken out of the wagering, but seconds later after it was clear there was a mix-up, he was allowed to run for purse money only.

Modern Games won the race, which was fortuitous for the owners, but not so great for those who had the colt keyed in the last leg of the Pick 5. Substituted with the (new) betting favorite, their tickets — millions of dollars' worth — were confetti. That's why, as a wonderful 2-year-old was led to the winner's circle after a beautiful performance, all **you heard were boos**.

Many in the industry were left flabbergasted. Sadly, some inside the business who are completely out of touch with the wagering side, had no idea why people were even booing.

Navigating these types of messes are not something that's easy to do. The Thoroughbred Idea Foundation wrote a comprehensive study on wagering integrity in an excellent multi-part series that I encourage everyone to read. In most cases, the sport doesn't even realize it has a problem, until it has a problem.

Fortunately, the majority of these issues (those that we might deem easier to fix) are not as big as the Breeders' Cup snafu and others the TIF documented. But the small things, along with the lack of response to address them, shows how systemically deep the chasm between industry and customer is.

Take for example the venerable Bob Marks, who has opined from time to time on this topic when he has his old-time Roosevelt handicapping hat on. Bob might mention a race where a 1 to 9 shot races poorly, or a driver doesn't pull a heavy chalk, or something happens in a race that affects a big amount of wagering money to be followed by dead air. Then, the next race goes off with no one reporting anything about the incident; no driver interview, no word from the judges. Nothing. It's like if we don't talk about Fight Club there is no Fight Club.

Bob can't understand it, and neither can I.

Currently, bettors frustrated over certain races or policy email blast a Jason Settlemoir, or a Woodbine executive, or Nick Salvi, or Jeff Gural or whomever. I'm sure they do their best (I know for a fact Settlemoir does), but I don't think anyone would disagree – this is not the way to handle a multi-billion dollar wagering business.

This week I listened to the **Jason Beem podcast** with a professional thoroughbred and harness bettor where he spoke about tracks needing a wagering expert. This person could be someone who knows what the wagering customer is thinking; what they want; what they need from this industry to be better customers. Someone to mind the store.

In my view, he is absolutely correct. And it's not like this is some sort of breakthrough idea. Professionally run businesses such as the Hong Kong Jockey Club do this as a matter of course. In fact, they employ a vice president of wagering with a team under him because they believe this is so important.

Setting up an organizational structure from the wagering side to communicate with on-air talent, management and judges is not heresy and it's by no means a radical concept. Wagering integrity and protecting the betting pools begins at home; at the basics, at the grassroots level. That's simply good business and I believe this industry should find a way to make it happen.

### LeTROT president Jean Pierre Barjon on his quest for breeding excellence

The man who spent \$1.4 million in Harrisburg and \$260,000 in Lexington on U.S. stock is convinced the next trotting champions will come from breeding American horses to French ones.

A relatively new name made its appearance among the major buyers at the yearling sales this year in Lexington and Harrisburg and especially at the Harrisburg Mixed Sale. His name is Jean Pierre Barjon, but his name should not be all that new to students of worldwide trotting.

Barjon first made his name known in American sales when he purchased the mare Graceful Touch at one of the Perretti Farms dispersals in 2011 for \$560,000. In addition, he was the owner of the 2009 Prix d'Amerique winner Meaulnes du Carta and has been the president of the powerful French Trotting organization LeTROT. Thanks to the cooperation of Monsieur Barjon himself and with the help of Steve Stewart and Monsieur's Barjon's associate and pedigree advisor Claude Guegan, I was able to connect with him.

Guegan, interestingly enough has some United States harness racing experience. He worked with David Reid at Preferred Equine Marketing while in the United States.

## Please tell us about yourself? What is your background in the sport? How long have you been involved?

"I am the owner of Meaulnes du Carta, winner of the Grand Prix d'Amerique in 2009. I became a breeder in 2006. Since then, I have been the breeder of four Group One winners. As an owner, I have won 17 Group One races including the Grand Prix d'Amerique,

the Cornulier (twice) and the Italian Derby. I sold my primary business in the beverage industry three years ago. In addition to my multiple horse holdings, I am presently and have been the president of the LeTROT Society in France since 2020."

