There is a saying that I first heard from Andy Grant in describing Herve Filion, "He must have been born in a feed bucket, because he knows everything there is to know about horses."

That saying could just as easily have been used to describe Jack Moiseyev.

"Jackie Mo," as he is often referred, is a third generation horseman.

His grandfather, Max, started in the business with Jack's father, Sid. They worked together training horses. Then along came Jack.

Even as a toddler, Jack remembers being around horses and feeling as though that was where he belonged.

He took his first drive in a jog cart somewhere around the age of 8.

By the time he was 12, he regularly jogged and trained in the company of his dad and grandfather.

His very first pari-mutuel race was a winning one behind Scotch V.O. at the age of 17 at Brandywine Raceway.

He was at Brandywine because he was too young to drive in his home state of New Jersey, where the minimum driving age was 18.

The next year he became a regular at Freehold, at first driving for his father, but once his talent became evident, he began life as a catch driver.

His first catch driving win was with a horse named Justa Tiger for Gerry Baldachino at the age of 18.

Eventually, he became known as one of a trio of great drivers who came to rule Freehold for decades – the other two being Catello Manzi and Herve Filion.

When The Meadowlands opened, it was only natural Jack would take his whip and colors to ply his trade at the world's foremost harness racetrack.

It wasn't instant fame when he first got there, but he more than held his own against arguably the greatest group of drivers ever assembled, including, but not limited to, Hall of Famers Bill O'Donnell, John Campbell, Mike Lachance, Ted Wing, Jim Doherty, Herve Filion, Carmine Abbatiello, Ron Pierce, Stanley Dancer, Bill Haughton Buddy Gilmour, Bernie Lindstedt, Cat Manzi, Ray Remmen, Ron Waples, Jimmy Takter, Tim Tetrick; with occasional stops made by Hall of Famers Tony Abbatiello, Keith Waples, George Sholty, Del Insko, John Simpson Jr, Wally Hennessey, Howard Beissinger Doug Ackerman, Clint Galbraith and Glen Garnsey.

Jack was up to the challenge. With each passing year his

numbers improved at his home track Freehold, at The Meadowlands and on the Grand Circuit.

In 1991, he achieved what he calls his "dream year" winning a plethora of classics races including the Hambletonian with Giant Victory and the Meadowlands Pace and Little Brown Jug with Precious Bunny.

All wasn't sweetness and light through those years, though. He had more than his share of racetrack injuries, some which caused him to miss time driving great horses in important races.

In addition, there were penalties for racing infractions. There was one time where he was penalized for six months.

In 2003, he was in Canada racing while The Meadowlands was closed. He enjoyed it, but his intent was to go back to New Jersey and continue his racing career there. Here we are 17 years later and he is still in Canada.

What precipitated the move? First, he was doing well. He was winning his share of races. Second, and perhaps more important, he met fiancée Joanne Colville with whom he has been together all that time.

He said he also appreciates the less frenetic lifestyle that he found in Canada. He liked the country and its lifestyle so much that in 2015 he became a citizen. He now enjoys dual citizenship and carries two passports.

Here's part of what I learned while speaking with this legendary driver:

Jack, you've won just about every important race there is to win in North America. You have won 9,877 races (19th all time). The horses you've driven have earned \$128,923,148 (14th all time). You would certainly be in anybody's all-time list of the greatest 20 drivers ever, maybe even top 10. Why aren't you in the Hall of Fame?

"Actually, the only really big race that I can think of that I haven't won is the North America Cup. I feel very confident that I would have won that as well, if I hadn't got in a bad accident on the track three days before the race. I was scheduled to drive Presidential Ball who eventually did win it.

"Insofar as me not being in the Hall of Fame, I don't know this for sure, but I'm guessing that it has a lot to do with the trouble I got into in the past. That's well in the past now. I much regret some of the things I may have done.

"My major problems occurred in 1990. Ironically, I had my career best year the following year in 1991. Maybe the enforced vacation did me some good. My problems are now 30 years in the past. I think I've been a very good citizen both on and off the racetrack. I can't erase the penalties. For the most part they were deserved. This isn't an excuse for any misbehavior, because ultimately we are responsible for what we do. But I mark down most of any problems I had to being young and foolish. I think I'm way past that stage.

"Just as the penalties cannot be erased from the records, neither can the accomplishments I've made on the racetrack. I don't mean to come across as bragging, because that's certainly not part of my personality.

If I became honored enough to one day make it into the Hall of Fame, I believe, I would be a long way from being either the worst person or the most accomplished one to become part of that great group.

** Authors Note. It is my intention to nominate Jack Moiseyev to the drivers' category of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2021.*

You've been around and sometimes driven for a multitude of the greatest trainers in the history of our sport. Who were the best?

"There were so many. Undoubtedly, I've left out a few.

"When I was first starting, the two that stood out were Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton. My family and Stanley were very close through the years. We both came from central New Jersey. I learned a lot from just listening to and watching Billy and Stanley. If Stanley had a horse that he



thought wasn't quite good enough to compete at the level that he was used to, but that he thought would make a decent horse to race at Freehold, he would offer it to my dad.

"I also had a lot of success driving for John Kopas.

"In later years, Brett Pelling, Bill Robinson and Bob McIntosh were outstanding. In recent times, you would have to include such names as Jimmy Takter and Ronnie Burke. Up here in Canada, Richard Moreau always has a top stable and Luc Blais does as good a job as anyone at developing young horses."

I've heard you and some other great drivers having been described as having "great hands" or "soft hands." I've sometimes found it difficult to picture what that means. It's kind of like Supreme Court Justice Potter Stewart who said, "I can't define pornography, but I know it when I see it." How would you define great and soft hands?

"It's really a hard thing to define, if, in fact, you can. I guess I probably would say it's the ability to make a horse go fast and to keep it going without inflicting either physical or mental pain. By mental pain, I mean the ability to allow the horse to maintain its confidence."

The two drivers I've mostly associated you with are Herve Filion and Cat Manzi. What about them?

"I'm guessing that's probably because we spent so much time together racing at Freehold. I think that the three of us probably learned a lot from driving against each other, for so long and so often. The word great is thrown around so often that it sometimes becomes kind of meaningless. However, when speaking of Herve and Cat, it's probably an

understatement. They were both great drivers, great horsemen and great people."

Let's talk about horses. Which is the best one that you've ever sat behind?

"That would have to be Precious Bunny. He was a perfect racehorse. He could do everything well. He could leave the gate faster than any horse that ever lived. Everybody who was at the Little Brown Jug the year that he was in it would remember when in about two seconds after leaving the gate, he had three lengths on the field. That was the first time I REALLY asked him to leave. Richie Silverman was inside of me with Die Laughing and I was pretty sure he intended to park me. He never got the chance.

"That race also provided me with the greatest thrill I've ever experienced in the sport. I'm generally even keeled. I rarely get too up or too down. But when I crossed the finish line with Precious Bunny, I felt all tingly and choked up. I don't think I've felt that way either before or since.

