And what a win it was in an epic contest.

"Yeah, that was some sort of race to be part of," McCarthy said. "When Minstrel came at me about 700 meters from home, I knew it would be full tilt from there because he's such a great, seasoned old stayer.

"I'd had such a soft run just in behind

the leader, I knew my guy would run a wicked last mile, but Minstrel never stopped coming at me. He was mighty."

Don Hugo obliterated the 2,300-meter track record with a 1:50.4 mile rate, taking a full second off the previous mark.

And he capped a stunning rise to stardom, having won the world's richest harness race, the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka, at Menangle on Sept. 7.

"He's a ripper, this horse," McCarthy said. "He just keeps getting better. Every time he goes out for a break, he comes back and goes to a new level.

"It's a credit to [owner] Tony [Licastro]. He spells at his place and absolutely thrives."

Don Hugo, still a 4-year-old, has only raced 41 times for 14 wins, 16 placings and earned \$1,536,174.

"That's the great thing, he's still so young and getting better," McCarthy said. "He could end up one of the best I've driven at this rate."

More features beckon.

"Next stop is the Hunter Cup [on Feb. 1 at Melton] and then we'll chase the Miracle Mile back here [at Menangle in March]," McCarthy said.

"I know it'll get much harder because Leap To Fame and Swayzee weren't here tonight, but this horse is still on the up."


Veterans Minstrel (rising 8) and Max Delight (rising 9) finished second and third, respectively.

"I was so proud of him. He gave me everything and went great," Minstrel's driver Deni Roberts said. "A couple of times I thought I might get to Luke, but his horse had an easier run from a better draw and just kept finding."



Max Delight's trainer David Aiken, who is two-and-a-half years into a battle with prostate cancer, was oozing with pride after the race.

"That was his 128<sup>th</sup> start and I don't think he's ever gone faster or better," Ailen said. "It was a great drive by Nathan [Jack] and the old boy gave it everything. You can't ask for any more."

# THE LOCOMOTIVE DOMINATES TROTTING INTER DOMINION

Owner Glen Holland admits his "accidental" love for trotters is one of the best things to happen to him.

It started in 2016 when he bought a Bettors Delight yearling with high hopes of pacing stardom, but Drop The Hammer turned out to be a trotter.

"He won 26 races and over \$300,000 and suddenly I loved trotters," Holland said, laughing.

On Saturday night, Holland landed his biggest win as an owner when his former star juvenile trotter **The Locomotive** thrashed his rivals in the Inter Dominion trotting final at Menangle.

Like the mighty Just Believe in the previous two Inter Dominions, The Locomotive took a clean sweep by winning all three heats and the final. He's won his past eight starts.

Holland revealed he recently "spent-up" at the yearling sales in the U.S. on three trotting yearlings with his friend, trainer Darren Hancock, who picked them out.

"We got two Chapter Seven colts and a Tactical Landing filly," he said. "They're due here [in Australia] any day now. It's really exciting."

The Locomotive gave Goulburn trainer/driver Brad Hewitt his biggest moment in the game.

"And what an easy drive to do it," Hewitt said. "He cruised it. It's amazing my first really big win has come with a trotter, but it's exciting."

Holland confirmed Hewitt would continue training The Locomotive after Victorian Wayne Potter prepared him to a string of major wins as a juvenile.

"Whether we go to the Great Southern Star [at Melton on Feb. 1], to Cambridge [New Zealand] in April for their big race or the next Inter Dominion [at Albion Park in July, 2025], Brad will be with him," Holland said.

The Locomotive, still just 5, boasts an impressive 22 wins from just 35 starts and has earned \$485,758.

# MISTER SMARTIE AIMING FOR 2025 INTER DOMINION

As one Inter Dominion closed, champion Western Australian trainer Gary Hall, Sr. was plotting his attack on the next with his latest star **Mister Smartie**.

A change of venue, format and schedule means the next Inter Dominion series will be held at Brisbane's Albion Park in just seven months (July 2025).

And the prize money will get a serious boost, the pacing final doubles to \$1 million, while the trotting final is up from \$150,000 to \$400,000.

Hall, Sr. revealed the plans after the long-awaited clash of Western Australia's two brightest young stars proved a one-sided fizzer.

Mister Smartee, a 4-year-old son of Always B Miki, sat outside and toyed with another boom 4-year-old, Never Ending, to make it 15 wins from just 18 starts, including 10 from 11 this year.

Hall, Sr.'s son, champion driver Gary Hall, Jr. drives both, but opted to stick with Mister Smartee just days before the clash despite drawing outside of Never Ending.

"I wouldn't judge Never Ending too harshly," Hall, Jr. said. "It's no secret he had an interrupted prep trying to get home [from Sydney after the Eureka in September], while this guy had come all the way through and been very impressive this season. He deserved me to stick with him.

"It was very hard to get off a horse like Never Ending with his big following and great group of owners, who've been so good to me.

"But Never Ending just got a bit keen on [trainer/driver] Justin Prentice in front, which allowed me to go slow and outsprint them.

"But full credit to this horse with the [limited number] of starts he's had, to come through a WA Pacing Cup and go on to win a Nugget from the breeze. All things being equal he should come back a better horse."

