When it comes to voting, polls aren't always right

This year, the Dan Patch award-winners showed a discrepancy between year-end voting and the weekly Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll.

For several weeks prior to the Dan Patch Horse of the Year ballots being sent out, there were a lot of discussions on social media about how close the voting in some of the categories were expected to be.

Two of the categories being most discussed were 2-year-old filly pacer and 3-year-old filly trotter.

But at the end of the voting day, the expected down-to-the-wire dogfights between freshman female pacers Chantilly and Miki And Minnie, and sophomore female trotters Allegiant and R Melina, didn't need a print.

In fact, none of the vote totals for the 12 divisional honors were close.

Perhaps part of the reason those early predictions ended up being off, is that many people look at the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown weekly poll as being the true indicator of how the voting will go. Many times, it has been, but the poll only has 35 voters, whereas the voting membership of the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA), which selects divisional honors as well as Pacer, Trotter and Horse of the Year, this year was 142.

"Honestly, with the feedback I was getting, I thought it would be close," said Chris Ryder who trains Miki And Minnie. "But I'm always hearing it comes down to the Breeders Crown, so I'm pleased that came through."

There is no question that Miki And Minnie did some of her best work at The Meadowlands winning the Three Diamonds and aforementioned Breeders Crown.

Knowing that Chantilly is one of the favorites for Canada's Somebeachsomewhere Horse of the Year, Ryder also said, "All the best to Chantilly."

In the 3YOFT ranks, Allegiant garnered the most votes.

With the divisional announcements being made on Christmas Eve, some horsepeople were busy preparing for the holiday and weren't able to watch the live broadcast revealing the winners.

Trainer Linda Toscano, who trained Allegiant for the last four starts of the season, was out shopping when the winners were revealed. Upon receiving a text saying "Congratulations," Toscano figured out that things must have swung Allegiant's way.

"At the end of the year, I think she kind of asserted herself as the best, so that's kind of cool," Toscano said.

To close out the year, Allegiant won a Breeders Crown elimination and final at The Meadowlands, the Matron at Dover and then returned to The Big M where she finished second in the FanDuel Open Mares Championship.

Right after learning Allegiant had won, Toscano had not yet spoken with the filly's owner Ryan Smith, but she did send him a quick text.

"I said, 'We got it, congratulations,' and he sent me back a crying emoji saying 'That's amazing. Thank you so much,'" Toscano said.

Once the holidays are over Toscano plans to speak with Smith.

"At some point when I come up for air I'll touch base with him, but I know he really wanted it, and he'll be really excited about it," Toscano said. "I am excited about it. Anytime you win one of these things you get excited about it, but even more so because I know how much it meant to Ryan and I know it means a lot to Vernon [Beachy] too. Vernon's never had this, so I know it's got to be very exciting for him too."

Beachy, 37, had trained Allegiant for most of the season before the late change to Toscano.

"And [Beachy] has handled it like an absolute pro because he instigated the trainer change, and that makes it a little bit easier too, because he's the one that made the suggestion to the owner to give the horse to me," Toscano said. "So, he also feels that he's getting to share in it and at the same time he had a part in it. So, it's good. It's a good story all the way around."

Another surprise in the voting was that Twin B Joe Fresh was the only unanimous choice with all 142 votes.

Many thought that 2-year-old colt trotter Maryland would also be a unanimous vote, and although the divisional standout did receive the majority of the vote (139), Eugene The Genius and Super Chapter each received one vote and one voter chose not to cast a vote for the division.

From a limited first crop of only 35 2YOs in 2024, he had 25 starters and 18 winners who earned **\$1,317,380**, in addition to **\$331,652** in Kentucky Stallion bonuses, topped by **LUNA LOVEGOOD**, earning **\$304,600**, including **\$76,000** in bonuses.

LUNA LOVEGOOD, 3x winner of the **KYSS** legs and the **Matron Stakes**, was the fastest 2YO trotter in North America in 2024 with a mark of **1:51.4**.

Also the sire of **BLANK** (1:54.4, \$164,520) winner of a leg of **KYSS** and a division of the **Bluegrass Series**, and **VOGUSH** (1:53.1, \$288,201), winner of the \$222,000 **Kentuckiana**, a leg of the **KYSS**, and 2nd in the **\$455,000 Goldsmith Maid**.

All three are out of **MUSCLE HILL** mares, proving an emerging cross of gold.

USHWA announces Dan Patch Award-winning horses

Unanimous selection **Twin B Joe Fresh**, repeat winners **Captain Albano** and **Jiggy Jog S**, and the year's leading money-earner **Maryland** led the way when divisional 2024 Dan Patch Award honors for pacers and trotters were announced during a broadcast presentation prior to Tuesday's (Dec. 24) racing card at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Four-year-old female pacer Twin B Joe Fresh was named on all 142 ballots returned in voting conducted by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. She became the third unanimous pick in three years, following Confederate in 2023 and Bulldog Hanover in 2022.

Three-year-old Captain Albano became the sixth male pacer this century to receive a Dan Patch Award at ages 2 and 3 while 5-year-old female trotter Jiggy Jog S became the fifth trotting mare to repeat as the division's honoree since 2000. Two-year-old male trotter Maryland, who topped the sport with \$1.22 million, was the second-highest vote-getter with 139.

The four remaining pacers to receive divisional honors were 2-year-old male **Louprint**, 2-year-old female **Miki And Minnie**, 3-year-old female **My Girl EJ**, and older male **Abuckabett Hanover**. The four remaining trotters were 2-year-old female **Champagne Problems**, 3-year-old male **Sig Sauer**, 3-year-old female **Allegiant**, and older male **Winner's Bet**.

All winners were named on at least 63 per cent of ballots.

The 12 division champions will be honored during the Dan Patch Awards banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, at Rosen Centre in Orlando, FL, on Feb. 23. Pacer of the Year, Trotter of the Year and Horse of the Year will be announced at the banquet.

Dexter Dunn this year drove a record eight divisional champs, including Twin B Joe Fresh, a horse he co-owned. The others were Abuckabett Hanover, Champagne Problems, Jiggy Jog S, Maryland, Miki And Minnie, My Girl EJ, and Winner's Bet.

Twin B Joe Fresh finished no worse than second in all 13 of her races this year, winning 11 and earning \$895,562 to lead all older pacers in money. Ten of her wins were on the Grand Circuit and included eight of the nine most lucrative races for pacing mares (missing only the Blue Chip Matchmaker final, in which she did not compete). She was voted No. 1 in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll for the final 21 weeks of the rankings.

A daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze, Twin B Joe Fresh counted the Breeders Crown Mare Pace among her triumphs for owners Chris Ryder, Dunn, Peter Trebotica, and Barry Spak. The mare was bred by Brittany Farms. She was one of two Dan Patch Award winners trained by Ryder, along with Miki And Minnie.

Miki And Minnie hit the board in all 11 of her races, winning six and finishing second on four occasions. The daughter of Always B Miki—That's The Ticket led all 2-year-old pacers in earnings, banking \$834,086 for breeders/owners Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo, and Lawrence Minowitz. Her six triumphs came over her final seven races of the campaign and included the Breeders Crown, Three Diamonds, and Kentucky Sire Stakes championship.

Captain Albano, one of two Dan Patch honorees trained by Noel Daley, along with Sig Sauer, won 12 of 18 races and earned \$1.11 million. The son of Captaintreacheraus—Angelou captured 10 of his final 12 races of the season, including the Little Brown Jug and Adios, for driver Todd McCarthy and owners Patricia Stable, LA Express and Sjoblom Inc., Sjoblom Racing Inc., and Michael Dolan. He was bred by Frederick Hertrich III.

The colt joined Perfect Sting, Tall Dark Stranger, Somebeachsomewhere, Captaintreacheraus, and Bettors Delight as male pacers to be Dan Patch Award winners at both 2 and 3 this century.

Sig Sauer, driven by Andrew McCarthy, was the season's fastest 3-year-old trotter with a mark of 1:49.3 set in winning the Kentucky Futurity. Overall, the son of Muscle Hill—Sigilwig won five of 10 starts, including a Breeders Crown and the Earl Beal, Jr. Memorial, and earned \$871,812. Bred by Southwind Farms, the colt was owned by Patricia Stable, Joe Sbrocco and JAF Racing, Allister Stables LLC, and Caviart Farms.