"If we were talking trotters, the best one would have to be Fools Goal. He was a wonderful horse that always came to race. The fact that he earned about \$3 million attests to his greatness."

You've driven for some wonderful owners through the years.

"The two best known were probably Tony Chiaravalle and

Peter Heffering. Both of them were great and generous guys. Another one is Dave Lemon. I had Daylon Magician in the Canadian Trotting Derby for him. He was so excited and proud. This was a horse that he had bred and raised. They were racing for a million dollars. Before the race he told me, 'I never dreamed that I would own a horse that was good enough to be in a race for that kind of money. I'll tell you what, Jack, if you win the race I'll double your driver's commission to 10 per cent.' We won and a week later he gave me a check for \$25,000, that, in addition to the normal driver's commission of that same amount. In recent years we've been pretty close with a great fellow by the name of Mel Luizza. He has been a great friend and owner of mine for well over 30 years."

After so much success in the United States, what brought you to race and live in Canada?

"None of it was pre-planned. The Meadowlands had closed and I decided to come up here to race for a meet while they were shut. I did fairly well. I met my fiancée Joanne Colville and also decided that I really liked the lifestyle and racing up here. So, one race meet led to another and I decided that this was where I wanted to live. Eventually I also became a Canadian citizen, as well. I now have dual citizenship."

You gave up driving a couple of years ago. You certainly weren't as great as you once were, but you were still decent. Why did you stop?

"I suppose it was a little like Sam Bowie said in your interview of him last week. This old body had suffered a lot of pain and it was getting much harder to drive without feeling its effects. The old saying is that Father Time is undefeated. He had caught up with me. The many racetrack wrecks I had been in were taking their toll. Like Mike Lachance said to you in an interview you had with him awhile ago, I didn't want to go out as just a poor imitation of what I had once been."

You are still involved, though, as a trainer.

"Yes, we have 14 in training and we've had a fairly decent season. I'm up in the morning training and at the track every night that we have something in to race. I fear that I've fallen into that fault that most trainers get some time or another. I sometimes second guess my drivers. "Why did he do that?" or "Why didn't he do that?" I might holler to myself. In general, though, the guys I use to drive my horses do a great job. I doubt that I could do any better. I find it's sometimes a lot more difficult to watch your horses and drive them from the paddock than to sit behind them in a race."

What does Jackie Mo do for fun?

"Actually, horses take up most of Joanne's and my time. Occasionally, I'll get out on a golf course, but I'm pretty terrible at the game."

"I'm a huge football fan. I love the NFL and am a great New York Giants fan. I watch as many football games as time allows me. If there's a game on TV, that's likely where you'll find me."

We'll finish off with COVID-19. How has it affected you?

"Initially, it hurt everyone in racing. But after awhile we adapted to the restrictions and learned to live with them. Actually, I believe that if society as a whole adapted and followed the rules as well as racing and its people have, things all over wouldn't be near as bad as they became."

"Personally, the travel restrictions hurt. I'd normally get down to New Jersey to visit family and friends a couple of times a year. Of course, that has been out for quite some time."

"Now we have been hit with the final whammy on a terrible 2020. There will be no more racing in Ontario until further notice. I'm hoping that within a short period of time the vaccines will have their desired effects and we'll get back to something approaching normal."

Lexi Sarkine's picture-perfect milestone moment came with an asterisk.

It was a scene she had played out in her mind several times over the past two years: the thought of celebrating her first win as a trainer

So, when Air Assault, a 5-year-old trotting son of Yankee Glide recorded a half-length win in 1:57.2 at Dayton Raceway on Dec. 4, it was everything Sarkine had dreamt of.

Well, almost.

The gelding, who sold for \$10,000 at the 2016 Lexington Select Sale, went straight from the winner's circle to a new barn after he was claimed for \$6,500.

Sarkine went from elated to deflated in less time than it took Air Assault, the 4-5 mutuel favorite, to complete his winning mile.

"It was a pretty bittersweet moment. My phone was blowing up afterwards, and everyone was congratulating me. Whenever anyone asked, 'How do you feel?' I always said that it was bittersweet. We've had this horse since he was a 2-year-old. It was pretty cool to win with him, but then he was claimed from that race. So, there was a lot of emotion in that winner's circle. I have a horse that's now a riding horse that used to get claimed all the time, so I know it how it feels. With him, I knew I would get him back and he would stay with me. This one... it hurts."

Perhaps even more so considering Air Assault won next time out for his new connections, another 1:57.2 mile, this time as the 3-5 choice.

Bred by Steve Stewart (Paris, KY) and Ernst Gerbaulet (Recklinghausen, GER), the well-traveled bay is closing in on the \$100,000 career earnings mark.

Sarkine has both fond and painful memories of the hard-trying horse that won his first pari-mutuel start at the Red Mile on Aug. 5, 2017, in a \$15,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes event.

"He's a pretty easy-going horse," said Sarkine, who is in a relationship with trainer/driver Mike Hollenback. "But he was a bit of a jerk when we got him. He bruised my ribs when he struck me as a 2-year-old. But then he chilled out. He's been a wonderful horse to have in your barn. He loves attention, he's great to train – there's just a lot of really nice things about him."

Sarkine has taken over the reins of lead trainer for the Hollenback stable for the time being while the horseman tends to their string of 2-year-old horses in Pinehurst (NC) over the winter.

While it took a little convincing to have her in the driver's seat, so to speak, for the Indiana-based pacers and trotters, she eventually got the green light.

"I thought, 'Finally!' It's a great feeling and I'm really enjoying it."

That wasn't always the case, albeit in the days leading up to her first horse racing gig as a groom.

When Sarkine went looking for a job in the sport nearly nine years ago, she wasn't initially sold on the idea of joining

the standardbred world.

That, however, would quickly change.

"I've been in this industry since 2012. I actually found the job through Craigslist. I was on there – I have this little old riding horse – and I was looking to buy a couple of things. When you have a riding horse, you're always buying things you don't really need. But I found this job, as a groom. Originally, I thought it was for thoroughbreds. When they called me up and they said it was for harness racing, I thought it sounded a little bit boring. But I thought I'd give it a try. And I'm so glad I did. I love it. I love the horses and the people. It's in my blood now. That's how it all began. I started working for Mike and here I am."

And where she happens to be is in a very happy place.

Not surprisingly, it's the horses that make it special for Sarkine, who along with Hollenback, currently have 15 horses in their operation, split between Indiana and

Pinehurst Race Track.

“It’s a nice, peaceful thing to do, this job. Every day, it puts a smile on your face. I would lose my mind if I didn’t have the horses in my life.”

Now that she has a training win on her stat sheet, Sarkine has her sights set on tracking down another first, specifically, a driving victory.

Although it’s a small sample size, a trio of starts in the race bike in 2019 yielded some encouraging results.

“I actually just started driving last summer at the fairs. I had three starts and ended up with two seconds and a third. My definite goal for next year is to get my driving win. I’d also like to keep doing the training thing because I really enjoy it. I love being around the horses every day.”

Reuniting with Air Assault down the road and having him back in the fold is also on her list of things she hopes to accomplish.

