Campbell sweeps Century Mile stakes after breaking both wrists in a spill

After breaking both wrists in a racing accident Sunday at Edmonton's Century Mile, Brandon Campbell kept driving and swept both the Western Canada Pacing Derby with Major Custard and the Robert Byrne Memorial with Probert later in the card.

Twitter was buzzing last Sunday (Nov. 29) following two big stakes races at Century Mile, not because driver Brandon Campbell won as expected with the two favorites. His accomplishments that day were surely unique. Campbell notched the stakes victories not knowing he had suffered two broken wrists sustained in a spill earlier in the card.

Trainer Jim Marino tweeted out a picture of Campbell in two casts with the message: "After a spill earlier in the card, Brandon won both stake finals and an overnight with two broken wrists!" Sugar Doyle, announcer at The Raceway at Western Fair tweeted, "He's like 'The Moneyman' – just keeps going...Amazing!"

It was in the fourth race where the accident occurred and watching it live, you could see one driver get catapulted out of the sulky. That reinsman happened to be Campbell, who was driving A Cowboys Dream.

"We were just going into the first turn and everybody was filing in line," said Campbell. "The rail horse — I'm not sure if

she jumped something or what she did — but she went straight down in a pile and it was just a chain reaction, so we're all over the place. Tyler Redwood and James Jungquist, both their horses went down and so did Shes On A Roll.I was just in behind and I had nowhere to go and no time to go there. So, she went down, and I got catapulted over top of the whole situation."

Like most harness racing wrecks, this one started suddenly and without warning, but Campbell retained a vivid memory of the event.

"I remember being up in the air, looking down, going 'Jesus, it's going to hurt." he said. "We're a long way up, and I happened to hit my feet running and then came straight down on my hands. Everybody walked away for the most part, but we all got shaken up pretty good."


Campbell did not at first think he had sustained serious damage.

"I guess I knew that I had hurt myself," he says. "I started to notice a little bit of pain in my wrist and my hands."

But there were still the two major stakes races to be run. He admits, he might have been just a little in denial.

"Yeah, 100 per cent," he said. "I was looking forward to this race for a long time with Major Custard. And then I happened to pick up Probert."

Major Custard came into the \$92,840 Western Canada Pacing Derby final with a record of 18 wins from his first 21 starts, and despite a sub-par performance in the elimination the week before, the sophomore pacing son of Custard The Dragon out of the Art Major mare Chemistry was still expected to be sent postward as an overwhelming favorite. Probert, winner of the \$75,000 Mary Murphy Memorial earlier in the month in a dazzling 1:52.3 paced over Fraser Downs, entered the final of the \$88,320 Robert Byrne Memorial on Sunday on a six-race win streak. She figured to be bet even heavier than Major Custard despite both pacers being quoted as 4-5 morning line chalks.

Probert took command of the Don Byrne heading to the half and she drove away to a four-length 1:53 win while under some urging from Campbell, who admitted the encouragement hurt his hands a bit.

"Yeah, the only time it hurt was when I was urging for the most part," he said. "But when you're in that situation, your adrenaline kicks in. I was really thinking of just pushing through it."

Push through it he did, but the Pacing Derby win would be anything but easy. Campbell and Major Custard got into some road trouble which they would eventually overcome on their way to victory.

"It all started happening up the backside around the 5/8 pole," he said. "The next thing you know, we all bunched up really quick. At the last turn, I wasn't overly concerned because all the horses in front had slowed to a walk. They were all tired, so I kind of dropped back to Dave Kelly's horse, Make Some Waves and I was pretty confident that at some point down the lane, I was going to get enough room. Mike Hennessy was drawing off a little bit with Criminal record, but his horse was already tired, too. Once I got the big colt motivated, he just started moving and he paced by the front horse easily."

Major Custard took a 2 1/2-length win timed in 1:54.4. Perhaps buoyed by sweeping two big stakes races, Campbell still didn't feel his injuries were significant so he made the three-hour drive home to Calgary.

