Hoosier Park's Thanksgiving night card no turkey

Though handle wasn't astronomical – and it was a big ask of everyone to race on a holiday – Harrah's Hoosier Park deserves kudos for being bold enough to try racing on Thanksgiving.

For the first time in the history of Harrah's Hoosier Park — and at the same time bucking general harness racing tradition — an evening Thanksgiving Day card of live racing was held on Thursday (Nov. 25).

Live racing on Thanksgiving night was an area that drew much attention when the 2021 Hoosier Park racing dates were approved last December. The signature events adding power to the card were four stakes races across the 3-year-old divisions known as the Thanksgiving Classic.

The decision to race on Thanksgiving was likely to replicate a formula that's worked so well the past couple of years for some of the smaller-handling tracks. Race when the others aren't. Being the sole track in the U.S. to race on Thursday with competition coming predominantly from only Woodbine Mohawk Park in Canada, how did the Thanksgiving Classic night go?

Strictly by the numbers, handle over the 14-race card was \$682,345. While not an overly enthusiastic number on the surface, it's more than Hoosier Park does typically. For instance, the Friday card from a week ago on Nov. 20 handled just \$479,878 and the Saturday card that next night handled \$393,184. Interestingly enough, the Thanksgiving Eve card from Wednesday where there was widespread competition handled \$635,454 and that came over just 13 races.

Aside for a moment as to how handle is viewed, there were

Grand Circuit horses throughout the Thanksgiving Classic stakes races that helped to add power to the card. The biggest star of all was **Bulldog Hanover** in the Thanksgiving Classic for 3-year-old pacers, who delivered as the heavy favorite in the full 10-horse field for a purse of \$60,000. The Thanksgiving Classic was the fourth straight stakes win at Hoosier Park for Bulldog Hanover, though he's better known for his success this year in Canada when he won a North America Cup elimination and was made the favorite next out in the North America Cup final.

Another notable winner on the card was **Kobe's Gigi** who won the \$40,000 Thanksgiving Classic for 3-year-old filly pacers. After winning two straight Indiana sire stake races in September and October, she went a huge mile to be second in the \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final as well as the Pegasus to the Grand Circuit winning Hot Mess Express. In the \$47,000 Thanksgiving Classic for 3-year-old filly trotters, **Dewtiful's Grace** delivered in a 15-1 upset for the hometown as the daughter of Indiana sire Pine Credit beat big favorite and Grand Circuit winning Pub Crawl. **Swingforthefences**, another Indiana-bred and multiple Grand Circuit winner, dominated in the \$54,000 Thanksgiving Classic for 3-year-old trotters, and the \$500,000-plus earner this season came to Hoosier on Thursday on the heels of winning the Matron at Dover two races prior.

Clearly, there was effort made to produce a card that went beyond a standard night of racing. In addition to the stakes races, most races throughout the card had full nine and ten horse fields too, making for competitive racing and wagering opportunities.



The most wagered race of the night – by far – was the Thanksgiving Classic won by Bulldog Hanover. Win, Place and Show pools totaled \$47,532, with the Exacta pool contributing \$13,869 and the Trifecta pool adding another \$13,869. Total race pool including additional wagers came to \$95,113. What makes those numbers interesting though is that they came in the second to last race of the night, after 11 p.m. local time.

Ultimately, how the Thanksgiving night card is viewed in terms of a success depends on what the expectation was going into it. Handle between Thanksgiving eve and Thanksgiving night was far stronger than normal, though far less than Woodbine Mohawk Park, for example, which handled \$1.4 million on the same night. Was Hoosier's handle enough when weighed against the ask of race participants to race on a holiday when no one else in U.S. racing is?

It was a bold decision to conduct a Thanksgiving card as it is, and management should be applauded for the decision to give it a shot and try something new. The quality of horses compiled for the Thanksgiving Classic races was impressive too and the purses for those races weren't bad for an inaugural go of it.

Those are all things that can be built on to drive handle further for future editions of the card, should the track elect to continue to move forward with Thanksgiving racing. I think there's enough potential that I hope they do.

Indiana horseman Dave White and family give thanks for outpouring of support after serious accident

The Thanksgiving holiday often provides us the opportunity to pause and reflect on the blessings we receive throughout the year. This season, Dave White and his wife, Susanne, have much to be thankful for due to the giving spirit of their fellow Hoosier horsemen and women. White was recently injured in a training accident at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, and the racing community quickly stepped up to help through a GoFundMe campaign that has raised nearly \$30,000 in only a few days.

"Unbelievable! What wonderful horsemen and friends we have. God has been great to us. Thanks for everything. Dave is on the mend a little. Still lots of pain and will be off at least through Jan 15th. Thank you friends and prayers to everyone," reads an update provided by the Whites in the campaign organized through Jeff Fought.

White, a long-time trainer and fixture at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, recently sustained broken ribs and a punctured lung when training a young horse. The injuries required a few days in the hospital, but the 76-year-old is now resting at home and will need time to fully heal.

Fought first heard about the incident prior to the Midwest Mixed Sale, held Tuesday (Nov. 23). A breeding to second-year Indiana stallion Capt Midnight was auctioned off before the sale, with proceeds going to the couple. The breeding brought \$4,500. After the sale, Fought, who manages the Midwest Mixed Sale, talked to a friend who suggested a GoFundMe campaign should be created. He took the reins and created the campaign and has been amazed by the response.

"I had never set up a GoFundMe campaign, so I didn't know what to expect," said Fought. "The response is overwhelming. It shows how respected Dave is in the Indiana racing community."

The goal for the fundraising effort was originally set at \$5,000. That was met within hours. Through Saturday afternoon, the campaign has received 100 donations and stands at \$28,805, with anonymous donors stepping up to contribute sizable amounts as certain thresholds were reached. An anonymous donor has pledged \$5,000 once the total reaches \$30,000.

Dave and Susanne are not only mending physically, but also mentally and emotionally. Tragically, Dr. James Myers, an owner and close friend of the couple, perished as a result of injuries sustained in the accident. Myers, 78, practiced medicine for more than 40 years in the Hoosier State and was a regular visitor to the stable. Myers and White owned Dreamstyle Herbie in partnership. The son of Here Comes Herbie won an Indiana Sires Stakes elimination at 2 and captured a consolation at three while finishing second in two eliminations. He earned \$82,717 over two seasons.