Whether or not it happens, the veteran trotter is never far from her thoughts.

“He got claimed again after he was claimed from us, but I let the people know that if anything happens to let me know. I want to make sure he ends up in a good situation or in a good home. That’s my goal, that he always has a happy life.”

As for short-term hopes, Sarkine would like to add another training triumph to her résumé.

This time, however, she’s hopeful that it isn’t capped off by having to watch the horse walking away to a new barn address.

“Exactly. I don’t know when I can win the next one, but I’d sure like it to be soon before Mike comes back. It would be nice for the second one to be happy from start to finish, no claims at all. It’s part of the sport, and I understand that, but it doesn’t make it any easier. You develop a bond with all your horses. Every one is different, but every one is special.”

TOTAL ESTIMATED VALUE – \$6,000,000

STALLION NOMINATION FEE: Due and payable January 15, 2021, in the amount of the advertised stud fee for the 2021 breeding season (\$500 U.S. funds minimum) -- plus an additional surcharge as indicated below -- provided, however, that for first-year stallions placed in commercial service (which would not include test breedings) after January 15, the nomination must be paid within 60 days after the stallion first breeds a mare. In no event will any first-year stallion nomination fee be accepted after December 31, 2021. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to determine the stallion nomination fee of those stallions whose 2021 service is advertised as private treaty, or if the amount of the fee is not advertised. This payment covers 2021 matings (foals of 2022).

In addition to the 2021 service fee, the amount of the stallion nomination fee must include a surcharge as follows:

a) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$3,000 to \$5,999 (or \$3,996 CAD (Canadian Dollars) to \$7,990 CAD), an additional amount equal to 40% of 2021 service fee must be paid;

b) For stallions that stand for a fee from US\$6,000 to \$9,999 (or \$7,992 CAD to \$13,319 CAD), an additional amount equal to 75% of 2021 service fee must be paid;

c) For stallions that stand for a fee of US\$10,000 (\$13,320 CAD), or more, an additional amount equal to 200% of 2021 service fee must be paid.

For stallions that stand for a service fee of less than US\$3,000 (or \$3,996 CAD), no additional surcharge is necessary for nomination.

Note: For the purpose of determining the surcharge in other than U.S. funds, the November 1, 2020 exchange rate is used; a rate of \$1.332 CAD per US\$.

Stallion nominations for other than first-year stallions that are postmarked after January 15, 2021, but on or before December 31, 2021, will be accepted upon payment of an additional penalty amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge). Likewise, stallion nominations for first-year stallions that are postmarked after the above sixty-day deadline, but on or before December 31, 2021, will be accepted upon payment of an additional amount equal to 50% of the above stallion nomination fee (including the above surcharge).

Any payment on a stallion that does not commercially conceive a foal or breed a mare by any means during the entire 2021 breeding season may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2021.

Moreover, if a nominated stallion does not breed more than twenty (20) mares in 2021 or produce more than fifteen (15) registered foals in 2022, up to 50% of the stallion nomination fee may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for adjustment by December 31, 2021 (mares bred) or by December 31, 2022 (registered foals). No stallion nomination fee will be reduced to less than \$500.00 U.S. funds.

Any payment on a North American stallion that has been nominated by January 15, 2021, and is subsequently exported prior to February 15, 2021 and that does not commercially breed a mare in North America by any means during the entire 2021 breeding season, may be refunded, provided, however, that it shall be the obligation of the stallion nominator to notify the Society in writing of any request for refund by December 31, 2021. With the exception of supplemental nominations or declarations as provided in the conditions, foals of 2022 by a stallion for which the above nomination fee has been refunded will be ineligible to the Breeders Crown unless an additional amount equal to the amount of the refund is paid.

Except as provided above, stallion nomination fees shall not be refunded.

Stallion payments may be made in the local currency of the nation in which the stallion stands, or in equivalent U.S. funds (\$500 U.S. funds minimum).

Conditions for nominating yearlings will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes & Futurities Nomination Book. Specific conditions for the races for which these foals are eligible will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes Guide in the year of the races. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to add to, amend or delete the conditions of all or any part of the Breeders Crown program, without liability.

In 2021, 2-year-old, 3-year-old and open Breeders Crown events will be conducted under the conditions of Breeders Crown 2021. All of these races are closed with sustaining payments due in 2021, with the exception of supplemental nominations.

Giannis has been a horsemen's hangout for at least 50 years. Not much in the line of atmosphere, but great food.


In Deerfield, in a building that housed the wonderful Marcellos, and then Frank and Dinos, is now Luigis. Good southern Italian fare at reasonable prices.

When it comes to Boca, there are really too many to name. I will give you my favorites. New York Prime is the best steak house in Florida. It's not better than the original Peter Luger in Brooklyn, but, on occasion, can be pretty close. The virus has curtailed the excitement of the bar, but the food remains wonderful.

Trattoria Romano still is as good as it gets on anyone's list. By far the best veal chop I have ever eaten and the Romano salad is to die for. La Viletta is a small, elegant spot where the food is exceptional. Last week, I had fresh Pompano deboned table side simply delicious. The specialty of the house is Yellowtail Snapper baked in sea salt.

Last, but certainly not least, is Carlo Vaccarezza's Frank and Dinos. Excellent food, long happy hour and beautiful bartenders. Maybe the best seafood salad you can find. Carlo will be opening in Lexington any day now.

The governor has actually gone out of his way to warn local municipalities against any kind of restrictions. If you went to any good dining establishment on a weekend in Delray or Boca you would never know there was a virus going around. I was at New York Prime recently and they were four deep at the bar, chatting away, no masks at all.

However, I will say, that the average of today's patron is most likely around 45, whereas in years past it was more like 65. There aren't a lot of old men like me hitting the ground running at 7:30 p.m. these days.

Tom Santoro asks: When a race is declared official all bets are paid off. Then the horse comes up positive and the purse is redistributed. Does the guy who bet the second place finisher have a legal right to sue for the money he should have had if the race was not influenced by drugs?

If you asked me this question a year ago I would have said once the race is official and the public is paid it is fait accompli (over). However, things have changed since this summer.

Jeffrey Tretter a gambler from Illinois actually brought suit against Bob Bresnahan Jr. the trainer and J.L. Sadowsky the owner of a horse that won at the Meadowlands and subsequently came up with a positive test for EPO. Tretter's attorney accused the pair of fraud and racketeering. I will not get into the details, but it was shown that the plaintiff had made a wager that was worth over \$30,000 had the drugged horse been disqualified immediately.

They settled the case for \$20,000 with what to me were some nefarious circumstances.

Mr. Tretter's lawyers were financially supported by PETA, that most likely was overbearing on the defense.

To me, this sets a ridiculous precedent. Sadly, the defendants didn't take the decision to a higher court.

Bill Coleman asks: What is the secret ingredient that creates a super trainer?

There are a few however I doubt they are a secret. I think the key is COMMUNICATION. Without it, you are finished before you start.