"My buddy drove and I just sat in the passenger seat and reflected on what a good day it had been," he said. "Then the

further we went down the road, they started hurting a little bit more. And I got home, had a shower and I tried to lay down but I couldn't because of the pain so I just decided finally, before anybody woke up, that I'd take myself into the hospital. The guy came to me and said, 'I got bad news for you. Both your scaphoid bones in your wrists are broken, so you're going to be in casts from 4 to 6 weeks."

Campbell isn't one to look for sympathy, but he was concerned how his two young girls Presley and Blakely might react. He came up with what he thought might be a good solution. He got both casts colored little-girl pink.

"They knew something was going on," he explains. "And I just thought it would kind of ease any struggles that they had and just make them happy when dad showed up with two pink casts on."

Two pink casts, each a memento of sorts for each stakes win taken on an afternoon at Century Mile that Campbell won't ever forget.

Pandemic year has many drivers staying put at The Meadowlands

Normally, some Big M regulars take some time off beginning in December, but 2020 is a different story.

Many drivers consider this time of year to be "The Grind."

After a long season, the combination of no stakes races, cold weather and fatigue – both mental and physical – has often led several members of the Meadowlands' driver colony to take time off.

But 2020 is not like any other year, so at least for December many of the Big M regulars are flipping the script and staying in town to race.

"I'm planning on racing right up to New Year's this year at the Meadowlands," said David Miller. "The older I've gotten, when the last stakes race is over, I was ready to pull my shoes and turn myself out, but [this year] I'm feeling really good still. I don't feel burned out.

"I raced in the cold weather for 30-something years and I really just don't like it anymore, that's the bottom line."

In previous years, Miller has taken some horses down to Florida and trained all winter, but in January 2021 he'll be taking his talents to Pompano Park to race instead.

Another draw for Miller is that his two daughters and grandson will be in Florida.



"I'm going to get to hang out with them," he said. "I feel like it's going to be a great winter."

Even though this may be known as the most wonderful time of the year, Yannick Gingras would beg to differ.

For him, it's the baby races and working with the babies in the spring just before they qualify and, of course, stakes season.

"Racing December to April is the less fun part of it, but it's part of the job as well," said Gingras. "Maybe 10 years down the road, once my kids are in college or are out of the house, maybe I'll do like some of the other guys. David [Miller], the first of January is going to Florida for a few months. That's something I would like to do at some point but my kids are too young. They're still in school and I'm not taking them out of school to go to Florida."

Gingras normally spends some of December in Maine near his wife's family, but the coronavirus pandemic has changed that, at least for now.

"We have a place we bought there five or six years ago," said Gingras. "It's right next door to her sister. This year we need to be careful and big gatherings in Maine are prohibited so we'll stay put and stay home and hopefully we'll get to see them next summer.

"I'd hate to be responsible for somebody else getting really sick. You've got to be respectful of others."

In recent years, Tim Tetrick has raced primarily at Dover Downs and Harrah's Philadelphia in December and 2020 will be no different.

"I'm going to take the weekends off and spend time with my family," said Tetrick. "I don't feel like racing when it's too-awful cold out and it's a two-hour drive for me to get up there [to The Meadowlands] one way.

"Even with the shortened season, it still seemed like we did a lot of traveling and a lot of work and I'm not 25 anymore. I've driven a lot of horses. I just had my 39th birthday and I looked it up and I saw I have 60,000 drives in 20 years."

Winter is usually the time when Andy McCarthy heads down under to see his family in Australia, but it's not just the pandemic stopping him from going this year.

His two sons, Finn and Olly, are in 1st grade and Pre-K, respectively, so trips back home may be planned for every other year at best.

Because of traveling restrictions imposed on anyone crossing the Canadian border, McCarthy had to remain North of the Border for three weeks while racing Ramona Hill.

