WIRE TO WIRE with DAVE BRIGGS

Inside harness racing's most famous octagon, the fight is against the emotions that come with the passage of time – which is only fair considering the name on the building.

Up the wide wooden stairs and hidden behind a closed door off the interior balcony at the Standardbred Stable of Memories, the last four decades of remarkable Brittany Farms history is laid out like a museum exhibit. The trophies and photos and banners and halters honoring harness racing royalty is a gobsmacking testament to everything Brittany owner George Segal has built in the sport in a relatively short time considering the age of the building where that bounty is now housed.

For the last 142 years, the Round Barn, as it's also known, has unflinchingly stood sentinel over the sport's most famous ring of clay as the city of Lexington has marched on both bit by bit. The barn has been there for all but eight of The Red Mile's 150 years, which means it has witnessed some of the greatest moments, horses and people in harness racing history.

One of my favorite memories is having the good fortune to bask in those spirits as the dusk slipped into darkness and the Gods sprinkled stars across the heavens.

Art Zubrod, the only farm manager Brittany had in its 39-year history, has felt some of the same ghosts, heard some of the same echoes.



It means that patch of bountiful bluegrass will continue to produce standardbred champions as the breeding end of Brittany takes its place among giants Castleton, Armstrong Bros., Lana Lobell and many more in horse racing Valhalla.

"[The Stable of Memories] talks to you without having a voice," Zubrod said.

In the end, it called out to Brittany just in time. In October, the night before the farm began selling its last crop of yearlings at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, a gala was held at the Stable of Memories to officially welcome Brittany's treasures to the treasured barn.

"The last thing that came together was [placing Brittany's] trophies [in the Stable of Memories]," Zubrod said. "I had sleepless nights about it. I did not want to have to auction them. It would've crushed me. It would have crushed all of us. Then Kathy Parker came up with this idea and it took a weight off all of us."

So it is that the tiered wedding-cake building came to have the perfect marriage with Brittany's gifts; sort of a memories for the mementoes and an old Kentucky home for a great Kentucky farm.

Considering the long list of champions Brittany bred, raced or both, the display is a fitting tribute to greats such as Artsplace, Cantab Hall, Western Hanover, Three Diamonds, Bettor's Wish, Manchego, Continentalvictory, Art Major, Father Patrick, Glidemaster, Mr Muscleman, Six Pack, Mr Feelgood, Life Sign, Perfect Sting, Artspeak, Real Desire, Artiscape, Western Ideal, Self Possessed, American Jewel, He's Watching, State Treasurer, Pastor Stephen and many, many more.

That Brittany also bred Twin B Joe Fresh, this year's probable Horse of the Year, is a sublime final chapter to the **story of the farm's closure.** That Brittany's land has been sold to Marvin Katz is the perfect epilogue. In the nearly four decades since Segal purchased Bill Shehan's Clermont Farm and Brittany was born in Versailles, KY in 1985, the farm has produced more millionaires (47) than years it's been in the game. It has nearly as many Breeders Crown trophies

Brittany Farms has bowed out of the breeding game, but the memories remain.

(31 from 23 different horses) to its credit, second most only to Hanover Shoe Farms.

That history all comes washing back as you walk on creaking wooden floors, count years that feel like minutes and marvel at the names on the silver and glass and bronze.

Yet, while one should never overlook even a single Hambletonian, Crown, Jug or Pace — and here there are multiples of most — one smallish, framed photo stood out among the riches.

It hangs just below a large burgundy and white Brittany flag and features the farm's three principals — Segal, Zubrod and Zubrod's wife, Leah Cheverie, who has been the office manager almost as long as there has been a Brittany. They are standing arm-in-arm under a farm sign at their shedrow at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion. Judging by the styles, fewer wrinkles and dark hair that is now gray, the photo was taken much closer to Brittany's beginnings than its end. The three beam with confidence, enthusiasm and hope for what might be. It was anything but certain then, but we know now that they made for a formidable trio at a formidable farm.

It's nice to think they will live on forever in the house of memories, frozen in time among the inspiring architecture as the architects of something magical.

OSS Super Final and Grassroots champ Crack Shot is one of a kind

On its own, the story of a rookie pacer who became the first horse in history to win both the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots championship and OSS Gold Super Final in the same season is nothing short of remarkable.

But it's the rigorous journey to reach undocumented heights that makes the tale of Crack Shot truly one of a kind.

Hopes have always been high for the 2-year-old bay colt, who was purchased for \$205,000 (USD) by veteran trainer/co-owner Gregg McNair at the 2023 Lexington Sale.

Alongside McNair, Crack Shot's ownership group consists of partners Dale Hunter (the coach of the OHL's London Knights), George Kerr, and Frank Brundle.

The latter owns and operates a successful family-built tire distribution business based out of Orangeville, ON, Tire Discounter Group.

Brundle is also a lifelong harness racing fan.

"I love racing," Brundle said. "It's a huge passion of mine. That was my first ever Grassroots trophy and it was the first Super Finals I've ever been in, and we won it.

"It was an amazing night."

Getting to that point, however, was anything but a smooth ride.

"We had him geared up to race in the Battle of Waterloo and the Metro Pace," Brundle said. "He raced in the Battle of Waterloo, but he was just off, he wasn't pacing right.

"Then we thought about taking him to the Metro, but something seemed off. So, we tried him in an overnight [race] about one month later, and he was still out of sorts."

Eager to find the root of Crack Shot's troubles, Brundle and Co. opted to have their promising freshman evaluated by a veterinarian in the United States.

The doctor identified a small pressure point that was bothering the youngster and administered a treatment to alleviate any discomfort.

Crack Shot responded well, and after a brief down period, was deemed ready for a return to action.

Competing in a qualifier at Lexington, the son of Bettors Delight—Beautyonthebeach looked like the horse that led gateto-wire to capture a pair of Grassroots legs in July.

"He qualified quite well," Brundle said. "The week after we brought him back up here to try him in another overnight.

"He went in :52 that night and we thought, 'Hey, we got something good here. Let's try the Grassroots."

With Crack Shot's health concerns in the rearview, Brundle's team knew their prized pacer was well-positioned leading into the Grassroots Championship.

"Going in, we believed we had one of the best horses in the race," Brundle said.

And right they were.

Crack Shot flew around Woodbine Mohawk Park's oval in 1:52.1 to claim the top spot over even-money favorite Sauble Wilson for his most impressive triumph to date – a distinction that would be usurped just two weeks later.