I find that there are many great trainers that because of lack of patience have never developed the ability to talk to clients. It is of the essence that an owner is in a comfort zone with a trainer and in the long run it will cover over a myriad of errors that just naturally occur in our business. For the 2021 barn, INTELLIGENCE is more important than ever.

There is something new or updated all the time and to be the best you must be aware of the day to day changes.

GREAT ASSISTANTS AND CARETAKERS are the backbone of any big operation and if your help is not on board delegating authority becomes irrelevant. In a large stable, it is impossible to do everything yourself. Therefore, the smartest help gets the job done. It is natural that things will fall through the cracks the object is to minimize that phenomenon and let the number of horses make up for them.

Last, but certainly not least, ATTENTION TO DETAIL, which in and of itself has become a major subject of late. Notice some barns have often received environmental contamination positives and others have not. To me that is of primary importance in today's trainer. The best never find the need to "push the envelope."

I scratch my head when I think about reading all the condition sheets and entering 50 horses to race in a day. To this writer it was a headache entering four. But in my day there were very few big barns like there are today.

I want to preface my next statement by pointing out that the two trainers I will use as examples are not necessarily the best but they truly fit my mold.

If you wish to see my theories in action two trainers that in my opinion exemplify big barn perfection are Tony Alagna and Jim Campbell.

Please don't send me letters naming your favorites. There are many very capable big barns out there, I merely selected two that to me have withstood the test of time.

Thank you so much for making this horrible year somewhat palatable. Without your wonderful input it would truly have been more of an uphill struggle. I wish all my friends and readers a healthy and Happy New Year. May we have the chance to socialize again in 2021.

Hall of Fame criteria for horses prone to missing mark

In 2021, Always B Miki, Bee A Magician and Sweet Lou will be the newest racehorses inducted into the U.S. Hall of Fame. As with all other top vote getters from their nominating class both past and present, their nominations were only first allowed due to each of them meeting sets of criteria set forth by the Living Horse Hall of Fame Committee.

In order to be under consideration for the Hall of Fame, racehorses must either have won \$2.5 million in career earnings along with two Dan Patch (U.S.) awards. Or, absent of two Dan Patch awards, horses must have won \$3 million lifetime. Horses who have been named Dan Patch Harness Horse of the Year can be eligible, too.

The specific sets of nominating prerequisites present a conundrum where horses that would otherwise qualify for consideration based on their merits, cannot even have their credentials debated.

Take for example, the case of Mach Three. The son of Matt's Scooter raced in 2001 and 2002 and retired with career earnings of \$2,376,700. Though inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame following his untimely death in 2017, in part because he had deep Canadian connections, Mach Three will never enter the U.S. Hall of Fame. It'll never even up for debate, as current conditions do not allow for it.

Mach Three doesn't meet the Dan Patch or earnings requirements, but if not for a nose defeat to second-over Western Shooter who rode his first-over cover in the 2001 Breeders Crown, he would have gone from zero to being two-thirds of the way there. If that narrowest of finish went the other way, Mach Three would have ran away with 2-year-old divisional honors and would have also finished over \$2.5 million in career earnings.

That Mach Three never won a Dan Patch award or the comparable O'Brien award in Canada is more of a reflection

of the quality of those loaded 2- and 3-year-old crops more so than on Mach Three himself. After just losing out to Western Shooter as a 2-year-old, he was bested for the honor by future Hall of Famer Art Major as a 3-year-old. In addition to Art Major whom Mach Three beat while racing, that crop also included the likes of McArdle, Red River Hanover and a host of other millionaires.

With a career record of 18 wins in 27 starts against one of the best racing crops in history – if not the very best – Mach Three's career highlights were winning the Metro Pace at 2 (over Red River Hanover) and winning the Meadowlands Pace at 3 (over McArdle), the latter of which in 1:49 established a Meadowlands Pace record at that time. Are those two wins plus 16 others and a lasting overall body of work Hall of Fame worthy in the U.S.? I honestly don't know. It seems like it might be, though. What would be lost by being able to bring it forward for discussion?

It should also be noted that Mach Three sired the winners of more than \$150 million, including one of the greatest racehorses and stallions of all time, Somebeachsomewhere. Mach Three may, in fact, qualify as a stallion. The criteria for stallions is as follows: must rank among the 10 all-time leading money-winning sires at their gait, OR have sired at least 100 \$200,000 winners, OR been a leading money-winning sire at his gait in three or more seasons. He is hovering around the top 10 all-time and has produced 445 \$100,000 winners, so, presumably, he has more than 100 offspring over \$200,000, though the exact count was not available at press time.

For race mares, the Living Hall of Fame nominating requirements are similar, though the earning thresholds have been lowered. Though, that won't aid the cause of one of the great race mares of all-time in Darlin's Delight.

The third-highest earning pacing mare ever at over \$2.9 million, she only won a single Dan Patch award during her 3-year-old season in 2006. The reason she didn't win another Dan Patch either as a 2-year-old or in her final two seasons had a great deal to do with her chief rival, My Little Dragon. Darlin's Delight and My Little Dragon represented one of the best pacing mare rivalries this century, and neither have yet been nominated to the Hall of Fame for their accomplishments. For her part, My Little Dragon does have the two Dan Patch requirements (winning as a 2-year-old and again as a 4-year-old) as well as the required career earnings for a race mare.

In looking at these two race mares, couldn't it be debated where they relate to fellow Hall of Fame pacing mares from around that same time period, Rainbow Blue and Bunny Lake? Both of those fillies were named Horse of Year for their 3-year-old seasons, but I don't recall either of those having to deal with the depth of a crop such as Mach Three or an equally talented rival such as Darlin's Delight and My Little Dragon. Don't misunderstand – this isn't meant to retract from Rainbow Blue nor Bunny Lake whom are both more than Hall of Fame worthy – but they didn't race against barriers others did that precluded them from higher earnings or additional accolades.

From an even more recent instance, Tall Dark Stranger would seem be on track for eventual U.S. Hall of Fame induction. His two-year career mirrors that of Captaintreacherous who was a first-ballot Hall of Famer, but Tall Dark Stranger would get in only on the condition that he wins the 2020 Dan Patch award for Horse of the Year since his \$2.3 million in career earnings is less than the required \$2.5 million (even with multiple divisional Dan Patch awards, unless one of them is Horse of Year). It'll work out this time

but had 3-year-old filly Party Girl Hill not been upset in her Breeders Crown this year, then Tall Dark Stranger would likely not be Horse of Year and would not be up for Hall of Fame consideration. And it seems like exclusion would then be due to appearance of a technicality between earnings and awards, which doesn't do justice to anyone in the process, including the Hall itself.

I'm not calling for the eligibility into the Hall of Fame to be less stringent; just perhaps less rigid. Set out to provide objective measures, the underlying Dan Patch award process can be subjective to start with. And earnings can vary based on the fluctuations of race purses, something that is increasingly prevalent today in current economic uncertainty.

At the end of the day the Hall of Fame should be reserved for the very best horses, as it always has been. Changing or removing the limits for horses to first be considered won't suddenly allow an undeserving horse to be inducted. But it might allow for an induction of a deserving horse that wouldn't be considered otherwise.