Asked whether Mister Smartee had champion potential, like former stablemate and three-time Inter Dominion winner Im Themightyquinn, Hall. Jr. said: "Yeah look, I think he's going the right way about it. He used to be a very 'revvy' horse and pull his head off in races, but he's settled and matured. He's starting to turn into the full package."

Hall, Sr. said Mister Smartee would have five weeks off now before chasing the \$1.25 million Nullarbor and \$350,000 Fremantle Cup at Gloucester Park in April before switching focus to the Brisbane Inter Dominion.

"The timing for the [Albion Park] Inter Dominion works well because he can go to the two big races here, then have a freshen-up and get ready for Queensland," Hall, Sr. said.

"It's not ideal the long trip, but he's good enough and I want to support a club who is getting some proper prize money back into the Inter Dominion with a \$1 million final.

"It's so important for the [future of] the race that these next three Inter Dominions are big and successful and I'll do my part to support them with a horse I think can be a major player."

# THORNLEY WINS INTER DOM YOUNG DRIVERS'TITLE

New Zealander Sam Thornley scored a runaway win in the Inter Dominion Young Drivers' Championship.

Thornley, 22, went into Saturday night's final heat of the series at Menangle with an unbeatable lead, and iced it by easily winning that ninth and final heat aboard former Kiwi pacer **Tact McLeod**.

Tact McLeod, a hard-luck story in last month's big New Zealand Cup and New Zealand free-for-all double at Addington, got a consolation win for being scratched from the Inter Dominion itself with an untimely hoof abscess.

"It was great to share a win like that with Sam to make it an all-Kiwi affair," Tact McLeod's New Zealand-based trainer Mark Jones said.

Tact McLeod now heads to Victoria for some lead-up racing before chasing the \$400,000 Group 1 Hunter Cup on Feb. 1 at Melton.

"I think he'll make a topliner, but he needs some seasoning in better races, which he'll get in Victoria," Jones said.

# Talking milestone wins with Tyler Borth, Jonathan Drury, and Kyle Husted

*The drivers recently hit career victories 2,000, 2,000 and 1,000, respectively, at Woodbine Mohawk Park.*

The driver ecosystem at Woodbine Mohawk Park has changed dramatically over the last two months.

The suspension of Sylvian Filion on Oct. 31 sent shockwaves across the industry. The Canadian Hall of Fame driver is now suspended for the next 10 years in relation to the **DPO positive of Funtime Bayama**. He is still fourth by seasonal driving wins at Canada's top track.


Doug McNair has also stated that he is taking time away from driving at Mohawk or anywhere else until the new year, in order to have more time for life outside of racing. He is the current number three driver at Mohawk and has been on hiatus since Logan Park's victory in the Nov. 30 FanDuel Championship Open Trot at The Meadowlands.


The absence of Filion and McNair has resulted in more drives available to rising reinsmen like Tyler Borth, who made the decision to move his focus from The Raceway at Western Fair to Woodbine Mohawk Park last season.

In his only Mohawk drive on Jan. 26, 2023, Borth recorded his first win there, courtesy of Shayne Barrington trainee Cutting Class (p, 5, 1:52.0f; \$76,260).

Borth's first charted lines were Western Fair qualifiers on Dec. 16 and 23, 2011. Since then, the Ingersoll, ON horseman has ascended the Ontario driving ranks, reaching a career-high year for purse winnings (\$3,198,409 U.S.) in 2023, the same season he had 414 driving victories from 2,440 starts, another personal best.

The 2014 O'Brien Future Star Award winner recently hit the 2,000-win milestone at Woodbine Mohawk Park, crushing with going-away winner Mikki Sixx (p, 3, 1:52.2s; \$48,509) in a Niagara Series opening leg for 3-year-old pacing fillies last Friday night (Dec. 6). It was the Suzie Kerwood trainee's second

straight win for Borth. He is seventh by wins and sixth by purse earnings this year in Canada, despite largely stepping away from The Raceway at Western Fair, where he was named 2023 Driver of the Year and captured the 2024 Ontario Regional Driving Championship over runner-up James MacDonald on April 23.

"I knew that I was on the brink of a milestone and it was funny, I didn't know if I wanted to get it at London or Mohawk," said Borth. "It didn't matter to me, but I raced at Western Fair on the Tuesday, and I was at 1,998 [wins], and then I ended up winning the first race at 40-1. So I had a full card that day and I thought I would get it, and then I never got it. I ended up getting it the next night [at Mohawk], on the Friday, on a 1-5 favorite. It was nice it was one of Suzy Kerwood's too. Suzy gave me a lot of drives when I first came here."

The 32-year-old Thamesford, ON horseman said that other drivers were filling the void created by the absence of McNair and Filion.

"Obviously, with guys like Dougie and Sylvain gone, they would take up a lot of the drives and a lot of the better drives, so I feel that with them gone, I'm getting on some more live horses, and we're getting better results."

On Friday (Dec. 13), Borth drove winners Oh A Legend (Niagara Series leg 2), Rule The West, Needabankloan (Pop-Up Series leg 1), and Rocket Freight.

Borth said he was always happy to take on more catch drives.

"This is my job, so the more drives you can get and the better ones you can get, that's always a good way to go," he told HRU, adding that he wasn't specifically trying to reach another milestone.