According to United States Trotting Association statistics, White has 3,954 career training starts dating back to 1991, with 397 winners and \$4.1 million in purse earnings. He has conditioned Indiana Sires Stakes final winners Trixie's Deidra (1998), CC Super Home (2000), Search Engine (2006 & 2007), Kentucky Brew (2005) and Solvent (2009).

Horse of the Year: a dozen early thoughts

- 1. In 1968 on Nov. 23, Nevele Pride was announced as the HOY repeater. That's right, Nov. 23, folks. It was different in those days.
- 2. Captain Corey on Hambletonian night might have won the whole thing right then and there, but he raced only seven times for the year (7 5-0-1, \$758,695), over \$100,000 per start.

Malabar Man was the first trotter to be HOY averaging over \$100,000 per in 1997. But the seven starts are likely not going to work. Chapter Seven at 10 in 2012 holds the mark for the fewest ever for a HOY.

3. How about the trotting mare division? Wow. Who wins this?

Manchego - 9 6-0-1, \$421,596

Atlanta - 12 6-3-1, \$432,699

When Dovescry - 18 8-7-2, \$514,014

4. Will the top five, six or even seven vote-getters all be female?

Test Of Faith, Niki Hill, Bella Bellini, Venerable, Lyons Sentinel, Joviality?

In 1958, 3YO Trotting Filly Emilys Pride got 28 first-place votes and 439 points overall to nail down the title, even though Belle Acton also got 28 first place votes, but 407 points.

5. The year 2001 saw a 3-year-old pacing filly best a sophomore trotting filly to go 1-2 that year in the HOY balloting: Bunny Lake-Syrinx Hanover. In 2017, three trotting females dominated with Hannelore Hanover and Ariana G and Manchego going 1-2-3 with 95 votes to 12 to 10.

6. Joviality had a unique daily double in 2021. No freshman filly has ever won the New York Sires Stakes final at Yonkers from post 8 and then the Breeders Crown from post 10.

7. Lyons Sentinel comes off a bruising season but three straight races where she never was on top at any point are likely to be costly.

8. Richard Norman has become the first trainer to ever have two million-dollar trotting fillies in one season — Venerable 11 9-01, \$1.04 million and Bella Bellini at 19 11-6-1, \$1,111,390.

9. It's not how you start, it's how you finish. Early-season heroics can be quickly dismissed (See Fear The Dragon 2017). But, sometimes, a slow start is no issue — Cam Fella in 1983 began 2-for-8 then won his final 28 that year to post 30 wins in 36 starts, both all-time highs for any HOY. Abercrombie was 3-for-8 in 1978 before finishing 22-for-33 and easily capturing the year-end title.

10. Niki Hill had a giant season any which way you slice it. Chris Ryder, is it possible he can have the HOY runner-up again? That was the case in both 2019 with Bettors Wish and 2020 with Party Girl Hill. Ray Schnittker's Deweycheatumnhowe was backto-back HOY runner-up in 2007 and 2008.

11. Live streaming to New Zealand? Australia? Sure hope so on Feb. 20. Ryder, Norman and Pelling all have Dan Patch major contenders. Rising Star Todd McCarthy? A big night looms Down Under.

12. Will 30 votes be enough to nail down HOY? It's possible. In 1974, 16 different horses got a least one HOY vote from 194 writers that cast ballots. Likely half that number will cast ballots this year.

Will David Miller set a HOY record?

David Miller is, well, getting up there — at least comparatively speaking. He will turn 57 on Dec. 10. IF Test Of Faith or Venerable should be named Horse of the Year, Miller would become the oldest driver in 47 years to claim the title. Delvin Miller was 61 with Delmonica Hanover in 1974 when she parlayed the Prix D'Amerique and the Roosevelt International (John Chapman) into a HOY season. Here's a look at the 50-something drivers since who have done it:

1975 - James Arthur, 56, Savoir

1977 - Billy Haughton, 54, Green Speed

1997 — Mal Burroughs, 57 (Ten days younger than David Miller) with Malabar Man

2006 – John Campbell, 51, Glidemaster

2007 - Ron Pierce, 51, Donato Hanover

2016 - Dave Miller, 52, Always B Miki

2018 - Brian Sears, 50, McWicked

Pelling's amazing season

If you look at the top 24 trainers of 2021 in earnings, you will see Brett Pelling at #7. But look a little closer to the right at his .UTRS: .465. It is a beyond-belief Stanley Dancer type of number that is simply not done in today's era.

In context, not a single trainer of the other 23 are 100 points near that. None. Pelling had 321 starts: 103 wins 56 seconds and 45 thirds. That's nearly \$13,000 per start, which is also #1 in North America. Brian Brown is at .401 in the #25 spot having a strong year of his own. In further context, the all-time

thoroughbred leader in the all-important in-the-money department is Chad Brown at 59 per cent. Pelling is over 65 per cent in 2021. This is all highlighted by the more-than-spectacular Test of Faith at 16 14-2-0 \$1,069,739 for the season.

Oh, brothers

Brothers Andrew and Todd McCarthy both surpassed \$7.5 million in driver earnings in 2021.

Andrew had \$8.5 million and Todd \$7.5 million.

Andrew landed in the Top 5 for the first time and Todd in the Top 10. Brothers Tetrick are at \$18.5 million combined with Tim at \$12.2 million and Trace at \$6.3.

Hail to King

Jim King, Jr. has done something unprecedented: consecutive \$2 million career-earning pacing mares: Shartin N followed by Lyons Sentinel.

Rod Allen retires

Horseman Rod Allen has retired at age 65. It's been 17 years since we lost his father, Carl, the patriarch of the Allen family. Rod started driving the year after his dad won the \$1.7 million Woodrow Wilson in 1983 with Carls Bird and Rod's brother Marty was the season's fastest on three different sized tracks with Its Fritz.