"Even though it's a shorter year, it feels much longer for me," said McCarthy. "The Canada deal for me was very stressful. I did very good up there but I think it took its toll on me mentally, that's for sure. It felt like an eternity being up there away from the family."

Corey Callahan didn't travel as much this year and perhaps feels the better for not having done so.

"Normally everybody's kind of worn out by the time the Fall Final Four finishes up," said Callahan. "Everybody's kind of ready to check out mentally and physically. But this year's a little bit different. We didn't race quite as much so mentally a lot of us are ready to keep going.

"The thing about the Meadowlands is you don't have to have the best horse in the race to win. That's what I like about it so much. The other night I won with a horse that was 75-1 from last."

Dexter Dunn plans to take some time off but not until sometime in the new year.

Like Callahan, Dunn didn't make the trip to the Great White North and still has some spring in his step.

"I feel like I got through the year pretty good," said Dunn. "I'm still only 31, so I've still got a bit of youngness sort of kicking through me, so that helps a lot."

At the start of the Big M Fall Meeting, George Napolitano and Simon Allard picked up drives vacated by those who chose to travel, but they made the most of those opportunities and are currently third and fourth, respectively, in the standings.

"I think I went harder [this year] than I ever have," said Allard, who at one point drove at 11 tracks in seven days. "I am tired a little bit, but two days a week at the Meadowlands is not going to hurt me. They have the best surface. The track is so nice that horses never put a bed step in there."

For Napolitano, racing at the Meadowlands is special and he's very grateful to all the trainers that have used him, especially Jeff Cullipher and Andrew Harris.

"I've been dreaming about this for a long time and it's happening," said Napolitano.

"If it keeps on looking positive, I'm going to stay even though it's cold and I don't want to," he added with a laugh.



Nancy Takter was selected as 2020 Trainer of the Year by all 12 USHWA chapters and its At-Large group.

Nancy Takter is unanimous choice for Trainer of the Year

Nancy Takter was voted 2020 Trainer of the Year by the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA) – and her year was so spectacular, the decision to have her receive the award did not even have to go to a vote. How? There are 12 chapters in USHWA and an At-Large gathering – and Nancy was nominated for top trainer by all 13 of these groups, meaning that the award was decided at the end of the nomination process – there literally were no other candidates brought forth by the communicators.

With over \$8 million won by her trainees, 31 per cent victories and a UTR of .442, the horses in Takter's stable seemed to almost never miss in the big events. The leader of the barn was Tall Dark Stranger, a 3-year-old pacing colt who was a prime candidate for Horse of the Year honors off of a year where he won 11 of 13 starts and earned \$1,302,681, tops among all North American harness horses. The Meadowlands Pace, Cane Pace, North America Cup, and two Grand Circuit victories at Lexington all were taken by a horse who earned widespread praise from seasoned veterans for

his fierce tenacity to hold on to the lead late when threatened with defeat.

Takter also trained the great trotting mare Manchego, whose 1:49.3 victory at Plainridge, a 5/8-mile track, was not only the sole sub-1:50 trot of the year, but probably the most impressive trotting mile of all. There was also Kissin In The Sand, who capped her year with seven straight wins against the top older pacing mares including her Breeders Crown, plush her Hambletonian Oaks champion Sorella and Governor's Cup winner Always A Miki. The list could go on for several more lines.

When informed of her selection, Takter was pleased, but was quick to spread the credit around. "It's a very big honor, and I think it's almost more of a Stable of the Year award, really, because I am nothing without my team. They executed the work, adjusted to the COVID circumstances, and never lost their focus.

"I knew coming into the year that we had good horses coming back, which makes my job easier, but then there were all of the adjustments we had to make. It wasn't always easy, but we never lost our sense of purpose. That was huge."

Their achievements in breeding and racing under the heading Lindy Farms s represents multitudes of marvelous accomplishments. The time, energy and finance involved in keeping the iconic Red Mile in existence and thriving as it is today is another testament to their true dedication to our sport. Their partners in the endeavor George Segal and Joe Thompson have already been enshrined. Their time is now.

