# Ranking the 10 best horsemen of all time

Of all the tremendous horsemen The Curmudgeon has known personally, here is his list of the top 10 in terms of talent.




I was asked this question by horseman John Amidon: "Who is the best horseman you've known?" I will amend the question to: *Ranking the Top 10 standardbred horsemen I've known personally*. He did not ask the question specifically about standardbreds, but I assume that's what he meant.

## 10. Ron Gurfein

Basically the same resume as Chuck Sylvester. Gurfein produced three Hambletonian winners and is a member of the sport's living Hall of Fame. He started out with nothing buying cheap horses from Delaware, OH and racing mostly at Monticello. He was a master at getting good horses, especially trotting mares and making them into top ones. He then evolved into buying yearlings and making top horses out of many of them. He developed great relationships and worked with many of the sport's most noted owners, including: Phil Tully, George Segal, Jerry Silva and most notably members of the Antonacci family.

# 9. John F Simpson Sr.

How could anybody expect me not to have him on this list? Certainly, there is some personal bias involved, but there is nobody else who has guided the number one breeding farm in history for decades, while most of the time being blind. He was the youngest driver to ever go a sub-2:00 mile with My Birthday at Old Orchard Maine. He has been involved with three Hambletonian winners, driving and training Hickory, Smoke and Ayres and as the owner and man behind the scenes with Timothy T. He was also the developer, trainer and driver of the great trotting mare Elma when she raced in America. In 1957, he was voted Horseman of the Year. That year, he had the winners of the two most prestigious races of the time with Hickory Smoke in the Hambletonian and Torpid in the Little Brown Jug. He also had three other divisional champions that year. He trained several other world champions including the fastest 2-year-old ever at that time - Bullet Hanover.

# 8. Chuck Sylvester

Three Hambletonian winners bought as yearlings and developed by him. A member of the sport's living Hall of Fame. What more can be said of him? A whole lot more. A great guy and a great horseman. One of the very few in the sport of whom I've never heard a bad word spoken. He has never had an overly large stable, preferring to focus on quality rather than quantity, however rarely at a high price. With the exception of Muscles Yankee, virtually all of his best horses didn't cost a lot of money, but they ended up earning a lot for their connections. I would guess that all one would have to say would be Mack Lobell and Muscles Yankee and those two would put him on this list.

### 7. Ron Burke

I'll start by saying that no North American trainer has ever won more races, nor have had his horses earn more money than Ron Burke. That alone should be enough to land him on this list.

There are those who might say that with around 300 horses under his umbrella most years, how could he not have. Ronnie, his brother Mickey, Jr. and their dad Mickey, Sr. started off by racing a few cheap claimers at The Meadows.

As their success grew, so did the size of their stable.

There is nobody in this game who is a better organizer of horses and people. To a great degree, he is a one man show when it comes to managing the large number of horses in his care.

He watches each and every one of them race. He enters

them all. He decides on their drivers. He works harder than anybody I have seen in this sport since WRH (William Haughton). His organization capabilities are just amazing.

# 6. Brett Pelling

Not only a great horseman, but an extremely bright individual. He came from the great learning tree of Ross Croghan, from which many outstanding Down Under horsemen have descended. Pelling has made it on all levels, from training overnight horses, to Saturday Night Specials, to developing yearlings into champions. He has remarkable foresight and patience and is able to recognize great potential at a very early stage. There is no one around today who been able to or does bring a young horse around better, without subjecting it to the major stresses before bring it into "the fray that only the brave endure," to quote poet Charles McKay.

# 5. Stanley F Dancer

One of a kind. Somehow I think he should be ranked higher, but I don't know who I would demote to get him there. As a driver, he revolutionized harness racing. His "going to the top" philosophy and believing that being on top was the shortest way around the tracks revolutionized harness racing. Prior to that, half-mile track racing was even more boring than it often is today.

As a trainer, he was an absolute perfectionist. He expected no less than that from himself and everybody else that he had working with him. He paid his help accordingly.

Once he became a "colt trainer" he strived to acquire only the best. Price rarely phased him or his owners. When he purchased Dancer Hanover for \$105,000, it was the highest priced yearling **of any breed** ever sold at public auction. His stable was immaculate as was his persona. Noted thoroughbred trainer D Wayne Lucas was known for having an appealing and immaculate stable. Stanley Dancer was D Wayne Lucas before anybody had even heard of D Wayne Lucas.

