Are year-end awards now in the bag?

Saturday's TVG / Final Four extravaganza at the Meadowlands went a long way toward solidifying which horses will win Dan Patch awards, but there's not a lock in every division.

(Editor's note: This is the first in a regular column by veteran racing writer Debbie Little with a sole focus on the Meadowlands Racetrack. Our hope is that it will appear weekly).

Did Saturday's (Nov. 21) TVG / Fall Final Four races at the Meadowlands solidify anyone's case for divisional honors in the Dan Patch awards?

In my opinion: yes and no.

I believe the race between Atlanta and Manchego tightened last night, but still leans towards Atlanta.

Going into the TVG Open Trot, the two award-winning mares had met five times during the season and Atlanta had a 3-2 edge in victories.

If Atlanta had won the TVG, I think she would have locked things up, but since Manchego won in her retirement race, it opens the door for her.

Now they both have three wins apiece. So how can they be separated?

Manchego's wins over Atlanta were the \$320,000 TVG, \$250,000 Spirit Of Massachusetts and a \$40,000 leg of the Miss Versatility, while Atlanta's wins over Manchego were the \$425,600 Maple Leaf Trot, \$175,000 Dayton Derby and \$170,900 Cutler Memorial.

of them. However, in every one of those races, Atlanta finished in front of Manchego.

But Manchego went 1:49 in the Allerage at the Red Mile which turned a lot of heads and apparently translated to support since in the voting for divisional honors. Atlanta only won by two votes over Manchego.

Meanwhile, congrats to Bettor's Wish on going out a champion while pulling double duty on the track and in the breeding shed.

He was barely asked to go and he opened up easily in the stretch on a talented field in the TVG Open Pace. Divisional championship in the bag.

There's also no question that Kissin In The Sand locked up divisional honors with a win in the TVG Mare Pace.

Her rebuff in the stretch of Shartin N was something to behold. That's the way you want to retire.

It would have been nice to know that Plunge Blue Chip was retiring in advance so she could have received the same pomp and circumstance as Manchego, Bettor's Wish and Kissin In The Sand.

Although she is not in the conversation this year for divisional honors, Plunge Blue Chip should be applauded for an outstanding career.

Despite what I've read, I don't believe Lady Chaos locked up the 2-year-old trotting filly division with a Crown victory.

Anoka Hanover, who dominated in the \$451,800 Goldsmith Maid and now has 10 wins in 14 starts including the last seven in a row, has to be part of the discussion.

Lady Chaos has six wins in 10 starts on the season with \$560,803 in earnings, while Anoka Hanover has banked \$599,050. Too close to call.

Dexter Dunn and Nancy Takter were also very impressive tonight and should be named Dan Patch Driver and Trainer of the Year, respectively.

Dunn won four races on the night including the three horses whose retirements were announced, while Takter won all driven by Dunn.



Manchego closes her career with TVG victory

Manchego made her final career start a winning one, capturing Saturday's (Nov. 21) \$320,000 TVG Open Trot championship by 1-1/4 lengths over Atlanta in 1:51.3 at The Meadowlands. Lindy The Great finished third (replay here)

Manchego, a 5-year-old mare, was retired in a ceremony in the winner's circle following the race. She ended her career with 33 wins in 56 career starts and \$2.72 million in purses.

Her victories included the 2018 Hambletonian Oaks and Breeders Crown titles at ages 2, 4, and 5. She is the fastest female trotter ever thanks to her 1:49 victory in the 2019 Allerage Farms Mare Trot at Red Mile and also the fastest female trotter in history on a five-eighths-mile track, with a mark of 1:49.3 in this year's Spirit of Massachusetts at



Manchego is the only female trotter to win with a sub-1:50 mile in multiple years. She has been the sport's fastest trotter in 2019 and 2020.

In 2017, Manchego won all 12 of her starts and became the first undefeated 2-year-old filly trotter in Breeders Crown history as well as the first unbeaten 2-year-old filly trotter to win a Dan Patch Award. With her Breeders Crown triumph last month, she joined Peace Corps and Grades Singing as the only female trotters with at least three trophies.

Manchego, by Muscle Hill out of Secret Magic, was trained by Jimmy Takter at ages 2 and 3, and Nancy Takter at 4 and 5. She is owned by Barry Guariglia's Black Horse Racing and was bred by Brittany Farms.

"She's just a super mare," Nancy Takter said. "She's been great since the first moment that she ever set foot on the track.

"When you get the call that you get to train a horse like Manchego, those calls probably aren't going to come very many times in my life, so I appreciate every moment that I had with her. She's just an unbelievable mare. She makes my job easy, she makes all of us look good around her, because

she's just such a professional."