Jiggy Jog S was a perfect six-for-six this year, earning \$929,188, before being retired because of a ligament issue. She defeated an international group of male rivals in the MGM Yonkers

International Trot in addition to beating the boys in the John Cashman Memorial (in a career-best 1:49.2), Arthur J. Cutler Memorial, and Sebastian K Invitational.

A daughter of Walner—Hot Mess Hanover, Jiggy Jog S was trained by Ake Svanstedt and owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc., Steve Stewart, John Lengacher, and Hickory Hollow Stables. She was bred by Vestmarka AB and joined Manchego, Hannelore Hanover, Buck I St Pat, and Peaceful Way as repeat winners in the division this century.

Maryland, who came within \$11,176 of setting the earnings record for a 2-year-old male trotter, won six of nine races for trainer Marcus Melander and owners Courant Inc., PCW Racing LLC, Holly Lane Stud East LTD, and SStewartRThorn Stable. He finished his campaign with a five-race victory streak that included the Mohawk Million, a Breeders Crown, Peter Haughton Memorial and William Wellwood Memorial. The son of Chapter Seven—Crucial was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

Nancy Takter trained two Dan Patch Award winners in trotters Winner's Bet and Champagne Problems.

Winner's Bet, a 4-year-old stallion, won nine of 13 races and earned \$786,684 for owners Lindy Farms of Connecticut and Robert Rudolph. The son of Walner—Side Bet Hanover, bred by S R F Stable, was a Breeders Crown champion and closed his season by winning five of his last six races. Earlier, he trotted a career-best 1:49.3 in a preliminary round of the Graduate Series and won the series final in his next start.

Champagne Problems won seven of 12 races and a division-leading \$500,086 in purses for owners Rojan Stables, Family Business, Patrick Hoopes, and Caviart Farms. The daughter of Tactical Landing—Miss Caviar, bred by Southwind Farms, counted the Jim Doherty Memorial and Kindergarten Classic Series final among her triumphs.

Completing the list of trotting honorees was Allegiant, a Breeders Crown champ who won six of 17 races and earned \$748,027 for owner Ryan Smith. Other victories included a Matron Stakes, the Moni Maker, and a Hambletonian Oaks elimination (she was third in the final). She ended the season by finishing second against older competition in the FanDuel Mare Trot Championship. The daughter of Tactical Landing—Too Good For You was trained by Vernon Beachy and Linda Toscano and notched Grand Circuit

victories with drivers Scott Zeron and Hunter Myers. She was bred by Atlantic Trot Inc. and Steve Stewart.

Returning to the pacing side, Ron Burke trained two horses to receive honors, Louprint and My Girl EJ.

Louprint hit the board in all 10 of his races, winning seven and earning a division-best \$737,939 for breeders/owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci LLC, and Phil Collura. The son of Sweet Lou—Rockin Racer, driven by Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., was a Breeders Crown and Kentucky Sire Stakes champion and became the first 2-year-old male in history to pace four miles in 1:49.1 or faster, with a mark of 1:48.4.

My Girl EJ competed for the Burke Brigade in 17 of her 18 starts this year before being sold in mid-November and closing the season with a second-place finish to Twin B Joe Fresh in the FanDuel Mare Pace Championship for trainer Andrew Harris. Overall, she hit the board in 16 of 18 races, winning nine and earning a division-leading \$796,399. Her victories included a Breeders Crown and Pennsylvania Sire Stakes final.

The daughter of Sweet Lou—Lucy’s Pearl was bred by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci LLC, and Elizabeth Novak and was owned by Burke Racing, Weaver Brusceci, Ronald Burke, and Novak prior to being purchased by William Pollock, Bruce Areman, and Harris.

Pollock, Areman, and Harris were the connections behind Abuckabett Hanover, who hit the board in 12 of 15 races, winning seven and earning a division-best \$833,022. He finished worse than second only twice in his final 12 starts and counted the William R. Haughton Memorial, FanDuel Open Pace Championship, Dayton Derby, and Dave Brower Memorial among his triumphs. The 6-year-old stallion, a son of Betting Line—All Tucked Up, was trained by Harris and bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

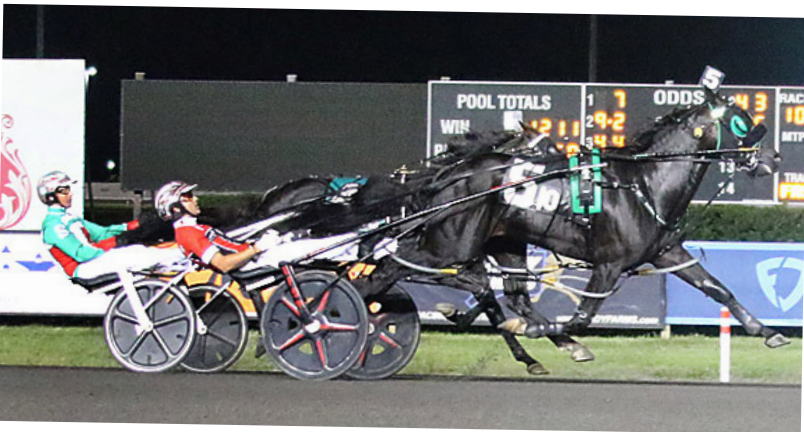

Dunn, Daley, Burke/Weaver Brusceci chosen as USHWA's Trainer, Driver, and Owners of the Year

Dexter Dunn and Noel Daley, as expected, were comfortably selected Dan Patch Award winners for 2024 Driver and Trainer of the Year, respectively, in recent voting conducted by the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA). It's never much of a surprise when the **Burke Racing/Weaver Brusceci partnership** is among the finalists for Owner of the Year, either, and, this year, they did win as well – but their margin of victory was as narrow as it could be.

In his first four full years of driving in North America, 35-year-old Dunn, a New Zealand native and a many-time champion Down Under, put on such a spectacular show that he won the Driver of the Year Award in the balloting four consecutive times (2019-22). Last year Dunn yielded his crown to Scott Zeron (while still posting a \$10M+ campaign, his fifth straight), but he went right back to the championship position in 2024, putting up personal marks in money won (\$16.6M) and UDR (.347).

Dunn was “in the conversation” but by no means assured of an award up until Oct. 25-26, when the Breeders Crown Championships were held at The Meadowlands. That weekend Dunn won an unprecedented six Crowns, driving Twin B Joe Fresh, Abuckabett Hanover, Miki And Minnie, My Girl EJ, Winner's Bet, and Mirage Hanover – the first five of whom went on to be 2024 divisional Dan Patch champions.

Dunn followed up on Nov. 30, Fall Final Four/Fan Duel Championship Night at the Jersey miler, with five wins, repeating with the first three horses listed above and also visiting Victory Lane with Nelsonbriteagle NO and Captain Optimistic in the eight finales held that evening. Add divisional trotting champs Maryland, Champagne Problems, and Jiggy Jog S, and Dunn had the best seat in the house behind eight of the 12 Dan Patch honorees.

Trainer Daley earned his first Glen Garnsey Trainer of the Year in 2024, which is appropriate because the 63-year-old trainer from Australia posted his best-ever total in stable earnings, over \$4.8 million, earning himself a spot in the North American Top Ten.

In 2024 Daley joined a group of three other highly-regarded trainers who since 1986 have harnessed a Triple Crown winner on both gaits in a single year: Tony Alagna (2020), Ron Burke (2017), and Jimmy Takter (2009 and 2014). The two horses in question were pacer Captain Albano (Little Brown Jug) and trotter Sig Sauer (Kentucky Futurity), who each were voted the colt champions on their respective gaits, and both of whom ranked in the top half-dozen in the final Top Ten Horses poll. (The horses also shared a common ownership partner, about which more follows directly).