Rod has been around for most of the last three and a half decades — with a memorable 1994-1996 campaigning standout C R Kay Suzie, the 1995 HOY. Carlsbad Cam won the 1992 Meadowlands Pace in Rod's lone appearance in the Pace, after a third in the NA Cup as the betting choice. C R Renegade won the 1999 Breeders Crown.

Three driving Allens won a trotting Triple Crown race — Mike the Kentucky Futurity with C R Track Master and Rod and Carl both in the Yonkers Trot.

If there is a classier duo in the sport that Rod and wife Dawn, I certainly have yet to meet them. All the best to a duo that may not realize it but they have set the bar even higher on how to conduct oneself in the sport of standardbred racing — on and off the track.

Hambletonian thoughts

The last two times there were four heats in the Hambletonian came in 1975 and 1976. Certainly, you can understand the taxing nature of this. In 1975, the top two finishers never again raced — Bonefish and Yankee Bambino. But, in 1976, just two weeks after the grueling Steve Lobell-won Hambletonian, 10 of the 12 participants in at least three heats made it back and competed in

the Colonial on Sept. 18, 14 days later. Steve Lobell actually made breaks in two different heats on Hambletonian Day and still won it.

Four-year-old blues? It sure looks like it for the last two Hambletonian winners in 2019 and 2020 combined as they went 1-for-12 as 4-year-olds; 0-for-7 this year for Ramona Hill and just a 1-for-5 slate for Forbidden Trade in 2020.

Who remembers Hambletonian medallions? in 1975, the medallions, along with \$5 admission tickets for the race, were sold for \$5 each to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the race. The goal was 25,000 sold, but it was topped to 28,535 Golden Hambletonian Medallions.

Where, oh where, have these days gone?

Hold onto your hats. On Feb. 20 1964 at Roosevelt Raceway — Opening Day — 35,191 people showed up (and 22,421 came the next night). For the opener, in 24 degree weather, just two days after a snowstorm, \$2,340,342 was jammed through the windows. One hundred and forty-six infra-red heaters were set up for those not lucky enough to make it inside or to the Cloud Casino. My favorite remembrance? Doc Robbins sold all 32,000 programs.

Rob and Tammy McNiven on a quarter century of sustained growth at Twinbrook

How the smaller Ontario breeders became a major player.

It has been a long, sometimes arduous and almost entirely happy road for Rob and Tammy McNiven, two of the people who personify the grassroots perspective that people think of when harness racing is mentioned.

It was 25 years ago when Rob bought out his brother Brad in their partnership of a previous incarnation of Twinbrook Farms. Previous to the buyout, Twinbrook Farms had been mostly a pig and cattle farm with perhaps four or five standardbred mares roaming its pastures.

Upon the breakup of the original Twinbrook Farms, Rob and his wife Tammy chose to concentrate solely on breeding and raising standardbred horses.

In 2022, it will be 25 years since this author received a telephone call asking if he was receptive to the couple sending a small consignment of yearlings to the Harrisburg sale that fall under the banner of their fledgling Twinbrook Farms. There were several questions asked by them:

1. Would they perhaps be better served if instead of representing



the yearlings themselves turning them over to an agent who might guarantee them better visibility?

Yes or no. They were promised that if they consigned the horses and if they were of the quality that people were looking for, if they represented them well, they would be well rewarded, regardless of whichever route they chose to go.

2. They only had a handful of their own yearlings. Would such a small number be overlooked in such a large venue as Harrisburg?

It was the author's belief then and still is that quantity is significantly less important than is quality when it comes to selling yearlings. Horsepeople have a way of finding the gems in a consignment regardless of its size. In a manner quoting the famous line from Field of Dreams "If you build it, they will come." All you have to do is substitute the word build with the word have: "If you have it, they will come."

There was another small but quality-oriented Canadian breeder who was contemplating selling at Harrisburg for the first time that year — Stan and Tim Klemencic's Rolling Hills Farm. The Klemencics had essentially the same questions as the McNivens. I cannot recall who's idea it was, but the two farms got together and jointly addressed the perceived problem of not having enough horses to draw lookers. They ended up with a joint consignment of 11 yearlings selling under the Twinbrook banner.

It is now 25 years later and both entities are still in business, playing at the top of the game in their individual ways. The Klemencics felt that their individual needs would be better served by going through an agent and diversifying their offering by selling at both Harrisburg and Lexington through Preferred Equine Marketing. Twinbrook decided to sell exclusively at Harrisburg with the exception of a few head of Ontario-sired ones at the Canadian sales. Both, to this observer, have done extremely well, perhaps even thrived, once again proving that there is more than one way to skin that proverbial cat.

In the aftermath of their most successful sale yet, I was privileged to speak with Rob and Tammy and discuss the evolution of Twinbrook Farms.

The year 2022 will mark 25 years that you have been consigners to Harrisburg. You started small and have grown exponentially, both in terms of numbers and quality. In all those years, some good, some better and none of them poor, for Twinbrook, you have managed to achieve good results, occasionally even doing well in what might have been perceived as being in a down market.

"It might sound simplistic. We've always been very hard workers. Ultimately, we are responsible for our own success or lack of it. We are far from being inordinately wealthy, so, if we do not do well, we will suffer the consequences. In the same manner that if we do well, we will reap the rewards. Twinbrook Farms is all

we do. We live or figuratively die based upon how well it does. In the good years, thankfully there have been far more of those than the occasionally challenging ones. Virtually everything we make goes back into the business, whether it be with regard to the physical establishment itself or the enhancement of our broodmare band. Of note is the fact that every single physical item on the farms, from our home to the stables to the fences is new in the sense that it has been built during our time here. The same philosophy relates to our broodmares. We constantly keep trying to improve our quality.*"

*Authors note: I certainly can attest to the veracity of that statement. Each year when I would arrive to come look at that year's yearling crop, there would be something new, whether it be a new or refurbished stable, a new lab, a new piece of land, but always something better than what it had been previously. Of course, the improvement in the livestock was evident in the breeding of the yearlings submitted each year.

You do as good a job as anybody and better than most in raising and presenting your yearlings. What do you attribute that to?