Dancer's list of champions is innumerable. He'd reach in every direction to get the great horses that he wanted from buying and developing yearlings to getting great horses such as Albatross, Cardigan Bay and Su Mac Lad into his stable.

# 4. Delvin G Miller

If he had only stood Adios in the stud and played a significant role in breeding Meadow Skipper he would be on this list, but he did more, much more. He built a racetrack —The Meadows.

He was a great trainer and an accomplished driver. He

developed numerous champions.

However, if I had to use only two words to describe him, those words would be "unselfish" and "generous."

He helped to develop many outstanding people as well as horses. As Tom Charters has said to me, "Once I started working for Delvin I never had to look for a job for the rest of my life."

He was perhaps the greatest ambassador throughout the world that the sport has ever known.

# 2. Jimmy Takter (dead heat)

His success speaks for itself. I doubt that there has ever been a horse trainer who has had so many champions in his stable in such a short period of time. He is a perfectionist who has risen from the bottom to becoming the best trainer of his generation. He started with master horseman Soren Nordin and is the son of another master Swedish horseman William Bo Takter. I'm sure Jimmy learned a lot from his mentors but he has always done it his way. An area in which he has specialized has always been compartmentalization. He knows what he likes to do and does it extremely well. He also knows that others may be as good or even better at what he doesn't particularly like to do. He has put together a great team, composed of among others, his wife Christina (business and bookkeeping), Perry Soderberg (yearling evaluation) and Connie Svensson (farrier).

# 2. W. R. Haughton (dead heat)

A great driver and an even better trainer. He had the unique ability to make lemonade out of lemons. Some of, if not the majority of, his best horses were bargain basement buys. He was incredibly adept at training them all — pacers, trotters, males, females, stakes horses and overnight horses. He specialized with problem horses — those which his second trainers could not find the key to or just couldn't get along with. I always thought that the luckiest owners were those who owned horses in his "mutts" classes who trained on Wednesdays and Saturdays. If they were "mutt" students, they received The Master's individual attention.

A prime example was Seton Hanover, the only horse to defeat Albatross at two. Billy had bought him as a yearling for John Froehlich for a pretty fair price. Mr. Froehlich liked to have his horses train up north at Roosevelt Raceway so that he could come see them train. Seton was left with Billy's number one man Apples Thomas. From the beginning, the colt was a problem child. Apples couldn't get him to hit the pace. By the end of March, he still hadn't shown any inclination to do what he was bred to do. As a last resort, he was shipped to WRH in Florida to join his brigade of mutts. The rest is history.

# Bazire suspended again in France

French top driver and trainer Jean-Michel Bazire has recently returned to the game in the sulky after a 15-day suspension and now it seems like the dominant Bazire will have to face another punishment after an incident at Vincennes during the Saturday race card.

Bazire had three horses from his stable in a race for 5-year-olds and the judges at the Paris track didn't like the way Bazire gave order to co-driver David Thomain in the last turn. Bazire himself drove Ghazi B.R. second over and gave a signal to Thomain, driving Calina in third over, to attack three wide in the last turn.

Calina won the race and Ghazi B.R. finished second. The judges at Vincennes decided to hand Bazire an eight-day suspension, beginning on Dec. 18, according to Swedish harness racing media <u>sulkysport.se</u>.

# **Face Time Bourbon dominant winner**

French 4-year-old champion Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) had no problem in \$110,000 Prix Octave Douesnel at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Saturday afternoon. Björn Goop was eager to reach the front position with Sébastien Guarato's trotter and after 250 meters the betting favorite was in the lead.

The Prix Octave Douesnel turned into a sleepy affair from there, with no opponents seriously challenging Face Time Bourbon, who won in a mile rate of 2:00 over 1.6 miles. However, that performance is far from what Face Time Bourbon will have to turn in if he goes to the Prix d'Amérique in January, but we've seen that this 4-year-old is something extra and both speed and strength exist when the temperature will rise against older top trotters.

The next objective for the Ready Cash son will be the \$220,000 Criterium Continental against 4-year-olds from all over Europe. Swedish star Campo Bahia (Muscle Hill) and Italian-bred Zarene Fas (Varenne) will most probably enter the Continental, to be contested on Dec. 22 at Vincennes.