On Saturday, Manchego and driver Dexter Dunn watched from fourth as Crystal Fashion led to the quarter in :28 and half in :57. As the field neared the final turn, Dunn moved with Manchego and gained the cover of Atlanta, who had been racing in second. Crystal Fashion remained on top at three-quarters, reached in 1:24.1, but in the stretch it was all Manchego, who came home in :27 for the victory.

"It's fitting that the first time she ever went behind the gate was at The Meadowlands and she gets to finish her career here with a win," Takter said. "She started her career with a win at The Meadowlands and she's going to end it the same way."

Said Guariglia, "It feels wonderful. She almost made that look too easy. She's super sharp right now. I was a little nervous when they got to the half in :57; she probably hasn't seen that since she trained back in March. Win or lose, I was ready for the emotions tonight. But, obviously, it's great to win."

Manchego, the slight even-money favorite over Atlanta, paid \$4.00 to win.

Anoka Hanover, Bee Forever score in Final Four trots

On Saturday (Nov. 21), a filly defended her crown while a gelding of regal blood scored himself high honors in Fall Final Four action at the Meadowlands.

Anoka Hanoverw on the \$451,800 Goldsmith Maid for freshman trotting fillies — sponsored by Hunterton Farms. Todd McCarthy drove the Noel Daley-trained filly to victory in 1:53.2. (replay here) The Kindergarten Classic champion scored her seventh-straight win of the season and her 10th win in 14 starts.

Beautiful Game was rushed to the front entering the first turn but settled for the pocket to a :28.1 opening quarter as Insta Glam cruised to the lead. Race favorite Anoka Hanover, from the pylon post, protected position to race third, and stayed put at the pegs while Insta Glam sped to a :55.4 half. But, to the far turn and with the Breeders Crown champ Lady Chaos ranging uncovered, McCarthy moved his charge for the leader.

Insta Glam began to feel the pressure of Anoka Hanover's strong strides past three-quarters in 1:23.3 while Lady Chaos spun her wheels and gapped cover. Into the stretch, Anoka Hanover drew away from the field to score easily by two-and-a-quarter lengths. Soaring up the inside came Flawless Country, who finished second, passing Beautiful Game, third, and Wet My Whistle, fourth.

Daley co-owns the daughter of Donato Hanover—Aunt Mel along with LA Express Stable LLC and Caviart Farms.

"She's been phenomenal," McCarthy said after the race.
"Noel's done an unbelievable job managing her. The success we've had with her has been a dream come true for me. She's been getting better and better all the time. I love her attitude; she wants to do the job every time."

Buck Chaffee of Caviart Farms said none of the connections thought Anoka Hanover was as classy as she raced this season. "She didn't look great as a baby. We didn't know she was good until she started racing," he said. "As owners we're happy. This is one of those pleasant surprises."

As the public's choice, Anoka Hanover paid \$2.80 to win. She increased her earnings to \$599,053.

Bee Forever, with Victor Kirby at the reins, pulled off an upset in the \$398,650 Valley Victory for freshman trotting colts and geldings — sponsored by Kentuckiana Farms — closing with confidence down the stretch to win in 1:54 (replay here).

Bee Forever was in no rush to leave, settling in ninth as Dees Red Delicous, race-favorite On A Streak, and Incommunicado stepped quickly off the gate. Incommunicado grabbed the top spot, but gave way past a :27.4 first quarter as Dees Red Delicous strode to the front. On A Streak, positioned fourth, then made his move for the lead, cruising by Dees Red Delicous through a :55.4 half

before bearing a first-over charge from Zenith Stride to the far turn. Zenith Stride kept the pressure on the leader to three-quarters in 1:25.1, but grew leg weary off the turn.

Storming three-wide from near last, Bee Forever found a clear path to aim at the finish line, and full of trot, Kirby did not have to urge the son of Muscle Hill—Bee A Magician to glide safely to victory by a neck. On A Streak held for second and Delayed Hanover followed to get third.

Richard "Nifty" Norman trains Bee Forever, who won his second race in nine starts.

"The first time I drove Bee Forever, Nifty told me the colt can trot really fast but he's green and needs to be taught. Every week he got better." Kirby said in Bee Forever's Kindergarten Final performance two weeks ago, "if I shake free, he wins, so I knew if he gets open space it would work out."

Bee Forever has now earned \$240,986 at 2 and Kirby feels there's a lot more to come at three. "You're going to hear from him next year," he said.

Bee Forever paid \$30.60 to win.