In the Norman Woolworth Owner of the Year category, the ubiquitous pairing of Burke Racing Stable LLC/Weaver Brusceci LLC (Sylvia Burke, trainer Ron Burke's mother, with Michael Brusceci and Mark Weaver), with hundreds of horses including many stakes winners racing at dozens of tracks, beat out Patricia Stable, named after owner Harvey Fried's wife, by a "nose" – a single vote, despite Patricia Stable having ownership in only 14 horses. Two of the Patricia horses were Dan Patch divisional champions Captain Albano and Sig Sauer (both Noel Daley trainees), but Burke/Weaver Brusceci also had two champions in Louprint and My Girl EJ (sold before her final race of the year), and their quality combined with quantity carried the day.

Burke/Weaver Brusceci without partners were the No. 1 stable in North American harness racing in 2024, with over \$5.2 million in the bank as the season ends from 367 victories and 16 six-figure earners. They also owned five other \$500G+ winners in partnerships, with "B/WB" involved in three \$1M-earning entities in the Top Twenty; plus four more which earned \$500G+; plus six others which earned \$400G+; and the list goes on. This Owner trophy will join the two other USHWA titles that Burke/Weaver Brusceci were voted in 2013 and 2018.

The winners will be recognized at the 2024 Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine. The Banquet will be held on Sunday (Feb. 23, 2025) at the Rosen Centre in Orlando, FL.

The United States Harness Writers Association is the leading group of communicators about the standardbred horse. USHWA conducts the official annual balloting for the sport's most prestigious honors: induction to the Hall of Fame and Communicators Hall of Fame, along with the selection of the Horse of the Year, Trotter and Pacer of the Year, and the leading divisional horses of each season. Each year USHWA hosts the Dan Patch Awards Banquet, honoring the best and brightest performers in North American harness racing. This banquet is the Association's principal source of funding, and with generous financial support from the harness racing and breeding industry, USHWA is able to host the banquet at a world-class facility in a world-class manner.

Wanda Polisseni voted Bergstein Proximity Award by USHWA

Wanda Polisseni is a standardbred owner who has devoted much of her life to helping the unfortunate via foundations. Her latest venture involves support for retraining racehorses past their competitive years, giving them other ways to continue a productive life. For these reasons, she has been honored with the 2024 Stan Bergstein-Proximity Award, the highest honor voted on solely by the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

After growing up on a farm that boarded standardbreds in Yates County, NY (southeast of Rochester), Polisseni first became a standardbred owner when she purchased six horses from a neighbor on New Year's Eve 2003. She also campaigns thoroughbred racehorses.

Two decades later, she remains a prominent owner and/or breeder of 100-plus racehorses competing under the Purple Haze Racing Stable banner. Named in memory of her late daughter's favorite color and song, Purple Haze has expanded its scope in recent years.

In 2006, Polisseni was approached about supporting the fledgling Thoroughbred Adoption Center in Finger Lakes, NY. Her eyes were opened to the importance of aftercare for retired racehorses of both breeds.

Five years ago, Polisseni and Purple Haze Standardbred Adoption Program (PHSAP) executive director Betty Holt established the New York Not-For-Profit Class "B" Corporation. PHSAP is based at Polisseni's 105-acre farm in Oxford, NY, and focuses on standardbred rehabilitation, retraining and rehoming. The program is accredited by The Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries and the Standardbred Transition Alliance.

Polisseni has been active in charitable endeavors ever since her retirement from Paychex in 1986. Her late husband, Eugene, had worked with her to establish the successful payroll and human resources company.

Polisseni has served on the boards of the FF Thompson Hospital Foundation, St. John Fisher College, National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, NY State Troopers Foundation, Artisan Works, Mercy Center for the Aging, and the Rochester General Hospital Foundation. She co-founded the Polisseni Foundation, which assists Upstate New York organizations working in the areas of education, human services and civic improvement.

Polisseni was recognized with USHWA's 2020 Dan Patch Unsung Hero Award. She has been celebrated for her involvement as a board member of The Finger Lakes Horsemen Benevolent Protective Association, the Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program, and the Harness Horse Breeders of New York. In 2019, she accepted the USHWA Monticello-Goshen Chapter's Cradle of the Trotter Award, acknowledging her achievements as a New York standardbred breeder.

PHSAP has already placed 90 former harness racehorses in well-matched new homes. Now 85 years of age, harness racing ambassador Polisseni has a history of enriching the lives of those around her, both human and equine.

Two up-and-coming stars of harness racing, horseman **Brett Beckwith** and track executive **Jacob Rheinheimer**, will be honored at February's Dan Patch Awards Banquet (presented by Caesars Entertainment) by the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA) as the Rising Star and Barasch Breakthrough Award winners. Also to be feted at the Florida banquet are husband and wife **Art Zubrod** and **Leah Cheverie** with the W. R. Houghton Good Guy Award and **Anne Chunko** as the LeeAnne Pooler Unsung Hero.

Beckwith, 21, had a leg up on success just on his pedigree: his father Mark has driven 5,896 winners and his mother Melissa has harnessed 2,423 visitors to the winner's circle (and her brother Richie Silverman was the first Rising Star winner in 1986). Go back a generation, and you find grandfathers Jerry Silverman, a member of the Hall of Fame, and Bert Beckwith, one of the most respected horsemen from New England in the last half-century.

But Brett has not rested on these laurels – in fact, it seems like he hardly rests at all. He was the leading driver at Saratoga during that meet's long meet, defeating longtime driving king Wally Hennessey, and at Plainridge he dead-heated for the top spot with veteran Bruce Ranger (those two drivers, by the way,

have over 22,000 lifetime wins between them). Additionally, he found time to make an impact in New Jersey, sitting seventh in the standings at Freehold and just outside the top 10 at The Meadowlands; Brett also was third during the winter Batavia meet. (That's a lot of car miles along with the sulky miles).

Brett's star is definitely on the rise, as his four years of fulltime driving show at press time: 2021, 113 wins, .202 UDR; 2022, 230 wins, .266 UDR; 2023, 452 wins, .286 UDR; and 2024, 603 wins (third in North America), .336 UDR (and \$6.1M+ in earnings). How much further he can progress, and whether he can latch on to driving in stakes racing and competing on richer circuits, will undoubtedly be fascinating to watch.

Rheinheimer also comes from a racing family, the campaigners of the well-remembered Freaky Feet Pete. However, after graduating from Trine University of Indiana in 2020, Rheinheimer went to work on the "front side," as an intern in the Hoosier Park marketing department, where he rose through the ranks while drinking up knowledge. He then showed his newfound skills to advantage, such as with the track's First Turn fractional ownership group, and he impressed people with his abilities during the 2023 Breeders Crown racing at Hoosier.

Already a proven handicapper, Rheinheimer took over lead hosting duties on the Hoosier simulcast presentation when the opportunity opened, using his knowledge of many aspects of harness racing in a smooth blend to showcase Hoosier racing to advantage. He is also a writer, for the important Midwest Harness Report among other outlets, and he serves as vice-president of the Indiana Chapter of USHWA.

Zubrod and Cheverie rose to prominence in managerial positions at the legendary Brittany Farms; Brittany's owner and Hall of Famer George Segal said, "I doubt that there are two people in harness racing that are more devoted to the animal." They also run their own operation, Fair Island Farm, who bred world champion Real Desire and takes part in racehorse partnerships.

It was through Fair Island Farm that Zubrod and Cheverie became involved with USHWA's annual Caretaker of the Year Award, with Fair Island becoming the award's sponsor and main financial backer in 2019 and continuing to this day to honor some of harness racing's hardest workers, those who care daily for the animals. Cheverie has also been a driving force with the Harness Horse Youth Foundation (HHYF) as a former trustee and secretary, and she herself won the organization's Service To Youth Award. Today the couple sponsors HHYF's "pony herd," used during the Foundation's summer camp series and one of the chief delights of the young participants, many of who have never worked with horses before.

The nominator of Chunko got right to the point capturing her myriad contributions to standardbred racing with a one-sentence opening paragraph in the submitted biography: "When you have questions, Anne Chunko has answers." The manager of the U.S. Trotting Association's information and research department, Chunko receives varied and voluminous questions about several areas of specialized harness knowledge – pedigrees, racing statistics, accessibility of data – and almost always provides complete and useful answers to those queries while always maintaining a helpful and professional manner.

