# Black Friday horse shopping in Indiana

On back-to-back days in Shipshewana, IN, the Midwest Mixed Sale and Michiana Classic Yearling Sale both posted solid results, with the latter up 16 per cent in average over a year ago.

Shoppers intently search for that holiday deal following Thanksgiving, and in Shipshewana, IN it was no different for horsepeople in and around the Hoosier State. On Friday (Nov. 29) and Saturday (Nov. 30), the Midwest Auction Company and Hoosier Classic Sale Company LLC hosted events at the Michiana Event Center that offered a little bit of everything for those looking to add to their stable or broodmare band before the close of 2019. Each sale posted solid results, with top-level horses attracting strong interest.

"I was very happy with the sale. The dispersal attracted a lot of interest, but we also had several other nice horses that generated interest. The quality was up considerably," said

Midwest Mixed Sale manager Jeff Fought. "We've definitely established ourselves as a breeding stock sale. When you look at the number of in-foal mares, for the breeders that have yearling money, if they want to reinvest in some mares, it's a great spot to do it."

Now in its third year, the Midwest Mixed Sale offers weanlings, stallion shares, broodmares and racehorses the day after Thanksgiving. This year, the sale attracted a catalog of 140 entries, including the dispersal of Fought's Cornerstone Stock Farm holdings. He started Cornerstone nearly a decade ago, and on Friday, all but a few weanlings

Rainbowinthedark, a full sister to red-hot Bettors Wish in foal to Stay Hungry, topped the Midwest Mixed Sale on Friday with a bid of \$130,000 from Ernie Martinez acting as agent for John Barnard.

were sold in a total liquidation included as part of the Winterwood Farm consignment. The group of 10 broodmares consigned brought \$352,000 in total, with Shadow Play mare Skippin By topping the dispersal with a \$100,000 bid. In foal to Downbytheseaside, the winner of nearly \$900,000 was purchased by Bruce Brinkerhoff on behalf of Stonebridge Farm in Ontario.

Southwind Pearl, a Muscle Hill mare in foal to Swan For All, brought \$50,000 and will stay in Indiana, moving to John Schmucker's Black Creek Farm. Winterwood Farm purchased

three broodmares from the dispersal, including Riley Character, a Shady Character mare that has already produced \$560,000 winner Baron Remy. Mark Adams signed the ticket for \$45,000.

"I wanted to see these mares go to good homes. Winterwood bought a couple of them, one is going to Anvil and Lace in Kentucky, one is going to Stonebridge," Fought said. "They all went to really good homes, and that was important."

The sale topper did not come from the Cornerstone dispersal. Instead, Rainbowinthedark, a full sister to red-hot Bettors Wish, brought the highest bid of the day when she was knocked off for \$130,000. An agent horse from the Ruddick Stables consignment, the Bettors Delight mare is in foal to Stay Hungry, and her first foal will be part of the sire's first crop. Ernie Martinez signed the slip for Hip 49, acting as agent for John Barnard. According to the sale results, 73 broodmares were sold Friday for a gross of \$887,500 and an average of \$12,158.

Dude Included, the last horse to pass through the sale ring Friday, brought the highest price of all racehorses sold at the Midwest Mixed Sale. Sired by Class Included, the colt earned just under six figures as a freshman, finishing third in the \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final. Consigned by Fawn River Stable, Ben Graber purchased the trotter for \$77,000. Bluto gelding Gotwuteverittakes brought the next highest price for a racehorse with a \$50,000 final bid. The trotter earned just over \$116,000, racing second in the Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final, and took his sophomore mark of 1:54.3 at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Rick Bucci purchased the soon-to-be four year old. Racing stock that consisted of 38 horses grossed \$534,900 and averaged \$14,076.

# Michiana Classic Yearling sale up 16 per cent

Saturday, the Michiana Classic Yearling Sale took center

stage, offering a catalog of 172 babies. Despite 11 outs, 161 yearlings sold for a gross of \$1.215 million and an average of \$7,551, close to a 16 per cent improvement in average compared to last year's event.

Wheelinontheedge, cataloged as Hip 121, topped the sale, bringing \$75,000 for the Oakwood Farms entry. The filly, sired by Guccio, is a full sister to May Baby, a dominant force in Indiana Sires Stakes as a freshman in 2019. The James Yoder pupil won five Indiana Sires Stakes legs and finished second in the Super Final before competing in the Breeders Crown and finishing the year with \$225,000 in earnings. Martinez made the winning bid and signed on behalf of his Martinez Equine.