"Not really. I just had my son, Brook, and I'm looking forward to watching him grow up, and I just want to stay busy, want to stay healthy, keep on driving consistent."

In a different career trajectory, Jonathan Drury actually began racing at Mohawk, winning in the first of his two qualifying drives on April 25, 2008, with Noble Zena, a mare trained by his father, Barry Drury. On Aug. 21, 2008, Jonathan Drury had his breakthrough win at Mohawk, delivering a 30-1 upset with trotter Eventime, whom he co-owned with his father.

Since then, the Guelph Eramosa, ON horseman has been based primarily at Mohawk, coming back after multiple injuries and surgeries. The 35-year-old reinsman said he has "lots of time to continue on," but he had anticipated his 2,000th win.

"As I was getting closer, I went on kind of a dry spell there for a bit, and it took a little longer to get to than I thought it might," Drury said. "But it's nice to get it. You don't really think about it until you start getting close, but once you do, it seems to be a thing on your mind until you get it done."

He reached the milestone on the night of Saturday, Nov. 30 at Mohawk, driving Self Made to the pacer's first win since coming to Mohawk on Sept. 30. Sitting at number 11 for wins among Mohawk drivers this year, Drury finished fourth in his two drives Friday (Dec. 13) evening: with Kiera Seelster in a Niagara Series second leg, and Hes Got A Vendetta in a Pop-Up Series first leg.

He reflected on Self Made, the horse who provided his 2,000th driving victory.

"I actually thought he was going into it really good," Drury said. "He had a couple of lines that he was in tough, where he had to race from off the pace... Finally he dropped down in class, and I thought he had a really good shot in there that night."

Drury agreed with Borth's assessment that lesser-used catch drivers were finding recent opportunities at Mohawk, but he was happy with the drives he had already.

"It definitely opens things up a little bit," Drury said. "I'm content with what I get, and you have to make the best of what you can."

Despite being happy with his 2,000<sup>th</sup> win, Drury said winning Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals and this year's Prix d'Ete at

Hippodrome 3R (with Redwood Hanover) was more important than reaching a certain number of wins.

"I'm always looking forward to the next thousand, but you've just got to take it one race at a time, and go from there," said Drury. "I'm happy here. I've been able to make a decent living here, and it's close to home. I keep busy, trucking horses and doing other things in my spare time. So it's nice to have a couple of nights of no racing."

Kyle Husted reached career win number 1,000 driving Fox Valley Tessa at Mohawk on Dec. 6, as she captured a first leg of the Niagara Series for trainer Amy Husted. It was the filly's Campbellville, ON debut. The pair repeated in leg 2 on Friday night (Dec. 13).

"I like it up here," said the Altamont, IL horseman. "You know, I'm watching [Mohawk] all the time. I think it's probably the best product going, so when we had a chance to bring one up here, it was a no-brainer. We bought [Fox Valley Tessa] for this series, so hopefully she makes it worthwhile. We got lucky the first week there, we have this one tonight, and then hopefully things will go good in the final."

The 33-year-old driver said that he and wife Amy had "12 or so" horses racing at Hawthorne on the weekend, and she had her hands full there Friday (Dec. 13) with two horses.

Driving since 2006, Kyle was making the second Canadian start of his career when he reached his 1,000th driving win.

"It's a little surreal to drive with some of the guys that you watch all the time," said Kyle naming Jody Jamieson, Bob McClure, and James MacDonald as some of the local reinsmen he admired. "It's a good place to win, an exciting place to win."


Mohawk bettors may be seeing more of Kyle Husted in the future, although likely with horses coming up from the U.S.

"I catch drive at home," Kyle said. "I wouldn't say no to the opportunity, but there's a ton of talented guys [at Mohawk],

and just because [McNair and Filion] are gone, doesn't mean there's not somebody capable to step in their place. I wouldn't say no to the opportunity, but there's a lot that goes into being a driver here."

Before driving Fox Valley Tessa to her latest win, Kyle reflected on the countdown to his 1,000th victory.

"I'd be lying if I said I didn't know it was coming," he said with a laugh. "You look at somebody like Doug McNair, for instance, he got it at a super-young age, and it makes you wonder if you'll ever get there. But to finally get there means a lot."

### Bruce Brinkerhoff considers himself to be one of the world's luckiest individuals

Bruce Brinkerhoff has no harness racing in his pedigree, but he comes from an area in Southern Illinois that has produced some of harness racing's most renowned families – that of the Tetricks (Tim, Trace and Tom), the Grahams (Sonny and Jerry; Brinkerhoff's dad was a schoolmate of Sonny), the Beckers (Carl and Kurt) and the Alagnas (Tony and mom Donna Lee).

He is the son of two school teachers. So, no association there. Actually, it was through thoroughbred racing, more specifically perhaps the greatest of all thoroughbreds, Secretariat, that Brinkerhoff began his lifelong pursuit in harness racing.

As a 10-year-old, he saw Secretariat win the Triple Crown. There were no significant thoroughbreds nor thoroughbred racing in Salem, IL, but there was harness racing; lots of it. So young Brinkerhoff took the closest path to horses. He began working as a groom, and eventually for the then very significant Sonny Graham Stable. His school teacher parents were not too keen on this lifepath decision. They felt it was of prime importance that he first get a good education and then follow any path in which life might lead him.