Thanks to a brand-new feature in the OSS program stipulating that a Grassroots Series champion could enter the Super Final if the division didn't fill with top point-earners from the Gold Series, the door was ajar for Crack Shot to forever stamp his place in OSS lore.

All the resilient racer needed was a stroke of luck.

"Chris Matthews, a good friend of mine phoned me up and said 'Frank, you're a lucky bugger," Brundle said, adding with a laugh, "I said, 'Of course,' jokingly.

"Then I asked what he meant, and he said we drew into the final. We got a decent post, but we didn't know what to expect. There were some good horses in there, but I knew we had a chance." Besides the inherent faith that any owner has in one of their own, Brundle's optimism was further bolstered by what he viewed as favorable circumstances going into the race.

"We came in fresh and ready to go, and a lot of the other horses I think we're just a little bit worn down," he said. "Also, the times in the Grassroots and Golds were only a couple seconds different, if at all.

"It wasn't like the Golds were going in :49 or :50 every week. They were going :52 or :53 like the Grassroots."

Once again, Brundle's intuition proved proper.

Crack Shot delivered a career-best mark of 1:51.3, rewriting the OSS history books along the way.

"It was an amazing night and really a dream come true to race in two Super Finals with the same horse in the same year and win both," Brundle said.

The owner out of East Garafraxa, ON, credited the McNairs and their team for having Crack Shot in peak condition for the Gold final.

As for what lies ahead for the rookie sensation, Crack Shot will be spending his winter like many other Canadians – in Florida.

"Gregg has a farm in Lake Okeechobee," Brundle said. "Crack Shot will go down there and hopefully be turned out for the rest of November and December, let him be a horse, run around, go a little bit, or kick and buck.

"Then he'll probably start training in mid-January, February and March. Then we can think about shipping him back up here for April."

Now fully embracing snowbird status, Crack Shot closes the book on a maiden campaign that saw him compile a 5-1-0 record through eight starts and some \$238,825 in purse earnings.

In a year characterized by luck, both good and bad, Crack Shot fought tirelessly to carve out a pristine position atop Ontario's sire stakes program.

No doubt encouraged by what he's seen, the high hopes that Brundle held for Hip #297 when he was first purchased have been raised even higher.

And why not?

"My goal is to win the Little Brown Jug with him," he said. "This guy is a small, stocky little horse. He went :51 across Mohawk and he looked really impressive. Getting him to win the Little Brown Jug would be a dream come true for me.

"My daughter Camille, who helps look after the horses, wants to win the North America Cup. I just hope Crack Shot comes back fully healthy and stays strong. I'm looking forward to him having a career next year."

Dave Landry on a Hall of Fame career in equine photography

He and his brother, jockey Rob Landry, form two of the most unique sibling duos inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

It is rare that the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame has enshrined siblings. There is Gilles and Mike Lachance,

Cliff and John Chapman, plus Hervé and Yves Filion (and now Yves' son Sylvain) on the standardbred side and John G. Sikura and Glenn Sikura on the thoroughbred side. But there are not a pair of Hall of Fame siblings quite like Rob and Dave Landry. They were enshrined for their work in entirely different areas of the business — Rob (in 2014) as a jockey and Dave, four years later, as a noted equine photographer covering both breeds.

Like his brother, Dave's initial roots were also in the thoroughbred sport, until Dave Briggs encouraged him to join the staff of the lamented standardbred journal *The Canadian Sportsman* not long after Briggs started working there in 1995.

But, let's talk about Dave Landry.

How and when did your career with horses and equine photography begin? Which was first the horses or the camera?

"Horse or the camera first? Simultaneously. My dad began taking me to the runners at Woodbine – I loved the excitement of the racing and watched Micheal Burns, Sr. photographing

at the finish line, and decided to get my first camera in attempts to emulate him. I'll never forget that first camera, a Minolta XGM that shot three-and-a-half frames per second. It seemed like the greatest thing to a 15-year-old kid. My father also took me to see harness racing at Greenwood Raceway, and although I enjoyed watching Ron Waples and Ron Feagan do their magic on the track, it never occurred to me to photograph them.

"I have always been proud of my brother's accomplishments. He was an exceptional jockey and preceded me into the Hall of Fame in 2014. He won numerous Grade 1 events including the Queen's Plate in 2004 with Niigon, the Alabama at Saratoga in 2009 with the Tapit filly Careless Jewel, as well as the Ricoh Mile in 1999 with Quiet Resolve at 44-1. As my brother's career progressed, it motivated me to improve and spend more time at the track, which was easy to do as I loved being around the stables, people, and most of all the horses."

When and how did photography become part of your being?

"In hanging around the stables and racetrack I decided I needed to improve my skills and shifted my focus towards getting a formal education that would arm me with some technical skills to accompany whatever artistic talent I might hold. My thinking was that if I was going to try and carve out a living from photography, I better be good at it.

"I graduated with a BA in photo technology from Ryerson University in 1988 and began doing corporate photography which paid very well. I then branched out to doing equine photography and won a few Sovereign Awards and things really picked up. I was lucky enough to have the world renowned Winfield's Farm take me under their wing to do some photography work, including conformation photos of their stallions. Looking back at it, I now realize that I was a work in progress for it was at least 25 years before I felt that I was any good at these conformation shots. It's one thing to do candid and action photography, but an entirely different beast when having to execute successful conformation photography. I have heard people say that harness racing's greatest photographer, George Smallsreed would sometimes say that when it came to conformation shots, 'I am a piss poor photographer.' There are numerous criteria when it comes to taking a great conformation shot. The number one requirement is patience, lots of it, by the photographer, the horse and perhaps just as important - if not most important – the person at the end of the shank. Properly reading the horse's body language and emitting calm body language yourself is also key."

Have you had any teachers? Who were they? Were there any tricks of the trade that you learned from them?