My next offering is a quiet gentleman that in some way or another has touched all our lives. Before the Internet, Eric Cherry's 900 number (the National race line) kept us all in the loop. We could get race calls, results, as well as immediate sales information. Now after many years have passed, Cherry's Ongait.com, has become an integral part of our sport and even more so with the present pandemic. His five decades of devotion to all phases of harness racing not the least of which was a major breeder are certainly noteworthy.

Another quiet gentleman and good friend that in my opinion has been overlooked for too many years is Per Eriksson. A more than dominant force in the trotting ranks toward the end of the last century, he won three Hambletonians and many other Grand Circuit races. He left our shores with wife Tina in order to raise their children in Sweden where both of them had their roots. There are no conspiracy theories involving his departure. His recognition is long overdue.

I promise to add to the list from time to time but will wait for my next offerings till the committee's announcements this summer.

Lisa Martin loving the Pompano life with Prairie Trinket and Prairie Virtue

Heat, hurricanes and broken hobbles can't slow Lisa Martin down, not when she's already charted a course for standardbred success.

It wasn't exactly balmy by any stretch – the mercury was hovering around 60 degrees Fahrenheit – when she took the call, but after a few bumps in the road, it seems sunnier days are ahead in the Sunshine State for the Pennsylvania-born trainer.

"I'm looking at the TV and watching the races at The Meadows," said Martin, daughter of longtime successful trainer Clarence Martin. "There's a lot of snow and rain. It looks pretty miserable out there, so I can't really complain." You might have forgiven her a couple of months ago if she had

Since October, Martin has been stabled in Florida, specifically, Pompano Park, campaigning a pair of trotters, Prairie Trinket and Prairie Virtue, co-owned (along with Laurie Poulin) by her mother, Mary Martin.

"It's definitely been different than home. Back in Pennsylvania, we have our own farm, and if we're looking to go a fast mile, our hometown county fair is only six miles away. So, it's definitely different going from a county fair where there are three or four stables, to Pompano, where it's a big operation, and is filling up more and more each day. It's been a little bit of a shock to the system and you have to get used to it."

So, too, do the horses.

Prairie Trinket, a 2-year-old trotting daughter of Diamond Goal (FL), didn't manage to get off on the right foot in her Pompano debut on Oct. 24.

The bay filly's race was over before it even started.

"Getting 'Trinket' going was a little difficult at first. But once we put the hobbles on her, she finally figured out her footing and began to put it together. Unfortunately, in her first start here, her hobbles broke behind the gate and she was pulled up."

Prairie Virtue fared far better than her stablemate on that same card.

The daughter of Shibboleth Hanover felt right at home on the 5/8ths oval.

"Our first win down here was with Prairie Virtue," said Martin. "It was the first leg of the Florida Stallion Stakes for 2-year-olds, but it was a non-betting race. I was little stressed out. When you looked at the fillies that were eligible for the race, there were 12 of them. I thought, 'Maybe there will be two divisions.' All summer I thought it would be a good race for us to be in. Then, I found out there was only division and it made it little more difficult. But 'Virtue' marched right out of there and won. With both horses, we just took things slow with them throughout the summer, knowing their races wouldn't be until near the end of October."

Both horses would have to wait two weeks before their next action, courtesy of a hurricane that caused a temporary cancellation of racing at Pompano.

"I guess it's safe to say I had my hands full over that time," Martin said with a laugh. "Prairie Virtue knew what it was like to race and she knew what it was like to win. She didn't understand why we weren't racing. Those two weeks were a little trying. She was on the engine with me during that time. But then things got better."

Much better, in fact.

No broken hobbles, no hurricanes and embracing warmer temperatures was a welcomed trifecta for Martin.

"After all of that, we got going again, the weather changed for the better, and Prairie Virtue was second, then second the following week, and then she won the [\$27,500] Florida Stallion Stakes on Nov. 29. I just really feel very fortunate to have both horses here with me."