You are one of the few French horsemen — others notably being my friend Jean Pierre Dubois and his family — who have made a significant investment in American trotting. What initially most motivated you in doing so?

"I seek, first and foremost, excellence and victories in the greatest international races throughout the world. I am convinced of the success of cross-breeding between United States and French bloodlines. History is showing it to be so. It will become even more successful, the more it is practiced."

The majority of your American purchases thus far appear to be primarily focused on the breeding aspect of the sport. If your primary focus is as a breeder, do you envision becoming a market breeder with the possibility of raising yearlings for the marketplace? Do you intend to race here? If so, who will be your trainer?

"I am both a breeder and an owner. As a breeder my goal is to breed excellent products in the United States. A stud farm in the United States is not part of my agenda. I already have horses in training and racing in the United States. My trainer is Julie Miller."

#### What is your main motivation in investing in American trotting?

"Breeding in the United States is part of my overall strategy. I have helped in exporting several trotting mares to your country by France's greatest stallion Ready Cash. The performance, thus far, from those mares is very promising. Already a Ready Cash mare when bred to an American stallion has produced Cuatro de Julio, one of the top 3-year-old trotters of this year. This encourages us to believe that this will turn out to become a great strategy."

How many horses do you presently own? Where are they located? It is my understanding that you race throughout Europe. Do you prefer racing to breeding?

"I look upon breeding and racing as two separate areas with one common goal — that goal is excellence, leading to greatness as evidenced by winning major events on racetracks throughout the world. My preference is in winning in either and preferably in both arenas. I am convinced that you need to breed at a high level in order to win races of a high caliber. I now own 40 broodmares. They are comprised of 25 French trotters and 15 Standardbreds. I own a total of 150 horses. The majority of them are in France. There are others in Sweden, Italy and the United States."

## Do you envision other people from France following your lead?

"I hope so. I myself have followed the experience and wisdom



of Jean Pierre Dubois, his family members and Philippe Allaire. I am convinced that others will follow. I believe that more French trotters will be born in the United States, thanks to the agreements made in 2014. These horses will then have the capabilities of racing in North America, throughout Europe and in France."

Will you be breeding some of your French trotting mares to American stallions and conversely your American mares to French stallions?

"I am a great believer in cross-breeding Ready Cash daughters to top American stallions. Its looking to already being incredibly successful and we've only touched the surface. We've only done it with a small number thus far. As the numbers increase, so will the successes. I think these crosses will be interesting in both directions."

To some degree, because of your strong investments internationally, there has been some speculation that perhaps that together with your status in French trotting that the French studbook might be on the verge of opening again as has periodically happened in the last century. Do you consider this to be a likelihood or even a possibility?

"To date, no decision has been taken, even if some breeders are wondering (perhaps with nostalgia) about the origins of today's great champions such as Face Time Bourbon, Bold Eagle, Ready Cash, Love You, Coktail Jet and others."

You are the President of LeTROT in France. Please tell our readership about its functions and importance.

"LeTROT is a very big organization in France. In association with France Galop, it administers 3,500 people including the PMU (9 billion Euro annual handle). LeTROT also manages more than 11,000 races a year at 215 racetracks and distributes more than 225 million euros in purse money and nearly 26 million Euros in premiums to breeders."

Some Americans, perhaps most notably the Antonacci family have dabbled a little in breeding their mares to French stallions such as Love You and Ready Cash in recent years. I realize that Ready Cash has been a super sire in France, throughout Europe and perhaps the world. Do you see his blood and perhaps that of Love You (through International Moni) or any others becoming a large influence on American trotting?

"For me it is a conviction. I believe it to be inevitable. These stallions themselves come from crosses with American blood — close up through Cocktail Jet and Viking's Way and further away through others such as Stars Pride."

What does American blood add to the French trotter and conversely what does French blood add to the American trotter?

"American blood brings precocity and speed. The French trotter perhaps brings more durability. The French trotter has progressed by producing some of today's best horses winning many international races."

I'll end these questions with a sacrilegious question. Do you see any possibility of ever buying or becoming

involved with a pacer?

"No. I have never even thought about it. I need to stay focused on my goals."

# Looking backward to see the future

The moment I was informed that a mare named Always Be Deo was soon to arrive here at the farm, I compulsively went to Pathway and ran her five generation pedigree. She's by Always B Miki, and out of Lisjune, by Camluck, a very nice pedigree, indeed.