Rocky Road Reba, a Guccio filly consigned by Premier Acres as agent for Bluebird Meadows, sold for \$46,000. The second foal from Lucky Chucky mare Lauries Lucky Lady, the bay is a sister to Whom Shall I Fear freshman Bluebird Ladyluck, a winner of just over \$60,000 at Hoosier Park. Dan Shetler was the winning bidder.

A total of 24 Guccio offspring sold Saturday for a gross of \$281,800. The sire's progeny averaged \$11,742. By comparison, 13 babies sired by Swan For All brought \$158,700 and averaged \$12,208.

On the pacing side, Phelgon, a Rockin Image filly consigned by Luckiana Farm, fetched the highest price at \$33,000. The

first foal from Bettors Delight mare Phillys Delight, Brandon Bates signed the ticket as agent.

For the second consecutive year, a benefit was held in conjunction with the Midwest Mixed and Michiana Classic sales. Freeman C. Miller, a Goshen resident, served as the focus of the benefit. Miller has been receiving treatment for colon cancer and recently completed chemotherapy. Friday night a benefit dinner was held following the Midwest Mixed Sale, with local churches donating the food and meal preparation. There were roughly 2,000 meals served during the by-donation dinner.

On Saturday, breedings for 10 Indiana stallions were auctioned, raising \$47,100, and all 1,500 tickets for a raffle sold at \$20 each. The Indiana chapter of the United State Harness Writers Association offered a bucket of tack supplies

donated by Hawthorne Products that was auctioned, and then donated back multiple times to be auctioned again. The supplies, first auctioned at the Hoosier Classic sale in October and now the Michiana Classic, raised over \$9,000. Freeman Miller Jr., formerly a driver and trainer, and his brother, Faron, were on hand to see the fundraising efforts for their father firsthand.

"It's overwhelming, it really is," Faron said after the fundraiser. "To see the people come around and support him in difficult times, it's just an indescribable thank you."







# **Old Oaken Bucket winner Im Your Captain scores first** victory in Europe

Last year, Im Your Captain (Muscle Hill-Frisky Strike) won the Old Oaken Bucket for 3-year-olds in Delaware, OH, then trained by Julie Miller and driven by Andy Miller.

Swedish trainer Stefan Melander brought the horse to Sweden ahead of this season and on Wednesday night, the 4-year-old captured his first win on Swedish ground.

In the \$62,000 Solvalla Grand Prix over 1.3 miles, Jorma Kontio served Im Your Captain a pocket trip trying to stay with ambitious leader Evaluate, who got a bit too excited in front for driver Björn Goop.

Im Your Captain easily disarmed the leader and came home in a mile rate of 1:55.3.

Stefan Melander had four trotters in the race (out of six) and the outcome couldn't be better. Melander's Evaluate finished second ahead of stablemates Flight Dynamics and Canadian-bred Tito C.A.

# Beautiful Colibri tops in Paris for Allaire

In Paris, the \$66,000 Prix Vourasie for 2-year-olds were held on Friday night. Philippe Allaire dominates much of the group-race circuit at Vincennes at the moment. Allaire is hard to beat when it comes to races where younger trotters gather around the black track in Paris and on Friday night he showed 2-year-old Ready Cash mare Beautiful Colibri (out of Supergill mare Gilly Lb) to be in perfect shape.

David Thomain drove the Italian-bred mare to victory in a stakes record 2:00 over 1.3 miles and Beautiful Colibri will

most certainly be an attraction in several races for the 3-year-olds when 2019 is over.

Allaire's dominance continued on the Saturday's race card at Vincennes when 2-year-old Charly du Noyer son Helgaffel, driven by Eric Raffin, easily controlled the field from the lead in \$66,000 Prix Ourasie.

Allaire could once again note that his adepts took all medals in a group race since his Holzarte Vedaquais and Heart of Gold followed behind the winner. The mile rate was 2:02 over 1.3 miles.

# Andover Hall progeny win in Finland

Two divisions of \$71,000 Breeders Crown for 4-year-olds in Finland were held last weekend and Andover Hall progeny triumphed in both races since Tuomas Korvenoja's Lewis Ale took a safe wire-to-wire victory for driver Mika Forss in mile rate 1:58.4 and Peanuts (out of From Heaven Above) was outstanding from first over paired with Jukka Torvinen. Peanuts came home in 2:01 and the mare can look back at November with a smile. In the beginning of the month, she won \$108,000 St Leger in Finland.