"We mentioned the hard work, but it's mostly a combination of things. Rob has had two great teachers in his dad Bob and his uncle Jack McNiven. There is no one, I repeat no one, who could prep a yearling better than Jack McNiven. Jack not only worked very hard, but he also paid attention and became involved with everything — especially the little things. No details were unimportant. Also of great importance is the fact that each yearling is different. They might have different needs. What you feed one yearling might not suit another near as well. Some yearlings might need more exercise than others. It's important to us that our horses are happy. More often than not a happy horse will look the part and to our feeling, probably perform better once it leaves us for the job for which it is intended.

"Rob can finish off a horse exceptionally well. Just as Rob has learned so much in following in Uncle Jack's footsteps, so has our daughter Jenna learned a great deal from Rob.

"She has perhaps surpassed him in some ways. She has become the face of Twinbrook Farms. She is quite active on social media keeping people apprised of the sometimes daily events in our horses lives. When it comes to knowledge of pedigrees, especially current ones, she is, in our opinion without peer. She knows her horses with the incredible detail that only an exceptional horseperson can. Twin B Nation, the colt that Determination and Luc Blais bought for \$300,000 at Harrisburg was always her favorite, even in their formative stages when the horses hadn't quite yet sorted themselves out. She always believed that he was destined to be special. Let's hope that carries forth to the next stage of his life."

Did the price that was paid for him surprise you?

"Yes, but only that you never — at least we don't ever — go into a sale expecting those kind of prices. However, we certainly thought that if he didn't sell well, we probably would have a disastrous sale. He was a truly exceptional colt. As people sometimes say, he checked all the boxes. He is a great looking colt who moved well and radiated a feeling of class about him. He comes from one of the greatest, if not THE greatest speed producing families in our sports history. His sire American Ideal is year after year, one of the leading sires in the sport, Going to a sale, we never have our expectations too high. We thought that if we had a six figure yearling in our consignment, then he would be the one. We surely will be following his progress and probably only next to perhaps Luc and Monsieur Godin will be his biggest fans next year and in the years to come. I think that Mac Nicol who owned American Ideal when he raced might have been the underbidder. I believe that Tony Alagna might have been bidding on him as well. We are thankful to them, as well."

We've mentioned Uncle Jack McNiven. Tell us something about him.

"As you well know, to know Uncle Jack, is to love Uncle Jack." We have never known anybody to say even the slightest negative thing about Jack McNiven. There is a good reason for that, because there is absolutely nothing negative about the man. He is one of the sweetest, kindest and most generous people to ever walk this earth. Add to that he is great horseman — not only good and kind to horses but to all forms of animal life. He is still involved with horses to a small degree. He boards some for Ed James at his farm. As you know, he is extremely personable. There is nothing he enjoys more than to visit and interact with people. One of my regrets about this year's Harrisburg sale was that Jack wasn't there with us. He was prepared to come, but at the last minute discovered that his passport had expired. He would have loved seeing the colt sell that well, but probably more, he would have enjoyed the camaraderie associated with visiting with so many horsepeople."

How many mares reside at Twinbrook Farms?

"It's in the range of 36-40, of which 28 are farm owned. We do keep a few boarders for friends and customers. We tried to buy several more at Harrisburg, but, as you know, they were pretty hard to buy. We ended up getting two, the maiden, Avia Hanover, a full sister to Allywag Hanover and Twin B Captivating in foal to Sweet Lou. We wanted a couple more, but were shut out."

You have evolved from mostly breeding to sires resident in Ontario to sires standing all over, mostly in New York and Pennsylvania, but actually wherever most of the quality stallions are perceived to be standing.

"We wish we were able to breed to more horses in our home province, but the reasons for this are mostly based on the economics we need to survive. The main reason is that with some exceptions, there were few stallions in the province where the prices that their yearlings brought were commensurate with the prices that we need to survive. Of course among pacers, Bettors Delight is a notable exception. With Cattlewash coming here and somewhat of a comeback being made by Sunshine Beach, this might change. Trotters do not seem to present anywhere near the same problem. I can't explain why. Unfortunately we only own three trotting bred mares, so this doesn't really apply. The puzzle is that Ontario still has one of, if not the very best Sires Stakes programs in North America."

Jenna is the farm manager in waiting, if not already the major domo of the farm. How about your other children?

"Our youngest, our son Robert, is more of an equipment, specifically, tractor guy than he is as horse guy. Not that he doesn't care for or isn't involved with the horses, its only that he is more involved with the inner workings of the farm. He was on a tractor watching on his cell phone when Twin B Nation was sold. Our daughter, Maddie, is married to trainer/driver Travis Henry, a member of the Henry family horse dynasty. They have a son Kingston who is our pride and joy. You may have seen some pictures of him with Twin B Nation from Harrisburg. Maddie is also involved with the horses. She is a well-known horse massage therapist. Both girls were always involved with the horses. They were both barrel racing champions when they were younger."

In shopping for mares, what is it you look for?

"As we've seen you quoted – 'family, family and more family.' We can't afford the great mares, but we look for their siblings or close relatives from the same families. After that, we want decent size and good conformation of course. But family is a priority."

When do you book your mares?

"It seems earlier and earlier each year. It will be pretty soon. We don't want to take chances insofar as getting shut out from our favorite stallions."

If you were going to describe your philosophy in the business, what would it be?

"To do the best job we can possible do, because raising and selling yearlings is only a part of the journey. To a large degree. how well our horses do in the sales ring is dependent on how good a job they do on the racetrack. That, of course, relates to how good a job we have done in breeding and raising them. To sum it up. If we were the customer instead of the seller, we would like to be treated in the same manner as we treat them."

Any regrets?

"As Sinatra would say, maybe a few but not too many. The major one would be that Rob's dad Bob didn't live long enough to enjoy the success that we've had. Nobody loved the horse business and the Harrisburg experience more than Bob McNiven. He would be thrilled."



Weaver was wonderfully attentive to Harold as he struggled and finally succumbed to cancer. He then sent his racehorses to Vernon Dancer, and again stayed with him until he, too, passed away.

As a breeder, Weaver wrote his name indelibly in the sands of our business when he bred the immortal Valley Victory. His passing has left a void that I doubt will soon be filled.