Chunko, a horse-crazy kid who was exposed to harness racing, like so many in the sport, through her family, graduated from Otterbein College, a university in Westerville OH – and if that Ohio city sounds familiar, it may be because the USTA has its headquarters there. Chunko earned her way upward through progressively-more responsible jobs, and is marking her 20th year in information and research. She also served as secretary of the Standardbred Pleasure Horse Organization of Ohio,

Hanover Shoe Farms, Lillian Hanover, Emoticon Hanover, Bettors Delight, Sweet Lou and Chapter Seven all Dan Patch honorees

Hanover Shoe Farms, the Pennsylvania harness racing nursery which has produced the highest money-winners of every racing year since records began to be kept in 1949, has had an outstanding 2024, and have been honored for this fact by being selected the Dan Patch Breeder of the Year Award winner in a poll of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA) members.

As the days dwindle down to a few left in this season, Hanover will post either the second- or third-best earnings figure for one year in harness history – it already holds the mark of \$35.6 million, set in 2022, and with additions to its current, at press time, total of nearly \$34.8 million, it will be close to the \$35.1 million figure the “Shoe Farms” reached in 2021.

Their two highest money-winning graduates in 2024 racing, 2-year-old trotting colt Maryland (\$1,227,695) and older pacing male Abuckabett Hanover (\$833,022), were recently voted Dan Patch Awards as champions of their respective divisions, and a pair of their 3-year-old pacing male output, Mirage Hanover and Legendary Hanover, ruled the roost at various points of their sophomore seasons.

“Hanover” horses were selected as Broodmares of the Year.

Pacing Broodmare honoree Lillian Hanover (Well Said—Lazan Hanover) was sold as a yearling, then was purchased back by Hanover the year after her racing career ended while in foal with Linedrive Hanover, who lowered his mark to 1:47

this year. She has further produced Legendary Hanover, mentioned above and a 1:46.2 winner in 2024, and the stakes-winning baby filly Lily White Hanover.

Trotting Broodmare of the Year is **Emoticon Hanover** (Kadabra—Emmylou Who), whose dam was acquired by Hanover in 2012 (and who still owns her) and who sold “Emoticon” to Quebec powerhouse Determination as a yearling. After winning two Breeders Crowns and over \$1.7M on the racetrack, Emoticon Hanover is establishing herself as a premier producer as well, with the filly Drawn Impression, who took a mark of 1:51.1 this year and has won Crown eliminations at 2 and 3, and Emoticon Legacy, who trotted in 1:52.3 at 2 in 2024 and also was a Crown elim winner.

The competition for Pacing Sire of the Year was “tight,” with the judges examining a photo and then finding no separation at 46 votes between **Bettors Delight** and **Sweet Lou** – both members of the Hall of Fame.

Bettors Delight (Cam’s Card Shark—Classic Wish), outstanding on the racetrack earning over \$2.5M, had an amazing stallion campaign at the ripe age of 26, topping the money list for all-age and 3-year-old performers with such fast offspring as Nijinsky, Mirage Hanover (those two sub-1:48 winners), and Its A Love Thing. He now embarks on a new adventure for the Bettors Delight Syndicate, as the dual-hemisphere stallion will be moving, on a one-way ticket, from Winbak Farm of Canada to Woodlands Stud of New Zealand.

Co-champion Sweet Lou (Yankee Cruiser—Sweet Future) also moved from being a stellar racetrack performer (a winner of

nearly \$3.5M) to becoming an outstanding dual-hemisphere stud, being owned by the Sweet Lou Syndicate and standing here at Diamond Creek Farm. Sweet Lou produced two Dan Patch divisional champions in 2024, Louprint and My Girl EJ, and was among the top three North American stallions for money in the 2-year-old, 3-year-old, and all-age ranks.

Chapter Seven (out of La Riviera Lindy by sire Windsong’s Legacy, yet another Hanover connection) is like his pacing counterparts a member of the Hall of Fame, and there is no arguing with the earnings numbers his progeny posted in 2024 – Chapter Seven topped the list for 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, and all-age performers. Maryland (Hanover again), with over \$1.2M in freshman earnings including the Mohawk Million and Breeders Crown, was the richest trotter of 2024, and his work was joined by 3-year-old trotting filly R Melina, seemingly right there every week against the best of her section.

The winners will be recognized at the 2024 Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine. The Banquet will be held on Sunday (Feb. 23, 2025) at the Rosen Centre in Orlando, FL.

An upset for the ages and other happenings in the final week of 2024

One week before Christmas, an upset of biblical proportions was witnessed at Saratoga Raceway.

Coincidentally, the last harness race to produce this level of an inexplicable result also came at the Saratoga Springs harness track, when the all-time great Niatross veered and fell over the hubrail in the 1980 Battle of Saratoga. But this time, in a shocking twist on Dec. 16 where the villain defeated the hero, the Grinch was able to overcome a trip where he was parked for the final three-eighths of a mile to wear down and narrowly defeat Santa Claus in the shadow of the wire.

Santa vs. the Grinch race has increased in popularity in recent years, with more tracks running the exhibition at holiday time. Just like the Globetrotters are “supposed” to beat the Generals, the same has always held true for Santa and Grinch. Not this time, however.

The race wasn’t without its share of confusion. From both the announcer and camera views, there was thought that the race would only be a half-mile distance, one lap around. But neither Santa nor Grinch got the memo – or perhaps they did but wanted to rage on with their battle for another time around – and continued with their duel as the commentary and camera resumed on the action. In the end, Santa tried to fight back but the Grinch, being high lined home would not give up the lead. Even with the deceptively-placed camera angle at the finish that drives me crazy in actual pari-mutuel races too, it was evident that Grinch had indeed won.

The question then becomes: Will there be any lasting impacts? Short term, there doesn’t appear to be any, fortunately. By all accounts, Christmas still came and those throughout the upstate New York region appeared no worse for the wear from Grinch’s victory nine days prior. Children who may have been horrified seeing their hero, Father Christmas, lose at the harness track, were likely comforted on Christmas morning knowing that Santa – just as Niatross did years before – was able to rebound and live up to his promise.

Longer term, hopefully the Grinch’s victory of Santa doesn’t produce any curses against the track. If, next year at Saratoga, we start seeing a string of 1-9-favored Mark Beckwith horses continuously losing from the rail, we’ll have a pretty good idea about the origin story. For next year’s edition of the race, obviously stronger precautions will need to be taken to ensure a more appropriate result.

That could entail taking the late-November FanDuel Championship winner from The Meadowlands as one of Santa’s reindeer against a \$4,000 claimer from over at Batavia for the Grinch, or maybe it’s as simple as giving Santa a 220 TrackMaster-rated horse and giving Grinch a 40. Either of those approaches should work, and for now we can close out this year’s amusingly diabolical chapter in harness history.

PHILLY HANDLE RECORD

Speaking of harness history, the highest handle in the history of Harrah’s Philadelphia occurred on the Christmas Eve noon card when the track took in close to \$1.6 million in wagers. It came as nearly every other racing track was dark in that timeframe. Logging into a wagering platform that afternoon, Harrah’s Philly and the thoroughbred track Tampa Bay Downs were the only games in town (or in the entire world, for that matter). Thoroughbred track Parx was to race, but they canceled.

As such, Philly was able to easily beat its prior record of \$1.3 million from a similar situation years prior when due to a heat wave most other competition on the U.S. east coast had canceled. The result of record handle with no competition isn't new – that's often when record handle for the smaller-handling tracks do occur, but it's always interesting when the dynamic sets up that way.

I wrote a column here back in 2021 how a new record handle could have been on the line for a late-May card with massive talent that featured almost all of the sport's best horses coming for the track's signature stakes day of the year, but handle never seriously threatened record figures that day. Instead, it just took a decent – albeit ordinary – set of horses across 14 races to accomplish the new benchmark. I'd imagine that Philly will continue to race in the same slot next year, as they should. It's a unique spot and with any luck maybe they even go past \$2 million.

AMAZON IN A CLAIMER?

Switching gears, there has been much deserved fanfare and publicity over the past two months regarding Southwind Amazon becoming the most winningest horse in harness history. Just last week, this column relived his ten top wins. But, dishearteningly, current USTA entries show Southwind Amazon is listed in-to-go for his final career start on Tuesday in for a \$5,000 claiming price.