"I suppose my first teacher was Michael Burns, Sr. I learned from him mostly by watching — what he did and didn't do. It came to mind that he was a bit of a slave to the finish line and I strongly felt that many of the best images could be attained at other locations on track, as well as behind the scenes on the backstretch. The greatest conformation photographer, perhaps ever, was Tony Leonard. Tony was quite generous to me in numerous phone conversations in which he revealed some of his methods. Something I learned from Tony was to carry a tape recording with me when doing a conformation shoot. If a horse is acting lethargic, a good way to get its attention and its ears up is to play a recording of another horse nickering in the vicinity. Some horses are really smart and catch on to it being something unreal, so I found using recordings of other animals — even an elephant — would often get the job done. "Sometimes the problem is the opposite, especially with some thoroughbreds who can be on edge and high strung. With those types I've tried dropping a dab or two of vodka in their mouths, not straight vodka, because they don't like its taste, but I've had some success with the flavored kind which sometimes succeeds in taking the edge off and helps them relax."

When it comes to conformation photos, which ones are you most pleased about?

"Two that come to mind are trotters that now stand at Tara Hills Farm. I thought that Green Manalishi [S] was exceptional. I don't know whether it was that the stars were in perfect alignment the day we shot him or that he is just such a gorgeous horse. I suspect the latter. The other horse was Muscle Mass. I had been doing conformation shots of horses for over 25 years and he did what no other horse has done, either before or since. The handler took him out and he stood without the slightest movement in a perfect conformation stance – like a statue! Not only did he position himself that way, but he never moved in the slightest until I was done with him."

I suppose my all-time favorite [horse to photograph] would be Moni Maker. I was there when she went her world record time trial at Lexington with Julie Krone. That was a magical day. I was also there in her last start at the Hippodrome de Montreal where I took one of my best and favorite images of my career. It shows her groom leading her away with a fist bump in the air. Alongside her are Jimmy Takter and Wally Hennessey with their arms around each other.

You started with thoroughbreds, how did the transition to harness horses come about?

"It was when HRU editor Dave Briggs was in the same at *The Canadian Sportsman*. One day he called me and offered me some work in the standardbred world. I came to work with him. We've been together ever since, through the remaining years of *The Sportsman* and with *Harness Racing Update* since its beginning under Dave. Poor Dave had to psychologically manage me at times, but always knew when it was safe to turn me loose by granting me free reign on image decisions."

You mentioned to me that not only do you do photography for HRU, but that you are also involved in its production.

"I've been winding down on some of my photography work. I don't do nearly as much as I used to. Briggs asked me if I wanted to help with putting the magazine together and I said I'd give it a try. Why not? I've done it for a while now. It can be somewhat challenging because of the terrible hours, but I really enjoy the work. There have been days where I don't get to bed until 4 a.m. or even later."

Tell us about some of the favorite horses you have photographed?

"I suppose my all-time favorite would be Moni Maker. I was there when she went her world record time trial at Lexington with Julie Krone. That was a magical day. I was also there in her last start at the Hippodrome de Montreal where I took one of my best and favorite images of my career. It shows her groom leading her away with a fist bump in the air. Alongside her are Jimmy Takter and Wally Hennessey with their arms around each other. More recently I did a conformation shoot of the great Bulldog Hanover at Seelster Farms which is likely to be out soon."

How about horsemen? Which one impressed you the most?

"Without a doubt that would be Jimmy Takter. What he doesn't know about horses probably isn't worth knowing. In my opinion he is the greatest horse trainer and horseman I have ever encountered of either breed.

"I would give honorable mentions to both John Campbell and Sandy Hawley – both at the top of my list, especially when they were in their primes – but, also, as a bonus, they are both extremely nice individuals."

You were enshrined in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2018. Tell us about it.

"The Canadian Sportsman magazine is largely responsible for me being in the Hall of Fame. With few restraints they let me do my thing. I owe a lot to Dave Briggs and Gary Foerster. I won a good number of awards for my photography, including seven Sovereign awards and an Eclipse, yet my induction into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame is the greatest honor I have ever received. I'm especially grateful that both of our parents were there to see both Rob and I receive this great honor. In reflection I am also very pleased with the speech I made that evening. Thank you so much harness racing."







Ervin Hanover is a lateseason star

Dave Menary was on the road to Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday (Nov. 22) when he had a few moments to talk about his stable's emerging star, Ervin Hanover (p, 4, 1:47.3s; \$448,967). The 4-year-old stallion son of Captaintreacherous-Eloquent Grace has 15 wins from 57 starts to date. The last three victories have been at Mohawk for trainer Menary and driver Louis-Philippe Roy, taking the WMP preferred pace in breathtaking style Nov. 9 and 16. The latter win is Canada's fastest mile by an older pacing horse this year and Ervin Hanover's new lifetime mark.

Owned by Pollack Racing LLC of Venetia, PA, Ervin Hanover had raced at Mohawk earlier in his career, when he was trained by Ron Burke and owned by Burke Racing Stable of Fredericktown, PA. The former \$115,000 Harrisburg yearling won his first two qualifiers at age 2, then broke his maiden in his first lifetime start, a 1:53.1f Pennsylvania Sire Stake win at The Meadows. Second to Confederate in their 2022 Breeders Crown elimination

that Oct. 21 at Mohawk, Ervin Hanover drew post 10 for the Oct. 28 final, in which he finished fifth for driver Joe Bongiorno. He was the longest shot on the board, sent off at odds of 76-1.

On June 10, 2023, Ervin Hanover returned to Campbellville, ON for the North America Cup eliminations. Despite leading much of the mile for driver Yannick Gingras, the colt was overtaken late and ended up fifth behind winner Christchurch, so he did not make the final. The Burke trainee did win five of 21 starts at 3, including a May 28 Pennsylvania Sire Stake division at Harrah's Philadelphia and the Pegasus Stake for 3-year-old male pacers on Oct. 28 at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

This year, Ervin Hanover changed ownership and debuted for trainer Jeff Cullipher, finishing second in a March 16 gualifier at The Meadowlands. His first 2024 win was an April 2 Yonkers overnight race with Todd McCarthy in the sulky. The narrow 1:53.4 victory on the sloppy track gave little indication of what was to come when the horse returned to Ontario this spring.

Menary, who is based at Classy Lane Stables Training Center in Puslinch, ON, said Ervin Hanover made an immediate impression.

"The first time I sat behind him, I let the hopples out," he told HRU on Friday (Nov. 22). "He's got a real presence about him. He's a cocky stud, an absolute specimen, but not a mean horse.

"Tom Pollack and Jeff Cullipher did a great job with him in New Jersey. He was well taken care of. We do our best work as a team."