Weaver bred NF Happenstance to Sebastian K and, after he died, Mr. Moore bought her back and sent her back to the races. From her breeding to Sebastian K, the mare had a filly who was injured and never raced. However, motherhood certainly seemed to improve NF Happenstance because she went back to the races for Mr. Moore and won \$365,000 at 7 and 8, including a Breeders Crown elimination.

Since being retired, again, NF Happenstance now has a yearling colt by Father Patrick, a weanling colt by Cantab Hall, and is in foal to Six Pack. The question is, where to go next with her?

NF Happenstance is by SJ.'s Caviar, out of Moira Hall, by Conway Hall. Obviously this kid had a little to do with her pedigree.

The first thought that strikes one about her pedigree is how old it is. Moira Hall is a foal of 2001, and she's still going strong with 11 foals so far, including a 2-year-old this year. She's hit twice, with NF Happenstance the winner of \$661,321 and Morairtime with \$369,917. (It took me a minute to interpret that mare's name as More Air Time. Clever, indeed.)

Neither S.J.'s Caviar or Airzoom Lindy are dominant sires. To explain how they could sire such good horses from a fairly nondescript mare, with all due deference to her breeder, once again you have to look at the genetic range of every horse as a deck of cards, running from two to ace.

The best producers, stallions or mares, have a deck that probably starts with a 10, and goes up from there. Those cards represent the speed gene every standardbred horse carries, so a 10 for a trotter translates into a speed of 1:52-1:53.

In the case of these two obviously fast horses, one can assume that at the moment of conception, both the sire and the dam brought together the highest cards in their respective decks, say a 10 and a jack. That happens randomly, and the chances of it recurring, i.e. if you were to keep breeding that horse to that mare, are slight.

For the record, that genetic make-up is technically the horse's genotype. It is invisible, and bears no similarity or connection to the "visible horse", or its racetrack performance. That's the reason a mare's ability on the track says absolutely nothing about her ability to reproduce fast horses. As every savvy breeder knows, the best and only clue to her reproductive ability lies in her pedigree, where you're looking for a history of speed production

on the Tail-Mare side in every generation, ideally.

Saying that, I know, will not change the fact that big prices will be paid for future broodmares with great racing credentials. Or that the same kind of big money will be paid for at least the first two foals of the same kind of mare with a flashy history on the track.

If I were to ignore my own beliefs and point to one racing characteristic of a mare that might mean something about her ability to produce fast horses, it would be high speed at 2. If you must insist on looking at a mare's racing history as a guide to her reproductive ability, look at her ability at 2.

But while this may be helpful, it is not one tenth as important as the strength of her pedigree.

Figuring out the sire potential of a stallion is a totally different kettle of fish. (If you like fish, try McDonald's Fried Fish sandwich. I recommend it.) With stallions, the pedigree means nothing. Every stallion is a separate entity unto itself, and how he's bred is irrelevant. The best clue to a horse's future in the stud is his racetrack ability at 2.

That's a belief that I share with a much higher authority, namely the greatest thoroughbred breeder of all time, Federico Tesio. Even that won't tell you the whole future, by any means, but it gives one something to go on.

Here again, I give the example of the two full brothers, Muscle Mass and Muscle Massive. Muscle Mass was a top colt at 2, winning more than \$200,000. At 3, he did nothing. Today he's one of the best trotting sires standing anywhere.

His full brother, Muscle Massive, was mediocre at 2, but won the Hambletonian at 3. In the stud, I'm not calling him a dud, by any means, but he is on his second farm.

That's it for the breeding stuff for now, but I want to go back 50 years to the day Mr. Sheppard told me, there's another street car every 15 minutes. Maybe so, but I'm still standing on the corner by myself, hoping another mare like Western Heat will come by.







Inoubliable, the princess of France

The best 3-year-old fillies bred in France gathered at Vincennes on Saturday (Nov. 27) afternoon when the \$125,000 Criterium des pouliches was on the card.

The bettors' first choice, Philippe Moulin-trained **Inoubliable** (Prodigious) proved to be best. The 3-year-old chestnut filly started slowly in the back of the 14-horse field, but driver Jean Philippe Dubois realized quickly that he had to make a move three wide and the duo hit the lead with a kilometer to go in the 2,700 meters long race.

Inoubliable had everything under complete control over Vincennes' home stretch and she collected the sixth win of her career.

Earlier this year, Inoubliable claimed titles in the \$115,000 Prix Gelinotte and the \$115,000 Prix Roquepine. The mile rate over 1.6 miles was 1:59.3.

On Saturday, the 3-year-old colts battled in the \$115,000 Prix Jacques de Vauloge over 2,700 meters and first choice **Italiano Vero** (Ready Cash), paired with David Thomain, hit the lead with a little less than 2,000 meters to go and even if the power ran out of the Philippe Allaire trained 3-year-old in the end, he held strong finisher Ideal Ligneries behind him at the wire.

Italiano Vero claimed his 10th victory in his career and his biggest triumph so far came in \$191,500 Prix Albert Viel at Vincennes in June this year.

The mile rate for winner Italiano Vero: 1:59.4 over 1.6 miles.

Fairy-tale ending of a 57-year long career

Swedish trainer and driver Hans-Owe Sundberg has decided to retire from harness racing after spending 57 years in the industry. On Friday night (Nov. 26), Sundberg had his last horse in a race.

The \$65,750 Solvalla Grand Prix for 4-year-olds over 1.3 miles was on the menu at Solvalla and Sundberg had **Selected News** (Maharajah) in the race. Paired with Magnus A Djuse, Selected News belonged among the upsets since Per Nordström's Önas Prince and Daniel Redén's Sister Sledge were favorited by the bettors.

Önas Prince (post 1 behind the gate) was the heavy favorite, but Nordström's trotter disliked the surface at Solvalla this cold night and made a break after 150 meters, trying to defend the front position. Sister Sledge (post 12 behind the gate) had to attack four- and three wide in the first turn and reached position first over after a half mile, while the pace was set high by leader Mr Mah Can.

Sister Sledge was beaten at the backstretch and Selected News got the order to attack at the same time. Sundberg's trotter easily disarmed new leader Zeolit and sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:56.2. A better ending of a long journey in the harness racing business is hard to find.

