Tackling cheaters, The Gural Rule, quarter cracks and how the little guy can compete in the yearling game


Tidbits: I have almost finished my first year-end column that I will name "The Good the Bad and the Ugly of 2018." I hope you enjoy reading it as much as I did writing it.

Don Theriault asks: Why does it seem like the cheaters in harness racing are always a step ahead of the testing methods? You hear of trainers profiled as cheaters being banned from certain tracks but you don't often see them in the USTA's Fines and Suspensions list. Do you think the testing methods are sufficient enough to properly police the sport?

When money is involved in any sport, not just ours, there will always be people that push the envelope. There are no sports where some cheating drama hasn't reared its ugly head. In my lifetime, I have actually witnessed a time when horsemen stuck together and rid the sport of a brutal cheat. In the seventies there was a thoroughbred trainer that was stepping up claimed horses at a ridiculous rate. His name was Oscar Barrera. He was so blatant that the horsemen in New York went to Kenny Noe, the race secretary at Belmont Park and said we have had enough we refuse to race against him. If he puts an entry in the box take us out and the race can't fill. He never raced again. There is a new Oscar Barrera in thoroughbred racing, yet he is not that blatant to warrant action like New York.

Training harness horses has become so state of the art I am sure we are crucifying some individuals who simply work harder and have a better system than others. I am not saying there aren't cheats out there that are using illegal drugs, but we must be very careful not to have a recurrence of what happened to Lou Pena in New York. To me it was just as bad as the police planting evidence on a known drug dealer to get a conviction. Cheaters are not always ahead of testing methods, they just seldom get caught. With the amount of money spent on drug development in our country it provides an impossible atmosphere to keep ahead of the cheaters. The expense of testing properly is enormous. There are many jurisdictions that skimp on testing and somehow the bad quys always know what is being tested and what is not.

As far as the Fines and Suspensions list missing some of the banned trainers, if you look hard enough you will find them. State-owned racetracks are not so keen on eliminating trainers because of lengthy lawsuits, but private entitles seem to pull the trigger when they feel a trainer doesn't live up to the ethics of the racetrack.

In my opinion, testing methods can never keep up with the lower element of our business. I would like to see the horsemen themselves take a stand whether it be like Belmont in the seventies or form a committee to self regulate the problem. So many good trainers suffer from this situation. I applaud the efforts in Ontario to rid the tracks of trainers with overloads of positives. They are headed in the right direction.

Conventional testing is definitely not the answer. Severe Out of Competition testing is a start. My belief is that if we take all the money we waste on detention barns and use it for policing and out of competition testing it would go to much better use.

Dr Aled Thomas asks: Whilst "The Gural Rule" was introduced to prolong the racing career of some of the sport's biggest names in order to attract new fans, it seem that the majority of colts are still retiring at three. Has the rule made any difference to the older pacing and trotting divisions?

Jeff Gural is a good friend and will go down in history as an innovator and risk taker that has saved the sport of harness racing as we know it.

That said, The Gural Rule was an ill-conceived measure. The concept had merit but in actuality it just cost a lot of people a lot of money. In order for this rule to have value, the 4-year-olds would have to race way more than just one year to have any impact. Racing aged talented and tough FFA stock is above the pay grade of a 4-year-old. They just can't

seem to adjust that quickly and are at a tremendous disadvantage. Once in a while there will be an exception but not often.

Art Zubrod manager of Brittany Farms said, "how much more money would Marvin Katz and George Segal have poured into the business if Father Patrick and Captaintreacherous had gone to stud at three... I don't think anyone can point to any benefit that the industry has gained from this rule."

Not only did the rule cost them a year, but it also cost them in popularity. Neither one had their stock go up after racing an extra season.

Jeff is a bright guy and I really think that if someone had sat down with him and explained that in order for his plan to work the horses would have to race through five and beyond, he would have reconsidered.

The only instances of any change in the older divisions was because of a horse being less fertile than need be for stud duty or lack of interest on the part of the breeders.

Robert Bresnahan asks: Does a small trainer like myself buying have a chance buying two to four yearlings a year with a \$50,000 to \$100,000 budget or should I stick to racehorses?

If you know what you are doing and know how to select a

colt you will be fine. I started racing \$1,500 claimers in Monticello. Don't think that guys like me, Takter or Sylvester started with 40-horse stables and high-priced yearlings. There is a great line from the movie Field Of Dreams, "If you build it they will come." Apply that to "reputation" and you will learn a few correct purchases can get you launched. I started out training yearlings that cost under \$ 10,000 for the first 10 years of my career and graduated to under \$20,000 for the next 10 years. If the highest-priced yearling was always the best, no one would be buying horses. I won the Hambletonian with Victory Dream, a \$40,000 colt, Chuck won it with Mack Lobell, a \$17,000 colt, I won the Merrie Annabelle with Vernon Bluechip, another \$17,000 purchase. Verlin Yoder has an undefeated trotting filly and Joe Holloway has a top pacing filly — both were well in your price range selling in the \$30,000 area.