# Standouts from Horse of the Year history

Who's going to be Horse of the Year for 2019? Your guess is as good as mine. You can look back and say it was a year with no standout horses, or you can look back and say it was a year with a lot of standouts. There was, however, no absolute dominant horse, although Shartin N did lead the Top 10 Poll the entire year.

So it's dicey to make predictions in advance. It's safer to look in the rearview mirror.

This great honor was inaugurated in 1947 and the first official Harness Horse of the Year was Victory Song, a winner of 12 of his 20 starts that season. (By the way, Victory Song's

heroics earned him exactly \$17,172 that year).

The next year, the top honor when to Rodney, who spent most of 1948 beating up on his older predecessor Victory Song. Rodney was a behemoth of a horse and he simply overpowered Victory Song and others in winning 12 of his 13 starts that season. His championship season was funded by earnings of \$37,782.

Interestingly, both Victory Song and Rodney had come up slightly short in their Hambletonian efforts. Victory Song was edged by Chestertown in 1946, a victory many said resulted from Tom Berry's clever drive behind Chestertown. Rodney won the first heat of the '47 Hambletonian, but was no match for Hoot Mon's speed in the next two heats.

Both Victory Song and Rodney went to stud in the Bluegrass — Victory Song at the refurbished Castleton Farm and Rodney at Walnut Hall Stud. Both died at age 19.

Both Victory Song and Rodney enjoyed successful stud careers, but neither one sired a Hambletonian winner. Yet, their male lines live on today as two of the strongest in the world.

# Multiple winners

While it's a great honor to be named Horse of the Year, the greater acclaim goes to the horses that have won that great honor more than once. And the greatest acclaim goes to a pair of superstars of the 1960s that won it each of the three seasons they raced.

Those two nonpareils would be, of course, Bret Hanover and Nevele Pride.

Bret burst onto the standardbred scene in 1964 by winning all 24 starts in his freshman campaign and becoming the first juvenile ever to claim Horse of the Year honors. Then Bret repeated at ages three and four and he retired as the richest and fastest standardbred ever.

While Bret was exiting the standardbred stage, a surly Jersey boy named Nevele Pride was about to become the sport's lead actor. He never won any Mr. Congeniality contests, but he won just about every time he faced the starter: 57 times in 68 starts over three seasons. He became the other harness horse to win the top honor three consecutive years.

Other extraordinary champions surely deserve recognition. Niatross was named Horse of the Year as a freshman in 1979 and then repeated the following year after his jaw-dropping 1:49.1 time trial, lowering the existing speed records for standardbreds by almost three seconds. (Imagine a horse today clocking a mile in 1:43.1 and you'll understand the impact Niatross made).

Niatross was the first harness horse to win more than \$1 million in a season and the 1990 Horse of the Year Beach Towel was the first to earn more than \$2 million in a single

campaign.

The other multiple winners of top honors include the lion-hearted Good Time, a winner as a sophomore in 1949 and then again as a 6-year-old in 1952. That is proof positive the little tiger's staying power on the track.

Good Time and his trainer/driver Frank Ervin never ducked a fistfight on the tracks of America. His first HOY season in '49 came after he won 15 of his 19 starts, but when he repeated in 1952 ,Good Time found the wire first in 23 of his 33 races.

Scott Frost won the Triple Crown in 1955 and that was enough to make him Horse of the Year and then he repeated the next year.

Pacer Adios Butler was the sport's superstar in both 1960 and 1961.

Albatross was voted the sport's most dominant performer in 1971 and the following season when he was campaigned to everlasting greatness by Stanley Dancer.

Delmonica Hanover was voted the sport's best in 1974 despite winning only five times in 17 starts in North America. One of those wins, however, was a repeat triumph in the International Trot at Roosevelt Raceway and, early in the season, she'd captured the toughest trotting race of all — the Prix d'Amerique in France. It's a little-known fact that this great mare got her lifetime mark of 1:59.2 in her final career start at Hollywood Park.

Cam Fella, the horse that refused to lose, never ducked a challenge in his career and won 58 times in 69 starts in 1982-83 while shipping all over North America and racing on every size track.