Sundberg, 71, recently reached 1,000 victories as a trainer. As a driver, he has collected 2,290 wins.

Elitloppet winner **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin) took a safe win from the lead in race for 5- and 6-year-olds the same night. Örjan Kihlström had to push his 5-year-old to the lead after 500 meters and in front, Don Fanucci Zet simply just cruised to safe win in 1:55.3. There are plans on sending the horse to France during the winter and the main objective is Prix d'Amérique for Daniel Redén's trotter.

Solvalla's Saturday (Nov. 27) race card contained two big races and in the \$65,750 Baroness Karsk's race for mares, Björn Gooptrained **Mellby Free** (Muscle Hill) ended her career with a safe wire-to-wire win in strong mile rate 1:55.2 over 1.3 miles. Goop's 7-year-old top mare had a superior season as a 4-year-old when she won the \$525,000 Stochampionatet and the \$350,000 Breeders Crown.

Mellby Free reached a great milestone since she won Saturday's race as she surpassed 10 million Swedish crowns (\$1,096,150) in earnings.

A 10-horse field of well-merited older trotters showed up in the \$65,750 Silverhästen (final in gold division, V75) over 1.3 miles and Timo Nurmos' 5-year-old **Brother Bill** (From Above) impressed as he won in a mile rate of 1:55.4. Driver Jorma Kontio chose an optimistic tactic from start, but had to find himself be positioned in third over after the first half mile. Kontio still had the optimistic feeling behind his horse and Brother Bill got another order to attack three wide with a half mile to go. In the last turn, the duo landed outside of leader Milliondollarrhyme and Timo Nurmos trotter fought really well as he disarmed the leader at mid-stretch.

Halftime adjustments

I began with a proclamation, "Like the Swallows of Capistrano, most participants in the yearling ownership game follow the same pattern each season. We study catalogs during the fall months, raise our hands at auctions, dream big, and then we see if our dreams have come true in eight or nine months. For people unfamiliar with our game, the empty wasteland between the excitement of a yearling sale and any racing action is long and tedious."

My pal shrugged. "That seems to be the basic model in your sport. Nothing much will happen for eight or nine months, and, oh yeah, they will need to pay staking fees and a hefty bill every month. That said, I'm sure there are reasons for the timing of yearling sales."

"Whatever the reasons for the schedule, the long void does not appeal to new owners. People today get impatient when their iPhone freezes. We need some models where time is not our enemy. I think I will take a whirl at creating one."

"A time machine?"

"Sort of – did you ever hear the term pinhooking?" I asked.

"Yes, reselling a product later in the process. Strange term. Is it one word or two?"

He pulled out his phone and asked, "Hey Google, Where did the term pinhooking originate?" Then he tapped a link and read from his screen:

"From tobacco trading. Aaron H. Washington, the son of John Bratton, founded a community in Flat Lick Creek, Kentucky, one mile from Licking's North Fork to serve his local store, mill, and tobacco house. Washington established the Bratton's Mill post office on January 25, 1865. The community was known as Pinhook. The office closed in August 1875 but was re-established on May 10, 1882, simply as Bratton. What remains of Bratton is still locally referred to as Pinhook. Whence Pinhook? An early resident named Alta Mae Walton recalled the story of the boy who would fish in nearby Flat Lick Creek using a bent pin for a hook. She and others believe that it was at this place that the term pinhooking originated because, in the early days, shady tobacco dealers and brokers operated in this area."

He slipped his phone into his jacket pocket. "So, is that Trey's new adventure, Pinhooking harness horses?"

"A version I'm making up on the fly. These days a person buying or selling a pinhooked horse has new tools with the Internet. Customers can take out an ad on a website, or participants can buy or sell a horse online or *Ongait* any time in the process."

He thought for a second and said, "The obvious problem is that nobody sells promising 2-year-olds well into training. Young horses like that are too hard to find. Buyers will always be ultra-wary, and in the back of their mind is the question, 'Why would anyone sell this potentially Sires Stakes quality horse?'"

"That's where my version enters the picture. Pinhooking seems to take place late in the process. Everyone knows that a 2-year-old that easily trains in single digits with a flawless gait in June and then wins a qualifier by open lengths in a jaw-dropping time has an excellent chance of evolving into an excellent racehorse. At this point, the horse has great value."

He took the contrary position, "And everyone knows that a horse

that can barely break three minutes in June is of minimum value. So, what's your point? What's your angle?"

"A middle ground determined by the time of the stopwatch."

"Do tell," he said.

"This fall, my friend and I bought three yearlings at various sales. Like a lot of people, we probably over-shopped. Still, we left each sale knowing that each yearling we purchased was 'the one."

He chuckled, "Your theory of 'the one' will not hold up under statistical analysis but continue."

"We all delude ourselves into thinking that the trifling stops between fame and riches; breaking, staking, training in 3 under minutes, training in 2:50, 2:40, 2:30, 2:20, 2:10, and then in the single digits and winning races is going to happen."

He said, "And you delude yourself with the best of them."

"Thank you. I'm telling you right now that when the horses train down to 2:35, there will be a sale. A complete accounting of the original sales price, training bills, and payments for stakes programs and races will be available. The horse can be examined and viewed. There will be a reserve price. Should one of the 2-year-olds sell, that's fine. If they do not sell, the horses will continue training."

"How much do you, or anyone, really know about a racehorse at this point?" he asked.

"Honestly, I'm not sure. However, everyone knows a hell of a lot more about a two-year-old training at 2:35 than they did last October when the horse was a bug-eyed yearling with a HIP number glued to their flank."

He paused, then said, "If your 2-year-olds in training don't sell, the commissions for repurchasing them, videotaping, and advertising costs will add up."

"True, and I spend more. When, and if, any of this trio are training at 2:15, the horses may go to market again."

"Where your price will go up."

"Or down. Who knows?"

He shook his head. "Would you have the emotional strength to sell a very promising 2-year-old at that point? Come on, Trey, I don't think you could do it."

"That statement indicates you have never lived paycheck to paycheck. Look, would selling hurt? Sure. Could the sale come back and bite us? Sure. At this point, the money would need to make sense to us. We can bake a solid profit margin into the asking price. At 2:35, the buyer and seller have more information and time to consider relative value. Wheeling and dealing can be fun. Horse trading is a big part of the attraction to this game."