Kissin In The Sand sets stakes record in TVG Mare Pace in her final career start

Kissin In The Sand took the lead at the half, fended off a challenge from Shartin N on the final turn, and pulled away from the field in the stretch to win Saturday's (Nov. 21) \$150,000 TVG Series Mare Pace championship in a stakes record 1:48 at The Meadowlands (replay here).

. Three-year-old filly Peaky Sneaky was second and Shartin N was third.

It was the final start of Kissin In The Sand's career. The 5-year-old mare finished the season with a seven-race win streak and pushed her lifetime victory total to 27 in 58 starts. She earned \$1.74 million for owners Marvin Katz and Hatfield Stables and trainer Nancy Takter.

"She was outstanding tonight," winning driver Dexter Dunn said. "She's had an amazing career, she's an amazing mare, and I was lucky enough to get on for the last four or five starts to enjoy the last run home."

Kissin In The Sand left from post nine and settled into third as Peaky Sneaky and Shartin N exchanged the lead in an opening :26.3 quarter. Kissin In The Sand made her move on the backstretch and got to the front just as she hit the

half in :53.4. She remained on top to three-quarters in 1:20.3 and came home in :27.2 to win by 2-1/2 lengths over stablemate Peaky Sneaky.

"She kicked in the straight really good," Dunn said. "She knows when it's go time. Once we got the plugs out, she went to another gear and finished off a very strong mile."

Sent off the 4-5 favorite, Kissin In The Sand paid \$3.80 to win.

Kissin In The Sand, by Somebeachsomewhere out of Kiss Me Kate, was bred by Christina Takter, John Fielding, R A W Equine Inc., and Concord Stud Farm. She was a Dan Patch Award winner at age 3. Among her wins to close out this season were her first Breeders Crown as well as the Dayton Distaff Derby, Milton Stakes, and Allerage Farms Mare Pace.

"When she was 3, I actually took care of her myself because I had a much smaller stable, so I had a very close relationship with her," trainer Nancy Takter said. "That's why she's so special (to me).

"She's matured so much through the years. She was a pain in the butt to break. I remember four years ago when she came into my barn, I called Marvin Katz and said she's either going to be great, or she's going to be terrible. So I'm happy she decided to be great. She was just tough from day one and her performance tonight just shows how tough she really is."

Kissin In The Sand will be bred to another of Takter's recently retired stars, Tall Dark Stranger.

"Hopefully, they're a match made in heaven," Takter said, adding with a laugh, "I already told Marvin and Bud (Hatfield) that I get to train the first baby."

Supporters of the betting favorites found themselves empty handed following the Fall Final Four pacing events on Saturday (Nov. 21) at the Meadowlands.

Breeders Crown champ Summa Cum Laude grew leg weary off quick fractions while pocket-sitter **Always A Miki** vaulted with fresh legs to a 1:50.2 victory in the \$371,900 Governor's Cup — sponsored by Walnridge Farm & Heritage Hill Farm (replay here).



Captain Sleaze, at odds of 90-1, kicked to the front and held a brief lead by a :26.3 opening quarter as Always A Miki pulled from the pocket with Summa Cum Laude on his back. Always A Miki cleared command to the backstretch before yielding to Summa Cum Laude. Then Abuckabett Hanover tipped first over from fourth tracked by his stablemate, Metro Pace winner Exploit, approaching a :54.3 half.

Abuckabett Hanover ranged toward the pacesetter nearing three-quarters in 1:21.4, but his advance stalled nearing the straightaway and forced Exploit to launch three wide. Summa Cum Laude clung to the lead into the stretch as a lane opened for Always A Miki to vacate pocket, and the Always B Miki—Beach Gal colt lunged to a late lead over an extended Exploit and held firm to a half-length victory. Summa Cum Laude held third with Captain Fancy closing for fourth.

"(Always A Miki is) a very small horse, there's not much too him — but he's shown all year [that] he's a true competitor," his driver Dexter Dunn said after the race. "We re-moved there at the quarter, then Yannick [Gingras and Summa Cum Laude] came and it worked out perfect. The three-quarters was pretty fast, and he was tagged on Yannick's helmet the whole trip. I knew he had something left if I could get him clear."

Owned by Christina Takter, Goran Anderberg, Herb Liverman and Rojan Stables, Always A Miki collected his fifth victory from 13 starts, earning \$342,418. Nancy Takter trains the \$16.00 winner.

Blue Diamond Eyes culled the flames of red-hot Breeders Crown champ Fire Start Hanover and emerged victorious in the \$323,600 Three Diamonds Final — sponsored by Daniel Baer & South Mountain Stables (replay here).