Hanna des Molles wins \$207,000 Criterium

The \$207,000 Criterium des 3 ans for 3-year-olds was held at Vincennes racetrack on Sunday (Dec. 20) and it became a great triumph for Laurent-Claude Abrivard-trained **Hanna des Molles** (Village Mystic), driven by Alexandre Abrivard.

Hanna des Molles had to advance three wide in the first turn and came to the lead, via position first over, with a kilometer to go in the 1.6-mile race.

Hanna des Molles had everything under complete control as the field turned for home and the filly claimed the trophy

in a mile rate of 1:59.

Criterium des 3 ans, which has seen winners such as Ready Cash, Timoko, Bold Eagle and Face Time Bourbon, is one of the biggest objectives during the French winter meeting in Paris and the victory for Hanna des Molles meant that both Laurent-Claude and his son Alexandre claimed their first win in the race, respectively.

World Driving Championship 2021 postponed

Italy was to play host to the World Driving Championship next year, but due to the COVID-19 situation, the competition is postponed and will take place in the European country in 2023 instead, according to Norwegian media tgn.no.

In connection to the championship, the harness racing world conference will be held in Italy in 2023.

New Zealand was to play host to the competition in 2023, but the drivers can look forward to a visit to New Zealand in 2025 instead.

Two-year-olds in focus in Paris

Jean-Philippe Dubois sat behind his 2-year-old filly **Illusive Artist** (Prodigious) when the \$103,500 Prix Une de Mai was held in Paris on Christmas Day. Illusive Artist quite easily claimed the victory in a mile rate of 1:58.3 over 1.3 miles. In

a race that contained several breaks (seven out of 13 contenders went off stride), Illusive Artist showed that she probably will be a factor when a new year begins.

Two-year-old colts were gathered around the track of Vincennes on Dec. 26. The \$103,500 Prix Emmanuel Margouty was scheduled and Philippe Allaire showed his **ItalianoVero** (Ready Cash) in perfect shape. The Ready Cash son came to the lead, paired with David Thomain and the duo controlled the field the whole way and came home in mile rate 1:58.1 over 1.3 miles.

The victory in the Prix Emmanuel Margouty was Italiano Ver's fifth consecutive win in 2020 and he will enter the new year as the master of the crop among French-bred colts.

Gocciadoro claimed big win in Italy

Alessandro Gocciadoro is the king of Italian harness racing and on Dec. 26 his **Virginia Grif** (Varenne) won the \$135,000 Gran Premio Due Mari in Taranto, Italy.

The 6-year-old mare was driven by Massimiliano Castaldo and cruised to safe victory in 1:56.1 and beat horses like Chief Orlando and Stepping Spaceboy.

Promising performance by Gu d'Heripre

Face Time Bourbon has already showed Europe that a fresh 5-year-old trotter can win the prestigious Prix d'Amérique in Paris in January. That was the case in 2020, when Face Time Bourbon came from splendid seasons as a 3- and 4-year old and played with the older, more merited and, normally, more brave trotters in the biggest race in Europe.

The comparison is perhaps unfair, but Philippe Billard-trained 4-year-old **Gu d'Heripre** seems to have all the ingredients required to take the big step against the best trotters in the world, which he showed in his victorious race, the \$207,000 Criterium Continental at Vincennes in Paris on Sunday (Dec. 27).

Franck Nivard took a safe route when the car left the 16-horse field in front of the grandstands at Vincennes and Gu d'Heripre was found in fourth over after 250 meters. But horses attacked three wide directly and when leader Guzz Mearas got company from Power midway through the 1.3-mile race, the pace was still set high and Gu d'Heripre sat in sixth over, with horses on his outside. So Nivard had to lift his horse out, with cover as fourth, three wide before the last turn and in the turn Nivard had so much power in his horse that he had to attack four and five wide. Gu d'Heripre (Coktail Jet) flew throughout the last turn and got close contact with the new leaders Go On Boy and Golden Mary. Nivard noted that he would win the race pretty early in the home stretch and Gu d'Heripre's performance was outstanding and so good that he must be considered as a big threat even in the Prix d'Amérique, for which

he received a ticket since he won Criterium Continental.

The mile rate was 1:54.2 and high grades were distributed to runner up Golden Mary and third placed Go On Boy, who both raced three wide most of the race.

Behind the top three, Jerry Riordan's Aetos Kronos finished incredibly strong in fourth after a trip where he ended up as last horse ahead of the last turn, in addition that he was roughly interfered attacking five wide at the top of the stretch.

Criterium Continental replay.

Ticket to Abrivard

Just like 2019, the \$103,500 Prix Tenor de Baune for 5-year-olds went to a horse trained by Laurent-Claude Abrivard, driven by Alexandre Abrivard. Last year, Excellent was victorious in the particular race which gave him a ticket to Prix d'Amérique (where Excellent made a break in the lead after a kilometer into the race). This time, it was **Feerie Wood's** turn to show that the Abrivard stable wants to participate in Prix d'Amérique 2020.

Feerie Wood (Rockfeller Center) followed in the back of Feydeau Seven in the last turn and when Alexandre Abrivard gave full order to attack at the home stretch, Feerie Wood disarmed the inside horse and won in a solid mile rate of 1:57.1 over 1.6 miles.

Laurent-Claude Abrivard has had a splendid year as a trainer 2020. His 865 starts have resulted in 163 victories, which puts him in fourth place among the French trainers this year. Jean-Michel Bazire is number one and the French champion trainer and driver has collected 203 victories during 2020.

2020 O'Brien Award finalists announced

Moreau up for a record 8th Trainer of the Year title.

Standardbred Canada is pleased to announce the finalists for the 2020 O'Brien Awards, which honor Canada's best in harness racing over the past season.

There are two finalists in each division which includes 12 divisional horse categories and five people awards. Horse of the Year will be one of the divisional champions.

The winners will be announced at the Virtual O'Brien Awards Gala on Sunday, Jan. 31 on <https://standardbredcanada.ca/>.

This will mark the 32nd edition of the O'Brien Awards, named in honor of the late Joe O'Brien, an outstanding horseman and member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Richard Moreau will be looking to add a record eighth O'Brien trophy to his mantle in the **Trainer of the Year** category and is up against **Ben Baillargeon** of Guelph, ON, a first-time nominee.

Baillargeon is enjoying a career-best season, training horses that posted 123 victories and banked more than \$2.9 million in earnings including O'Brien finalist PL Jill in the Older Trotting Mare category.

Moreau of Puslinch, ON has earned seven consecutive titles as Canada's Trainer of the Year. To date in 2020, he has sent 236 winners postward and trained horses to more than \$3.6 million in earnings including O'Brien finalist Lit De Rose in the Older Pacing Mare Category. Moreau, one of the country's busiest trainers with more than 1,582 races to his credit, has topped the Canadian earnings charts for trainers for several years and was the leading money earning trainer at Woodbine Mohawk Park and Georgian Downs during 2020.

Bob McClure and **Doug McNair**, the top two money-earning drivers in the country are the **Driver of the Year** finalists.