Brinkerhoff did attend and graduated from Ohio State's ATI campus with a degree in Horse Production and Management. More important though, it was there that he met his wife Melissa who also graduated with a Horse Production and Management degree.

Through the years he has been involved for varying periods of time in just about every facet of horsedom including, but perhaps not limited to, breeding, training, driving (just a handful of races), farm management (including even at a thoroughbred farm), doing reference and pedigree work at the USTA and Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sale, all of them contributing to his present position as co-manager of the sport's number one yearling sale the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and also of its Ohio subsidiary the Ohio Selected Jug Yearling Sale.



# Let's take a timeline tour through your life in harness racing.

"It began in Southern Illinois, Salem to be exact, when I went to work at the county fairgrounds rubbing horses. It progressed to where I actually trained and drove a little on the Illinois Fair Circuit. I suppose that my first taste of the big time was when I took the 3-year-old pacing filly Final Act on the Grand Circuit road for Sonny Graham. She was a good filly, but not good enough to defeat the likes of Three Diamonds and Albaquel who were in her age group. She earned just a few dollars less than \$280,000 which was pretty darn good back then."

#### Then?

"I had gotten married. Life on the road was not the healthiest environment for a young newly-married person who was looking to start a family so we went to work for Kentuckiana

Farms for a season with sale yearlings. From there we moved to Ohio and I ran a thoroughbred farm for a couple of years. I then received an offer to manage Bob O'Donnell's Hobby Horse Farm in Ohio and I ran, not walked to grab it."

# What can you tell us about Hobby Horse Farm and Bob O'Donnell?

"I worked for Bob for three years until he sold the land and retired. If there is a number one place for a great breeder who history has not given its due, that spot should be reserved for Bob O'Donnell. With the possible exception of Bill Shehan, I do not believe there has ever been a small breeder who has had a greater impact on the sport than Bob. While Shehan is mostly remembered and given his due, O'Donnell and Hobby Horse have sadly been almost forgotten.

"O'Donnell was first and foremost a great student of pedigrees. Of all the people in the sport I've known, there are very few if any that have been as assiduous and well organized and as detail oriented as Bob. I received a great education studying under him. He had systems for just about everything. He had manuals for every function on the farm. To this day I follow some of the procedures I learned from him. As I speak with you, I am looking at a picture of perhaps my all-time favorite mare, Richelle Hanover, a representative of the prolific Miss Duvall family in which Bob O'Donnell was a great believer. Richelle Hanover was of course the dam of the great world champion filly Misty Raquel and the grandam, third, fourth and even fifth dam of numerous top racehorses and producers up to the present. (I believe Richelle Hanover deserves to be in the Hall of Fame)."

#### After Hobby Horse, you worked at the Meirs family's Concord Stud in New Jersey. They were already standing Direct Scooter and just had acquired the great Niatross. Allow me to digress a bit and speak of the number one puzzle that has eluded me more than any other of my lifetime in the sport.

"You are certainly speaking of Niatross, the horse of who so much was expected in the stud. He not only met those expectations, but surpassed them – but only from his first two crops, especially the first one where he produced so many topquality colts that perhaps the only thing that prevented him from having more champions was that they had to race against each other. Then with significantly larger crops, including many with foals from arguably better mares, he was never able to come even close to duplicating his previous success. I'm afraid I cannot help you. It's a question that I've often asked myself to which I've never come close to coming up with an adequate answer — if indeed there is one."

#### After working at Concord, you came back to Ohio.

"I had the opportunity to work at the USTA with David Carr in the Information and Research Dept. concentrating on pedigrees and statistics. It was work that I enjoyed and which intrigued me. We worked with pedigrees which led to the USTA computer generated ones of today. We also developed the Crosses of Gold. While at the USTA, the person who was doing the pedigrees for the Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sale left unexpectedly. Randy Manges, the sales' manager, asked me if I would come to work for them doing pedigree work. I accepted the offer and also became part of the Sale's yearling inspection team along with Randy and Bart Glass."

#### You mention Randy and Bart as being among the individuals from which you have learned the most.

"Yes, Randy mostly because of the opportunities he gave me both at Kentucky Standardbred and at Ohio Selected Jug Sale. I tagged along with him. I learned by watching. I was able to help him do whatever he asked me to. Bart became like a second father to me. He knew more about livestock in general and horses and cattle in particular than anybody I have ever known. He was most generous with both his time and knowledge. Being on the road with him evaluating yearlings allowed for a great deal of time for me to ask questions and increase my knowledge. It was like being paid to go to school. Thankfully, he never tired of imparting his wealth of knowledge."

#### You are now the co-manager, along with David Reid, of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. How did that come about?

"In 2023 Randy's health had seriously declined. I was asked to be the co-manager and Randy assumed a position as a senior advisor. Sadly, Randy passed away last fall."

# What does it feel like to manage the world's most successful standardbred yearling sale?

"Yes. I consider myself to be one of the world's luckiest individuals. I work doing what I love. The position allows me to work with and be close to almost all of the world's greatest horsepeople and their horses, both already established and many who have greatness in their destiny."

## Donna Duer reigns from a royal harness racing family

Donna Duer was born and raised in the Bluegrass State of Kentucky, but refers to herself as a nomad for she presently splits her time between Kentucky, Florida and Delaware.