But what struck my eye as I looked at the five generations of Always Be Deo was her fourth dam, a mare named Bret's Romance, who was by Bret Hanover, and out of Knight's Embassy, by Knight Dream.

I still have a vivid memory of the night at the Tattersalls Winter Sale when I watched Earl Teater buy Knight's Embassy for \$2,300. For those unfamiliar with the show horse world, Teater was the greatest saddle horse trainer who ever lived. He worked for Francis Dodge, later Francis Van Lennep, and his masterpiece was the incomparable five-gaited stallion, Wing Commander.

Francis Dodge had bought Castleton Farm in 1947 and turned it into a powerful force in both the standardbred and saddle horse worlds. She put her own name into the record books in 1940 when she rode Greyhound to a new world record of 2:01 ¾ for trotters under saddle.

For the early part of my life, up to the time I had to start making a living, to be exact, I was a small part of the show horse world. During those days Teater, with the Dodge Stable horses, dominated the horse shows. To me, he was a god.

Later, when I was old enough, I sought out his company every chance I got. There were always other people present, and I never said a word, just making a mental note of every syllable Teater uttered.

Once someone asked him if riding his world champion walk trot mare, Meadow Princess, was as exciting as it looked. Teater shot that down when he answered, "About as exciting as kissing your sister."

When another fool made the mistake of asking how old his perennial champion mare Lover's Lane was, Teater rasped, "Old enough to sleep by herself."

Then there was the time that Sally Wheeler, of the St. Louis Anheuser Buschs, showed up at the Washington National with her very large, very fierce dog on one side and a new guy on the other.

There was a lot of chatter about what it all meant, until Teater laid the subject to rest, by pronouncing, "That big damn dog is

mighty friendly with that guy."

Sure enough, soon after they were married; Sally, the new guy, and that big damn dog.

But back to Always Be Deo, and her fourth dam, Bret's Romance. By 1974, I was a full-fledged horse breeder, and I never missed a sale at Tattersalls, the Lexington sale barn that's now a fast food burger joint.

Although I hadn't shown a horse for more than 10 years by then, I still regarded Earl Teater with total reverence. While he was still on the show circuit, and still winning more than his share, he also now had a small band of standardbred broodmares. Every fall he'd sell five or six yearlings with the Castleton consignment.

So I was watching him that night at the Tattersalls Winter Sale when he bought Knight's Embassy for \$2,300. For me, she was an okay pacing mare who had already produced at least eight foals, but nothing special.

Knight's Embassy was by Knight Dream, who as a racehorse became the first 2:00 3-year-old pacer when he won the first heat of the Jug in 2:00 flat. He then took the trophy for the Gray Brothers when he won the second heat, just a few ticks slower.

Knight Dream went on to be a successful sire at the Shoe Farms, although he never got a son or grandson who could keep the line alive. Interestingly enough, Nibble Hanover, Knight Dream's sire, was the only horse ever to sire both a Little Brown Jug pacing winner, in Knight Dream, and a Hambletonian trotting winner in Miss Tilly.

What I missed at the time about Knight's Embassy was that no matter whom she was bred to, every one of her foals made it to the races and took a record. That included two by New Discovery, a horse I had never heard of before, and never have since.

Her dam was Miss Reed, by Bert Abbe, owned by Arthur Brown, who by day operated the ABC Freight Forwarding Co. (Boy, couldn't we use his expertise today.) Every horse he bred had the word freight in its name, and his masterpiece was ABC Freight, the world champion 2-year-old trotter who then achieved immortality by siring Garland Lobell.

Although I saw nothing special about Knight's Embassy, Earl Teater did. Then again Teater could see things about horses that ordinary mortals like me couldn't. So he bought Knight's Embassy for cheap, took her back to Castleton, and bred her to Bret Hanover.

The result of that mating was a filly Earl and Carrie Teater named Bret's Romance. And all Bret's Romance did was become a foundation mare for one of the most successful families in our business today. Horses such as I Luv The Nitelife, Lis Mara, and Albert Albert, all millionaires, are just a few of the champions who directly descend from Bret's Romance.

Always Be Deo is just the latest generation of valuable mares to descend from the family Earl Teater started, and she surely won't be the last.

