When you get to that point in your career a positive would be earth shattering. You don't win classic races by pushing the envelope you win the years before in the sales ring and then prepping them properly for the big dances. Classic races are won by great horses, trainers are

There are so many trainers with multiple entries it becomes a nightmare of logistics to race that many horses for that much prestige and money.

I will say I don't like the four-eight split for the 2-year-olds on the first night and sophomores and older horses on the second. I really would like to mix and match with a six-six split. There is necessity for all the 2-year-olds to go on the same night.

Another plus would be eliminate all overnight races for those two nights. Fill the card with consolations and preferred and Invitational races. There are a myriad of top

horses that are not eligible to the Crown. I am sorry if this takes some effort to accomplish, but sometimes we can go a step further.

Lastly, give the bettor time in between races. Trying to go on 20 minutes rushes the participants as well as the bettors. The extra time would be a big advantage to paddock and winner's circle interviews as well as giving the drivers a chance to catch their breath.

I am so pleased that the Crown returns to the Meadowlands for no other reason that I feel it provides the most fair racing strip available in the U.S. or Canada.

**Tom Santoro asks: Does a harness driver know when a horse has received performance enhancing drugs?**

This is by no means an easy question to answer, simply because there are so many facets to explore.

If you asked me 30 years ago I would say unequivocally yes because the drugs were not nearly as sophisticated as they are today and an animal treated with performance-enhancing drugs (PEDs) would be more grabby or on the muscle than he was without the stimulant.

Today is another story. The driver may know more having trouble pulling the horse up at the end of the mile than he actually observed scoring down or going to the gate.

Blood doping would increase wind and stamina not likely to create a puller. However, high power pain killers might get an older horse feeling so good he may get a bit grabby.

All I have stated above is basically prudent conversation and is meaningless in the total scheme of things.

The top reinsmen are quite intelligent individuals. They are all well aware of what horses have PEDs when the draw comes out and they know exactly what is going on. Cheaters are notorious. Anyone that thinks that they are secretly getting away with murder is a fool. Don't think for a moment that if Jeff Gural or Ron Gurfein know who are using drugs that Gingras, McCarthy, et al aren't privy to the same

information and more.

Look back at the results from previous years. Who were the drivers named on the horses of the indicted trainers. Truly not guys with .107 UDRS.

The situation is totally different with the use of blood doping. Before its existence, trainers would treat a horse to be good on a certain day, a big race, or as a method to cash a bet, but not on a every race basis. Today with programs of EPO, bicarbs and clenbuterol, the criminals, in essence, have every horse in every race on their toes.

If you haven't read Brett Sturmans article ([full story here](#)) on Pat Lachance's recent success please do. It gives great insight on how cleaning up the cheating has helped the honest trainers. I have personally known Patrick since he was a youngster. There was never a more honorable, talented and intelligent trainer in my book. His explanation of his present winning streak speaks volumes about how far we have come in the past year. Hopefully this is not the end of the story and we will hear of more similar scenarios as time goes on.

**trainer earnings per start shouldn't Ake Svanstedt be up there?**

No question Plunge Blue Chip is a wonderful mare but her achievements pale in comparison to the aforementioned duo. We are talking about a Hambletonian winner and the Oaks Winner. Both Atlanta and Manchego are approach \$3 million and Plunge Blue Chip at \$1.5 million. This year's earnings are: Atlanta \$700,000, Manchego \$600,000 Plunge Blue Chip \$300,000.

Sometimes, when you like a horse, you tend to overestimate her capabilities. It's perfectly normal. As for Ake being a top trainer in earnings per start, he certainly is, and if memory serves me right he is second or third behind Nancy Takter, but something like \$7,000 per start behind.

In no way do I want to demean Ake or Plunge. I have the highest regard for him as a horseman and her as a racehorse. I merely want to keep the record straight.

**David Cannon asks: In Sweden all owners and trainers sign a contract, outlining fees and payments. Training fees are paid to the commission and forwarded to the trainers account. This way the commission has an overview of who is the trainer of record at all times. Do you think this would work in America and hinder this epidemic of beard trainers?**

Beard trainers will always exist and can only be discovered by live stable surveillance. There really is no money trail to speak of. Your Swedish model would in no way deter or expose the criminal. The beard trainer simply receives the cash from the commission and gives it to the real trainer.

That said, I love the idea, not so much as a deterrent to coverups but for the financial protection of the trainer. The amount of unpaid invoices in our sport is overwhelming.

I have at least a quarter of a million dollars on the books

that I will never see. The Swedish method would prevent that from ever happening.



## Rene Allard officially indicted in huge horse doping case

The Paulick Report's Natalie Voss reported Tuesday (Dec. 8) ([full story here](#)) that trainer Rene Allard is now officially indicted as part of a larger case in which some 30 standardbred and thoroughbred participants are accused by the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York of serious horse doping schemes.