Totally "bred in harness racing purple," her father is renowned farm manager/breeder Carter Duer, and her mother Helen, functioned as the sales director at the Tattersalls Sale Company for many years.

If you're involved in harness racing you either personally know or have heard of Carter Duer, for he is one of the most renowned men in our sport. At one time he was the manager of Castleton Farms and Kentuckiana Farms before he and his wife Helen established Peninsula Farm.

Donna said, "As a young child, I remember helping my mother with the pedigrees for the sales catalog. She was tasked with proofreading the catalog before it went to print, and I guess mom thought if I helped it would be a good way to teach me how to read.

"Growing up at Castleton, I was exposed to many great horsemen who were also my father's close friends, such as George Sholty, Steve Brown [Walnut Hall] and Glen Garnsey. I would beg 'Big D', (a nickname for my father), to let me stay home from school so I could go have lunch with him and his friends at the famous Coach House. I loved hearing them tell their stories about horses, racing, and track gossip. Of course, the lunch couldn't last too long for my father had to have me back at the bus stop on time so my mother wouldn't know I skipped school."

Throughout the years Donna wore many different hats. Working on their family farm was a joint effort as Donna helped with stallion collection, preparing the yearlings for the sales, foaling, and office work. She admits working with horses didn't come to her as easy as it did to her sister Teresa who presently manages Peninsula; or her brother John, a former horse trainer who is now a Growing up at Castleton, I was exposed to many great horsemen who were also my father's [Carter Duer's] close friends, such as George Sholty, Steve Brown [Walnut Hall] and Glen Garnsey. pharmaceutical representative, but also helps with the family business.

Although Donna always loved the horses it took some time before she was confident enough in her abilities to work with the equines, but when she did, she was off and running, and Donna has added another title to her lengthy list - race horse owner.

"Outside of my time at Peninsula, I own several racehorses, along with my partners Mitchell Frair and Roman Lopez," Donna said. "Owning the horses enables me to be involved with their everyday care. I'm really proud of Forty G's, our 3-year-old Muscle Hill colt; Catch A Thief a 3-year-old International Moni (1:55.3), and Spicy Salsa, a 2-year-old Southwind Frank filly, and we recently purchased a colt at the Fasig-Tiptin sale to add to the stable."

Donna has had many memorable moments in the business.

"Hands down [the most exciting] was when Captain Corey won The Hambletonian."

It was one thing for Donna to raise, breed, and foal yearlings, but emotions can be quite different when you take them to the sale and let them go.

"It's so much fun and exciting to breed, raise, and watch our 'kids' grow up, hopefully to become a champion one day. Of course, there are highs and lows. I can't name how many horses we have produced over the years and the older I get, the harder it is to let them go. It is our livelihood, so I have to make peace with letting them go.

"I spent many years braiding ribbon into the manes of countless yearlings, until we retired the green and gray ribbon for browbands. As far as pressure, the sales never affected me like it did my father."

With all the many horses she's dealt with over the years, Donna has a few that stand out.

"My fastest is Forty G's," she said. "He has won five out of his last six starts and had one second. His best time was 1:55.1 and I'm really excited to bring him back next year.

"As far as my favorite, it's hard to pick one. Miss Talon who was the first horse I ever owned, was so easy to love. She had a small stature and sweet nature and made it easy to come to work. And then there's Fiery Chip, my first stakes winning horse who won the American National. They all hold a special place in my heart.

"And of course, Luv U All, the dam of Captain Corey, who is very special to me. She is so sweet and has a great disposition. After the car accident dad and I were in, we took Luv U All, along with two other fillies to Virginia to train on the family farm. Those horses really helped dad rehabilitate.

"Luv U All was 'the whole package.' One reason she is so significant is because of the time my father and I spent together while he trained her."

Peninsula Farm has been one of the leading breeding nurseries for decades, and although they don't do the volume they once did, 2024 was still a good year.

"This year we sold 33 yearlings at Lexington and 18 yearlings at Harrisburg," Donna said. "The sale at Harrisburg this year was a little more difficult because my father didn't attend due to his needing surgery. Thank God he is doing much better now.

"The sales were successful as we sold a yearling in Harrisburg called The Old Man for \$450,000, and at the Lexington sale we sold a big brown colt named M J D – a son of Captain Corey – for \$270,000. M J D is also very special to us for M J D are the initials of my great-grandfather, Maurice James Duer, who had his horse Tyson Hanover in the 1947 Hambletonian. His dam was You Want Me. Although I didn't have a relationship with her like the others, I took care of, we got closer when she became a broodmare. She is my sister's favorite horse and has proven to be a very good producing mare."

There are definitely those that Donna would like to thank for helping to guide her through the business that she loves.

"I am so grateful to both my mother and dad 'Big D' for starting the farm and creating the legacy we can all be so proud of," Donna said. "Even though I'm somewhat of a vagabond traveling between racetracks these days, Peninsula has always been my home and I look forward to seeing it flourish.

"I also want to thank my partner Mitchell Frair for including me in the racing stable. He is a great guy who loves and supports our sport. And finally Roman Lopez (Romeo) for his infinite patience with me as I learn this side of the business."