Cam Fella wasn't flashy; he was just efficient. He probably won more races by less than a length than any horse in history. But he usually found a way to win.

Mack Lobell was the cynosure of all eyes wherever he raced in 1987 and 1988, including Europe, and his supersonic trotting speed made him a two-time Horse of the Year.

More than a decade after Mack emerged on top of the trotting scene, the behemoth mare Moni Maker won admirers on both sides of the Atlantic with her fabulous international campaigns in 1998-99.

Some superstars have earned the spotlight in the 21st century — Somebeachsomewhere and Muscle Hill, to name just two — but no harness horse has repeated as Horse of the Year in the 21st century.

What horse will wear the crown for 2019? The voters have begun making that difficult decision this week.

# **Unprecedented Horse of the Year** race in 2019

Assuming nothing changes, the top six vote-getters in this year's Horse of the Year (HOY) ballot, all will have lost their last race, which is completely unprecedented in harness racing history:

Shartin N Greenshoe Warrawee Ubeaut Bettors Wish Manchego Gimpanzee The likely top three finishers in the 2019 HOY ballot in some order had a combined 12 second-place finishes between them.

Shartin N - 3 times Bettors Wish - 6 times Greenshoe - 3 times

Outside of Shartin N's post 8 off-the-board finish at Yonkers in the Matchmaker in her second start of the year (she would later dominate the \$401,000 final), no other race saw this top trio worse than second all year.

A couple of precedents here:

No horse has ever been voted HOY while being the Hambletonian runner-up the same year. Greenshoe has that fact to deal with. Three times a Hambletonian runner-up has been HOY, just not that year. Savoir was the 1975 HOY four years after being the runner-up in the Hambletonian. Delmonica Hanover was the 1974 HOY two years after finishing second in the Hambletonian. Victory Song, the very first HOY in 1947, was the 1946 Hambletonian runner-up.

Bret Hanover lost three times to Adios Vic in 1965 as a 3-year-old — his only three losses of the year. He was easily voted HOY, and even more, he won his division over his only

conqueror 174 votes to 2.

This year, Caviart Ally decisioned Shartin N three times, all on mile tracks. We'll see how it plays out.

# Matts Scooter and Shartin N

The 1989 HOY Matts Scooter was the runner-up the year before and won more money in 1988 than 1989 (\$1,140,994 after a \$1,783,558 season in 1988). Shartin N hopes to be the 2019 HOY and she too had a larger bankroll a year back becoming the first mare pacer to post a seven-figure season. In the 30 years in between, no HOY runner-up has come back the next year to be named HOY.

# Killer "B"s

Bettors Wish, Bettors Delight, Bye Bye Byrd.

IF Bettors Wish is voted HOY for 2019, 21-year-old stallion Bettors Delight would be the first pacing stallion in 43 years of that age to have a HOY. Bye Bye Byrd was 21 in 1976 when his son Keystone Ore nailed down the award. Bye Byrd himself was the 1959 HOY as a 4-year-old.

# **Bettors Delight surging**

Bettors Delight was never a HOY, but possibly is a HOY sire in 2019 with Bettors Wish. In 2000, as a 2-year-old, Bettors Delight won the \$871,475 Breeders Crown and sported a slate of 10 6-1-1 \$804,661. He also sired Caviart Ally, whose late season surge put her into the national conversation as a dragon-slayer —and she approaches \$2 Million career.

Meanwhile, Bettors Delight continues to surge as a sire. He has been the number one pacing sire in four of the last five years and his progeny earnings keep growing with each passing year. In 2019, he is on the cusp of the first \$25 million siring season:

2015 #1 - \$21,022,068

2016 #1 - \$21,382,375

2017 #2 (to Somebeachsomewhere) — \$22,918,898

2018 #1 - \$24,563,132

2019 #1 - \$24,680,089

# **Resilient HOY winners**

- 1. Nevele Pride posted his 1:56.4 mile at Saratoga and his 1:54.4 mile at Indianapolis right after his defeat to Une De Mai in the high profile Roosevelt International.
- 2. Staying Together's 1:48.2 world record mile of June 19, 1993 an all-time record by a full second came after three straight loses in the Hudock, Battle OF Lake Erie and the Driscoll elim.
  - 3. Cam Fella started the 1983 season winning just two of

his first eight starts. Then he won 28 straight to go 30-for-36 on the year, a Horse of the Year (HOY) record for wins and starts during the award-winning year.