Is it easier if you have \$3 million to spend? Of course it is, but you have to start somewhere. However I wouldn't give up my racehorse stable. You need to generate income in both places in order to stay above water. If you don't, and you have a bad year with colts it will be a very lean summer.

Jeff Cantine asks: Would you please discuss your approach to dealing with quarter cracks?

Before dealing with fixing them let's talk a little about preventing them. The most important aspect is to keep the colt's foot supple. By that I mean that the hoof should have some softness to it and not be rock hard. Picture what it would be like if the skin on the bottom of you foot was taught every step would hurt and eventually the skin would crack. Keeping the foot growing at a normal rate and applying proper foot care products is the answer to a nice malleable hoof. I don't want to name products because of conflicts with advertising, but your vet or harness shop will get you the best hoof growth and hoof packing ingredients.

Next we must keep the foot level. Trouble lies ahead when your horse is landing in an uneven manner as toe first or heel first. You can figure this out by looking at his worn shoes and they will show where the horse is landing first as that part of the shoe will be more worn than the rest. Your blacksmith will adjust him to land correctly. To me the most important part of shoeing to prevent cracks is to make sure that the shoe ends at the bars of the foot and don't cover them. I have seen way too many instances where the shoe covered the bar, absolutely an accident waiting to happen.

As for fixing a quarter crack it really depends where it is. I personally never had much luck in patching a crack that is in the bar of the foot. It is a convoluted method that applies too much pressure to the heel. For bar cracks, I suggest cleaning it out and hand walking or stall rest till it can be manageable when jogging. For your run of the mill every day quarter crack, I prefer the Ian McKinley method of wiring the foot together and covering the area with fiberglass for support. There are many very capable blacksmiths available to do this sort of work. I have had horses patched in this fashion and race the next day and were perfectly sound.



McWicked, Shartin N and Atlanta top early Dan Patch Awards

Divisional champions were announced Wednesday and Thursday with Captain Crunch, Warrawee Ubeaut, Dorsoduro Hanover, Kissin In The Sand, Gimpanzee, Woodside Charm, Six Pack, Homicide Hunter and Ariana G also named winners.

McWicked and **Shartin N**, ranked No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the sport's year-end poll, were landslide winners for division honors among pacers in Dan Patch Award voting released Thursday by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. Shartin N, a 5-year-old mare, was named best older female pacer on all but one ballot while McWicked, a 7-year-old stallion, was named best older male pacer on all but three.

Meanwhile, Hambletonian-winning filly **Atlanta** led a distinguished group of trotters named division champions in Dan Patch Award voting released Wednesday. Atlanta received 96.1 per cent of the votes for best 3-year-old female trotter, the highest total among the six trotting



honorees.

Also named pacing division winners were 2-year-old colt **Captain Crunch**, 2-year-old filly **Warrawee Ubeaut**, 3-year-old gelding **Dorsoduro Hanover**, and 3-year-old filly **Kissin In The Sand**. All of the winners with the exception of Dorsoduro Hanover received at least 90 per cent of the vote in their division. Dorsoduro Hanover won, 65-53, over runner-up Courtly Choice in the closest divisional balloting among either pacers or trotters this year.

The trotting division winners were 2-year-old colt **Gimpanzee**, 2-year-old filly **Woodside Charm**, 3-year-old colt **Six Pack**, 6-year-old gelding **Homicide Hunter**, and 4-year-old mare **Ariana G**.

Ariana G, who received the nod for best older female trotter, was the only repeat winner. She collected her third trophy and joined CR Kay Suzie (1994-96) and Peace Corps (1988-90) as the only female trotters to receive a Dan Patch Award at ages 2, 3 and 4.

A total of 130 Dan Patch Award ballots were returned by the U.S. Harness Writers Association's membership this year. Dan Patch Award winners will be honored at the organization's banquet Feb. 24 at Rosen Shingle Creek resort in Orlando, FL, at which time Trotter, Pacer, and Horse of the Year will be announced.

McWicked led the sport in earnings this year, with \$1.57 million. He became the first horse older than the age of 5 to top the money standings since 7-year-old trotter Savoir in 1975. McWicked also became the oldest male pacer to ever win a Dan Patch Award at age 2 or 3 and capture another trophy as an older horse. His first honor came at 3 in 2014.

For the season, McWicked won 12 of 19 races, capping his campaign with a five-race win streak, and hit the board a total of 17 times. His victories included the \$500,000 Ben Franklin Pace, \$471,100 William R. Haughton Memorial, \$462,000 Canadian Pacing Derby, \$430,000 Breeders Crown, \$350,000 TVG Series Open championship, \$250,000 Dan Rooney Invitational, and \$179,000 Allerage Farms Open. His 1:46.2 clocking in the Allerage was the second-fastest race mile in history.

Brian Sears was McWicked's primary driver, but David Miller also posted Grand Circuit wins with the Casie Coleman-trained stallion. McWicked, a son of McArdle out of Western Sahara, is owned by Ed James' S S G Stables. He was bred by Andray Farm.

Shartin N became the first pacing mare to earn \$1 million in a season, finishing the year with \$1.05 million thanks to 19 wins in 24 races. The New Zealand-bred mare joins Hall of Famer Cardigan Bay as a "Down Under" import to receive a Dan Patch Award. Cardigan Bay, also from New Zealand, was a two-time honoree (1965 and 1968).