Driver David Miller had Blue Diamond Eyes revved early, powering for the front past a :27.3 first quarter to pocket Notorious Pink into the backstretch. Fire Start Hanover raced fourth into the backstretch and gradually edged off the pylons until committing first over by a :56 half. Once taken outside, Fire Start Hanover rolled towards Blue Diamond Eyes to battle the leader by three-quarters in 1:23.3.

However, the far-turn blitz paid a toll on Fire Start Hanover as she retreated through the field with shortening strides. Blue Diamond Eyes meanwhile blazed to the finish while prompted by pocket-popping Notorious Pink, who settled for second by one-and-a-half lengths in the 1:51.1 mile.

Thebeachiscalling wove through traffic for third with Lindy At The Beach taking fourth.

"Really where she turned her whole year around was in the Kentucky Sires Stakes," trainer Ron Burke said after the race. "She went down, re-found herself, then she came back and won the final. Then even in the Breeders Crown, we couldn't get her in the right spots. Last week [David Miller] said she's ready for a big effort and he said we'll give it to her this week. Like, we're just going to put her on the front and make them come beat her. He was very right—I knew when they came into the last turn [that] they'd have to pace hard to get around her, because she'll fight when she gets the lead."

Winning her fifth race from 13 starts, Blue Diamond Eyes has banked \$554,617 for owners Thomas and Scott Dillon. The filly by Captaintreacherous—Aria Hanover returned \$11.40 to win.

An \$81,000 consolation was contested earlier on the card for the Governor's Cup. Chris Ryder trainee Beachhead bolted down the center of the track off swift fractions of :26.2, :54.3 and 1:22.4 to win by three-quarter lengths in 1:51.2 over Baklouva, who rallied from last for second. David Miller drove the \$13.40 winner for owners Steve Heimbecker and Mac Nichol.

Plunge Blue Chip wins surprise swan song at Big M

Three months have passed since When Dovescry and **Plunge Blue Chip** clashed at The Meadowlands in a Steele Memorial thriller. Saturday night (Nov. 21), both million-dollar mares returned to settle the score in the \$140,000 TVG Mares Trot.

The 2019 Hambletonian Oaks winner When Dovescry, a 4-year-old mare by Muscle Hill—Cedar Dove, set a career best mark of 1:50 in the Steele this past August. The Brett Pelling trainee entered off a second-place finish in her local prep race last week. She left from the outside post (6) as the even-money favorite taking on five rivals, with her adversary, Plunge Blue Chip, drawing post position three.

Plunge Blue Chip, the daughter of Muscle Mass—Dunk The Donato, finished second to When Dovescry when the two last met locally in the Steele. Ake Svanstedt, who trains, drives and owns the 5-year-old mare in partnership with Blue Chip Bloodstock, Inc. and Tomas Andersson, got away well at the sound of the bell, sending Plunge Blue Chip to the early lead.



Around the first turn, she relinquished the top to long-shot, Felicityshagwell S, who made the opening quarter in :27.1.

Sensing a slow pace, Svandstedt pulled the pocket and brushed to the point with Plunge Blue Chip as the field linked up with the backstretch. She progressed unhurried to the half-mile marker, catching a :29.1 breather, clipping the beam in :56.2. With plenty in reserve and no serious threats, Plunge Blue Chip showed the field her heels in the stretch, kicking clear to a 1½-length victory (replay here).

Pat Matters advanced from last to finish second from When Dovescry who disappointed, settling for third.

Plunge Blue Chip stopped the clock in 1:51.4, matching a stakes record jointly held by Hannelore Hanover and Emoticon Hanover. Plunge Blue Chip paid \$5.80 to win as the 9-5 second choice.

"The best position for her today was in the front, and she made it," Svanstedt said. "She came home fast and felt good."

On a night that celebrated the retirements of Manchego, Bettor's Wish and Kissin In the Sand, Svanstedt revealed in a surprise post-race announcement, that Plunge Blue Chip has made her final trip around the Big M oval. According to Svanstedt, "[Plunge Blue Chip] sold as a broodmare and she is going to Anvil and Lace farm in Kentucky."

With her win in the TVG Mares Trot, Plunge Blue Chip improved her record to 23 wins from 48 career starts. She retires with \$1,576,251 in earnings.

Bettor's Wish romps to 1:48.1 score in TVG Open Pace in final career start

Bettor's Wish closed out his racing career in style with a powerful performance in Saturday's (Nov. 21) \$340,000 TVG Series Open Pace championship, defeating Backstreet Shadow by 2-3/4 lengths in 1:48.1 at The Meadowlands (replay here). This Is The Plan finished third.