On Thursday (Dec. 3), Allard's name was officially included in a superseding indictment filed in federal court against Louis Grasso, Donato Polisenio, Thomas Guido III, and Richard Banca. Prior to Dec. 3, Allard had a sealed complaint issued against him that was announced about a week after the indictment of 28 others was initially disclosed publicly on March 9 ([full story here](#)).

Voss reported that, "All defendants have entered not guilty pleas to one count each of drug adulteration and misbranding conspiracy for their role in what prosecutors say was a scheme to 'manufacture, distribute, and receive adulterated and misbranded performance enhancing drugs (PEDs) and to secretly administer those PEDs to racehorses under scheme participants' control."

"The superseding indictment calls for the defendants to forfeit assets acquired as a result of the alleged criminal acts."

None of the allegations have been proven in court.

Other harness racing participants who have been indicted include trainers Chris Oakes, Chris Marino, Rick Dane Jr. and Conor Flynn, an assistant to Banca. The thoroughbred horsemen involved include high-profile trainers Jason Servis and Jorge Navarro.

FBI special agent Bruce Turpin alleges that Grasso, who had a veterinary license and worked for Allard, operated a company that manufactured adulterated and misbranded drugs.

Voss reported the Dec. 3 indictment alleges, "that Grasso allowed his veterinary license number to be used by non-veterinarians calling in orders to pharmacies for a charge of \$100 per prescription, despite not knowing what the non-vets were prescribing to themselves. The drugs involved in the scheme allegedly included bleeding medications, pain blockers, and EPO-like products, among others. Polisenio stands accused of purchasing and distributing the drugs made by Grasso. Guido and Banca are fellow harness trainers. The drugs, according to the indictment, were designed to be undetectable in testing."

Perhaps the most disturbing part of the sealed complaint against Allard ([full story here](#)) does not directly involve Allard but is the text of an intercepted phone conversation between Grasso and Ross Cohen, both of whom are among the original group indicted. In that conversation, Ross and Cohen allegedly joke about horses of Allard's that, allegedly, died because of the use of illegal drugs. Cohen, according to the original indictments, is someone who was, allegedly, distributing performance enhancing drugs (PEDs).

The conversation reads as follows (and note this appears exactly as it did in the sealed complaint in terms of grammar and spelling):

**Cohen:** What's going on with the Allard death camp?

**Grasso:** (Laughter) well I didn't get any more emergency calls yesterday so I am assuming

**Cohen:** Assuming the number stopped at 7?

**Grasso:** Well yeah

**Cohen:** How many died?

**Grasso:** Three

**Cohen:** Jeez. What were you thinking?

**Grasso:** Three or two maybe.

Grasso and Cohen continue to discuss the effects of the drugs on the horses.

**Cohen:** Ok, maybe it was just the batch that Allard got I guess I don't know.

**Grasso:** They got high fever kidneys shut down.

**Grasso:** ...One of them just died on the table they just cut him open and poof it died.

**Cohen:** Holy f-k did they do an autopsy?

**Grasso:** Their heart rate was like triple they were breathing real heavy their membranes were going f-ing purple.

## Are New Jersey's stricter whipping rules a double-edged sword?

Can modified whipping rules end up being a double-edged sword?

According to the New Jersey Racing Commission (NJRC), the changes were made to protect New Jersey racehorses from harm.

Part of the rules restrict whipping to wrist action only and does not allow for the whipping arm to be raised above the driver's shoulder height, while another part no longer allows for hitting the wheel disk.

"The rule limits use of the whip to clearly identified areas," said Leland Moore, a spokesperson for the NJRC. "These limitations, which prohibit hitting the wheel disk, prevent interference with competing race participants."

This is certainly different from what our fans have seen for years and while it may be being done for positive reasons, it could leave our fans wondering what's going on.

"When drivers stop driving on a horse because they're not getting any reaction, the bettors will be like, 'Why did you stop driving on the horse?'" said trainer Nancy Takter. "Yes, we have to have parameters, but I think we also have to be a little careful about going down a rabbit hole where we're trying to please people that are never going to be pleased.

Because once you establish these types of rules, it's very hard to take them back.

"We're never going to please PETA [People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals] and those type of people. They're not going to be happy until all the animals roam around free on earth. I would love these people to spend a day in my barn and actually see how well these horses are cared for."

Trainer Ron Burke agrees with Takter.

"To me, I think bettors want the horse to be urged right to the wire," he said. "I get that people don't want to see these horses flogged around the track – I understand that – but the idea that you can't bend your elbow or hit the wheel disk? We didn't need this. It's just more rules."

Takter and Burke both expressed the importance of that urging in a sport where the difference between winning and losing can be an inch or less.

"The horse doesn't know where the finish line is," said Takter. "That's the only way the driver can be like, 'No, we're not done yet,' maybe just to keep them on task."

Burke said he believes even the great Foiled Again would have struggled under these new rules and as a result of the changes has had to make some changes of his own.