I haven't had the opportunity to speak to the horse's connections so it wouldn't be fair to presume motives, but, just on its face, the move to now place what's become a cherished horse into a claimer – solely because it's the last time that the soon-to-be

15-year-old can race outside of amateur competition, simply isn't a good look whatsoever.

One of my first reactions was that Northfield management should have rejected the entry, but then I thought otherwise. Perhaps now it's a claiming opportunity open to anyone else who wants to provide a deserving life after racing for a horse that's done so much.

PAYING MY RESPECTS TO FREEHOLD

Lastly, by the time this column is published, Freehold Raceway will have officially completed its final race in the track's long, storied history. Most of my memories at the track come from the early 2000's when I frequented it often at a time when my family owned horses that raced there.

For the first time in many years, I visited the track in early November to pay my final respects. As almost everything today looks identical as it did then – even down to the broken escalator which has become part of its charm – it was almost like a step back into time. I know that even my first foray into Freehold was already after the track's heyday, but it wasn't difficult to envision the appeal that it had. It was a fun atmosphere to be able to see the horses up close that came over from the farms just miles down the road, and it will be greatly missed.

A dozen things we'll see in 2025

After the ball drops in Times Square, here are some things that we will, might and want to see happen in the New Year.

1. John Campbell turns 70 on April 8. That's right, 70. He'll become the first horseman since Herve Filion and just the second ever to live half their life and more as Hall of Famers. Campbell was inducted in 1990 at 35 and Herve lived 42 more years after he, too, went in at 35 in 1975.

2. Yannick Gingras is set to be the fourth in history to reach \$250 million, a quarter-of-a-billion. He starts 2025 about \$4.8 million away as he looks to join Campbell, Miller, Tetrick in this illustrious group. Campbell hit this milestone first, doing so at The Meadowlands in 2007 winning the freshman filly Breeders Crown Trot with Snow White. Fittingly, that standout for trainer Kevin Lare set the all-time record for earnings for any 2YO trotter with over \$1.25 million, that stands today.

3. Mike Lachance will hit 75 on Dec. 16. "Iron Mike" was a 1997 Hall of Famer inductee and four-time Hambletonian winter including the fastest of the 20th century, 1:51.3 with Self Possessed (1999).

4. It's 90 years since Greyhound's Hambletonian and will be the 100th Hambletonian ever contested come the first Saturday in August.

5. It will be the 70th anniversary of the very first Triple Crown winner Scott Frost. The Yonkers Trot debuted that very year and the Messenger the following season thus introducing us to the Triple Crown era on both gaits.

6. Twin B Joe Fresh will be looking to do what has not been done in the 21st century, successfully defend a HOY title. It's also been a quarter-of-a-century since anyone did it: Moni Maker in 1998-99.

7. Walner turns 10 on April 9. Can you think of another horse who has done what he has prior to his 10th birthday? Especially after his epic sales season of late 2024 which included the all-time high ticket item Amazing Catch!

8. Will it mark the 22nd-straight year without a Pacing Triple Crown winner? No Pan Intended was the very last to do so in 2003.

9. Can the youngest ever "Rising Star" winner Brett Beckwith join in with the sports very elite, a la Marcus Melander? In 2018, Melander won the same award and just a year later was "Trainer of the Year," the only winner to turn that daily double that quickly. The previous youngest to win the Rising Star Award was

Beckwith's very own uncle Richie Silverman in 1986, also 21, but two months older than Beckwith.

10. Will Homicide Hunter's world record 1:48 4 mile hold? It'll be seven years since his memorable mile in the fall of 2018.

11. Dave Miller is on course – on a career path – to topple John Campbell's all-time earnings mark of \$299.8 million. Miller starts 2025 just over \$292 million, with around \$7.8 million to go. Yes, he just turned 60, but you'd have a hard time thinking he won't post a similar year to 2024 when he finished \$1.5 ahead of the number needed this year. Miller was not yet to a one million career on Million Dollar Babies Night in 1986 when Campbell surpassed Herve Filion and has never looked back. An astounding 38 plus years. Campbell was 31 folks, 31, when he assumed the top spot. Maybe even more impressive is that five different drivers have been second during his reign: Fillion, then Bill O'Donnell, then Mike Lachance, then Ron Pierce, and now Dave Miller.

12. Finally, a few questions. Will Dave Miller win his first Hambletonian or his record sixth Jug? Will Tim Tetrick win his first Jug or his record-tying seventh Meadowlands Pace?

NOTE: The year 2025 will be chock full of notes/stories/trivia on the 100th Hambletonian, which will start early and continue right through the big day, the 45th edition in New Jersey.

Keep Going qualifies for the Prix d'Amérique

Two B-races remain before all qualification events ahead of the grand Prix d'Amérique at Vincennes in January are decided. Sunday's (Dec. 22) two big races – the \$255,000 Criterium Continental and \$255,000 Prix Tenor de Baune – ended with one new name ready for the Prix d'Amérique since the latter race was won by Laurent-Claude Abrivard-trained **Just Love You** (Love You), who already had her spot secured via a fourth-place finish in the Prix de Bretagne on Nov. 17.

Alexandre Abrivard sent Just Love You to the lead with 1,900 meters to go and in that position the 5-year-old mare was unbeatable.

First choice Just Love You won in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.6 miles on a quite sloppy Vincennes' track.

The purse was the same in the two big races in Paris on this special day, but the Criterium Continental for 4-year-olds felt like a more important event, maybe because it's open to 4-year-old trotters who will face the older elite next year, and even in the Prix d'Amérique. Whether **Keep Going** (Follow You) will race in the Prix d'Amérique or not will be a question for later. The fact right now is that Mathieu Mottier's horse has his spot in the big Grand Prix, if the connections of Keep Going want to race.

And Keep Going has lately developed to be the best 4-year-old French-bred trotter after winning the \$330,000 Criterium des 4 ans in September and now the \$255,000 Criterium Continental.

In a :26.1 opening quarter, Keep Going looked strong outside of leader Kilmister and Mottier could send his trotter to lead shortly after.

The pace continued to hold at a high level with the first choice Keep Going controlling the race in front and Mottier's horse had moral and strength to defend himself when East Asia attacked on the outside in the stretch. This was an impressive win by the 4-year-old Follow You son and with four weeks to go, this is the dark horse in the Prix d'Amérique 2025. If he will race, is a decision that will be made by Mottier and the owner in the coming weeks.

A mile rate of 1:52.1 over 1.3 miles must be considered a very impressive one with conditions that prevailed at Vincennes last Sunday.

American-bred Crown finished third in the Criterium Continental and gets high grades after a tough trip where he raced three wide during the race's first kilometer.

Keep Going will probably aim towards the Prix d'Amérique, that can be assumed when the field of horses ready for the big race not yet includes the big, heavy favorites.

Gambling companies mention San Moteur, Go On Boy, Idao de Tillard and Izoard Vedaquais as the favorites for winning the Prix d'Amérique 2025, but we have to remember that the three latter named horses aren't even in the race yet.

But that may be solved in today's (Dec. 29) \$125,000 Prix de Bourgogne over 2,100 meters.

This is, so far, the most challenging B-race this winter, not least because of the participation from Go On Boy, Idao de Tillard and Izoard Vedaquais. In addition to these three names, Swedish-bred Don Fanucci Zet tries to secure his spot for the PdA and the conditions of 2,100 meters starting behind the gate suit him well. With four spots at stake, this could really be a spectacular event at Vincennes.

Gennaro Casillo's mare came home in 1:54.2 while Delicious Gar followed in second ahead of Dali Prav.

JOVIALTY STOPS

Courant Stable's Joviality (Chapter Seven) has come to the end of her racing career. The decision was announced on Dec. 24 by the trainer Sabine Kagebrant.

"Joviality has a minor crack in her right front leg and needs eight-to-10 weeks before she can return to full training," Kagebrant said in a press release. "It is, of course, a setback, when we are preparing for the Prix d'Amérique, where her place also looked pretty clear now after Just Love You's win on Sunday. The harness racing business gives and the business takes. We are at the very highest level and sadly, it seems like this can happen."