Bettor's Wish led to the first turn before yielding to Southwind Ozzi in a :27.1 opening quarter. Southwind Ozzi's time on top was short-lived as driver Dexter Dunn directed Bettor's Wish back to the lead and took the field to the half



in :54.2 and three-quarters in 1:22. He was never threatened in the stretch.

Sent off as the 1-2 favorite, Bettor's Wish paid \$3.00 to win.

"I barely asked him tonight, to be honest," Dunn said. "It was all him. It's been him his whole career. He's a true racehorse.

"It was a special feeling crossing the line with him tonight. He's been an amazing horse to me."

Bettor's Wish, a 4-year-old stallion by Bettor's Delight out of Lifetime Star, won 24 of 44 career starts and \$2.60 million. He failed to finish among the top three only three times in his career. He received the Dan Patch Award for best 3-year-old male pacer in 2019 and was second to Shartin N in voting for both Pacer of the Year and Horse of the Year.

Other victories this year for Bettor's Wish included the Sam McKee Memorial, Dayton Pacing Derby, and Allerage Farms Open Pace.

Bettor's Wish is owned by trainer Chris Ryder, Bella Racing, Fair Island Farm, and Bettors Wish Partners. He was bred by Brittany Farms.

"I'm very sad to retire the horse tonight, but it's the right time, it's the right thing to do for his stud career," Ryder said. "I'm really, really going to miss him. He's raced so good for us so many times, it's like I've got to pinch myself when I look back on those races. There are so many good memories.

"I'd really like to thank my ownership group. They stood behind me 100 percent and let me race him wherever and whenever and that's made it a whole lot easier. The whole trip has just been very exciting and something I'll never forget."

Bettor's Wish bred 58 mares in New Jersey this year before beginning his 4-year-old campaign. He will stand at Diamond Creek Farm of Pennsylvania in 2021.

Dunn, Takter lock up year-end honors at The Big M

Fall Final Four / TVG Finals Night saw a handful of horses lock up divisional honors Saturday night (Nov. 21) at The Meadowlands.

It also saw the two most-coveted human awards cinched by a pair of the game's biggest stars.

First up was Dexter Dunn, the 30-year-old native of New Zealand, who in his second year driving full time in America, left no doubt whom the United States Harness Writers Association's Driver of the Year will be.

Of the eight stakes races on the card, Dunn emerged victorious four times, guiding Manchego (TVG Open Trot), Kissin In The Sand (TVG Mares Pace), Always A Miki (Governor's Cup) and Bettor's Wish (TVG Open Pace) to victory lane.


Add in the fact that Dunn won four Breeders Crown races and was the only driver in the sport with \$10 million in earnings this year coming into the night, he better make room for a second DOTY trophy.

Takter scored three times on the card, as her trainees – Manchego, Kissin In The Sand and Always A Miki – were all handled by Dunn. She entered Saturday with earnings of \$7.3 million from just 397 starts.

During 2020, in addition to the aforementioned power-packed threesome, Takter also had likely Horse of the Year winner Tall Dark Stranger – the Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup champion – in her barn.

It's clear that Takter will raise the USHWA Trainer of the Year hardware.

A LITTLE MORE: Trainer Ron Burke and driver Dave Miller both reached an incredible milestone, as each pushed past the \$250-million mark in lifetime earnings. Burke reached that lofty number when his Baklouva finished second in the Governor's Cup consolation while Miller became a quarter-billionaire after scoring with Blue Diamond Eyes in the Three Diamonds. Burke is harness racing's leading all-time trainer in terms of earnings while Miller is second to John Campbell, who finished his career with \$299 million in his bank account... Harness racing's indispensable Moira Fanning has spent a lifetime in love with the sport


Moira Sullivan Fanning's equine career began as those of many young women - she loved and rode horses. As a teenager she decided to make horses her life's work.

She was from Valley Forge Pa. Her first job in the sport was

nearby as a groom working for Courtney Foos, Jr.

Very few of you reading this will likely know that name. However, for a few short years, Mr. Foos was one of the sport's most prominent owners.

But he wasn't only an owner, he went whole hog into the business. He established his own training center where he trained and eventually drove a significant stable of mostly high-priced horses. He was the very first person to ever claim a horse for \$100,000.

He was mostly known as the owner, trainer and sometimes driver of the world champion 2-year-old trotting filly Starlark Hanover.

Fanning took care of racehorses and yearlings while working with Foos.

Foos' career as a driver was cut short due a to a horrific racing accident at Brandywine Raceway. I'm supposing that led to his eventual exit from the business.

But I digress. This conversation is about Moira Fanning, not Mr. Foos.

Working for Foos, Fanning discovered the world of the racetrack. She immediately fell in love with just about every aspect of life there.