Trained by Jim King Jr. and driven by Tim Tetrick, Shartin N's wins included the \$373,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker Series championship, \$281,200 Roses Are Red, \$270,000 Breeders Crown, \$197,400 Lady Liberty, \$175,000 TVG Series Mare championship, \$161,000 Artiscape, \$150,000 Betsy Ross Invitational, \$102,200 Chip Noble Memorial, and \$98,500 Allerage Farms Mare Pace. She also finished the year with a five-race win streak.

Shartin N, a daughter of Tintin In America out of Bagdarin, is owned by Richard Poillucci and Jo Ann Looney-King. She was bred by GJ Crabbe.

Atlanta, who received 125 votes, became the first filly to win the Hambletonian since 1996 when she captured the \$1 million final Aug. 4 at the Meadowlands. Trained by Rick Zeron and driven by his son Scott, she won eight of 14 races this year and earned a division-leading \$1.01 million. Her victories also included the \$320,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity and \$238,613 Empire Breeders Classic. She finished second

in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown.

A daughter of Chapter Seven out of Hemi Blue Chip, Atlanta is owned by Rick Zeron, Michelle and Al Crawford's Crawford Farms, William Holland's Holland Racing Stable, Howard Taylor, and Brad Grant. She was bred by Order By Stable.

In the division for the 3-year-old colts and geldings, Six Pack received 54.6 per cent of the vote in the closest balloting among trotters. He outdistanced runner-up Tactical Landing, 71-46.

Six Pack, a son of Muscle Mass out of Pleasing Lady, won 11 of 15 races this year and earned a division-best \$1.15 million. His triumphs included the \$620,000 Kentucky Futurity, \$500,000 Yonkers Trot, \$223,673 Empire Breeders Classic, \$210,150 Matron Stakes, and a \$181,000 division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial. His winning time of 1:49.1 in the Kentucky Futurity final is the fastest mile ever by a 3-year-old trotter.

Ake Svanstedt trained and drove Six Pack in addition to owning the colt with Jeff Gural's Little E LLC, Tomas Olofsson's Stall Kalmar FF, and Lars Berg. Six Pack was bred by Brittany Farms.

Ariana G added to her hardware collection by receiving

Shartin N (Tim Tetrick, winning the Allerage Mares Pace at Red Mile) earned all but one of the votes in the Older Female Pacer division.

63.8 per cent of the vote for best older female trotter, finishing 50 votes ahead of second-place Emoticon Hanover. Ariana G was trained by Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter, who retired at the end of the season, and posted victories with drivers Yannick Gingras, Brian Sears, and David Miller.

The homebred mare, a daughter of Muscle Hill out of Cantab It All, won five of 14 races this year and earned a division-leading \$597,802 for owners Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld. She beat male rivals in all her wins, including the \$405,850 Hambletonian Maturity and \$250,000 Graduate Series final, which were for 4-year-olds, as well as the \$150,000 Dayton Trotting Derby and an elimination of the Maple Leaf Trot. She finished third in the Maple Leaf final.

Homicide Hunter, the fastest trotter in history thanks to his 1:48.4 winning mile in the Allerage Farms Open on Oct. 6 at Red Mile, received the Dan Patch Award for best older male trotter with 73.8 per cent of the vote. Marion Marauder, the

division's 2017 champion, was the only other vote-getter.

In addition to winning the Allerage, Homicide Hunter captured the \$500,000 Breeders Crown, \$200,000 Charlie Hill Memorial, and \$100,000 Great Northeast Open Series championship. George Napolitano Jr., Aaron Merriman, and Brian Sears each had a Grand Circuit victory with the Chris Oakes-trained gelding. Homicide Hunter, a son of Mr Cantab out of Evening Prayer, is owned by Michelle and Al Crawford's Crawford Farms Racing and was bred by Patrick Graham.

Gimpanzee and Woodside Charm were undefeated, marking the first time both 2-year-old trotting champions completed unblemished campaigns. They also were the two richest 2-year-old trotters this season.

Marcus Melander-trained Gimpanzee, who got 90 per cent of the vote, dominated the New York Sire Stakes circuit, winning six preliminary rounds and the \$225,000 championship, before finishing his season by winning his



Breeders Crown elimination and the \$600,000 final.

His 9-for-9 performance resulted in earnings of \$591,358 for owners Anders Ström's Courant Inc. and Lennart Agren's SRF Stable. Brian Sears drove Gimpanzee, who became the first undefeated 2-year-old male trotter to receive a Dan Patch Award since Wheeling N Dealin in 2012. Gimpanzee, a son of Chapter Seven out of Steamy Windows, was bred by Order By Stable.

Woodside Charm, who received 93.8 per cent of the vote, won all seven of her starts for owner-trainer-driver Verlin Yoder. Her wins included the \$600,000 Breeders Crown and \$236,000 Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes. She also won a division of the New York Sire Stakes at Saratoga in 1:53.4, the fastest mile ever by a 2-year-old trotter on a half-mile track.