# 100 for Emilia

Swedish driver and racing under saddle jockey Emilia Leo reach a great milestone on Friday night. At Romme racetrack, the 27-year-old noted her 100th victory during 2019, an achievement that is hard to reach by anyone in the game, but, traditionally — and unfortunately — has been especially difficult for a female driver to accomplish.

Leo is in many ways a role model for all the female drivers and jockeys all around in Europe and she has developed her strengths in the bike remarkably the last few seasons. Leo is often seen in the Swedish V75-game and she has also participated in several group races this year.

Generally speaking, her victories in 2019 are divided equally between harness races and racing under saddle races and at Romme on Friday night, Emilia Leo took three victories. Harness Racing Update will soon publish a longer interview with the girl on fire.













# Scott Young on a tear at Woodbine Mohawk Park

If you have been betting Woodbine Mohawk Park and haven't been cashing on horses driven by Scott Young in the past month, you just haven't been paying close enough attention.

Young has been on a tear and has created a buzz, and by winning the first 1 3/8 mile race carded on Oct. 31 as part of the current pilot project at the track, Young might even be part of a trivia answer. He guided the 4-year-old Andover Hall mare Venus Duharas to a 10-1 upset that night despite being parked the entire way, one of many longshots he has driven to victory. The mare was making her first start for his dad Bob and with that win things just seemed to take off for Scott. As of the end of action Friday night, Young had notched eight wins at Mohawk in November, with three of those coming as a hat trick on Nov. 15 and he has delivered a high win percentage.

"It's really been a dream come true," the personable catch-driver, who turns 28 today, said, beaming. "I was always doing a little Mohawk here and there wherever I could, and with Trevor (Henry) and Doug (McNair) being away, it kind of created a little more opportunity for me."

Young says all it took was a little push from a friend for him to try out Mohawk Park on more of a full-time basis.


"I was doing Thursdays for a while because Flamboro Downs wasn't that busy," he said. "I kind of got talking to Bobby McClure about it and he said to me: why don't you try to come here? I already kind of had ideas about it, but, you can go there all you want but you have to be able to get some work once you're there."

Young, who should take his 1,000th driving win early in 2020, said that racing more at the big track has been a case

of so far, so good.

"It's been great," said Young.. "I got some drives right off the hop, I got a little horsepower, and it's been a run that I sure didn't expect that's for sure."

Young's success has even created a bit of demand for his driving services. "I laughed there two Thursdays ago," he said. "I came out with six drives but two of them were two races where two different guys put me down on their horses. I was laughing with my dad, saying: look at me getting doubles downtown at Mohawk. I certainly never thought I'd see the day where I would have to pick and choose who I was driving at Mohawk. Some of the trainers that I've driven for all along at the B tracks are putting me on their Mohawk stock too, now and that's always well appreciated, too."

Young has gained Internet fame — some may call it infamy — due to a paddock camera catching him in action falling off the bike as he was leaving his stall to head out for a post parade in a race several years ago. At least a couple of times a year, the video gets shared by someone in the industry — usually drivers — and Young is always a good sport about it, as he was when I asked him about it.

"It was my second year driving, I was 19 and it was a Saturday afternoon at Flamboro," the Guelph resident said of the incident that sparked the popular video. "I remember it like it was yesterday. I was on the bike and I knew I was going to hit the wall because the bike was too far over. It was my own fault because when you are on the racetrack on dirt and you shift your butt over your wheels will move. So that's what I did, but being where I was, it doesn't work with rubber on rubber.

Young remembered that he shifted when he made contact with the wall and "that's when I ended up falling out because all my weight was going the one way." He said he knew that camera was there but he hoped he got lucky and they had already moved on to the post parade because the #1 horse was already on the track. No such luck.

"When I got out on the track, I told Billy Davis Jr. what had happened and he was killing himself laughing," Young said. "I said imagine if it got on film? When I came in that day, James Macdonald, who was still driving at Flamboro comes over and he starts laughing to me and I said: no way they didn't get that on film."

Macdonald's brother Curtis was working at Flamboro at the time and he captured all the action. "Curtis texted me and said, don't worry, I caught it all — Twelve minutes from start to finish and I already posted it on YouTube," Young said, laughing.