"Some of my horses can't race at the Meadowlands now," he said. "If you sit there and do nothing, they're just not going to go."

"If a horse is backing through the field and somebody is beating on one or beating one after the race. Nope. Nope. Give them whatever [penalties] you want to give them. The horse doesn't even know why he's being beat there. There was one guy who did something after the race and I texted him: 'The next horse you abuse of mine after the race will be the last.'"

No one in our sport wants to see horses abused, but will the changes actually have the desired outcome?

Similar rules have been in place for several years in Indiana and Hall of Famer Dave Magee, currently the presiding judge at Harrah's Hoosier Park, thinks they do have an impact.

"Everyone here is pretty compliant and the fines have been going down consistently because of that," said Magee.

When Hoosier played host to the Breeders Crown for the first time in 2017, Magee was an associate judge and it was his responsibility to speak with all of the out-of-town drivers and make sure they were familiar with the new rules.

There were no violations during the Crown elims, but

during the finals there were a total of six whipping rule offenses for using other than wrist action, which involved five drivers as one was a repeat offender. For each infraction they received a \$500 fine and a three-day suspension.

When the Crown returned to Hoosier this year, the number of violators decreased to four but the number of violations rose to eight, four of which occurred in the 3-year-old colt and gelding pace.

As opposed to 2017, no one received any days, but the fines increased as the infractions occurred and since these were stakes races, the fines were more. The highest amount given was \$1,000 for a fourth offense.

“Escalating fines to me seems to be more equitable and focused on the violator,” said Magee. “And it makes a statement to the other drivers that the consequences are well defined and are going to escalate if you consider the same behaviors.”

Since the new rules only went into effect at the Meadowlands on Friday, Nov. 6, it's a little too soon to know

how both the fans and horsemen are adjusting, but one thing that is certain is that the Meadowlands has always prided itself on being at the forefront of doing what's right for everyone on and off the track.

“We rarely have issues with whipping at the Meadowlands,” said Jason Settlemoir, the track's chief operating officer and general manager.

For the calendar year, there have been a total of 11 excessive or indiscriminate use of the whip violations and only three of those took place after November 6.

Of those three, one was just a \$100 fine, and the other two were \$500 fines that also included a five-day suspension.

Considering approximately 8,000 horses competed this year at the Big M, those numbers don't appear to be too bad, but only time will tell.

## Zach Miller put his first big score as a trainer to good use

All it takes is an educated guess as to what industry helped Zach Miller pay off his four-year education at Purdue University.

On the night of Sept. 10, 2011 at Indiana Downs, the 21-year-old from Amboy, IN was hoping Pacific Sun Rae, a pacing daughter of Panspacificflight (IN), would have the race of her life.

Sent on her way at 5-2 in the \$200,000 Indiana Sires Stakes 3-year-old Fillies Final, the sophomore bay, with Trace Tetrack at the controls, converted a head advantage at the stretch call into a 1 ¼-length win in a time of 1:53.3.

"I was still in school at that point," said Miller, who co-owned Pacific Sun Rae with his father, longtime Indiana horseman Alvin Miller, and Ted Comerford. "She was a nice mare, a horse we bought for \$6,500. We knew she had a good shot, but there was a really good horse that year, Radar Contact, that we beat in the leg before the final. It was the first time she had lost in 2011. So, we figured if we could work out a trip, we might have a shot."

Although the trip didn't quite work as expected, the end result was all that mattered to the connections of Pacific Sun Rae.

"The only thing that threw us for a loop was that our mare was a closer," said Miller. "She always came from off the pace. Trace, who always did a great job with her, would have her rolling late and she'd come home like a

freight train. In the final, she was first-up and going after Radar Contact. I thought, 'Oh, Dear Lord.' But, she was good that night. She drove on by and got the win."

It didn't take long for the younger Miller to figure out what he was going to do with his share of the \$100,000 payday courtesy of the horse that he keep on as a broodmare.

First on the list: seeing a zero beside his student loan amount. Second: a sweet ride.

"That was a good year and a great result. I wanted to make sure I paid off my school, and I wanted to get myself a truck. So I did both."

Smart decisions, on and off the racetrack, are nothing new to Miller.

When he joined the standardbred ranks as an 18-year-old, he made an immediate impact, winning his first official drive at the Converse Fairgrounds, in Converse, IN.

"I think I jogged my first horse before I was in Kindergarten," Miller said with a laugh. "I'm not sure if I was destined to be in racing, or if I was just born into it. But I wanted to make sure I completed my education before making any big career decisions."

After earning his diploma, Miller had two jobs, one outside of the harness world, and the other as an assistant trainer to his father.

He knew, early on, it had to be one or the other when it came to his career.

"When I got out of college, I was doing this and I had

another job. I did that for two-and-a-half, almost three years. You just can't do that. I didn't have enough time for both. I realized that you can't do either job right if you're splitting time between them both. So, I decided what I really wanted was to have my own stable.