A daughter of Chapter Seven out of Fireworks Hanover, Woodside Charm was bred by AV & Son Bloodstock. She became only the second unbeaten 2-year-old filly trotter to win a Dan Patch Award, following 2017 honoree Manchego.

Dorsoduro Hanover got the nod among 3-year-old male pacers after leading the division with \$1.28 million in purses, the second-highest total in the sport. He won 10 of 22 races, with his victories including the \$530,000 Breeders Crown, \$400,000 Delvin Miller Adios, and \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship. He also had six second-place finishes, including in the Meadowlands Pace and Little Brown Jug.

Ron Burke trained the gelding, who was driven by Matt Kakaley. Dorsoduro Hanover is owned by Sylvia Burke's Burke Racing Stable, the partnership of Jerry Silva, Theresa Silva, Purnel Jones Jr. and Elizabeth Jones, the partnership of Mark Weaver and Mike Bruscemi, and the Wingfield Five (Bradley, Charles, Kimberly, Robert and Thomas Wingfield). The son of Somebeachsomewhere out of Deer Valley Miss was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

Two-year-old filly Warrawee Ubeaut also is part of the Burke Brigade. She won seven of 12 races and earned a division-leading \$646,995 for trainer Burke and driver Yannick Gingras. Her wins included the \$600,000 Breeders Crown and \$207,000 Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes. In addition, her 1:48.3 victory in a \$61,250 division of the International Stallion Stakes at Red Mile made her the fastest 2-year-old pacer in history.

Warrawee Ubeaut is owned by Sylvia Burke's Burke Racing Stable, Phil Collura, the partnership of Jerry Silva, Theresa Silva, Purnel Jones Jr. and Elizabeth Jones, and the partnership of Mark Weaver and Mike Bruscemi. A daughter of Sweet Lou out of Great Memories, she was bred by Warrawee Farm.

Three-year-old filly Kissin In The Sand and 2-year-old colt Captain Crunch both are from the stable of trainer Nancy

Atlanta (Scott Zeron, winning the Kentucky Filly Futurity at Red Mile) earned 125 of 129 votes to win the sophomore trotting filly of the year award.

Johansson and were driven by Scott Zeron.

Kissin In The Sand won 10 of 15 races and never finished worse than second on her way to a division-best \$845,495 in purses. Her wins included the \$300,000 James M. Lynch Memorial, \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship, \$191,800 Mistletoe Shalee, and \$126,000 Bluegrass Stakes. She was second in the Breeders Crown and Fan Hanover.

Marvin Katz and Bud Hatfield's Hatfield Stables own Kissin In The Sand, who is a daughter of Somebeachsomewhere out of Kiss Me Kate. The filly was bred by Christina Takter, John Fielding, RAW Equine, and Concord Stud Farm.

Captain Crunch won six of 10 races and earned a division-leading \$616,113. His triumphs included the \$600,000 Breeders Crown and \$469,300 Governor's Cup.

He is owned by 3 Brothers Stables (Alan, Ron and Steve Katz), Christina Takter, Norman and Robert Aerenson's Rojan Stables, and Judy and Buck Chaffee's Caviart Farms. Captain Crunch, a son of Captaintreacherous out of Sweet Paprika, was bred by Walnridge Farm and Sherri Meirs.

Should votes for Dan Patch Awards come with a name?

Every year as the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA) announces its Dan Patch award winners, there is normally at least some controversy in at least one of the divisions.

This is to be expected as part of a contentious process where there is often more than one deserving winner, but there are also plenty of instances where votes are treated frivolously, going to horses who in no way realistic way could be considered for divisional honors. In these instances, are votes going for or against horses for purely personal reasons, or is it a matter of simply not paying attention to what horses have been doing throughout the year?

Members of USHWA that I speak to all take their role in the Dan Patch selection process seriously, as I presume most others surely do. But for the small few that don't, there are ramifications. In addition to the overall process looking silly when far outlying horses take votes away from deserving ones and winning connections taking home physical hardware, there are financial implications that come with the Dan Patch awards – especially if won unanimously – that can easily be thwarted by a single stray vote.

Are these reasons enough that there should be some level of accountability in the voting process, and have the names of the voters released that correspond with each of their selections?

I can't say which USHWA voters pay more attention throughout the year or take the process more seriously than others, but I know unquestionably that at the top of both lists is editor in chief for DRF Harness, Derick Giwner. When asked about how he feels about obviously undeserving horses taking votes away from ones that are no-brainers, Giwner said "It used to really bother me because I felt it kept some deserving horses from being unanimous winners. Now I've reached the point where it seems silly to let it get under



my skin. It's only a handful or fewer people, so the integrity of the voting is still in place."

If votes were made public by voter, one could surmise that selectors may put more consideration into their selections. The purpose wouldn't be to pressure voters to conform to who convention wisdom says a winner should be, but rather help to eliminate ridiculous votes.

Though of course not mandated to do so, Giwner is one that's always been forthcoming when asked about his selections in the process. "I'm a big believer in integrity and transparency," said Giwner.