Now Young — who lists Pieceoftherock, Nickle Bag and Whiskey Tax as some of the best he has driven to date — is making winning videos regularly "downtown" at Mohawk as they call it, and at least in the month of November, he was the bettors' best friend.

# Flying high, completely potted

My one - and only - adventure with marijuana

# The best racing card of the year

The best racing card of this year, in my less than humble opinion, was contested last Saturday at The Meadowlands. The only thing missing from a perfect night of racing was the absence of long-time Meadowlands broadcaster Hollywood Heyden.

For once, the weather cooperated. Although it was slightly chilly, there was no precipitation, nor were there heavy winds that have often plagued major race cards especially those taking place at or near the end of the year.

The money and honors were fairly well divided.

As Dave Briggs pointed out in HRU the day after the card, the results still left the voting for Horse of the Year, as well as those for the other categories, uncertain.

There were only two runaway winners in all the stakes events. One was by Always a Prince stealing the TVG final in part because of a brilliant judge-of-pace drive by Yannick Gingras, seemingly putting his opposition to sleep. The second was by the brilliant 2-year-old Papi Rob Hanover who totally laid over his opposition.

Of the six events:

The eight winners were represented by eight different sires

The eight winners were owned by eight different entities.

The winners were guided by seven different drivers. Gingras was the only one with two wins.

The winners were conditioned by seven different trainers, with only Ake Svanstedt being the trainer of more than one.

The winners were bred by seven different breeders. Only Hanover Shoe Farms had two.

The breeders represented three different countries - the United States, Canada and Finland.

In terms of where the sires of the winners stood at time of conception, Pennsylvania had three, New York and Ontario each had two and Indiana had one.

# Dealt A Winner hits the century mark

How about a round of applause for Dealt A Winner, who has raced against three different Horses of the Year and took his lifetime mark against Wiggle It Jiggleit in the 2015 Cane Pace of 1:47.3. He also has gone head to head versus Always B Miki and McWicked. Dealt A Winner, son of the oldest living Horse of the Year Cams Card Shark, made his 100th career start-finishing 7th in the TVG Open Pace last Saturday and now sports a 100 21-16-10 \$1,307,799 record for Mark and Tammy Silva.

# McWicked (indeed)

McWicked retires with 110 starts and record of 40-26-16, \$4,931,842 in a career that saw him twice lead all pacers in earnings — and he did it four years apart — 2014 and 2018.

# Mother's night?

The dams of the top two finishers in the Three Diamonds were J K Shes A Lady (J K First Lady) and Rocklamation (Rocknificent) — the former a HOY and the latter a \$2 million winner.

E L Ideal won the Valley Victory and improved to  $10\,4\text{-}3\text{-}2$  \$523,934 on the year. His dam was one of the first ever half-million-dollar yearlings, Courtney Hall - \$500,000

# **Camille Booker – Professional** bid spotter and auctioneer

Although auctioneering is dominated mostly by men, the National Auctioneers Association estimates that women comprise seven per cent of auctioneers in the United States today.

A woman named Emma Baily was the first female to drop the gavel at an auction back in 1950. Today, the numbers for women are still surprisingly low for this growing career path.

But this didn't intimidate or deter Camille Booker from giving it a try.

Born in Richland, WA, Camille grew up riding horses on the family farm.

"I trained my first horse when I was 12 years old. Our horses were used mainly for pleasure and working cattle. Although I had zero background with racehorses, I always wanted to be a jockey," she said, laughing.

"In the 1980s, my father and grandfather launched an auction company that services Washington, Oregon, and Idaho — specializing in selling equipment, real estate, and fundraisers. My first job was running the clerk sheets to the office when I was only 5."

Years later, Booker would excel as one of the best female auctioneers in the country. She even won the International Auctioneer's Championship in 2011 in the women's division.

"My parents sent me to an auction school when I was 16 years old. Dad sent my sister and I to The Reppert's School of Auctioneering in Auburn, Indiana. It was a two-week course, which was an introduction into developing your bid call, and an overview of the auction business and profession," Booker said.

Today, Booker works full-time in the family business, and also as a contract auctioneer/bid assistant.

"I love what I do — from working with my family at home to my outside contract work. The versatility and people I meet make it unique and interesting.

"I've been doing this for 20 years now. I didn't fully pursue the profession until I was a senior in college. It was then that I realized I wanted to make it my career.