Ervin Hanover drew post 7 in his May 15 Charles Juravinski Memorial elimination at Flamboro Downs. It was his first race for driver Louis-Philippe Roy. Sprinting to the early lead in :25.4 – "Flamboro's fastest quarter ever," said Menary – the stallion opened up on the front end through a :54 half, fighting the first-over All Class to three-quarters in 1:22 and finishing second to him in the 1:50.3 mile. It remains Canada's fastest 2024 win by a stallion on a half-mile oval.

"In the final, he drew the 8-hole," Menary said. "I still think he had the chance to swoop them."

Ervin Hanover and driver Tyler Borth followed the cover of No Control along the backstretch and went three-wide approaching three-quarters, reaching the sulky wheel of frontend winner Huntinthelastdolar on the final turn. Although Ervin Hanover lost ground by the top of the stretch, finishing sixth, he never saw the proverbial rail in the gutsy effort.

After a fifth-place finish to Huntinthelastdolar at Mohawk on June 1, in the opening leg of the 2024 Graduate Series, Ervin Hanover went back to the United States.

"He went home to race in some other Graduate legs at The Meadowlands," said Menary, admitting that he hoped to have the stallion back at Classy Lane again soon. "Every time I talked to them [Pollack and Cullipher], I said, 'What about Ervin Hanover?' He's as pretty a horse as you'll see, from a very desirable family."

Ervin Hanover, bred by Hanover Shoe Farms of PA, is the second foal of Eloquent Grace (p, 3, 1:51.4f; \$100,200). She also produced his full siblings Energetic Hanover (p, 4, 1:49.3s; \$438,421) and Caviart Belle (p, 3, 1:49m; \$687,750), who sold for \$325,000 and \$375,000 respectively as yearlings. Caviart Belle was originally named Eunoia Hanover.

Although Ervin Hanover had a pair of non-stake wins at Pocono on Aug. 18 and Sept. 7, he was back with Menary by mid-October.

"It was the second time I've had him this year," said the trainer. "To be honest, I was lucky to have him for three starts in the spring, when they sent him up for the Juravinski."

Returning to the seven-eighths-mile training track at Classy Lane, Ervin Hanover showed his potential to rapidly climb the Mohawk class ladder, regardless of lacking Grand Circuit wins at age 4.

"The 4-year-old year is tough for a lot of horses," said Menary, whose stable has been based at Classy Lane for about six years because of the ability to send top horses like Ervin Hanover through their paces on site. "I think it's the nicest place in North America, and we have the second-best track in Canada after Mohawk."

On Oct. 19 at Mohawk, Ervin Hanover advanced early from post 8, opening up past the :26.3 opening quarter in what announcer Ken Middleton called "a serious-looking front-end mission" for driver Doug McNair. Hitting three-quarters in 1:20.3, he was reeled in by P L Ozzy and late-charging American History down the stretch, still finishing third, individually-timed in 1:49.2.

"I think that mile kind of blew the carbon out of him," said Menary. "The first start that I had him back, when Dougie drove him, [McNair] came back and apologized... He said he didn't mean to go those fractions."

Ervin Hanover was no worse for the wear, making his WMP preferred handicap debut Oct. 26 with Phil Hudon in the bike. Getting away eighth from the rail, he gained ground thirdover from the back of the field approaching three-quarters, swinging widest of all at the top of the stretch. He closed for fifth behind winner Saulsbrook Victor.

Reunited with Louis-Philippe Roy on a Nov. 2 class drop, Ervin Hanover sat fifth as Sometime Somewhere and American History battled to the :54 half. He got rolling first-over at that point, squaring off head-to-head against American History to three-quarters in 1:21.2, then drawing away by over six lengths to stop the teletimer in 1:47.4.

"I think he kind of bonded with Louis," Menary said.

Two races later, Ervin Hanover and Roy followed Taurasi and Saulsbrook Victor from third to the :54.3 half before unleashing another devastating late kick. Winning by six open lengths again, this time a fifth of a second faster than his previous best, the stallion's third consecutive win took little out of him. ••• The first time I sat behind [Ervin Hanover], I let the hopples out. "He was just ears up all the way through the stretch," Menary said. "Louis said he was just so happy and willing. When he went to the test barn, he was playing around and barely blowing."

Saturday night (Nov. 23), Ervin Hanover was absent from the Mohawk top class. Menary told HRU there was nothing amiss.

"I planned on giving him this week off," he said. "It seems like he and Louis really get along, and Louis isn't driving Saturday night. We hope to be back eight days from now. We'll have to talk about it, but I think we'd like to race him a few more times this year [at Mohawk] and then give him a break, probably at dad's place."

Menary's father, Larry, has looked after well-known trainees like the now-retired 2017 O'Brien Older Pacing Horse of the Year Sintra (p, 4, 1:47.2m; \$1,370,839) and recent WMP filly and mare preferred winner Dabarndawgswatchin (p, 5, 1:49.0s; \$548,756) on his rural Ontario farm.

With his star ascending late in his 4-year-old season, Menary said Ervin Hanover is expected to race again at age 5, likely returning to Grand Circuit competition. He wasn't sure about whether top 3-year-old filly pacer Its A Love Thing (p, 3, 1:48.2s; \$1,044,535) would be returning to race again in 2025.

"I'd say it's 50-50," he said. "It's hard to say. They have to make the decision, and they are in the breeding business."

The 2024 Fan Hanover, Jerry Silverman Memorial, and multiple Ontario Sires Stakes Gold winner is owned by Eric Good of Davidsonville, MD, Thomas Biederman of Lexington, KY, Joshua Green of Midway, KY, and Rich Lombardo Racing Llc of Solon, OH.

With year-end awards on the horizon, 45-year-old Menary said he's just hopeful for his stable to be short-listed.

"Whatever [category] it is, the more, the merrier," he said.

He won the 2023 O'Brien Award for 2-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year with Pass Line, while also training divisional runner-up Its A Love Thing, and brought home the 2013 Dan Patch Award for 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year with New York-based He's Watching.

"But I always hope that the best horse in the barn is one of the babies," he added with a chuckle.

Right now, the Cambridge, ON horseman said he is just happy to have the horse to beat in next Saturday night's WMP preferred (Nov. 30). Ervin Hanover has made a late-season statement, leaving Menary in awe.

"Just the way he's done it," he said, "and the horse couldn't be sounder or fresher."





Did a record score trigger the deadly Roosevelt Raceway riot?