Martin has high praise for the rookie trotters.

She also has high hopes for her "Prairie" duo.

"Prairie Virtue, she's just all class. She has a huge white blaze down her face. She's good looking, she loves to jog and she loves her job. She has pure desire to race. Prairie Trinket is figuring things out. She's getting better and she's getting faster. She's coming home faster. She seems to realize that racing is fun."

How they came to be part of Martin's stable is a story in itself.

It's a tale she never tires of telling.

"We owned Shibboleth Hanover and we ended up retiring him when he was seven," Martin said of the horse that now stands stud in Florida. "We were weighing our options, and we reached out to Laurie Poulin, and asked if she'd be interested in leasing him from us. And she did. Once she got him to Okeechobee [FL], things just took off running. He's done a lot of great things here for them. We had always wanted one of his babies. This time last year, Laurie called my dad out of the blue and said she had a filly if he might be interested. The sale had come and gone, and we had spent our resources, so we went to Florida to see the filly. We ended up making an agreement with Laurie to be partners on Prairie Virtue.

"When we got home, we started thinking some more, and my dad realized that all his colts had been broke, and he didn't want Prairie Virtue to be alone. Laurie had 'Trinket,' so she sent us her, as well. It's a pretty cool story. Some of my greatest childhood memories come from Shibboleth Hanover, who was the best horse my dad ever had. I can still remember the day he won the Sires Stakes consolation at Pocono. There are so many great things he did for us. I can see "Shibby" in her every day. She's a clone of him. For me, with both horses, it's been a fun ride so far."

But not one Martin necessarily figured was a sure thing. After posting seven training wins in limited action in both 2014 and 2015, she left the standardbred scene for five years.

It wasn't loss of interest in the sport that prompted the decision.

"Back in 2014, my dad came up with this great idea that he

should send me and five horses to The Meadows. I packed up and moved out there. The saving grace is that I'm good friends with Doug and Jan Snyder. Doug was my right-hand man and helped me with everything. I really got my feet off the ground there. After a while, things just weren't going the way I wanted them to and I came back home.

"Life had changed for me. My grandparents got sick. My parents go to Georgia for the winter, and my mom was worried about my grandparents. I told her that I'd move to Vernon [NY] and take care of them. So that's what I did. I ended up working at Turning Stone, the casino out there, and I was an event planner for three years."

After her grandparents passed away, Martin moved back to the Keystone State last August.

Just over a year later, she's back on track, literally and figuratively, in a place she had never imagined she'd find herself in.

"We always joke and I'll say, 'Can you believe I'm in Pompano?' I never thought in a million years this would happen. But believe me, I'm totally grateful for it. I always say to harness people that you can always go home. It always leads you back home in some way, shape or form. That's such a reassuring feeling to have. If things don't work out, I know I can always go back home."

For now, Martin is hitting her best stride 1,286 miles south of Honesdale, PA, thanks to a trotting twosome that are heating up in Pompano Beach.


And if she ever wants to step outside the training ranks, but stay inside the sport, Martin has already charted out other racing careers.

"When I was at The Meadows, I was told that I should learn more about racing by doing different things. I connected with the racing judges there and I learned how to chart. I'm a licensed charter and licensed clerk. I work at Vernon Downs. Between my mother and I – she's a licensed charter as well – we split the position at the racetrack. I also work at county fairs throughout the summer as the race secretary."

Whatever role she takes on, Martin will be well prepared for it.

"I love being able to do different things in harness racing. Having those things means that no matter what road I take, I'll always be involved in the sport."





Breeders Crown returns to the Meadowlands in 2021

The Breeders Crown, harness racing's annual \$6 million year-end series of 12 championship events, returns to long-time partner track The Meadowlands, in East Rutherford, NJ, for 2021.