Bob McClure of Rockwood, ON, is en route to a career-best season in the earnings column, and is the leading money winning driver in Canada. He recently eclipsed the \$7 million mark, an impressive addition to his resume and has also made 229 trips to the winner's circle. McClure, a finalist in this category in 2016, 2018 and 2019, was the regular driver for five O'Brien finalists – Donna Soprano, Lauras Love, Lawless Shadow, Macho Martini and Tattoo Artist. McClure was also the winner of the prestigious Lampman Cup as the Ontario Sires Stakes' leading driver this past season.

The O'Brien Awards will be held virtually this year on Sunday, Jan. 31.

The winner of Driver of the Year honors in 2017, McNair of Guelph, ON is having one of his best years with 283 winners and more than \$6.2 million in earnings. He was the regular reinsman for two O'Brien finalists – Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly Karma Seelster and Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly, Warrawee Vicky.

Gilles Barrieau and **Kelly Hoerd** are the finalists for the **O'Brien Award of Horsemanship** and are both past winners in this category.

Two-time Horsemanship winner and defending champion, Gilles Barrieau of Saint John, NB, competes on the Atlantic provinces circuit and to date this season, he's trained 44 winners and horses to more than \$227,000 in purse earnings while boasting a UTRS of .552. On the driving side, he has 170 winners and more than \$485,000 in earnings, giving him a .411 UDRS.

Kelly Hoerdts of Beaumont, AB, won the Horsemanship Award in 2013. This year, the Alberta-based trainer/driver has trained 152 winners and horses to more than \$860,000 in earnings, while driving 163 winners and horses that earned more than \$895,000.

Caviart Audrey and **Scarlett Hanover**, both daughters of Bettors Delight, are the nominees in the **Two-Year-Old Pacing Filly** division. Caviart Audrey won five of nine races and more than \$372,000 in her rookie campaign which included victories in the Eternal Camnation, Champlain, an elimination and final of the Shes A Great Lady.

Scarlett Hanover posted 11 top-three finishes from 14 starts and earned more than \$449,000. She won two Ontario Sires Stakes events including the Super Final and also competed against Grand Circuit company, scoring a season's best 1:51.3 victory in the Champlain Stakes and winning an elimination of the Shes A Great Lady.

A pair of Shadow Play colts, **Bulldog Hanover** and **Lawless Shadow**, are the finalists in the **Two-Year-Old Pacing Colt** division.

Bulldog Hanover won four of six races, all Ontario Sires Stakes events including the season ending Super Final and more than \$248,000 in 2020.

Lawless Shadow hit the board in eight of nine races, including four wins in his rookie campaign and topped \$307,000 in purse earnings. He scored two victories in Ontario Sires Stakes events, a win in the Nassagaweya, runner-up finishes in a Metro elimination and OSS Super Final and a third-place finish in the Metro Final.

In the **Three-Year-Old Pacing Filly** division, Ontario-breds **Lauras Love** and **Karma Seelster** will compete for O'Brien honors.

Unraced as a two-year-old, the Betterthancheddar filly, Lauras Love was a model of consistency in 2020, scoring 16 top-three finishes, including eight victories from 20 races, and earning \$331,000 for her connections. In addition to a victory in an Ontario Sires Stakes event, she scored multiple victories in overnight competition and also won a division of the Simcoe against Grand Circuit company.

The Sportswriter filly Karma Seelster had three wins and nine top three finishes in 15 races and earned more than \$277,000. She added a win in an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold event and a sweep of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association Stake (SBOA) to her resume.

Major Custard and **Tattoo Artist** are the **Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt** finalists.

Major Custard was almost invincible this season, winning

15 of 16 races and earning more than \$237,000 while competing on the Western Provinces Circuit which included Fraser Downs in B.C. and Century Downs and Century Mile in Alberta. The Alberta-bred son of Custard The Dragon scored victories in the Alberta Sires Stakes, the Ralph Klein, the Maverick, the Robert Murphy Stakes, the Western Canada Pacing Derby and the Brad Gunn Stake.

Tattoo Artist, a son of Hes Watching, won eight of 17 starts and more than \$666,000 this season with victories in five Ontario Sires Stakes events, and a division of the Simcoe Stakes. One of his biggest efforts was a runner-up finish in the \$1 million North America Cup.

Lit De Rose and **So Much More** are finalists in the **Older Pacing Mare** category.

Lit De Rose boasted 14 top-three finishes from 18 starts and earned more than \$169,000. Primarily a Fillies & Mares Preferred campaigner, the daughter of Leader Bayama scored an impressive runner-up finish in the Milton Stake Final.

So Much More dominated the fillies and mares preferred ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park, winning 12 of 30 starts and eclipsing \$300,000 in earnings during her season. On July 25, she scored a career best 1:49.3 lifetime best at Woodbine Mohawk Park and put together a three-race win streak in

October.

Century Farroh and **Sintra** are the **Older Pacing Horse** finalists.

Century Farroh is looking for his second consecutive O'Brien trophy, after being voted Canada's Three-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year in 2019. Competing as a four-year-old, the son of Mach Three scored 12 top-three finishes in 16 starts and more than \$637,000 in earnings. His stakes victories included the Breeders Crown and the Dan Patch.

Sintra is also looking to secure his second O'Brien trophy in this category after winning it in 2017. In 2020 the son of Mach Three scored 15 top-three finishes, including nine wins, in 22 starts and bankrolled \$249,531 for his connections. Competing primarily in the Preferred ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park, he most recently scored three consecutive wins at Mohawk.

Donna Soprano and **Imextraspecial** will compete for **Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly** honors. Donna Soprano won five of seven races and more than \$575,000 for her connections which included sweeps of the Pure Ivory and Peaceful Way Stakes, a win in a Champlain division and an impressive runner-up finish in the inaugural edition of the Mohawk Million.

Imextraspecial won five of 10 races and more than \$223,000 in her rookie campaign, which was highlighted by five victories in Ontario Sires Stakes events.

In the **Two-Year-Old Trotting Colt** division, stablemates **Macho Martini** and **On A Streak** are the finalists. Trained by Luc Blais for Determination of Montreal, QC, these two colts topped the rookie trotting colt charts in 2020. The Muscle Mass colt Macho Martini was a winner of eight of 11 starts and \$454,000, scoring victories in four Ontario Sires Stakes events, the Millard Farm elimination and final, a Champlain division and an elimination of the William Wellwood Memorial Stake.

On A Streak had only two wins in 10 starts, but they were both very lucrative ones. His maiden-breaking effort came in the \$525,000 William Wellwood Stakes which was worth \$267,500 and a spot in the inaugural Mohawk Million, where he finished a solid third. His second victory came in the Breeders Crown, and was worth \$300,000. In total the Cantab Hall colt earned in excess of \$850,000 for his season which also included a runner-up finish in the Valley Victory.

Sorella and **Warrawee Vicky** are the finalists in the **Three-Year-Old Trotting Filly** division.

Sorella won eight of 15 races and \$737,000 including

victories in the Reynolds, the Hambletonian Oaks, the Casual Breeze, the Bluegrass and the Matron.