"I drove a little bit (he has 64 career driving triumphs), but I decided to leave that to the professionals and focus on training. And now, I'm exactly where I want to be. I never wanted to have a 50-horse stable. That turns into an assembly line."

A smaller operation hasn't meant less success.

Over the years, there have been other memorable stars Miller has campaigned. That group includes pacer Mojoto Hanover ("the first nice horse I trained"), Fun Time, a pacing son of Full of Fun (IN) he trained and owned, and Winning Is Sweet, a pacing son of Dontgetinmyway (IN).

Miller trained and co-owned Winning Is Sweet with his father and Comeford.

"I bought him as a baby. He didn't race at two, but did race at three. We sold him at the end of his 3-year-old season at Delaware – we got \$33,000 for him. He raced at Yonkers for about seven months as a 4-year-old, and he broke a coffin bone. He went back in the sale, and dad and I actually bought him back for \$3,000. We gave him eight months to rest and he came back and made another \$100,000 after we got him. We raced him for two-and-a-half years and he ended up getting claimed for \$20,000."

Miller, who has 11 horses in his stable (10 of which he owns a part of), still helps his father with his operation.

He also works side-by-side with his wife, Dessa.

The couple has had success with Skyway Brittney, a 2-year-old daughter of Rockin Image (IN), they own. They paid \$6,000 for the bay pacer, bred by Lyle Slabach, at the 2019 Hoosier Yearling Sales.

Although she's winless in 10 starts, Skyway Brittney recently finished third in her Indiana Sires Stakes event, bringing in \$30,000 for the Millers.

"Dessa's a very hard worker and does a fantastic job. I

absolutely could not do it without her. She does all the barn work, takes care of the horses, makes sure their legs are good, and everything runs smoothly."

After four training wins from 30 starts in 2016, Miller duplicated that output the following year. Since then, he posted a career-best 19 races in 2018, and 17 in 2019.

Despite a 2020 campaign impacted by COVID-19, the stable has produced 16 victories and a career-best \$178,265 in purse earnings.

Miller, now 30, is hoping to find another Pacific Sun Rae to add to his barn.

And if he were to land that horse and win another six-figure stakes race, he already has a pretty good idea of where most of that money would go.

Spoiler alert: it's not school-related.

"Dessa and I have been looking for a nicer house, so that's probably where the money would go next time around. We had a pretty good this year and we got to buy some nice babies at the sale. Hopefully, there could be another special one in that group for us."

STALLION NOMINATION FEE: Due and payable January 15, 2021, in the amount of the advertised stud fee for the 2021 breeding season (\$500 U.S. funds minimum) -- plus an additional surcharge as indicated below -- provided, however, that for first-year stallions placed in commercial service (which would not include test breedings) after January 15, the nomination must be paid within 60 days after the stallion first breeds a mare. In no event will any first-year stallion nomination fee be accepted after December 31, 2021. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to determine the stallion nomination fee of those stallions whose 2021 service is advertised as private treaty, or if the amount of the fee is not advertised. This payment covers 2021 matings (foals of 2022).

In addition to the 2021 service fee, the amount of the stallion nomination fee must include a surcharge as follows:

a) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$3,000 to \$5,999 (or \$3,996 CAD (Canadian Dollars) to \$7,990 CAD), an additional amount equal to 40% of 2021 service fee must be paid;

b) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$6,000 to \$9,999 (or \$7,992 CAD to \$13,319 CAD), an additional amount equal to 75% of 2021 service fee must be paid;

c) For stallions that stand for a fee of US\$10,000 (\$13,320 CAD), or more, an additional amount equal to 200% of 2021 service fee must be paid.

For stallions that stand for a service fee of less than US\$3,000 (or \$3,996 CAD), no additional surcharge is necessary for nomination.

*Note: For the purpose of determining the surcharge in other than U.S. funds, the November 1, 2020 exchange rate is used; a rate of \$1.332 CAD per US\$.*

Stallion nominations for other than first-year stallions that are postmarked after January 15, 2021, but on or before December 31, 2021, will be accepted upon payment of an additional penalty amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge). Likewise, stallion nominations for first-year stallions that are postmarked after the above sixty-day deadline, but on or before December 31, 2021, will be accepted upon payment of an additional amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge).

Any payment on a stallion that does not commercially conceive a foal or breed a mare by any means during the entire 2021 breeding season may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2021.

Moreover, if a nominated stallion does not breed more than twenty (20) mares in 2021 or produce more than fifteen (15) registered foals in 2022, up to 50% of the stallion nomination fee may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for adjustment by December 31, 2021 (mares bred) or by December 31, 2022 (registered foals). No stallion nomination fee will be reduced to less than \$500.00 U.S. funds.