- 4. Even though Matts Scooter was fifth in the Levy, second in the Graduate, fourth in the Canadian Pacing Derby and disqualified in the Battle Of Lake Erie to second in 1989, he won 23 of 30 attempts en route to HOY honors. No horse has started that many times since and been named Horse of the Year.
- 5. Here's something you almost never see for a horse voted the best of the year. Precious Bunny's first three purses in 1991 were \$7,600, \$8,500 and \$9,400. Yet, he still set the earnings record for a single season (\$2,217,222), one season after Beach Towel became the first single-season double millionaire.

# How can this be?

Muscle Hill, Chapter Seven, Donato Hanover, Glidemaster, Malabar Man, Mack Lobell, Green Speed, Nevele Pride, Speedy Scot, Scott Frost, Rodney and Victory Song all were trotters who were voted Horse of the Year at least once, but never sired a Horse of the Year.

# Why not Frank first?

Bion Shively in 1967 at age 89, became the first ever trainer/driver inducted into the Hall Of Fame. Rodney and Sharp Note, the 1952 Hambletonian winner, would be his career highlights. Even though he was 26 years younger, Frank Ervin, entering the 1967 season, had five HOY trophies to his name. No one else had more than two. Ervin went into the Hall in 1968





# New York

# Kelley eyeing winter campaign at Yonkers for returning Obrigado

Multiple stakes winner Obrigado made his last start in the \$200,000 Caesars Trotting Classic at Hoosier Park Sept. 21, 2018. Despite finishing fourth beaten just 1 3/4 lengths by Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder and trotting his final quarter in :27, Obrigado did not emerge from the race well. Trainer Paul Kelley faced the reality that the career of his \$1.8 million earner was over.

"He had a little bit of a suspensory issue going around (Hoosier), which was something we had never experienced with him before. He's had other aches and pains for sure. It wasn't really looking too good. We scanned it a few times and pretty much the prognosis looked like retirement was probably the right thing to do," Kelley said.

"Wintertime was coming on and you want to find any horse a good, permanent home. I was kind of scrambling; I didn't really have any options. I figured the best scenario would be to get him someplace where he could be turned out for the winter and let him heal up naturally on his own."

Kelley sent Obrigado to Olive Branch Farm in North Carolina, where the 9-year-old wintered and recuperated. Come April, Kelley still didn't have a forever home lined up for the Boy Band son, so the trainer brought him to his racing stable at Congress Hill Farm in Monroe, NJ.

"He's one of those horses that you don't really want to part with," Kelley said. "At one point, I was thinking maybe I'll be the permanent home."

However, Obrigado didn't find retired life of daily paddock turnouts interesting enough, especially when forced to watch the other standardbreds going to the track every morning. Kelley recognized the horse needed work.

"We were putting him out in the paddock every day, but you could tell he was a little bored just doing that; that wasn't enough, especially being in the barn with all the other horses that were getting tacked up and going to the track every day. He's an intelligent horse and he wanted to do that too," Kelley said.

The trainer had Obrigado's leg scanned again, and with a

green light from the vet, began light jogging on the track, swimming sessions, and under saddle riding. Obrigado took to his work and started to rebuild his foundation. With routine scans coming back clean, Kelley started to step on the gas over the summer.

"The horse loves being on the track. He loves being out there with other horses. That was really the easy part of it all," Kelley said. "It wasn't like we had to push him along. He's always been a happy horse, likes work, likes the competition and all that.

"We just gradually increased the workload to the point where we got to August and we felt like he'd had enough groundwork, maybe we can start some more speed work with him. We did that and I held my breath for a long time thinking, 'Is he going to be okay? Is he going to come out of it okay?' So far, he's been remarkable, he's been just fine."

### **Harness Racing Update**

A 45-time winner in 92 starts, Obrigado's accomplishments include a pair of Maine Sire Stakes championships in 2012 and 2013 and the Crawford Farms Open Trot in 2015. Obrigado's biggest season came in 2016, when he captured the Maxie Lee, Charlie Hill Memorial, Cleveland Trotting Classic, Cashman Memorial, repeated in the Crawford Farms Open Trot, won the Dayton Trotting Derby, and competed in the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot before closing the year with a victory in the \$400,000 TVG FFA Trot. Obrigado remained competitive on the Grand Circuit in 2017 and 2018 before going on the shelf.