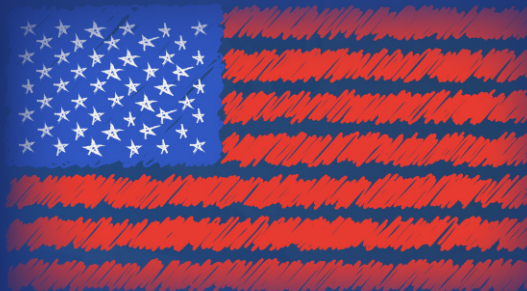
Joviality banked approximately \$2.4 million and her biggest triumph came in the \$800,000 Swedish Derby in 2023.

She must be considered as one of the very best mares ever bred in Europe and her early retirement is sad news for the harness racing fans. Joviality will now enter the breeding business and her first partner is not decided yet.

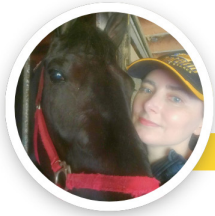

THE VIEW FROM WOODBINE MOHAWK PARK

New post time for the new year at Mohawk

Regular players of Woodbine Mohawk Park will be tuning in a little earlier in the New Year, as the Campbellville, ON track test-drives a new 6:30 p.m. (ET) post time starting Thursday, Jan. 2. The post time will remain the usual 7:10 p.m. (ET) on Monday, Dec. 30.

"I think it's something we've thought about for a while," said Bill McLinchey, vice-president of standardbred racing for Woodbine Entertainment. "We're always talking about how we can improve or look to do things a little differently. We thought that maybe an earlier start time would line us up better with The Meadowlands on weekends."

Mohawk has been regularly racing with a 7:10 p.m. (ET) post time and only occasional variations, such as the afternoon Boxing Day (Dec. 26) card that began at 1 p.m.

McLinchey told HRU that scheduling Mohawk cards with a new 6:30 p.m. post time for race 1 is expected to help prevent overlap with its biggest pari-mutuel rival.

"Our goal is to be 10 to 12 minutes after their race goes [at The Meadowlands]," he said. "We try to coordinate, so we thought that with them starting at 6:20, if we start at 6:30, we'll land where we want to be with them throughout the night."

McLinchey said that moving to an earlier post time made it easier to avoid simultaneous starts at North America's two biggest harness tracks by handle.

"When we were starting after 7 and they were starting at 6:20, it just gave us more time to kind of get where they might have a delay or something like that, and our first race ends up going at the same time as theirs," he noted.

Paying careful attention to post times and delays at other tracks is already a priority, said McLinchey. "We're doing that," he said. "On Thursdays now, there's a lot of [simulcast] traffic. Like last Thursday night [Dec. 5], there was Meadowlands, there was us, there was Yonkers, Flamboro, Woodbine thoroughbred, and Turfway [Park] in Kentucky had started."

Coming from a harness racing family (McLinchey is the nephew of Goshen Hall of Fame horsemen John and Jim Campbell and the grandson of Jack Campbell), Woodbine's VP of standardbred racing said that ending a little sooner on dark winter nights was another consideration when it came to the timing of the post time change.

"I hope that for the horsemen, if it gets them home a little earlier in the wintertime, I think that's appreciated by both horses and horsepeople," he said.

A third factor behind the shift was acknowledging the demographics of harness racing bettors. McLinchey agreed that not many on-track or simulcast customers are night owls anymore, although they may have been when they were younger. He said that some patrons may find that the earlier Mohawk post time works better with having dinner at the track.

"I think that our feedback is to keep the people in the simulcast [lounges] like our Champions [Ontario OTB outlets], [change was necessary]," he said. "It seemed like [OTB customers] weren't hanging in there until 11 o'clock anymore."

"I think, too, that the wagering has changed a little bit, where our first race is the best-bet race on the card now, and that wasn't always the case."

"Our biggest pool of the night is the Pick 5 pool, which starts right then [race 1], so we have to make sure that nothing negatively impacts it."

Another multi-leg wager, the non-jackpot Pick 6, debuted at Mohawk on Dec. 26, attracting a promising \$19,233 at first

offering. It begins in race 4 each card going forward, with the early Pick 4 now starting in race 3. If no one hits all six winners in the Pick 6, 100 per cent of the pool will carry over to Mohawk’s next live card.

However small the post-time adjustment, McLinchey said the track was busy making sure that horseplayers knew ahead of time.

“We’re just trying to get the word out. We’re just trying to make sure that people don’t miss us those first couple of nights at 6:30, and they tune in shortly after 7 and we’re already rolling.”

He added that the earlier start was not necessarily a permanent change.

“We’ll have to reassess, probably the biggest factor is when the [Woodbine] thoroughbreds start back. We want to make sure that we have enough time after them.”

The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) approved 129 race dates next year for Woodbine Racetrack, beginning on Saturday, April 26, 2025. Mohawk’s thoroughbred sister track has a 1:10 p.m. (Eastern) post time except on Thursdays, when race 1 is slated to start at 4:50 p.m.

Mohawk was allotted 220 race dates in the coming year, with the new 6:30 p.m. post time applicable from Jan. 2 through March 29, 2025, as well as on Saturday, May 17, June 14 (Pepsi North America Cup), and September 20 (Metro Pace and Mohawk Million).

Although McLinchey called early social media reactions to the earlier post time “pretty harsh,” he said that it was always worth trying something that could prove popular with Mohawk customers and the people working hands-on with the horses.

“I would imagine that the horsepeople will be pretty happy with the change. With winter and weather and all that, I think it’s something, so we’ll do it. We’re going to give it a shot. I mean, it isn’t a huge change.”

Aaron Lehman's bright colors catch your eye and his talent keeps your interest

The thrill has only just begun for Aaron Lehman.

It has been a whirlwind two years, on and off the racetrack, for the young horseman from Medford, WI.

After being honored in February as the 2023 Minnesota Harness Racing Caretaker of the Year, Lehman was in the race bike in late summer, set to make his driving debut.

The man in the red and gold colors would be as good as gold at Viroqua, a half-mile oval, on Sept. 17.

Partnered with bay pacer AK Up N Attem, a son of Andreoli Hanover—Dawns Early Rise, Lehman and the Quentin Schneider trainee won the non-betting race in 2:01.4.

It was one of three wins on the day for Lehman, who also recorded a trio of thirds for his six drives.

“That was a lot of fun,” he said of his milestone victory. “It was my first time fair racing. I was a little bit nervous, but it ended up being such a great day. We won that first race by a couple of lengths, but the feeling of coming down the stretch and no one is that close to you is just amazing.”

Lehman didn't slow down a fraction from that eye-catching curtain-raising performance.

“Looking back, getting those qualifiers in before my first race was a lot of fun,” Lehman said. “It made me realize how much I wanted to be a driver. I love everything about it.”

It certainly shows.

This year, Lehman, who earned his “P” license, has been sensational in the sulky, fashioning a record of 10-14-1 from 40 career starts.

Rather than speaking of his successes, Lehman’s focus is on self-improvement.

“I want to learn more every day,” he said. “I think that is important, especially in a sport where there is so much you need to know. You have to put everything you’ve got into it.”

Which is precisely what Lehman did when he started in the industry.

He was introduced to the standardbred world by his friend Mel Mullet, a longtime owner associated with QKS Racing Stable, run by husband-and-wife Quentin and Kimberly Schneider.

Lehman began his racing career as a groom for the Schneiders.

The role helped prepare him for the rigors of competing on the racetrack.

“I like to think it did,” Lehman said. “You look at a horse and you can see what they need. And that is the same when you are driving. You have to be aware of what will bring out the best in the horse. I also think starting as a groom, rather than as a driver, gave me a good perspective of the horses.”

After competing at Running Aces and Wisconsin fair tracks for a portion of 2024, Lehman took his show on the road.

Currently, he’s competing at Cal-Expo, the one-mile oval in Sacramento, CA.

On Dec. 13, he piloted the 3-year-old bay filly Overthemoonforyou, trained by Quentin Schneider, to a 45-1 upset.