Bringing the championship series back to New Jersey was made possible through the efforts of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey and New Meadowlands managing owner and CEO Jeff Gural, partners in what has long been considered the premiere harness racing product in North America.

"The Meadowlands is synonymous with championship racing," said Gural. "Getting back in the Breeders Crown rotation makes sense for all involved and is good for the business. I'm happy we could make this happen."

The Meadowlands is the leading host racetrack of Breeders Crown events, staging 91 events since the first Crown held there in 1987 and most recently holding all 12 Crown events in 2014 and 2016.

"All of us at the Meadowlands Racetrack are excited to host the Breeders Crown again in 2021," said Jason Settlemoir, chief operating officer and general manager of the famed mile oval. "The Meadowlands has a long and rich tradition of hosting many of our sports top races so it's fitting for the Crowns to come back to the Garden State. I would like to thank Mr. Gural, the Hambletonian Society and the SBOA of NJ for entrusting the team at the Meadowlands to showcase our sport's best."

The Breeders Crown will feature the four freshman events on Friday, Oct. 29. The eight 3-year-old and open races will be held on Saturday, Oct. 30. Eliminations for all events, if needed, would be held the prior week, Oct. 22 and 23.

"Securing the return of the Breeders Crown to The Meadowlands was a goal we worked with Jeff Gural to make happen," said Mark Ford, president of the SBOA of NJ. "We are excited to accomplish that, and look forward to an incredible fall championship calendar."

Since 2016, the Breeders Crown series enjoyed record-breaking runs at Harrah's Hoosier Park (2017 & 2020), The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono (2018) and Woodbine Mohawk Park (2019.)

"The Hambletonian Society has partnered with The Meadowlands to present many extraordinary races over the last 40 years," said John Campbell, president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society, which owns and administers the Breeders Crown. "The SBOA of New Jersey along with Jeff Gural and his management team have really pulled together over the last three years to strengthen and promote all factions of the harness racing industry in New Jersey, and bringing back the Breeders Crown continues that legacy."

Breeders Crown 2-year-old races are the richest stakes offered in the division, with \$600,000 finals in each gait and gender. Payments for the 2021 Breeders Crown program commence Feb. 15, and all information can be found at https://www.hambletonian.com/formsinfo.

The Breeders Crown Series was created in 1984 by the Hambletonian Society, one of the most influential sponsors of Standardbred racing. The 37-year-old series has typically crowned champions in every division for trotters and pacers and has been the deciding factor in Horse of the Year honors since its inception. More than \$209 million in purse money has been disbursed over 430 events. Originally conceived and executed as a traveling series, the Crown has been hosted by racetracks across North America and been raced as single night or multiple events.

At 4, she won the \$132,000 Joie De Vie in a career best 1:52f, and legs of the Graduate and Miss Versatility. She retires with over \$1-million in career earnings.

Custom Cantab will reside at Steve and Cindy Stewart's Hunterton Farm in Paris, KY, with plans to breed her in 2021 to Muscle Hill.

Longshot lovers love it at Big M

Longshot players had their way over the course of the 26-race weekend that took place at The Meadowlands Nov. 27-28.

Big payoffs came one after the other, beginning Friday night (Nov. 27), when the biggest scores came in the track's two 50-cent Pick-4 bets. The wager that spans races six through nine came back \$5,960 after \$83,617 was poured

into the pool. The Late Pick-4 – races 10 through 13 – saw \$64,548 in wagers taken and a payoff of \$5,486.

Driver Scott Zeron played a big part in the bloated payouts, scoring with 82-1 shot Stellenbosch – who topped a \$14,340 Trifecta – in the eighth race and 12-1 shot Enduring Hope in the 11th.

Saturday's card started with big expectations – and ended with a handful of bettors hitting big.

A 20-cent Pick-6 carryover led to a total pool of over \$32,000. Favorites did score in the final two legs of the wager, but it mattered little, as only two players cashed in large, walking away with \$14,143.