Any payment on a North American stallion that has been nominated by January 15, 2021, and is subsequently exported prior to February 15, 2021 and that does not commercially breed a mare in North America by any means during the entire 2021 breeding season, may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2021. With the exception of supplemental nominations or declarations as provided in the conditions, foals of 2022 by a stallion for which the above nomination fee has been refunded will be ineligible to the Breeders Crown unless an additional amount equal to the amount of the refund is paid.

Except as provided above, stallion nomination fees shall not be refunded.

Stallion payments may be made in the local currency of the nation in which the stallion stands, or in equivalent U.S. funds (\$500 U.S. funds minimum).

Conditions for nominating yearlings will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes & Futurities Nomination Book. Specific conditions for the races for which these foals are eligible will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes Guide in the year of the races. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to add to, amend or delete the conditions of all or any part of the Breeders Crown program, without liability.

In 2021, 2-year-old, 3-year-old and open Breeders Crown events will be conducted under the conditions of Breeders Crown 2021. All of these races are closed with sustaining payments due in 2021, with the exception of supplemental nominations.

## Billie de Montfort best in Milan

The \$333,000 Gran Premio delle Nazioni was held in Milan, Italy on Monday (Dec. 7) and in a strong field with several top trotters competing, a mare with super powers proved best.

Sébastien Guarato trained **Billie de Montfort** (Jasmin de Flore), paired with Gabriele Gelormini, burst past strong opponents at the top of the stretch and went on to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.3 miles.

Leader Zacon Gio had to use the highest gears reaching the front position and when first over trotter Vivid Wise As put hard pressure on the leader at the back stretch, Zacon Gio had to capitulate before the last turn.

And Vivid Wise As couldn't defend himself when Billie de Montfort attacked from second over in the last turn, so the home stretch became a safe trip to victory for Sébastien Guarato's 9-year-old top trotter. Chief Orlando finished strongly as runner up ahead of Volokaja Hindö.

This was Billie de Montfort's first win in 2020. In 2019, she noted three victories, among them a quite surprising win in Prix d'Amérique preparation race \$125,000 Prix de Bourgogne.

Billie de Montfort has in some way lived her life in the shadows behind other more merited horses in the French "B-crop". Stablemate Bold Eagle dominated the sport during a long period and the French crop born in 2011 is something special with horses such as Bird Parker, Belina Josselyn, Brillantissime and Bahia Quesnot. There is no doubt that Billie de Montfort belongs in top when the best horses in history are named and her \$2,828,000 in earnings puts her in third place in the league of richest mares in France. Only Roxane Griff (\$3,761,812) and Belina Josselyn (\$3,170,300) are ahead of Billie de Montfort at this point.

## Superior winner in Paris

The \$133,150 Grand National du Trot Final at Vincennes on Sunday (Dec. 6) contained a field of French-bred trotters who had qualified to the race via several local events at several different racetracks during the year. Jean-Michel Bazire trains and drives the horse that became the first choice in the race.

Bazire has become the master of the Grand National du Trot. He has trained the winners in the last four finals (Aubrion du Gers 2016, Bel Avis 2017, Ble du Gers 2018 and Cleangame 2019) and when the drama was over on Sunday afternoon, the trainer another trophy from the prestigious race.

**Elie de Beaufor** (Royal Dream) came to the final after two wins in the \$90,000 Grand National du Trot series and the 6-year-old gelding was outstanding at Vincennes racetrack. Jean-Michel Bazire couldn't possibly count on victory 100 meters into the race in this year's edition. Elie de Beaufor went off stride immediately when the horses left, which resulted in, at least, 60 meters handicap to the horses in front of the field, but when Bazire got contact with his opponents, the tactic was clear. An optimistic Bazire followed three wide with a little less than a mile to go and in the last turn, Elie de Beaufor could rest for a moment in second over, before the final attack was set at the top of the stretch. Elie de Beaufor disarmed horses on the inside and this was a very impressive performance in Paris. The mile rate was 1:56.4 over 1.7 miles and Elie de Beaufor has to be the number one target for many sports managers on tracks around Europe. Since Elie de Beaufor is a gelding, he is excluded from the big Grand Prix races in Paris during the meeting and Bazire has taken his shot with horses such as Aubrion du Gers in other countries than France previous years.

## Sixteen horses in second B-race

The \$115,000 Prix du Bourbonnais is scheduled at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Sunday (Dec. 13) and 16 horses take their chance to reach a spot in Prix d'Amérique 2021.

Diable de Vauvert, Feliciano and Bahia Quesnot secured their Prix d'Amérique spots, respectively, when the \$115,000 Prix de Bretagne was held on Nov. 22 and none of those three horses will enter Sunday's race at Vincennes.

Sébastien Guarato's super trotter Face Time Bourbon, title defender in the Prix d'Amérique, will contest the Prix du Bourbonnais on Sunday and he will be the heavy favorite in the race, but the 5-year-old Ready Cash son is basically already ready for Prix d'Amérique, since his earnings are enough to be one of 18 contenders on Jan. 31.

