Rare driver's objection demonstrates integrity

It would be nice if drivers objected more often.

In harness racing, driver objections are so rare that they tend to make news whenever one does occur. Unlike their thoroughbred counterparts in which jockey objections are a daily occurrence, nearly all reviews of possible race infractions in harness racing are initiated only by the judges.

All of which makes a recent objection at Plainridge Park unique. In Tuesday's 10th race nightcap ([replay available here](#)), a driver's objection was not only lodged, but was allowed by the judges and it resulted in the elevation of the second-place finisher to first.

Here's what happened. In the race, Nicholas Graffam drove the 4-year-old gelding Mic Woodrow. Sent off at odds of 7-2, Graffam – the fifth leading driver at Plainridge this year by both wins and earnings – moved his horse Mic Woodrow first over prior to the half-mile mark. Mic Woodrow engaged the race favorite and leader See Me Streakin nearing three-quarters, but flattened and then backed away around the final turn. In the stretch, Mic Woodrow didn't lose any more ground but remained a constant one to two lengths behind the same leader. With about 10 yards left to go and the race seemingly decided, See Me Streakin veered over a path to the outside causing interference to Mic Woodrow which led him to go off-stride.

What then ensued was the announcement of an inquiry with Mic Woodrow being the subject of the inquiry due to the break, but the graphic on the screen showed both an inquiry and objection. Within a minute it was announced that the inquiry sign was being taken down on the toteboard and that the focus was now the objection. In

less than two minutes the judges took down See Me Streakin and placed Mic Woodrow first.

I don't know what was more surprising: The fact that an objection was lodged to begin with, or that a decision was made to change the placings as quickly as it was. It was a borderline call that I think you could argue either way. Yes, there was clear interference but it seems almost impossible to think that Mic Woodrow would have won regardless.

The more important point is that Graffam should be commended for initiating the objection to begin with. He obviously felt something wrong had occurred and he made the decision to force the issue himself. In the process he wasn't just taking a stand for himself, but for the horse's connections and the bettors who had interest in the horse.

Aside from this occurrence and other rare instances, there seldom exists a driver's objection.

Marcus Miller – one of the sport's higher-regarded drivers – wrote on Twitter previously that objections aren't put in because drivers can't win them. He cited three times he's tried where the infraction's looked seemingly obvious, but all three times the objections were disallowed.

While this could be part of it, the overarching explanation is that harness racing has become a gentleman's game, which, of course, speaks to an even larger issue.

The same type of courtesy that drivers extend to one another on the track such as needlessly giving tucks, opening lanes or just generally playing nice for other drivers extends post-race. There's an unwritten rule that it's bad form for drivers to object to a race result.

One of the better examples to illustrate is the 2015 Yonkers Trot. In that race, Trond Smedhammer initiated a successful objection against a Jimmy Takter-trained horse that finished second. As was reported at that time here in HRU, Takter suggested that Smedhammer did something that drivers aren't supposed to do. Takter was quoted as saying, "That's why we hire judges." It doesn't bother me if I get taken down if it is done just by the judges. When a driver claims foul that's poor sportsmanship."

Takter isn't alone in those thoughts, either. More recently in the 2017 Hambletonian, driver Scott Zeron echoed those same sentiments. Zeron's drive in that race was obviously impeded and knocked off stride, yet the horse that caused the interference ended up with a fifth-place check from the \$1 million purse with no action taken against him. Asked by HRU at that time why drivers rarely initiate objections, Zeron said, "In an overnight race, we like to leave

things to the discretion of the judges."

The prevailing industry mentality doesn't make sense. Despite the friendly nature of harness races, most drivers are fiercely competitive. If there is a perceived wrongdoing, why defer to judges to see if an issue should be considered?

Like all of us, judges are far from infallible. It's not realistic to expect that they're going to be able to pick up every possible nuance in a race. Not to mention, the drivers are the ones in the middle of the action and are more well-positioned to note if a possible infraction takes place.

Above all of this, drivers should have an obligation to object to a result if they feel a violation has occurred. With tens of thousands or even hundreds of thousands of dollars bet on a race, drivers have an obligation to help ensure the integrity of the results.