In 1963, two days after a Connecticut bartender cashed a record ticket of nearly \$80,000 at Roosevelt, a riot broke out at the Long Island track. Were the two events connected?

As our fall days turn darker, we take a look back at one of the darkest days in harness racing history — the 1963 riot at Roosevelt Raceway that would cause more than \$100,000 in damages, result in 15 arrests and the death of Roosevelt's chief of security.

The riot could have easily had its start on Wednesday (Nov. 6), thanks to a record "twin double" ticket.

The twin double, or a double daily double, would require punters to select the winners of Roosevelt's sixth and seventh races. Those successful after the first two legs would then exchange their ticket for a try at the eighth and ninth races.

Gusty winds (up to 40 miles per hour) and torrential rains made handicapping difficult that evening.

But a 39-year-old bartender from Waterbury, CT by the name of Joseph Mariano turned a \$20 bill into a standardbred and thoroughbred record \$79,660.30 on a \$2 wager.

Adjusted for today's value, that winning ticket would be worth more than \$800,000.

The previous record was a twin double at Suffolk Downs for \$68,228.80. The harness record was \$37,116.10 set just three months earlier on Aug. 18, 1963 at Monticello Raceway.

That night at Roosevelt, Mariano purchased 10 "2-6" tickets and thanks to victories by Miracle Henry (\$4.90 to win) and Sea Missile (\$32.80) – both driven by Gene MacDonald – he found himself at the exchange window.

With 10 tickets at his disposal, Mariano keyed #5 Dixie Melody in the eighth race and selected "All" for the payoff leg.

Lee Benson, who would go on to train the 1975 Little Brown Jug champion Seatrain, steered Dixie Melody (\$6.90) to a convincing win in 2:09 that evening over the half-mile Long Island oval.

With the Dixie Melody win, Mariano was guaranteed a winning ticket. How much it would pay was the only question. The winner of the final leg, a Grade C pace for 5-year-olds and up for \$2,000, would determine the final amount.

There were 247 tickets in contention,#1 Spindletop's Best (\$1.85-1) would return \$758.60. The 30-1 longshot, Lieut Byrd would bring home nearly \$80,000. Lieut Byrd, a 6-year-old gelding, was winless in his last 21 races and left from the outside post 8.

Carlton (Stanley Dancer) led the field of eight past the opening quarter in :30.3. Miss Delightful (B. W. Morris) grabbed the lead before the half-mile station in 1:02.2. Thirty-five-year-old Canadian pilot, Joe McAlduff, put Lieut Byrd into play, sitting sixth with cover at the half. Lieut Byrd went three-wide and stuck a nose in front at the three-quarters in 1:35.3. Holding off the late charge of Just Wait (Del Insko), Lieut Byrd was a half-length clear in 2:08.1.

Harness Racing Update

The tote board showed \$61.60 - \$28.70 - \$12.90, but the most important number was the twin double payout of \$79,660.30 for the single winning ticket.

Mariano was a Wednesday night regular at the Westbury, NY plant. He would routinely make the nearly two-hour trip to Roosevelt Raceway. He hit the twin double for \$575 earlier in the meet.

So how does a record setting ticket cause a riot just 46 hours later?

The publicity of instant windfall reignited the dreams of the tri-state residents. More than 16,000 went to the races on Thursday night and 23,127 would watch Friday's Dexter Cup card.

The Friday card would start off kind of formful and slow – a 15.90 win ticket and a 2:06.1 mile highlighted the early card.

The fifth race was the \$80,376.61 Dexter Cup won by Speedy Scot (Ralph Baldwin) in 2:11.2 over the mile and a sixteenth.

The sixth race was the first of the evening's twin double where a total of 85,574 tickets were sold.

As the field of eight approached the threequarter mile pole, Waygone (Robert Frame) was leading when the pocket-sitting Lynch Hanover (Joe MacDonald) tried to pass and stepped on the wheel of Waygone, causing a chain reaction incident. Canny Maid (Hugh Bell), Helen Boss (Joseph McAlduff), Dick's Brother and Amber Dream were also involved and did not finish.

Knight Deposit (George Sholty) and Delaway (Marcel Dostie) were the only finishers.

Knight Deposit was declared the winner of the \$2,600 pace, paying \$35 and making just 3,563 twin double tickets alive.

Not satisfied with the judge's decision and demanding a "No Contest," many fans showed their displeasure with booing, throwing programs and eventually flooding out onto the track.

Hundreds of patrons smashed the tote board, set fires, broke windows, engaged in "hand-to-hand" combat with the police and attacked the judge's booth, injuring judge John DeMatteo.

At least 15 patrons and five police officers were injured and the raceway's chief of

security, Conrad H. "Connie" Rothengast died of a heart attack at the onset of the riot.

Rothengast, 65, was a three-decade New York Police Department veteran, and retired from the NYPD as a Chief Inspector in 1953. He joined the force in 1921 and received numerous citations for outstanding work, including driving notorious gangster Arthur "Dutch Schultz" Flegenheimer from the city.

Nearly 150 police officers were called to the track. Service revolvers and tear gas guns were drawn, but no shots were fired.

Twelve ambulances were sent and the Westbury Fire Department was called in and used their hoses to keep the rioters back while they extinguished the numerous fires.

The riot was declared "under control" at 11:55 p.m., about an hour and 15 minutes after it began.

The final three races were cancelled and the \$145,745 net pool in the Twin Double was distributed as a consolation payout of \$40.80.

The Nassau County police confiscated movies taken during the riots. Fifteen patrons were arrested, charged with everything from unlawful assembly to felonious assault.


The riots did little to affect attendance and wagering at Roosevelt Raceway. The following night, 31,398 patrons and plain clothed policemen attended the nine-race card, wagering \$2.2 million.

In 1964, the largest twin double was hit for \$172,726.80 at Roosevelt Raceway.

The ultra-large jackpot twin double wager would eventually lead to counterfeit tickets and tax evasion schemes. The wager was eventually banned at New York and Pennsylvania harness tracks and was eventually replaced with a Pick 4.

Roosevelt Raceway closed in July 1988 after 48 years of racing.

'Jiggy,' 'Joe,' and 'Jackie' all ladies of distinction

Jiggy Jog S, Twin B Joe Fresh, and Jackie Ingrassia are ladies of distinction and all on stage – front and center – in 2024.

First, let's take a look at the very first female 1-2 finish in Horse of the Year balloting, something we could very well be looking at again in 2024.