# Remembering Freehold, Part 2

I'm not the only one with favorite memories of Freehold. Plenty of horsepeople wanted to weigh in as well before the track closes permanently at the end of the month.

**Helene Gregory:** "Besides being my favorite job ever as the track photographer, I'd have to say winning the R.U.S. race with Armbro Doyle on Open Space Pace Day. It was also the year that Foiled Again did his farewell tour [2018].'Murph' had hand walked him down the track and back to the paddock and let the fans pet him. I was crying it was so special."

**Billy Mann:** "I didn't race there enough to have a great one. I was just starting out and was happy to be driving with such greats as Luc [Ouellette], Cat [Manzi], Jackie [Moiseyev]. Definitely a better time in the business then; it was like a mini-Meadowlands."

**Stacy Chiodo:** "There are so many it's hard to choose. Freehold is where my family would come and watch me race and I have many photos taken with them. I won my biggest purse race there with Lucy Light Year in the Development Fund for 2-year-old pacing fillies for \$70,000. I won the first Open Space Pace with C C Racy in which Joe Klecko [Hall of Fame defensive lineman from the New York Jets] was in the winner's circle. Most recently our homebred Floor It Freddie won a leg of the Development Fund for 2-year-old pacing colts in 1:54 flat, just two fifths off the track record which has held since 2002."

**Carl Conte, Jr.:** "Dec. 7, 1991. I won the invitational with Jesse Purkey even though I hadn't driven in two years."

**Bonnie Butler:** "My first win was there with Betty B Butler who ironically was not owned by us. The race had three recalls and she was so fired up that, despite not being able to leave the gate well, she went wire-to-wire. I started my senior year of college the next day."

**Bruce Riegle:** "That would be breaking the world record on a half-mile track for 3-year-old pacing fillies with Three Diamonds [in 1982]."

**Andrew Filion:** "When dad [Herve Filion] won his 14,000th race, it was at Freehold. My entire family was there."

**Dave Palone:** "The Challenge of Champions [Feb. 20, 1995] competition. Doug Brown was there, Herve [Filion], Dave Magee. Jackie [Moiseyev], Luc [Ouellette]. We had a lot of fun that day and I actually won."

**Yannick Gingras:** "For me it wasn't a race but it was when my kids were very young and they would come and hang out on big days with our neighbors and just play on the apron. Being able to watch them reminded me of myself as a young kid at Blue Bonnets."

**Walter Case, Jr.:** "When I beat Life Sign 12 days before the Jug [in 1993]. It was at Freehold with Captain Pantastic in the James Dancer [\$301,016] and it was my biggest win ticket of my career at 80-1. I came second over, went three deep down the backside, and went by him in deep stretch. Twelve days later I followed Life Sign in that memorable Jug with him and didn't get a check."

**Paul Kelley:** "Outside of winning a division of the Lady Maud and a few other minor stakes, my best moment was meeting Bill Weaver at Freehold. That led to a 16-year relationship with one of the most loyal and understanding people I have ever known."

**Irish Joe Hanney:** "Winning the St. Patrick's Day Pace the first year they held it, usually on or around that day. The race was featuring drivers of Irish descent. I drew post 8 with a horse

I got away in the back and came up to the half able to flush some cover. I ended up third over into the last turn and then tipped four deep into the final turn. I set sail for home and I was 66-1. I got up in time and John Sheehan was second and George Brennan third. That meant something to me having a race strictly for drivers of Irish descent at my home track. Very satisfying, plus the race was sponsored by my good friends Pete and Mary Grandich. We had many friends in the winner's circle with a blanket and a nice trophy."

**Jackie Ingrassia:** "Winning my first pari-mutuel race in the USA with Springfield Smith at Freehold [1972]."

**JoAnn Looney King:** "My first start at Freehold [Oct. 2, 1975] was also my first win. It's all significant because I was supposed to drive this horse, Great Chuck, at Rosecroft the month before. But presiding judge Martin Landau would NOT allow me to drive at his track. He said me driving horses was a "frivolous whim." I remember every word of that conversation. Boy, was I pissed but could do absolutely nothing about it, so about a month later we took him to Freehold and won with him. It was one of my best days ever. One more thing, I sent a win picture to Judge Landau, and here's the best part, he proudly displayed this picture in his office and apologized to me and we became best friends."

John Cirillo: "My first time at Freehold Raceway. Late '70s. My best buddies Vinnie and John Olivieri were excited about the trip. Ninety minutes from Sheepshead Bay in Brooklyn. I had a dream overnight that a 1-2-4 Triple was the last race combo. I bet two \$3 Trifectas and won \$600. I stuffed the cash into my right front pocket and kept my hand there as if someone was going to steal it as we walked to the parking lot. We went to Brennan and Carrs for roast beef. Dreams do come true."

**Pat Lachance:** "Winning the Breeders Crown with Shady Daisy." [Pat's dad Mike drove her to a resounding score in 1994].

**Dawn Allen commenting on Team Allen, Rod, Carl, and Mike:** "The stable won many NJSS including CR Kay Suzie and CR Daniella setting world records at 2; the Dexter Cup [in 1995] with Super Wally (CR Kay Suzie tied up that year], the Lady Suffolk with CR Gone Fishin. I remember the announcer [Jack Lee] referring to Rod [A motorcycle enthusiast as was his dad Carl] as 'Hot Rod Allen.' In those days they weighed the horses before they raced. One day we had the fastest time of the day and the lightest horse too. The Announcer said after the winner's circle, 'Take him back home and feed him!'"