And if you're wondering how old Always Be Deo is, I'll be glad to tell you, she's old enough to sleep by herself.



#### **Speaking out**

How one BC family saved its stolen standardbred.

"When you get a text [saying] your horse is dead, [and] this text comes in after midnight, you get suspicious," said Katherine Anderson, who added that she just couldn't believe the message on her daughter's phone.

Fortunately for 7-year old pacer Town Speaker (p, 4, 1:54.1f; \$101,554 U.S.), stable name Thomas, his owner's skepticism proved correct. But where was he? The gelding had not raced since July 24, when he finished third for trainer Andrew Baird at The Track on 2. "My daughter was in Alberta and going to see Thomas," said Anderson, who lives in Pitt Meadows, BC. "We asked for the address and vet's name. No answer."

Before going missing, Illinois-bred Town Speaker divided his time between Fraser Downs and Alberta, where he raced at Century Downs and The Track on 2. In November 2020, the gelded son of Well Said debuted for Baird and Anderson at British Columbia's lone pari-mutuel harness track, finishing

fourth. He won two starts later. Despite competing in claiming races, Anderson never planned to part with him.

In March 2021, Town Speaker started his season at Fraser Downs, later moving to Century Downs, where he qualified May 25. He alternated between Alberta tracks until July 24, when he finished third in race 3 at The Track on 2. Then his trail turned concerningly cold.

In her written statement for the RCMP, which she submitted this week, Katherine stated that on Aug. 2, 2021, Baird had called to ask if she would consider selling her gelding for \$4,500. When she declined, "he begged [Anderson] to reconsider" and they agreed to a three-month lease for the purpose of helping Baird become a licensed driver.

"During the weeks that followed he gave me regular updates on how well and happy Town Speaker was," she noted in the letter. "My daughters met Andrew [Baird] at Fraser Downs Wednesday September 22nd. Andrew said to my daughters that TS [Town Speaker] was arriving back to BC on the Saturday 25th of September. Andrew told my daughters what shedrow and stall TS would be in and they could come see him every day if they wanted to."

Three days later, Katherine's daughter Laura received the early-morning text from Baird. In Katherine's written statement, she described Baird's message, which stated "TS was washed out and never came around and coliced [sic.] and passed away" while turned out in a field. Katherine's other daughter, Lisa, was visiting Alberta's Century Mile track, near Edmonton, but was still unable to find an address for Baird's farm; the trainer's phone was seemingly always turned off.

In a frantic social media post, Laura said Baird's text message had raised suspicions because the horse's "body [was] nowhere to be found and no vet was provided and he will not answer phone calls." Laura noted that her family discovered Town Speaker had been covertly sold to an Amish buyer, likely destined for road use in the United States. "Thomas is our pet and his lease was up [October] 31 and [he] was being broke to ride [in] November for my nephew," read her heartfelt Facebook post, which was widely shared on various platforms.

When Katherine's husband confronted Baird at Fraser Downs, the trainer reportedly told him, "I'm sorry your horse is dead" but refused to elaborate. "Later on Andrew phoned my family and admitted that a man [name withheld] came into Century Downs and was not leaving Century Downs without TS. He threaten[ed] Andrew['s] life multiple times and said he wanted the horse and proceeded to remove TS from his stall and onto his trailer and then drove away," according to Katherine's account of events. "However Andrew did not know that we had been in touch with [name withheld]," who originally denied the allegations.

The family shared the story of Town Speaker's disappearance widely, in the hope that it wasn't too late to find him. Microchipped and freeze-branded, with a small star and above-average height for a standardbred, Thomas might be more recognizable and identifiable than some missing horses.

"I called a friend at the racetrack and asked her to find out the main Amish buyers," said Katherine, adding that the BC Standardbred Horse Adoption Society's Greener Pastures Horse Rescue contacted her daughter Laura to confirm their fears: No one had stolen Town Speaker from Baird. A buyer (name withheld due to pending investigation) had reportedly paid Baird and removed the horse from Century Downs in a trailer July 29, without providing identification to track security. The gelding was subsequently sold to an Ontario buyer, who had a veterinarian perform bloodwork and other health checks for transport across the Canada-U.S. border. Town Speaker was eventually located in an upstate New York Amish community, but only after the Andersons managed to untangle the lies that had illegally relocated their horse from one coast to another.