Among her employers were Jim Shafer's Ozark Stable at Liberty Bell Park, The W. R. Haughton Stable where she worked under Leo Bond in the Meadowlands division and briefly for the outstanding standardbred and thoroughbred trainer Barry Abrams.

It was at The Meadowlands where she met her future husband Tom Fanning.

In 1979, she and Tom pulled up stakes and went to California to race on that circuit. She recalls a fellow named Ron Pierce residing in a neighboring tack room at Sacramento.

Her first white collar job in harness racing was when she was hired by Marv Bachrad to be his assistant at Brandywine Raceway.

"To this day he remains the best person I've known in the sport," Moira said. "He succeeded the irreplaceable Colonel Dave Herman there. Marvin was kind and patient. He gave freely of his time and resources, not just to help me, but to help just about anybody in or out of the business. He walked me down the aisle when I got married. He personified the Yiddish term 'Mensch."

From there she moved to Garden State Park where she worked under the legendary publicity man Bill Fidati, the man credited with discovering the perhaps more legendary



news reporter, Andrea Mitchell, who is married to former Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan. It is such a small world we inhabit. Talk about six degrees of separation.

At Garden State, Hall of Famer Bob Quigley had assembled an all-star cast, much as he had previously done at The Meadowlands. It included Bob, his wife Eileen, Kim Pratt, Larry Lederman and Jay Farrar, to name a few.

Unfortunately, the demographics and its closeness to the casinos of nearby Atlantic City were destined to doom Garden State Park. It was at Garden State when that track was playing host to the Breeders Crown races that Moira had her first working relationship with her future boss, Tom Charters of the Hambletonian Society. After the Breeders Crowns were completed, Tom asked Moira if she would come to work for the Society. His assistant had just left and he desperately needed someone. She describes her tenure at Garden State as "paradise."

She is still very close friends with many that she worked with while there. However, she could see the handwriting on the wall for Garden State.

Thus began her 37-year tenure at the Hambletonian Society, where she is now the chief operating officer.

Moira, you've been involved with the Breeders Crowns for a very long time. How many tracks have you been to while in the employ of the Society?

"There have been 31 host tracks, the only two tracks that I recall not going to were the one in Alberta for 3-year-old pacing colts and Canterbury Downs in Minnesota for 2-year-old trotting fillies."

Which was your favorite and why?

"Just about every one of them had their plusses. That first one that I was involved with at Garden State was great. We had a great crowd and great racing. The famous one where Dragon's Lair beat Nihilator at The Meadows might have been the one that put The Breeders Crown on the map. It was a great event. There was great publicity all week, before and after the event. It was truly a case of David upsetting Goliath and with a hometown hero winning it.

"The one at Roosevelt will always be remembered by Robust Hanover tripping and the infamous interview of Billy O by the most wonderful Alan Kirschenbaum.

"The ones at Pompano were very special. John Cashman was the consummate professional. He knew every aspect of the business. The win by Artsplace in the 2-year-old colt pace is still remembered by many as one of the greatest performances they've ever seen.

"The ones at the WEG tracks are always very special. The management there are old school horsepeople. They care about the horses, the racing and everybody associated with the events.

"Places like Northfield Park and Yonkers went all out in trying to promote the races as best they could.

"The Meadowlands is still our number one venue in the sport and every time we've had the races there, they've done a fantastic job.

"I suppose that if you asked anybody who was at Hoosier Park the first year that they hosted the events that they would say they were the best managed and the ones where the host tracks did there darndest to make it the resounding success that it became. They did this despite terrible weather conditions. They also overcame adverse challenges in this horrible year of COVID-19, when the fact that they were held at all was a minor miracle.

"The same could be said for Pocono Downs which faced challenging weather conditions both years that they held the races."

Let's talk about the Hambletonian. Which one was your favorite?

"I would suppose it would be the year of the dead heat. Going into the race it had lost most of its sizzle with the absence of Valley Victory and Peace Corps. It came to the point where the actual race rescued us. Who would have anticipated a dead heat in our most special race? Certainly not me or anybody else. Thank goodness for Probe and Park Avenue Joe. I don't know this for a fact, but I can't recall any thoroughbred classic races finishing in a dead heat."

Through the years, The Breeders Crown has sometimes encountered problems, yet they've always managed to overcome them.

"We've had our share. The first one that comes to mind was when the Breeders Crown races were held at Mohawk. When the entries were made, Bob Key and Harold Shipp paid their entry fees together with their declaration. As is the norm in the business, everybody else declared their horses in with the entry fee to follow prior to the race.

"Mr. Key and Mr. Shipp said that the conditions specifically said that the entry fees had to accompany the declaration. Therefore the race in question should have only their two horses in it. A judge upheld the Society's position and the race went off with all the horses in it.