"That's why I always divulge my ballot and I'd gladly defend any selection. So, yes, I do think making the votes public puts more pressure on people to make a more logical decision. Don't get me wrong, everyone deserves the right to choose whichever horse they want, but if the public calls you out on it you should have to stand up and provide some reasoning why. At least that provides a sense of checks and balances."

In this year's voting where divisional honors were announced this week (overall Pacer, Trotter and Horse of Year will be announced in February), there weren't any unanimous winners. There was one ballot that did not list Shartin N for Older Female Pacer, and just a few ballots that prevented a host of others from being unanimous divisional choices as well. Even Hambletonian winning filly Atlanta missed out by four votes from being on everyone's ballot.

Within the divisions, almost all went according to form. One however that I feel went the wrong way was with the 3-year-old colt trotters. In this division, Six Pack won out over Tactical Landing by a tally of 71 to 46. The margin wasn't even that close, which was highly surprising to me based on Tactical Landing closing out the year with a resounding win in the Breeders Crown and then an almost equally smashing performance over 3-year-old rival Six Pack and other aged foes in the TVG FFA. Accordingly, Tactical Landing finished ahead of Six Pack in this season's final Hambletonian/Breeders Crown Society top ten poll.

Giwner was one of the 71 that went for Six Pack and he noted that it was probably his most tough decision on the ballot. He said, "If you asked me on TVG night after Tactical Landing won, I'd have went with him as the dominant performance was too fresh in my mind to ignore. After reflecting back on the year as a whole, looking at statistics and considering both of their seasons from start to finish, I felt like Six Pack did a bit more. He went faster, earned more, and since I'm not convinced that either was the 'better horse' I leaned on their stats."

I don't agree with Six Pack being the divisional choice,

though I can absolutely respect the selection that Giwner and the majority of others made knowing what the logic was behind it. It doesn't have to come to a point where every voter be armed with numbers and statistics to back up their choices, but at least putting a name with a ballot would aid in the name of transparency. It would help in providing as much confidence as possible into the selection process.









Canada's O'Brien Award finalists announced

Casie Coleman and Richard Moreau will vie for Trainer of the Year honors, while Bob McClure is up against Louis-Philippe Roy for Canada's Driver of the Year award.

On Tuesday (Dec. 18), Standardbred Canada announced the finalists for the 2018 O'Brien Awards, which honor Canada's best in harness racing over the past season.

The winners will be announced at the annual O'Brien Awards Black Tie Gala on Saturday, Feb. 2, 2019, at the Hilton Mississauga/Meadowvale hotel in Mississauga, ON.

This will mark the 30th edition of the O'Brien Awards, named in honor of the late Joe O'Brien, an outstanding horseman and member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Casie Coleman and Richard Moreau, both five-time winners of O'Brien Awards as Trainer of the Year, are finalists for the 2018 title.

Cambridge, ON resident **Casie Coleman**, the winningest female trainer in the sport, had a solid 2018 campaign led by superstar pacer McWicked, who is looking for his first O'Brien in the Older Pacing Horse category, and Stag Party, who is a nominee for Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year. Coleman has trained 43 winners and horses to \$3.1 million in earnings to date in 2018.

Richard Moreau of Puslinch, ON has earned five consecutive titles as Canada's Trainer of the Year. He put up some incredible numbers in the 2018 season, as he sent 305 winners postward and trained horses to more than \$4.5 million in earnings, a new personal best.

Bob McClure and Louis-Philippe Roy, who are both en route to career seasons, are the Driver finalists.

Bob McClure of Elora, ON is en route to a career-best season, as he has driven 317 winners and horses to more than \$5.1 million in purse money. McClure, a finalist in this category in 2016, transitioned to the Woodbine circuit in the winter of this year and hasn't looked back. He's driven more winners than any other driver in Canada over the past two seasons, and currently sits in the top three in the driver standings for wins (third) and earnings (second) in Canada.

In 2016, Louis-Philippe Roy, a native of Mont-Joli, QC who now makes his home in Guelph, ON, won the Future Star

Award. It was a sign of things to come, as his ascension up the driving ranks has been phenomenal. In 2017, he was a full-time driver on the WEG circuit and a finalist for Canada's Driver of the Year. His nomination for the 2018 season is a result of a career year that includes a total of 408 wins with purse earnings in excess of 7.3 million while topping the Canadian driver charts for both wins and earnings.

Rick Zeron, a three-time winner of the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship, is up against Guy Gagnon, who was also a finalist in this category last year.

Although some may consider that he's in the twilight of his racing career as a trainer/driver, 2018 may have just been one of the most memorable seasons on record for horseman **Rick Zeron** of Oakville, ON. Zeron, a winner of the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship in 2010 and 2016, continues to compete at the highest level, and in 2018 conditioned Atlanta, the winner of one of the sport's most coveted races, The Hambletonian, with Zeron's son, Scott driving. On **the training side**, Zeron had 37 wins and almost \$1.65 million in earnings, and **his driving stats** included 34 wins and more than \$702,000 in earnings.