He seemed to be softening his view, "Marketing a horse in 2022 is easier than ever."

I nodded, "The idea is simple. Potential buyers are closer to the finish line than they were at the sales. For several cold months, we have taken risks, paid bills, and paid the stakes. These two-year-old racehorses are much more finished products. How that affects the price is up to the marketplace."

He said, "I still don't think this unorthodox sales schedule will find buyers."

"You may be correct, but so what? And getting back to the start of this conversation, this project could be great for new owners who might join a partnership with seasoned partners. The newbie could pay their money and then in a month or two, turn the keys and go for a ride."

He smiled. "So you are working on another crazy experiment." "It's what I do. See you around 2:35."







Meadowlands strives to be the best by shortening cards, decreasing "courtesy tucks"

The Meadowlands remains committed to making its product the best it can be. There are a few changes on the horizon as we respond to the input of our customer, the horseplayer.

Long a point of contention has been the length of the racing card. While the placement of our live races to avoid direct competition is a key element of maximizing handle, the flip side is that we are putting on five-and-a-half hour marathons.

In an attempt to find the formula that will best serve both, The Meadowlands will begin to shorten the time between races. The horses will still be coming on to the track at 1 or zero minutes to post and we will continue to drag 6-8 minutes after they do, but there will be considerably less time from the end of one race until the horses come out for the next. For example, two minutes shaved from between 13 races should shorten the card up by 25-30 minutes.

This experiment will be tweaked over time to find the best way to maintain handle while getting everyone home a little earlier on race night.

A second initiative being addressed is the competitiveness of the races themselves. Jeff Gural has met with the drivers several times to discuss the policies and practices that have resulted in the races too often being boring and predictable.

Thus far, there is a recognizable difference to the racing style with fewer early "courtesy tucks" and in turn, more contested racing. Winter racing sees the driver colony evolve as several of the regulars head South or take their tack to other tracks, which annually provides an opportunity for others to take their shot racing at The Meadowlands.

With the new policies in place and the likely invasion of some younger drivers seeking to make their mark, hopefully the product will continue to improve and we will once again have the style of racing that allows horses to come from behind.

For the 83rd time in his fledgling career, Jason Bertolini lined up behind the starting gate in a pari-mutuel purse start. Since the year 2017, the 24-year-old has been knocking on the door, picking up five seconds and 14 third-place finishes along way. On 'Black' Friday (Nov. 26) Bertolini finally rang the cash register, finding his virtual 'stairway to heaven' with his own Led Schneppelin in 1:59.

Bertolini went right to work in the Aaron and Ryan Hall Stable after graduating Gardiner (ME) High School in 2015. Training and rubbing horses and learning as much as he could, he has been driving around the Maine fairs for the last five years. This summer he asked the owners if he could buy Led Schneppelin. They said, "sure, as long as YOU drive him."

So off Bertolini went, into the Maine Amateur Driving Club (MADC), also known as the 'The Greatest Sideshow in Maine Harness Racing, in charge of his own destiny. Competing in the \$4,000 'Group B', perhaps his boss, driver/trainer Aaron Hall said it best in a congratulatory Facebook post, "You'll never forget this one. You deserve this moment more than anyone I know."

Scoring from post five, U.S.-born but Finnish-bred Bertolini was in no mood to let anyone go Friday. He left alertly and made the top just past the eighth pole with the 10-year-old son of Memphis Flash. From there Led Schneppelin and Jason Bertolini got every call, widening their margin on the field at every well-rated stanza. By the head of the stretch they were on top by three and never had an anxious moment.

Bertolini was quick to credit both of his mentors, Aaron Hall, and his mother Kirsi Bertolini, for much of his harness racing education. "They both gave me plenty of opportunity to drive and helped give me the experience I needed," said the aspiring reinsman. "Yes, today was a great day. But like Kevin Switzer Jr. told me, 'One day you're a hero, one day you're a zero.' So I try to stay humble."

The oldest of five siblings, Bertolini has been going to the barn since he was an infant. His mother Kirsi is very proud of her son's strong work ethic and his horsemanship skills. The elder Bertolini said, "Everyone in Maine wants him to warm up their horses because he gets along with anything."

Jason echoed those sentiments, declaring, "I believe you should work hard and dream big...and let the horses do the talking."

Drew Campbell gets victory #5,500

Nova Scotia-born harness driver Drew Campbell learned from his father Winston "Soupie" Campbell a long time ago, 'If you are going to do this, do it right."

Hanging around Drew Campbell, and his younger brother Heath, it's obvious that they live and breathe harness racing. "We were horse-crazy as kids and learned everything we know, including shoeing our own horses, from my father," he said. "I never wanted to do anything else and it's really great to be able to get up every morning and love what you are doing." said the 54-year-old top New England reinsman.

Drew Campbell began driving horses in 1989 and has earned \$17.6 million in purse earnings. Saturday (Nov. 27) at Cumberland he picked up his win number 5,500, just like it was another day at the office. He started the day by winning the third race with Lindas In Heaven, paying \$4.80. Then Campbell came right back to win the fifth race with Surreal Sergeant, wire-to-wire, and paid \$6.20 while reaching the milestone.

"I know a lot of people that win way more races than me," noted Winston 'Drew' Campbell who shares his first name with his late-father. "But 5,500 wins is a lot of work. Hats off to the guys that got more."

A third generation horseman, his dad 'Soupie' Campbell picked up 1,784 wins in an era when catch driving was not the norm, but the exception. Drew Campbell's first win came aboard a horse owned by his dad named Mountain North at Exhibition Park in Saint John, New Brunswick. At the time, it was the aspiring reinsman's seventh career drive.

"Driving horses is a lot of sacrifice and a lot of traveling," Campbell said. "I also had a lot of help from the trainers and owners. They really put all this together!"

Campbell has enjoyed many decades of driving success, often with 300+ victory seasons and over a million in purse earnings in four separate years. "I have a blast racing no matter what happens," he said. "Of course I like making money, but some days things just don't go your way or the horse simply doesn't have it. Then you go out there the next day and do it all over again."