The 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 was the first of two wagers that saw only one winner walk with plenty of Christmas green. It only took five correct selections out of seven for one sharpie to hit for \$7,930, while the 20-cent Pick-5 was the biggest gift of all, as one player hit for \$55,157.

Quagmire Bluechip, 75-1, was the key to the Pick-7 and Pick-5 by scoring in the fourth race.

The weekend saw only six winning favorites – a meager 23 percent – but that did not stop the mile-oval faithful from betting a total of \$5,155,861.

"The Meadowlands gave the horseplayers an exciting weekend of competitive racing and the biggest pools in the sport," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "This resulted in the kind of payoffs you can only see at The Meadowlands when we have big fields, which has been a regular occurrence thanks to Gov. Murphy and the members of the NJ. legislature going to bat for the racing industry time and again.

"The average \$2 win price for the weekend was \$20.71, which allowed the players to shoot for the moon with their wagering. The overwhelmingly positive response from horseplayers around the world to our races and wagering menu not only shines a positive spotlight on The Meadowlands, but the great state of New Jersey as well."

EITHER WAY, BIG PLAY: The Big M is known for its big payouts, but the weekend before (Nov. 20-21), 13 favorites clicked (50 per cent) and betting was robust nonetheless, with a total of \$5,079,059 in action. Wagering has now exceeded the \$5-million plateau for three straight weekends.

THREE OF A KIND: Andy Miller, Dave Miller and Dexter Dunn did the most damage among the drivers last weekend, with each winning four times.

Andrew Harris led the trainers with three winner's circle visits.

"Despite all the challenges this year, we have been able to complete our meet without interruption and that is due to everyone involved working safely and carrying out all our safety guidelines. Hopefully the increased purses will help make the holidays a little better for all."

The final week of racing consists of Wednesday (Dec. 9) and Saturday (Dec. 12) with post time for both days at 5 p.m.

Nominations now open for Caretaker of the Year

Nominations are now being accepted for the 2020 Caretaker of the Year. The award, sponsored by Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie's Fair Island Farm in conjunction with the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA), recognizes the unsung heroes of the sport — the caretakers who maintain the health and welfare of the horses on a daily basis.

Initially titled Groom of the Year Award when first presented in 1982, the honor was instituted as a result of a suggestion made by Delvin Miller at the annual Harness Tracks of America meeting when he received HTA's Stanley F. Bergstein Messenger Award. Previously sponsored annually by HTA and Hanover Shoe farms, the tradition lapsed in 2014 but was re-established in 2015 by Hard Rock Northfield Park and USHWA, with Fair Island Farm coming on last year.

"Leah and I were very honored to continue the tradition of recognizing the outstanding caretaker of the year last year and we look forward to again rewarding an exceptional individual this year," said Zubrod. "While the racing season may have been altered a bit with the covid-19 pandemic, caretakers continued to work as hard as ever. A caretaker's work is important to the success of not only the horse, but the entire stable."

The Fair Island Farm 2020 Caretaker of the Year will receive a cash prize of \$500 and a trophy that will include a photo of the winning caretaker and a favorite horse.

"In 2020, caretakers have had to endure and persevere in spite of the overwhelming obstacles associated with the pandemic," said USHWA president Kim Rinker. "These folks are the backbone of our industry and have seen to it that racing has continued to not only survive, but thrive, in these troubled times. This award is a shout-out to grooms across North America and beyond who dutifully care for their equine athletes."

Any caretaker working for any stable or farm in North America is eligible to be the Fair Island Farm Caretaker of the Year. All that is needed to nominate is a letter or email, 200 words minimum, from an individual or group detailing the skills and special qualities of the caretaker.

The winner will be chosen by a seven-person selection

committee comprised of USHWA members, all of whom are former caretakers: Tim Bojarski (chair), Tom Charters, Moira Fanning, Dean Hoffman, Rob Pennington, Kim Rinker and Shawn Wiles.

Minnesota Racing Commission seeks assistant commission veterinarians