In 1958, the 81 voters coast-to-coast couldn't separate 3YOFT Emilys Pride and 4YOMP Belle Acton who received 28 first place votes each. But the total vote count did (10-5-3-2-1) with Emilys Pride getting the top tally of 438-407. Flave Nipe drove the fastest ever sophomore trotting filly, Emilys Pride, in 1:58, for trainer Fred Egan as she also captured both the Hambletonian and the Kentucky Futurity. Billy Haughton came oh-so-close to his first ever HOY trophy with Belle Acton but he'd have to wait 19 more years for Green Speed in 1977. Haughton's 4YO mare pacer would retire as the richest ever pacer the following year. Others receiving first place votes in this ladies only first ever 1-2 finish were Shadow Wave with 19 and 370 total votes; the ill-fated 2YOFT Merrie Annabelle fourth with one first-place vote and 129 points giving the female set three of the top four spots. Emilys Pride was owned by both Castleton and Walnut Hall Farms.

FAN OF FAN

In 1981 the first female pacer was named HOY: Fan Hanover. What a year! Fan Hanover gave her sire Albatross his third-straight HOY credit having won it back-to-back with Niatross in 1979-80. It was a wide-open year to say the least with a record 23 getting at least one vote for the top honor (Twenty-five got a vote for 3YOCT, also a record).

Owned by Dr. Glen Brown, Fan Hanover went 17-for-23 and banked \$497,717, an all-time best for sophomore filly pacers. Not bad at all for a \$20,000 yearling. None of the 248 ballots returned had the very same divisional winners! "Fan" got 135 of the 248 first place votes, with her Jug victory playing a huge role. She remains today as the only female to win the Jug (1981) and is the last female pacer to win any Pacing Triple Crown event. Glen Garnsey was her trainer/driver. Her caretaker Odell Short also had the 1978 HOY Abercrombie.

Forty-three years later, Twin B Joe Fresh hopes to duplicate this year end honor, a year older than Fan Hanover.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY LADY J

Nov. 13 this year marked the 45th anniversary of the U.S. citizenship for one Jacqueline Ingrassia in 1979 in Freehold, NJ. She had been something of a fixture at Freehold for seven to eight years prior after coming over from England to start the 1970s. The former Jacqueline Coard married Frank Ingrassia and they are still going strong today. Jackie was the first female driver to win a race sub 1:55 with Followme Holly on July 25, 1986 at The Meadowlands in 1:54.4 and she was the fourth-place finisher in the \$907,000 Woodrow Wilson with Southern Raider in 1989. No female driver on these shores has ever competed for as much in one race or cashed in one. Her 2000 Yonkers Trot win with Goalfish, still stands as the lone female driver Triple Crown race win.

When asked if she remembers the 1979 date when she officially became a citizen, she said, "When I went to the courthouse in Freehold to receive my citizenship, the judge beckoned me up to his desk. There were many people there that day and he's calling on me. 'Oh boy, what have I done now?' That was my immediate thought. So, when he leaned towards me and said, 'Got a winner?' I was relieved. Turns out he was a big fan of Freehold Raceway."

MORE BACK-TO-BACK

Speaking of outstanding ladies back-to-back or 1-2, the 1973 Liberty Bell yearling sale sold Hip #32 Meadow Blue Chip and Hip #33 Silk Stockings. Meadow Blue Chip, four years later, became the first sub 1:55 winner in Meadowlands history (1:54.3 in July 1977) and just two years later Silk Stockings took on the boys and romped in the sports richest race, the first edition of the OTB Classic. In 1975 she almost got a six-year jump on Fan Hanover as the first female pacing HOY just narrowly losing to Savoir 52-49.

Gear up folks as Twin B Joe Fresh and Jiggy Jog S will try and add their names to this legendary list of ladies.





Jackpot for Bot in Uppfödningslöpning

Dutch trainer Erwin Bot had a successful day at Jägersro on Saturday (Nov. 23), when the biggest race for 2-year-olds in Sweden was held. The \$240,000 Uppfödningslöpning, over 1,640 meters, included a fresh Swedish record-holder in Per Nordström's Eyeofthetiger, but the big favorite didn't like the sloppy winter track in Malmö and Eyeofthetiger went off-stride in the first turn.

Bot trained Eol, driven by Robin Bot opened quickly for the lead and Robin tried to shake his opponents off in the last turn. Robin really stepped on the pedal and Eol got several lengths advantage as the field turned for home.

What Robin knew was that stablemate **Pele Boko** (Readly Express) sat in the position behind him, but when Eol flew away for that big lead, Pele Boko had problems with his gait and driver Örjan Kihlström really had to show a big register from his bank of skills, helping Pele Boko continuing trotting.

And when Kihlström untied the knot behind his horse, Pele Boko started the attack, chasing his stable mate Eol, who looked to be the winner of the event.

Pele Boko succeeded in his attempt and Eol was disarmed just before the wire in a mile rate of 1:58.3 and Erwin could enjoy his afternoon in Malmö since Eol held on for the silver.

HOHNECK SON BEST IN PARIS

Philippe Allaire's Hohneck, still racing with success, has his first crop of progeny at the tracks this fall and in Saturday's (Nov. 23) \$65,000 Prix Timoko for 2-year-olds, Hohneck's son **Monzon Normand**, trained by Allaire of course, was victorious for driver Yoann Lebourgeois.

This was Monzon Normand's fourth win in six starts and Hohneck's future in the breeding business seems bright.


The 2-year-old fillies battled in the \$65,000 Prix Vourasie and the big favorite **Marion d'Atout** (Ready Cash) outshined her opponents after a very slow-paced race, where Marion d'Atout controlled on the front for driver David Thomain.

Antidotes to loneliness: a sport, two books, and a movie

My pal, Layne Henderson, placed his coffee cup on the blue-tiled tabletop at the Deja Brew Coffee and Egg Emporium and stroked his long salt-and-pepper beard. He pointed his long index finger at me across the table and said, "We're freaks."

"All the cool people are freaks. Are you referring to yourself as a wealthy oddball or me being a harness racing fan?"

He smiled and said, "This, sitting here, men, face-to-face, talking about more than the weather. It's not normal."

"Normal is boring. It's better to be unique. What's this about?"

A book, *We Need to Hang Out*, by a writer named Billy Baker. Have you read it?"

"Not if it was published after 1989 and contains long words."