I get it that in today's racing bettors aren't as necessary to the sport as they used to be, and as such aren't protected as they should be. But trainers and owners have a vested interest in the results as well, and you would think that their interests should mean enough to drivers to file an objection if a possible wrongdoing has occurred.

Much can be taken from the successful Graffam objection at Plainridge. Though it occurred at one of the lesser-followed tracks, drivers from other colonies should take note. The industry will be better off when it's not frowned upon for drivers to let it be known if they object.

Dead heat in prestigious 2-year-old race at Jägersro

The \$308,000 Uppfödningslöpningen for Swedish-bred 2-year-olds was held at Jägersro racetrack on Saturday afternoon and two horses shared the victory after a dramatic finish.

Svante Båth had four horses in the final, among them, the first choice Bythebook (Googoo Gaagaa) and second choice Global Adventure (S.J.'s Caviar).

Trixtion son Trix On Line, out of top mare Fascination, opened quickly from post one behind the gate and kept the lead while Global Adventure's driver Erik Adielsson chose to race without cover outside the leader. That gave a trip second over to Bythebook and driver Örjan Kihlström left that position and attacked three wide with a little less than a half mile to go. At that point, Global Adventure began to lose

his gait and in the last turn he made an inevitable break.

Bythebook seemed to sprint away to a comfortable victory, but the son of Googoo Gaagaa got hesitant when he was first in mid home stretch and from position far back in the field, trainer Sten O Jansson's Belker (Scarlet Knight) finished illusively fast. When the horses crossed the wire, no camera could separate them, so Uppfödningslöpningen crowned two winners 2018.

The winning time was 1:58.3 and Kihlström, who can look back at a career where he has won most of the biggest races in Europe, collected his first victory in this particular race.

Torbjörn Jansson drove Sten O Jansson's Scarlet Knight son Belker and the trainer from the island of Gotland has only one horse of a total of nine in his barn that races. A happy story for Jansson, who also is the breeder and owner of Belker, was satisfied with the result.

"We had some problems in the first turn, which, most certainly, got expensive in the end of the race. Belker is just an extraordinary trotter, just like his trainer," said Jansson.

For Svante Båth, the victory with Bythebook was his third consecutive in the race and Båth has entered the winner's circle in total five times after the oldest classic young horse-race in Sweden.

Uppfödningslöpningen replay

Bold Eagle mare best in Paris

The \$90,000 Prix Vourasie for 2-year-old mares at Vincennes racetrack became a successful story for top trainer Sébastien Guarato and his Bold Eagle daughter Green Grass.

Gabriele Gelormini sent Green Grass to the front and could rather easily keep their chasers behind them.

This was Green Grass' third victory in six starts and mile rate over 1.3 miles was 2:03.

Dryade du Parc (Ludo de Castelle) won Prix Joseph Lafosse (€135,000) under saddle for jockey Eric Raffin. Wire to Wire was the recipe for the victory in mile rate of 1:57.4 over 1.7 miles.

Heather Wilder – Wife, mother, interviewer and advocate

Many women in harness racing were lucky to have been raised in the sport because their family was involved in one aspect or another. Such is the case for Heather Wilder, wife of top driver Mike Wilder. She “grew up in the barn area” as the daughter of trainer Dan Altmeyer

“I always knew I would make harness racing my life,” she said. “It was never a question. I was hooked from the beginning. Not only were my mother and father involved, but I also had a strong influence from my grandfather and Uncles Scott and Dave Rankin.

“I’m sure that my family thought I would outgrow the fascination, but as the years passed and I learned more about the business from different facets, I became involved in not only the racing side, but the promotional side as well.”

The Meadows is the home of the prestigious Adios for 3-year-old pacing colts. Adios, the son of Hal Dale, was originally trained by Frank Ervin and for awhile owned by Harry Warner of Warner Brothers.

In 1948, Adios was bought by trainer/driver Delvin Miller to stand stud at his Meadowlands Farm. The son of Hal Dale/Adioo Volo emerged as the dominant pacing stallion of the ‘50s and ‘60s and is considered among the greatest sires of any breed. His male line is still prominent today through Artsplace, Art Major, Sportswriter and Sweet Lou.

The Meadows Racetrack is also where some of harness racing’s top drivers launched their careers, such as Dave Palone and Brian Sears.