Katherine said it wasn't clear if her pacer's freeze brand or microchip helped bring him home: "Yes and no, as nobody bothered to check or ask for paperwork." She gave greater credit to "local standardbred and social media," who shared the family's message widely when Thomas went missing: "We have a lot of horsepeople we asked for help to locate him."

Town Speaker arrived home in BC late last week, "doing ok, but has a lot of scratches and marks," she told HRU. "He was very

happy to come home."

The first-time standardbred owner admitted she was frustrated with the injustice of the situation, "having to pay to get my horse back and the two people that stole him paid nothing." Urgency did not allow for economy in rescuing Town Speaker; she was advised to bring him back to Canada before filing formal charges against the individuals who sold him. In her statement to the RCMP, Katherine wrote, "I assume they thought that my family and I were just to accept the fact that our horse had died and that this would all go away."

Since Oct. 2, Andrew Baird has been subject to full suspension and a loss of grounds privileges at Fraser Downs, pending the outcome of a BC Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch Racing Division investigation.





### Sally Shaffer – Autumn Lane Farm

There's a new farm in town and owner/breeder Sally Shaffer could not be happier about her Autumn Lane Farm (www.autumnlanefarm.com).

Growing up in Columbus, OH, in a family that had no connections with horses, Sally Shaffer's mom said her daughter had a "birth defect" because all she ever talked about were the four-legged animals.

Unlike most girls who opted to spend their time playing with Barbie dolls, Shaffer would go to Scioto Downs to watch the beautiful racehorses.

When the family moved to the country, Shaffer joined the 4-H FFA, and started hanging out with the runners. When she attended college, Schaffer relocated to Lexington, KY for

the spring and summer semesters and got a job working at Spendthrift Farm and then at Darby Dan.

"Breeding, foaling and raising foals has always been my main interest. Once I graduated from college I moved back home and began working with standardbreds," Shaffer said.

"In 1987, I met my husband, Jim Parkinson, who was an Ohiobased driver and trainer. I began working at the USTA in Race Track Support and then with Albert Adams at Winterwood Farm, foaling mares.

"I was a charter/clerk of course for over 20 years at the Ohio Fairs, while also helping my husband in the barn. In 1997, Jim was severely injured in a race, so it was then that we decided to start the farm of my dreams."

Autumn Lane is located 35 miles east of Columbus.

"My husband and I built everything on the farm as it was a bare soybean field when we purchased it.

"Sadly, Jim passed away 12 years ago, but I continue to live and run the farm by myself. He would want me to continue 'our dream' and that is what I'm going to do."

Autumn Lane Farm consists of a total of 85 acres owned and leased pasture, There are 18 stalls, a four-stall stallion barn and an indoor collection area.

"There is a strict no stress rule for the horses that are here. There is no training — only paradise for the four-legged guests and occupants.

"Each field has an automatic waterer/run in sheds/ free choice alfalfa and four-board oak fencing. The horses are grouped when permissible, by their sex and age. Diets are individual and tailored to what each horse requires.

#### **Harness Racing Update**

"While the farm is a business, it is not a factory. It's a labor of love. I personally am in every field each day checking each one, and I refuse to have more horses than what I can personally inspect and care for daily."

Generally, in the off-season, there are 20-25 total horses at the farm and during foaling season approximately 25-30 mares are foaled out.

As far as owning any horses of her own, Shaffer said, "I am into my third generation from a foundation mare named AUTUMN YANKEE, who I purchased years ago.

"My best broodmare is one I bred named WINNING COLORS K. She is the dam of the world champion AUTUMN ESCAPADE (\$890,000, 1:53.2), Cash Lane (1:54.4), Cassius Lane (1:53.2),

Autumn Estelle, and others.

"I have high hopes for WINNING COLORS' 2 year-old Muscles Yankee filly, AUBREY LANE. I also own the now retired stallion VICTORY SAM – a sire of over \$14 million.

"My husband and I always stood stallions through the years. After passing away 12 years ago, most people were unaware that I was doing all the work myself: collecting, breeding and inseminating. Some owners moved their horses thinking the farm would cease to exist without Jim.

"And the next year I was diagnosed with stage two Breast Cancer. After a few surgeries I put my big girl pants on and decided it was time to pour myself back 100 per cent into the breeding business. And her I am.