Eighteen trotters could have entered the race on Sunday, but only 16 will gather around the big, black track of Vincennes in the afternoon.



## American History to race and breed in 2021

Breeders Crown champion and millionaire American History joins a growing list of popular young stallions that will both stand stud and continue their racing careers.

As a 4-year-old he defeated his elders — including Horse of the Year McWicked — winning the \$500,000 Breeders Crown at Mohawk in 1:48.3-:26.3.

“In that race, he finally showed everyone he’s the horse we knew he was all along,” Alagna said. “So fast, so powerful, and so versatile... on that night, it all came together when he just blew past the field in the stretch.”

From the sire-making Western Ideal line — like first-crop sensation Always B Miki — American History has every ingredient for success in the breeding shed. He’s a powerfully-built, handsome stallion (\$150,000 yearling) and hails from one of Brittany Farms’ most respected maternal lines, one replete with World Champions and marquee stakes stars.

## Racing reflections with David Miller

David Miller never thought twice about a career, and it's safe to say his chosen path has more than paid off. Miller, who was enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2014, continued to add to his list of accomplishments in 2020, surpassing \$250 million in career purses and 13,000 in career wins.

The Ohio native, who turned 56 on Thursday (Dec. 10), ranks No. 2 in history in driver earnings, behind only John Campbell, and is No. 5 in victories.

"This is no lie; I knew at a very early age what I wanted to do," Miller said. "I wanted to drive and train horses, be around horses. I was around horses right from the start. My grandad (Clyde) and my dad (Donny) both had horses and trained. I remember going to the barn on the weekends at 7 or 8 years old and riding in my dad's lap on the track training and going to the races at the county fairs when I was little.

"I was lucky. I never had to second guess. I never played sports in school, I just wanted to be with the horses."

When Miller was around the age of 10, his father bought him an old pacing mare to take care of, helping set the foundation for the years ahead.

"I would jog her and train her; it was pretty cool," Miller said. "She couldn't go very fast, but she was safe. Dad let me loose on her and then soon I got to training with him.

"With her, I learned a lot. I had to take care of her, too. I had to clean her stall, jog her, I put her away. I bathed her, rubbed her legs, I actually looked after her. I think that's an important part of it. I think once you get to working with them, you grow more attached to them and you begin to understand them."

Miller began driving at the matinees at age 12. In the ensuing early years of his career, he began enjoying success at the county fairs.

"It took me a couple years to get my first win because when I was 12 or 13, I might drive three races a year," Miller said. "When I got to the fairs, those horses were pretty good. I just had to sit there and not fall off and they would usually win."

In 1990, Miller cracked the top 20 in wins in North America and three years later he was named the Rising Star Award winner by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. Since then, he has been named Driver of the Year on three occasions – 2003, 2015 and 2016. He has ranked among the top five in purses 20 of the past 21 seasons and is fourth this year.

Miller's 2020 campaign got off to a difficult start when two stars he piloted in 2019, Real Cool Sam and Papi Rob Hanover, were sidelined. But Miller's season picked up with the likes of Perfect Sting, Lady Chaos, Century Farroh, Cattlewash, Blue Diamond Eyes, and Test Of Faith. Miller won three Breeders Crown trophies, upping his career total to 27, which is tied for fourth in the history of the event.

"I did more than I thought I was going to," Miller said. "In about July, I was thinking this might be a lean year. But (trainer) Ronnie Burke started using me, and that helped, and I was fortunate to have some other really nice horses. It ended up being a fantastic season."

Miller does not follow his stats, but said reaching \$250 million in lifetime purses, which he accomplished while winning last month's Three Diamonds with Blue Diamond Eyes, was special.

"I'm very happy and amazed," Miller said. "It's a great feeling of accomplishment.

"People have told me, the older I get, the stronger I'm getting. I don't feel any different than I did 12 or 15 years ago. I still feel good in the bike and I enjoy what I do. I feel like I'm still in my 40s. I know some people might think that's still a little old, but I don't feel 55 turning 56.

"That goes to show you, you just keep steady, grinding away at it, and you never know."

Even if you knew what you wanted to do all along.

Leon Bailey is living his dream. The 34-year-old from upstate New York recently won his first driving title at Vernon Downs – an emotional accomplishment he dedicated to his late father Bill – took top driving honors on the New York County Fair circuit, and won his first races at The Meadowlands.

For the year, he has won 96 of 524 starts and \$288,971 in purses – all career highs.

“I’ve been waiting a long time to have a year like this,” Bailey said. “It’s kind of nice to have a little success. I don’t really know the formula of how it happened. I had some live drives early in the Vernon season, and success leads to success. You keep getting better drives the better you do. It just kept rolling. It’s like a domino effect.

“Even now, it still feels like a domino effect. Things keep happening that are better and better. I just hope to keep it going.”