Altmeyer is a well-respected name in harness racing. Dan married Ruth Rankin – the sister of Ohio horseman, Dave Rankin. This was not unusual for in the world of harness racing there are many cases of people marrying others in the business, so I guess you can say “we keep it in the family.”

Little Heather Altmeyer grew up to be a beautiful (inside and out) young woman who is not only the wife to Mike Wilder and mother to daughters, Scarlett and Lauren, but a strong voice in harness racing.

In 2013, Heather won The Lew Barasch Breakthrough Away Award, an award that honors a non-driver/trainer for early career accomplishments.

“I love working with the horses and help my husband, Mike, in our stable as much as possible. I also try to be involved in different things in the industry such as helping Jenn Starr do race interviews at Mohegan Sun Pocono Downs and the simulcast at The Little Brown Jug,” Heather said.

“I love every horse we own and treat them like one of the family. Of course, we can’t keep them all and I admit I cry when one leaves, but it is a business.

“I grew up at The Meadows and have seen the changes both at the track and in the business. The one thing I miss the most is night racing and all the fans who attended the races back then. That was when it was the most exciting.”

It’s not easy raising a family in the business, for often it requires being on-hand 24/7, but for Mike and Heather Wilder, they found a way.

“Luckily, everyone in our family is horse crazy and we all look through the same bridle supporting one another and each other’s pursuits.”

Watching generations in harness racing succeed is encouraging and exciting and the Rankin/Altmeyer/Wilder clan is one of the best out there.

Communicators Hall of Famer Marv Bachrad dead at 82

Marvin Bachrad, a member of harness racing's Communicators Hall of Fame, a former president of the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA) with 35 years as a director of the association, and such an influence on generations of harness journalists that he won the Harness Horse Youth Foundation Service To Youth Award, died Friday evening in Phoenix AZ at the age of 82.

Born to the late Max and Freda (Lipow) Bachrad on December 28, 1935, Bachrad was already doing sports journalism while at Norristown (PA) High School, into whose Hall of Fame he was inducted in 2015 – he gained fame by entering sports trivia contests and acquiring a massive collection of sporting equipment. After graduation, he worked in radio, starting in Beckley WV then gravitating back to his native Philadelphia area, initially his hometown of Norristown, where he conducted the first sports call-in show.

Two contacts proved important in Philadelphia: Tommy Roberts, owner of a radio station in Camden NJ (near Garden State Park) and a thoroughbred broadcaster who was an influence on Bachrad's being "double-gaited" in his horse racing knowledge (he had no family connections to racing); and the sports staff of Philadelphia's KYW Newsradio, where he quickly made his talents evident and covered the city's major sporting events for over 40 years, with a 1982 induction into the Philadelphia Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

Bachrad worked as an announcer at Liberty Bell Park and as assistant publicist to the legendary "Colonel" Dave Herman at Brandywine, and upon Herman's retirement after the 1979 season became the track's director of publicity. Working with the Electronic Race Patrol of Sid Alpert and his son Mark, with whom he worked while doing thoroughbred publicity at Garden State Park, Bachrad was a pioneer of pre-race handicapping on tracks' closed-circuit TV system, and an innovator in doing attractive and detailed video profiles of horses and horsemen competing at Brandywine.

Marvin later worked at TIMES: in harness, the Harrisburg PA publication that was the first major entry into the electronic reporting of harness racing news. He then was summoned back to the outskirts of his Delaware Valley roots when the state of Delaware passed slot machine gaming. He became publicity director at Dover Downs, a track that so profited from the new gaming that its late 1995 invitational purse in three successive weeks was \$2,000-\$5,000-\$9,000, and which rose from 55th of 57 harness tracks in terms of

purses to second a couple of years later. Bachrad served as publicity director for over two decades at the capital city track, using the combination of innovation, hard work, and attention to the needs of the fans that had hallmarked his career.

Bachrad also gave back to the sport on a national level. He was president of USHWA in 1992-1993, and at the time of his passing, his 35 years of being a director for the organization was tops among living directors of USHWA. He was a president of the Harness Publicists Association, winning that group's Golden Pen Award.