The duo, second through three-quarters in 1:30.2, took over soon after and glided to a 1½-length score in 2:01.2.

“That was a great effort,” Lehman said. “The horse showed a lot of determination to get the win.”

It was a textbook score for a young driver whose preference for coming from off the pace worked to perfection in that dash.

“I like it here,” he said. “For myself, I appreciate a longer stretch. If I have to cut a mile, I absolutely will, but I like coming from behind, from off cover, and the horses who love to close. I like that feeling of coming from out of it and storming down the stretch.”

When he isn’t lighting up the tote board with the longest shot on the board, Lehman is a student of the game.

From watching replays, reading the program, sizing up the competition, and honing his craft, the young reinsman is earnest in bringing his A-game with each call he gets.

“I am hoping that I will eventually make it to the Grand Circuit – that’s one of my goals,” he said. “For now, I think I will be racing in Minnesota and California for the next couple of years.”

Lehman is looking to add a new role in the near future.

“I want to get my trainer’s license and have a few horses of my own,” he said. “I’d also like to catch-drive a lot.”

He won’t be hard to miss in those bright driving colors.

For Lehman, they are far more than just a fashion statement.

“Quentin, who I drove for, he has those colors, and I like them too,” Lehman said. “I think red and yellow stand out – you can see them from a distance. I went on a website, and I was able to design them myself.”

Looks aside, crafting a long career is at the top of the chart.

“I would say everything I have learned so far, before and after I started driving, will help me push forward,” Lehman said. “There will be good days and bad days, but if you come in with an open mind, a willingness to learn, and treat every horse and horseman with respect, hopefully, you will find success.”

“It takes hard work, and you need commitment to do well in this sport. I want to challenge myself to be the best I can be.”

While his racing career is on an upward arc, Lehman opts for the downhill life when he isn’t piloting pacers and trotters.

Skiing has long held status as his favorite pastime.

“I love getting out on the slopes whenever I can,” Lehman said. “One of my brothers lives in Idaho, so I will likely take a week and make my way up there at some point and enjoy some skiing.”

Giving his lofty numbers a lift at Cal-Expo, however, is the top priority right now.

“Each drive I get, I learn a little something more,” he said. “Win or lose, I always want to be able to take something away from the experience. That’s very important to me.”

Growing up in Michigan, Jenna Otten spent many hours in a barn or at a county fair with her older sister, Jessica, helping their father, Peter. Although sibling rivalry is a normal part of a family's life, the Otten women have remained close and today follow the same path in life: promoting the sport of harness racing. Presently Jessica is the marketing coordinator at The Meadowlands and Jenna is employed at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

The Ottens are third generation horsepeople and huge advocates of harness racing, so it came as no surprise when Jenna decided to embark on the same path. Although her parents may have been a bit disillusioned after Jenna spent four years in college studying for her Bachelors in Sport Psychology only to take a job with Caesar's Entertainment, they fully supported Jenna's decision.

Jenna spoke about her relationship with her sister Jessica.

"It's been pretty amazing watching Jessica grow in the sport," Jenna said. "She's not only a big role model for me, but for many other women who want to pursue a career in our sport.

The sisters teamed up on the 2024 Little Brown Jug and Kentucky Futurity broadcasts.

"When Jess and I were on Fox television at The Red Mile, nothing really felt different, but now looking back, that was the first time

The Red Mile was aired on national television, and the fact that Jess and I were together is pretty cool. “Working at Caesars the opportunities are endless. I’m still young and really enjoy the travel aspect of things and covering the Grand Circuit action. On the commentary side of things, I want to bring as much information as I can about a horse to the fan and gambler. On an outreach aspect, I want to try to bring in as many new faces to the sport.”

Even though the Otten sisters grew up together, they are not always of the same mind.

“Believe it or not, although Jess and I get along most of the time, there are times when we butt heads. I feel this is not a negative but positive because it could get interesting for the viewers to listen to us to hear a true real debate on horses, not just commentary from us back and forth. Maybe it will make it more entertaining and add a little comedy.”

Jenna said she first got involved in the sport because it’s just in her blood.

“Being brought up in the barn with my sister and father is something that may have been difficult at times, but I wouldn’t have changed one thing,” Jenna said. “I loved watching horses grow and develop. On the other side, I love watching people at the track for the first time. At Scioto Downs fans can get close to the action and just watching them cheer on the horse they probably bet \$2 to win on always puts a smile on my face.”

The younger Otten sister is quite invested in the sport.

“Presently I own two horses,” she said. “One is Two Can Play, a Shadow Play colt, and I also have a 2-year-old Captain Crunch gelding named D A Captain Marvel.”

Horses have always been a part of Jenna’s life, even at school.

“There were two horses that are special when I was younger working at the barn,” she said. “One was Thome, a gentle giant who taught me many things. I actually took him to school when I was in the 4th grade for Show and Tell.

“The other one was a trotter named Cain Rocks. My father never had many trotters, but this one was special. I bought him as a 3-year-old by myself and trained him down and got him to the races. He won his first race back and that was pretty special at a young age.”

There are many women that Jenna admires in the sport.

“If I didn’t say my sister Jessica first, I’d probably get a phone call the second this article came out. Besides Jess, I look up to Emily Gaskin, Moria Fanning, Heather Vitale and Amy Hollar. And I want to thank Victoria Howard for starting this column to honor all the women in the sport.”

Having been around the sport for her entire life, Jenna has some ideas of how to improve it.

“I think we must find a way to keep drawing younger fans to the track,” she said. “I’m a believer that once a person sees a race, they will want to come back.”

At a time of the year when so many people are thankful for their blessings, Jenna is certainly among them. She said she knows that she did not get to where she is today on her own.

The first season I was annoyed at myself because I had so many questions about everything, but they never once batted an eye and have always been there for me. It wasn’t easy moving away from home not knowing many people in the area, but they truly have made this place feel like home and I couldn’t be more grateful.

“And last, but not least, I want to thank all my friends back home who have always supported me and remind me they are just a phone call away.”

The broodmare Behindclosedoors 3, 1:53.2f (\$589,226), the dam of Sister Sledge 2, 1:53.1; 3, 1:51.2 (\$842,815), has died at the age of 17 at Sergent Stables in Ocala, FL.

“It’s with a heavy heart that we say goodbye to Behindclosedoors, the mare who truly laid the foundation for Sergent Stables,” said Sergent Stables farm manager Troy Eyler. “As our first broodmare purchase, she started the Sergent Stables’ legacy, and her influence has been felt in so many ways over the years, having produced eight beautiful foals.

“‘Doors’ wasn’t just a great mare; she was part of our family. She was a reliable, steady presence and always welcomed newcomers to the field with grace. Many of those newcomers came from the same bloodline, including Dip Me Hanover and Mezcal Morning, bloodlines we continue to invest in, inspired by the legacy she created.”

Behindclosedoors was a daughter of Andover Hall and the Yankee Glide mare Margarita Nights. She was trained by Hall of Famer Chuck Sylvester and finished second in the 2010 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Filly Trot.

Sister Sledge is one of five daughters produced by Behindclosedoors, with all in the broodmare bands of major breeders. Sergent Stables’ broodmare band includes a half-sister to Behindclosedoors, the Donato Hanover-sired Mezcal Morning, the dam of 2024 stakes winner Hangover.

Silver Label, Prohibition Legal cap off racing careers; Millar Farms and MacDonald recognized

Award-winning mares Silver Label and Prohibition Legal put a bow on their racing careers during a night of celebrations on Saturday (Dec. 21) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Both 5-year-old mares made their final start in the \$36,000 mares preferred with Silver Label getting one final victory in

1:51.2 to go out in style for owner/breeder Millar Farms, trainer Nick Gallucci and driver James MacDonald.

The victory was another cherry on top of already planned celebrations, as both Millar Farms and MacDonald were recognized for their outstanding 2024 seasons.

With just a few cards remaining in the year, George Millar’s Millar Farms has secured their second Leading Owner Award, while MacDonald has wrapped up his fourth consecutive Leading Driver Award.

Silver Label’s win gave Millar Farms their 51st win of the season at Woodbine Mohawk Park to go along with \$1.6 million in earnings. The victory was also MacDonald’s 397th of the campaign, which continued to increase throughout Saturday’s program.