Warrawee Vicky scored four wins in 12 starts and banked more than \$230,000. Three of those wins came in the Ontario Sires Stakes events and the fourth was in a Simcoe division.

Pemberton and **Ready For Moni** will compete for **Three-Year-Old Trotting Colt** honors.

Pemberton, a son of Wheeling N Dealin, won eight of 10 races and earned more than \$363,000 for his sophomore season. Four of his victories came in Ontario Sires Stakes events including the season-ending Super Final.

The aptly-named Ready For Moni boasted a bankroll in excess of \$646,000 for his sophomore season which included five wins in 11 starts. His season was highlighted by a sweep of the Goodtimes, victories in the Zweig Memorial and Stanley Dancer, and a runner-up finish in the Hambletonian.

In the **Older Trotting Mare** category, **Hey Livvy** and **PL Jill** are the finalists.

Hey Livvy won nine races and more than \$278,000 in 22 trips postward, highlighted by her richest payday, an impressive victory in the Armbro Flight.

PL Jill was a consistent performer in the Preferred trotting ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park, winning nine of 25 starts and banking more than \$241,000. Her biggest payday came in the Earl Rowe Stake where she got up for a head victory.

On The Ropes and **Perfetto** are finalists in the **Older Trotting Horse** category.

On The Ropes won six races and \$142,000 during his five-year-old campaign and all of his 34 starts took place at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Perfetto won seven of 24 races and \$149,000 while also making all but one start at Mohawk.

This year marks the eighth year for the **Future Star Award**, with two PEI natives competing as finalists. **Rachel Andrew**, of Dundas, ON, and **Austin Sorrie** who resides in Freerton, ON, both posted some impressive stats this season.[2]

Andrew trained 51 winners and horses to more than \$434,000 in earnings in just her third year of full-time training.

This marks the second consecutive year that Sorrie is a finalist in this category. The young reinsman was in demand on the Ontario B Track circuit in 2020, driving in more than 1,155 races, scoring 143 wins and driving horses to more than \$874,000 in purse earnings.

Seelster Farms and **Warrawee Farm** are finalists in the

Armstrong Breeder of the Year category.

Three-time Breeder of the Year Seelster Farms of Lucan, ON, won this award in 2006, 2013, and 2018.

In 2020, horses bred by Seelster won 239 races and earned more than \$3.3 million. Top performers included O'Brien finalists Lawless Shadow and Karma Seelster along with Tokyo Seelster.

Horses bred by Rockwood, ON-based Warrawee Farm won 41 races and earned more than \$1 million in 2020, including O'Brien finalist Warrawee Vicky. Other top performers included Warrawee Vital and Warrawee Ubeaut.

One of the winners in the divisional categories will be awarded the Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year title.

BREAKING STRIDE

A view from a Vulcan

“Are you for or against HISA?” I asked David as I flicked on the turn signal.

“Who, or what is HISA?”

“Legislation, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act.”

“Since I don’t know what it is, it would be foolish to take a stance.”

“What are you, a Vulcan? Real humans make snap judgments on jazz music, politics, civil wars, laws, the opera, or tofu. Humans defend our position to the death. We listen passionately to voices from our side and brand the other side idiots.”

“And never change your mind?”

“Traitors change sides.”

Softly he said, “Or maybe heroes.” He paused for a moment, then asked, “So, what is this HISA legislation of which you speak? The title sounds benign. Who can be against integrity and safety?”

“The harness racing national organization doesn’t seem to be a big fan of HISA.”

He said, “I’m going to need a little more information. Without data, I would be a person spouting off an unfounded opinion.”

“Data? Where do I get data? I’m a nobody with no inside track. All I have are opinions and op-eds marinated in the traditional treadmill of rumors, shooting from the hip, and gossip.”

“Well, give me your impression. Since when is Trey timid about offering an opinion?”

I sighed. “To me, HISA looks like a power thing. The side that supports the legislation says that the federal government would do a better job for horse racing’s integrity and safety. The folks against the bill prefer individual states

and individual breeds of racing tend to their barns. For example, if the feds rule, using the medication, Lasix, could be out. Otherwise, the states or types of racing can keep using it.”

“What do you think about Lasix?” he asked.

“I’m on the fence. My long-time trainer rarely used it, but it was annoying when we were the only horse in a race without it.”

“YOU, on the fence? Maybe you have some Vulcan blood.” He flashed me the split-finger Vulcan sign with his right hand and said, “Back to the pending legislation, besides the medication issue, what are other objections?”

“Not sure. The anti-legislation folks say racing under the Feds could cost more money to race a horse because of additional testing. We would get lumped in with other types of horse racing. Deep down, plenty of folks in harness racing are old school and don’t like change or to be mandated.”

He finally offered a hint of an opinion, “I’m guessing existing state agencies currently in place don’t want to get squeezed out.”

“Who does?”

He scratched his greying buzzcut and asked, “How is the current system working out for harness racing?”

“Not great. The most recent example was just before COVID. Several arrests went down for cheating in horse racing. Some of the indicted were harness trainers and vets. These alleged cheats did their drugging year after year, took purse money, and not much of significance happened. They were some of the highest-earning trainers in the sport. Only when the Feds stepped in with wiretaps and unlimited resources did the hammer fall. It still may be falling.”

“Hmmm.”

“What do you mean, hmmm? I’m looking for wise counsel, not a harmonica solo.”

He smiled and asked, “Do you know any crooks?”

“I’ll take the fifth.”

He smiled, “I imagine good crooks remain anonymous.”

“Not so much in racing.”

He thought for a moment, then asked, “Do you think a crook in horse racing is more afraid of the racetrack and the racing commission or the FBI and the IRS?”

“I’ll retake the fifth.”

Then he asked, “What enforcement tools would help in harness racing on the integrity and cheating fronts?”

“Out of competition testing, blood gas testing, random

searches, statistical data on vets and horse performance, banning trainers and chopping off beards, universal enforcement and...”

“Enough. Now tell me, who has the power, the money, the time, the motivation, the backing, and the mandate to enforce these tools?”

I shrugged.

He continued, “Imagine you are a local regulator with a tip or a statistical anomaly on a horse’s performance. You show up unannounced at a local training center for out of racing testing. You know the owner or trainer, and they will know you. The test comes back dirty. Your next step is to go to your bosses and throw this expensive pile of manure and fury on their desk. They may talk the talk, and they might try to enforce, but deep down, especially against big dogs, all along the line, everyone sees expense and trouble to possibly no satisfactory end. The local regulator is between two parties that are irritated. Litigation can go on forever. The task is endless. Do you want that job?”

“I want no job.”

He said, “My first thought is the federal route would be the most promising. Different breeds of horse racing probably do not care about each other, but they increase their clout if they unite. My impression from my working in technology was that national legislation would eventually reach gambling and funnel through big tech. If your sport is an isolated outlier, any effect is limited. How will an entity like the state of Michigan harness horseman’s commission combat something along the lines of offshore gambling?”