"Several years ago I began seeking a new stallion in an effort to 'reload' and got the horse LIONHUNTER for ACL Stable. A few weeks ago I got a phone call from trainer Annette Lorentzon as to standing GUARDIAN ANGEL AS here.

"I could not be more thrilled to have this incredible stallion. Needless to say, he comes from an extremely successful trainer, who just happens to be a female (Lorentzon).

"I believe it was meant to be for GUARDIAN ANGEL AS to end up here: a single woman owned and operated farm.

"Today I'm a single mother who has a wonderful 34-year-old son and an amazing 7-year-old granddaughter named Aubrey. She is obviously the apple of my eye and is taking after me in her love for horses.

"Aubrey is becoming a pretty skilled rider with hunting/jumping. Recently, I have started to do competitive CDE driving, and Aubrey is my navigator."

Sally also is a total supporter of racehorse adoption and the Full Circle Program, and enjoys taking photos for people of their horses.



# Cantab Fashion to stand in Maine

### Bulldog Hanover, Pub Crawl continue winning ways at Harrah's Hoosier Park

After capturing the \$220,000 Monument Circle Pace for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings last week, **Bulldog Hanover** continued his winning ways at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino in the \$60,000 Star Destroyer Stakes on Thursday (Nov. 18). With his Indiana pilot John DeLong in the bike, Bulldog Hanover stopped the clock in 1:50.3 to record his third straight win in the Hoosier state. Three divisions of the Star Destroyer Stakes were featured on the evenings 14-race card — one division for the 3-year-old colt trotters and pacers and one division for the 3-year-old filly trotters.

Sent off as the heavy 1-5 favorite, Bulldog Hanover coasted away from the gate while Betterrock and Brandon Bates blasted to the front through the opening quarter in :26.1. Unable to find a suitable spot along the rail, Bulldog Hanover was forced to press on toward the front from first-over. Goldie's Legacy and Trace Tetrick quickly grabbed the cover and were well placed second over passing the half in :55.

As the field reached the third station in 1:23.4, Bulldog Hanover had put away the pace-setting Big Gulp and Sam Widger. Just as Bulldog Hanover struck the front, Goldie's Legacy tipped off his back with a full head of steam. Using a :27 closing quarter, Bulldog Hanover fought off Goldie's Legacy to get the win by a head. Betterrock and Brandon Bates finished third. As the heavy betting favorite, Bulldog Hanover returned \$2.40 at the betting windows.

"He's a fighter, I think he proved that," DeLong said after the victory. "He's a great horse and great horses find a way to win even when the trip doesn't work out."

Trained by John Darling, Bulldog Hanover has now won nine of 14 seasonal starts and extended his Hoosier Park win streak to three. The son of Shadow Play—Bj's Squall is owned in partnership by Jack Darling Stables LTD and Bradley Grant. Bulldog Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

In the 3-year-old trotting filly ranks, **Pub Crawl** and Peter Wrenn extended a win streak of their own, this time in the \$50,000 Star Destroyer Stakes. Overcoming the outside post nine, Pub Crawl turned in a decisive gate to wire effort to win by three lengths in 1:55.2 over Dewtiful's Grace and Michael Oosting. Pub Crawl was also victorious last week in the \$105,000 Crossroads of America Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Trained by Julie Miller, the daughter of Bar Hopping—Myth recorded her seventh win of the season from 20 trips behind the gate. Pub Crawl is owned in partnership by Marvin Katz, Al Libfeld and Sam Goldband and was bred by Fair Winds Farm and Steve Jones.

The biggest upset of the evening was produced by **Street Gossip** and Sam Widger who pulled the 24-1 upset in the \$53,000 Star Destroyer Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings. Employing a :26.4 closing quarter, Street Gossip was able to track down the heavily favored Swingforthefences and Peter Wrenn to get the win by a head in 1:55.1.

Trained by Virgil Morgan Jr., Street Gossip is owned in partner-ship by Carl T Howard and Jesmeral Stable. The gelded son of Cash Hall—The Young Princess recorded his tenth win of the season from 24 starts. Street Gossip was bred by Morrisville Col Fdn Inc.