"I call BS. You read more than race programs and yearling catalogs."

I leaned forward and whispered, "Keep that to yourself. Real men don't discuss books."

"Men don't discuss much. That is the premise of two books and a recently released movie. Baker is a middle-aged writer from the *Boston Globe* who set out to write an article that riffs about the modern loneliness epidemic. Along the way, he realizes that he is lonely in many ways. So, he looks for misplaced friends and goes on crazy quests to revive old friendships and make new ones."

"Scraping up old friends sounds sort of pathetic," I said.

Layne sipped his coffee and continued, "Baker uses data to confirm the topic is no joke. Almost 50 million Americans over the age of 45, especially men, suffer from chronic loneliness, and loneliness contributes to a person's risk for premature death. Covid made the loneliness epidemic worse. Close friendships easily lapsed into distant memories."

I digested this and said, "I keep up with a few high school pals, but most of my friends are from harness horse racing." He nodded, "A large majority of participants in horse racing are relics. In many ways, they are lucky to have the racing community for socialization. Social science shows that fewer of us join civic

or community organizations like the Kiwanis or the Elks or attend church regularly. About 15 years ago, sociologist Robert Putnam opened the door on this topic in a book titled *Bowling Alone*.

"Another book, c'mon man."

The Brain said, "Well, if you don't want a book, go to Netflix and search for a new movie, *Join or Die*."

"A bit of an extreme title."

"It's a film about why we should join small groups or clubs. It was just released. The guy who made the movie was a former student of Professor Putnam. The concept has a lot of data behind it, and loneliness is a real problem."

I took a bite of my donut and said, "Horse racing is from an era where face-to-face was more likely. The sport's pulse beats on with old timers who found the sport and hung on for dear life. Their friendships and the twists and turns in the game keep them alive. People in harness racing are as tough as old boots. The people who work or play in horse racing never seem to have time to be sick, and the old gamblers face new challenges with every racing program."

Layne took a beat to consider this. He said, "I don't think that handicappers fit this discussion about connecting with people. Gamblers seem to self-isolate purposefully."

"What about women? Where do they fit?"

"That was an interesting chapter in the Baker book - Mars versus Venus. Male friendships are fundamentally different than



female friendships. Women gossip and talk face-to-face. Men talk shoulder-to-shoulder."

I nodded, "Every time I take a woman to the racetrack, she wants to chat and wander around the premises, which is annoying. What about social media? Doesn't that connect us?"

"Social media connects us but not at a deep level. In the long run, how harness racing adapts to socializing in a new world will be interesting but does offer possibilities. The new world will offer fewer and fewer places where people can communicate face-toface, let alone shoulder-to-shoulder. They will be nose-to-screen. Laptops and phones will further isolate us in some ways."

"So, give me some good news."

Layne was ready, "Technology may have crushed local social communities, but technology has spawned passionate microcommunities. Your little sport needs to be among those. The battle to create these new virtual communities may seem impossible. Still, common sense and geography indicate that growing new participants sitting in grandstands to watch a glacially slow sport is not the answer."

I blew him a raspberry, "People in horse racing have been banging that social media technology drum since I got involved. Crickets. Twenty years later, we have handfuls joining the harness racing choir. We need multitudes of new singers."

He shook his finger across the table, "The past is past. Today, digital fires get sparked every day. Technology is much more immersive than years ago. I'd recommend you keep chipping away at finding new players in micro-communities. Plenty of conversations and interactions are available for a grassroots sport with horses, characters, training, pedigrees, and gambling."

"Like what, like how?"

He drained his coffee and shrugged, "I don't know, maybe an ownership partnership group on a yearling or gamblers debating the best value wagers could offer plenty of communication topics. Fanatics could dive into breeding data analysis over the past 20 years. Taking up a cause creates face-to-face interaction. Maybe start a community advocating something weird, freelegged pacers receiving bonus money from the purse, or a group of owners of a 2-year-old analyzing all the state horses they will race against, just find a little corner of interest that others can gather around and start talking."

"Huh? Men talking, books to read, new movies, microcommunities, weird stuff."

Layne slipped \$10 under the sugar shaker, saying, "Your sport should be grateful. Horses and horse racing are tremendous subjects of conversation and bonding agents."

I stood and nodded, then said, "Nice chat. Same time next week?"

"Sure thing, I'll be here. Talking is good therapy."

Primo Maschio records new mark in DSBF final

by Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund

After being narrowly upended in both preliminary rounds, Forrest Bartlett's **Primo Maschio** proved much too strong for his seven rivals in the \$110,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund (DSBF) championship for 2-year-old male pacers, throwing down a career-best 1:53.4 mile on Thursday (Nov. 21) at Bally's Dover.

In line to Trae Porter, Primo Maschio asserted himself from the pole position at race's outset and forced Shore Not Beach (driven by Pat Berry) into the pocket through a :27.3 first quarter. Once in control, Primo Maschio continued unopposed through a :56.1 half before accelerating up the backstretch to extend his lead to 2½ lengths past three-quarters in 1:24. That burst of speed from Primo Maschio was enough to do

away with his competition, as the Badlands Hanover— Primadonna gelding soundly defeated Shore Not Beach by four lengths. Won Last Call (Montrell Teague) gave futile chase to the top pair throughout and finished third, 15¾ lengths in arrears.

Walter Callahan trains Primo Maschio, who was bred by Let It Ride Stables and Bottom Line Racing and has won nine of 11 career starts and banked \$174,170. He paid \$4 to win as the even-money favorite.

The \$110,000 DSBF championship for 2-year-old fillies, named in memory of longtime Delaware harness racing publicist Marv Bachrad, will go as the fourth of 15 races on the Monday (Nov. 25) program at Bally's Dover. First post is 4:30 p.m. (EDT).

Nijinsky, who paid \$25,000 to supplement to Progress Pace, was parked the entire mile as was It's Saturday Night. Captain Albano was fierce and would not give up the lead passing the half in 54 seconds, a :27 flat throw down.

Captain Albano steamrolled to three quarters in 1:22, a :28 flat quarter.

Nijinsky and It's Saturday Night began to get leg weary, approaching the three-quarter pole.

Mirage Hanover, Captain Luke and Nuclear circled three wide from the back of the pack in pursuit of Captain Albano. In the lane, Better Is Nice and Calicojack Hanover skimmed along the pylons but their attempts were in vain.