“So, the Vulcan from Silicon Valley thinks we should get under the umbrella.”

He shrugged. “I don’t know all the details and ramifications for harness horse racing, but most of the time, an umbrella is better than running alone in a storm.”

Racing halts in Ontario due to COVID-19 lockdown

In response to the Ontario government's recent announcement of a provincial lockdown due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ontario Racing will continue to monitor the situation closely as it relates to the standardbred racing industry and its many participants in the province of Ontario.

As outlined by the provincial government, the lockdown (which went into effect as of 12:01 a.m. on Dec. 26) is currently set at 28 days.

"While we are disappointed that we must temporarily suspend live racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park, we continue to be supportive of the Government's efforts to manage the COVID-19 pandemic," said Jim Lawson, CEO Woodbine Entertainment. "The safety of our employees, horsepeople, customers and communities will always be our highest priority. As we have demonstrated throughout the pandemic, we will continue to be leaders in health and safety and look forward to when we can safely resume live racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park that supports thousands of people in the region who depend on it."

Purse monies provided under the Long-Term Funding Agreement assigned to the cancelled racing days will be added to the remaining scheduled racing days once live racing resumes at affected racetracks in mid-to-late January. Lost racing days will not be rescheduled.

Should the lockdown extend beyond the current timeframe established by the provincial government, Ontario Racing will consult with industry leaders and industry partners on the next steps, including the possibility (pending approvals) of redistributing purse monies from cancelled race days in

the form of horseperson support payments, available to eligible standardbred horsepersons who have horses in active training in Ontario during the lockdown.

"As the voice of horse racing in Ontario, Ontario Racing, its board of directors and the Ontario Racing-formed standardbred task force, remain committed to ensuring horsepeople across the province are kept informed of any pertinent industry-related news, including this temporary pause to live horse racing," said John Hayes, chair Ontario Racing. "We are closely following the current situation and will provide any necessary updates."

Handle tops \$3.7 million at Big M

The Meadowlands' faithful was out in force with Christmas money in hand Saturday night (Dec. 26), and at the conclusion of the 15-race card, all-source wagering topped the \$3-million mark for the first time during the Fall Meeting on the last day of racing in 2020.

Handle for the night totaled \$3,718,250, an average per race of \$247,883. The last time – other than Hambletonian Day and Meadowlands Pace Night – that business was as brisk on a per-race basis was on July 11 (Meadowlands Pace Eliminations Night) when a total of \$3,440,248 was bet over 13 races, an average of \$264,634 per dash.

Things got rolling in the fifth race Saturday, when a night-best \$366,063 was pushed through the windows with \$117,910 in exacta action leading the way. Twenty minutes later, \$85,859 in 50-cent Pick-4 play keyed total betting of \$353,837 in race six. Race eight – which saw an exacta pool of \$98,671 – was the third \$300,000 or better race of the night, with total action of \$302,405.

ON THE TRACK: Warrior One took the \$19,000 high-end conditioned trotting co-feature for trainer Ron Burke and driver Yannick Gingras in 1:52.3.

The 4-year-old gelded son of Father Patrick–Yoga was on the go from the start, making the lead out of the first turn from post eight before yielding to Hill Of A Horse just after the quarter. Gingras moved his horse back to the top before the half and went down the road from there, recording an



easy 3-length score over Cue Hall. Hill Of A Horse was third.

Sent to the gate as the 5-2 favorite, Warrior One returned \$7.40 to his backers in winning for the 13th time in 52 lifetime starts. He now has earnings of \$221,146.

In the co-featured high-end conditioned pace, Harambe Deo got back into the win column for trainer Jeff Cullipher and driver Simon Allard. Racing in a softer spot than he had in his previous three outings, the 5-year-old gelded son of Woodstock-Tea Time held off the late-charging Bracken Storm A by a nose in 1:49.3. J M Mandamin was third.

Harambe Deo was away well from post nine and made his way to the top at the half in a pulse-pounding :54.1 on the chilly evening that saw a wind chill of 19 degrees. He used a :27.2 third fraction to open a 2-length lead on the pocket-sitting Heza Real Diamond before holding off Bracken Storm A – who might have won had he found room just a moment or two earlier in deep stretch when in bad traffic – by an eyelash.

As the 5-1 fourth choice, Harambe Deo returned \$13.20 to win in scoring his 17th career win from 85 starts. His earnings stand at \$263,369.

\$150,000 GUARANTEED: After longshots scored in the third, fourth and fifth races Saturday night (Dec. 26) at The Meadowlands, the track's 20-cent Pick-5 wager did not yield a winning ticket, setting up what could be a gigantic pool when racing resumes Saturday, Jan. 2.

Those who correctly selected four winners cashed in for \$312.78.

The bet started innocently enough as the 9-5 second choice and 2-1 favorite won the first two races on the card. But then the bombs fell as 14-1, 50-1 and 36-1 outsiders took the final three legs of the sequence, leading to a carryover of \$46,731.16.

As a result, Big M management – in conjunction with the United States Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering initiative – has guaranteed next Saturday's pool at \$150,000.

Fair Winds also had a 2-year-old pacing filly on the scene, Podium Girl the Somebeachsomewhere out of Cinamony won five of 11 starts. Trained by Chris Ryder Podium Girl won the New Jersey Standardbred Development Fund final and the Renaissance Final both at Freehold Raceway. These are just a few highlights from the Fair Winds Farm award-winning year.

Info, forms for early 2021 Pocono late closers now available

Horsepeople should note that the conditions for two popular early-season series at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, the Game Of Claims Series and the Bobby Weiss Series, have been posted online at the Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association's website, www.phha.org.

In February The Game Of Claims will have four segments which will feature three weeks of preliminary action for pacing horses entered at a base price of \$7500, \$10,000, \$15,000, and \$25,000, with prelim purses equal to the first-round base price, and the claiming price going up to a degree in each subsequent prelim. The top point-winners in the three preliminary legs will go for a final (out of which there will be no claiming) of double their base claiming price, with those races to be held on Saturday, March 6 and Sunday, March 7. On Mondays in March, \$15,000 claiming trotters will race in a series of the same format.

Pocono's traditional showcase for developing younger horses is named by the Bobby Weiss Series, in honor of the long-time trackman who helped hone the Pocono oval into a 5/8-mile strip which earns universal praise for horsemen. The basic conditions for the races are for 3-year-olds who were non-winners of 2 races or \$30,000 lifetime as of Feb. 1.

Pacing colts will have three \$17,500 preliminaries on Saturdays in April, trotting colts on Sundays (except April 4 Easter Sunday; that first leg will be moved back a day), pacing fillies on Mondays, and trotting fillies on Tuesdays. During the week of April 24-27, the top preliminary point winners in each group will follow through on its night to contest a \$40,000 final, and a \$17,500 consolation should there be sufficient entries.

The Pacing Game Of Claims Series require nominations by

January 15, so action should be taken right away. All full schedules, nominating dates and fees, and the general conditions of every series are available on the PHHA website. Further questions should be directed to Rick Kane at 570-831-2126 beginning Jan. 10.