"Mentally, that horse has never changed. That's what's remarkable about him," Kelley said. "You see people sometimes; your attitudes go up and down throughout a racing season. You see that with horses; horses have lulls where they just don't seem to be too keen. He's never ever been that way. He's always just been real bright-eyed, real keen, head out over the gate, and ears are always forward. That's just the kind of horse he is. He's a happy fella and he really loves being out on the track and he loves being out with other horses all the time."

Obrigado raced well, but finished sixth Saturday in his comeback race — a \$42,000 open handicap trot at Yonkers Raceway. Dan Dube drove the 8-1 morning line shot from an assigned inside post for owers Paul Kelley Racing Stable, S R F Stable and Linwood Higgins.

Obrigado prepared for his return with three qualifiers at Freehold. Rene Sejthen drove Obrigado to a second-place finish in 2:01.1 over a good track with a minus two variant Nov. 1 and again took the lines in a 13 1/4-length qualifying win on a fast track in 2:00 with a minus one variant Nov. 8. Kelley brought in Dube for Obrigado's final trial Nov. 22, in which the gelding posted a 1:59.2 win.

"My second trainer Rene took him the first two times and he was doing the right thing with the horse and being cautious and letting the horse do it on his own," Kelley said. "I know from talking to Rene the weather conditions on those days weren't particularly good. According to Rene, they were both really good miles for Obrigado considering the conditions and the horse did everything on his own and real easy.

"I skipped a week and then I had Dan Dube take him the last time and I just told him, 'Make sure he does a little work the last half of the mile. He's got to go a little bit.' It was kind of a funny qualifier because he got caught in and a couple of pacers were battling things out up front. When Dan finally got him out and got rolling, I think he trotted his back-half in about :57.2 and he came a good last quarter, so that was good. It gives him a little bit of speedwork.

"I suspect it's going to take him a couple of races to get up to speed with the rest of the horses he's got to race against, but everything has gone very well. He's come back very well, so it will really be interesting to see what happens over the course of the winter.

"He's coming off the bench and he's been on the bench for 14 months, so I can't expect him to be tip-top, but maybe by having the inside, he can save some ground. I know the horse is going to be competitive from his own standpoint, but maybe he's not physically ready quite yet. I would expect it's going to take two races for him to get up to speed. I think that's realistic."

Although he will take things on a start-by-start basis, Kelley hopes to race Obrigado at Yonkers throughout the winter. Obrigado sports a 7-for-19 record at the Hilltop with seven additional placings, all at the open level or higher. Kelley will also look for options during Yonkers' hiatus beginning Dec. 18 and continuing into early Jan. 2020.

"We'll get a couple of starts in at Yonkers and then they go on break," Kelley said. "Maybe with Yonkers down, (Freehold) will be able to fill an open. That's a possibility if I can do that for a race or two until Yonkers comes back, but I think Yonkers is where I'd like to race him the most over the course of the winter. I think he could be a real good winter horse for Yonkers."

Kelley also hopes to reunite Obrigado with Mark MacDonald, who's last driving start came with Kelley's The Veteran at Saratoga July 20. MacDonald suffered a fractured shoulder joint, among other injuries, in a pre-race spill later that night, but is approaching a return to the sulky.

"(Obrigado) definitely likes this track, he knows his way around that track for sure, so it makes sense," Kelley said. "I don't want to get too far ahead of myself, but I'm hoping around the first of February, Mark MacDonald should be back and it would be great if I have the horse coming off the shelf and Mark coming off the shelf and we can reunite the two of them.

"The partners are all excited. They're all amazed just like I am that he's back. Horses like that, they're once-in-a-lifetime horses. They're remarkable in their own way. Where there's a will, there's a way and they find a way to get back in the game. I'm just hoping we can go week to week, he can stay sound and we can manage him properly and it can be a fun 2020."

# Southwind Chrome scores in Friday's Big M feature

After going off stride just after the half a week ago as the 4-5 favorite on the way to a ninth-place finish, Southwind Chrome rebounded in a big way Friday night, taking the featured \$30,000 preferred for trotters at the Meadowlands.