"Another was the Robust Hanover situation. The horse's connections didn't want to pay the entry fee because the horse had to be scratched. It was clearly pointed out that the

conditions stated that the only exception to the entry fee being paid was if the horse died prior to the race.

"Then [in the Hambletonian] there was the Park Avenue Joe and Probe dead heat which actually went to court, but thankfully was settled outside of it."

You've had two bosses in your 37 years at the Society, Tom Charters and John Campbell. No surprise that they are both Hall of Famers. Tell us about them.

"Tom and I are kindred spirits. We both love the horses, the history of the sport and food. If there is a Bob Evans around, we both know where it is. Tom is looked upon as being methodical and I suppose that he is. But he has been an amazing steward of both the Society and of harness racing. He is a very rational person who is very adept at getting along with people and reaching his goals whatever they might be.

"John is a great ambassador of the sport. He is very outgoing and is not shy. He was working on standardizing racing rules even before he became president. That committee hasn't attained that goal as of yet, but I'm sure he will continue working towards that end. He is terrific on the phone. He knows how to get along with people and holds no grudges. I suppose that being a former driver helps him in that regard."

Tell us about some of the best people you've been associated with while at the Society.

"Two that immediately come to mind are Andy Grant and John Cashman.

"Andy was a man of few words, but like E.F. Hutton when he spoke people listened. When it came to harness racing in general and the Hambletonian Society in particular, Andy was a very altruistic person. He was a great listener. When he felt that something was beneficial to the sport, he would pick up the ball and run with it.

"John was more of a front-and-center type of guy. He was consumed with harness racing — every single aspect of it. He was a font of knowledge. If there was something about the sport that he didn't know about, then it probably wasn't worth knowing."

One of, if not the primary responsibility of the Hambletonian Society, is the maintenance of stakes races and the payments associated with them.

"It certainly is and we have some wonderful people administering them. Even though regional stakes have cut into the participation of Grand Circuit type events, we've managed to hold our own. Actually, in recent years, stakes

payments have been up. Getting tracks to continue with these events can be an ongoing issue. That's an area where John Campbell really shines. He is frequently on the phone working to get homes for these events from year to year. I can well understand the horsemen's view in drifting away from them. They are expensive, transportation and the movement of help is difficult. Regional stakes are cheaper and easier to handle.

"Nevertheless, I think that events open to everyone are important and need to continue. Open stakes racing is much more prestigious and more indicative of who the best horses are. After all, that's what racing is all about. I don't know if it fits here, but I feel I need to make mention of Bob Key who has been our biggest customer for decades. He pays more sustaining and entry fees than anybody else in the game and he does it without the aid of partners."

Your husband is the successful horse trainer Tom Fanning. What's it like being married to a horse trainer?

"It's wonderful. I am envious of him being around horses most of the time. I get a great perspective on his part of the business from him. He is smart and even keeled. Both of us being involved in racing is a big plus."

You have two adult daughters, what about them?

"They are wonderful as well. Veronica is a first grade teacher, while Caroline is an assistant editor at *Reader's Digest*. We are very proud of both of them."

The harness raceway's odyssey: present the perfect product, Part 1

Homer may have shouted the miracles of Apollo, but he did not lead us to an oracle that could predict how harness racing might alter its usual format to arouse a fresh generation of followers.

That goal is, perhaps, the sport's odyssey, but sometime it must end, else it is a worthless pursuit.

Since I turned my main career to games and gaming, I witnessed many attempts to reshape harness racing's traditional parameters. It always seems like a fruitful exercise to tweak the components of standardbred pari-mutuel racing so it might appear fresh and appealing to neophytes, while at the same time remain sensitive and loyal to veteran, old school bettors. As of this writing, though, all initiatives, no matter how creative or dumb, have failed. The face of harness racing remains that of a curmudgeon, when it should be a vernal call to adventure.

All right, I know handles are up based upon a prolific flow of single—and multi-race exotics attracting bettors with a lottery mentality (wagering volume is the root of all racetrack success). However, putting more "show" into the

show business of the sport could only put more flesh on that essential kind of success.

Some of the concepts that tanked over the past few decades were actually good ideas. They supported the risky journey of change that, though it rarely incites phenomena, might deliver unexpected success by bumping into another, better idea. Let's take a look at some of those bold overtures as best as my memory serves.

Post draw at post time:

Knowing that horses' post positions is a meaningful element to bettors, this idea forced the handicapper to focus on the horse, not from which post it left in a race. The post positions were not designated in the program — they were drawn before the race. Apparently, the post position element was even more important to bettors than expected. The process left those bettors unsatisfied with their posts feeling cheated; a feeling not balanced by those feeling benefit from the plan. That is not a good atmosphere for any paying audience.