**Dave Miller:** "I'd have to say winning the Cane Pace with No Pan Intended in 2003 stands out the most."

**Sarah Lauren Scott:** "My first experience at Freehold Raceway is a memory I cherish deeply. I was just 16 years old, spending

my summer vacation away from Canada. I had the incredible opportunity to travel to New Jersey with my horse Village Berretta for Joe Stutzman [Note: Sarah later took care of 2005 HOY Rocknroll Hanover]. # Maintaining tracks during tough Ontario winters

While their work often takes place behind the scenes, including at times when everybody else has yet to rise, their vital contributions to the harness racing industry should never be kept in the dark.

Track maintenance crews across Ontario work tirelessly to ensure the safety of every human and equine athlete that graces the province's dozen standardbred ovals.

But as the calendar turns and the weather dips, what's already a challenge on the best of days becomes an even greater test of ingenuity, resolve, and prudent thinking.

Few, if any, understand those hurdles better than Dan and Greg Coon of Coon and Associates, the mastermind duo who designed the tracks at The Red Mile, Delaware County Fairgrounds, and Pompano, as well as the recent Grand River expansion project.

"There's a lot of moving parts," Dan said. "These are dedicated people, and it's to everybody's advantage to recognize them."

Dan was a keynote speaker at the Racetrack Surfaces Symposium put on by Ontario Racing this September.

Facing the crowd of seasoned track superintendents, he started his presentation by "simply telling the truth" about track crews and the obstacles they're confronted with year-round.

"These crew members bust their hump all summer trying to keep the cushion right, keep it wet, and put in long hours doing so," Dan said. "That's the easy part.

"Now, we're in the winter. The freeze and thaw, the part [of the track] in front of the grandstand that freezes first because of the shadow, the tractor didn't start. It's one thing after another. My hat goes off to these guys."

Clearing the freeze and thaw hurdle, and in a timely manner, is particularly important according to Greg.

"If it's 35 degrees [Fahrenheit] and the track's thawed but it's going to freeze at 2 or 3 o'clock in the morning, somebody's

got to be there at 2 or 3 o'clock in the morning, especially if it's going to stay frozen for the next week," Greg said. "If you don't harrow it dry, you'll be up against it for the next week."

However, that's only half the story.

Even if the crew makes it to the track on time and successfully freezes it dry, then comes the next challenge: dust.

While Greg says there are ways to manage the dust with calcium chloride, magnesium chloride or salt, it still comes with baggage.

In essence, maintaining a racetrack in the winter is about balancing trade-offs to achieve the most desirable racing surface despite undesirable conditions.

"You're out there harrowing the track when it's thawed," Greg said. "The idea is, as it freezes, you're breaking it up. You're not letting it freeze like a skating rink. You're trying to keep some cushion loose, and the cushion might have a feel like popcorn when you get done, but it still takes the sting away.

"If there's nobody there to freeze it dry at 2 or 3 or 4 in the morning, the next day, it's a rink."

As if that wasn't perplexing already, the winter months also throw a bevy of wildcards at track crews, including sudden drops in temperature.

"You get to the third race, and it's sloppy; it's 30 degrees, and then it goes down to 12," Greg said. "You can't be out there

working it while the race is on. There's a chance you could lose it where it freezes faster than you can groom it.

"And it just happens, it's not anybody's fault."

Dan added that it's possible to skid over the top, but it's still tough to make a cushion.

With no shortage of conundrums to sort through, both Dan and Greg agree that a shared understanding between horsepeople and track crews is of utmost importance.

"Horsepeople are a pretty hearty group," Dan said. "They know what you're up against, probably better than most."

That was evident during his time at Hawthorne Race Course in Cicero, IL.

Januarys in Illinois are quite comparable to that of Ontario - wind, snow, sleet, all of the above.

As Dan recalls, "Everyone knew it was going to be windy and cold and miserable. In the daytime, it would be thawed, and in the evening, it would be frozen."

However, instead of sharing their gripes over the less-thanideal conditions, Dan said the horsepeople were aligned on what matters most.

"Credit goes to the horse people as well; they know what you're up against," said Dan, adding with a laugh, "They're capable of giving you a little bit of a hard time, but you know who to listen to.

"It's not all about the time. It's about equine and human safety."

This line of work is not glamorous. It is demanding and requires a certain level of expertise and skills that take years to hone.

It is also an invaluable discipline that the harness racing industry simply could not function without.

"There's nothing easy about it," Greg said. "I mean, we're not splitting the atom, but it requires effort all day and all night.

"We all know how tough it is for these track managers to find staff. And then you're telling them you're going to work nights

These [track] crew members bust their hump all summer trying to keep the cushion right, keep it wet, and put in long hours doing so. That's the easy part. Now, we're in the winter. The freeze and thaw, the part [of the track] in front of the grandstand that freezes first because of the shadow, the tractor didn't start. It's one thing after another. My hat goes off to these guys.

and weekends? Even though you're on the day crew, you've got to show up at 2 o'clock in the morning."