Guy Gagnon of Gatineau, QC, is a regular trainer-driver at Hippodrome 3R and Rideau Carleton Raceway, where he is at the top of the driver's standings for wins in 2018. To date this year, **Gagnon has driven** 206 winners and horses to earnings of more than \$1.1 million. On **the training side**, he's sent 58 winners postward from his stable while earning in excess of \$340,000.

Prescient Beauty and Tall Drink Hanover are the nominees in the Two-Year-Old Pacing Filly division. Prescient Beauty hit the board in 11 of her 13 season starts while netting almost \$470,000. She was a top-three finisher in several stakes and

concluded her season with a season's best 1:50.4 victory in the Three Diamonds at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

The Captaintreacherous filly **Tall Drink Hanover** was a top-three finisher in all but one of her 11 races and earned more than \$455,000. She swept the Whenuwishuponastar, the Shes A Great Lady, and won a division of the Eternal Camnation at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Bronx Seelster and Stag Party are the finalists in the Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt division. Bronx Seelster scored seven wins and earned in excess of \$383,000 from 12 races. Three of his wins were in Ontario Sires Stakes events and he also swept the Battle of Waterloo at Grand River Raceway.

Stag Party, a son of Bettors Delight, hit the board in all nine of his seasonal starts and earned almost \$670,000. Among his victories were two Ontario Sires Stakes events, and the elimination and final of the lucrative Metro Pace at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Kissin In The Sand and Shower Play are the finalists for Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year. Kissin In The Sand scored 10 wins and earned more than \$884,000 while notching victories in The Lynch, her Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Final, the Bluegrass and Tattersalls before ending her season with a runner-up finish in the Breeders Crown.

The Shadow Play filly **Shower Play** scored six wins during her 2018 campaign, including three Ontario Sires Stakes events, the Fan Hanover Final and a division of the Simcoe. She bankrolled almost \$480,000 and took a mark of 1:50.2 in the Fan Hanover Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt category was one of the most competitive in recent years. Two standout colts, Jimmy Freight and Lather Up, are finalists for the Canadian title.

Jimmy Freight, a son of Sportswriter, won 11 races and more than \$834,000, while collecting victories in all five Ontario Sires Stakes races he competed in, including his season-ending Super Final. He also won eliminations of the Messenger and Progress Stakes, and finished his season with a runner-up finish in the Progress Final.

The Ohio-bred Lather Up won 11 races and more than \$1 million in his sophomore season. Undefeated on Canadian soil, he won a division of the Somebeachsomewhere, and the elimination and final of the North America Cup. Stateside, he scored wins in eliminations of the Hempt, and the Little Brown Jug, and several Ohio Sires Stakes.

Caviart Ally and Exhilarated will compete for Older Pacing Mare honors. Caviart Ally won seven races and more than \$374,000. She swept the Milton Stakes and posted a season's best 1:48.3 in her elimination. Exhilarated was a warhorse in 2018, racing 44 times from January through December while winning 11 races and \$211,000 in purse money. She was a regular competitor in the Fillies and Mares Preferred ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Two of Canada's top pacers, McWicked and Nirvana Seelster are the finalists in the Older Pacing Horse category. Now seven, McWicked was never better than in his 2018 season, as he won 12 races with earnings exceeding \$1.6 million. Some of his major stakes victories included the Canadian Pacing Derby and the elimination and final of the Ben Franklin. He finished the season with a five-race win streak that kicked off with the Allerage Open Pace at the Red Mile, included the Breeders Crown, and concluded with the TVG Pace.

Nirvana Seelster has become of the country's most popular and talented older pacers. The seven-year-old son of Camluck won nine races and more than \$245,000 this year while primarily competing at the Preferred level at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

HP Titania Runner and The Ice Dutchess are the Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly finalists. HP Titania Runner, a daughter of E L Titan, won four Ontario Sires Stakes, including her OSS Super Final and \$248,000 during her juvenile campaign. The Ice Dutchess won five races and \$472,000. She swept the Peaceful Way Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park and won her Bluegrass Stakes division at the Red Mile.

The rookie trotting colt finalists are Dream Nation and Forbidden Trade. Forbidden Trade won seven races and \$300,000, including his Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final and four additional OSS events. Dream Nation won six races and more than \$205,000. Included in his victories were three Ontario Sires Stakes wins and the elimination and final of the Balanced Image Stakes at Hanover Raceway.

Atlanta and Illusioneesta are the nominees for Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year. Hambletonian champion Atlanta won eight races and more than \$1 million in 2018. The Chapter Seven filly never finished worse than third during the season, and along with her coveted victory in the Hambletonian, she added wins in the Kentucky Filly Futurity, her Breeders Crown elimination, Empire Breeders Classic elimination and final and two New York Sires Stakes events to her resume.

The Kadabra filly **Illusioneesta** won four races and more than \$241,000 in 2018. Two of those wins were in Ontario Sires Stakes events.

In the Three-Year-Old Trotting Colt division, two colts who battled one another in many Ontario Sires Stakes events are the nominees – Run Director and Stormont Ventnor. Run Director had six wins and purse earnings exceeding \$436,000. Four wins came in OSS events, including his OSS Super Final. Stormont Ventnor had four wins, two of those in OSS events, along with \$268,000 in purse money.