Bailey’s grandfather, Jack, captured multiple driving championships at Vernon Downs and Bailey’s father won 1,513 races in his driving career. Bill Bailey passed away at the age of 54 on Sept. 27, 2018, after a battle with cancer. Almost two years later to the day – Sept. 26 – Leon Bailey accepted his Vernon Downs driving title.

“I can’t think of a single thing in my entire life that I wanted more than this,” Bailey said at the time. “Dad passed away two years ago. Unbelievably, he never won a title here, although he came darn close a lot of times. It got late in the year and I knew I had a shot. This one definitely goes to him.”

Bailey’s success at Vernon Downs this season included driving 4-year-old trotting mare Jenny Lake, who was named the track’s Horse of the Year after winning eight of 12 starts there.

Other top moments for Bailey were winning New York County Fair championships with Miley Rose, a 2-year-old pacing filly he also trains, and 3-year-old pacing colt Mr Dunnigans. On Oct. 9, he won two races at The Meadowlands and last month he added a third triumph at The Big M with 91-1 longshot Milady Denver A.

“There have been so many highlights,” said Bailey, who has won 370 races lifetime. “The goal now is to keep having good things happen and to keep putting myself in a position to have good things happen.”

Bailey, who is quick to thank all the horsepeople that have contributed to his success, has not slowed down since Vernon

Downs’ season ended in September. In addition to racing at The Meadowlands, he is competing at Freehold, Monticello, and Yonkers. This past Friday, he drove at three tracks, beginning his day with four starts at Freehold before two at Yonkers and one at The Meadowlands.

“That was something I’d never done before; I didn’t even think it would be possible to drive three racetracks in a day,” Bailey said. “That was cool. It was a lot of fun.

“I don’t have a specific day that I’m at a certain track, it’s whenever and wherever the horses get in,” he continued, adding with a laugh, “My truck has turned into my personal locker room. I’ve got my colors, my boots, an extra set of clothes. I need to find a little dresser that fits in there and I’ll be all set.”

Bailey dabbled with jobs outside of harness racing years ago, but returned to the sport to pursue his dream.

“My goal in life has always been to be a catch driver,” Bailey said. “I absolutely enjoy taking care of the horses, I like putting my all into them to see them do better, but driving is the biggest thing.

“I’ve always wanted to be leading driver (at Vernon) so I wanted to do whatever I could do to get to that point or get closer to that point. It all falls into that experience category. It’s kind of hard to come up with a plan for it, you just have to take what you get and hope you do well with it.

“I finally got there.”

## **Fiftydallarbill to stand stud at Chapel Ridge Farm**

Fiftydallarbill 2, 1:55; 3, 1:52.1f; 4, 1:50.2 (\$1,056,238), the winner of the 2018 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Trot, has been retired to stud duty and will stand at Lester Schmucker's Chapel Ridge Farm in Indiana. He is the fastest trotter in history to stand at stud in Indiana.

"He raced two heats in the Futurity on that incredibly hot day and to come back and win the Indiana Super Final, he just showed what an incredible warhorse horse he is," said Barnard. "After the Futurity we didn't know if he should race five days later, but he showed he was healthy and ready to go."

Fiftydallarbill returned to the track as a 4-year-old and took a lifetime mark of 1:50.2 when he defeated Six Pack in a Graduate Series leg at the Meadowlands.

Fiftydallarbill is by the top sire Swan For All and out of the Royal Troubador mare CR Dixie Chick, a full sister to world champion and Dan Patch winner CR Commando 2, 1:53.2z. Swan For All, the perennial leading sire in Indiana, has sired the winners of nearly \$30 million, led, by his richest son, Fiftydallarbill.

Fiftydallarbill will stand the 2021 breeding season for an introductory fee of \$5,000 at Chapel Ridge Farm, presenting a great opportunity for Indiana breeders and anyone interested in participating in the Hoosier State program.

"In addition to his racing credentials, Fiftydallarbill has so many great attributes," said Schmucker. "I had Fiftydallarbill as a yearling and I've never had a horse as smart as he is. He's just an incredible individual."

## Millionaire Dapper Dude to retire to stud after today's race at The Meadows

He's banked nearly \$1.4 million, and he could out-tough almost every opponent he ever faced. But that old warhorse Father Time proved even more persistent, so after his start today (Dec. 11) at The Meadows, 11-year-old Dapper Dude will retire from racing and launch the next phase of his glorious career at stud.

Dapper Dude leaves from post 2, race 6, with his favorite driver, Aaron Merriman, in the sulky.

In his recent starts, the son of The Panderosa—Dressed To Suggest has looked nothing like his old self, drifting through the class ranks and bottoming out in low-end conditioned races. His trainer, Tim Twaddle, said it's painfully clear to him that retirement is Dapper Dude's best option.

"He still tries hard but doesn't have it like he should," Twaddle said. "I don't want to prolong the obvious."

He indicated that Dapper Dude would stand at Harris Paint Horses & Stallion Station in Federalsburg, MD and that David Cohen's Micki Rae Stables would continue to own him.