The even-money betting favorite, Captain Albano (Captaintreacherous) won by a half-length in 1:48.4. He paid an even \$4 for the win. Noel Dailey trained and Todd McCarthy drove. Better Is Nice finished second and Calicojack Hanover was third.

'Warrior' on comeback trail, wins at Big M

Recently, times have been tough for **Warrior One**, a veteran whose lifetime earnings are nearing \$800,000, but the Ron Burke trainee got back into the winner's circle for the first time since June 20 on Friday night (Nov. 22) in the \$11,000 conditioned trotting feature at The Meadowlands, and looked impressive doing it to snap a seven-race losing streak.

"The way he's been racing he should have been in non-winners of \$1,000," said a sarcastic winning owner/driver Yannick Gingras in the back paddock after the victory at the non-winners of \$5,000 level. "But he has great class. He hasn't been racing to his level [of late] but tonight he was really good."

Warrior One sat a pocket to the quarter, where Love This Bar had the top in :28.4. Starlit Rambo then made his way to the point at the half, leading at that call in :57.3 as Warrior One vacated the rail from the 3-hole at the five-eighths to go after the leader. He turned a one-length deficit at three-quarters (Starlit Rambo was there in 1:27.2) into a two-length edge at the top of the lane before going on to an easy three-length score in 1:56.4. A pair of 38-1 longshots, Love This Bar and Altus Hanover, finished second and third, respectively.

"[In this class] it's supposed to be easy for him and I think it was a step in the right direction," said Gingras.

Little Expensive, the 4-5 favorite, was never involved on the way to a lackluster fifth-place finish.

An 8-year-old gelded son of Father Patrick—Yoga, Warrior One scored for the 39th time from 158 lifetime starts. He returned \$7 to his backers as the 5-2 second choice.

A LITTLE MORE: JM Betonsix snuck up the rail to nail stakescaliber 3-year-old filly – and 3-5 favorite – Canigetalouploup by a nose in 1:54.1 as the 6-1 fourth choice in the pacing feature, an \$18,000 conditioned event for fillies and mares. The 6-year-old daughter of Betting Line – Six Of Hearts was driven by Braxten Boyd and trained by Blake MacIntosh... All-source handle on the 14-race card totaled \$2,126,456.

Steve Jones to receive Leadership Award at NY Banquet

Renowned third generation standardbred breeder and farm owner Steve Jones will be the recipient of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA) Monticello-Goshen Chapter's John Manzi Leadership Award at their annual awards banquet in Campbell Hall, NY.

Recognized for his influential work with a multitude of organizations, recently Jones was instrumental in his role as trustee of the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Fund in securing a record purse structure for the New York Sire Stakes program for 2025. In addition, the 'Ag Fund' also announced \$1.75 million in breeders awards along with a set of new 2-year-old races with a million-dollar total purse structure.

Jones said, "We have worked very hard to make the program as good as possible for everyone. It's important to develop a racing schedule so that all the program participants can be rewarded appropriately."

While his roots are now firmly entrenched in Orange County, NY, where the family owns and operates Cameo Hills Farm on over 400 acres, Jones was born in Bucyrus, OH, while his father (Hall of Famer Hal Jones) and grandfather (Walter) both worked at Pickwick Farms.

Steve recalled his first job in the industry when he was living at Hanover Shoe Farms.

"I worked on the weekends, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., answering the phone in the office on Saturday and sometimes Sunday," he said. "I worked 18 hours a week and made \$2.30 per hour. This gave me a weekly take home pay of \$38.98 a week. And I was thrilled to get it."

At other times he also lived on Blue Chip Farms and Lana Lobell Farm of NJ where his father was the farm manager. Steve graduated from Delaware Valley College in Doylestown, Pennsylvania in 1982, which was the same year that the family purchased the land that is now Cameo Hills Farm.

"I would say my father let me deal with the clients from the day we started the farm, because he didn't want to deal with them," Steve said. "So, I was talking to clients about their mares and dealing with their wants and needs at the sale from the very beginning. I was also very involved in the mares and stallion shares that we purchased. I was fortunate to be able to rely on my dad's knowledge for many years."

The list of champion racehorses bred by Steve reads like a who's who in the chronicles of the standardbred sport, including: King Of The North, Max Contract, Instagram Model and Check Me Out. Over the years the Jones family have also bred Deweycheatumnhowe, Well Said, Goalie Jeff, and many more. In fact, Steve has been a top 10 North American breeder for money earnings in two of the last three years, and routinely ranks among the top 20 against nurseries with far more foals per year.

Focusing on quality over quantity, Steve can still be seen at the sales purchasing quality breeding stock to add to their impressive broodmare band. He is often accompanied by his sons Tyler and Jake, who are fourth generation horsemen and assist in the daily operation of the farm.

Steve met his wife of 32 years, Kathy, while he was in college and she also helps run the family business. A sampling of the stellar group of mares that call Cameo Hills Farm home are: Bella Bellini, Check Me Out, Venerable, You Ato Dream, Hey Blondie, Brickhouse Babe, Mazzarati, Delilah Hanover, Blonde Bombshell, Violet Stride, Check Out Trixie and Born On Third Base. Many of the yearlings from these prized mares blew up the bid board at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale this season, where Cameo Hills was the third leading consignor by average (\$112,469 for 32 sold) for a gross of \$3.59 million (ranked fifth overall).

In addition to his role at the Ag Fund, Steve is also the president of Goshen Historic Track, a trustee of the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame, a director of the Hambletonian Society and vice president of the Grand Circuit.

In his usual tongue in cheek style, Jones quipped, "All jobs pay the same."

When the Monticello-Goshen USHWA chapter holds their 65th annual awards banquet, presented by the New York Sire Stakes, on Sunday (Dec. 8, 2024), Steve will receive the chapter's second highest honor, their John Manzi Leadership Award.

Bob is absolutely correct and I think it exposes racing's lack of transparency. [It has] never been forward thinking when it comes to the betting public. Over the years, I have had many trotters and you knew when your horse was racing well and when you removed the shoes there was a marked improvement in performance. Now, back then, purses were small so many small timers had to cash a bet to keep things going so this is not anything new, it's been going on forever. If it was improving trotters back then you can see how important it would be with the high-priced trotters or blueblood trotters that are racing today. From a betting standpoint, with all things being equal, shoes off trotters are some of the best overlay bets in racing.