With such ability and success of course came many awards, with the crown his 1997 election to the Communicators Hall of Fame. His 1988 Service To Youth Award meant very much to him, being a mentor to many of harness racing's "next generations" of media – three of which have followed him into the Communicators Hall of Fame. He was the winner of Harness Tracks of America's Dan Patch Award for excellence in communications in 2005, and received a 2010 Special Appreciation Award from the Delaware Standardbred Owners Association, in addition to the other tributes mentioned above.

Bachrad was also a harness horse owner for over 40 years, from the early days of Liberty Bell, where a newcomer named

Herve Fillion was the trainer/driver of his horses, right up to July of this year, when his sophomore trotting filly Star Sapphire won a \$100,000 Delaware Standardbred Race Fund Championship at the State Fair in Harrington. He possessed a detailed knowledge of pedigrees.

Bachrad leaves behind two brothers, Allen (Marci) of Phoenix AZ and Ronald (Eileen) of Boca Raton FL; a bachelor, he also leaves behind four nieces/nephews and six grandnieces/grandnephews. His "extended" family, a lifetime of colleagues and friends, will also greatly miss his sagacity and kindness.

Lazarus N to stand in New Jersey

Taylor Made Stallions announced today that international superstar Lazarus N, Q 1:48.3 - BT 1:46.3, New Zealand's greatest and most accomplished racehorse of all time, has been retired from racing and will start his North American stud career at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey for a North American fee of \$10,000.

Named New Zealand Horse of the Year twice, three-year-old pacer of the year, four-year-old pacer of the year and five-year-old pacer of the year, as well as Australasian Grand Circuit Champion for two years, Lazarus N compiled an international race record of 51 starts, 37 wins 8 seconds 4 thirds 2 unplaced races with lifetime career earnings of \$4,125,988 in true racing dollars (no conversions), making him the richest standardbred stallion in history to stand at stud anywhere in the world.

A multiple stakes winner at 2, the precocious Lazarus N flashed his brilliance as a juvenile winning 6 times from 8 starts, pacing the fastest 2-year-old mile ever Down Under in 1:52.4 with a final quarter in :25.1.

Bred on Australasia's golden cross, being by breed-defining stallion Bettor's Delight out of a Christian Cullen mare, Lazarus has eight crosses to Meadow Skipper in his five generation pedigree similar to Sweet Lou, McWicked, Foiled Again and Anndrovette. Noted pedigree expert Bob Marks said, "Lazarus has an All American pedigree, for all intents and purposes he could have been bred and foaled in North America. Given his precocity and All American pedigree, there is no reason to conclude that he won't perform like a great

American stallion, and represent the logical extender of the Cam Fella line."

Lazarus N was a 15-time Group 1 winner, establishing five track records in New Zealand and another three records in Australia. Sent to race in North America, Lazarus N won the \$325,000 Dan Patch in his North American stakes debut. The mile went in 1:48.4. His next U.S. stakes victory would come in the \$177,000 Hoosier Park Pacing Derby where he paced the mile in 1:48.4.

Perhaps his greatest performance on U.S. soil came at the Red Mile. The mighty Lazarus N, parked the entire mile, much of it without cover, finished second in a beaten time of 1:46.3 while gaining at the wire. This made believers of those in attendance of his extraordinary talent. Lazarus N's trainer, Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter said in an interview with Michael Guerin, "This is just a great, great horse. I urge breeders to breed their top mares to him."

"We were so fortunate to have raced such an extraordinary talent as Lazarus," said Duncan Taylor. "We are extremely pleased that he is standing at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey. His sire Bettors Delight has truly been a breed shaper and a renewable annuity. Our expectations are that Lazarus will follow in his sire's footprint."

Mike Gulotta CEO of Deo Volente Farms added, "Lazarus N is arriving in New Jersey at the beginning of our renaissance. Both the legalization of sports betting and the expected financial support from our state government will result in a revitalization of standardbred racing in this state and a positive environment for Lazarus N. Just as Lazarus was raised from the dead, so too will New Jersey racing."

Shares in Lazarus N are now becoming available at the rate of \$50,000 per share with payment options. Share owners will be entitled to two breedings per year in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 with one breeding per year thereafter. Additionally, North American shareholders will share in Southern Hemisphere revenues.