Racing on the turf:

The idea was simple: present harness races on both surfaces offered in thoroughbred racing — dirt and turf. Because of its popularity with "the runners," there was every reason to think that harness racing bettors would embrace the challenge when a race went from dirt to turf and vice-versa. Since the breeds shared many racetracks with thoroughbreds, it would be no expense to feature some races on either surface.

When I resided in Great Britain, each breed at every track raced and mostly trained solely on grass. Harness racing was not as prevalent as the runners but the sport had its own raceways. Though small and country-fair oriented, pacers and trotters were steered around steep turns and green stretches



without bettors' objection. It was rugged, for sure, and it affected race times, but the Brits were not weighed down with the sport's traditional standards. That was strange in itself, since it was the British thoroughbred Messenger that became the pacer's foundation sire.

In North America, though, presenting harness races on the turf was a flop. It did not attract a new audience and the veteran fans saw it as a miserable handicapping element, as an obstacle to measuring a horse's speed, no less its specific gait talents or lack of them for negotiating a whole new surface.

The one-turn mile:

In 1997, I was briefly involved with promoting Colonial Downs in horse-racing-rich Virginia. I was truly jazzed at its primary feature — a one-turn mile for harness races (satisfying the one-mile standard for racing while eliminating crucial turns — it was actually a 1 ¼ single-turn mile, as was installed and used with great success in the '80s at Hollywood Park for thoroughbred racing).

It was obvious races would get faster (the first sub-1:50

trotting mile was recorded in 2008) but I thought they would also become more strategic, making the outside lane less daunting, adding chances for more horses to thrive in contests of lesser class, an appealing factor for bettors. The track's autumn harness racing meet offered a pastoral brilliance and the finer remnants of summer, an atmosphere made for large crowds. However, after 13,000 showed up for the opening of the rural-area structure between populated Richmond and Williamsburg, the bloom was desperate to stay on the rose. Crowds dwindled, matters between horsemen and management soured, and vapid promotions commingled to make a one-mile harness race moot.

Sometimes, even great notions go limp, so the energy of purpose remains untested. There is no limit to creating a significant brand for harness racing with designs that attract new fans and bettors and combinations of both.

In Part 2 of this topic, we look at some more failed attempts versus a continued pursuit for emblazoning the sport.

guided the Bob McIntosh trainee to his fifth win in 13 starts this season.

Beach Demon did the heavy lifting early, posting sizzling fractions of :27.2, :54.2 and 1:22.2. The torrid pace did in Beach Demon, who gamely hung in for a fourth-place finish.

Beyond Better sat fifth throughout and swept by rivals on the far outside with a :28.1 final-quarter to win by a length and a half. Delightful Terror sat fairly close to the hot tempo in third and split through to finish second. Heart On My Sleeve followed Beyond Better's path to a third-place finish.

A gelded son of Bettors Delight—Somethinincredible, Beyond Better moves up to \$71,810 in earnings for owners Robert McIntosh Stables, Dave Boyle and Mardon Stables. Unraced at age 2, Beyond Better now has back-to-back victories to go along with a pair of runner-up finishes in the two starts prior.

Beyond Better returned \$5.80 to win.

A homebred for Northfields Farm, Northern Sultan is now three for 11 on the season with \$57,272 earned. The gelded son of Royalty For Life—Dover Miss made just two starts as a rookie.

Those that backed the Brethour-trained Northern Sultan got back \$22.40 for a \$2 win ticket.

The Harvest Series was open to Ontario-sired 3-year-olds that were non-winners of \$30,000 in 2020 as of Sept. 30, 2020.

Morrill made his first start driving for his father at Foxboro Park in 1984. The family's operation eventually moved to Rosecroft Raceway where Morrill started getting many catch drives and soon found himself in high demand. In 1990 Morrill went to New York and started driving for Ray Schnittker and George Anthony at Yonkers Raceway and with much success achieved there, decided that move would be long term.

During his time competing at the New York/New Jersey circuit Morrill recalled his most memorable race as being the 2004 Meadowlands Pace where Holborn Hanover was a 58-1 upset winner in 1:49 to equal the stake mark.

After 15 years of driving at the highest level, Morrill left the metropolitan area in 2005 and relocated his family and business to western New York and since arriving has not only been at the very top of the driver colony on that circuit, but also an annual dominant force in the New York Sire Stakes.

In 2006 at Batavia Downs, Morrill set the all-time driving standard for the track with 177 wins and a UDR of .537 for one meet.