It's a rerun of the 2017 awards, with Emoticon Hanover and Hannelore Hanover back as finalists in the Older Trotting Mare division for the 2018 season. Emoticon Hanover won six races and more than \$397,000 during her five-year-old campaign. She put an exclamation mark in concluding her stellar season with a three-race win streak that included the elimination and final of the Breeders Crown and the TVG for trotting mares.

Defending champion **Hannelore Hanover** had another solid season with six wins while adding \$403,000 to her purse account. 'Hannelore' swept the Armbro Flight Stakes at

Woodbine Mohawk Park and also scored wins in the Cutler Memorial and Miss Versatility.

Dancer Hall and Will Take Charge are competing for Older Trotting Horse honors. Dancer Hall finished first or second in 18 of 22 races and earned almost \$285,000. He predominantly competed at the Preferred level at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and also scored a victory in the Earl Rowe Trot at Georgian Downs.

Will Take Charge won nine races and more than \$492,000. The son of Kadabra eclipsed a million dollars in career earnings in 2018 and scored victories in the Maxie Lee Memorial Invitation and the Crawford Farms Open Trot.

In the Armstrong Breeder of the Year category, Seelster Farms and Warrawee Farm are the finalists. Lucan, ON-based Seelster Farms bred horses who earned in excess of \$3.4 million in 2018, including O'Brien finalists Bronx Seelster and Nirvana Seelster.

Warrawee Farm, a boutique breeder in Rockwood, ON, bred horses that earned more than \$1.3 million in 2018, including Warrawee Ubeaut, who became the fastest freshman pacer in the history of the sport with a sizzling 1:48.3 victory in the International Stallion Stakes at the Red Mile.

Two talented young trainers are the finalists for the Future Star Award, Kyle Bossence of Arthur, Ont. and Chris Lancaster of Airdrie, Alta. Bossence has trained 41 winners and horses to earnings exceeding \$231,000 while competing primarily at Flamboro Downs, Georgian Downs and The Raceway at Western Fair District.

Lancaster has conditioned 29 winners and horses that have earned \$214,000 while racing at Century Downs and Northlands Park. Lancaster also trained the stakes-winning two-year-old pacing filly Rockin Mystery for the latter part of her season, which included an Alberta Sires Stakes Super Final victory.

One of the 24 horse nominees will be honored as Canada's Horse of the Year.

Santa needs to deliver a chance to win

What are you wishing for this Christmas?

Perhaps you're hoping the yearling that has shown promise pans out; that your barn has some new powerful stock; that there's extra cash in the stocking for stakes payments. Maybe you're simply wishing for health and happiness. That's a pretty good stand by.

For the good ship harness racing, we might wish for more slots, or better sports betting revenue, or some sort of big promotion that makes the sport more relevant again. Those things are all good.

But my wish for the sport is much more basic than that.

Back in 1962, a UCLA Ph.D. named Ed Thorp published a book called Beat the Dealer. He demonstrated that with perfect play (and a whole lot of smarts), blackjack could be beaten. Seasoned players read the book, studied the techniques and some did beat the game. Of course, this was offset by many others who flooded casinos and never did "beat the dealer". In the process, blackjack exploded.

According to The Director of Gaming Research and UNLV lecturer David Schwartz, the game's popularity since 1960 had nothing to do with "new layouts, attempts to make the game more social, or outreach to customers." In fact, "antsy casino managers often made the game less welcoming."

There were no bells and whistles, special deals, rebates, blockbuster fights or free room and drinks helping the game grow. Its explosion was all about a customer base realizing they had a chance to come out ahead.

Recently, this has not been the focus for the grand old game. Casino managers have made the game harder and harder to beat. They've whittled the player edge by over two per cent through hitting on 17, multiple shoes, and 6:5 blackjack. They hoped customers would not notice the difference, but they did. In Nevada, tables have fallen by 31 per cent, and revenue from blackjack is off an inflation-adjusted 46 per cent since 2000.

For harness customers reading this, I am sure you're nodding your heads, because you know this tale all too well. The sport of racing, through intransigence, nickel and diming, and a bond of marriage to the status quo that would make the Father Knows Best demographic blush, has not delivered a chance to win. In fact, it's been more difficult to win than ever. Players been living with shorter, less competitive fields, higher takeout, and fewer and fewer betting opportunities.

The betting customer base has seen the after races concerts and fireworks; the on-track promotions; the promise of slots and sports betting. Those things, like with blackjack, have not to helped them do what they want to do — bet horses with a chance to win.

So, what I hope Santa delivers harness this Christmas is simple. When the sport's brain trust is about to make a decision that affects customers, I hope it begins to ask itself one question: "Will it help the customer win?"

When it asks what to do with a portion of slot money, or this half a million from sports betting, or this new subsidy that comes down the pike, the question should be: "Will it help the customer win?"

When discussing a new betting surcharge, or signal disruption, or change to the time off to qualify rule, or the protocol of a judges' decision, it should ask: "Will it help the customer win?"

When the race office is putting a card together, or creating a new bet; when they're deciding which races to make a part of the pick 4 or 5; when they're devising a new stakes series, it should ask: "Will it help the customer win?"