The brothers specifically lauded the track crews at smaller venues that may not have access to the same resources as Grand Circuit establishments.

"At Hawthorne years ago, if you needed 250 tons of stone dust to put on the racetrack, you just went to the garage and got it," Dan said. "Maybe that's not an asset that some of these smaller tracks have.

"These guys do a lot with sometimes very little in terms of assets. They're a very resourceful crew."

Before signing off, the track gurus gave the folks that tend to Ontario's ovals year-round one more coat of shine.

"It's a challenge in the summer and even more so in the winter. But don't think it's easy in the summer.

"These are great people who work hard."





## Duvaldestin's Mack de Blary a rising 2-year-old star

French trainer Thierry Duvaldestin continues to prove his skills in the harness racing business and now that French-bred trotters named with the letter M (2-year-olds) are hitting the track, it seems like Duvaldestin has produced another top trotter.

Théo Duvaldestin sat behind his father's **Mack de Blary** (Face Time Bourbon) in Saturday's (Dec.14) \$125,000 Prix Emmanuel Margouty at Vincennes and the duo had to settle in fifth over, while leader Monzon Normand kept the pace at an even level pretty much throughout the whole race.

With a kilometer to go, Mack de Blary got a signal from his driver and he had to race three wide the rest of the way. That didn't bother Mack de Blary, who sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 2:00.4 over 1.6 miles. This was Mack de Blary's fourth consecutive win and Thierry can look forward to more wins before the winter meeting in Paris is over.

#### **PROMISING TROTTERS IN MILAN**

Milan played host to two divisions of the \$190,000 Gran Premio Allevatori on Saturday (Dec. 14). In the fillies' event, **Giovaz** 

(Maharajah) was outstanding from the lead. Giovaz was sent to the front by Antonio di Nardo and when di Nardo stepped on the pedal in the last turn, Giovaz left her opponents several lengths behind and she came home in 2:02 over 1.3 miles.

The colts' race included an already well known 2-year-old trotter. Philippe Allaire's **Ginostrabliggi** (Muscle Hill), driven by Gabriele Gelormini, hit the lead as the car left the field and the race looked like the fillies' event in many ways. Gelormini let Ginostrabliggi trot away from the opponents in the last turn and the victory was superior in a mile rate of 2:00 over 1.3 miles.

#### SAN MOTEUR IMPRESSED AT ÅBY

Björn Goop-trained **San Moteur** finished second in the first B-race in Paris, the Prix de Bretagne, earlier this winter and secured his spot in the 2025 Prix d'Amérique 2025. On Saturday (Dec. 14) night, he impressed a lot in the Swedish Gold division \$40,000 Legolas Minne over 1.3 miles.

From post 10, in the second line behind the gate, San Moteur found a position in fourth over and when tough opponents Barack Face and Önas Prince fought over the front position with a kilometer remaining in the race, Goop could wait for a three-wide attack until the last time the field went down the backstretch. When Goop fired away with San Moteur, the opponents looked like extras, without any chances of defending themselves. Before the last turn, San Moteur reached the lead and won easily by 50 meters over runner-up Dancer Brodde.

The mile rate of 1:55.1 over 1.3 miles looked like a training jog for San Moteur and he will be a serious name leading up to the Prix d'Amérique in January.

# Captain Pete delivers decisive DSBF prelim win; Crissman-Bier doubles

#### by the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund

**Captain Pete** stamped himself as the likely horse to beat in the \$110,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund (DSBF) championship for 3-year-old male pacers with a sparkling 1:52.2 win in the second of three \$20,000 second-round preliminary divisions on Thursday (Dec. 12) at Bally's Dover.

Following a 1:57.1 front-end score in the first preliminary round, Captain Pete and driver Allan Davis seized control of the terms in their second-round split after securing the pocket and brushing to clear LL Julio (driven by Cody Poliseno) after a :27.2 first quarter. The Roddy's Bags Again—Capitana gelding maintained a stout pace through middle splits of :56.1 and 1:24 before LL Julio reemerged from the pocket to challenge on the far turn. Captain Pete remained steadfast, repelling LL Julio to win by 1½ lengths and miss his lifetime mark by only a fifth of a second. Boris Badenov (Ross Wolfenden) finished third.

Jason Johnson trains Captain Pete, a 10-time winner with \$129,382 in career earnings, for Mulligan Stables, Calcutta Stable and Denise Davis. He paid \$2.10 to win.

Trainer Crissy Crissman-Bier and driver Tim Tetrick swept the other two DSBF divisions. They won the first split with Vincent Ferriero, Jr., Robert Lovenbury and Crissman-Bier's **Lovenbury**, a Badlands Hanover—Major Millie gelding who vaulted three-wide to the lead off a protracted backstretch duel before evading Midnite Mike by two lengths in 1:56.2; and the third with P T Stable's **Beat Cop** (\$3.60), a Dragon King—Beat The Beat gelding who sustained a first-over push through the far turn to overpower pacesetter Papas Son and evade runner-up Im Still Here by 2½ lengths for a 1:54.1 win.

Captain Pete and Lovenbury, both of whom swept their series preliminaries, will be joined in Thursday's (Dec. 19) \$110,000 final by Midnite Mike, Beat Cop, Im Still Here, LL Julio, Shocking Truth and Boris Badenov.