A daughter of Bettors Delight, Silver Label finishes her career with 26 wins, \$1.6 million in earnings and a mark of 1:47.3. The 2022 O’Brien Award 3-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year most notable wins were the 2022 OSS Super Final, 2023 Lady Liberty, 2023 Perfect Sting and 2021 Champlain.

Prohibition Legal’s racing career concludes with 13 wins, \$1.1 million earned and a mark of 1:50. The daughter of Big Jim was the 2021 O’Brien Award 2-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year and notably won the 2021 OSS Super Final, 2021 Eternal Camnation and was second in the 2021 Shes A Great Lady and 2023 Dayton Distaff.

“There was so many [highlights] with these two mares,” said George Millar. “To be as fortunate as I was to have two such great mares in the same year and it was hard to watch them race against each other. I was a little bit emotional watching them go to the post and when they both turned for home, I was ready to cry.”

Silver Label will be bred to Always B Miki, while Prohibition Legal is lined up for a date with Sweet Lou.

A retirement ceremony for both mares and the leading owner and driver presentations all took place following the mares preferred.

Also on Saturday’s program, fan favorite pacing mare So Much More scored her 75th career victory. The 8-year-old was a coast-to-coast winner in 1:53.2 for MacDonald and trainer Don Beatson. The victory takes her over \$1.7 million in career earnings for Don Beatson, Kenn Beatson and Cole England.

K F Pro Sam into Ohio Harness Horse Hall of Fame

K F Pro Sam, a three-time Ohio Sire Stakes champion, has been selected to be the latest standardbred to be enshrined into the Ohio Hall of Fame by the members of the Ohio Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

The gelding by Nobleland Sam and out of the mare, Pro Choice (Falcon Almahurst) was bred by Henry Kaufman of Baltimore, OH.

As a 2-year-old, he went into training with co-owner Scott Mogan and went on to win freshman divisional honors, winning the Ohio Triple Crown – the Ohio State Fair, Ohio Sire Stakes final and the Ohio Breeders Championship.

At 3, he repeated his OSS final title and earned the Ohio 3-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year award. K F Pro Sam was also fifth in the final of the 2000 Little Brown Jug before heading east where he won the \$100,000 Maryland Governor's Cup, the \$100,000 Freehold Cup and multiple open events at The Meadowlands.

In 2001, he threepated in the OSS final and also picked up Ohio Older Pacer of the Year and Ohio Horse of the Year awards under the ownership of Howard Schoor, John Fielding and Peter Heffering.

"Sam" retired in 2003 with 26 wins in 60 starts, earning \$635,578.

In 2014, K F Pro Sam was sent to New Vocations and found his forever home as a riding horse until his passing in December 2023 at the age of 26.

K F Pro Sam will be inducted at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet on Saturday (Jan. 18) at the Marriott Columbus Airport.

Machtu N takes Cumberland's Auld Lang Syne

Machtu N won the \$6,000 Auld Lang Syne farewell pace for 14-year-old pacers at Cumberland Raceway on Saturday (Dec. 21), in a nail-biting tight finish with a fast-closing Rockaholic.

Scoring from post 4, driver McGwire Sowers took Machtu N out for an early lead, and had to work to get around Rockaholic (Andy Harrington) into a :29.4 opening panel. From that point Sowers lead the 3-5 favorite through comfortable middle fractions of 1:02 and 1:31.2, when the pensioner pacers turned for home a battle ensued for final bragging rights.

Rockaholic had gotten a perfect, 2-hole trip while Machtu N had set relatively modest fractions, so the pair were equally prepared for the thrilling stretch drive. While Rockaholic and Harrington were gaining ground with every stride, Machtu N and Sowers had just enough spark to hold on and prevail in 2:01.2, while the fans waited for a photo for win.

When the judges posted the final order of finish it was Machtu N that had won by a nose over his colleague Rockaholic. The 14-year-old son of Mach Three is owned and trained by Tammy Sowers and paid \$3.20 for the win.

Urbana Bayama (Dave Ingraham) finished third; Calvin B (Mark Athearn) was fourth.

The entire day was a big delight for fans of Maine harness racing as 12 14-year-old standardbreds paraded in front of the stands, received Barbara Dresser-designed plaques while being recognized by the announcer, and were photographed with their connections.

Lucan Hanover p, 3, 1:48f, a world champion and winner of an elimination heat of the Little Brown Jug, led the post parade, in the opener. The son of Western Ideal is owned and trained by Aaron Hall, and has accrued \$1.4 million in purse earnings. During his storied career he was the first sub-1:49 standardbred on a five-eighths mile track, and also won an elimination of the Breeders Crown during his sophomore campaign.

The entire day was dedicated to these special horses, with the first race marked for the soon-to-be retirees. Overall, the 12 horses have combined earnings of \$4.9 million, which is an average of \$414,082. The combined start total is 3,692 with an average of 308 starts per horse. Total combined wins for these

foals of 2010 are 561, which is an average of 47 victories per horse.

The fastest record belonged to the aforementioned Lucan Hanover, who is also the most decorated standardbred with 74 trips to the winner's circle. Eleven pacers and two trotters paraded in front of the stands individually, with the average win time of all the honorees an equally impressive 1:51.4.

The other retirees were: Goin Manstyle, Heart Breaking, Ideal Rowan, R T Lange, Rockin Rambaran, Scottish Blue, and Ugly Stik.

Harness racing at the Southern Maine's iconic oval will reconvene in April 2025.

Ohio Standardbred Development Fund announces changes to Ohio Sires Stakes program

The Ohio Standardbred Development Fund has announced several changes for the 2025 Ohio Sires Stake Program. The changes include:

- All horses must start in at least two Ohio Sires Stakes legs to be eligible to start in the championships.
- In any Ohio Sires Stakes race leg, there shall be no more than one trailer.
- All non-purse finishers in the \$100,000 Gray Championships (sixth through ninth on a five-eighths-mile track or sixth through eighth on a half-mile track) that start and finish the race will receive a \$1,000 starter's payment.
- The purse for the four Ohio Sires Stakes Veteran's Championships will be raised to \$100,000.

The changes approved by the OSDF, still need to be approved by the Ohio State Racing Commission at an upcoming meeting.

The Ohio Sires Stakes schedule for 3-year-olds will begin on May 16, 2025. The first of five legs for 2-year-olds will begin on July 12, 2025.

The Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet Championships are scheduled for Saturday (Sept. 27, 2025), at Hollywood Dayton Raceway. The Gray Championships will take place on Friday (Sept. 26, 2025).

The Ohio Sires Stakes Veteran's Championships are scheduled for Aug. 30, 2025, at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

More tracks may close if we don't get more excitement in the races

Thank you for the articles about the closure and memories of Freehold Raceway.

I grew up in the Philadelphia area. The two old harness tracks I grew up with, Brandywine Raceway and Liberty Bell Park (and later Garden State Park), are all gone. For now I still have Harrah's Philadelphia for my live harness racing action. I guess this just shows how much harness racing has lost interest from the betting public.

When I was younger, I remember the large crowds especially on big race days. Today, most people either stay home and

bet via the Internet or live mostly inside the simulcast area. Unfortunately, I will be one of the missing for the final day of racing at Freehold. I had an accident at home and broke my leg and I am still unable to walk so I will be one of those watching through my internet betting sites.

I am sorry to see another historic track close, but as I have been watching, all I see is betting handle go down as the betting dollars go elsewhere. Unless someone can get more excitement in the races, we may see even more tracks close. I feel there must be a way to make the races more competitive. There are too many races where the outstanding favorite always wins. This leads to low mutuel profits in all pools except maybe the multi-race bets. However multi-race bets do not drive mutuel handle. The industry cannot continue to hope to continue on other source income to fund purses. At some point that may disappear.

I would suggest fewer races with more competitive fields. Maybe even eliminate some of the higher purse feature races and increase regular race purses to encourage investment in horses that will compete in normal races at higher purses and bring more competitive racing on the track.

Thanks again for the memories of Freehold. I hope I don't lose my last local harness track since I still like seeing harness racing live.