A vibrant and healthy industry – any industry – exists when there are a great many people completing a great many transactions. To encourage transactional economies in harness racing, you have to encourage customers to bet. Helping bettors win is a big part of that, and it doesn't take a professor and a popular book to help make it happen.







Face Time Bourbon dominated in Paris

Björn Goop drove Sébastien Guarato's new top trotter Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) to a solid win in Sunday's \$272,700 Criterium des 3 ans (\$272,700) .at Vincennes racetrack in Paris, France.

The particular race over Prix d'Amérique-distance 2,700 meters, approximately 1.7 miles, had collected many of the best 3-year-olds in France and the first choice, by far, Face Time Bourbon dominated the race once Björn Goop found the lead with 5/8ths of a mile to go. At that point, early leader Fly With Us, who was one of the toughest antagonists to Face Time Bourbon, got out of gait midway through the race and her driver Yoann Lebourgeois had to leave the field as soon as Fly With Us jumped over to pace instead of trot.

Goop took his chance and sent Face Time Bourbon to the lead and in the last turn the Swedish driver had full control over the field. Face Time Bourbon easily sprinted home in safe win in mile rate 1:59.4.

The son of Ready Cash started his career as a 2-year-old in August last year, with trainer Sébastien Guarato in the bike and it ended with victory. One more start was made 2017 and Face Time Bourbon showed that he really should be a horse for the biggest races in France. So far, he has nine wins in 10 attempts and the only loss came in May, when he was first at the wire but the judges disqualified him due to bad gaiting, a rule which is commonly used in France.

Yoann Lebourgeois, named as driver behind Fly With Us, has had a successful year in France 2018, but on Monday afternoon he and Jarmo Niskanen were involved in a serious accident in Le Mans and Lebourgeois has announced that he will not return to the racing tracks before 2019.

Driver and trainer Jarmo Niskanen is still at the hospital with several broken ribs and bleedings in his body.

Champion stallion Coktail Jet is dead

One of Europe's most outstanding stallions is dead. Coktail Jet (Quouky Williams—Armbro Glamour), born 1990, won Prix d'Amérique and Elitloppet the same year, in 1996 and has served Europe with top trotters as a stallion since the end of the last century.

Trained and driven by Jean Etienne Dubois, Coktail Jet showed the racing fans that French horses (with a touch of American blood in the veins since Super Bowl was the sire of Armbro Glamour) could win big races in other ways than what we were used to regarding the French trotter. Coktail Jet had speed like no other horses and the victory in the 1996 Elitloppet 1996 was almost unreal for those who were at Solvalla that day. Coktail Jet's home stretch is often named as one of the most thrilling in that category and the champion at the tracks also became a popular champion in the breeding business.

Love You, Look de Star, The Best Madrik and Saxo de Vandel are just a few of all top trotters Coktail Jet has bred in France and outside his home country, Yarrah Boko, Amaru Boko, Papagayo E. and Jetstile must be named as some of the most successful sons of Coktail Jet.

Future in doubt at The Raceway at The Western Fair District

Gateway Casinos announced Wednesday (Dec. 19) that they will be moving their casino operation out of Western Fair District. This comes after months of negotiations between the two companies and the City of London.

"We're not shocked but we are disappointed. Our preference would have been to have Gateway remain here," said Western Fair president Hugh Mitchell.

The announcement leaves the future of harness racing at Western Fair in jeopardy and impacts thousands of people as standardbred racing at The Raceway generates an economic impact of more than \$50 million and supports well over 5,000 jobs in the region.

Horse racing has been an integral part of the fabric of the community in London and surrounding areas for decades. Many of the sport's greatest athletes, human and equine, began their careers at The Raceway at Western Fair.

"We have made both the OLG (Ontario Lottery and Gaming) and the (premier Doug) Ford government aware of the level of financial support needed to continue our racing operation if Gateway relocates. We are currently waiting for the government's response to our formal request for long-term funding support," Mitchell said.

Enterprise was trained by Marcus Melander and won half of his 12 starts in 2017, including an elimination of the Hambletonian S. at the Meadowlands, as well as a leg of the New York Sire Stakes at Vernon, and an elimination of the Good Times at Mohawk.

Enterprise finished fourth, placed third in the \$1 million final of the Hambletonian, and has won on all sized tracks, including a 1:55.4h victory against older horses at Yonkers.

During the colt's 3-year-old season, Melander noted, "(Enterprise) moves so easy, even though he's a pretty big horse. He's got speed, but he never gets tired. He's a very strong horse."

While racing in Europe at four, Enterprise was 1-2-3 in 7 of 17 starts, including a third-place finish to Hambletonian winner Perfect Spirit in the prestigious Kings Trophy at Aby, which was a track record performance (1:54.2f mile rate) over the 1 5/16th mile distance.

Scott DiDomenico (160 wins), Richard Banca (141) Ron Burke (113) and Jennifer Bongiorno (71) completed the first quintet among wins.

The Raceway's 234-program, 2019 season is set to begin Monday night (Jan. 7), with a first post of 6:50 p.m., A complete schedule accompanies this release, with all dates pending approval of the New York State Gaming Commission.