### In support of microchips

I read the comments by Trish Soulsby (2021-11-13 Feedback) and respect her opinion but respectfully disagree. I offer this feedback.

There is a false narrative that our evolution in identifying horses from markings and chestnuts to lip tattoos, to freeze branding to now microchips is somehow putting our standardbreds in jeopardy at the kill pens. Some say freeze branding is absolutely necessary to avoid this risk and therefore should be mandated in addition to the microchipping. That would add a cost of about \$400,000 to all members who obviously would bear that extra cost if mandated.

If one wants to freeze brand a horse they have the option to do that on their own in addition to microchipping.

At kill pens those actively participating in saving our horses have been supplied with readers and for me the natural progression from chestnuts to microchipping is indeed progress.

The microchip is inserted into a ligament, is the size of a grain of rice, cannot be easily removed, and it does not migrate on its own. Again, there is, in my opinion, a group wishing for the USTA to mandate freeze branding, at an additional cost to all, rather than leave it optional.

Unless I am incorrect, I think New Vocations and others do not wish to see us go back to mandatory freeze branding. In addition, the New York State Legislature passed a Horse Slaughter Bill that mandates microchipping for thoroughbreds and standard-breds by Jan. 1, 2022, without which horses will not be eligible to race in NYS. The New York law further requires the USTA to maintain and make readily available to the NYS Gaming Commission such microchip data in order to penalize anyone found in violation of this law which is meant to protect our horses and hold violators accountable.

In 2010, the microchipping rule was passed after each District considered it. The rule's implementation had been held up until some uniformity with other breeds and livestock could be achieved. The date for implementation has now come for this far superior way to identify all horses. The debate about the failure of USTA to put this rule to the membership violating their rights is a false narrative.

Your vote to move horse ID into the 21st century is a step forward, far superior to markings, lip tattoos and freeze branding, which individuals can still elect to use on their own and at their own cost.

If you agree that microchipping is the right path, bringing the USTA into a global identification system long utilized worldwide, then vote to reject rule change proposals #4, 18, 20, 21 and 24.

# Dr. John Hayes on accidents

RE: Are there more accidents and, if so, what is causing them?

I have a few thoughts on this subject, from the perspective of a person who was once quite invested to now an arms-length observer.

- 1. I agree that with faster horses, race incidents occur quicker with an attendant quicker reaction time required, so that anything that diminishes reaction time potential is a major risk factor;
- 2. Complimenting the increased speed of the 2021 standard-bred, is the natural and clean gaits that most possess. Fewer horses wear boots today, especially pacers. And most pacers wear loose hopples. Interference and tight hopples had safety implications. That being said, if accidents are the same numbers today with a safer horse between the shafts, then maybe the risk has increased from other areas.
- 3. Keith Waples could "scoot a sulky" sideways a foot, as could many others. Think of how many wheels he/they avoided hooking with this skill. As sulkies and driver posture have evolved, it appears that this skill is much less in play.
- 4. Regarding the suggestion of making racetrack surfaces deeper to diminish speed, I would suggest that that would impact soundness negatively, leading to unintended consequences. Horses are meant to bear primary impact weight on the walls of their hoof, with some upward track-surface pressure on the frog to keep the foot pump functioning optimally. The sole is the most pressure-sensitive area of the external hoof. If racetracks were deeper in cushion, more surface material would "ball up" in the sole area, resulting in more weight bearing by the sole, on impact The hoof sole has somewhat thin protection from much vascularity above it. Excess sole trauma has pathology implications that are to be avoided, in my view.
- 5. Regarding driver posture, hand hold position and their ability to react, I would suggest that some can do it very safely, and maybe some are an accident waiting to happen. It appears most drivers are adopting the current style, but optimal adaptation requires certain physical capabilities that aren't equally available to all. Watching Connor McDavid... I'm Canadian so my analogy is hockey... and being able to duplicate his moves are worlds apart. Maybe the divergence of the gifted, the capable and the wanna-be are exposed too often when incidents develop. Unfortunately resultant bad outcomes affect everyone.

# Faraldo on medication thresholds

I almost think the Commissions should suffer penalties for what they are accepting as validly-supported proper threshold levels of permissible therapeutic meds.

What's wrong with these taken together RMTC (Racing Medication Testing Consortium), ARCI (Association of Racing Commissioners International) and HISA (Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act)? In a word, EVERYTHING.