Hall of Famer Bob McIntosh and his cousin, Al McIntosh, bred Dapper Dude and campaigned him during his freshman and sophomore seasons. They knew early on they had something special.

"He comes from a great family, and you couldn't draw a better-looking horse," Bob McIntosh said. "He was tough as an army boot, and he wore well."

At 3, the handsome chestnut finished third in the North America Cup final, and he bested the redoubtable Sweet Lou in the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championship.

Dapper Dude subsequently was sold several times; for each new owner, he showed that same speed and grit — despite multiple throat surgeries. In many of his races at The Meadows, he looked so weary into the final turn that it appeared only an oxygen tank could get him home. But when a rival looked him the eye, he found more and usually prevailed. To Merriman, that determination is what marks him as a champion.

"He exudes such class," Merriman said. "I don't know how many times he seemed defeated yet came back in the stretch to win or improve his position. He knew where the money was. When you consider that he suffered with breathing problems his whole life, it's amazing that he accomplished what he did."

Dapper Dude's exuberance is as noteworthy as his toughness. Bill Bercury, who trained him for Renee Bercury for most of his time at The Meadows, notes that the horse is "loaded with personality."

"When you took him off the trailer," Bercury says, "he would start bellowing, letting everybody know he was there, as if to say, 'I am here. I am ready. Watch out.' Then he'd strut into the ship-in barn."

Harris Paint Horses & Stallion Station has a short list of standardbred stallions, so Dapper Dude has a chance to make an immediate impact. Twaddle said he plans to acquire some broodmares to send to Dapper Dude to get him off to a good start.

"I was looking at his win pictures the other night, and every single one of them was by a head, a nose, a neck," Twaddle said. "He never ran off, just did whatever was necessary to beat them down. If he can pass along that trait, he'll make a lot of people happy."

## Presents come early for Big M faithful

Temperatures may be falling, but many popular wagers at The Meadowlands have seen payoffs on the rise of late, much to the delight of those playing at the mile oval.

The 20-cent Pick-5 did not pay anything special — \$141.10 — on Nov. 27, when the first three winners in the sequence

went off at odds of 3-5, 8-5 and 5-2, but since then, it has been a big-payoff bonanza in the multi-leg wager that begins the card on a nightly basis.

On Saturday, Nov. 28, one sharp player raked the pot (being the only winner), cashing in for \$55,157. That bettor may have been helped by the “all” button in the fourth race when a 75-1 shot scored, but the other four legs – despite none being won by the favorite – did not have any winner score at odds in excess of 9-2.

Last weekend (Dec. 4-5), the Pick-5s came back \$1,444 and \$5,886 on Friday and Saturday, respectively, but P5 players were not the only ones able to check everything off their respective Christmas gift lists after making some big scores at The Big M.

Recent action – and returns – on the track’s “signature” Pick-4 wagers have been strong as well. Over the last four race cards, nightly handle on the bets that begin in races six and 10, respectively, has been at least \$132,000, with a high of \$170,822 put in play last Saturday.

The Early Pick-4 on Nov. 27 paid a handsome \$5,960 despite two 3-1 shots and an 8-5 favorite scoring. An 80-1 chance proved to be the key for those cashing tickets.

The Late P4 came back \$3,558 on Dec. 4 when a pair of 4-1 chances and a 1-2 chalk were joined in the sequence by a 39-1 bomb. Clearly, there are Big M bets where windfalls can result if players can find that one race that drives the big return.

“We are extremely pleased at how the wagering public has responded to the low [15 per cent] takeout wagers,” said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. “The Meadowlands has always tried to have the most exciting and price-conscious wagering menu in the sport, and the current betting lineup has made all kinds of big scores possible for Big M players around the world.”

Some other recent noteworthy payouts include the \$15,163 on Nov. 21 and \$7,930 on Nov. 28 that 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 players enjoyed.

The 20-cent Pick-6 has been creating a stir for about a month with carryovers on the last four Saturday programs. Two recent payouts stand far above the rest, as on Nov. 14, the return was \$5,642, while on Nov. 28 – when the final two legs were won by favorites – two winners walked away with \$14,143.

“The growing interest in our wagering product resulted in the biggest handle of the Fall Meeting on Saturday [Dec. 5],” said Settlemoir.

Indeed, the \$2,894,040 pushed through the windows was a meet

best and pushed the streak of Saturdays with at least \$2.5 million in handle to five. In addition, The Big M has seen wagering exceed the \$5-million level for four consecutive weekends.

Historically, Meadowlands’ bettors love the track for its vulnerable favorites, but a look at recent returns reveal total handle is brisk whether there’s chalk or not.

Over the last four race cards, 17 public choices have scored from 52 races for a win percentage of just 32. The four programs prior to that saw 25 chalks take 52 dashes for a cool 48 percent, yet all eight programs were part of the current \$5-million weekend streak.