Although just four years apart in age, Drew's younger brother Heath is hot on his brother's heels in the driving category, with 5,414 wins and \$17.2 million in earnings. "Heath is very successful in New England racing," Campbell said. "Now he's at Gilcrest in Florida with a large stable of colts. I look forward to joining him soon to be his wing man."

For Drew Campbell, every day in the horse business is a victory.

Bruce Ranger has a slight lead over Drew Campbell in the Cumberland drivers' standings, 54-53. Other driving doubles on the Saturday (Nov. 27) card were enjoyed by Bruce Ranger and Nick Graffam.

Siegel provides numbers, analysis on accidents

The prevalence of harness racing accidents had DECREASED in the last 12 years, though there has been a slight uptick in the last three years. However, the numbers themselves (provided by TrackMaster using USTA data) are so relatively small, one needs to look at a number of years to draw any reasonable conclusion. My conclusion is that the number has decreased overall from 15-20 per 1,000 races rate to the 10-15 per 1,000 races.

I wanted to see the actual data and here it is. The table below counts a race as an accident race if one or more horses has in its running line record an "AC" [for accident] or "FL" [for fell] indicator in any US race.

With the facts above, several have opined about rates increasing, rather than why they have decreased. The question should be what is an "acceptable" rate and if we as an industry want to reduce the rate for whatever the reason, what can be done to reduce it with having a minimal impact on the sport? Nearly all sports have introduced rule, equipment and protocol changes to improve the safety of the sport.

Further study would need to be done on the causes of accidents in order to know how to approach the objective. For example, if hooking wheels were responsible for 25 per cent of the accidents, one might look to a sulky modification to prevent such accidents. If one saw that accidents were disproportionately caused by rookie drivers, perhaps licensing provisions should be made more stringent. To do this, the USTA (group best suited) would need to make some database and entry changes for the chart callers to enter details about an accident and/or the USTA staff would review video, possibly talk to the participants, and to do this database work itself. Given the number above, we are talking about a pretty small effort on a go forward basis

(a bit more than one per week on average in recent years). A retrospective analysis could also be done, but it is a bit more shakey using only video. But this would only make sense if there is a strong motivation to reduce the number of accidents.

Soulsby responds to Faraldo on microchips

I sent USTA chairman Joe Faraldo an email replying to his HRU Feedback published on Nov. 21 (full story here), and did not plan on addressing his rebuttal here, but feel it merits an open response. Mr. Faraldo once again implies that we are anti-chip. Our rule change proposals only ask for the USTA to continue to provide what they have given our horses for the last 25 years, a visible ID. To continue to freeze brand actually brings them into compliance with their own rule, in the current rule book, addressing horse identification, which I will again provide. It is Rule 7.06 "No horse that has not been tattooed or freeze branded and implanted with a microchip as authorized by the USTA will be permitted to start at an extended pari-mutuel meeting unless the permission of the presiding judge is obtained... How is what is printed in our rule book, a false narrative?

Beyond that, he claims microchips are far superior to freeze brands. How so? In what regard? Simple, low tech, freeze brands are not only recommended by the Equine Protection division of the Humane Society of the United States, but in a Texas A&M study are described as follows: "Freeze branding can be done on horses of any age. It appears painless and does not scar or damage the horse's hide. The brand is legible, permanent, and difficult to alter. It can be seen from a distance."

Faraldo described chips in this manner: "The microchip is inserted into a ligament, is the size of a grain of rice and cannot be easily removed, and it does not migrate on its own."

My question is then how does it migrate, as we have heard first hand cases of two chips in one horse, and chips migrating to their shoulders, and chips on both sides of their neck with two different sets of ID, and this gem: "One of my horses was chipped a few weeks ago. A day or two later, the groom was sitting in the stall with him petting him on his neck. The chip had come out and was hanging there. If she hadn't seen it, it would have just fallen off and no one would have known. So not so reliable." There are certainly appealing points to microchips and scanners, ease of use at the track when racing, to name one, but to infer they are superior is also false. Again, both freeze brand and chip, together create an extra layer of protection for our horses.

Mr. Faraldo also claims that New Vocations and other groups do not wish the USTA to go back to freeze branding. If we are to believe this is New Vocation's position, then they are the only horse adoption group, of dozens I know of, that support making horses hard to identify. While New Vocations is very good at what they do, and I applaud their efforts, they are not operating a rescue organization, like SRF, and thankfully, many other organizations, and individuals, working to help standardbreds get out of dire circumstances. The horses New Vocations receive are donated, not pulled from "kill pens". Therefore New Vocations is not qualified to speak to the importance of a visible ID.

While I, and others, continue to work towards the passage of rule change proposals 4, 18, 20, and 21, which all relate to keeping freeze brands, along with micro chipping, please keep these points in mind. Thank you.

In some jurisdictions, only those who own 5 per cent or more of a horse require a licence. In other jurisdictions, even those that own as little or less than one per cent are required to go through the licencing process which, believe me, turns many people off. More people would join 'fractional ownership' groups if this was not the case. And many times 'fractional owners' develop a broader interest and want to buy bigger shares in horses. In those cases, I have no issue with them requiring a licence.

Kudos to the New Jersey Racing Commission

For some time now I have been writing about our regulator's shortcomings and the negative effect their lack of effort has on our public perception and overall future.

A lingering issue the questionable New Jersey Racing Commission (NJRC) policy of not interviewing drivers involved in a race incident that requires an inquiry has been highlighted in the 2021 Meadowland Pace. This highly irregular deviation from the industry norm of obtaining key information from drivers has been put on the front burner via the Charlie May placing in the Meadowlands Pace. Charlie Mays owner has filed an appeal since this specific policy has denied his right to due process protocols that clearly would influence the presiding and associate judges' decision. This past weekend, the NJRC "no call" policy was on the agenda for a presiding judges' meeting at The Meadows where it was announced that the policy has been rescinded.

It is not often you read about accolades for our regulators albeit "kudos" to the NJRC for pro-actively correcting a policy that infringed on the rights of their constituents. This development should have a critical impact for Charlie Mays' owner Don Tiger's appeal.