Well let's start out with what the USTA has been preaching for years, the illogical and therefore improper setting of threshold levels of permissible therapeutic medications way too low. For all those years the USTA has tried to convince the RMTC that what it was doing by setting thresholds at such low levels on permissible therapeutic medications was contradictory to the science and therefore, in plain English, simply wrongheaded. This is till today for not only thoroughbred, but also harness racing.

The ARCI created a scientific Advisory Committee to satiate the USTA's concerns but comprised it of members of the same RMTC, who created these wrongheaded rules. Then ARCI continued to champion the appointment of those RMTC members to HISA's Scientific Committee.

Examining the work of RMTC provides a long trail of damage done to many individuals in both industries. The most recent and devastating of which occurred in the thoroughbred's most prestigious event the Kentucky Derby, where a threshold improperly set on Betamethasone at 10 pg/ml tarnished the entire racing industry with a massive blow. The USTA's Harness Racing Medication Collaborative (HRMC) had verified that the science showed that the more appropriate threshold level for that permissive medication was 100pg/ml, a place it had been set at before RMTC intervened. The Kentucky Derby level detected was a mere 21pg/ml of Betamethasone. That was in excess of the RMTC level nut far lower than what HRMC determined scientifically to be the proper threshold level, ie 100pg/ml.

Now let's go to the most recent debacles that occurred on 9/23/2021at the Delaware County Fair. In the Old Oaken Bucket a report has surfaced that 67 pg/ml of Dexamethasone was found exceeding the Ohio adopted RMTC threshold levels of 5

pg/ml. The HRMC set a threshold for this therapeutic medication at >100pg/ml. Let's not stop there, in the standardbred on the same day some 68pg/ml of Dextamethasone was detected triggering another unnecessary positive that should never have been called but for the improper setting of threshold way too low by RMTC. Now the first-place money in the Old Oaken Bucket, \$40,000 +and Standardbred, \$20,000+ will need to be returned and redistributed. The question becomes, Why?

For that question there is no logical or practical reason except that many in this entire game still don't get what the USTA has learned the hard way. That our game's medication guidelines must come from the science that dictates at what levels therapeutic medications can have little to no effect at such minuscule levels. In setting these low levels out of thin air, optics, RMTC is hurting the game and forcing trainers to look elsewhere for treatment options once medicines are effectively removed from a veterinarian's practice. Trainers may look to compounders for solutions and we all know where that can lead.

Our game can no longer tolerate having any entity dictate threshold levels that an entity like ARCI can take and blindly submit to a regulatory body unless the science verifies such levels. If the levels are challenged then a resolution of the same must be independently made, not by the entity that made the determination which is what happens now that RMTC controls all the dialogue and ARCI is tethered to them. What does that have to do with HISA? Well the current head of RMTC, Dr. Mary Scollay and another closely aligned with RMTC have been nominated to the HISA Scientific Advisory Committee. If the thoroughbreds don't mind the treatment they get like they did this year in the Ky Derby fine but those of us in harness racing who have endured the back of RMTC's arbitrariness for years think that this cannot be accepted or glossed over with statements that there is concern for the problems being created when that is not accompanied by legislative reforms that gives our harness industry real input and not subject to the back of RMTC's hand or that of any one else for that matter. The science must prevail. The Commissions that accepted these levels in blind reliance should reconsider every regulation RMTC puts before them before adoption.

For now those in the Old Oaken Bucket and the Standardbred who will be harmed, they should think about their support for HISA in view of its RMTC connections to it. The Authority now proposes meting out penalties to not only trainers but veterinarians and owners based upon these ridiculously low thresholds . The RMTC's ascension into HISA is reason enough to ask a million questions about what the heck we as an industry allow to get by us in the regulatory scheme and who should have real and meaningful involvement in that process.

The participants in Kentucky Derby, The Old Oaken Bucket ,The Standardbred and our industries all deserve better treatment than what we are getting from those who profess to know what is better for us. Science and education of the public transcend the optics which so far has ignored both science and common sense. The connections of both Sunny Crockett and Captain Cowboy have my sympathies. It is a bad deal that the industry still doesn't seem to understand or appreciate, the degree of the harm being done. There will be more coming just like this, it has to be stopped.