"I was fortunate to have parents who raised and instilled in me to work hard and chase my dreams. It has allowed me

some great opportunities to work with some of the best teams there are."

What does it take to be a good auctioneer?

"A good auctioneer should have product knowledge of what they are selling, and great communication skills with the bid assistants while commanding the attention of the crowd. An auctioneer's chant should be engaging and clear."

Booker also is also a spotter at horse sales. If you were at The Standardbred Horse Sales Company this November, you may have seen her there. This was only her second year bid spotting at the Harrisburg Sale and the prices brought for the yearlings sold were record breaking, smashing all-time average records.

The average of the yearling sale was up eight per cent and the gross was up nearly \$1.8 million from the year before.

"I was truly amazed at this year's prices. I was told that the sale was up from last year in sale totals which made us smile knowing we had quality horses being offered and hopefully happy sellers," Booker said.

Auctioneering and bid spotting are not the same, thus Booker really has two different jobs.

Spotting is different than auctioneering. A spotter is a bid assistant, an extension of the auctioneer and the liaison between a bidder and auctioneer.

"A good spotter has to be able to adapt to the auction environment and understand their bidders and what they

want. I wouldn't say it is difficult, but you have to be comfortable with people and a variety of personalities," Booker said.

Besides the Standardbred Horse Sales, Booker works at The Barrett Jackson, Marquise Arabian Auction, and RES Auction Services. She also assists her family at Equipment and Real Estate Auctions and Fundraisers.

With only two years of working the Harrisburg sale, Booker has gotten a reputation of being hard working, competent, credible, and an upstanding person.

# Svanstedt looks back at career of world champion Six Pack

Ake Svanstedt has only one favorite memory of now retired trotter Six Pack.

It covers roughly 950 days.

"His whole career," Svanstedt said, smiling, while sitting in his office several days prior to Six Pack's final race in the TVG Open Trot last weekend at The Meadowlands. "When he was 2, he was big and not so fast in the beginning. But in April (2017) he started to feel like a good horse. So, from that April until now, it's a big memory.

"I'm going to miss him. It's not so easy to find a horse like him."

Six Pack and trainer/driver Svanstedt went out a winner in the TVG Open Trot, giving the 4-year-old stallion 19 wins in 35 career races and \$1.93 million in purses. He was a Dan Patch Award winner at age 3, when he became the fastest sophomore trotter in history with a time of 1:49.1 in winning the Kentucky Futurity. This season, he became the fastest 4-year-old male trotter with a 1:49.2 victory in the Allerage Open Trot.

No other trotter in history has recorded sub-1:50 wins in multiple years. And his track-record 1:50 performance in the TVG gave Six Pack an unparalleled four lifetime wins of 1:50 or faster.

In addition to the TVG, Kentucky Futurity and Allerage Open, Six Pack's wins included the Yonkers Trot, a Matron, a division of the Stanley Dancer, a New York Sire Stakes championship, and Empire Breeders Classic.

"He's very good gaited," Svanstedt said. "He's a big horse and heavy but he has a very light gait. He handled the short tracks in New York very good. When he won the Yonkers Trot, I let him go the last quarter full speed. I think it was the fastest I ever drove in a turn on a half-mile track. He was always perfect gaited. Never took a wrong step.

"Of course, he had a good head. He was very nice to handle and drive."

This year, Six Pack won four of 12 races and hit the board a

total of 11 times. He made seven starts from posts seven, eight, nine or 10 this season, and another from the second tier. He finished second to French star Bold Eagle from post 10 in the Breeders Crown and second by a neck to Atlanta from post nine in the Graduate Series championship, in 1:49.1.

"It's unbelievable how bad the posts have been," said co-owner Jeff Gural, the chairman and CEO of The Meadowlands Racetrack, during Six Pack's retirement ceremony in the Big M winner's circle following the TVG. "Honestly, I think had he gotten good posts, we'd be looking at the Trotter of the Year. I don't think he would have gotten beat.

"It's been an amazing ride. I give Ake all the credit."

Svanstedt owns Six Pack with Little E-Knutssontrotting (a partnership of Gural and Tristan Sjoberg), Stall Kalmar Inc. (Tomas Olofsson), and L Berg Inc (Lars Berg). Six Pack, by Muscle Mass out of Pleasing Lady, was bred by Brittany Farms and will now stand at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey.

"Everything has an end," Svanstedt said. "I'm happy to have him all these years."