Sent off this time as the 5-2 second choice in the wagering, Southwind Chrome raced with cover past the quarter behind 9-5 public choice Muscle M Up and ending up clearing the top before the half, which was timed in a quick :54.4 with strong winds at their backs.

Midway around the far turn, Ake Svanstedt directed Muscle M Up to vacate the pocket and the duo then dueled all the way to the wire from there. Muscle M Up was determined, but Southwind Chrome was just a bit better, hanging on to win by a neck in 1:51.4 after a contentious stretch battle. JL Cruze finished third.

"He was super," said winning driver Tim Tetrick of Southwind Chrome. "We went a very fast middle half with a nice horse following us. My horse showed a lot of toughness to hold off Muscle M Up. My horse went a big mile. I'm very happy with his effort."

Southwind Chrome, a 4-year-old son of Chapter Seven—Counter Pointe who is trained by Jeff Cullipher and owned by Pollack Racing and Cullipher, returned \$7.20 to his backers. He's won 10 of his 30 lifetime starts and earned \$181,085.

A LITTLE MORE: Leading driver Dexter Dunn, fresh off a month of November that saw him win 23 Big M races, had three winners on the Friday card... Dunn and trainer Harry Landy teamed up to take the 11th and 12th races... One shrewd handicapper betting into the Oregon hub was the only player to last six legs in the 20-cent Survivor Pick-10 and cashed in for \$7,480... All-source handle totaled \$2,252,358 on the 13-race program.

# Eric Cherry: let's rebrand ourselves as "trotters"

This is in response to Chris Schick's concern, and rightly so, that our industry will be included with the issues that the thoroughbreds are dealing with in regards to fatalities on the racetrack (full story here).

I suggest that from this point forward we refer to our industry as the "Trotting" industry. We know the difference between trotters and pacers, but most outsiders do not. We also know that we race standardbreds, but the public does not and they confuse us with them all the time. When I explain the difference to most people they say something to the effect of "Oh, are they are the ones that pull the carts?"

It would be relatively easy, with little risk, for lawmakers to just lump us together. What strikes me is not the amount of thoroughbreds that die on the track, but that it is only double what was anticipated. We have a strong case since it is relatively rare for one of our horses to die in that manner, but we have to make it easier for them to remember that we are a totally different breed. By calling ourselves "The Trotters" it will be a step in that direction.

# Suggestions from a fan

At the close (in October) of the Grand Circuit meet at The Red Mile, Jeff Gural and Michelle Crawford and other harness luminaries spoke glowingly about the racing and tradition of that race meet. I was there in the late '80s and came away with the same reaction. Yet, I was amazed at how insular the whole experience was: so many people I saw there were folks I had seen in the trade magazines or on telecasts of racing programs. Unlike the crowds at nearby Keeneland or Saratoga or Del Mar, I did not see throngs of regular race fans. One problem is takeout rates so high that it is very hard for even serious fans to show a profit. For fans today who want to follow the meet via a turf club or an ADW, there are several additional issues. I'd like to address them with some constructive suggestions. For starters, the quality of the television signal is woeful. Even Hippodrome Trois-Rivieres has an HD signal. Hey, it's 2019! Perhaps John Campbell, who has come up with some very sound ideas in his new role, can work on this, at least for the Grand Circuit races. In the t-bred game, the Jockey Club recently came up with funds to aid some mid-tier flat tracks to go HD. The sound quality is another issue: sounds kind of scratchy. Equally annoying — in fact, bush league — is the approach to interviews. Quite often, part of the interview has to share the time with the race replay. I want to see and

hear the interviews; often the visuals convey more than the discussion. During a race call, I want to hear the sound. There are reasons we have race callers; their magic helps fans to follow the action and enjoy the excitement. What's the rush? In my last conversation with the late Sam McKee, he agreed with me that the Meadowlands races were being run a bit too fast, and that those at The Red Mile and WEG were much too fast. He also agreed with me that it is unfair for the fans and a bit disrespectful to those involved in the interviews to not broadcast both sound and picture. Sam did a great job with his race calls. Gabe Prewitt likewise for race calls and interviews. This year Dave Brower obviously had worked hard to be so well-prepared. Let's not be disrespectful of their work.
